

Bill Doherty's Legacy Lives On

William "Bill" Doherty was an early choir member who made an outsized impact on the West Side Tremble Clefs. His wife Inge had Parkinson's disease. They heard about WSTC, came, and both stayed. Bill became generous with his time by being our first Treasurer and did a meticulous job by hand, without use of a computer. He was well-acquainted with the sacrifices Sun Joo Lee was making for us in those early years and knew well our financial needs. Then on June 16, 2010, Inge died, leaving Bill a lonely widower. As many of our widows and widowers of deceased Parkinson's patients do, Bill continued to attend our practices and concerts, enjoying the camaraderie with friends he had made at WSTC.

Knowing what a wonderful and important part WSTC played in his wife's life, Bill began generously contributing \$3,000 annually to the WSTC in memory of his wife. He continued to faithfully attend until our in-person practices were abruptly stopped last March because of the current pandemic. Bill died September 26, 2020, after spending several weeks in a care facility. But that did not stop his generosity. Within a month, we received a letter from the administrator of Bill's estate. He had taken time the previous December to include WSTC in his Will. The letter informed us of his bequest of \$10,000 to WSTC. To my knowledge, that will be the largest single gift we have ever received from an individual.

We miss Bill, but his legacy lives on. This last significant gift of his will help guarantee the financial viability of WSTC through this current pandemic that has shut us off from our audiences at concerts, our primary source of income. Many of our members are no longer capable of significant involvement. My toughest jobs as President are finding capable volunteers to fulfill key roles and in generating sufficient income to fund our program.

Whether you have Parkinson's or are a spouse without Parkinson's, you can make a wonderful difference in thousands of lives by volunteering to serve. And consider remembering the Tremble Clefs in your will, or as a beneficiary of one or more of your financial accounts. Bill made a larger-than-life difference for a quiet but thoughtful person. You can too.

What Helps People with Parkinson's?

I was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease and focal dystonia in 2013. I was initially misdiagnosed twice (in 2009 and then again in 2012). After talking to many people in the Original Tremble Clefs and in Idaho, I had DBS surgery in 2019.

To cope with PD:

I spend time in prayer, meditation, and help others where I can. I think it is very important to stay connected with people with a positive attitude and to be a part of a strong PD community. I do enjoy a good movie and like watching AZ sports. I can ride my bike (slowly). Sometimes, I put pen to paper and write.

My husband Stan was diagnosed in 1987 and lived with Parkinson's disease for 31 years. The things that helped him, and me so much were:

Going to chorus every week - singing AND party time at the break to talk with friends and EAT TOGETHER. Sun Joo Lee encouraged Stan to continue singing. He had a good voice and loved singing solos.

Family: Stan enjoyed phone chats to keep in touch with the out-of-state family. **EXERCISE helped.** 2-3 times a week with a personal trainer who came to the house. Exercise made a huge difference in keeping him mobile for a lot of years.
