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Tremble Clefs - Music Therapy for People with Parkinson's disease A Choral Group Starts in Mesa

My husband John was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease and Lewy Body Dementia seven years ago. As we look back he had been dealing with it much longer than that.

Our introduction to Tremble Clefs was at a health seminar here in Venture Out RV Resort. I attended but my husband John did not. One of our neighbors attended as well. We were agog at the choir singing and at the camaraderie of the group. We went home and talked to our husbands and another couple into going to a concert with us. We met and visited with Sun Joo and talked with some choir members. Everyone was so positive and upbeat. For the remainder of that season a group of 10-14 of us drove 40 miles each week to the South East Tremble Clefs group in Sun Lakes.

As we attended these meetings an idea began to grow. "This is so positive and helpful, we need to get this in our park." Thus it all began. We have not been good at attending the online sessions as John becomes confused with all the talking. However, we have tried to keep up with some of the voice exercises.

Thanks to the work of Libby, Rocky, myself, and TC AZ Board members with funding from a community grant from the Parkinson's Foundation and generous donations from the Venture Out Foundation, we had our first Mesa Tremble Clefs meeting on January 10, 2022. We expect people from other locations in Mesa to join us here at Venture Out. From humble beginnings, great things can happen.
