TORN PAPER BISON SCENE

Supplies: Construction paper Glue Paper plates, 10-inch Single-hole punch Yarn (8—inch pieces)

Before sharing this craft. Make a sample to show the students. Torn paper art is like a collage. To create an image or design, glue different-sized pieces of construction paper into place.

Give the children scraps of construction paper in a variety of colors, glue, and a sturdy 10-inch paper plate. They will tear the construction paper into different shapes and sizes and glue into place to create a bison scene.

Students can design a bison's face, complete with beard and horns. They can imagine a bison scene: a mother and calf, or bison grazing at the Wichita Mountains Wildlife Refuge.

Using the single-hole punch, make two holes three inches apart on the paper plate. Cut an eight-inch piece of yarn and tie each end into the holes.

Now the bison scene is ready to hang on the wall at home or school.
