Through their guidance, I've gained access to certification processes, networking opportunities, and a community of fellow minority business owners who understand my journey. Working with outreach coordinators like Vivian Watkins has helped transform STEPHENSON CORP from simply a business idea into a structured enterprise with a clear path forward.

Looking ahead, I envision STEPHENSON CORP growing into a six-figure operation within the next few years. My strategic plan includes expanding our fleet, creating quality employment opportunities, and securing major contracts—including work on the Brent Spence Bridge project. Each milestone we reach represents not just business success, but a step toward reshaping industry expectations about minority-owned businesses.
