## **Anaphylactic Shock**

Part 3

<u>In reference to</u> Bill 3, also known as Sabrina's Law 2005, new Provincial legislation was enacted January 1, 2006 to protect anaphylactic students within the school environment.

"Anaphylactic shock" is a severe allergic reaction, which may be fatal, and occurs when an allergic individual is exposed to a particular substance such as peanut products, nuts, eggs, fish, or is stung by and insect such as a bee, hornet or wasp.

Under this new law, parents/guardians and students are required to supply information on life-threatening allergies. In order to comply with this requirement, please provide the following information;
