Article I Name/Identity

This motorcycling activity group will be recognized and known only as the Moose unit listed above **Moose Riders Activity Group**


At no time will this group be known as a Motorcycle Club (MC), a Riding Club, or a Motorcycle Chapter or Association, in print, signage, website, or any electronic media, including popular social media outlets, videos, clothing, or patches.


The Moose Riders Vest and Back Patch

For those Moose Riders Activity Groups wishing to wear Moose Rider vest and back patches, the accepted and recognized Moose Rider patch images (Figs 1, 2 & 3), as designed by the Membership Department of Moose International, are the only authorized Moose Rider patches to be worn as representative of the Moose Rider program as outlined by the Moose International Membership Department.

The small (4 inch) Moose Riders authorized emblem 1 depicts a moose skull mount with antlers on a red shield. Above and centered are the words "Moose Riders". On either side are the initials. L.O.O.M. and W.O.T.M. signifying the Loyal Order of Moose and Women of the Moose. Below the mount is a silhouetted motorcycle, identifying us as riders. Below is the Moose Rider motto "Loyal To The Bone" signifying the Loyalty to the causes of Mooseheart and Moosehaven, going beyond the flesh, to our very core, which is reinforced by the Moose skull mount above.



The large Moose Riders authorized emblem in Fig 2 depicts the same image in the center as Fig 1, but includes the words Mooseheart and Moosehaven above and below the central image, with areas on either side for Lodge Activity Groups to customize the patch with their Association name, or Moose unit numbers, as in the example shown. This is a one-piece patch and no other patch additions are allowed, nor are any alterations allowed to the central image.

Authorized emblem Fig 3 depicts a black motorcycle wheel with a black moose head superimposed over it. This is a modernized version of the original L.O.O.M. logo and identifies us as Moose members and motorcycle riders. Stylized brown antlers, taken from a 1931 Moose International design are on either side of it. Curved above and centered are the words “Moose Riders”, set on a gold field. Appearing at the bottom of the logo is a white banner with a capital “M” flowed by a clock face set to nine o’clock, and a capital “B”, under which are the words “Moose On Bikes”. The initials M.O.B. are **always** to be depicted with the clock face set at 9:00 as the “O” in the center. This is a one-piece patch and no other patch additions are allowed, nor are any alterations allowed to the image.



When worn, the Moose Rider back patch must be the dominant feature of the back of the garment to which it is applied. Authorized Moose Rider back patches must not be subjugated to the patch of any motorcycle club or motorcycle owners' group. No other back patch or back patch design is recognized as representative of the Moose Riders Activity Group. Modifications or variations upon the original theme(s), without the expressed written approval of Moose International through the Membership Department, are not authorized. Existing Moose Rider back patches that vary from the

above examples will be submitted for approval to the Membership Department of Moose International (Attn: Moose Riders).

Specification of the garment upon which the Moose Rider back patch is to be worn is left to the discretion of the individual Moose Riders Activity Groups.

Under no circumstances are Moose Riders to add unauthorized rockers above or below the core patch or wear multi part back patches, or add the designation "Motorcycle Club" (M/C) or "Riding Club" (R/C) adjacent to the back patch. This will be cause for the suspension or dissolution of the offending Moose Rider group.

Dress

Each Moose Riders Activity Group is free to set the standards to which members are attired, unless superseded by the Moose Unit's Board of Officers rules regarding appropriate attire. Moose Riders is a program under the direction of the Moose International Membership Department, and as such, members are representatives of The Moose. It is strongly recommended that members dress in a manner that promotes a positive image for The Moose, particularly when involved with Moose Unit's activities or interacting with the public as a Moose Rider.

Moose Riders Activity Groups may produce t-shirts and other garments expressing their individual Moose unit identity; however, these items will be subject to the following conditions:

1. The quantity produced shall not exceed the number of Moose Unit's members eligible to become Moose Riders.
2. The images shall not depict the Moose Riders Activity Group as a Motorcycle Club (M/C), a Riding Club (R/C), bear the term "1%", or otherwise link Moose Riders to any other Motorcycle Club affiliation.
3. Custom t-shirt logos may not infringe upon established motorcycling or other recognized industry logos, copyrights, or trademarks.
4. Phrases used may not cross the boundaries of good taste, the rules for acceptable Social Quarters language, nor otherwise disparage or demean The Moose, the public, or any other organization, race, or religion.
5. Items created may not be sold to the public, with the exception of those created to raise funds during an event for supported charitable 501(c) 3 organizations. They may not be sold for Moose unit profit or to benefit an individual Moose member (unless that member in need is to be the beneficiary of an approved charitable event).
6. All garment designs will be subject to the co-approval of the Moose unit Board of Officers and the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group and will be submitted to the Membership Department of Moose International, via email or US Mail for final approval.

Article II Purpose

The purpose of the Moose Riders is to be a social and civic activity group for members of Moose Unit listed above and of The Moose, whose main concern shall be the support of Mooseheart, Moosehaven, local charities, and local branches of national worthy charities through motorcycling and volunteer work, and the social enhancement of their Lodge.

Though encouraged to help their Moose Unit out financially, at no time are any Moose Activity Groups under any direct obligation to regularly raise funds specifically for the upkeep and operation of the Moose Unit. Activity Groups are created to enhance the enjoyment of membership and promote volunteerism.

Article III Formation

Section (1) Motorcycle riding Moose members, and support members in the Moose Unit, must meet to determine if there are enough interested good standing members to support the formation of a Moose Riders Activity Group.

Moose Riders Activity Group membership is open to any good standing member of the Moose Unit, whether they ride a motorcycle or are simply a supporter.

Initially, enough interested Moose Unit members are required to fill the necessary officer positions (outlined in Article VII). Any good standing Moose Unit member may hold any position in its Moose Riders Activity Group.

An open invitation to attend the exploratory meeting of the group should be extended to the general membership.

Section (2) Permission must be requested from the Moose Unit Board of Officers to establish a Moose Riders Activity Group. A written request, or a request to be heard in person at a Moose unit meeting, to seek permission to start a Moose Riders group may be sent through the Moose unit Administrator.

Section (3) Once permission is received from the Moose Unit's Board of Officers to proceed, a copy of these completed guidelines must be submitted to the Moose Unit's Board of Officers for approval.

Section (4) Officers of a Moose Riders Activity Group must be established. The members of the newly formed Moose Riders Activity Group may openly nominate individuals for election as the initial Activity Group officers.

Section (5) Once the Moose Riders Activity Group Guidelines have been properly approved and signed, the Secretary of the Moose Riders Activity Group will fill out the Moose Riders Activity Group notification roster (at the end of these guidelines) and send it to the Moose International Membership Department, 155 S. International Dr. Mooseheart, IL 60539 1172 (Attn: Moose Riders).

Section (6) Moose Riders Activity Groups shall not be made to exist under any extraordinary or substantially more excessive set of rules or regulations than are set forth here, or are imposed upon any other recognized Moose Unit Activity Group.

Section (7) The dissolution of a Moose Riders Activity Group may take place in the following manner:

1. The greater membership of the Moose Riders Activity Group may make a motion to dissolve the group and vote on the issue.
2. The Moose Unit Board of Officers may call forward the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group to investigate specific infractions or allegations of wrongdoing or improper practices by individuals or the group at large and report back to them with their findings. Based upon the severity of the charges and the verification of infractions against these Guidelines or the General Laws by the accused, expulsion of individuals, or dissolution of the group may be the proper (but not necessarily the only) solution.

Article IV Membership

Section (1) All voting members must belong to Moose Unit listed above and of the Moose.

Section (2) Application for membership should be made to the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group. An Activity Group participation fee will be established by the group. Upon payment of the required activity fees and providing written proof of insurance (as required by prevailing state law) for all motor vehicles that will be used in Moose Riders Activity Group events, the applicant should be deemed elected into membership.

Section (3) Good standing members of a Moose Riders Activity Group should be members whose membership fees are paid in full and not in arrears. Annual activity fees should be as approved by the Moose Riders Activity Group's membership and paid on or before the annual meeting. The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group may pro-rate activity fees until the first annual meeting after election into membership.

Section (4) If any members home unit **does not have** a Moose Riders Activity Group, he or she may be proposed as a non-voting honorary member. In addition, they must be in good standing as a Moose member.

Section (5) Honorary members before the issue of these guidelines are grandfathered honorary members.

Section (6) If an honorary member becomes a good standing member of unit that they are an honorary member, they automatically relinquish his or her honorary membership.

Article V Meetings

Section (1) The annual meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group should be in the month of December of each year at such time and place as the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group designate.

Section (2) The order of business at meetings should be:

- Introduction of guests and new members
- Minutes of previous meeting
- Reports of Officers and Committees
- Old Business
- New Business
- Good and Welfare
- Election of Officers (annual meeting)

Section (3) General Moose Rider membership meetings should be held monthly in the Lodge home on such days and times as approved by the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group and membership. The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group may reschedule meetings cancelled due to holidays, conflicts, inclement weather, etc.

Section (4) The President of the Moose Riders Activity Group may call a special meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group whenever one third (1/3) of the good standing, voting members of the Activity Group make a written request to the President, specifying the purpose for the meeting. Not less than ten (10) days prior written notice of such special meeting should be hand delivered, emailed or mailed to the voting members. Only business of the object of the meeting as contained in the notice should be discussed or voted on.

Section (5) All meetings should be conducted according to parliamentary rules and open discussion from the floor on all measures should be permitted and encouraged.

Section (6) The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group should meet at least once a month, prior to monthly Moose Riders general membership meetings, at such times and places as determined by the Activity Group officers.

Section (7) No person other than a member of the Moose Unit Board of Officers or a good standing or honorary member of the Moose Riders Activity Group should be present at a meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group unless the President of the Moose Riders Activity Group specially invites him or her.

Section (8) The Secretary of the Moose Riders Activity Group should mail or email a notice of each annual and monthly meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group to every member of the Moose Riders Activity Group at least ten (10) days before the date of the meeting. Use of social media to announce meeting is not permitted.

Article VI Quorum

Section (1) No official business may be conducted at any monthly Moose Riders membership meeting unless a quorum consisting of not less than ten (10) percent of the total good standing, voting membership of the Moose Riders Activity Group is present. A simple majority vote of the good standing, voting members present should prevail.

Section (2) At meetings of the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group, a majority of the total number of officers should constitute a quorum, and a simple majority vote of the officer's present at any such meeting should prevail.

Section (3) Any good standing, voting Moose Riders member, who feels he or she has just cause, may present his or her view in writing to the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group for their consideration and action.

Article VII Officers and How Elected

Section (1) The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group should be Junior Past President, President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant at Arms and Road Captain. The Moose Unit President may appoint a separate Moose Unit Moose Rider Chairman (not Moose Rider President) to act as the Lodge liaison between the Lodge Board of Officers and the Moose Rider Activity Group and who will give a monthly Moose Rider Activity Group report at the regular Moose Unit membership meeting. At his/her discretion, the President may confer this position to the elected Moose Rider President.

Section (2) The regular term of office should be one year commencing January 1 and terminating at midnight on December 31. No officer should serve more than two (2) consecutive terms in any one office.

Section (3) After the election and by January 31st. The list of officers for the unit shall be emailed or mailed to the Moose International Activities department listing the Moose unit with Moose unit state, Moose unit number and each officer name and Moose ID number.

Section (4) Nominees for office and those making nominations must be good standing, voting members (not honorary) of the Moose Riders Activity Group. Any good standing, voting member present at the Moose Riders Activity Group formation meeting may make nominations for the initial officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group.

Section (5) The annual Activity Group Nominating Committee should consist of the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group and two (2) Moose Riders Activity Group members in good standing appointed by the President of the Moose Riders Activity Group.

Section (6) Voting rights are restricted to good standing male or female Moose Riders Activity Group members. Honorary members may not vote.

Section (7) The office of Past President of a Moose Riders Activity Group is a condition and not an elected office. To hold this office and be qualified as a Past President of a Moose Riders Activity Group, the member must have served continuously for not less than 180 days and have completed the term as President of the Moose Riders Activity Group for which he or she was elected.

Section (8) The election of officers of a Moose Riders Activity Group should be held at the annual meeting in the month of December.

Section (9) In the event of a vacancy in an elected office, the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group (presided over by the highest-ranking officer in attendance) should elect a member in good standing who will fill the unexpired term until the next general election.

Section (10) No one may hold an office in a Moose Riders Activity Group while concurrently holding an officer's position in any other manufacturer's motorcycling group, R/C, or M/C.

Section (11) No one may hold an office in more than one Moose Riders Activity Group concurrently.

Article VIII Duties of Officers

(A) Board of Officers

Section (1) The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group should manage the affairs of the Moose Riders Activity Group and take such action as necessary for the

proper transaction of business. The Moose Riders Activity Group should not conduct any social functions, entertainment or incur any obligations or liabilities, financial or otherwise, except and only when authorized and approved by the Moose unit Board of Officers, and then by the Lodge Moose unit membership at a regular meeting of the lodge.

Section (2) It should be the duty of the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group, subject to membership approval, to prescribe and publish rules regulating the Moose Riders Activity Group and the care and protection of Moose Riders Activity Group property and the good name of the Moose unit. It shall also be the duty of the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group to uphold and enforce the General Laws of the Moose. A copy of the General Laws should be in the possession of, or available to, the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group. Any rules adopted by the Moose Riders Activity Group shall not be contrary to nor negate these Moose Riders Guidelines.

Section (3) The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group should meet for the transaction of business at least once a month and at any other time at the request of the President of the Moose Riders Activity Group or the majority of the Activity Group officers, provided sufficient notice may be given to each of the Activity Group officers prior to the appointed time of the meeting.

Section (4) At the annual meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group, the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group should make a full report of their proceedings during the preceding calendar year and recommend such measures as they deem advisable.

Section (5) The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group may fill any vacancy among the officers by a vote of the majority of those present at a regular monthly meeting of the Activity Group officers, with such election to be for the unexpired term. Officers of a Moose Riders Activity Group or their successors are not to be appointed by the Moose unit.

Section (6) Any officer of a Moose Riders Activity Group who is absent from three (3) monthly meetings of the Activity Group officers (unless he or she is excused by the Activity Group's presiding officer) should be deemed to have resigned as an Activity Group officer. The Activity Group officers should, by majority vote, have the authority to declare any Activity Group office vacant if, in its collective opinion, the occupant has failed to perform the duties of such office.

Section (7) In any case where action has been taken by the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group that affects the relations of any member with the Moose Riders Activity Group, the action taken should not be reviewed at a subsequent meeting unless notice in writing is sent by the Secretary of the Moose Riders Activity Group to every officer of the Moose Riders Activity Group at least ten (10) days before the meeting, stating that the previous action will be brought up for review and reconsideration.

Section (8) The officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group should have the following specific powers:

- a. Make and publish rules for the conduct of members of the Moose Riders Activity Group in accordance with the General Laws of the Moose and the Moose Rider Guidelines.
- b. Temporarily suspend and, after a hearing, discipline a member for conduct in violation of the published rules, improper behavior prejudicial to the interests of the Moose Riders Activity Group, or a violation of the General Laws of the Moose.
- c. Immediately suspend any member who fails to maintain liability insurance if required by state law, or who conducts himself or herself in an unsafe manner.
- d. Fix and enforce penalties for violations of established rules.
- e. Remit penalties for offenses against established rules.
- f. Call a special meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group to consider special subjects or projects.
- g. With notification to the Lodge Board of Officers, make, alter, and amend the rules for the government of the Moose Riders Activity Group, and fix and enforce penalties for violations of such rules. However, any change to the Moose Riders Activity Group's rules and regulations should be read at the next Moose unit meeting and approved by the Moose unit membership before such change becomes effective. Changes do not include amendments to these guidelines.
- h. Prescribe additional duties for any of the Activity Group officers, in addition to those contained herein.

Section (9) Any actions on the part of any member of a Moose Riders Activity Group, which is detrimental to the Moose Riders Activity Group, the Lodge as determined by any officer of the Moose Rider Activity Group, should be grounds for immediate suspension, pending a review of the suspension by the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group. Unless the suspended member waives notice, the Moose unit Board of Officers should conduct a hearing only after the suspended member has received seven (7) days actual notice of the hearing. The suspended member should not be afforded the right to confront any accuser(s) and review all evidence considered by the Moose unit Board of Officers. The decision of the Moose unit Board of Officers should be by the greater weight of the evidence. The Moose unit Board of Officers may do one of the following: take no action, or reprimand, suspend or revoke social quarters privileges in the Moose Unit or the Moose Riders Activity Group, as deemed appropriate in accordance with the evidence.

Section (10) Any Activity Group officer or member found to be in violation of the General Laws of the Moose may be removed from office or membership in the Activity Group after the proper proceedings have taken place according to the procedures laid out in the General Laws, found in the following chapters: Charges, Chapters 54 -55; Commissioner, Chapters 58-59; Contempt, 53.2; 58.13; Expulsion, 46.20; 55.2; 59.5; Fraud, 53.5; Investigating Committee, 56.3; Moose officers and members, 53.1; Chapter 55; 56.1; Penalties, 24.5; 53.2; 53.5; 53.6; 55.4; 46.20; Chapter 59; Procedures, Chapters 54 - 59; Suspension, 54.1; Chapters 55 - 57; 59.4.

(B) President

Section (1) The President of the Moose Riders Activity Group should preside at all meetings of the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group and membership meetings of the Moose Riders Activity Group, and should enforce all the laws and regulations of the Moose Riders Activity Group. The President of the Moose Riders Activity Group should perform such other duties as should be required of him or her by resolution of the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group. If the Moose unit confers upon him or her the Moose unit Moose Rider Chairperson, he or she will become the Moose unit liaison to the Moose Rider Activity Group and will be required to report on Moose Rider Activities at the regular Moose unit meetings.

Section (2) The President and Secretary of the Moose Riders Activity Group, along with the President and Administrator of the Moose unit, should sign all written contracts and written obligations of the Moose Riders Activity Group, provided approval has been granted by the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group and membership, and the Moose unit Board of Officers and membership of (Moose unit name) Lodge No. (Moose unit number).

Section (3) Any and all contracts must be approved by the Chief Compliance Office.

Section (4) The President of the Moose Riders Activity Group should have the power to appoint Moose Riders Activity Group committees whenever he or she deems it appropriate (i.e., Rules Committee, Finance Committee, Food Committee, Publicity Committee, Activities Committee, Entertainment Committee, Membership Committee, etc.).

(C) Vice President

Section (1) The Vice President of the Moose Riders Activity Group will perform the duties of the office of the President of the Moose Riders Activity Group in his or her absence. In the event of the death or disability of the President of the Moose Riders Activity Group, the Vice President of the Moose Riders Activity Group should act until the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group fill the vacancy.

Section (2) The Vice President of the Moose Riders Activity Group should visit the sick or distressed and a committee may be appointed by the President of the Moose Riders Activity Group to assist in these duties.

(D) Secretary

Section (1) The Secretary of the Moose Riders Activity Group should keep the minutes and other official reports of the Moose Riders Activity Group; conduct the official correspondence of the Moose Riders Activity Group; keep all records, books,

documents and papers relating to the Moose Riders Activity Group in such a place as designated by the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group; issue all Moose Riders Activity Group membership cards (if so desired); and mail notice to all members when directed.

(E) Treasurer

Section (1) Upon approval of the Moose Riders Activity Group, the Moose unit shall request a dispensation for a savings account and monies from the Rider Activity Group shall be turned in to the Moose unit's administrator for deposited into the Moose Riders savings account or in the accounting line item designated for the Moose Riders Activity Group in the Moose unit's general fund and be receipted to the Moose Rider Secretary and or Treasurer. Any funds withdrawn on behalf of the Moose Rider Activity Group shall be voted and approved by the Moose Rider Activity Group membership and the Moose unit membership, and those funds shall be withdrawn by the Moose unit Administrator, Moose unit President and Moose Rider Activity Group Secretary whose names shall appear on the Savings Account. The Treasurer will submit a financial report at each monthly meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group. The Treasurer will submit the same report to the Moose unit's administrator for agreement on the Moose Rider Activity Group balance. At the annual meeting of the Moose Riders Activity Group, the Treasurer will submit a detailed financial report to the membership for the preceding calendar year. An Financial Review Committee appointed by the officers of the Moose Riders Activity Group will review the report.

Section (2) At every Moose Rider Activity Group event or meeting when money is collected. A report will be filled out by the Treasurer or Secretary or if neither is present a Moose Rider Activity Group officer listing the amount raised, expenses (if any) with receipts, what the event/meeting purpose. Where the monies are to be deposited or sent. This report will be submitted to the Moose unit's administrator and a copy kept by the Moose Rider Activity Group.

Section (3) A small petty cash fund not exceeding **\$500.00** should be permitted for incidentals. The petty cash fund shall initially be made up of participation fees, and be replenished by member donations and proceeds from specifically designated group activities.

(F) Road Captain

Section (1) The Road Captain should coordinate all Moose Rider Activity Group rides, including:

- A) Mapping routes, establishing stop points, providing maps, confirming insurance compliance, informing riders of rules, etc.
- B) Working with local law enforcement to provide logistics for major Lodge Activity Group functions (i.e., toy runs).

C) Ensuring that all participants have signed approved Moose Rider ride/event waivers, and that those waivers are collected and kept by the Moose Rider Secretary.

Section (2) A committee may be appointed to assist the Road Captain in the performance of his/her duties.

(G) Sergeant-at-Arms

Section (1) The Sergeant-at-Arms should keep a record of attendance of members present at each meeting and maintain order at all times. When so instructed by the President of the Moose Riders Activity Group or presiding officer, the Sergeant-at-Arms should expel any member from a meeting for disorderly or unbecoming conduct.

Article IX Fees/Funds

Section (1) The amount of the annual Moose Rider Activity Fee will be established and agreed upon by vote of the Activity Group members. Any member who fails to pay their annual fees within fifteen (15) days after they become due, or who fails to pay any indebtedness owed to the Moose Riders Activity Group within thirty (30) days after a bill for same has been rendered, should be suspended from all privileges of Moose Riders Activity Group membership and should remain suspended until the full amount of such indebtedness has been paid. Any monies collected on behalf of the Moose Riders Activity Group should be turned over to the Treasurer as soon as possible.

All funds raised by the Moose Riders Activity Group should be accumulated for the purpose of the following:

- a. Donations to Moose Charities for the Mooseheart/Moosehaven Endowment Fund
- b. Agreed upon improvements to the Moose Unit Building
- c. Specific Moose Unit approved charitable donations
- d. Contributions to efforts organized by the State/Provincial Moose Association Moose Riders for special projects
- e. Replenishment of Moose Rider operating costs (petty cash)

Section (2) All funds raised by the Moose Riders Activity Group must be expended toward their intended purpose. The Administrator and President will handle requests for approved disbursement of funds in an efficient and timely manner.

Moose Riders allocated funds used in an emergency situation by the Moose unit, with approval from the Moose Rider Activity Group, will be replenished in a timely manner, and disbursed to their intended purpose.

Article XI
State/Provincial Inclusion

Section (1) State/Provincial Moose Association Moose Riders Activity Groups are encouraged and endorsed by Moose International. However, upon formation, this Moose Riders Activity Group and its members are in no way obligated to join or pay membership fees to any State/Provincial Moose Association Moose Riders Activity Group. There are no provisions of District Moose Rider Activity Groups, only groupings of Moose unit sponsored Moose Rider Groups within a designated District.

Section (2) Individuals in this Moose Riders Activity Group may petition or may be invited to join the State/Provincial Moose Association Moose Riders Activity Group of the state or province in which it resides. Upon approval by the State/Provincial Moose Association Moose Riders Activity Group, individuals of the Moose unit Moose Rider Activity may become State/Provincial Moose Rider members, but are not mandated to do so. However, if they choose to join, they will abide by all regulations set forth by the Association Board of Officers, and will pay approved fees and participate in approved events as required by membership in that State/Provincial Moose Association Moose Riders Activity Group.
