Fall Maintenance Tips

1. Call your local chimney sweep to clean your fireplace. If you are a frequent user, your chimney should be cleaned every three (3) years.

2. Change out those batteries in your smoke alarm.

3. The burn band has been lifted. Before burning you must call WILCO @ 512-864-8323 and report. ALL burns must be completely out by dusk.

ACC Reminder

The Durham Park Deed Restrictions state that all improvements and livestock must have prior approval from the Architectural Control Committee (ACC). Applications are posted at <u>www.durhampark.info</u>. The ACC generally completes all applications in less than a week.

Deed Restrictions Update

We have a Focus Group of community members who have been meeting diligently to review and propose changes to our current Deed Restrictions which will be up for revision in 2020. Their deadline to provide inputs to the board is September 30th.

The next step is the formation of a Deed Restriction Committee. They will review the recommendations and determine if any additions/deletions should be recommended and provide a finalized committee document to the current board by Dec 15^{th.}

The document will then be submitted for legal review. Once that is done and any appropriate/required changes are completed, the document will be sent to the property owners for review by the end of March 2019.

The board will address all concerns, both written and oral during the May 2019 Board Meeting. If needed, special meetings will be set up to go over the proposed updates.

Each suggested change will be voted on as a separate item. Ballot vote November/December 2019

Approved changes will be recorded with Williamson County as part of the official records of the Association.
