A Brief History...

Round Hill Country Club was originally founded in 1959 as a combination golf course and luxury housing community. Homes were built from the 1960's through the 1980's and RHPOA was developed shortly thereafter. Today, there are 396 homes that make up the Property Owners Association. The annual RHPOA dues are \$115 per year, per parcel. There are nine volunteer Board Directors who are residents of our community and receive no compensation. The dedicated Board members meet the third Tuesday of each month. During COVID-19 we have been meeting virtually. Pre and post-COVID-19, we meet at the Round Hill Country Club on the third Tuesday of each month.


Message from the RHPOA President

Mark Cordone- President, Contra Costa County Service Area P-5, Flag Display

The RHPOA Board has the important responsibility of applying the rules and regulations set forth in the documents that make up our Round Hill Property Owners Association. Those documents were provided to you when you purchased your home. Those important documents include the 1) Articles of Incorporation, 2) By-laws and 3) Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs). The most important document the CC&Rs. The Board has a fiduciary obligation to apply the rules to all homeowners. You as a homeowner and/or resident have the obligation and responsibility to follow those rules. When there are Infractions by a homeowner, the Board may require a hearing with the homeowner to resolve the violation. If the issue is not rectified, fines may be imposed until the matter is resolved. Please know that the RHPOA Board is not in the business of fining homeowners and it is not our desire to do so. Our desire is for all to live by the rules so that all may enjoy our beautiful neighborhood and maintain the values of our community. We live by the motto, "Be a Good Neighbor."

We are fortunate to have many beautiful streets enjoyed by outdoor enthusiasts such as walkers, joggers, and bicyclists. Please maintain the neighborhood maximum speed limit of 25 miles per hour for everyone's safety.

Contra Costa County Service Area P-5 - Alamo is unincorporated and therefore has no budget for a police force. Two dedicated Sheriff Deputies and a police vehicle, which are funded by Contra Costa Country with tax revenues from 736 parcels within the P-5 jurisdiction, protect Round Hill. The 736 parcels each pay a \$470 annual tax. The P-5 jurisdiction includes the communities of Round Hill, Round Hill North Estates, Windsor Green and a few immediate surrounding streets. We are fortunate to have



these dedicated Deputies. You will recognize the P-5 Logo on the rear panel of the police vehicle. Wave a friendly hello when you see a Deputy on your street.



Automated License Plate Cameras - A few years ago, Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR) were installed throughout Alamo. Again, Alamo is unincorporated and had no budget for ALPR Cameras. Fortunately, seven cameras were funded through private donations from RHPOA, Round Hill North Estates, and Round Hill Country Club, and cameras were installed to protect the P-5 jurisdiction. The cameras have been proven to make a great impact on deterring and preventing crimes in our community. ALPR cameras are installed in several neighboring cities such as San Ramon, Danville, Walnut Creek, Orinda, and Moraga. The cameras work in-sync to deter crime and assist with solving crimes in Alamo. Twenty-two ALPR cameras are strategically located throughout Alamo. Collectively, those 22 cameras read approximately 2 million license plates per month. Readings that recognize a wanted felon or vehicle are immediately sent to the Alamo Sheriff Substation located in the Alamo Plaza, and deputies immediately pursue of the vehicle.

Beautification and Safety – Starting December 7, when weather is permitting, Woodiwiss Painting will be painting the white address number box, Round Hill logo "RH", and address number at each of the 396 properties' curbs in our neighborhood. Refreshed white paint and uniform address numbers, with high quality reflective paint, will add to



the beautification of our neighborhood. Painting address numbers also increases safety by ensuring that emergency vehicles can easily find homes, and minimizes slowing in the middle of the street by vendors as they search for home numbers. This committee assures that Round Hill residents comply with the current Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs). These CC&Rs encompass exterior standards, landscaping requirements, vehicle parking, fencing and much more. We have found that most residents actively seek to comply with the CC&Rs and most violations are resolved with a simple phone call or letter. The goal of the CC&R's is to ensure that all homes meet a minimum standard of



maintenance and appearance. This helps us maintain an enhanced neighborhood in which we all reside, and also preserves property values for our community.

- Replaced county street signs with custom street signs
- Completely overhauled and ratified our CCRs and By-Laws
- Replaced and enhanced the Round Hill front entrance signs
- Made a significant investment in ALPR cameras to strengthen security
- Installed lighting to illuminate oak trees entering the main entrance on Round Hill Road

Beautification | New Entrance Landscaping

As I say every year, we live in the best place in the Bay Area. I am very proud to be part of the Round Hill community. A portion the RHPOA budget is used to keep the two entrances at Stone Valley Road in bloom. Three to four times a year, the RHPOA Beautification Committee selects the annual flowers appropriate for the season. The Round Hill Country Club ground maintenance crew plants, waters, and maintains the area for the residents.

This is an exciting time in Round Hill. After careful consideration, we have designed a new landscape plan at the two entrances on Stone Valley Road. This new plan will encompass a redesign of existing the perennial and annual planting areas, new lighting, adding a path and

an upgraded irrigation system. Our goal is to create a safe walking path, as well as a beautiful and inviting entrance with year-round color and beauty.

Lastly, holiday lights will be installed the week before Thanksgiving and remain until the second week of January. Last year's lights were added to the second entrance of Round Hill to create a comparable effect at both entrances.

Thank you for allowing me to serve on the Round Hill HOA Board. I truly enjoy serving our community.

Safety & Deterring Crime

As a community, we need to be proactive in *deterring and preventing* crime in Round Hill. Here are a few reminders to ensure your home is not a target.

- 1. When leaving your home for a vacation, or even a short trip into town, turn on your security camera systems and home alarms.
- 2. Use automated indoor lighting when not at home. Install movement sensor spotlights in your yard.
- 3. Remove, or hide from sight, any valuables from your car at all times. Eliminate the opportunity for theft.
- 4. Garage door remote controls are a key into your home. Be sure to hide or remove the remote control when your car is parked in your driveway or at the grocery store.
- 5. If you see somebody or an activity that appears suspicious, please call 911. A dedicated P-5 Sheriff Deputy will be dispatched to investigate. You may be preventing a crime against a neighbor.
- 6. Amazon, UPS, etc. are leaving packages on several of our homeowners' doorsteps, in front of garages, etc. When possible, please arrange for a neighbor to pick up your packages if you are not home. That will reduce the opportunity for someone to steal the package.
