I believe it is important to meet women where they are. Empowerment comes from understanding what is important to the woman you are interacting with and helping find a solution for them. As an example, of that, if we want to attract younger women we need to understand where they are. They may be new moms or starting a new career and while they love the Zonta mission, their involvement may look different than that of a seasoned Zontian. They may find it difficult to attend meetings or to serve on a committee. We need to find ways to include them 'where they are at'. Perhaps recording meetings and sharing the link so they can view at a time that works with their schedule or asking them to help with a smaller project so they feel connected.

As for a specific project of empowerment, I would look to share with our area the Hilo Pay It Forward project. We can provide the outline and documents of how to get this started and share with our area clubs and then at the district level.

The idea would be similar to our Higher Education and Hands Are Not For Hitting projects that were shared as a 'kit in a box.'

Finally, I strongly believe that 'a rising tide lifts all boats.' My fellow Zontians success is my success and we need to do more to support women instead of trying to compete with them, both inside and outside of our clubs.

As most of us have become familiar using Zoom, we should continue that by staying connected to other island clubs to keep consistent connections with them.
