## NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION FOR TPDES PERMIT FOR MUNICIPAL WASTEWATER

## AMENDMENT

## PERMIT NO. WQ0010641003

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION. City of San Angelo, 72 West College Avenue, San Angelo, Texas 76903, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a major amendment to authorize converting its existing Texas Land Application Permit (TLAP) No. WQ0010641003 to a Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0010641003 (EPA I.D. No. TX0141534), which will authorize the disposal of treated wastewater via discharge at a volume not to exceed an annual average flow of 12,000,000 gallons per day via Outfall 001 with provisions for disposal via surface irrigation and evaporation at a daily average flow not to exceed 11,300,000 gallons per day or an annual average flow not to exceed 10,700,000 gallons per day on 2,240 acres of land. The combined annual average flow for disposal via irrigation and by discharging shall not exceed 12,000,000 gallons per day. The current permit authorizes the disposal of treated domestic wastewater at an annual average flow of 10,700,000 gallons per day via evaporation and surface irrigation on 2.240 acres of land in the Interim Phase, and an annual average flow of 13,700,000 gallons per day via evaporation and surface irrigation on 2,680 acres of land in the Final phase. TCEO received this application on June 22, 2021.

The facility and disposal site are located at 1898 City Farm Road, San Angelo, in Tom Green County, Texas 76905. The treated effluent will be discharged to directly to the Concho River in Segment No. 1421 of the Colorado River Basin. The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located in the drainage basin of the Concho River in Segment No. 1421 of the Colorado River Basin. The designated uses for Segment No. 1421 are primary contact recreation, public water supply, and high aquatic life use. In accordance with 30 Texas Administrative Code Section 307.5 and the TCEQ's Procedures to Implement the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards (June 2010), an antidegradation review of the receiving waters was performed. A Tier 1 antidegradation review has preliminarily determined that existing water quality uses will not be impaired by this permit action. Numerical and narrative criteria to protect existing uses will be maintained. A Tier 2 review has preliminarily determined that no significant degradation of water quality is expected the Concho River, which has been identified as having a high aquatic life use. Existing uses will be maintained and protected. The preliminary determination can be reexamined and may be modified if new information is received.
