JOHANA

Johana comes upon a casket. It is open and empty.

JOHANA

This site's no good.

EXT. CAMP - NIGHT.

Johana finishes her meal and settles down for the night.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

Johana meanders through the forest, journal in hand. A sudden PING of a proximity alert brings her to her senses.

JOHANA

Talk to me, Nina.

CONTINUED: 2.

NINA (VOICE)

I'm tracking several signals to the northeast.

JOHANA

Looters?

NINA (VOICE)

There have been reports of zealot activity, but no confirmed reports of looting in this area.

JOHANA

Well what would be worse, zealots or looters?

NINA (VOICE)

That would depend on the scenario, doctor. Probability would indicate that an encounter is inevitable. Would you like me to generate a list of probable outcomes?

JOHANA

I don't think that's necessary right now, Nina. Thank you though.

Johana continues walking.

EXT. CAMP - NIGHT.

Sounds of the forest echo endlessly through the miles and miles of trees. Johana sits beside a small fire, writing notes down in her journal. A rough map of the planet and a textbook are also set beside her.

JOHANA

I can see why so many people have gotten lost on this planet.

NINA (VOICE)

Dioliev is the largest planet in this system, doctor.

JOHANA

Don't I know it.

Johana looks over some number in her book. She scans over a list of numbers pertaining the current number of people on Dioliev. At the bottom of this list it says "Unaccounted For: 2,763"

CONTINUED: 3.

JOHANA

Who was that professor Seiken said went missing out here?

NINA (VOICE)

Eamus Kazemede. Former professor of philosophy at the Royal Academy. Left his post and came here twenty-three years ago. Disappeared soon after. His body was never recovered.

Johana writes in the journal.

NINA (VOICE)

Any updates you'd like to make to the current route?

A noise in the forest startles Johana.

NINA (VOICE)

I'm reading several animal signals. No human lifeforms nearby.

Johana kicks some sand onto the fire.

JOHANA

Let's get some rest. We've got a lot of ground to cover tomorrow.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

Johana walks through the forest. She stops to sketch something in her notebook.

EXT. FOREST - LATER.

JOHANA

Nina, could you route a call to James for me?

NINA (VOICE)

Sure.

Johana continues walking through the forest as the RINGING of the phone call sounds in her ears.

EXT. GARDEN - DAY

FLASHBACK

Johana and her brother JAMES walk through a garden.

JAMES

So, I looked over at this kid, and he wasn't just asleep mind you, but he was leaning over and drooling on the girl's shoulder next to him.

JOHANA

No.

JAMES

Dead serious. She was not amused in the slightest. So I walked on up there and poked him with my ruler-

JOHANA

Careful now, people have gotten in trouble for less than that.

He gives her a look.

JAMES

Right- so he wakes up and just kind of looks up at me. Huge trail of saliva all down his cheek. So I say to him, "Would you like me to get a rag, because you appear to have sprung a leak."

JOHANA

Okay, you have officially turned into Dad.

JAMES

Hey, come on know, it's clever and you know it.

JOHANA

No. You're my brother and I love you, but that does not mean I have to laugh at your jokes.

JAMES

My humor is just too high brow for someone in your field I guess.

CONTINUED: 5.

JOHANA

You know, a new study came out that said archaeology is one of the top five funniest professions.

JAMES

So I should mail all of my jokes to you then, for approval?

JOHANA

Please do not.

JAMES

I'll have to get more stamps.

JOHANA

Do not. Just keep testing out your bad jokes on your students.

JAMES

Maybe. Honestly, I don't really see myself there much longer.

JOHANA

Yeah?

JAMES

Yeah, they've got plenty of history professors as it is, and you can only have so many kids fall asleep in your class before it starts getting you down.

They walk by a pair of people praying in the garden. Johana gives a look of disapproval. They keep walking.

JOHANA

So what's next for the great James Shenzra?

JAMES

Well, you know, I've got a couple of different things laid out. But I'm thinking of moving some place a little quieter than here.

JOHANA

Well, where are you thinking?

JAMES

I was looking into either Dresher or Kaesyn.

CONTINUED: 6.

JOHANA

Dresher has a good market, but Kaesyn is just that moon that had the monasteries built on it forever ago. What's there that you're looking at.

James lowers his head.

JOHANA

Wait, what? You can't be serious.

JAMES

I was talking with Dean last week, and it turned out he's a follower too. We were just talking - I can't remember how it turned to the subject of faith. But, you know, it really makes a lot of sense when you think about it.

JOHANA

Jim, we've been over this. What would Dad think if he heard you were thinking of moving to Kaesyn to become what? A monk?

JAMES

Well, he's not here, Jo. And Mom isn't either. I've been thinking about this for a while, and I've really felt it weighing on me, you know? I need this right now. I'm sorry.

INT. HOME - DAY

James stands at the door with a bag packed. Johana stands further in the home, resigned to what is about to happen.

JAMES

The monastery allows visitation on Saturday afternoons, so I guess just let me know a couple days beforehand if you'll be there.

JOHANA

Okay.

JAMES

I can hire somebody to take care of the house while I'm gone. CONTINUED: 7.

JOHANA

It's fine. I can handle it.

Embrace.

JAMES

I love you, you know that right?

JOHANA

Yeah. I love you too.

James begins to walk out.

JAMES

Would you be mad if I prayed for you?

EXT. ALIEN FIELD - DAY.

BACK TO PRESENT

SFX: Phone ringing

NINA (VOICE)

It's unlikely Mr. Shenzra will answer.

JOHANA

I know.

She takes a few more steps before a DIAL TONE stops the ringing.

NINA (VOICE)

I can try again in a couple of hours if you'd like.

JOHANA

Okay.

EXT. RUINS - DAY.

Johana walks through a series of ruins. She and Nina converse. Johana has her journal out.

JOHANA

This place really fell apart, didn't it?

The PING of a proximity alert stops Johana in her tracks.

CONTINUED: 8.

NINA (VOICE)

Human signals.

JOHANA

How close?

A robed ZEALOT steps out from around the corner. They spot each other. An awkward silence falls over the ruins.

ZEALOT

Desecrator.

He pulls out a knife and runs at her. She dodges but trips. The zealot tackles her but Johana kicks him off. As the zealot stumbles off of her, he pulls a page out of the journal. Johana runs out of the ruins. A foot chase ensues. More Zealots appear and chase her as well. She trips over something and the Zealots are almost upon her. A series of gunshots ring out through the forest, and one by one the Zealots fall to the ground. EAMUS emerges from the woods.

JOHANA

Did you-

EAMUS

Yes. Those shots will have alerted others nearby. Who are you?

JOHANA

Dr. Johana Shenzra. Who're-

EAMUS

You have a weapon?

JOHANA

No, sir. I do not. I'm an-

EAMUS

That site's been empty for ages, what were you doing in there?

JOHANA

I stumbled through there accidentally. Now look, I don't want any trouble. I'm just passing through here and-

EAMUS

This planet has been dead for a thousand years, no one just passes through here.

Voices are heard in the distance.

CONTINUED: 9.

EAMUS

What're you really doing here? Better talk fast.

JOHANA

I'm looking for a tomb. That's all.
I'm an archeologist.

EAMUS

Not enough grant money for a whole team?

The voices grow louder and nearer. Eamus lowers his weapon.

EAMUS

Come with me. But don't try anything stupid, or I'll leave your body here with the others.

Johana looks off towards the voices.

NINA (VOICE)

I think you should go with him, Doctor. Twice as many signals approaching as before.

JOHANA

Well we don't really have a choice, Nina, do we?

EAMUS

What's that?

JOHANA

Nothing.

NINA (VOICE)

Signals getting closer.

EAMUS

Now, please.

EAMUS

Any particular tomb you're looking for, Dr. Shenzra?

JOHANA

Yes, actually.

She gets out her journal.

CONTINUED: 10.

JOHANA

This one. I found a book that mentioned it, and I wanted to see if there was any weight to the theories about it.

He looks at the journal and stops walking.

JOHANA

What?

EAMUS

Looking for big game I see.

He continues walking.

JOHANA

Excuse me?

EAMUS

Bet you could get a nice couple billion for the body on the open market couldn't you?

JOHANA

Sir, you miss the point entirely. My purposes here are strictly academic.

EAMUS

That why you didn't come here with a weapon?

Johana keeps silent.

EAMUS

Okay, look-

Eamus stops walking. He pulls out another gun and gives it to her.

EAMUS

Take this. I ran into a scout party week before last who heard rumor that someone may have found the entrance to that tomb in the mountain range north of here. No word on what happened to that someone since then though.

JOHANA

Well why haven't you gone to see it?

CONTINUED: 11.

EAMUS

I like to keep my business under the radar. That find there is very much over the radar. Big finds bring big names to come looking for you.

Johana writes 'north' on the map in her journal.

JOHANA

Thank you.

EAMUS

Don't be afraid to use that gun next time.

Eamus begins to walk away.

JOHANA

Next time?

EAMUS

Yep. They'll be back. They'll always be back.

EXT. RUINS - DAY.

A group of zealots has gathered to mourn their dead comrades in the ruins. The LEADER looks at the bodies.

LEADER

These were good men. Let them find the warm embrace of the holy Sister.

ZEALOTS

Let their memory be praised.

LEADER

Let they who did this find our Brothers' everlasting damnation.

He notices that one has a crumpled up piece of paper in his hand. He pulls out the paper to look at it. It is the rendering of the goddess and a portion of Johana's map.

LEADER

Brothers and sisters...

The zealots gather round. The Leader holds up the page.

CONTINUED: 12.

LEADER

Another poor child had been deceived by those who would wish to blaspheme the holy Sister.

Murmurs emanate from the other zealots.

LEADER

We cannot allow this homeworld to be turned inside out by people who refuse to accept the one final truth of the universe.

They have gone silent. The Leader looks to two of the zealots, AJAX and XAN. He hands them the page.

LEADER

Find this person, and purge them from this place.

EXT. FOREST - LATER.

Johana walks through the forest. She stops for a moment to examine her journal again. Where she had written 'north', she had previously written 'south'

NINA (VOICE)

Do you wish to continue on the present path?

JOHANA

Yes.

NINA (VOICE)

Reports show increased zealot activity along our present course.

JOHANA

Okay.

Johana keeps walking.

EXT. CAMP - NIGHT.

Johana sits by the fire reading and writing in her journal.

JOHANA

Hey, Nina.

CONTINUED: 13.

NINA (VOICE)

Yes?

JOHANA

Is there anyone nearby?

NINA (VOICE)

Not a soul.

Johana looks up at the stars.

JOHANA

Then let's have some music.

NINA (VOICE)

Anything specific?

JOHANA

Surprise me.

Nina begins playing (NINA's SONG). Johana sits and listens.

Johana looks up to the sky.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

Johana walks through the forest. She stops in a small clearing and looks at a pile of rocks. One has a symbol on it. She makes a note of it in her journal.

EXT. RIVER - DAY.

Johana walks beside a river.

JOHANA

Nina?

NINA (VOICE)

Yes, doctor?

JOHANA

Could you try calling James again?

NINA (VOICE)

Certainly.

INT. HOME - DAY.

FLASHBACK

Johana throws on a coat and heads for the door. A picture of Johana and James sits on the table next to the door.

JOHANA

Hey, Nina, I'm going out for a bit. I've got an appointment with Dr. Seiken.

NINA (VOICE)

I'll lock up after you.

JOHANA

Thanks.

Johana heads out.

INT. OUTSIDE SEIKEN'S OFFICE - DAY.

Johana sits outside an office. She notices a bulletin posted to a corkboard on one of the walls. She zeros in on a peice of paper that reads "DIOLIEV SURVEY TEAM: SIGN UP NOW".

SECRETARY

Dr. Shenzra? Dr. Seiken will see you now.

INT. ACADEMY - DAY.

Johana walks into DR. SEIKEN's office. His office is strewn with the typical trappings of an academic, most of which are more than familiar to Johana. She notices that there is a beautiful stained glass artifact sitting in the window.

SEIKEN

What's brings you by this time, Jo? Need more grant money? Because I'll give it to you.

JOHANA

You can't give me grant money, Dr. Seiken.

SEIKEN

I know, but it always feels good to offer. I've actually got a staff meeting I need to run off to soon. Do you mind if we walk and talk?

CONTINUED: 15.

He gathers some papers and stands.

JOHANA

Not at all.

She gestures to the artifact.

JOHANA

Is this a new piece?

SEIKEN

Yes, it's really quite remarkable. Regardless of the subject matter, you can't deny the craftsmanship involved in its creation.

He begins to walk out. Johana follows. The following dialogue is delivered as they walk out of the office.

JOHANA

Did you hear about my brother?

SEIKEN

Ah, Jim, yes. He was a good kid. Sad to have him go.

EXT. UNIVERSITY - DAY.

Johana and Seiken exit the building. The following exchange occurs on the steps of the university.

JOHANA

Did he tell you why he was leaving?

SEIKEN

Indeed he did.

JOHANA

What do you think?

SEIKEN

Well you and I have had this conversation before. You know I've never been one to buy into the notion that all the chaos in the universe is just a series of cosmic ripples from some sort of sibling wrestling match.

JOHANA

He and I had had this conversation before too. That's the part that (MORE)

(CONTINUED)

CONTINUED: 16.

JOHANA (cont'd)

really gets me. I don't know what changed. I thought he knew better. But somehow his mind changed. And that's why I want you to put me on the Dioliev survey team.

SEIKEN

What?

JOHANA

You know I can get out there and find it. Your survey team will just go out there and dust off some old hunk of rock and say it's the discovery of the year. Let me lead the team, and I'll go out there and find her body.

SEIKEN

I'm not going to do that, Jo.

JOHANA

Why not? You know I could.

SEIKEN

That's neither here nor there. I'm not going to put an entire survey team at risk so that you can hunt down what is essentially a very academic hunch.

JOHANA

Tell me that there isn't historical evidence of those three siblings having lived on that planet.

Seiken lets her continue, knowing he won't be able to stop her until she says her piece.

JOHANA

Tell me there isn't historical evidence that, yes, they did rule there for a long time. And people in a position like that would have gotten the best burial rites available. Correct?

SEIKEN

Correct.

CONTINUED: 17.

JOHANA

So unless they actually became gods, her body is out there on that planet somewhere, frozen in a pillar of glass. Right?

SEIKEN

And we have absolutely no idea where that would be.

JOHANA

But the only reason it wouldn't be able to be found is if they were actually gods, yes?

SEIKEN

Johana.

JOHANA

Do you think she's a goddess?

SEIKEN

No.

JOHANA

So you think she's out there?

SEIKEN

Yes, I do.

JOHANA

So let me find her.

SEIKEN

Johana, I know this is a rough time for you. But you have to let James make his own choices. I don't agree with them either, but he's a grown man. And I'm not setting you loose on that planet without some firm evidence of the location of whatever burial site might be out there. I'd lose my job, and you might lose your life.

He checks the time.

SEIKEN

I really need to get going. I'm sorry I can't be of any more help right now.

CONTINUED: 18.

JOHANA

It's alright. Thanks for letting me vent.

SEIKEN

Any time.

He walks away.

INT. HOME - NIGHT.

Johana sits at her table reading a textbook about the Siblings. She gets out an empty journal and begins to write in it.

JOHANA

Hey, Nina?

NINA (VOICE)

Yes, doctor?

TOHANA

What was the name of the pilot we met at last year's conference?

NINA (VOICE)

The one from the Naval Academy?

JOHANA

Mmhmm.

NINA (VOICE)

Seargant Henry Marcius.

JOHANA

Give him a call for me would you? I want to book a flight.

NINA (VOICE)

Certainly, doctor.

SFX: Phone ringing

EXT. RIVER - DAY.

BACK TO PRESENT

SFX: Phone ringing

This phone call follows the same course of events as before.

CONTINUED: 19.

NINA (VOICE)

We can try calling him again tonight, doctor.

JOHANA

Thanks, Nina. I really appreciate having you to talk to.

NINA (VOICE)

Thank you, doctor.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

A pair of zealot trackers follow Johana's footsteps through the underbrush. The wield wicked looking blades.

EXT. NORTHERN RUINS - DAY.

Johana walks amongst ruined columns. Several bodies lay around her, various religious looking weapons protrude from the dead treasure hunters. Johana pulls out the gun given to her by Eamus. She notices a symbol on the boots and bag of one of the bodies. This symbol appears in various other places on the other bodies.

JOHANA

Nina, are you reading this?

NINA (VOICE)

Looks like this was the survey team from the academy.

Johana decends into the ruins.

INT. ANTECHAMBER - DAY.

Johana descends into the antechamber, and immediately recognizes that this is not the place she is looking for.

NINA (VOICE)

Something in this chamber is obscuring my sensors.

Various religious relics are strewn about, but this site is obviously not a tomb.

JOHANA

Let's get out of here then.

She climbs out of the antechamber.

EXT. NORTHERN RUINS - DAY.

Johana comes out of the antechamber. She makes her way through the strewn bodies of the dead to continue on into the forest.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

Johana continues through the forest just outside of the ruins. The all too familiar PING of a proximity alert rings in her ears.

NINA (VOICE)

Human signals.

Johana takes cover behind a tree and arms her gun. She peaks around the tree to see Domiel walking through the woods towards the site she was just came from. He is talking on some sort of communicator.

DOMIEL

I'm about a kilometer out from the site, any word from whoever sent the signal?

Somebody on the other side of the communicator responds.

DOMIEL

Copy. I'll let you know what I find.

Domiel continues on into the ruins. Johana moves from her cover further into the forest.

JOHANA

Nina, let's re-evaluate our route. This was a dead end.

NINA (VOICE)

Will do, Doctor.

They continue through the forest.

EXT. RIVER - DAY.

Johana hikes through the forest and comes to a river.

JOHANA

We need to get across.

Johana pulls out her journal and a map.

CONTINUED: 21.

NINA (VOICE)

I'm detecting a new signal nearby.

JOHANA

Human?

NINA (VOICE)

Yes.

JOHANA

How many?

NINA (VOICE)

Only one.

Johana draws her gun and approaches the riverbank. She sees TOVIS fishing. She approaches. The only other gun in sight is set on a rock out of Tovis' reach. She picks it up.

JOHANA

Are there even any fish in this river?

Tovis is startled and turns around. He sees that she has his qun.

JOHANA

Now I don't want any trouble. Is there a bridge anywhere nearby?

TOVIS

There's one about five miles from here.

JOHANA

Upstream or downstream?

TOVIS

Nope.

JOHANA

Nope what?

TOVIS

Give me my gun and I'll tell you.

JOHANA

I'm not an idiot.

TOVIS

Neither am I.

CONTINUED: 22.

JOHANA

What's your name?

TOVIS

Tovis.

JOHANA

Why should I trust you, Tovis?

TOVIS

Because I was just here fishing? It's quite cathartic. Why should I trust you? You're the one with the gun drawn.

Johana lowers her gun.

TOVIS

I'm a botanist. Now I am here with a someone else if you must know, but he's just my guide through this area. Can I have my gun back now?

NINA (VOICE)

Physiological readings indicate he is telling the truth.

JOHANA

Don't do anything stupid.

Johana tosses him the gun. He holsters it. She lowers her gun.

TOVIS

So what's your story?

JOHANA

I'm an archeologist.

TOVIS

Right, so you're Doctor 'what' then?

JOHANA

Shenzra. First name's Johana.

TOVIS

Nice to meet you, Dr. Shenzra. I would've preferred it at a conference or something, but I guess this will have to do.

He picks up his fishing gear.

CONTINUED: 23.

JOHANA

Where's the bridge?

TOVIS

Well, it's more of a fallen tree, but it's five miles upstream. We were actually headed that direction, but Domiel went off to check something out, so I've been waiting here.

JOHANA

Anything interesting about him?

TOVIS

I hired him to show me around this area. There's a nocturnal flower that only grows during this season, and this is the only planet it grows on. What are you here for?

JOHANA

Just investigating a rumor.

TOVIS

Just you?

JOHANA

For now.

TOVIS

Well you can come with us if you want, as long as we're traveling on the same route. We haven't seen any of those religious fanatics all the freighter pilots talk about, but there's always more strength in numbers. In case.

JOHANA

That's true.

Johana looks out at the river. Domiel calls in on the comms.

DOMIEL (VOICE)

Tovis. You there?

TOVIS

I'm here. What's the situation over there?

CONTINUED: 24.

DOMIEL (VOICE)

Looks like something hit this place hard before we got to it.

TOVIS

That's too bad.

DOMIEL (VOICE)

You still by the river?

TOVIS

Yeah.

DOMIEL (VOICE)

Night's falling soon. Head about a kilometer upstream. There's a more secure area up there that I think we should hole up in for the night. I'll send you the coordinates.

One of Tovis' bags DINGS. He pulls out an electronic map.

TOVIS

Got it. Meet you there?

DOMIEL (VOICE)

Yeah. Stay out of trouble. I don't want any unnecessary paperwork.

TOVIS

For what?

DOMIEL (VOICE)

If I have to mail your body off this planet.

Johana gives Tovis a look.

TOVIS

He jokes like that.

DOMIEL (VOICE)

You still there?

TOVIS

Yep, sorry. Will do. Over and out.

Tovis puts the comms away.

JOHANA

Seems like a charmer.

CONTINUED: 25.

TOVIS

Want to come with?

NINA (VOICE)

It couldn't hurt to go with them. He is right about strength in numbers.

EXT. NORTHERN RUINS - DAY.

Ajax and Xan looks about the ruins. Xan points to a disturbance in the dust, in the shape of Johana's footprints. The footprints lead away from the ruins and into the woods.

EXT. FOREST CAMP - NIGHT.

Tovis and Johana set up a meager camp. He cooks one of the fish over the fire.

TOVIS

So what's this mysterious fact-finding mission you're on, doc?

JOHANA

Just trying to get some historical documents.

TOVIS

Historical documents?

JOHANA

Yeah.

TOVIS

What, a novel? A map? Thousand year old tax audits?

JOHANA

Not quite sure yet. But crossing that river is the first step.

TOVIS

Well, I'm glad I could be of service on that front.

JOHANA

I guess it's pretty lucky I ran into you.

CONTINUED: 26.

TOVIS

What do you mean?

JOHANA

Well, from what I've seen so far of this place, most people here just want to kill you. And you didn't try to kill me.

TOVIS

Well, I figured it was the polite thing to do. But I don't think it was lucky. Luck isn't real.

JOHANA

I don't follow.

TOVIS

Luck isn't real.

JOHANA

Do you always get this intellectual when you first meet somebody?

TOVIS

No, but I think it's an interesting conversation starter. Why do you believe in luck?

JOHANA

I wouldn't say I 'believe' in it. That makes it sound like some kind of religion.

TOVIS

Exactly. And that's ridiculous right?

JOHANA

But I would word it differently. I think luck is a thing, like love, or happiness.

TOVIS

Okay, so if luck is some tangible thing, what power did luck have over us running into each other on this particular planet?

JOHANA

It's metaphysical. It doens't exert force.

CONTINUED: 27.

TOVIS

So then why say it's lucky we met?

JOHANA

It's a description of the situation. "It's lucky we met". It's like an adjective for the meeting.

TOVIS

Right. And that's why I say that luck, as most people see it, is not real. Luck isn't a thing, like gravity or time. It's no thing.

JOHANA

I see what you did there.

TOVIS

Yeah?

A small smile crosses Johana's face.

TOVIS

I figured this was better than the traditional kind of small talk people make the first time they meet.

JOHANA

I can't say I disagree with you.

They sit for a moment.

TOVIS

So, there sure are a lot of stars up there, huh?

JOHANA

Alright.

EXT. FOREST CAMP - DAY.

Some smoke still emanates from the ruins of the fire. Tovis is sleeping soundly. Johana wakes up to find Domiel watching over the both of them.

DOMIEL

And who might you be, miss?

Tovis stirs.

CONTINUED: 28.

JOHANA

Johana Shenzra. Are you Domiel?

DOMIEL

DOMIEL

JOHANA

I can take care of myself.

DOMIEL

I hope so.

Domiel begins to pack up his things.

DOMIEL

Now let's get moving.

Domiel leaves the camp.

JOHANA

He's even more charming in person.

TOVIS

That why I pay him the big bucks.

Tovis follows Domiel out of the camp.

JOHANA

See what you can find out about this guy, Nina. Begin with the known databases.

NINA (VOICE)

I don't imagine he'd be on any of the known databases.

Johana follows them out.

CONTINUED: 29.

JOHANA

I know.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

The three travelers move through the forest.

JOHANA

So what's this flower you're looking for, Tovis?

TOVIS

It's called the Red Star Bloom. Hasn't been found on any other planet, so the lab sent me to try to get some samples of it. Its actually pretty interesting. Historically, the natives called it the 'mind killer' because it's pollen would make the insects go crazy. They thought it was possessing the bugs' spirits.

DOMIEL

I'm glad you showed up, Johana. Now I get to hear all of this again.

TOVIS

It's interesting!

DOMIEL

Its a flower. It blooms, it wilts, it dies.

TOVIS

And it's beautiful the whole time.

DOMIEL

And what are you here for, Jo?

JOHANA

Just investigating a rumor.

DOMIEL

Got lot's of those out here. Any one in particular.

JOHANA

Yes.

CONTINUED: 30.

DOMIEL

Care to enlighten us?

JOHANA

Not particularly.

DOMIEL

Fair enough.

Domiel begins to walk a little faster.

DOMIEL

Let's pick up the pace.

Tovis speeds up to match Domiel, Johana lingers behind a bit.

JOHANA

Nina, what can you find out about this guy?

NINA (VOICE)

Not much. I would assume he keeps most of his business of the books, like that other fellow we encountered.

JOHANA

I don't like this.

TOVIS

What's that?

JOHANA

Nothing, just talking to myself.

DOMIEL

You shouldn't do that, Jo - people will think you're crazy.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

The zealot scouts have come upon the travelers' campsite.

BROTHER AJAX

The Siblings have sent us a blessing. The heretic is traveling with two others.

BROTHER XAN

Poor souls.

CONTINUED: 31.

BROTHER AJAX

We will give them a chance to recant of their heresies. But do not assume they will.

EXT. RIVER - DAY.

The travelers walk beside a river. Tovis looses his footing and one of his feet slips into the river. Domiel pulls him up.

TOVIS

Thanks.

Tovis takes the waterlogged boot off.

DOMIEL

Let me have that, boss. I've got a spare set here you can borrow.

Domiel take the boot and removes a new pair of boots from his bag. The boots have the academy's symbol on them.

JOHANA

Nina, do you see that?

NINA (VOICE)

Yes, Doctor.

TOVIS

Thanks.

DOMIEL

No problem.

Domiel catches Johana staring at him.

DOMIEL

What the matter, never seen a man this pretty?

Johana says nothing. Domiel laughs and keeps on walking.

DOMIEL

The river forks further on. I want to get there before nightfall.

Tovis has finished putting on the new boots and begins to follow Domiel.

CONTINUED: 32.

NINA (VOICE)

Doctor, I think it would be advisable to part ways with these men as soon as possible.

EXT. CAMP - NIGHT.

Tovis, Domiel, and Johana sit around a fire. Johana is writing in her journal.

DOMIEL

Whatcha got there, Jo?

JOHANA

My notes.

DOMIEL

Mind if I take a look?

JOHANA

As a matter of fact, I do.

Domiel chuckles. Johana keeps on writing. Tovis is grooming a small plant. Domiel checks his gun. There is a single shot in the magazine. He loads in a second shot.

DOMIEL

Sure I can't take just a quick peek?

Johana keeps writing. Domiel gets up and walks over to her. She closes the journal and looks up at him.

DOMIEL

What're you after?

Tovis looks up from his plant.

DOMIEL

Let me see that book.

JOHANA

No.

Johana begins to put the book back in her bag. Domiel reaches out and grabs her arm.

JOHANA

Let me go.

CONTINUED: 33.

DOMIEL

What are you looking for?

Tovis gets up.

TOVIS

What are you doing?

Johana punches Domiel in the face. He lets her go. Johana stands up. Domiel lunges at Johana but is intercepted by Tovis. Tovis and Domiel struggle for a moment before Domiel pushes Tovis away. Domiel pulls out his gun and shoots Tovis. Tovis falls to the ground as Domiel turns back to Johana and shoots her in the shoulder. She falls to the ground and leans against the log she was formerly sitting on. Domiel kneels down beside her.

DOMIEL

You sure are beautiful.

Domiel begins to rifle through her belongings. He finds her journal and begins to flip through it. Another gunshot rings out through the night. Domiel falls to the ground. Johana looses consciousness.

INT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Johana awakens, bruised and bandaged. She looks around. Eamus enters.

EAMUS

Feeling better? You were out for a long time.

Johana looks around. She notices the bandages around her shoulder.

EAMUS

Sorry I couldn't get to you sooner. I didn't know that hunter was going to go crazy like that.

JOHANA

Where are we?

EAMUS

Somewhere safe.

JOHANA

Were you following me?

CONTINUED: 34.

EAMUS

Yes. As a field test of sorts.

JOHANA

Why?

EAMUS

To see if I could trust you.

JOHANA

Excuse me?

EAMUS

I know. Not the smartest move I've ever made. I shouldn't have let you fall in with those two.

EAMUS

We can talk more about this when you're feeling better. I just wanted to make sure you were okay. I'm Eamus, by the way, Eamus Kazemede.

JOHANA

I figured.

EAMUS

What tipped you off?

JOHANA

My AI told me about you when we came to this rock. I just kind of assumed it was you. I don't imagine there's too many other reclusive hermits out here.

EAMUS

Well, now you can understand why I wanted to stay under the radar.

Johana lays back down.

EAMUS

I'll check back in in a couple hours. You'll be safe here. The zealots don't know about this place.

He leaves.

INT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Johana gets up out of bed and rummages through her bag. She finds an earpiece and puts it in.

JOHANA

Nina?

NINA (VOICE)

Yes, Doctor? I was beginning to worry about you.

JOHANA

Same here.

She looks toward the door.

JOHANA

Any signals outside?

NINA (VOICE)

Only Dr. Kazemede, but he's a mile or so outside the perimeter.

JOHANA

Let's take a walk.

EXT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Johana walks around the hideaway, taking in the beauty of the area.

JOHANA

What day is it, Nina?

NINA (VOICE)

It's the twenty-seventh day of the current solar cycle.

JOHANA

I want to try calling James again.

NINA (VOICE)

As you wish.

The phone rings, and is picked up this time.

MAN (VOICE)

Hello?

CONTINUED: 36.

JOHANA

Yes, hello, is this James Shenzra?

MAN (VOICE)

No, he's in prayer this afternoon. May I ask who's calling?

JOHANA

Um, this is his sister, Johana.

MAN (VOICE)

He should be available in another couple hours, I'll let him know that you called.

JOHANA

Thank you.

The man on the other end hangs up.

INT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Eamus comes in with some food. He sets a plate down in front of Johana.

JOHANA

This place is beautiful.

EAMUS

I found it on a scouting expedition, and moved in when I decided it wasn't safe to go off world anymore.

JOHANA

Why was that?

EAMUS

Because I found it.

Johana lets that settle in.

JOHANA

What's inside?

He begins eating.

EAMUS

I don't know.

CONTINUED: 37.

JOHANA

Excuse me?

EAMUS

What?

JOHANA

You don't know what's inside?

EAMUS

No.

JOHANA

So you've been sitting accross the discovery of the millenium and you don't actually know what's in there?

EAMUS

I couldn't open the door.

JOHANA

So break in some other way. I'm sure we could figure something out.

EAMUS

No, I'm sure the door works fine. I just couldn't bring myself to open it.

A moment of silence.

JOHANA

I don't get it.

EAMUS

Look. If I went into that tomb and there was no body inside of it, then nothing would have changed and people could go on living their lives the same way they have for thousands of years. But, if I went in there and found that woman's body, then hundreds of billions of peoples' lives would be shattered forever. An entire swath of humanity suddenly without a way of life, because of me. I was standing there at the door, and suddenly I didn't want to know what was inside.

CONTINUED: 38.

JOHANA

So what? If she's there people should know.

EAMUS

Archeology was about preserving people's culture, not destroying it.

JOHANA

Don't try and pull that. This is bigger than just some archeological expedition. This is about finding the truth.

EAMUS

Is that what you told yourself to get this far?

JOHANA

Now look, I didn't travel all this way to get a lecture from some old man in a cave. The universe needs this. If she's there I need to know.

EAMUS

Why? What good does it do if you find her?

JOHANA

Think about the people that chased me out of those ruins. They wanted to kill me. And they would have if you hadn't gotten to them first. You're telling me this is the kind of culture we need to preserve? One where people try it kill you if you disagree with them?

EAMUS

You're not just disagreeing with them. You're exhuming the woman they worship.

She gives him a look but continues eating.

EAMUS

Okay, I'll make you a deal. Take a day to think this over. If, by tomorrow, you're sure this discovery is something you want, we can talk about where the tomb is.

CONTINUED: 39.

Johana keeps eating.

EAMUS

Besides, you have to finish healing anyway. Just take some time and think this through.

EXT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Johana awakens and leaves Eamus' abode to explore the surrounding area and give some thought to his offer.

EXT. FOREST - DAY.

The two zealot trackers look at the bodies of Tovis and Domiel before heading towards Eamus' hideaway.

INT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Eamus looks through some of his old books. He pulls up old maps and texts regarding the Siblings. He looks out the window to see Johana outside.

EXT. SPRING - SAME TIME.

Johana sits by the water. Eamus walks up.

EAMUS

Lunch is about ready if you want it.

JOHANA

This place reminds me of a moon my family used to travel to. Every summer we'd go there. Everyone would always want to go to the lakes, but I would want to stay in the cities and go to the museums. That's why I became an archeologist. Figured I could get the best of the academics and the exotic locations.

Eamus sits next to her.

JOHANA

Can't even remember the last time we were there as a family. James would know.

CONTINUED: 40.

EAMUS

Who's James?

JOHANA

My brother.

EAMUS

And what does he do?

JOHANA

He joined the priesthood.

Eamus understands. He stands up again.

EAMUS

Come on. Come inside and get some food.

INT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Eamus has some food prepared on plates. An assortment of books are also on the table. A map is being used as a tablecloth. Johana and Eamus sit.

JOHANA

Thanks.

EAMUS

I think I understand now.

JOHANA

What?

He pulls out a journal of his own.

EAMUS

Here's all my notes on the tomb, including it's location. I can't handle the weight of knowing what's in there, but I think you're different. This is obviously a much more personal thing for you than it ever was for me.

She reaches for the journal. He hold it back.

EAMUS

I need you to understand the weight of this information. This could change the lives of billions of people. I need to know that that's something you're okay with.

CONTINUED: 41.

Johana nods. He hands her the journal.

EAMUS

We can leave in the morning if you'd like. I can take you as far as the perimeter of the site, but after that you're on your own.

JOHANA

Thank you.

EAMUS

I hope you know what you're getting yourself into.

JOHANA

I do.

EAMUS

Good. Now-

A sudden PING on one of Eamus' consoles breaks the conversation. Eamus gets up to check on the alert.

EAMUS

Something triggered my perimeter relays. Two signals.

Eamus grabs his gun. Voices can begin to be heard in the distance. The liturgical chants of the zealot trackers begin to fill the air.

EAMUS

We may have to move that morning departure up a bit.

EXT. EAMUS' HIDEAWAY - DAY.

Eamus and Johana emerge from the hideaway and begin their escape. The trackers spot them and give chase. Eamus is shot in the leg. He falls, Johana turns around. Eamus looks at here, and there is an understanding between them.

NINA (VOICE)

We should go, Doctor.

JOHANA

Thank you, Eamus.

She goes. The trackers approach. Eamus aims his gun.

EXT. FOREST - SAME TIME.

Johana hears a series of gunshots ring out in the forest. A dark silence falls over the forest. She waits for a moment before continuing.

JOHANA

Signals?

NINA (VOICE)

I can detect no signals in the nearby area.

Johana continues on.

EXT. TOMB - DAY.

Johana stands at the doorway to the tomb. She checks Eamus' journal to make sure she is in the right place. She reaches out a hand to touch the door, but is stopped by the RING of her phone.

NINA (VOICE)

Incoming call from James, Doctor.
Should I respond?

Johana thinks for a moment.

CUT TO BLACK.
