INT. DINING ROOM - NIGHT.

Emily is sitting at the table. John comes in and takes off his coat.

EMILY How was work?

John goes to the fridge to get a drink.

EMILY

Well, I got to go to a school today and talk to the kids about becoming a new patriot.

John is only half listening.

EMILY

I went with Hank - you know Hank, the doctor - well, anyway, part of the visit was to give all the kids their mandated checkup. Turns out one of the little tikes had leukemia. So the other kids got to see what it's like when someone fulfills their duty to their country.

JOHN Do you ever think about it wonder if it actual helps at all?

EMILY Of course it does. Why wouldn't it?

INT. DINER - DAY

John is quietly eating breakfast before his orders come in. Another Enforcer enters the diner. They acknowledge each other with a slight head nod. The other enforcer goes over to a woman seated at the bar.

> ENFORCER 1 Samantha Taylor?

> > SAMANTHA

Yes?

ENFORCER 1 Could you step outside with me for a second? Government business.

The Enforcer and Samantha step outside. John tries to focus only on his meal. A gunshot is heard outside.

INT. CAR - DAY

John is driving. The radio is on and a commercial starts playing.

RADIO PERSONALITY (VOICE) Remember, citizens, the National Public Health and Productivity Act of 2021 requires all civilians to comply with the enforcement of all public and private health violations. The success of our beautiful nation depends on the health and well being of our populace. Your sacrifice will lead our nation to glory.

INT. BEDROOM - NIGHT

John and Emily stare at the ceiling.

She thinks for a second.

EMILY

Sometimes.

Quiet.

EMILY

We making heroes out of them, John. It's not bad if you think about them every once in a while.

Silence.

EMILY Oh, I've got my checkup tomorrow, so I'll be in the city most of the day. You'll probably be on your own for dinner.

INT. ENFORCER HEADQUARTERS - DAY

John enters and heads to the front desk. He addresses the man behind the desk (MARCUS)

JOHN How's life, Marcus.

MARCUS Not too bad. Here for your paycheck I assume? JOHN Well, I certainly didn't come to see your pretty face.

Marcus gets a check out of a file and hands it to John. The familiar PING of orders emanates from Marcus' computer.

MARCUS You're in luck, Johnny. I'm forwarding you some fresh orders to go with that paycheck.

John's checks the new orders that just came to his phone.

INSERT: "DOUGLAS WAKEMAN. 1717 W. PINE ST. N/A"

JOHN Marcus, this guy's not sick. You must've sent me the wrong file.

MARCUS You're right. He's not sick, but his wife was. He tried to smuggle her out of the country instead of allowing her to fulfill her patriotic duty.
