

This year taught us to keep high spirits and emphasized the importance of organization, but above all, NEVER BACK DOWN NEVER WHAT?! (Never give up!).



I will leave you in the extremely capable hands of my favourite director (soon to be VP), Shunit, and I know she won't disappoint!


