## **Entry Information**

- All entries must be received before 5pm on the closing date of each show, and may be submitted by mail, dropping them off in person at the farm, or scanning and emailing to <a href="mailto:lnfo@OakLaneEquestrian.com">lnfo@OakLaneEquestrian.com</a>.
- Same day entries may be permitted, with applicable late fees.
- Accompanying your entry form must be proof of current negative Coggins, flu/rhino vaccination, payment, and a signed waiver.
- If submitting via email, you will receive an online link to pay your entry, which must be done within 24 hours.
- All entry fees are non-refundable after the closing date of the show. In the event of a veterinary
  emergency for the horse being shown, class fees may be refundable provided a letter from your
  veterinarian.
- Each show will be held rain or shine, show time begins at 9am.

# **Entry Fees**

- Combined Tests: \$75 per each division
- Individual Dressage Classes: \$25.00 per each class
- Individual Hunt Seat Classes: \$15.00 per class
- Late fees: \$5.00 per class. If dressage tests are requested as a late entry, they will be ridden after all scheduled riders have completed their tests.
- Office Fee: \$15.00 per horse/rider combination each weekend
- Stabling or Hauling
  - Stabling: \$25.00 per calendar day that the horse will need the stall (ex: hauling in Saturday night and staying through the end of show Sunday is 2 calendar days)
  - o Trailer Ins: \$15 per day. Applicable to all horses hauling in and working off their trailers

#### General Information and Rules

- All judge decisions are final.
- Multiple riders may ride the same horse.
- All riders must wear an ASTM/SEI approved riding helmet and boots while mounted. Schooling attire is encouraged; show jackets are not required. Braiding is optional.
- Oak Lane Equestrian reserves the right to limit entries, cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors that are not demonstrating safe riding and humane horsemanship.

- Oak Lane Equestrian also reserves the right to cancel or combine classes as each competition warrants and in the best interest of the show.
- Ride times and a show schedule will be emailed to registered competitors no later than 8pm on the Wednesday immediately preceding the show. This information will also be posted on the Oak Lane Equestrian website, <u>www.oaklaneeguestrian.com</u>
- Dressage tests may be read to riders at all levels.
- Lunch will be served at each show, with ample time allocated to a lunch break.
- Stabling will be available after 5pm on the Saturday immediately preceding the show. Please bring your own water bucket. Stalls will be prepped with basic bedding; if additional bedding is needed please plan to bring what you need. We ask that you please strip your stall on departure. Manure buckets and the spreader will be accessible to help you with this task.
- Schooling is not permitted in the show ring after 6am the morning of the show.
- Please leave your dogs or other furry friends at home, Oak Lane does not permit visiting pets aside from your equine partner.
- Smoking is prohibited in or near the barns and show grounds.

#### Division and Class Information

#### Combined Tests

- Walk Division: riders will ride in a Walk Only dressage test, to be combined with their score in a walking ground poles class; riders may not cross enter into any other divisions
- o Intro Division: appropriate for riders ready to walk trot; USDF Intro A combined with a course to trot over pole piles to be judged on equitation; riders may not cross enter into any canter classes at the show
- Green as Grass Division: appropriate for riders who are cantering on the flat; USDF Intro C combined with a course of crossrails; riders may trot or canter their course; judged on equitation
- Starter Division: USEA Starter test, plus a course up to 2'3" to be judged on equitation
- Beginner Novice Division: USEF BN Test A, plus a course of fences up to 2'7" to be judged based on equitation
- o Intro Dressage Division: combined scoring based on performance on Intro tests A, B, and C
- Training Level Dressage Division: combined scoring based on performance on Training Level Test 1, 2, and 3
- First Level Dressage Division: combined scoring based on performance on First Level Tests 1, 2, and 3

- o Beginner Equitation on the Flat
  - Walk trot canter riders who have less than 2 years showing experience
- Beginner Equitation Over Fences
  - Walk trot canter riders; may trot or canter a course of crossrails
- o Green Hunter on the Flat
  - Walk trot canter for horses in their 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year of showing experience
- o Green Hunter Over Fences
  - Walk trot canter and small crossrails for horses in their 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year of showing experience
- o Intermediate Equitation on the Flat
  - Walk trot canter riders
- Intermediate Equitation Over Fences
  - Walk trot canter riders; to canter a course of jumps up to 2' 2'3"
- Advanced Equitation on the Flat
  - Walk trot canter riders
- Advanced Equitation Over Fences
  - Walk trot canter riders: to canter a course of jumps 2'3" 2'7"
- Dressage tests will be USDF and USEF 2023-2026 tests, with the exception of the USEA Start
  division test and the USEF Beginner Novice Test A; the Walk Only test is available on the Oak Lane
  website. Western Dressage tests will be WDAA 2022 tests.
- All combined tests will be judged based on equitation for the fences component.
- Combined test scores will be the sum of the components for a total value and placed accordingly.
- Individual test scores will be ranked by class based on score.
- Ribbons placed first through sixth will be awarded for each division and each individual class at each show.
- Year-end championship awards (also first through sixth) will be distributed after the last show of the season, for riders who have participated in the same divisions in at least three of our shows.
