Public fears lessened due to revised by laws

Chandigarh : Stricter the revised rules against community and pet dogs would be enforceable after the notification is issued by the local administration Following a Supreme court mandate on aggressive breeds, feeding and sterilization points would be designated for safety point of view. Mandatory segregation of aggressive and rabid dogs along with the creation of specific, dedicated spaces fir aggressive canines, establishing earmarked feeding points for community dogs in every municipal ward, would require involvement of Residents Welfare Associations in identifying and finalising these feeding points. Stringent action would be initi-



ated against defiant individuals who create obstacles or create problems in the management and enforcement of the laws. The bylaws categorically prohibit keeping of certain aggressive breeds and any of their crossbreeds like American bulldogs, American pitbull, bull terrier, fogo Argentinini abd Rottweiler. Dog owners would be required to keep their registered dogs under control at all times to prevent intimidation, injury or biting. The sole liability to compensate the victim will remain with the dog owner.

American firms investing in India also gain access to one of the fastest- g r o w i n g consumer markets in the world, while Indian companies have invested billions of dollars here in America, helping to create new jobs and opportunities in the communities we represent, they said. "This Indiscriminate tariff escalation jeopardises these ties, raising costs for American f a m i l i e s , undermining the ability of A m e r i c a n Companies to compete globally, and undercutting ground-breaking innovation and co-operation," the letter argued. The letter also underlined that India has become a vital partner in defence c o - o p e r a t i o n conducting joint military exercises with US forces and working constructively with the US and its allies to secure vital maritime routes.

Sans registered sale deed, property title can't be transferred : Court

CHANDIGARH : The counsel submitted that declaration of title cannot be made on the basis of an agreement to sell and will, as it is against the public policy submitted the counsel in a property sale deed case.



A district court has dismissed a suit of declaration for transfer of the title of a property based on an agreement to sell and will executed by the owner. The court dismissed the suit filed by Kailash Garg, a local resident. In the suit, Garg said the house was allotted to late Atul Gupta by the Chandigarh Housing Board. Gupta had deposited all charges of the house with regard to its allotment and a possession letter was issued to him. Garg said he was known to Gupta and was taking care of him in his last days. He had purchased the dwelling unit from Gupta vide an agreement to sell/sale in November 2016 for Rs 60 lakh. After receiving the amount,

Gupta executed a will in favour of him, which was registered with the Sub Registrar, Sector 17, Chandigarh, on November 8, 2016. As such, he was having full right over the property, claimed Garg. He argued that the plaintiffs had approached the Chandigarh Housing Board to get the property transferred in their names, but the authorities refused to do so. Vikas Jain, counsel for the Housing Board, said the suit was not maintainable. He submitted that the dwelling unit was allotted to Gupta vide allotment letter September 17, 2009. The physical possession of the dwelling unit was issued vide letter dated March

16, 2010, and no dues certificate (NDC) was issued on December 9, 2015. After hearing the arguments, the court said the matter contained a question of law with regard to the maintainability of this suit on the basis of a mere agreement to sell and a will executed on the same day. The court said once the agreement to sell was executed showing the payment of the full consideration amount, what was the need to execute a will. It shows that the intention was to avoid the payment of the stamp duty/tax, which is chargeable on the transfer of the property. Clearly, the case is covered under "Suraj Lamp" case as decided by the apex court. The court said in view of this, it is of the considered opinion that the present suit is not maintainable, so far as the declaration of title is concerned.

Make use of Ambala Cantt airport for flight operations while Chandigarh airport goes for repair work : Vij

AMBALA : "The Chandigarh airport is to be closed for a few days due to repair works, and it will cause inconvenience to the passengers as there is no other airport from Delhi to Amritsar which can be used in this situation, said Anil Vij, Cabinet Minister.



Even as the inauguration of the domestic airport in Ambala Cantonment remains pending, Anil Vij has urged the Union Civil Aviation Minister to explore the possibility of shifting flight operations from Chandigarh Airport to Ambala for the convenience of passengers. According to officials, Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport, Chandigarh, will remain closed for flight operations from October 26 (1 am) to November 7 (11.59 pm) due

Strict firecrackers curbed by Mohali admn, imposes prohibition on E-commerce portals

MOHALI : Under Section 163 of the BNNS, restricting the use, sale and storage of fireworks in Mohali district during upcoming festivals including Diwali, Guru Nanak Dev Ji's Parkash Purab, Christmas and New Year celebrations the Mohali administration has issued prohibitory orders.



The permissible time for bursting fire crackers in Mohali district on Diwali is from 8pm to 10pm; Guru Nanak Dev Ji's Parkash Purab (November 5) is from 4am to 5am and 9pm to 10pm; Christmas (December 25 and 26): from 11.55pm to 12.30am; New Year's Eve (December 31, 2025 – January 1, 2026): from 11.55 pm to 12.30 am. The orders have been issued in compliance with the directions of the Department of Science, Technology & Environment (STE Branch), Government of Punjab, vide instructions dated September 18.

District Magistrate Komal Mittal said, "The manufacture, stocking, distribution, sale and use of series/chain fireworks (laris) is strictly prohibited throughout the state. Only green crackers, which do not contain barium salts, antimony, lithium, mercury, arsenic, lead, or strontium chromate, will be permitted for sale and use. Only licensed traders are authorised to sell approved green crackers. E-commerce websites including Flipkart, Amazon, etc., are prohibited from accepting or fulfilling online orders for sale of firecrackers within the jurisdiction of

Mohali. The Police Department and Pollution Control Department shall ensure strict compliance with these directives. The Punjab Pollution Control Board will conduct short-term ambient air quality monitoring in selected towns of the district as per the guidelines of the Central Pollution Control Board. Additional caution will be exercised in non-attainment cities considering their ambient air quality levels. All actions will be in compliance with the directions of the Supreme Court of India and the National Green Tribunal (NGT). The prohibitory orders further read that any violation of these directions shall invite immediate penal action under Section 15 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, besides action under relevant provisions of BNNS and other applicable laws. The orders shall remain in force from October 1, 2025, to January 2, 2026.

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“Modi agreed to stop buying Russian oil”, claims Trump

NEW DELHI : There was no phone call and that India's energy policy was driven solely by national interests emphasised Randhir Jaiswal, spokesperson of Ministry of External Affairs. India on Thursday rejected US President Donald Trump's claim that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had assured him New Delhi would stop buying oil from Russia, “I am not aware of any phone call between Prime Minister Modi and President Trump yesterday,” dismissed Randhir Jaiswal, the remark of Trump. The clarification came hours after Trump, speaking from the Oval Office, told reporters: “He is (Narendra Modi) a friend of mine. We have a great relationship. I was not happy that India was buying oil from Russia



and he assured me today they will not be buying oil. That's a big stop. The claim triggered diplomatic and political ripples in both capitals, already tense after Washington's recent move to double tariffs on Indian goods to 50 per cent and impose an additional 25 per cent levy on imports linked to India's purchase of Russian crude. New Delhi had called the US action “unfair, unjustified and unreasonable”. Rejecting any suggestion that India was reconsidering its Russian oil imports under US pressure, the MEA reiterated that the country's energy policy

was guided by the need to protect Indian consumers from global price shocks. “India is a significant importer of oil and gas. It has been our consistent priority to safeguard the interests of the Indian consumer in a volatile energy scenario. Ensuring stable prices and secure supplies are the twin goals of our energy policy. This includes broad-basing our energy sourcing and diversifying as appropriate to meet market conditions,” Jaiswal said. According to government sources, India was not cutting off crude oil purchases from Russia. They said discussions with Washington on energy cooperation were “stand-alone and unrelated” to India's procurement from Moscow.

MUMBAI : A 72-year-old businessman in Mumbai has allegedly been duped of a staggering Rs 58 crore in a 'digital arrest' scam orchestrated by fraudsters posing as ED and CBI officials, police said on Thursday. The Rs 58 crore loss could be one of the largest reported in a 'digital arrest' cyber fraud case involving an individual, an official said. The Maharashtra cyber department, which is conducting a probe into the case, has arrested three men, he said. 'Digital arrest' is a growing form of cyber-crime in which fraudsters pose as law enforcement officials or personnel of government agencies and intimidate victims through audio/video calls. They hold the victims hostage and put pressure on them to pay money. In the latest case, the fraudsters, posing as personnel of the Enforcement Directorate and the Central Bureau of Investigation, contacted the businessman between



August 19 and October 8 and claimed his name had cropped up in a case of money-laundering. The businessman got scared as they placed him and his wife under "digital arrest" after making a video call to him, the official said. The fraudsters asked him to deposit money into the bank accounts specified by them. The victim transferred Rs 58 crore through RTGS in multiple bank accounts within a span of about two months, the official said. He later realised that he had been cheated and approached the cyber police with a complaint. The cyber sleuths registered a case last week under relevant provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and the Information Technology Act.

Tougher new English language tests for visa to UK



life,” said UK Home Secretary Shabana Mahmood. “If you come to this country, you must learn our language and play your part,” she said. Laid out as part of a written ministerial statement (WMS) in the House of Commons this week, the measures form part of the British government's ‘Immigration White Paper’ from May, designed to tighten the visa regime. Among the other changes in law, the time for international students to find a graduate-level job after completing their studies under the Graduate Route visa, popular among Indian students, will be cut to 18 months from the current two years from January 1, 2027. However,

PhD-level graduates will continue to be eligible for three years of permission as part of an announcement made earlier this year. “This change is informed by data showing that too many graduates are not progressing into graduate-level employment, which the Graduate Route was created to facilitate access to. It is intended to ensure that those who remain in the UK transition into graduate-level jobs and properly contribute to the UK economy,” reads the parliamentary statement from Home Office Minister Mike Tapp. Finance requirements for student visas will also be increased for the 2025-2026 academic year, meaning foreign students will have to demonstrate they have sufficient funds to support themselves. The current requirement of having maintenance funds of 1,483 pounds per month will be raised to 1,529 pounds for London and to 1,171 pounds per month (up from 1,136 pounds) for the rest of the UK.

2,191 food adulteration cases were penalised Rs 3.04 crore in 5 yrs : AAP

CHANDIGARH : In the adulteration of Milk and Diary products Punjab govt had apprised that Punjab and Haryana High Court that it imposed penalties totalling Rs 3.04 crore in 2,191 cases decided between January 2019 and December 2024. The data was placed on record through an affidavit filed by Under Secretary Ram Ishwar, Department of Health and Family Welfare, in compliance with the high court's July 22 direction to both Punjab and Haryana to submit details of penalties imposed in such cases over the last five years. The case has its genesis in a public interest



litigation filed by advocate Sunaina on adulteration in milk and milk products across the State. The affidavit said penalties were imposed in about 95 per cent of the decided cases. The adulteration recorded in a affidavit showed in a wide spectrum of food items, ranging from cow and buffalo milk, curd, paneer, khoya, desi ghee and butter to milk-based sweets such as burfi, rasgullas and milk cake, besides products like biscuits, namkeen, ice

cream, haldi powder, red chilli powder, rose squash and edible oils. The PIL seeks court directions for the establishment of additional food-testing laboratories, extensive public awareness campaigns, and harsher penalties for repeat offenders. It also presses for strict enforcement of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, arguing that adulteration of milk and dairy products directly violates the right to health under Article 21 of the Constitution.

Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

GURUGRAM : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city. The authority has drafted a ‘net zero 2050’ document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being



added into the atmosphere. The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

7,000 km high-speed rail corridors would be built by 2047: Vaishnaw

NEW DELHI : High-speed routes, designed for maximum speeds of up to 350 km per hour and an operating speed of 320 km per hour, will mark a transformative leap in India's rail infrastructure, said the Union railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw while inaugurating the 16th International Railway Equipment Exhibition (IREE), 2025, at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi. Unveiling an ambitious roadmap for the Railways, on Wednesday announced that the government plans to build 7,000 km of dedicated passenger corridors by 2047 under the Viksit Bharat vision. Vaishnaw said the proposed corridors would be powered by indigenously developed signaling systems and modern operations control centres, ensuring both speed and safety. He also outlined the



government's futuristic vision for Vande Bharat 4.0, Amrit Bharat 4.0, and next-generation railway manufacturing standards. Highlighting the success of the Vande Bharat series, he said the third-generation train already meets global parameters, with acceleration from 0 to 100 kmph in just 52 seconds, faster than many trains in Japan and Europe, while maintaining low noise and vibration levels. “Vande Bharat 4.0 will be a new benchmark in performance and passenger experience,” said Vaishnaw, adding that the upcoming model will focus on superior

seats, enhanced toilets, and refined workmanship. Discussing the Amrit Bharat series, the minister said the 2.0 version is already operational and the 3.0 model, based on push-pull technology, is being developed for long-distance routes. The 4.0 version, he added, will bring in new-generation trainsets and locomotives, expected to be ready for testing within 36 months. Vaishnaw credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership for what he termed “a decade of modernisation,” noting that more than 35,000 km of new rail lines have been laid and 46,000 km of electrification completed in the past 11 years. “Our budget allocation for the Railways has consistently risen, reflecting the government's commitment to a modern, self-reliant network,” he said.



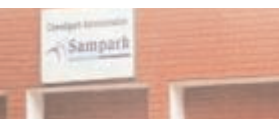
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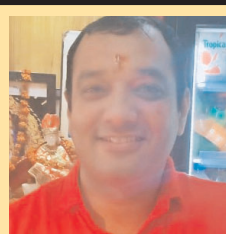

MOHALI : For the sale of fire crackers , a draw was held in the corridors of the district administration to issue 44 temporary licences. In order to ensure total transparency , the total proceedings were videographed. Only 13 designated sites were approved for crackers sale Barring these locations, no other site would be accepted for selling the crackers on Oct 18,19, and 20 and on Nov 5(Gurpurab) between 10 am to 07.30pm. The draw was conducted in the presence of Deputy Commissioner Komal Mittal, SDM DamanDeep Kaur,ADC Geetika Singh , and Tehsildar Kharar Gurbinder Kaur. Only 20 % of the numbers of licences issued in 2016 we're permitted this year. Out of 1200 applicants received, 1180 were found valid. Of these 44 applicants were allotted temporary licenses -- 18 for Mohali. and Banur., 8 for Kharar, Kuarali and Nayag Gaon. Six were allotted for Dera Bassi. For Lalru and Zirakpur only 12 applicants were granted licenses, matching the quota, no draw was required to be held.

Chandigarh : The initiative identified the financial realities of the lower and middle income groups in the university system and would ease the burden over employees striving to educate their children, said, Honey Thakur, President Punjab University staff Association (non teaching). The tuition fee concession for class B and C employees and their wards studying in self financed courses would . A committee has cleared the proposal and has placed before the board of finance. The existing 25% concession would remain unchanged for class A employees, class B and their wards will be entitled to a 35% concession and class C employees and their wards to a 50 % concession. The revised policy is intended to provide greater relief to workers from lower income groups.

Former Prime Minister Seikh Hasina issued with arrest warrant

Dhaka : The tribunal in Bangla Desh has accepted the charges filed by the prosecution to arrest the former prime minister Seikh Hasina. Seikh Hasina, 78, faces multiple cases after being ousted last year following mass student led agitation in the country. Major General Tarique Ahmad Siddique and 26 other, in two separate case filed over alleged " enforced disappearance during the "awami league" tenure. One case pertains to abduction of opposition activists and their torture at the Taskforce Interrogation Cell sustained by the Rapid Action Battalion, other relates to detentions and torture at the Directorate General of Forces intelligence's Joint Interrogation Cell.

Highly polluted rivers of Punjab augment in 4 years : CPCB

New Delhi : The data released by Central Pollution Control Board has unfolded a worsening situation aggravating in Punjab despite a national decrease in polluted river stretches which fell from 351 to 31 across the country between 2018 and 2022. The state's most polluted stretch -- the Satluj from Ropar to Harike saw its biochemical oxygen demand concentration ascent from 108 mg/ L to 120mg/ L. The total number of polluted river stretches across water bodies in Punjab rose from four in 2018 to five in 2022.The state, Punjab in 2018 had 4 polluted river stretches By 2022 the number had augmented to 5, with 3 now falling into priority no 1. The Satluj , a lifeline for the region, a non complying with the primary water quality criteria for out door bathing at 10 out of 12 monitoring location between upstream of Ludhiana and Harike based on 2024 data. The River Rejuvenation



Committee has prepared a comprehensive action plan to restore the polluted river stretches into a commensurate stage for bathing amenity, has been confirmed by Central Pollution Control Board. The comprehensive plan would include cleansing of utilisation of treating waste, municipal sewage waste, industrial pollution control, waste management, river catchment/ basin management, adoption of good irrigation practice, ground water recharge aspects, flood plain zone protection and it's management. The review by the State level committee, and central monitoring committee administered by Secretary, of Jal Shakti Ministry of the Union Government, would be able to determine the success of River Rejuvenation Committee.

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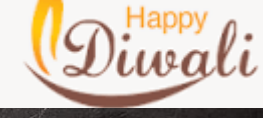
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
