Sundra(DeraBassi): One can conveniently reminisce, any entrepreneur once, for launching one's project, had to struggle for procuring three (3) consents from the regional pollution control centre, located at Mohali. It had been, indeed for the good health of the respective industrial unit and its durable life. There had followed systematic series of neg-

lect and apparent violations of the environmental law in place. Had there been proper periodical maintenance and checks, there could 't have been so many disasters, penalties with regard to industrial operations. Subsequent periodical consents as necessitated were not procured from the local pollution control authorities for longevity of the industrial efficiency and outputs their of . Over exploitation of

ground water resulted in rising contamination from geological sources , causing toxic elements including the perpetuity of uranium. At Sundra village, one farmer Karnail Singh narrates his woeful tale on depleting ground water and barricading his village by industrial units. None other than the spate of Akums Life Sciences, Aqua Fiber Ltd have victimised the gullible farmers of their fine assets, like



resources green postures , air and water. "The villager fellowmen kept watching patiently, the unchecked depleting trends of water, as well the dissemination process of carbon smoke. The untreated effluents of

The consequences, nevertheless witnessed depletion of ground water beyond 500 feet, bemoaned the Karnail Singh of Sundra village . men for their irresponsible and unchecked discharge of effluents, water mismanagement, leakages of sewage lines, radio active waste and oil leak spills. Water pollution has persistently been contributing its wrath in germinating and compounding the cases of dreadful cancer and other multiple diseases. The birth of infants with abnormalities have been noticed mainly due to water bacterial viruses.

Repeated violations of environmental norms may today also be witnessed through open discharge of carbon smoke, untreated effluents, despite explicit warning to M/S Akums Life Sciences, nevertheless ,the unit continued transgressing the environmental laws under the cognizance of pollution control sleuths. Recently, on 25 July 2024 in Parliament, the grave issue of fast water depletion was reported

as 70 % well registered dip beyond 4 meters were comingup. The concern of parliamentarians was brainstorming as the acceleration of depletion is threatening, from 50 ft to 500 ft, how would it be recovered / compensated against the loss.? Excessive extraction of ground water has only ensured considerable depletion of crucial water resource nothing else to ponder over but to explore the remedy.

Chandigarh: All three new criminal laws came into effect on July 1, 2024, while numerous cases at various police stations across the city were still pending, filed under the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The police have now said that these cases will be reviewed according to the new legislation. Enforcement actions and justice delivery for victims and complainants will be aligned with the updated laws.



All police personnel, from constables to SSPs, are committed to effectively implementing these laws, with significant support from the NIC. The UT Director General explained that all police procedures, including investigations, CFSL report procurement, charge sheet filing, witness summons, and e-testimonies, will now operate under these three new laws, underscored Surendera Singh Yadav ,the Director General of Police, UT. This new framework establishes specific timeframes for resolving cases of all magnitudes, addressing the previous issue of prolonged court pendency. SSP Kanwardeep Kaur said that the new laws allow trial proceedings to continue even if the accused becomes a proclaimed offender (PO), unlike the previous system.

Artificial Intelligence model gains copyright registration of Govt of India

Chandigarh: In order to identify difference between forged and real signatures , researchers have developed an artificial intelligence model.A copyright has already been granted by the Govt of India. The AI model has been developed by Prof Kewal Krishan and his accompanying team Rakesh Meena, Damini Siwan, Peehul Krishan, Ankita Guleria, Nandini Chitara Ritika Verma , Akansha Tana and A y u s h i Srivastva.Professor Abhik Ghosh and Dr Vishal Sharma too guided the scholars in creating this model. Rakesh Meena is work-



ing on signature verification for his PhD research and would be utilising this model. This model is based on on SVM, a supervised machine learning algorithm which distinguishes the real and forged signatures on practical situation. The innovative model has received an accuracy of 90 % in classifying the real and forged signatures on 1400 handwritten signatures (700 real

700 forged) The AI model is unique and may be utilised and may be utilised in forensic examinations and criminal investigation where the signature forgery is involved. There is a direct utility of the model in identifying signatures on forms, cheques, drafts,treasury documents and registration of property and other bank documents.

Rahul Gandhi is a 'traitor of the highest order', says BJP

Congress writes to Lok Sabha Speaker about 'defamatory' comments that 'not only tarnishes the image of the esteemed Parliament, but also insults the dignity of a high constitutional office'.

New Delhi : The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Thursday (December 5, 2024) alleged that a triad of a George Soros-linked foundation, a global news portal, and senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi were part of a conspiracy to destabilise India, and accused Mr. Gandhi of being a "traitor of the highest order". BJP MPs Sambit Patra and K. Laxman, in a press conference cited a report by French newspaper Mediapart as it targeted Mr. Gandhi. Mr. Patra alleged that George Soros's Organised



Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP). Mr. Gandhi ("a traitor of the highest order"), and Mediapart were three sides to a "dangerous triangle". Termining the statements by Mr. Patra defamatory, the Congress's whip in the Lok Sabha, Manickam Tagore, wrote to Speaker Om Birla,

stating that during the press conference, the BJP MP had "used highly slanderous language against the Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha". "Such behaviour not only tarnishes the image of the esteemed Parliament, but also insults the dignity of a high constitutional office. As a custodian of the Parliament, I urge you to take immediate and stringent action against Shri Sambit Patra...", the letter said. Mr. Patra earlier said that according to the report in Mediapart, a major portion of the funding for the OCCRP, which currently has 50 major media partners across six continents, came from the Open Society Foundation associated with Mr. Soros, while many U.S.-based bodies and government agencies also funded it.

Control of Waqf Board over unclaimed property

Waqfs are not universal to all Islamic countries. Libya, Egypt, Sudan, Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, Tunisia and Iraq do not have them. The history of waqf is traced back to the Ottoman Empire. Thus, the Islamic countries that fell under this empire have waqf in some form or the other. Waqf in India goes back to the period of the Sultanate, to the reign of Sultan Muizzuddin Sam Ghaor in the late 12th century. He dedicated two villages for the upkeep of the Jama Masjid of Multan. With the consolidation of the Muslim rulers in India, waqfs and properties under them expanded. The glaring politics behind the thin veil of noble intentions of redressing 'the issues and challenges in regulating and managing Waqf properties', as the government's statement on the issue, is evident from the recent events. Originating from the Arabic word 'waqafa', meaning to detain, hold or tie up, waqf is the permanent pledge by a Muslim person of his property, movable or immovable, for a pious, religious or charitable purpose under the Islamic law. Once pledged, such a property can neither be sold nor donated or used for any other purpose. Allah being an inchoate and ethereal entity, a 'waqif' creating a

waqf for the benefit of the people appoints a 'mutawalli' for the management of the waqf. Once the waqif transfers the property to Allah, it becomes irrevocable. During the British rule, a dispute over a waqf property in the late 19th century landed in the Privy Council. The Bench of four British judges declared the waqf invalid, describing it as 'a perpetuity of the worst kind.' However, that decision was not accepted in India. The Mussalman Waqf Validating Act, 1913, retained the institution and the waqfs continued after Independence. An amendment in 2013 made the management more efficient and transparent. The Waqf Repeal Bill, 2022, and amendment to the Waqf Act, 1995, tabled in the Rajya Sabha on December 8, 2023 are efforts towards doing away with the waqfs or neutralising their roles in the ownership and management of such large chunks of land and property. 1. The Waqf Bill, which is currently with the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC), has the following four main features: 2. The Bill changes the composition of the Central Waqf Council and waqf boards to include non-Muslim members. 3. The survey commissioner has been replaced by the

collector, granting him powers to conduct surveys of waqf properties. 4. Government property identified as waqf will cease to be waqf. The collector will determine the ownership of such properties. 5. The finality of the tribunal's decisions has been revoked. The Bill provides for direct appeal to the high court. The stress on including non-Muslim members conveys the impression that these bodies, with such rich assets, are prone to misusing the resources. The inclusion of different sections of Muslims, women in particular, would certainly create a representative set-up and is desirable. The phrase 'government property identified as waqf' creates an impression that the waqfs are prone to encroachment of public land. If there are individual cases of such impingements, they must be checked. But to put it in a legal instrument demonises an institution linked to a community which has been under pressure for over a decade. The JPC has not been able to finalise the Waqf Bill for obvious reasons. While the objections of the opposition MPs are not known, the reason why it faced rough weather can be surmised.

15 clubs served noticed for violating noise pollution rules

CHANDIGARH : Nine repeat offenders, besides six have again been served show-cause notice for violating noise pollution norms by the Excise and Taxation Department. The UT police had requested action against these establishments recently. Maintain 4.9% GDP for FY 25, 26 pleads Confederation of Indian Industry

CHANDIGARH : "The balance between fiscal deficit and fiscal support for growth has been vital in ensuring macroeconomic stability and building resilience amidst global economic uncertainty." said Chandrajit Banerjee, the Director General of CII. Mr Banerjee emphasised the importance of prudent fiscal management for macroeconomic stability, which has been crucial for India's rapid growth despite a slowing global economy. The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) has recommended to the government maintain its fiscal deficit target at 4.9 per cent of GDP for FY 2025 and set a target of 4.5 per cent for FY 2026. CII said overly ambitious targets beyond these levels could have a negative impact on economic growth. CII also welcomed the Union Budget 2024-25's commitment to keeping the fiscal deficit at levels that would help reduce the debt-to-GDP ratio. For the medium term (by 2030-31), CII proposed a glide path that would bring the Central Government's debt



to below 50 per cent of GDP and to below 40 per cent in the long term. Achieving these targets, CII believes, would positively impact India's sovereign credit rating and help lower interest rates across the economy. To support long-term fiscal planning, CII recommended the introduction of Fiscal Stability Reporting. This could involve issuing annual reports on fiscal risks under different stress scenarios, along with a long-term outlook for fiscal stability. Such an initiative would help forecast potential economic challenges and opportunities, assessing their impact on the fiscal path. Many countries, including Brazil (10 years) and the UK (50 years), have adopted similar forward-looking fiscal planning measures.

panchayat polls, which were held through ballot paper, the urban civic polls will be held using EVMs. The five MCs that go to the polls are Amritsar, Jalandhar, Phagwara, Ludhiana and Patiala. With this, the model code of conduct has been imposed in the state. The expenditure limit for candidates contesting the polls has been fixed. For municipal corporations, the expenditure limit is Rs 4 lakh and for municipal Council it is between Rs 2 lakh and Rs 3.6 lakh, said Chaudhari. It is equally important for the ruling Aam Aadmi Party, which is contesting the polls under its new state president Aman Arora. The Congress, which draws its strength from

urban voters, too, is expected to go all out to woo voters and try and retain its majority in the urban civic bodies, while the BJP will be testing the success of its urban voter outreach. The result of these polls, which unlike the panchayat election, will be contested on the party symbols, will prove who the urban voters see as their political leaders. A total of 1,609 polling locations and 3,717 polling booths have been identified by the State Election Commission. Of these, 344 are declared hypersensitive and 665 sensitive polling locations. As many as 20,486 personnel of Punjab Police and Home Guard jawans will be deployed for these elections besides 500 patrolling parties and 283 Striking Reserves. The total voters who will exercise their franchise in these polls is 37.32 lakh.

notification, there was a provision for 20 per cent annual hike, which should be around Rs 8.81 per sq m today. On an average, a Residents Welfare Association gets Rs 6,000 to 15,000 per month for the maintenance of a small park. For POSH Act to political parties approach Election Commission, SC directs petitioner

NEW DELHI : One PIL urged the Supreme Court to hold political parties accountable for preventing and addressing sexual harassment and ensure a safe and inclusive work environment for women in political parties. The Apex Court on Monday refused to entertain the PIL seeking directions to apply the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013 (POSH Act) to political parties and asked the petitioner to first approach the Election Commission on the issue. "The petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to approach the competent authority (EC). In case the petitioner's grievance is not effectively addressed, she shall be at liberty to approach a judicial forum in accordance with law," a Bench led by Justice Surya Kant told senior counsel Shobha Gupta, who represented petitioner Yogamaya MG. The direction came after Gupta told the Bench that political parties were registered entities as per Section 29A of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951 and recognised by the Election Commission.

The Bench also pointed out that the Kerala High Court had held that POSH Act was not applicable to political parties and that the said judgment has not been challenged. Initially, the Bench said the Election Commission needed to be made a party to the PIL as it was the competent authority with respect to political parties but later asked the petitioner to approach the poll panel first and then come back to the court depending on the EC's response. Making the Centre, BJP, Congress, AAP, TMC, NCP, NPP, BSP, CPI(M) and CPI parties to the PIL, the petitioner sought a grievance redressal mechanism for enforcement of the Act. Making the POSH Act applicable to political parties would create varied levels of protection and support for victims of sexual harassment, the PIL contended.

Naxalism will be wiped out from country by March 2026: Amit Shah

devouring funds meant for poor and tribals, he said the BJP once voted to power will put all corrupt Jharkhand leaders behind the bars. "NDA will win 52 seats out of 81 in Jharkhand given people cast 47 per cent votes to the alliance in Jharkhand during the recent Lok Sabha elections," Shah said. He said the people of Jharkhand gave nine out of 14 parliamentary seats to the NDA, with a total of 80 lakh votes cast in favour of the alliance. Elections to the 81-member Assembly in the state are set to take place in two phases on November 13 and 20, with the votes to be counted on November 23.

UGC to announce revised norms on CUET-UG, PG for 2025

NEW DELHI : The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate courses is set to undergo several changes in the 2025 edition following a review by an expert panel, according to UGC Chairman Jagadesh Kumar. The University Grants Commission (UGC) had constituted an expert committee to review the conduct of CUET-UG and PG. "Based on feedback from past years, it is also essential to continuously improve the examination process to provide a better, more efficient and conducive environment for students taking CUET. In this spirit, the UGC has constituted an expert committee to review the conduct of CUET-UG and CUET-PG for 2025," said Kumar. "The committee has examined various aspects of

the test, such as its structure, number of papers, duration of test papers, syllabus alignment and operational logistics. The commission considered these recommendations in a recent meeting," he added. The UGC chief informed that the commission will soon release a draft proposal detailing the revised guidelines for conducting CUET-UG and CUET-PG 2025, inviting feedback and suggestions from students, parents teachers and institutions. In the first edition of the exam in 2022, CUET-UG was plagued by technical glitches. Also, as a result of tests for a subject being conducted over multiple shifts, the scores had to be normalised during the announcement of results. The exam was conducted in hybrid mode for the first time in 2024. It was cancelled across Delhi a night before it was to be held citing logistical reasons.

Entry of heavy vehicles banned in urban areas from 8am to 8pm

Such a situation leads to long traffic jam and sometimes cause law and order problems, it adds.

Rs 6.67 cr residential school for specially abled inaugurated by CM

SHIMLA : The government was planning to introduce a comprehensive scheme for specially abled children in the Budget for 2025-26. He inaugurated the first residential school for specially abled children constructed at a cost of Rs 6.67 crore at Hiranagar in Shimla district, said Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. He said, "In the next Budget, we are planning to formulate a new scheme in consultation with the teachers to address the needs of specially abled children." He added that the Hiranagar school was one of a kind in Himachal Pradesh that was providing free quality education along with vocational training and free accommodation facilities to the students. "The government is constructing Mukhyamantri Adarsh Gram Sukh Aashray complexes at



Sundernagar (Mandi) and Luthan (Kangra) at a cost of Rs 92.33 crore each with a residential capacity of 400 individuals," he claimed. The school caters to children aged six to 18 years and would offer state-of-the-art facilities to them. Sukhu said that the school comprised 16 modern classrooms, including a computer lab, music room and a multipurpose hall. The hostel block could accommodate 50 children and comprised a medical room as well as residential quarters for staff. He said, "Himachal is the first state to legislate for the care and education of destitute children. Under the Mukhyamantri Sukh Aashray Yojana, the

government has adopted them as 'children of the state' and is bearing not only their educational expenses but also providing them with Rs 4,000 monthly pocket money." Over the past two years, the government had extended financial benefits to the tune of Rs 38.50 crore under the scheme, he added. The Chief Minister said that the state government had launched the Mukhyamantri Sukh Aashray Yojana in its first Budget while in the second budget, provisions were made to bear the educational expenses of 23,000 children of widows. Sukhu said that the government was focusing on the social security of weaker sections and a centre of excellence was being set up at Kandaghat in Solan district to provide higher education opportunities to 9,000 specially abled children. The centre was expected to be ready within two years, he added.
