Attempts to usurp land beside VIP road, in connivance with judiciary

Chandigarh/Zirakpur: At DaryaGanj New Delhi based Guru Nanak Vidya Bhandar Trust had moved Punjab and Haryana high court against an attempt to grab eight acres of their prime land adjacent VIP Road in Zirakpur

The honourable high court has ordered a probe by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) into the alleged attempt of grabbing eight acres land located beside VIP Road in Zirakpur.

The petitioner Trust, Daryaganj, had moved the high court in February, seeking transfer of the probe to CBI. The bench of Justice Pankaj Jain directed the high court registry to send the case file to the administrative judge for "information and necessary action" about a Bathinda judicial officer, Navreet Kaur.

In a report submitted by Mohali SSP Sandeep Kumar Garg on August 18, it was conveyed to the court that the cancellation report in the First Information Report (FIR) has been approved. Yet, on October 18, a new status report was submitted by SSP, and it took a significant change in direction. The report stated



that chargesheets had been filed against four individuals on October 16, and the involvement of others is currently under investigation.

The court noted that the inconsistent stance taken by the investigating agency does not reflect positively on the situation, particularly when the case is still under consideration by the high court. The court stressed that this matter should not be treated lightly, especially considering how the legal process has been misused. This indicates that the offense is not ordinary,

and the individuals involved should not be underestimated.

As a result, the court instructed the CBI to investigate the FIR and complete the process within six months. Regarding the role of the judicial officer, it was alleged that a lawyer from Bathinda, Vikas Kumar, involved in the dispute in Mohali, covertly moved the legal proceedings to Bathinda. There, the case was heard by judicial officer Navreet Kaur, who issued orders in an unrelated case. These orders included requests for the trust's records and the examination of certain witnesses, seemingly as a means to exert pressure on the complainants associated with the trust.

The High Court, asked the judicial officer for an explanation. However, the officer could not provide a satisfactory explanation regarding the "relevance of evidence, such as the trust's records," in the case being handled in Bathinda. This observation was made by the bench in its order and the role of investigating officers has gone under lens due to the suspicious nature of handling the case in favour of the accused.

ED would arrest Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal

NEW DELHI: Amid ongoing war of words over Enforcement Directorate's (ED) summons to Arvind Kejriwal in connection with excise policy case, AAP leader and minister Atishi on Tuesday alleged that the central agency will arrest Delhi chief minister when he appears before them, because Prime Minister Narendra Modi fears him. Kejriwal has been issued summons to appear before the ED for questioning in a money laundering case linked to the alleged excise policy scam. The agency will record his statement once he deposes before the investigating officer of the case in Delhi. "We are getting information that when Arvind Kejriwal appears



before ED on November 2, ED will arrest and put him in jail," claimed Atishi. Stating that Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the PM want to finish AAP, Atishi said, "Arvind Kejriwal will be arrested not because there is any case against him, it is because the PM fears him. BJP and PM Modi know that they cannot defeat AAP in polls. Now to finish AAP, its leaders are being put in jail. Putting all the big leaders of the Aam Aadmi Party behind bars means only one thing that they (BJP) to finish

AAP." For the first time that Kejriwal has been summoned by the ED. He was questioned by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in the case in April. Meanwhile, AAP leader Saurabh Bharadwaj said that party leaders and workers are not afraid of going to jail. "It is clear that the Central government wants to finish the Aam Aadmi Party. Now, they want to put Arvind Kejriwal in jail." In a related development, the Supreme Court on Monday rejected two separate bail pleas of Sisodia in corruption and money-laundering cases related to the alleged Delhi excise policy scam and said a transfer of Rs 338 crore was tentatively established in the matter.

EDITORIAL –

Buoyant domestic tourism, thy love for foreign visitors

The geopolitical scenario in India has already made an initial impact on one of the key tourism destinations, Goa. It is well known that charter flights from Russia and its neighbours like Kazakhstan and some European countries form a big part of the winter rush to this tiny state. Latest reports indicate that the Ukraine-Russia war has cut down the tourist arrivals from these regions. The effects of the West Asia war have also reduced travel numbers as hopes have been dashed for the launch of charter flights from Israel. The good news is that domestic tourism is rebounding back to pre-pandemic levels while foreign tourism is also rising, though not at the same rapid rate owing to disturbed conditions abroad. The first six months of 2023 apparently saw a virtual doubling of foreign tourist arrivals to the country. The not-so-good news is that this country with all its much-vaunted historical monuments and wildlife reserves is still not high in the rankings of global tourist destinations. The fact is, despite strife in several parts of the world, more people than ever before are travelling to distant destinations on holidays. The clampdown on travel during the Covid pandemic was followed by a spurt in global travel in 2022; projections for 2023 are that the tourism sector will return to pre-pandemic levels. The conflict in West Asia is likely to affect the upbeat forecasts made by the World Trade and Tourism Council (WTTC), but the extent can only be determined in the coming months.

As of now, the WTTC expects 5.8 per cent growth for this sector to continue annually right up to 2032, considerably higher than the 2.9 per cent rise expected in the global GDP. Despite these apparent setbacks, the overall trends remain buoyant for domestic tourism. There are reports that key destinations like Goa and Udaipur will continue to be thronged by travellers during the peak winter months as hotel bookings are rising rapidly and occupancy levels are high. In other words, the peripatetic domestic traveller is compensating for the loss of foreign tourism in many parts of the country. This compensation is in the form of conferences, destination weddings and individual holiday travel, which is evident in the increased passenger traffic by air as well. According to the World Economic Forum’s Travel and Tourism Development Index, India is at the 54th position on the list of 117 countries. Japan tops the list, followed by the US, Spain and France. It thus appears there are many countries that may not have all the splendours of antiquity that our countrymen never cease to boast about, but tourist footfall is not matching up to the potential. It is strange that a country which encompasses breathtaking monuments like the Taj Mahal, pristine beaches on both the west and east coasts, and hilly terrain with eye-catching landscapes in the northern region is not able to woo more foreign tourists to its shores. In contrast, countries which have fewer attractions are

able to draw many more visitors. Many reasons exist for this lacuna and surprisingly, several can be easily resolved. The first, which is mentioned time and time again by studies on tourism issues, is the need to improve cleanliness and sanitation facilities at major tourist destinations. Undoubtedly, the situation has improved remarkably in recent years as the requirement for such basic infrastructure has been recognised by the tourism authorities. Even so, it is imperative that as historic monuments are being upgraded and restored in many parts of the country, including the Capital, sanitation facilities be simultaneously expanded to cope with the increase in tourist footfall. The focus needs to shift away from the golden triangle of Delhi, Agra and Jaipur, although it’s essential to continue upgrading basic facilities even in these areas. The lack of trained guides as well as absence of a proper regulatory system in strategic locations like the Taj Mahal was highlighted recently in a report that a fake guide took a top US functionary around the monument. The vast mountainous regions of the Himalayas can be exploited much more than has been done so far. Similarly, newer regions like Arunachal Pradesh need to be opened for tourism. The state encompasses a vast area with breathtaking natural beauty and a unique tribal culture. The caveat, naturally, must be that ecological considerations are kept in mind in any such development.

Apply for the post of RERA chief, interviews fall on November 18

CHANDIGARH : Eyeing post-retirement rehabilitation, atleast 16 Haryana bureaucrats are in race for the posts of chairpersons and the member. A total of 34 candidates are vying for each post of chairperson while 63 are in fray for member’s post. Now Decks have finally been cleared for the appointment of chairpersons for Panchkula and Gurugram Benches of the Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA) and a member of the Panchkula Bench. The Haryana government has invited the candidates for interview for the post of chairperson on November 18, and for the member’s post on November 17 and 18. Among the former IAS officers, who are eyeing both the posts are Varinder Singh Kundu, Sunil Kumar Gulati,

Arun Kumar, Alok Nigam, Mahavir Singh, Rajeev Arora and Dheera Khandelwal, all former IAS officers, and Yogender Chaudhary, former IRS. The Haryana Government constituted two benches of RERA—Gurugram (with jurisdiction in Gurugram) and Panchkula (with jurisdiction in rest of Haryana) in 2017—to provide an institutional grievance redressal mechanism to property buyers and regulate the largely-unregulated real estate sector across the state. KK Khandelwal and Rajan Gupta, chairpersons of the Gurugram and Panchkula Benches, respectively, retired earlier this year. A substantial number of bureaucrats and other professionals apply for these lucrative posts which carry handsome salaries and other perks, including palatial bungalow and official car.

Unaided teachers receive nod for revised pay scales

CHANDIGARH : For unaided post held by teachers, a meeting of the Panjab University (PU) Syndicate lasted more than six hours, which included discussion over revised pay scales. The PU authorities have finally approved the Seventh Pay Commission scales for self-financed teachers. During the course of the proceedings, the Chandigarh Aided College Teachers’ Association (CACTA) organised a protest in front of the administrative block at the PU. One of the other relevant decisions taken during the meeting concerned transparency in the tender process related to construction. The Syndicate members unanimously agreed upon pulling up RK Rai, executive engineer, the PU construction office. To avoid dealing with tender violations, it was suggested that residents

must submit satisfactory report immediately after the completion of the construction work. Dr Parveen Goyal, one of the Syndicate members, said construction officials were biased while prioritising work. So, despatch system must be in place, Dr Goyal said. Also, the Syndicate members reached a consensus over not extending the services of doctors of 62 years age and above at the PU health centre. Besides, the Syndicate approved the reconsideration of the employment of Dr Rakesh Khullar as Medical Officer at the Bhai Ghanaiya Ji Institute of Health, on contract. During a protest earlier, Dr Kulvinder Singh, president, CACTA, said, “Private managements are leaving no stone unturned to fill their coffers with government grants and fee from students. They are openly flouting the PU/UGC norms.”

MC clears charging, swapping stations for 32 parking lots

CHANDIGARH : In a meeting of its committee, the Mayor Anup Gupta decided that recommendations had to be sent to the UT Administration in this regard on or before November 2 and the corporation has intended for 100 per cent revenue from the deal. The move follows UT Administrator Banwarilal Purohit’s recent directions, asking the civic body to complete all formalities within a week for the setting up of charging stations in parking lots. The city Municipal



Corporation gave permission for setting up of charging and battery swapping stations for electric vehicles (EVs) at its 32 parking lots. “With some changes in parking lots, we cleared the sites,” said Mayor Anup Gupta. In August, the Administration had written to the MC, stating that directions with regard to approving sites for installation of charging stations

were issued under Section 405 of the Punjab Municipal Act, 1976, and were to be complied within 10 days, failing which the work would be initiated by the Administration. It comprised councillors Jasmanpreet Singh and Sachin Galav, nominated councillor Umesh Ghai, Beopar Mandal chief Charanjiv Singh and CREST project manager Parul Gazta.

Ban on liquor sale in municipal wards on Nov 4, 5

The storage of liquor by individuals shall be curtailed during this period and the restrictions provided in the excise laws on the storage of liquor in unlicensed premises shall be vigorously enforced.

India developed economy for \$30 trillion by 2047 - Think tank

NEW DELHI : The draft “Vision India @2047” by Niti Aayog will be ready by December this year and publicly unveiled in the next three months, he said. “Consultations with sectoral groups of secretaries and thought leaders, including industrialists Gautam Adani, Mukesh Ambani and Google CEO Sundar Pichai, will take place in November,” CEO Subrahmanyam, the think-tank disclosed on Monday. Busy in preparing, the NITI Aayog a vision document for India to become a developed economy of about \$30 trillion by 2047, said the Central Government’s think-tank. The PMO had initiated the preparation of this vision document in 2021 with the formation of 10 sectoral groups of secretaries. In 2023, the NITI Aayog was asked to consolidate the 10 sectoral thematic visions into a combined vision. In



2019, PM Narendra Modi had forecast that India would become a \$5 trillion economy by 2024-25. However, with a declining growth rate, it is expected to reach only \$4 trillion by 2024-25. Perhaps conscious of this slippage, Subrahmanyam said the vision document would outline the required institutional and structural changes and reforms to become a developed nation by 2047. “The whole purpose of the vision document is to avoid the middle-income trap,” he told the media. The middle-income trap is a situation where a country reaches a

stage of development where it can no longer compete internationally in labour-intensive areas because wages are relatively higher. It also cannot compete in higher value-added activities because productivity is relatively lower. Subrahmanyam did not mention the growth rate required to become a \$10 trillion economy by 2047. Speaking last month, Union Minister Hardeep Puri had forecast that the Indian economy would touch \$10 trillion by 2030. Economists had then calculated that it would require India to grow at 9 per cent for the remaining period.

Muliti-crore rupees cryptocurrency scam unearthed

SHIMLA : A special investigation team (SIT) has conducted raids at 41 locations in the state and seized incriminating documents, property records, mobile phones and other digital devices in connection with the scam that involves money to the tune of Rs 2,300 crore and over one lakh investors, both from the state and other parts of the country. The police has arrested one of the masterminds who, along with other three accused, orchestrated the multi-crore rupees cryptocurrency scam. The SIT has nailed Abhishek Sharma, a resident of Una district and one of the main accused who had been absconding, in Dharamsala on Sunday. A local court remanded him in police custody for five days. DIG,



Northern Range, Abhishek Dullar, who heads the SIT, said: “A total of 10 accused have been arrested so far in connection with the scam. We conducted searches at 41 locations across the state, including Hamirpur (25), Bilaspur (four), Kangra (seven), Mandi (two), Una (two) and Solan (one). “These searches were conducted at houses of top-line investors who lured other investors and played a major role in widening the scam. These investors are in hundreds and key to our investigation. The searches have yielded incriminating

documents and other crucial evidence. We have also obtained various details related to the proceeds of the crime,” he added. On being asked about Subhash, one of the masterminds, hiding in an unknown foreign location, Dullar said, “We cannot reveal much about him for now. Efforts are on to nab him.” He, however, said: “The evidence collected during the searches brings us one step closer to holding the culprits accountable for their actions.”

Over river waters issue, BJP chief Sunil Jakhar attacks CM Bhagwant Mann

LUDHIANA : On the issue of SYL, Punjab BJP Chief Sunil Jakhar said it is the responsibility of the state government to take everyone along and protect the interests of the state, but the chief minister is running away from it. BJP Chief Jakhar on Monday attacked Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann over the Sutlej Yamuna Link (SYL) canal issue, accusing him of not being serious about the state’s river waters. Jakhar alleged that Mann was diverting peoples’ attention from the state’s real issues. Jakhar said if the SYL canal is built and more water is given to Haryana, Punjab’s Malwa area, especially Abohar, will be adversely affected. “If somebody is not worried about river waters it is the Chief minister Bhagwant Mann because he is not serious about it,” said Jakhar. The BJP leader said Punjab does not have a single drop of water to spare with any other state. Replying to a question on the November 1 debate, Jakhar said that he had been saying from day one that the AAP government believed in “deception and distraction.” It tries to divert attention and befool people, he alleged.



Jakhar said the Punjab Agricultural University, where the debate is to take place, and the Ludhiana city has been turned into a police cantonment. CM Mann had dared opposition leaders for an open debate on issues concerning the state on November 1. On October 26, Mann had said the main political parties of Punjab would have to answer for their “misdeeds” during the ‘Main Punjab Bolda Haan’ debate in Ludhiana. He had thrown the challenge in response to the opposition parties’ criticism of his government over the SYL canal issue. The opposition parties had attacked the AAP government following the Supreme Court directive on October 4, asking the Centre to survey the portion of land in Punjab that was allocated for the construction of a part of the SYL canal and make an estimate of the extent of construction carried out there.

905-gm gold hidden from turban seized at city airport

ED summons Kejriwal hrs after SC dismisses bail plea in Excise case

NEW DELHI : Hours after the Supreme Court turned down the bail petition of his former deputy and close confidant Manish Sisodia. The Enforcement Directorate on Monday summoned Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal to appear before it on November 2 in connection with the ongoing probe into the alleged liquor scam. Enforcement Directorate had in Apex Court intended to investigate AAP .But the court asked why it had not made AAP an accused in the case despite claiming that the bribes earned from allegedly favouring a cartel of liquor dealers were used to fund the Kejriwal-led party's election campaign in Goa.But the grounds for Kejriwal's questioning appeared to be getting readied soon after ED quizzed his PA Bibhav Kumar and Jasmine Shah, another close aide who headed the Delhi Dialogue Commission, in February, around the time Sisodia was taken into custody. Vijay Nair, AAP's communications chief who was among the first to be arrested in connection with the liquor scam, is also known to be very close to the Delhi Kumar repeatedly changing his phone devices allegedly to destroy evidence had found mention in the prosecution complaints (chargesheets) filed by the enforcement agency earlier against other accused ED brought on record Kejriwal's involvement in the excise policy scam in multiple chargesheets filed by it. Kumar was questioned on the list of people who had spoken to the CM in connection with the scrapped excise policy of 2021-



22. The ED had called Nair, who resided in a ministerial bungalow next to the CM's residence, one of the key protagonists of the scam and was allegedly instrumental in generating Rs 100 crore in advance kickbacks from the South Group, a cartel of liquor dealers from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana who, after the changes carried out by the Kejriwal government, ended up controlling the liquor business in the national capital. Nair, as per his statement under Section 50 of PMLA, functions from the camp office of Arvind Kejriwal. Further, Nair, since 2020, has been residing in the government bungalow allotted to cabinet minister Kailash Gehlot, part of the GoM on excise policy 2021-22," the ED had said in one of the chargesheets filed in a PMLA court here. In another chargesheet, the ED had quoted from the recorded statements of C Arvind, a DANICS officer and secretary to Sisodia, about the alleged conspiracy and active connivance of the CM and other members of his government in the liquor scam. Arvind had told the agency that he was called to Kejriwal's residence by his boss Sisodia where he was handed over the 'draft GoM' report which was allegedly designed to benefit a group of wholesalers by raising their commission from 5% in the old regime to 12% in return for bribes.

New iPhone to be manufactured by TATA group

New Delhi: Tata Electronics is a wholly owned subsidiary of Tata Sons, the promoters of the salt-to-software conglomerate. The group is seeking to make inroads into electronics production and e-commerce. Tata Electronics already operates a manufacturing facility in Krishnagiri district of Tamil Nadu. The production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme has already propelled India into becoming a trusted and major hub for Smartphone manufacturing and exports.

"Now, within just two and a half year, @Tata Companies will now start making iPhones from India for domestic and global markets from India " he said in a post on X,



formerly known as Twitter. "Thanks you @Wistron for your contributions, and great going for Apple in building a global supply chain from India with Indian companies at its helm." The takeover of the Wistron Corp factory concludes after bout a year of negotiations . The facility employs over 10,000 workers, who assemble the latest iPhone 14 model. "Upon confirmation and signature of the relevant

agreements by both parties the deal will proceed to obtain the necessary approvals," Wistron said.

Apple's iPhones are mainly assembled by Taiwanese manufacturing giants like Pegatron Corp and Foxconn Technology Group. Wistron's Board approved the sale or Wistron InfoComm Manufacturing (India) Private Ltd to Tata Electronics for \$125 million, the Taiwanese electronics manufacturer said an iPhone assembly plants near Bengaluru. Tata Group is set to become India's first homegrown iPhone maker after Taiwan's Wistron Group agreed to sell a plant in Bengaluru to India's largest conglomerate.

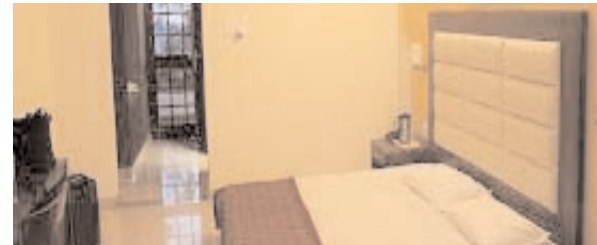
Act against illegal hotels at Morni, orders Pkl DC
