EDITORIAL -

Law must for 1/3 representation to Indian women

Women in India have breached every ceiling, as lawyers, corporate heads, scientists, pilots, you name it they are there. But in the Lok Sabha, they are just over 14%, and 2019 showed an improvement of 3%, mainly because of the impressive strike rate (over 70%) of the women who fought on the BJP ticket. Their winnability — an argument made against giving women tickets — was more than that of male candidates. But 74 years after Independence, surely that is not good enough? The numbers in state Assemblies are even more pathetic. This, when women are coming out in larger numbers to vote. In several states they outnumber the men. In 'Bihar 2020', women voters were 5% more than men. Women are also slowly evolving as a vote bank. There were instances of women voting together on an issue — like Ram Mandir in UP in the '90s. The joke used to be that women in Mulayam Singh Yadav's family had voted against his party. Or after Indira Gandhi's assassination in 1984, when more women (5%) came out to vote than men. Political awareness is growing by leaps and bounds in women. The large number of protesting women from farming families who camped on Delhi borders sleeping out in the open during winter months would have been unthinkable some years ago. The powerful khaps in the Jat community that have held a conservative view about the role women should play encouraged their participation. Protesting

women farmers have made it to the covers of international magazines. It is the grandmothers who led the anti-CAA stir at Shaheen Bagh last year, which became a symbol of protest by Muslim women who used to be confined to their homes. 'Exposure' has its own ripple effect. It is a genie you cannot put back into the bottle. Of late, they have begun to vote on the issues that affect them directly, like prohibition, which reduces domestic violence and releases more money for basic necessities. Prohibition — and cycles for girls to go to school — won Nitish Kumar the loyalty of women voters. It is they who bailed him out of a sticky situation last year. Mamata has also been assiduously cultivating the women's constituency, giving more tickets to women, and encouraging TMC women MPs to speak fearlessly. Mahua Moitra is emerging as the most strident critic of the BJP government in the Lok Sabha. Whatever be the outcome of the battle for Bengal — and the BJP is pulling out all stops, with the PM to address 20 meetings, Amit Shah many more — it is 'Bengal's daughter' Mamata who has become the central theme of poll 2021, and the biggest symbol of the fight against the Modi-Shah politics. The challenge for her is not just to retain power, or for Modi-Shah to wrest it from her, it is to put out a blueprint for how they are going to grapple with the unprecedented situation brought on by the pandemic. More women lost their jobs than men. Girls are being pulled

out of school, subjected to sexual violence, and married early so that they are not a burden on their families, negating the gains of the last 25 years. The International Women's Day, celebrated since the start of the UN Women's Decade in 1975, is an occasion to honour women. But it is also time to take stock, and this year to look again at women's abysmally low participation in politics. Disha Ravi, a climate change activist who supported the farmers' movement, and labour activist Nodeep Kaur, both arrested for their beliefs, represent an aspirational India from where the new leadership is going to emerge. There is also a pool of women who have been readied for roles in governance. There are two million of them in the panchayats and local bodies. This leadership has been in the making for the last 30 years since the enactment of the 73rd and 74th constitutional amendments, giving greater autonomy to the local bodies and one-third representation to women, with 30% of leadership roles reserved for them. On March 12, PM Modi is going to kick off the celebrations to mark 75 years of Independence. There is a new Parliament building in the making. It will have seating for 1,224 members, almost double the present capacity. It will be only in the 'fitness of things' if the new Parliament can commence its functioning with a law to give one-third representation in Parliament to the women of India.

Offline exam in the midst of spurt of Covid cases

CHANDIGARH : Illogically adamant on holding offline exams whereas Covid positive cases are on a steep rise across the city and the country. Normally parents are afraid that these schools may not become super-spreader hotspots," said Nitin Goyal, president, Chandigarh Parents Association. Parents of students are in panic as many city schools are conducting offline examination in the midst of spurt in Covid cases. "To avoid a citywide lockdown in the near future, the Administration must immediately close all schools. Even Panjab University is holding its exams online and the CBSE has postponed the board examinations till May-June," he added. Although incidences of children testing positive in schools are less in Chandigarh, parents are quite worried seeing the rising number of students contracting virus in nearby districts like Patiala. "My daughter goes to a school in Sector 9, Chandigarh. A Class XI student, who went to school for giving exams tested positive and yet the principal is adamant on taking offline exams. We have no online option," said Sheetal, a parent from the city.



"In Punjab, the local health authorities are conducting Covid tests in schools. However, such measures are not being undertaken by the health authorities in Chandigarh. This is why not many cases of school going children testing positive are highlighted here," said a government school teacher requesting anonymity. For Classes III to VIII, online exams are being conducted in government schools. However, offline tests will be held for students studying in Classes IX to XII. The exams will start from March 15 and continue till March 31. The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has allowed all its affiliated schools to conduct in-person annual examinations for Classes IX and XI. "For Classes IX and XI, schools should conduct examinations by strictly following Covid-19 protocols as per by-laws," read the notification issued by the CBSE controller of examinations, Sanyam Bhardwaj.

Chandigarh Sweets plagues life of workers bereft of requisite NOC

CHANDIGARH : On account of missing fire fighting amenities, there had been massive fire break out in 2018 where Chandigarh fire brigade had to face herculean task in extinguishing the blaze. One of the staff fire fighters Jagdeep Singh had to undergo surgical operation and seek medical plate/rod to sustain movements for further fire battles in the field. No lesson from the past catastrophe has been learnt by the proprietor Ramesh Aggarwal of Chandigarh Sweet Pvt Ltd Industrial Area Phase-1. Nevertheless, the company has not yet emulated standard fire fighting procedures and procure decent range of equipments, says Surjit Singh, Station



Fire Officer. Requisite notice with copies of advisory were sent on 11 March, 2020 to caution the proprietor from carrying out breach of the laid down standard procedures. Yet the attitude remains defiant and recalcitrant in accomplishing the ethical task which could save life of labour from potential mishaps particularly in peak load hours as had

happened in the past. On confirming about the preparedness, Ramesh Aggarwal claimed he has made fighting system satisfactory but not yet received clearance (NOC) from the fire authorities, which is clear violation of the standard operating procedures, commented fire safety department.

Consumer Commission directs estate developer to refund Rs 32.84 lakh

CHANDIGARH : The State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has not only directed the builder, TDI Infratech Limited, to refund Rs32,84,560 to a consumer with interest but also told him to pay Rs50,000 as compensation for causing mental agony and harassment and litigation costs. Not giving actual possession of a plot with all facilities and mandatory approvals in a fixed time frame has cost a builder dearly. Rajesh Arora approached the commission after the builder failed to deliver actual physical possession of a plot purchased by him in "TDI City", Sector 111, SAS Nagar, for want of approvals/sanctions, development activities and basic amenities despite the victim paying almost full amount. Arora said he booked the plot in May 2008. He had paid Rs32,84,560 against total sale consideration of



Rs34,12,500 from May, 2008, to January, 2012. However, only symbolic possession was offered vide letter dated April 9, 2012. It was offered without necessary approvals/sanctions and also without development at the project site. Arora said he made a number of requests to builder to deliver actual physical possession of the plot after completing the project and getting clearances/approvals, but to no avail. After over five years, he was told to get the sale deed executed of the plot vide letter dated December 15, 2017, and also to make the remaining payment. In the absence of delivery of valid possession, the company started charging maintenance charges

also. Stating that the conduct of the builder amounts to deficiency in service and adoption of unfair trade practice, he filed a complaint before the commission seeking possession of the plot, or in the alternative refund of the amount paid along with interest and compensation. After hearing the argument, the commission held that the project was launched in complete violation of the mandatory requirements. The complainant is therefore held entitled to get a refund of the amount actually paid by him along with interest at the rate 12 per cent per annum from the respective dates of deposits. The commission directed the builder to refund Rs32,84,560 and also Rs46,456 received towards maintenance charges to the complainant, along with interest at the rate 12% per annum from the respective dates of deposit onwards.

PPDAP seeks parity with neighbouring states in VAT on petrol, diesel

MOHALI : Paramjit Singh Doaba, the PPDAP (Petrol Pump Dealers Association Punjab) President said, "Petrol and diesel is high-priced in Mohali as compared to cities of the neighbouring states in North India. The reason for petrol and diesel being costly in Punjab is higher state taxes (VAT and cess)." The PPDAP has lamented the negative impact of the rising prices of petrol and diesel on its business as well as increased burden on farmers, industry and common man in the state.



"Higher VAT in Punjab has stifled the growth. The PPDAP has since 2017 continuously sought parity in VAT with the neighboring states and the UT. Though the present government decreased VAT in 2019, it did not wait for results to come and increased the tax again, which

throttled growth in the state," he added. "Haryana and Chandigarh have gained at the expense of Punjab by reducing VAT on both the products since 2000. However, petrol and diesel consumption grew in Himachal, which increased VAT collections for the

state," he said. "As the Finance Minister prepares to present the Budget, we demand a reduction in VAT on petrol and diesel and bring it at par with the neighbouring states and the UT. Such a step is needed for the consumers in Punjab, who have been struggling in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. Moreover, tax reduction on fuel will encourage industry, business and transport in the state," he said.

Case registered against 2 medical officers in forgery and irregularities

PANCHKULA : Dr Sarita and Dr Meenal Gahlawat medical officers were allegedly not attending patients, especially during Covid 19, and remained absent during their working hours and referred patients to various hospitals. He said medical officers also stamped blank OPD tickets. The Panchkula police have booked two medical officers of the local Health Department on charges of cheating, forgery and irregularities in reporting for duty on time under several sections of the IPC and the Disaster Management Act on a complaint filed by a journalist. The medical officers are Dr Sarita and Dr Meenal Gahlawat, who are deployed at the ESI



Dispensary in Sector 19. The complainant, Chander Shekhar Dharni, said he visited the dispensary on a tip-off on December 11, 2020, about the misdeed and irregularities prevalent. It was revealed after questioning a few patients and driver of Dr Meenal, a medical officer, that Dr Meenal reached hospital at 9 am, not following her duty hours. "As per the information received by me, the official duty hours are 7 am to 1 pm and 1 pm to 7 pm. Thereafter, to verify the facts stated by the driver, I went inside the dispensary to take the

recorded versions of Medical Officer and Senior Medical Officer where I met with Dr Sarita and Dr Meenal. Dr Sarita, when confronted with some facts and bogus referral OPD tickets, refused to comment. Dr Meenal kept intervening in the support of Dr Sarita," said Dharni. "Thereafter, I recorded the version of the Senior Medical Officer Dr Aradhana who disclosed the misdeeds, irregularities and indisdisciplinary behaviour of Dr Sarita. She said Dr Sarita is supposed to join her duty in the evening shift but she used to come in the morning shift and does not even sign the duty roster. She also disclosed that whenever she wanted to take any disciplinary action against Dr Sarita, she was

given the threats of transfer by Dr Sarita with influence of her VIP status," states the FIR. "The complainant comprehends that since the above named medical officers are politically influential, they can implicate the complainant in a false case just to save their skin and may also cause harm to the complainant. It is therefore requested that the life and liberty of the complainant and his freedom as a journalist be protected," the FIR further read. The FIR has been filed under Sections 420 (cheating), 464, 465 466, 467, 468, 471 (forgery) of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 51, 56 of the Disaster Management Act at the Sector 20 police station.

Cong MLAs question own govt

CHANDIGARH : The Amarinder government is replicating the deeds of the former SAD government and now they need to work for the benefit of the farmers. The farmers are not getting timely payment, said Kulbir Singh Zira. Nevertheless nothing has been done forcing me to raise the issue in the house. I have no intention running of any one down. I just want to know when the project will start as we are left with just one

In the next hearing, ED will submits reply and court will take its decision on regular bail to accused. Hooda had allotted 14 industrial plots worth around Rs 30.3 Crore in a prime area of Panchkula to 14 acquaintances in 2013 allegedly at rates four- five time below the market rate. Prominent

beneficiaries of the scheme included close members of the Hooda family, his MLAs/party workers and his personal staff in the chief minister's office. The criminal incident pertained to 2011-12 as per the prosecution complaint during the congress government in the state. Hooda was the chairman of Huda(Haryana Urban) Development Authority . The plots were located in Industrial Area Phase-1 of Panchkula and ranged from 496 sq mt, offered at Rs 31.74 lakh, to 1,280 sq mt, offered at Rs 64 lakh. The investigating agencies have alleged that the market Price was much higher at the time of allotment when the commoners were not in position to buy such type of costly industrial plots.

Hooda may quit Cong, says Abhay Chautala

India deplores UK lawmakers' debate on farmers' stir

LONDON/DELHI : The Indian mission in its statement, pointed out that foreign media, including British media, had been present and witnessed the events surrounding the farmers' protests in India first-hand and therefore any "question of lack of freedom of the media in India does not arise". The High Commission of India in London has condemned a debate among some British lawmakers on an e-petition over the right of peaceful protests and freedom of the press in India amid the ongoing farmers' stir against three New Delhi laws on agricultural reform. The Commission damned the debate, held on Monday evening inside the British parliamentary premises, as "false assertions" in a

"distinctly one-sided discussion". "We deeply regret that rather than a balanced debate, false assertions — without substantiation or facts — were made, casting aspersions on the largest functioning democracy in the world and its institutions," the commission said in a statement after the Monday evening debate on an e-petition. The debate was held in response to an e-petition which had crossed the 100,000-signature threshold, required for it to be approved by the House of Commons Petitions Committee. The Indian High Commission made its displeasure known despite the British government earlier reiterating that the three New Delhi laws on agricultural reform were a "domestic matter".

Ministries to highlight vigilance role while approaching UPSC to discipline officers

NEW DELHI : The Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) has asked all Union ministries and departments to highlight its role while approaching Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) to seek advice on the quantum of penalty in disciplinary proceedings against Group 'A' officers and officers of All India Services. The practice of referring to CVC's opinion while approaching UPSC had been done away with in December 2012 to avoid "difference of opinion" and "delay due to duality of authority". The apex vigilance body is consulted at two stages in vigilance cases/disciplinary proceedings, which involves "first-stage advice" on the investigation reports, and "second-stage advice" before a final decision is taken at the conclusion of

proceedings. The DoPT in 2011 asked to dispense with "second-stage advice" of CVC in disciplinary cases involving consultation with UPSC. However, it was observed that the move didn't obtain the desired result. No extra chance for those who exhausted last attempt in 2020. The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) had issued guidelines in 2011 asking to dispense with "second-stage advice" of CVC in disciplinary cases involving consultation with UPSC. The UPSC is consulted for the quantum of penalty against the concerned officer along with CVC, but the latter had taken a backseat for the past eight years due to DoPT guidelines. However, it was observed that the move didn't obtain the desired result and there were considerable delays in finalisation of disciplinary proceedings in those

cases as well, wherein the proceedings were initiated on the advice of the apex vigilance body. "One of the reasons noticed for delay in such cases is that while approaching UPSC for advice about quantum of penalty on the charged officer concerned, the fact that the disciplinary proceedings were initiated on the advice of CVC in that particular case, is not highlighted by the organisations," according to a communication sent by CVC on Monday. Therefore, CVC added, it is desired that the authorities concerned, at the time of approaching UPSC for advice, with respect to such cases, "must highlight the fact that particular case was based on the First Stage Advice given by the CVC, so that the cases receives due attention with the authorities in UPSC and its advice is tendered on priority basis".

40 lakh tractors to gherao parliament if farm laws not repealed - Rakesh Tikait

Sindhu / Gajipur Border : Farmers have been protesting on different borders of the national capital since November 26 last year against the three newly enacted farm laws. Addressing a Kisan mahapanchayat in Rajasthan, Rakesh Tikait threatened the central government and said that if the three laws are not repealed, the farmers will 'gherao' the Parliament with 40 lakh tractors.

Amid the ongoing farmers protest against the three farm laws, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has extended the deployment of 93 companies of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) in the national capital including "The MHA Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), Border Security Force (BSF), Indo-Tibetan Border Force (ITBP), Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) and Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) till March 15 for law and order duties. "Rest 20 companies of

CRPF, BSF and CISF will be de-inducted after March 10," it added. Farmers have been protesting on different borders of the national capital since November 26 last year against the three newly enacted farm laws - Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, 2020; the Farmers Empowerment and Protection Agreement on Price Assurance and farm Services Act 2020

SOP issued by Supreme Court for hybrid physical hearing from March 15

NEW DELHI : "On an experimental basis, and as a pilot scheme, the final hearings/regular matters listed on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays may be heard in the hybrid mode, as may be decided by the Bench, considering the number of parties in a matter as well as the limited capacity of court-rooms.



The Supreme Court, which is hearing cases through video-conferencing since March last year due to the pandemic, will commence hybrid physical hearing from March

15 for which it has issued the standard operating procedure. Several Bar bodies and lawyers have been demanding that physical hearings be resumed immediately. All other matters, including those listed on Mondays and Fridays, shall continue to be heard through the video/teleconferencing mode," according to the SOP issued by the SC.

Cabinet nod not mandatory for transfer of govt land

CHANDIGARH : In order to boost the tempo of development the BJP-JJP government has made the transfer of land belonging to the government, municipal bodies and panchayat for public purpose transparent and hassle-free. Under the "Policy for transfer of government, municipal bodies and gram panchayat lands for public purposes", there would be no need for approval from the Council of Ministers for the land transfer from one government department to another. However, the Chief Minister's approval would

be required though no prior concurrence of the Finance Department would be required for the land transfer. The transfer would be free of cost, stated a notification issued by Sanjeev Kaushal, Financial Commissioner Revenue (FCR). The transfer of government land to municipal bodies, and Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) would, however, be made on collector rates. The approval of the Council of Ministers would also be required. Prior concurrence of the Finance and the Revenue Departments would be required by the acquiring department.

The transfer of municipal land to the government department would be effected at collector rates. Similarly, the transfer of panchayat land to any department would be done at the rate prescribed in the Punjab Village Common Lands (Regulation), Rules, 1964. "In case, land has to be transferred to the Union Government at rates less than the collector rates, a committee headed by the Chief Secretary will examine the matter and place the proposal before the Council of Ministers after the CM's approval," the notification added.

UK to witness World War-I Sikh fighter pilot's memorial

LONDON : The statue of Hardit Singh Malik, the world's first Royal Flying Corps (now the Royal Air Force) Sikh, turbaned fighter pilot, will be emblematic for the broader Sikh contribution in the British armed forces of World War I and II," notes the One Community Hampshire & Dorset (OCHD) organisation behind the campaign for the memorial that was approved by the Southampton City Council last year. The design for a sculpture of an early 20th century Sikh fighter pilot, cricketer and golfer from Oxford University has been approved for a new memorial to be erected at Southampton (England) in memory of the Indians who fought in the world wars. Hardit Singh Malik first arrived in the UK in 1908 as a 14-year-old to Balliol College at the University of Oxford and went on to become a member of the Royal Flying Corps during the



World War-I. As the first Indian and turbaned pilot with a specialised helmet, he became famous as 'Flying Sikh'. Malik also played cricket for Sussex and was also the Indian Ambassador to France after a long and distinguished career in the Indian Civil Service. But he is best known as a fighter pilot during 1917-19. "I am truly overwhelmed by the striking beauty and power of the exceptional design of the memorial, which captures the spirit and endeavour of this great RAF fighter pilot, Hardit Singh Malik, so well. It gives me great happiness to learn that the design is approved by the community," said Lord Rami Ranger, Chairman of the British Sikh Association and Chief Patron of OCHD.

Punjab Budget focuses on poll promises

CHANDIGARH : With the Opposition turning the heat on the Congress government in Punjab over its "unfulfilled" poll promises, the party is all set to announce provisions to fulfil these in the Budget 2021-22 already presented in Vidhan Sabha. Some of the promises find place in the Budget include enhancement in the old-age pension and "shagun", skill training for wards of construction workers, unemployment allowance, free housing for SC beneficiaries and farm loan waiver for landless labourers. CM Capt Amarinder Singh on Sunday had



directed all ministries and departments to proactively push for the realisation of the seven-point "Agenda 2022" unveiled by him in the Vidhan Sabha on Friday. "The agenda comprised improvisation in the announcements made in 2017 and the way forward," said a senior party leader.

Countering the Opposition, the government claimed that 84 per cent of the promises had been fulfilled. Of 546 promises made in the 2017 manifesto, the Congress has fulfilled 455 and the remaining will be met in its remaining term, the sources claim.

Farmers need not stock wheat, procurement to start from April 1

CHANDIGARH : The Haryana Government has decided to start procurement of wheat from April 1, so that farmers do not have to stock the early crop. The procurement of wheat was started on April 10 last year. About 400 small and big procurement centres will be set up for the procurement of wheat. While addressing a press conference, Haryana Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala said Haryana is the only state in the country where a

total of six crops — wheat, mustard, pulses, gram, sunflower, and barley — are purchased at the minimum support price (MSP). For the first time in the state, barley crop would be procured on the MSP and for this seven mandis were earmarked. He said Haryana would be the first state in the history of the country where the payment for the crop would reach the farmer in his own bank account or in the account of the arthiya within 48 hours of submitting the J-Form. He said so

far 7.25 lakh farmers of the state had registered themselves on the Meri Fasal Mera Byora portal for the sale of wheat. Not only this, 1.03 lakh farmers of neighbouring states had also registered themselves on the portal. He claimed that Haryana was the first state in the country to successfully complete the first batch of Phase-III of the Pradhan Mantri Gramin Sadak Yojana. In this batch, 690-km length of rural roads came under Haryana at a cost of Rs 383.58 crore.
