to any visitor or client. The sale manager of the 'Sanat Realtors' however said the land was ancestral and no customer was required to worry as they were safe in the hands of the said realtors.

No one, at this juncture, should forget the deeds of

the former Executive Officer Girish Verma who amassed several crores of rupees by passing wrong architectural layouts and never checked the practically built up houses or the commercial buildings. The issues were tran-

Russia would target Paris Olympics: Macrons

Paris: Macron's remarks represent his most explicit acknowledgment to date of foreign threats to the security or smooth running of the games..

The globally anticipated event takes place amid a complex global context, with Russia's war in Ukraine and Israel's conflict with Hamas in Gaza complicating efforts to safeguard the Olympics.

French President Macron had no doubt Russia would malevolently target the Paris Olympics this summer in comments that underline the fraught geopolitical backdrop to the games. "I have no doubt whatsoever, including in terms of information," he said in response to a reporter's question



about whether he thought that Russia would try to target the Olympics.

A Macron aide, speaking on condition of anonymity declined to say whether the president was referring to specific intelligence signalling a future Russian interference attempt. Instead, she said: "There is a hardening from Russia, which we have been seeing for several months." Macron has recently adopted a tougher stance against Russia, vowing that Moscow must be defeated,

and has not ruled out that European troops may one day go to Ukraine, although he has made clear that France has no intention of instigating hostilities against Russia.

Relations between Russia and the International Olympic Committee, too, have worsened in the run-up to the Paris Olympics, where Russian athletes will compete as neutrals, without their flags and anthems, and be excluded from opening parade.

One’s economy steers instincts of voter

Many types of curbs would create ‘risks for bilateral ties’ by suppressing China’s trade and technology development. According to the Chinese readout, Xi apprised Biden that Beijing would not ‘sit back and watch’ if the US continued to impose such restrictions. US restrictions on high-technology exports to China were necessary to prevent advanced US technologies from being used by Beijing to undermine American security. He also said that these steps were taken without unduly limiting trade and investment. China had already moved the World Trade Organisation (WTO) in December 2022 against US restrictions on advanced computing semiconductor chips, supercomputer items, semiconductor manufacturing items, related services and technologies for China, which it said had violated the relevant articles of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, the Agreement on Trade-Related Measures and the Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights. What other steps would the Dragon take now? In the pre-2024 election mood, some sections of America are treating Xi’s warning as a result of ‘Biden’s weakness’ in dealing with a more assertive China. The Rupert Murdoch-owned New York Post recently went to the extent of alleging that Xi might be having ‘damning dirt on the Biden family’s multimillion-dollar business dealings in China’ or that Biden might be too reticent to escalate ‘overseas tension’. This has reignited an old

controversy that the Bill Clinton administration was hasty in helping China enter the WTO in 2000. In 2017, Robert Lighthizer, then President Donald Trump’s US Trade Representative (USTR), reported to the US Congress that ‘the United States erred in supporting China’s entry into the WTO on terms that have proven to be ineffective in securing China’s embrace of an open, market-oriented trade regime’. Tesla’s recent slump in China is being cited as an example of how American interests are hit. Just recently, the New York Times said Chinese EV makers are taking market share and becoming a security concern for the US and Europe: “Chinese leaders wanted a Tesla plant to jump-start China’s EV sector... Its Chinese rival BYD overtook it in worldwide sales late last year.” Further, Bloomberg reported a \$350-billion ‘slump’ in Tesla’s investor expectations. There is no evidence that America was remiss in considering its security and commercial interests while allowing China into the WTO. On September 12, 1999, then US President Bill Clinton met his Chinese counterpart Jiang Zemin in New Zealand. Washington’s objectives then were to expect Beijing to respect ‘political pluralism’ and ‘free markets’ through Chinese ‘reformers’. Sandy Berger, Clinton’s National Security Adviser, had then said that the US-China relations were back on track. During that era, Clinton’s trade and security leaders, like Michael Kantor (USTR)

and William Perry (Defence Secretary), had said that China was helpful in managing the 1995 Taiwan Strait crisis and North Korea’s nuclear ambitions. In pursuit of this policy, an all-day discussion was held on September 24, 1999, by the US National Intelligence Council and the Federal Research Division of the Library of Congress to discuss the five-year outlook for China’s domestic development, its international security behaviour and its implications for the US. Its transcripts, running into 104 pages, covered every facet of the US-China relations. Among those who attended were nine China specialists from the US intelligence community and the directors of the China departments in state and defence. Most of them felt that China’s new features in governance were an increasing institutionalisation, less arbitrary decision-making, civilian-based leadership in its Politburo, the growth of civil society amid increasing wealth and the influence of businessmen and academics. Following this, the US-China Relations Act of 2000 was signed into law on October 10, 2000, following substantial support in both Houses of the Congress, after which China became a WTO member on December 11, 2001. Joe Biden, then a Senator, stated on record that this would help promote stability across the Taiwan Strait, encourage China to reform its economic system and enhance its respect for the rule of law.

13 checkpoints strengthened by huge police force at Mansa Devi

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : An elaborate security arrangements in view of the Navratri fair at Mansa Devi temple from April 9 to 17 have been made by police and District Administration. The police have set up 13 checkpoints and deputed 750 police personnel to maintain law and order during the fair. The fair has been divided into three zones, and the administration has deputed a duty magistrate in each zone. A control room has also been set up at the fair premises. Deputy Commissioner of Police Himadri Kaushik said five police patrolling cars would also make rounds of the area. DCP Kaushik paid a visit to the Mansa Devi temple today and issued directions to the police personnel. She said devotees in huge numbers come to the city to pay obeisance at the temple. “The department has deputed 750 police personnel on duty who will monitor all the checkpoints throughout the day till the fair lasts. We have also created a help centre to address any problems that the devotees face. A separate team of assault groups has been deployed at the fair to initiate immediate action in case of an untoward incident,” she said. The department has also deputed anti-sabotage teams,



door frame metal detectors, crisis management teams, a teargas squad, bomb disposal, ambulances and fire brigade teams. Meanwhile, the District Administration has made elaborate parking arrangements for devotees at six different places. Officials from the administration said the Mansa Devi temple, Kali Mata temple, and Chandi Mata temple would be provided with uninterrupted electricity supply. The administration has also directed the district Health Department to deploy doctors at the dispensary at the temple library. Officials in the administration said the Civil Surgeon had assured them that a team of doctors would be present at the fair around the clock. The administration has also made arrangements for ambulance and medical camps organised by AYUSH and the National Institute of Ayurveda as part of the fair.

Rs 9.10 lakh by fraudulent dupes 75-year-old resident online

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : Ram Kanwar Dalal, who retired from the post of superintendent of HSEB, Panchkula, said he had received a WhatsApp call on April 1 and the caller claimed he was his relative, Rocky, from Melbourne, Australia. The caller said he wanted to send Rs 9.10 lakh to Dalal’s bank account, which was to be further sent to his friend for his mother’s medical treatment. A 75-year-old resident of Sector 25 was duped of Rs 9.10 lakh by a scammer posing as his relative. The man collected his bank account details, and later shared a receipt of a transaction of Rs 9 lakh with him. He also asked him to transfer the money to his friend, while the transaction was yet to be completed. Dalal went to the bank and transferred Rs 4 lakh into two bank accounts as per details shared with him. The complainant then again received calls wherein the imposters kept on asking for money on one pretext or the other. He even received phone calls wherein the callers



claimed that they represented the bank and that they had rung him up to ascertain the reason for huge sums of money being transferred to his bank account, which left Dalal under the impression that the original callers were not lying. He later transferred another Rs 5.10 lakh to their accounts through RTGS. He then contacted Rocky’s parents after he failed to receive the funds from abroad. He then ascertained that he had been duped of Rs 9.10 lakh by fraudsters. A case under Sections 406 (criminal breach of trust), 420 (cheating and dishonestly inducing delivery of property) and 120-B (party to a criminal conspiracy to commit an offence punishable with death) of the IPC has been registered at the cybercrime police station in the city. The police have started an investigation into it.

PM Modi to address a rally in mid-May

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi will be addressing a rally at the Sector 34 ground in the middle of May for the third consecutive time in the Lok Sabha elections. Preparations in this regard are already underway as his team from the Centre inspected the Sector 34 ground two days ago and held talks with those concerned, said sources. City BJP president Jatinder Pal Malhotra confirmed that the PM would address a rally here, but the date was yet to be finalised. “The Modi factor will definitely have an impact here. Notably, Chandigarh has always voted for the party that has ruled at the Centre,” said a BJP leader. Even in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, it was felt in the local political circles that Modi’s rally had turned the tide in favour of the party candidate MP Kirron Kher at the time when Congress candidate Pawan Kumar Bansal was going strong during the campaigning in Chandigarh.



The sources said as per tentative plans, Modi could be in the city between May 16 and 18. Significantly, Modi’s May 14, 2019, election pitch was more for “Phir ek baar, Modi sarkar”, rather than the party candidate. During his nearly 40-minute-long address, he had not mentioned Kher’s name even once. Modi had not even asked people to vote for the BJP candidate. All he said was, “Your vote on Kamal will go to Modi’s account.” In the last Lok Sabha elections, sitting MP Kirron Kher had retained the Chandigarh seat by garnering 2,30,967 votes. While Bansal got 1,84,218 votes, AAP candidate Harmohan Dhawan, who passed away recently, polled only 13,781 votes. In the 2014 elections, Kher had secured 1,91,362 votes, while Bansal and AAP’s Gul Panag had got 1,21,720 and 1,08,362 votes, respectively.

Chandigarh MC to clear legacy waste by April 30 deadline



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The bioremediation of the legacy waste was kicked off in 2022 and over 11 LMT (lakh metric tonne) of garbage has been removed. The remaining waste, less than 2 LMT, is set to be cleared by April 30. With the Dadu Majra dump likely to be a major issue in the Lok Sabha poll in the city, the Municipal Corporation (MC) has now set April 30 deadline for clearing the legacy waste. To break the vicious cycle of legacy waste, the civic body had earlier established a composting plant. The corporation claims the entire dry and wet waste generated daily by the city is being processed and no fresh garbage is being dumped at the Dadu Majra ground.

Both AAP and the BJP will claim credit if the dump is cleared ahead of the LS election. The project was inaugurated during the tenure of a BJP Mayor. Dadu Majra councillor from AAP Kuldeep Kumar is the incumbent Mayor. The project was inaugurated in September 2022 with the 43-month stipulated period. However, efforts are on to finish work in 26-28 months, ahead of the election to the city LS seat scheduled for

June 1. For the Rs 70-crore project, the Central Government earlier approved Rs 28 crore. With the allocation of Rs 11 crore under the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) funds, the MC’s burden has been reduced to Rs 31 crore. The corporation has requested the Centre to bear the remaining cost of Rs 31 crore, which is supposed to be borne by the civic body. According to the agency carrying out the project, the biomining of the garbage will produce refuse-derived fuel (RDF), inert material and soil. While the RDF will be used for electricity generation, the inert material will go to the sanitary landfill. Soil will be used in fields to raise the level.

Interstate liquor smuggling to be curbed through portal



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The department was in real-time coordination with excise nodal officers of other states to immediately act on instances of illegal smuggling of liquor. The department had sent its additional commissioner and a DSP-rank officer to Bihar to coordinate with the Bihar Police and its excise authorities to improve interstate coordination said Vinay Pratap Singh, Excise Commissioner. The Excise and Taxation Department, Chandigarh, has launched an online portal for interstate coordination to curb smuggling of liquor. The move came close on the heels of the Election Commission issuing stringent guidelines to curb the illegal distribution of liquor in all states during the Lok Sabha elections. The portal has been

launched to share information on all liquor export consignments with destination and en route states so that no pilferage happens on the way. As soon as any export permission from the UT is granted through the system, it would send out an email and SMS alert to the nodal officer(s) of the recipient state and to the states where the export consignment will be en route. It will confirm inter-alia consignment and vehicle details, approximate time and location when the consignment will enter and

exit the en route states and time when it will enter and reach the destination of the recipient state. If any state confiscates any illegal liquor consignment “for supply/sale in Chandigarh” or from the bottling plants in Chandigarh, provision has been made on the portal for that state to login and enter/upload the requisite details of the confiscated consignment so that the Chandigarh Excise Department can be notified in real time. This prompt information sharing will largely help in effective enforcement and tracing the confiscated liquor consignment to the source. Singh said the department had written to the secretaries of excise departments of all states with request to direct their officials to use the portal effectively to ensure that interstate smuggling of liquor was curbed.

Time period extended for upgradation of Chandigarh railway station until May 31

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Initially set for April 10, 2024, the project’s timeline has been revised to May 31. The railway officers from the headquarters and Ambala division took stock of works being carried out under the Amrit Bharat Stations scheme.



Local railway station’s transformative upgrade, designed as a prototype for future stations, has encountered an extension in its completion deadline. The station is being upgraded with innovative modular designs and prefabricated components. The contract has been awarded to M/s Ahluwalia Contracts (India) Limited at a cost of Rs 462 crore. Buildings (G+3) of sizes 60m x 42m each are planned on both sides of the station. The ground floor features essential services such as

ticket counters, book stalls, a souvenir shop, a retail shop, railway offices and an executive lounge. The second floor will house enquiry counters, a food court, retail shops, a cloak room and a paid waiting lounge. The third floor will have an exclusive food court. An air-concourse (72m x 80m) will connect the second floors of the two buildings. The platforms will be accessible through lifts, escalators and stairs from the concourse. Two foot overbridges (each

12 m wide) are strategically positioned on the Kalka and Ambala ends of the station. These will be used by arriving passengers and will also be connected with the station building. A through roof, measuring 180m x 80m, covering the entire area of air-concourse and both the foot overbridges is an important feature. The present parking area on both sides of the station are being developed and is being increased from the existing 13,720 sq m to 24,515 sq m.

Punjab to see single-phase polling on June 1

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : With the Election Commission announcing seven-phase Lok Sabha poll schedule today, elections on 13 parliamentary seats in the state will be held on June 1. The General Election will commence on April 19 and the votes will be counted on June 4. As of March 1, the state has 2,12,71,245 voters out of which 1,19,29,959 are men, 1,07,75,543 women and as many as 744 are transgender voters. The state has a total of 24,433 polling stations. The state has nine general constituencies, including Gurdaspur, Amritsar, Khadoor Sahib, Anandpur Sahib, Ludhiana, Ferozepur, Bathinda, Sangrur and Patiala. The four reserved seats (SC) include Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur, Fatehgarh Sahib and Faridkot. In the 2019 Lok Sabha poll, the Congress



recorded victory on eight seats, SAD and the BJP won two seats each and AAP one. So far, only AAP has announced eight candidates—Ministers Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer (Sangrur), Dr Balbir Singh (Patiala), Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal (Amritsar), Laljit Singh Bhullar (Khadoor Sahib) and Gurmeet Singh Khuddian (Bathinda). The three others include Sushil Rinku (Jalandhar), Karamjit Anmol (Faridkot) and Gurpreet Singh GP (Fatehgarh Sahib). Meanwhile, three prominent Congress leaders—Rinku, GP and Chabbewal—have switched their loyalty

towards AAP. There’s a buzz of more leaving shortly incase their “political aspirations were not respected by the party high command”. So far, SAD and the BJP have neither released list of their candidates nor have they announced an alliance. During the year-long farm stir in 2020-21, the Akali Dal had pulled out of the pact with the BJP. In February, Home Minister Amit Shah had mentioned about the talks between the two parties. However, the issues related to farmers and ‘Bandi Singhs’ have kept the tie-up lingering.

US accused of forcibly deporting Chinese students without valid reason

Beijing : The US has been overstretching the concept of national security and without any valid evidence, arbitrarily cancelled Chinese students' visas, banned them from entering the US and forcibly deported them, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning disclosed before media.
China on Monday accused the US of forcibly deporting Chinese students without any valid evidence and warned of "resolute measures" to safeguard the interests of its nationals.
Asked about reports that Chinese students and scholars were interrogated and forcibly deported when entering the US border at the Washington Dulles Airport and the Dallas Airport, Mao said, the US moves inflicted enormous damage on the persons concerned and obstructed people-to-people exchanges between China and the US.
"The recent cases show that the US law enforcement personnel are bent on



making excuses for deporting Chinese personnel. These are typical cases of selective, discriminatory and politically motivated law enforcement," Mao said.
"China will take resolute measures to safeguard the legitimate and lawful rights and interests of Chinese citizens. The US needs to immediately stop unjustifiably harassing," she said.
China's state-run Global Times quoted Chinese Ambassador to the US Xie Feng alleging that dozens of Chinese arriving in the US, including students, were being denied entry every month over the past few

months.
They held valid visas, had no criminal records, and were returning to school after travelling elsewhere or reuniting with their family in China, he said.
But when they landed at the airport, what awaited them was an 8-hour-long interrogation by officers, who prohibited them from contacting their parents, made groundless accusations against them, and even forcibly deported them and banned their entry, Xie alleged.
According to the US Department of Homeland Security reports, last year Indian students overtook the Chinese in American educational institutions.
The number of students going to the US climbed to 3.20 lakh last year against 2.54 lakhs attributed by Chinese officials to the increasingly negative environment in the United States over concerns about the flight of scientific knowledge.

Congress will transfer Rs 1 lakh to SC/ST women, if voted to power : Rahul Gandhi

SEONI : Congress would provide guaranteed apprenticeships to unemployed youths if the Congress formed the next government at the Centre said Congress leader Rahul Gandhi.
Mr Gandhi on Monday exuded confidence about winning the upcoming Lok Sabha elections and announced a party-led government will transfer Rs 1 lakh annually into bank accounts of women belonging to SC, ST, and backward categories.
Reaching out to tribals in Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-ruled Madhya Pradesh, Gandhi said they are the original owners of the land and bemoaned that no individual from the community is among promoters of the top 200 companies in the country or part of their senior management.
Addressing a rally at Dhanora in Seoni district, part of the Mandla Lok Sabha constituency which will vote in the first phase on April 19.
He assured that if the Congress came to power, it would settle the indigenous people's claim on their land in just one year.
"Our manifesto mentions three



to four revolutionary steps like transferring Rs 1 lakh into (bank) accounts of women belonging to SC and ST categories, backward classes, and for women from poor families. This way we will provide thousands of rupees in their accounts every month," he said.
The Congress has fielded former minister and MLA Omkar Singh Markam from the tribal-reserved Mandla constituency against the sitting BJP MP and Union minister Faggan Singh Kulaste.
The Congress manifesto has also promised to double the money being paid to Asha (community health volunteers) and Anganwadi (child care centre) workers, Gandhi said..

Police forcibly detains protesting Trinamool Congress leaders outside Election Commission's office in Delhi : Mamta

NEW DELHI : A 10-member delegation of the Trinamool Congress (TMC) had announced the dharna after meeting a full-bench of the Election Commission (EC).
TMC leaders were detained by the Delhi Police on Monday while they were holding a dharna outside the Election Commission's office, demanding that the chiefs of CBI, NIA, ED and Income Tax Department be changed.
The delegation urged the Commission to ensure a level-playing field in the Lok Sabha polls and stop the "misuse" of the Central agencies against Opposition parties and leaders, TMC Rajya Sabha member Sagarika Ghose, who was among the leaders who met the poll panel, said.

Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

GURUGRAM : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city.
The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

India developed economy for \$30 trillion by 2047 - Think tank

NEW DELHI : The draft "Vision India @2047" by Niti Aayog will be ready by December this year and publicly unveiled in the next three months, he said.
"Consultations with sectoral groups of secretaries and thought leaders, including industrialists Gautam Adani, Mukesh Ambani and Google CEO Sundar Pichai, will take place in November," CEO Subrahmanyam, the think-tank disclosed on Monday.
Busy in preparing, the NITI Aayog a vision document for India to become a developed economy of about \$30 trillion by 2047, said the Central Government's think-tank.
The PMO had initiated the preparation of this vision document in 2021 with the formation of 10 sectoral groups of secretaries. In 2023, the NITI Aayog was



asked to consolidate the 10 sectoral thematic visions into a combined vision. In 2019, PM Narendra Modi had forecast that India would become a \$5 trillion economy by 2024-25. However, with a declining growth rate, it is expected to reach only \$4 trillion by 2024-25.
Perhaps conscious of this slippage, Subrahmanyam said the vision document would outline the required institutional and structural changes and reforms to become a developed nation

by 2047. "The whole purpose of the vision document is to avoid the middle-income trap," he told the media. The middle-income trap is a situation where a country reaches a stage of development where it can no longer compete internationally in labour-intensive areas because wages are relatively higher. It also cannot compete in higher value-added activities because productivity is relatively lower. Subrahmanyam did not mention the growth rate required to become a \$10 trillion economy by 2047. Speaking last month, Union Minister Hardeep Puri had forecast that the Indian economy would touch \$10 trillion by 2030. Economists had then calculated that it would require India to grow at 9 per cent for the remaining period.
