## Despite directives of Vidhan Sabha committee, not a single FIR lodged against corrupt builders by incumbent Executive Officer

*The 13 member recently constituted Vidhan Sabha committee is headed by MLA Gurpreet Singh Gogi*

DeraBassi : All awry to existing orders of the Vidhan Sabha Committee, this excuse or that other one, the Executive Offr Jagjeet Judge says due to electioneering he could not undertake campaign against the corrupt builders and the associated officials, who had been instrumental in bamboozling the chequer. The letter sent by Vidhan Sabha committee to DeraBassi on 15th March, 2024 reads the associated

officers in crimes, even they were now retired, would not escape adverse and stringent action as the illegal structures in DeraBassi jurisdiction had surpassed the glaring figures of 116. The delayed or non action by the Municipal authorities has not embarrassed the sensitive officer Jagjeet Judge as yet. He says he did not know about the directives of the Vidhan Sabha Committee where as the President of the Civic Body said they are forming two

committees who who would hunt the corrupt builders and initiate requisite action. The question arises how did Mr Upneja come to know about the formation of the Vidhan Sabha Committee and its orders. The Executive Officer Mr Judge should have also come to know and done sincerely the anticipated task and entrusted by the said Vidhan Sabha Committee. The letter also dictates in case the corrupt official has retired the post retire-

ment benefits should be stopped. The 13 member Vidhan Sabha Committee headed by MLA Gurpreet Singh Gogi has exclusively been constituted to review the functioning of civic bodies particularly where malfunctioning has been persistently reported and but was ignored by the incumbent Executive officer of the respective institution. The probable best punitive action would be the registration of the police FIR against

the law offending builders aswell the officials entrusted with the duties of ensuring compliance with the standing practices and laid down orders. The letter of Vidhan Sabha apparently necessitates for reining in the culprits who violated municipal norms and conveniently raised illegal structures, even the Executive officers who did proceed on retirement after availing undue benefits would not be spared. Registration of FIRs would be the only remedial

dose for the illegal beneficiaries since the FIRs can be lodged any time if the offence is perpetrated, gets unfolded against the illegitimate estate builders and the crime is established before the common man. The local Municipal Council as per the data available with the Vidhan Sabha Committee has disclosed 116 illegal structures, colonies and no action as yet has been initiated by the incumbent Executive Officer Jagjeet Singh Judge.

The Commissioner News Service apprised Mr Judge who feigned ignorance about the urgency of Vidhan Sabha letter. In the absence of non enforcement of municipal norms, the morale of the unscrupulous builders has been getting more spiked up and the colonisers would not take the issue of bamboozled very seriously. In the jurisdiction of local municipal body there are 186 unauthorised colonies and buildings unidentified

## NGT slaps fine of Rs 4.6 Cr on Manali MC devoid of solid waste management plant : Huge Environmental Damage

New Delhi : A penalty of Rs 4.60 Cr on Civic body Manali for causing environmental damage has been imposed by the National Green Tribunal. The Municipal Council has failed to manage a solid waste management plant that could have cleansed the environmental pollution in a great deal and filthy air over the spot. The NGT chairperson Justice Parkash Shrivastava and Justice Sudhir Agarwal has directed the Executive Officer of the MC to deposit Rs 4,60,55,962 in three months.



The tribunal has also recommended initiation of criminal action against District Magistrate, Kullu; Executive officer, MC Manali and Principal Secretary, Urban Development Department, Shimla, under the Environmental Protection Act for violating provisions of Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016. The tribunal has ordered that the criminal action might be taken either by the Centre Government or by the Himachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board (HSPSCB). As per the order, the penalty against Manali MC has been levied as an

Environmental compensation under the 'polluter pays' principle for failing to handle, manage and process municipal waste and for polluting the Beas river. The penalty amount which the tribunal has ordered the Manali MC to submit to the HSPSCB will be utilised for "restoring and rejuvenating the damaged environment". The tribunal has also ordered the setting up of a joint committee comprising deputy commissioner, Kullu; member secretary, Central pollution control Board; and Member Secretary, HSPSCB.

## Rs 50 lakh for students health care at GHS Sector 22

Chandigarh: The Government of India has approved Rs 50 lakh for the health care project in the financial 2024-2025, with a potential additional Rs. 1.2 crore to be considered next year based on the project's progress. In 2020, the project was moved to the education department. In Jan 2024, the education department presented it as an innovative idea to the Government of India, and it was approved as the first-of-its-kind project under the Samagra Shiksha scheme with an initial funding of Rs 50 lakh for 2024-25. Aiming to revolutionize health education for students, the education department is set to launch Chandigarh health education



centre at GHS, Sector 22, in December. As per the information, the Rotary Club. is providing equipment and training worth around Rs 1 crore. The engineering department has approved around Rs 71 lakh for renovation, funded by the school education department's budgetary head and the finance department, UT, has accorded concurrence to the department to meet recurring expenditure such as wages of the staff (28 numbers) of around Rs. 1.04 crore per annum from the school education department budget.

## UGC to conduct exams in 2 shifts on 18th June 2024

Chandigarh : National Testing Agency (NTA) has released the schedule of UGC NET 2024 exam. The complete schedule of UGC NET i.e. University Grants Commission, National Eligibility Test 2024 June session may be checked on the official website [ugcnet.nta.ac.in](http://ugcnet.nta.ac.in). The exam will be held on June 18 in two shifts. The morning shift will be held from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. At the same time, in the second shift, there will be an exam of 41 subjects from 3 pm to 6 pm.



City slip will be issued exactly 10 days before the exam. The city slip will have the location of the exam center. Admit cards will be issued only after this. This year UGC-NET exam will be conducted in pen-paper mode for admission to Junior Research Fellowship, Assistant Professor and PhD pro-

grams in 83 subjects. There will be two papers in the exam: Paper 1 and Paper 2. A total of 3 hours will be given to solve both the papers. Both papers will have objective type multiple choice questions. Paper 1 will have 50 questions and Paper 2 will have 100 questions. There will be no negative marking in the exam. According to the new circular of UGC, now admission in PhD program will not be given through PA entrance test held at university

## Delhi Govt may move SC for clearing DERC file by LG

New Delhi: A committee appointed by the apex court to shortlist the candidates had completed the process by the second week of March but the announcement of general elections and implementation of the model code of conduct resulted in the delay of finalizing the appointments. Kejriwal's arrest in the liquor policy case within a week of the announcement of elections further complicated the matter: Since the file can only be sent to LG by CM, sources said the only option govt is now left with is to approach the SC for its intervention. The transaction of business rules has clearly laid down that such proposals have to be endorsed by the chief minister and forwarded by him to LG. Since the minister of power in Delhi govt cannot do it directly, the

The DERC comprises a chairperson and two members. Two posts of members have been lying vacant since the same month.

**EDITORIAL -**

**Police an unalienable tool of governance**

Policing is synonymous with challenges as the police are the first responders to all kinds of legitimate problems confronting the nation. The current challenges before the police and related accountability issues are very complex and need to be understood with due sensitivity in the overall scheme of governance. Law-enforcing agencies find themselves at a crossroads. The police force is in a bind. If it refuses to carry out the orders of the political masters, it can be accused of being disobedient and disloyal to the government; and if it carries out these orders, it often not only violates the due process of law but also inflicts harm on the body politic. The unfortunate part is that this desire to use the police to neutralise opponents is not confined to any political party. The temptation to use the police is too alluring, and with the availability of willing officers, it has spread like a disease. The police are an instrument of the law, designed to enforce laws; its accountability, therefore, should always be traced to the laws and constitutional ideals. At the same time, it is also true that the police are an unalienable tool of governance in the hands of the powers that be. Ideally, governance should always be beholden to the concept of rule of law, but, at times, faultlines become evident when conflicting interests are to be addressed. In such situations, the police have no

option but to act as per the wishes of the ruling dispensation and often constitutionalism takes a back seat; accountability gets blurred by the call of duty. However, it is up to the individual police officer to decide whether to deviate from the constitutional principles to accommodate the political masters. It is here that the strength of character of the officers at the helm of affairs is put to the test; some buckle, whereas others stand tall against all odds. The prevailing administrative sub-culture, probity in private and public life and the quality of the political leadership have a bearing on it. Career-oriented officers have eclipsed true professionals in every department of the government; they prioritise self-promotion without caring for ethics, professional standards and duty towards the nation. Being a careerist is not bad if one remembers one's duty towards the nation and commitment to the rule of law. Indian politics has increasingly embraced indiscipline and irresponsibility. Misuse of power and authority, corruption and usurping powers of the executive are common traits of the political class, though honourable exceptions may always be there. It is a real challenge for the present-day police officers to accommodate their political bosses and maintain their commitment to fair play in their duties. Members of the police force, wielding so much power having a direct

bearing on the life and liberty of people, cannot afford to be indisciplined in their professional conduct. The time has arrived for the police to examine the recruiting system at all levels. Policing has become so technical that generalists cannot do justice to the work at hand. Moreover, there are no parameters regarding aptitude that can be checked prior to recruitment in the police force. Unfortunately, psychologists are not being attached with the recruiting authorities. The profile of crimes and criminals is changing at a faster pace than ever before, but policing methods and practices have not changed proportionately. Accountability is the byproduct of professionalism; the police should upgrade their standard of investigation by overhauling the system. Information technology, artificial intelligence (AI) and cybercrime have already thrown up new challenges to the police; this is the time to evaluate our preparedness to meet them. Inadequate staff strength and un-scheduled multifarious duties are major problems being faced by police force. At the same time, the trend of fake police encounters has to be discouraged and shunned. American policing research pioneer David H Bayley has rightly said: "Illegality in the service of public safety makes policing a furtive and anxious activity and undermines the pride, which is the basis of job satisfaction."

**Compounding regime of synthetic milk**

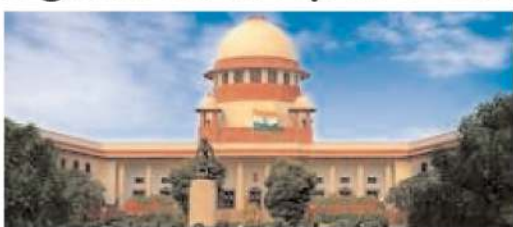
**Salary not paid over 2 months gone, Chandigarh Sports Dept sleeps**

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** Last month, the humiliation faced by outsourced employees was reported. Thereafter, the department released their salaries. However, expecting their salaries, which have been pending for two months, the employees were shocked to receive the salary for a month and their provident fund dues. Virtually, now the employees are awaiting salaries for the months of April and May, to which the officials have turned a blind eye. The UT Administration has gone in a deep slumber as the UT Sports Department employees, hired through the outsourcing system, have not received their salaries for two months. This is for the fourth time in one year and the second delay in recent times, when hundreds of employees, who are already hired on nominal salaries, failed to get their dues. As per the setup, the (sports) department releases the salaried amount to a designated contractor (service provider), who further disburses the funds to the employees. Earlier, the contractor claimed to not have received timely funds from the department to release the employees' salaries. However, this time, sources claimed the contractor is yet to be hired by the



administration to run the operations, leaving hundreds of employees in a lurch. Last year, the same delay in releasing the salaries occurred twice, in March and September, for different reasons. The list of affected employees includes security guards, attendants, cleaners, and gardeners, among others, who are already withdrawing a nominal salary to run their livelihoods. As per a letter (dated May 25, 2022), issued by the Superintendent Personnel for the Secretary, Personnel, Chandigarh Administration, the wages of the persons engaged on a contract basis through outsource are to be disbursed by the 7th of every month by the contractor or service provider. "We are hired at nominal salaries. The authorities should have made prior arrangements to accommodate us. A new contractor was hired in the month of April; however, the company refused to work as they refused to submit the security amount. Thereafter, the process to hire a new contractor has been underway," claimed a security guard, working at a local sports complex.

**Special Lok Adalat from Sept 29 to Oct 3 to be organised in Apex Court**

Round 2 would follow on July 20 in Bengaluru to complete the South Zone qualifiers. The Top 5 riders from each qualifier will feature in the finals on December 15 and 16. The event introduces several firsts that set it

apart. For the first time, a Veterans' Class has been introduced, celebrating the enduring passion and skill of competitors over the age of 50. Additionally, the championship will now feature a team and manufacturers trophy. Starting from Round 3, each event will include a novice training session on the day before the competition, aiming to identify and nurture new talent. Encouraging a diverse range of participation, the competition will comprise 12 championship classes, with cash prizes awarded to the top three berths in each category. In addition, there will be a special class for local, novice riders from each zone.

**Panchkula civic body to allot project to new company**

**Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA :** For the construction of new office building, the MC aims at floating tenders and completing the construction by March 2025. After years of delay due to a fundamental breach of contract and its cancellation, followed by a court case, the Panchkula Municipal Corporation's project of construction of a new office building in Sector 3 is now finally set to be allocated to a new company. Earlier, the Municipal Corporation had allocated the construction of the new building in December 2019 for Rs 29.49 crore. The work was supposed to come to completion in April 2021. However, well before the project could come to completion, it was marred by a fundamental breach of tender conditions due to subletting of part of the work and a delay in execution, after which the company expressed its inability to complete the task. The contract between the MC and the company was



terminated, and the firm was held liable to pay liquidated damages of Rs 2.94 crore along with a 20 per cent penalty for the incomplete work. It was debarred from the tendering process, and its bank guarantee of Rs 1.47 crore was ordered to be forfeited. The court directed the MC to get the work done at the risk and cost of the company. The MC then invited fresh tenders for completion of the pending work; however, as the court had restricted it to finalising the bids only, the company again went to court over the same. As a result, the tender process remained inconclusive. In a recent oral order issued by a single Bench of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, it said the contract between the MC and the

firm envisaged an arbitration agreement and redirected the pending disputes, including the issue of debarment and the risk and cost of the company for completion of the pending work, to the arbitration court. It also allowed the MC to raise construction for the new building either through the existing tender, by issuing a corrigendum, or by inviting fresh tenders. Gian Chand Gupta, Panchkula MLA Speaker of the Haryana Legislative Assembly said the blockages in the way of construction of the new building were removed with the disposal of the court case. Mr Gupta said, "The MC will issue a new tender for the pending work soon, and it will be completed at the earliest."

**Rs 30K penalty for selling food items sans licence**

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** On the basis of material available on record, a notice was served upon Pushpender Singh, the trader on May 29 this year to which accused pleaded guilty and did not claim trial. The trader was found running food business and selling biscuits, rusks, carbonated water, etc, without having food licence. Sachin Yadav, Chief Judicial Magistrate, Chandigarh, has imposed a fine of Rs 30,000 each on two traders for selling food items without having a food licence mandatory under the Food Safety and Standards Act-2006. The court also sentenced the convicts



to undergo imprisonment till the rising of the court. In the first case, the Food Safety Officer, in a complaint filed before the court, stated an inspection was carried out in Mani Majra on August 21 last year. The court said since the accused has pleaded guilty, he was convicted and sentenced to undergo imprisonment till rising of the court and to pay a fine of Rs 30,000. In the second case, the

court convicted Gudia, a shopkeeper in Sector 22, for running a food business without licence. During a checking carried out on August 14 last year, the woman shopkeeper was also found selling milk, paneer, curd, lassi, etc, for human consumption. She also confessed to her guilt. The court sentenced her to undergo imprisonment till rising of the court and fined of Rs 30,000.

## Modi signs first file of farmer outreach to pursue welfare

After signing the file, the PM Modi said, "Ours is a government fully committed to kisan kalyan. It is therefore fitting that the first file signed on taking charge is related to farmer welfare.



We want to keep working even more for the farmers and the agriculture sector in the times to come."

Experts, however, feel the Modi-led NDA government and new Agriculture Minister Shivraj Chouhan still need to do much more to regain the farmers' trust and address the agrarian distress comprehensively.

Official sources meanwhile said the Cabinet decision on housing would help meet the requirements arising out of the increase in the number of eligible families under the PMAY.

The Centre has been

implementing Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana since 2015-16 to provide assistance to the eligible rural and urban households for construction of houses with basic amenities. Under the PMAY, 4.21 crore houses have been completed for the eligible poor families in the last 10 years, the sources said.

All houses constructed under the PMAY are provided basic amenities like household toilets, LPG and electricity connection and functional household tap connection through convergence with other schemes of the Central and state governments.

The provision of free ration to rural poor households and construction of houses for both rural as well as urban poor have been the major focus areas of the Narendra Modi-led government.

The Health Department is planning to launch a comprehensive awareness campaign in the district to educate people against the ill effects, risks and consequences of self-medication.

The Health Department has directed all the programme officers, medical officers and in-charges at the Community Health Centres (CHCs) and Primary Health Centres



(PHCs), urban primary health centres (UPHC) and urban health centres (UHCs), health sub-centres to launch a massive campaign in this regard.

In a letter from the Ministry, specific points have been mentioned, including misdiagnosing the conditions and administering inappropriate medicines which delayed proper treatment, improper use of medicines without the knowledge of action, indication and dose which

may lead to serious drug reactions, Verma added.

Apart from people taking mixed medicines, which may result in harmful drug interactions in the body, improper use of antibiotics for self-medication not only contributes to the antibiotic resistance, but also makes the patient prone to infection with resistant organisms. Scores of medicines especially sedatives and opioids may lead to risk of addiction, he added.

## Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

**GURUGRAM** : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city.

The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

## India envisages developed economy for \$30 trillion by 2047 - Think tank

**NEW DELHI** : The draft "Vision India @2047" by Niti Aayog will be ready by December this year and publicly unveiled in the next three months, he said.

"Consultations with sectoral groups of secretaries and thought leaders, including industrialists Gautam Adani, Mukesh Ambani and Google CEO Sundar Pichai, will take place in November," CEO Subrahmanyam, the think-tank disclosed on Monday.

Busy in preparing, the NITI Aayog a vision document for India to become a developed economy of about \$30 trillion by 2047, said the Central Government's think-tank.

The PMO had initiated the preparation of this vision document in 2021 with the formation of 10 sectoral groups of secretaries. In 2023, the NITI Aayog was



asked to consolidate the 10 sectoral thematic visions into a combined vision. In 2019, PM Narendra Modi had forecast that India would become a \$5 trillion economy by 2024-25. However, with a declining growth rate, it is expected to reach only \$4 trillion by 2024-25.

Perhaps conscious of this slippage, Subrahmanyam said the vision document would outline the required institutional and structural changes and reforms to become a developed nation

by 2047. "The whole purpose of the vision document is to avoid the middle-income trap," he told the media. The middle-income trap is a situation where a country reaches a stage of development where it can no longer compete internationally in labour-intensive areas because wages are relatively higher. It also cannot compete in higher value-added activities because productivity is relatively lower.

Subrahmanyam did not mention the growth rate required to become a \$10 trillion economy by 2047. Speaking last month, Union Minister Hardeep Puri had forecast that the Indian economy would touch \$10 trillion by 2030. Economists had then calculated that it would require India to grow at 9 per cent for the remaining period.

## Hooda calls for early assembly elections

Chandigarh : Former Haryana Chief Minister and Leader of the Opposition, Bhopinder Singh Hooda expressed gratitude toward Haryana's voters, noting a "significant increase" in the Congress vote share from approximately 28% in the 2019 election to almost 48% in 2024. Thursday, Hooda was joined by State Congress president Udaibhan, Rohtak MP, Deepender Singh Hooda, former Union minister and Hisar MP Jai Prakash, Ambala MP Varun Chaudhary and Sonapat MP Satpal Brahmachari. Mr Hooda asserted that these results indicate a "strong public mandate" for the Congress to form the next government in Haryana. "The people of Haryana have voted not for caste or creed, but for progress and devel-

opment," stated Mr Hooda. The Congress leader criticised the BJP for attempting to divide society along caste and religious lines claiming that the electorate prioritised employment, development and education. The former chief minister said that the Congress presented strong candidates who campaigned vigorously, resulting in the highest vote percentage for the party in INDIA alliance across the country.
