Narendra Modi Tops List of Most Popular Global Leaders : Morning Consult

New York : Surpassing the lead of world leaders Joe Biden, Rishi Sunak Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been ranked as the world's most popular leader with an approval rating of 76 per cent, according to a survey by US-based consultancy firm 'Morning Consult'. The Indian prime minister's approval rating is over 10 percentage points higher than the next top leader on the list. Mr Modi was followed by Mexican President Andrés Manuel López Obrador (66%), Switzerland President Alain Berset (58%) and Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva (49%). United States President Joe Biden stands ranked seventh on the list with an approval rating of 40%, his highest approval rating since March. The data, collected by the political intelligence



research firm, is based on a survey of 22 global leaders. According to the data collected from September 6-12, 2023, PM Modi also has the lowest disapproval rating on the list at just 18%. As far as the disapproval rates are concerned, among the top 10 leaders on the list, Canada's Justin Trudeau has the highest disapproval rating of 58 per cent, which is believed to be a possible outcome of Canada's diplomatic fall out with India over Khalistani terrorist Nijjar's killing.

Scam in Punjab State Pharmacy Council unearthed Two Registrars, Superintendent Arrested

Chandigarh : With regard to registration and issuance of certificates to ambitious pharmacists in collaboration with private institutions, Punjab vigilance bureau reportedly has unearthed a scam running into multi crores, rupees in State Pharmacy Council. Two former registrars and accounts superintendent were taken to task and arrested by the sleuths of vigilance bureau. The former registrars were named Parveen Kumar Bhardwaj and Dr. Tezvir Singh and accountant Ashok Kumar who was working as superintendent in the pharmacy council. The oversight lapses in the verification process were found during the registration



of pharmacists. The probe also led to the discovery of numerous fake D-Pharma certificate during routine inspection. It became evident that the accused registrars and officials disregarded stringent protocols and mandated educational qualification during the admission process for D-Pharmacy courses across 105 pharmacy colleges in Punjab. The Punjab State Technical Education Board, responsi-

ble for conducting online counseling for admissions in state government colleges, encountered persistent vacancies in private institution. To fill these seats, private colleges allegedly admitted students from other states in connivance with the said registrars and officials of PSPC without obtaining mandatory migration certificates, accepting significant bribes from unsuspecting candidates.

Zirakpur cries for sterilization of stray dogs

Zirakpur:- Where is the administrative hold to provide peaceful and prosperous life to the inhabitants of Zirakpur. Several residents Prem Kumar (42 yrs), Shano Devi (58 yrs), Sohan Deep (12) were reportedly bitten on Saturday by these undomesticated canines. In Pabhat area Shankar City, Mannat Enclave many residents were bitten by the canines. Other victims of dogs included a resident Om Tiwari (13yrs) besides one was taken to PGI Chandigarh. Several residents have bemoaned saying for the past over 22 yrs, not a single sterilization camp has been organised by the MC officials, that is the reason why the strength of dogs are multiplying.



One resident, including child's father, alleged that the administration has not taken any action despite multiple complaints. As per Dhakoli government hospital records, 40-45 rabies injections were administered daily. On the contrary, there are many unreported cases as people prefer not to go to government hospitals since the treatment over there is not of any use. The victims have to visit Panchkula and

Chandigarh, besides private hospitals. Singh, Executive Officer, MC Zirakpur, said the Animal Welfare Board of India has accorded its approval for the dog pond. With a company an agreement has been executed for this dog problematic attacks. He claimed that constructive action against the canines would be initiated from the next week.

Work on sanctum sanctorum gains momentum as consecration ceremony closes

Ayodhya :The Ayodhya Ram Temple is nearing completion with mere weeks left for the inauguration ceremony. Officials from the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust shared an update on Saturday to highlight the extensive work done on the sanctum sanctorum - where the idol of Ram Lalla will be placed next year. "The sanctum sanctorum of Lord Shri Ramlala is almost ready. Recently, the lighting-fitting work has also been completed. The Sri Ram Janmabhoomi Tirath Kshetra Trust will enthrone Ram Lalla at

the sanctum-sanctorum of the temple between noon and 12:45 pm on January 22. The trust has invited 4,000 saints of all sects for the ceremony. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will also attend the inauguration ceremony. Trust general secretary Champat Rai had earlier said that the idol - depicting the child form of Lord Ram is 90% ready. The 4 feet 3 inch idol is being constructed at three locations in Ayodhya. "Three artisans are building the idol on three different pieces of stone, and one of the idols will be accepted by the Lord. These idols are 90% ready, and the finishing work will take about a week to be done," he had said.

EDITORIAL -

Managing stubble burning a crucial task ?

We require a multi-pronged approach that would address the root causes and encourage sustainable alternatives. The CROP (Conversion, Regulation, Optimisation and Prevention) initiative presents a comprehensive and pragmatic solution. This approach addresses cultural, legal, economic, environmental, political and health concerns simultaneously. The initiative emphasises the potential of alternative energy derived from crop residue. The residue, rich in organic matter, can be transformed into biochar or biofuel with lower emission levels than traditional diesel. Additionally, anaerobic microbes can convert biomass into highly energetic gas, offering an alternative and renewable energy source. Legal measures have been implemented, but their efficacy remains questionable. The CROP initiative suggests a thorough review and strengthening of both legal and surveillance systems, possibly through the establishment of a specialised body under the Ministry of Agriculture. A potential solution is the Happy Seeder, a cost-effective and environment-friendly machine, which can be used to cut and lift straw while simultaneously sowing seeds directly into the soil. However, economic and implementation barriers have hindered widespread adoption of this technology. Educating susceptible individuals about the effects of pollution on health and alternatives through various channels, including social media and advertisements, is crucial. Stakeholders from public and private sectors, politicians, community leaders, physicians and farmers must collaborate to disseminate information effectively. Immediate protection strategies, such as reducing outdoor

activities during high pollution levels and utilising indoor air purification systems, should be promoted. Despite the challenges inherent in implementing the CROP initiative, particularly in India's diverse and democratic landscape, the potential benefits make it a worthwhile investment. Addressing conflicting interests and obtaining a broad consent of stakeholders, especially the powerful agrarian lobby, may be challenging, but it is crucial for the success of initiatives aimed at curbing CRB. To sum up, CRB in India is a local, regional and international public health concern. Because of the excessive amount of crop residue produced and burnt, the health implications are alarming. The cardiopulmonary effects seem the most impactful, notable for increased cardiovascular mortality, coronary artery disease, heart failure, stroke, COPD and asthma. Simultaneous implementation of the four dimensions of CROP is expected to reduce CRB in the country. Crop residue burning (CRB), an extension of agricultural practices, is a key contributor to air pollution in various agriculture-dependent regions globally, including India. Unfortunately, CRB has become a prevalent method due to its perceived convenience compared to proper stubble management, which is deemed expensive and time-consuming. The adverse effects of CRB are most pronounced in states such as Uttar Pradesh (nearly 72 million tonnes or MT of residue per year for cereal crops), Punjab (around 45.58 MT/year) and Haryana (about 24.73 MT annually), where up to 25 per cent of the residue is burnt to prepare the fields for the next crop. This practice contributes

significantly to air pollution, making the country accountable for approximately 26 per cent of the global air pollution-related Disability-Adjusted Life Years (DALY). Moreover, CRB causes environmental degradation and economic losses worth \$300 million annually. CRB-induced air pollution worsens the related health burden, leading to not only respiratory, cardiovascular and skin diseases but also increasing the risk of various cancers. Pathological cardiovascular conditions linked to air pollution include ischemic heart disease, heart failure, arrhythmias (irregular heartbeat), stroke (brain vessel blockage) and hypertension (high blood pressure). Fine-particle air pollution, through various mechanisms, elevates the risk of cardiovascular illnesses and contributes to intravascular thrombosis and atherosclerosis. Moreover, air pollution is also linked with respiratory illnesses such as chronic cough, asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). High levels of particulate matter during crop residue burning cause respiratory health concerns, particularly in children. Local populations, especially farm households, experience adverse effects like coughing, eye discomfort, headaches, nausea and respiratory allergies. The rising pollution in northwestern India has led to thousands of premature deaths and millions of asthma episodes annually. Additionally, air pollution has been associated with neurotoxicity, carcinogenesis, skin aging, skin cancer, microbiome alterations and increased liver enzymes in newborns. There is a correlation between lung cancer incidence rates and exposure to ambient benzo[a]pyrene concentrations in India.

20% hike in Nov GST collection by Panchkula

PANCHKULA : According to the Ministry of Finance, the collection for November stood at Rs 210 crore, Rs 35 crore more than Rs 175 crore collected during the same month in 2022. The goods and services tax (GST) collection in the city last month witnessed an increase of 20% against the gross levy collected during the corresponding period last year. The collection for October stood at Rs 389 crore, Rs 38 crore more than Rs 351 crore collected during the same month in 2022. In September, the UT had witnessed a growth of just 6% with Rs 219 crore mop-up, which was Rs 13 crore more than Rs 206 crore collected during the same month in 2022. In August, the UT



saw a similar growth of 7%. The tax collection was Rs 192 crore against Rs 179 crore during the same month in 2022. The GST collection had registered an increase of 23% in July against the mop-up during the corresponding period last year. The collection for July stood at Rs 217 crore, Rs 41 crore more than Rs 176 crore in the same month last year. The GST collection had registered a growth of 34% in June against the mop-up during the corresponding period last year. The

collection for June stood at Rs 227.06 crore, Rs 57.36 crore more than Rs 169.7 crore in the same month last year. The GST collection for May had witnessed a record increase of 55% against the collection during the corresponding period last year. The collection stood at Rs 259 crore, Rs 92 crore more than Rs 167 crore collected in the same month last year. It was the highest-ever collection for a month by the UT since the inception of the GST.

Poll preparation for local bodies underway for Jan contest

CHANDIGARH : "All the groundwork is complete for the local bodies poll. The model code of conduct will come into force by December 15" revealed highly-placed sources. Elections to at least five Municipal Corporations and 41 municipal councils will be held in the first fortnight of January 2024. The Secretary, Local Government, had issued a notification that elections to five Municipal Corporations, including Amritsar, Patiala, Phagwara, Jalandhar and Ludhiana will be held in the "first fortnight of November". The term of Amritsar and Patiala MCs had ended on January 22, Jalandhar on January 24 and Ludhiana on March 26. The tenure of Phagwara MC had ended in March 2020. The notification came after the Punjab and Haryana High Court in March had asked the State Election Commission to conduct the poll. The Election Commission had committed that the final publication of electoral rolls would be completed by November 10. Sources said the work related to delimitation of wards in the local bodies was complete. They said



preparations were underway to conduct the panchayat poll in the third week of January. Even block samiti and zila parishad elections are also expected to be conducted on the same day. The CM is learnt to have expressed his intention that all elections should be held within a limited time frame. Earlier, the government had decided that panchayat elections would be conducted in two phases. Even delimitation exercise in panchayats was underway. Moreover, January being less hectic for farmers, it's the most ideal month to conduct the poll. The state has around 13,240 panchayats, 150 block samitis and 22 zila parishads. These elections would be a litmus test for the Aam Aadmi Party government's which came to power with a massive mandate in March 2022.

Release Rs 8,000 cr funds for mandis, roads in Punjab withheld by Centre : MP

NEW DELHI : Dr Sandeep Pathak AAP MP appealed to the Centre to release all withheld funds. He said, "The Centre owes Rs 5,500 crore under the Rural Development Fund (RDF) to Punjab. This fund is utilised for the construction and maintenance of roads in rural areas and mandis, directly impacting the agricultural sector. Previous governments used this fund for other purposes." AAP Rajya Sabha MP Dr Sandeep Pathak raised the issue of pending funds for Punjab in Parliament. "Now, the AAP government has ensured that the money is spent solely on mandis and roads in rural areas. Hence, the Modi



government should release this fund without any delay." He said Rs 621 crore under the National Health Mission (NHM) was also pending. The Centre has refused to release this amount, citing that it's not meant for Aam Aadmi Clinics. Pathak informed Parliament that the NHM fund was not being utilised for Aam Aadmi Clinics in Punjab. "This money is meant for medicines, medical equipment, and district and sub-district government hospitals.

Therefore, withholding of these funds is inappropriate," he added. "The Centre is also withholding Rs 850 crore Market Development Fund (MDF) and Rs 1,800 crore Special Assistance Fund. Collectively, this amounts to nearly Rs 8,000 crore, which rightfully belongs to Punjab and its people," said Pathak. He pointed out that if the Modi government continued to deny funds, there would be no option left but to approach the Supreme Court.

43 services at people door step, launched by Arvind Kejriwal, Bhagwant Mann

LUDHIANA : Under the scheme of 43 services AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal and Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann launched the "Bhagwant Mann Sarkar Tuhade Dwar" scheme, aimed at providing citizen-centric services to people at their doorstep, on Sunday. Kejriwal said as many as 43 government services will be

delivered at the doorstep of people. He said to avail these services, people will have to dial helpline number 1076. They will be asked to schedule their appointments according to their convenience to get their work done, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader said. Kejriwal said his government in Delhi started this service in the national capital in 2018.

WhatsApp-based bus ticketing system planned by Delhi government

NEW DELHI : The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) already has a WhatsApp-based ticketing system in place. The service was launched in May this year and subsequently extended to all corridors of the rapid transit system, including the Gurugram Rapid Metro. Now, Delhi government is planning to launch a WhatsApp-based bus ticketing system in the national capital on the lines of the Delhi Metro, officials said. They said the Transport Department of the city government is working on rolling out the digital ticketing system for DTC and cluster buses. There will be a cap on the number of tickets a user can generate. For purchasing Delhi Metro



tickets, passengers have to send a message with the text 'Hi' to +91 96508 55800 on WhatsApp or scan the provided QR code to effortlessly purchase metro tickets using their smartphones across the whole network. Ticket cancellations are not allowed in WhatsApp ticketing. A marginal convenience fee is applied to transactions made via credit or debit card, while no convenience fee is charged for UPI-based transactions.

Rs 100 crore withheld by 500 tax defaulters under Sonapat MC

SONEPAT : The government has directed all municipalities in the state to pace up the recovery of property tax. Tightening the noose over property tax defaulters, the Municipal Corporation has prepared a list of 500 defaulters who owe over Rs 100 crore tax to the civic body. The MC has now started serving notices to the defaulters and launched a sealing campaign against them. As per data, as many as 1.89 lakh properties are registered in MC records, of which 1,631 are agricultural units, 12,297 are commercial, 2,663 industrial, 1,272 institutional, 9,431 mix-use units, 94,799 residential houses, 68,493 vacant plots and 1,001 units fall under special category. The recovery of property tax has been going on at a slow pace and the MC has so far achieved only 30 per cent of its target of Rs 30 crore during Financial Year 2023-24. MC Commissioner Vishram Kumar Meena had directed the taxation branch to prepare defaulters' list and asked them to pace up the collection. The MC has prepared a list of around 500 such defaulters who individually owe more than Rs 3 lakh or more



property tax to the civic body. MC's Zonal Taxation Officer (ZTO) Rajender Kumar had set the target to recover Rs 30 crore as a property tax in the current Financial Year budget but recovery has been very slow and less than Rs 10 crore has been received so far. Notices are being served to all the defaulters with warnings to deposit their pending dues at the earliest or face sealing, the ZTO said. MC chief Meena said the 500 defaulters owe over Rs 100 crore as property tax to the MC. "We have decided to pace up the recovery as only four months of the current financial year are pending," Meena added. A special sealing plan has been launched to seal the properties of major defaulters, he said. Two teams would be formed for the purpose, one would follow ensure recoveries from government departments and the other from the remaining entities, Meena said.

Residents demand revised compensation before demolishing towers: Chintels Paradiso RWA

GURUGRAM : The local administration has asked the builder to clear all financial dues before proceeding with the demolition process. Even as the Gurugram administration gears up for the demolition of five unsafe towers of Chintels Paradiso housing society in Sector 109 here, the condominium's residents are demanding the revision of compensation terms that were agreed upon almost a year ago. The residents discussed a proposal by the promoters of the group to shift fire, electric and water facilities from the unsafe towers (D, E, F, G and H) to the open area of the safe towers (A, B, C and J). The flat owners have demanded an increase in the original buyback price of Rs 6,500 per sq ft. They say it's necessary because the prices of flats in other societies in Sector 109 have increased significantly in one year. They also demanded that rent should be paid to



those demanding the reconstruction of their flats. "We want the revision of the buyback price as it has been over a year and the prices of properties have skyrocketed. We demand a proportionate increase over what is being offered to us by the builder," said Rakesh Hooda, President of Chintels' Resident Welfare Association. Army to evolve more dynamic policy : Cadre aspirations

New Delhi/Dehradun : In view of grouses like in long-standing hogging the promotions in senior ranks, the new policy will address "cadre aspirations" of all arms and services. "It will provide almost equitable satisfaction in promotion boards as well as strengthen meritocracy," the source said.

The new policy will also ensure Major Generals of the "staff stream" are considered for promotion to Lt-Generals, though only for staff positions. At present, Major Generals from the "command and staff stream" are generally promoted to the next rank.

"Moreover, officers physically fit to serve in all terrains will get command



appointments at the Colonel and Brigadier ranks. Battle casualties and those injured in operations, of course, will continue to get promotions like now," the source said. The new promotion policy comes after the Army in August adopted a common uniform for Brigadiers, Major Generals, Lt-Generals and the chief, irrespective of their parent cadre and appointments, by discarding distinctive regimental hats, shoulder rank badges, gorget

patches, belts, lanyards and shoes for them.

"The new policy will help in aligning leadership requirements to the present and emerging operational challenges, both in internal & external dimensions," he added.

The "comprehensive" promotion policy for the "select ranks" of Colonel, Brigadier, Major General and Lt-General will come into effect from January 1.

Withdrawal order by UT on provisional recognition of school stayed : High Court

Chandigarh : The court observed that as long as the school is keeping 25% seats reserved and agrees to fill them as per the outcome of the on going hearing, the order of withdrawal of recognition shall remain stayed.

The copy of the detailed order, however, was not available till the filing of the current report. In its undertaking submitted before the bench by the school through its administrator, Gurpreet Singh Bakshi informed that the school is ready and willing to provide admission to EWS/dis-advantage students at entry level of the school for the academy session for 2024-25 under the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009 to the extent of 25% of the class streng. The admissions made in the school would be subject to outcome of the petition pending before the HC

and the special leave petition (SLP) pending before the apex court where in the issue regarding minority status of the school is a subject matter.

Saint Kabir had challenged the withdrawal of recognition orders passed in May by the Chandigarh administration in the High Court. The school had pleaded that it was not able to start its admission process in the entry level due to the order passed by the administration. The school had also contended that the government was not fulfilling its responsibilities and pushing the school to admit students under EWS without full reimbursement.

Justice Sandeep Moudgil of the HC has passed these orders after the school submitted an undertaking to the court that it would keep 25% seats reserved for the EWS quota for admission in the school.
