New Delhi: Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's first trip in 2018 became a diplomatic disaster after it emerged that a man who had been convicted of attempting to assassinate an Indian politician on Canadian soil somehow ended up on Canada's guest list for an event.On this trip, even before the plane breakdown, Trudeau had been publicly criticized by Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi for allegedly allow-



Global warming subjects glaciers to melt

Evidence shows that change climate accelerating and the extreme weather events are increasing both in frequency and intensity. According to Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), climate change is human-induced phenomenon and so are most of the disasters that occur in the hills. In the Himalayas, it is also becoming increasingly clear that haphazard, unplanned unregulated construction

the name development and to cater to the needs of tourists is working as a force multiplier in terms of the impact of climate change. Besides melting glaciers in the Himalayas due to global warming, human activities such as encroachment riverbeds, building of

hotels and houses on the riverside, widening of roads by indiscriminate cutting of slopes beyond desirable, tunnelling by blasting of rocks, construction of dams and dumping of resultant muck in rivers and streams disturbing the fragile ecosystem of Himalayas, leading to frequent flashfloods and

landslides. The push for running hydropower projects beyond their capacity is also not environmentally and socially sustainable, especially in remote, environmentally fragile climatically vulnerable areas such as Pangi and Lahaul & Spiti. These factors must taken consideration context of the carrying capacity of various areas. Given this background, it is clear that we must present revisit our development model and come up with an entirely approach to development in the Himalayan region — one that is climate-resilient sustainable, and suitable for the wellbeing of residents as well as of tourists. The 'business as usual' approach will not do. The Supreme Court

recently proposed to set up a panel of experts to assess the carrying Himalayan region. It asked the Central Government to provide of names three institutions capable of implementing such a study. This came in the backdrop of the recent devastation in Himachal

Pradesh due unprecedented heavy rain accompanied flashfloods landslides. This study can provide a

basis for future directions to ensure rational and sustainable development in the Himalayan region spread across 13 states and UTs. It will also act as an essential tool for evidence-based policymaking and execution and offer medium/long-term help in strengthening disaster prevention, preparedness and response capacities at the state and local

The study will be an opportunity to conduct an analysis based on a critical review of the carrying capacity by a mapping of the tourist places of the entire Himalayan region of India. It could also ascertain, based on realtime data, the factors responsible for the enhanced impact of disasters in various regions. And finally, based on the findings, it recommend or suggest a way forward in terms of policy and practices to prevent or mitigate the impact of disasters on lives and livelihoods, especially at the community level.

The Himalayan region has several popular tourist destinations. The carrying capacity of such places is closely linked to the population residing permanently and the tourists. An assessment should, therefore, take into account factors such as seasonal influx of tourists to the hills and intensive infrastructure development that puts additional burden on the carrying capacity in terms of land use for construction activities, income and quality of services provided.

The carrying capacity is associated sustainable development as well as the potential impact of climate change. It has a lot to do with the level of human activity that an area can withstand without deterioration of its physical, economic and social environment. Exceeding the carrying capacity has impacted both local residents and tourists.

The findings of the proposed study on the carrying capacity and its recommendations can pave the way for a development model that is environment-friendly and economically as well as socially viable.

Before starting infrastructure development project, an environmental impact assessment needs to be conducted thoroughly. As developmental activities have made the Himalayan extremely unstable. efforts must be made to restore its stability and tread a cautious path in the future.

Rules or the standard procedures operating (SOPs) must be followed strictly by contractors engaged in highway construction or building of hotels or houses. They must be held accountable if found flouting rules and regulations. Clearly, the focus of the governments at the state and local levels should be on the environmental aspects of development works, identification of landslide-prone places and increasing the response

PATIALA: The PPCB authorities have asked the proprietors of dairy farms and gaushalas that as per National Green Tribunal (NGT) orders, it was mandatory to comply with the revised guidelines for environmental management and to have consent to establish a unit. Directing owners of dairy farms and gaushalas to get its consent for operations, the Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB) has asked them to adopt necessary safeguards and ensure compliance of revised environmental guidelines or face penality. This comes as the majority of gaushalas and dairies continue to discharge dung and wastewater into drains, leading to water pollution. The consent include undertaking that the dairies and farms would treat wastewater before releasing it into sewers

and stop dumping bovine dung. The PPCB approval

would be given only if the units would collect dung from the sheds at regular intervals.

"At present, the majority of dairies are flouting norms and polluting both air and water. This has to stop or environmental compensation will be levied against defaulters as per NGT orders. At present, most farms are operating without following any norms," said a top PPCB official. Sources said the recent order came following the problems caused by discharge of dung and wastewater, especially during the floods across Punjab.

"Many dairy farms and gaushalas throw dung along with wastewater into drains, leading to clogging. This ultimately reaches rivers and creates water pollution. The dung produces many gases and compounds which are emitted into atmosphere," said PPCB Chairman Adarsh Pal Vig.

Amrinder Singh Raja Warring state Congress chief claimed that the government's action had laid bare the double standards of the AAP leadership, who




consistently criticised the Central government for snatching their powers. "The incom petent CM of Punjab is spoon-fed by his masters in Delhi," he

Chandigarh: "Bids have been allotted and work is progressing well. The airport terminal would give connectivity to the Army area. There was initially some hurdle as the contract for internal roads had to be terminated and reallocated, which led to some delay. The Airport Authority of India (AAI) will take over once the construction is complete," said a PWD
