is procured from the property tax which deliberately by the Municipal officials remain uncollected and the revenue loss is perpetrated manyfolds, (comments on anonymity basis), a businessman who regularly had been paying his taxes. Law exists equally enforceable for all, but the treatment differs and remains historical blunder in this satellite town where revenue is earned daily in lakhs of rupees for the development and catering to public



amenities. It is widely discussed in the revenue circles that Zirakpur has gained the glory of becoming no. 1 city to amass highest revenue in Punjab, if the statistics are to be believed by any analyst for the references. At many occasions, dust had been raised on the carelessness being rendered by the big wigs in satellite town mainly by the builders who think themselves above the enforced laws. In a day last week on 8 Dec Municipal Corporation Chandigarh collected Rs 58 Cr from the defaulters of

long pending unpaid property tax Ms Anandita Mitra Commissioner had shown tough postures toward the persistent faulty behaviour by stealing tax. A total of 41.26 Cr commercial and Rs 16.83 Cr residential tax stood unpaid for long period, said the Commissioner. Water, Power connection would be snapped if tax is not deposited. Despite several notices, the legal obligations was not being executed. It does not behave like an ideal institution which ignores mandatory practice



of tax collections yet it happens with local Civic body. Several lacs of property tax is lying uncollected from, take it property big wigs and other local biz tycoons. Despite many efforts in the morning on 13th Dec 2022, Tuesday at about 11:30 AM Ravneet Singh, Executive Officer was not available for seeking his comments and Municipal Engg, Vijay Mahajan said that he was not dealing with the collection of property taxes and Executive Officer only could give his remarks on failure of tax collection.

45% grievances soar against police: Haryana Human Rights Commission

CHANDIGARH: A total of 18,659 complaints were received and 8,367 (44.8 per cent) out of them were against the police said HHRC (The Haryana Human Rights Commission) chairperson Justice SK Mittal (retd). The HHRC has completed 10 years, stated that close to 45 per cent of the complaints before them were against the police during January 1, 2016, to November 30, 2022. As many as 1,035 complaints (5.5 per cent) were related to



women's issues, 818 complaints (4.3 per cent) to services, 440 to the health sector (2.3 per cent) and 403 were related to jails (2.1 per cent). Justice Mittal revealed on complaints against police, that half of them proved to be bogus. "However, compensation has

been provided against police atrocities and action against police officials has also been recommended in many cases," he added.

Members of the Commission, Justice KC Puri (retd) and Deep Bhatia, were present on the occasion. "Due to the efforts of the HHRC, the Jails Department framed a policy in 2021 for the payment of compensation on account of deaths of prisoners in the jails. Even, the National Human Rights Commission praised it," said Justice Mittal.

Reshuffle of ministers likely this month

New law on judicial appointments can replace existing collegium system : Supreme Court

NEW DELHI : The scheme of the Constitution requires the court to be the final arbiter on the position of a law as enacted by leading a three-judge Bench Parliament, says Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul. The Supreme Court said nobody is stopping the government from bringing a new law on judicial appointments, but till then Collegium system and its Memorandum of Procedure is the "final word". The court's remarks to the government came after Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankar criticised the striking down of the National Judicial Appointments Commission (NJAC) Act by a Constitution Bench in October 2015. Mr. Dhankar, obliquely referring to the NJAC law, said the court had "undone" the will of the people expressed through the Parliament. "Yes, Parliament has the power to enact laws. The government can ask the Parliament to lay down a new



law. Nobody can prohibit it. You want to bring a new law, gather consensus, you can always do that. However, then you may have to stand the scrutiny of a challenge. The scheme of the Constitution requires the court to be the final arbiter on the position of a law as enacted by the Parliament," Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul, leading a three-judge Bench, addressed Attorney General R. Venkataramani, for the government. The court said the law on judicial appointments to the High Courts, as it stands now, is the Collegium system evolved by the Supreme Court in

the Three Judges cases.

Our job is to enforce the law as it exists now. When you (government) lay down a law, you expect the Supreme Court to enforce it. Similarly, if a law (Collegium system) is laid down by the Supreme Court, then the government is equally bound to follow the law.

Mr. Venkataramani said it was "very unfortunate" to hear that "only one part follows the rule of the law and the government does not". He said the government considered the appointment of judges to the constitutional courts a matter of national importance.

He said the government's views for finalisation of the Memorandum of Procedure (MoP) was sent to the Supreme Court on July 11, 2017. But the court responded that the "final view" of the Collegium on the MoP was received by the government months before, on March 13, 2017.

Respect people's mandate, parliamentary's sovereignty

NEW DELHI : The duly legitimized constitutional prescription" of the (NJAC) National Judicial Appointments Commission through the 99th Constitutional Amendment Bill, passed unanimously by both Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, was "judicially undone", said Jagdeep Dhankhar, the chairman of Rajya Sabha. Addressing Rajya Sabha for the first time as its chairperson, he said, "It was a glaring instance of severe compromise of parliamentary sovereignty and disregard of the mandate of the people of which this House and Lok Sabha are custodians."

Dhankhar has been raising the matter in different forums over the last few days, which comes amid the friction between the Centre and Supreme Court over the



appointment of judges through the apex court's collegium system. Mr Dhankhar in Rajya Sabha, said the "historic parliamentary mandate" for NJAC was struck down by the SC in October 2015 by a majority of 4:1 on the ground that it was not in consonance with the judicially evolved doctrine of the "basic structure" of the Constitution.

"We need to bear in mind that in democratic governance, the basis of any 'basic structure' is the prevalence of the primacy of the people's mandate reflected in

Parliament. Parliament is the exclusive and ultimate determinative of the architecture of the Constitution," he said. "It is disconcerting to note that on such a momentous issue, so vital to democratic fabric, there has been no focus on it in the Parliament for over seven years now. This House, in concert with Lok Sabha, being custodian of the ordainment of the people, is duty bound to address the issue, and I am sure it will do so," he added. He said democracy blossoms and flourishes when its three facets the legislature, judiciary and executive scrupulously adhere to their respective domains. "Any incursion by one, however subtle, in the domain of the other, has the potential to upset the governance apple-cart," he said.

Feminist dress code an ideological pillar in Iran

In the months before the protests began in mid - September, videos of the morality police dragging women into vans bound for re - education centers in one case, while the woman's mother begged them to stop had stirred fresh outrage among Iranians. In September, the US imposed sanctions on the morality police. Security forces have responded to the protest movement with a crackdown that has left hundreds dead, and the government has threatened harsh punishment for dissent including executions. Rights groups say that at least 300 people have been killed since the protests began, including 50 minors, and the United Nations has said that some 14,000 people have been arrested. Demonstrators fed up with political repression, censorship, corruption and economic mismanagement have called for an end to the Islamic Republic. They have taken aim directly at the most powerful man in Iran, Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, whom they want removed from power. In recent years, Iranian women had grown bolder within the constraints of the dress law, embracing colourful robes, barely covering their hair in loose wraps and, in some cases, even letting their head scarves drop onto their shoulders, baring their hair. Though the morality police still

roamed the streets, enforcement appeared spotty. When Amini died in custody after being arrested by the morality police on a Tehran street, the nationwide protests that followed focused initially on the Islamic dress laws. The protests, now in their third month, have been led by women and young people demanding an end to clerical rule and greater social freedom, tapping into years of pent - up anger. Protesters chanted "woman, life, freedom," tore off their hijabs, burned them in street bonfires and cut their hair in symbolic acts of defiance. University students chanted "Killings after killings, to hell with morality police" But the protests soon grew to encompass the entire range of discontents with Iran's ruling establishment, making it unclear whether protesters would be satisfied with this concession. Iran has abolished the morality police, according to an announcement by the attorney general carried on state media, following months of protests set off by the death of a young woman who was being held by the force for supposedly violating the country's strict Islamic dress laws. The morality police "was abolished by the same authorities who installed it", the statement by attorney general Mohammad Javad Montazeri said, according to state media reports.

The judiciary would still enforce restrictions on "social behaviour". He also indicated that the authorities were reviewing the head scarf regulations. But it was not clear whether the authorities planned to relax the hijab law, which remained in force. There was, however, no confirmation of the closure from the interior ministry which is in charge of the morality police, and Iranian state media said Montazeri was not responsible for overseeing the force. The decision to scrap the - morality police was the government's first major concession to the protesters. Residents posting on social media and newspapers such as Shargh daily say there have been fewer sightings of the morality police on the streets in recent weeks as authorities apparently try to avoid provoking more protests. The primary role of the morality police was to enforce the laws related to Iran's conservative Islamic dress code, imposed after the 1979 Islamic Revolution and recently invigorated by the country's new ultraconservative president. The dress code for women became an ideological pillar of the ruling clerical establishment, central to its identity. The restrictions require women to cover their bodies in long, loose clothing and their hair with a head scarf or hijab.

Chargesheet filed against Sundar Sham former minister

CHANDIGARH : The supplementary charge sheet would be presented in due course as further investigation is being conducted in the case. However the Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB) on Monday submitted charge sheet (Challan) before a competent court at SAS Nagar against former minister Sunder Sham Arora on completion of partial investigation in a bribery case. A VB spokesperson said a bribery case was registered against former Punjab minister on the complaint of Manmohan Kumar, posted as Assistant Inspector General (AIG) of Police, VB. On October 14, 2022, AIG Manmohan Kumar received a WhatsApp call from Sunder Sham Arora, he gave a complaint to the Chief Director, Vigilance Bureau, Punjab. He introduced himself as the complainant's old known acquaintance and further told that his wife had passed away. Thereafter, Arora



requested the complainant that he wants to share his joys and sorrows after coming to his house. Afterwards, the former minister arrived at the house of the complainant and started discussing the matter pending against him in the VB. To get help on this matter he offered a bribe of Rs 1 crore. The accused further offered the complainant to pay half amount of Rs 50 lakh as advance bribe and the remaining to be paid later on. The former minister was trapped/arrested by a VB team in the presence of two independent government witnesses, while he was handing over a bag containing Rs 50 lakh bribe money. Presently, he is in jail under judicial custody.

Major parties start canvassing for 2024 Lok Sabha poll

CHANDIGARH : National Party President JP Nadda recently visited the party office and asked the leaders and cadre to hit the ground for the Lok Sabha polls. Nevertheless the 2024 Lok Sabha elections are more than a year away, major political parties — the BJP, Congress and AAP — have started their campaign early by reaching out to the masses in a bid to make an impact. The BJP has already started holding party meetings. National BJP information and technology (IT) cell head Amit Malviya also addressed party leaders at the city office and directed them to utilise digital media tools at their



disposal to reach out to the people. Arun Sood, city BJP chief, says: “Our preparations for 2024 have been on for the past five months and will go on till the elections. We recently held Shakti Kendra Sammelan and will organise a Booth Samiti Sammelan this month, wherein 6,000 to 9,000 office-bearers will be in attendance. We are holding election-oriented activities at all 595 polling booths. Subject-based panels have been formed to mitigate people’s problems.”

Space not allotted, shifting of grain market be delayed

CHANDIGARH : During a meeting of the Administrator's Advisory Council, Charanjiv Singh, president, Chandigarh Beopar Mandal, requested the administration to allot sites/shops available at the new mandi to commission agents at a reserve price. The shifting of the grain, fruit and vegetable market from Sector 26 to the new site in Sector 39 is likely to get delayed further as the UT Administration is still waiting for permission from the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for the allotment of space at the new site. In an action taken report on the issues mentioned during the meeting, the UT Administration stated the Centre had been requested by the UT Agriculture Secretary vide a letter dated May 5, 2021, followed by reminders to grant permission for adopting the Punjab State Agricultural Marketing Board (Sale and Transfer of Plots) Rules, 1999, for disposing of sites at the second grain, fruit and vegetable market in Sector 39. The UT stated that the reply to the same was still awaited. The last reminder was sent to the Secretary, MHA, on August 26. “Since permission is still awaited from the MHA, a

meeting will be held with stakeholders to reach an agreement on auction of sites as per Estate Rules, 2007, by giving preference to the current licence holders of the Sector 26 market,” stated the authorities. Recently, the Mandi Board had invited suggestions from the stakeholders for the allotment of sites at the new mandi. A commission agent said the process to shift the Sector 26 mandi to Sector 39 was started in 2007, but the UT Administration had failed to finalise a policy for allotment of sites at the new mandi to date. He suggested the administration should allot the sites at reserve prices to be calculated on the basis of the cost of the land and the amount spent on creating the infrastructure, instead of the current market value of the land. He said the administration was waiting for a tragedy to happen. Most buildings in the Sector 26 mandi were no longer safe. There was wild growth and rats had hollowed out the land below. He said other major problems faced by the traders were poor cleanliness and a shortage of space. Fruits and vegetables arrived here from all over the country but sometimes, there was not enough space to unload the vehicles, he added.

Govt to interview candidates for Vice Chancellor of BFUHS



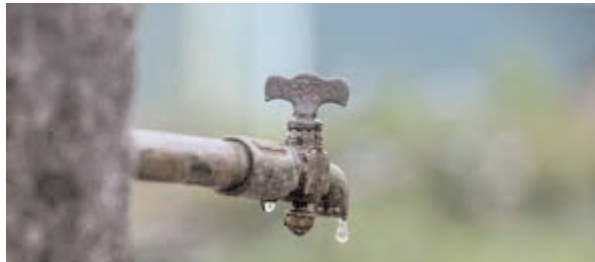

CHANDIGARH : The state government has now decided to conduct interviews of all candidates while taking precautions to save itself from any traumatic instance as has earlier clashed. The Governor had snubbed the university authorities for bypassing the procedure during selection of the Vice Chancellor (VC) of Baba Farid University of Health Sciences (BFUHS). The decision was taken at a meeting chaired by Chief Secretary Vijay Kumar Janjua on November 24. It was decided at the meeting that this time in search and selection committee a representative of the University Grants Commission would also remain present. Apart from that an expert from outside, who is not linked to Punjab's Department of Medical Education or the BFUHS, would be part of the committee. In October, the government had sent a file to Governor recommending cardiologist Dr Gurpreet Wander for the post of

the VC. However, it became a huge embarrassment for the government when Governor Banwarilal Purohit, who is chancellor of the BFUHS, sent back the file to the government and conveyed that proper procedure was not being followed during the selection of the VC. As per the past practice, for selection of a VC of state universities, a short list of candidates is prepared after scrutiny of applications. Following that the search and selection committee headed by Chief Secretary holds interviews of shortlisted candidates. However, no

interviews of candidates were conducted during the selection and the government sent just one name for Governor's approval, which he refused. The Governor had even asked the Chief Minister to remove Punjab Agricultural University Vice Chancellor Prof Satbir Singh Gosal. For the last about 6 months the post of the VC of the BFUHS has been lying vacant when after facing humiliation at the hands of Health and Medical Education Minister Chetan Singh Jauramajra, Dr Raj Bahadur had tendered resignation from the post.

Groundwater level dips becoming cause of worry



The question was asked by Raghav Chadha, MP from Punjab. The home district of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, Sangrur, is among the worst affected areas. The water level has dipped into the ‘very deep’ category in the district. The MoS, in his reply to the questions, said the groundwater level in Sangrur (November 2021) was more than 47 metre below the ground level. Of the 24 ground wells meant to monitor the level,

13 had the level which was judged to be in the ‘very deep’ water category (20-40), while 11 wells reported very critical ground water level. Mansa, Barnala, Patiala, Fatehgarh Sahib and Ludhiana, covering the majority of the Malwa region, have reported ‘very deep’ water level. Tudu said the Central Ground Water Board (CGWB) was periodically monitoring the groundwater levels throughout the Country, including Punjab,

on a regional scale, through a network of monitoring wells. When asked about the steps taken to address the water scarcity and pollution problem in the state, he said water being a state subject, water scarcity and pollution problems fall under the states’ mandate. However, the Central Government had taken up a number of initiatives for the sustainable management of groundwater, said the MoS.

Annual recruitment for 1,800 constables, 300 sub-inspectors cleared by Punjab Cabinet

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The idea behind holding annual recruitment is to ensure that all vacancies in the state are filled, especially in wake of the current law and order situation in the state. Just two days back, a police station in Tarn Taran was attacked with an RPG. The recruitment will be done in a transparent manner. The decision was taken in a meeting chaired by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann. After the Cabinet meeting, Finance Minister Harpal Cheema said a schedule for this annual recruitment has been cleared by the Council of Ministers. The recruitment process will start in January each year, with written exams being conducted in May- June and physical tests to be conducted between September 15-30 each year.



“The recruitment process will be completed in one year,” said Cheema. Punjab Cabinet has decided to recruit 1800 Constables and 300 Sub Inspectors in Punjab Police every year. “ In Punjab, various posts of NCC have been lying vacant. We have decided to fill 203 posts immediately. The recruitment has not taken place in past five to six years,” said the Finance Minister. In addition, the

Cabinet had also decided to fill 710 posts of revenue patwaris. The Cabinet has also given its approval to recover Rs 186 crore from anyone who is using water meant for irrigation to other uses. It has also been decided to extend the timeline given to crusher units in the state for submitting their security deposit.

Harpal Cheema commits to develop horticulture

Commissioner News Service SANGRUR : Finance, Excise and Taxation Minister Harpal Cheema said he would visit more farmers to offer them the required help in the coming days. He appreciated Balwinder’s initiative and appealed to other farmers to plant fruit gardens as per the recommendations of the Horticulture Department.

Mr Harpal Cheema visited the dragon fruit farm planted by progressive farmer Balwinder Singh of Rogla village in Dirba. “The AAP government has been providing subsidy for planting fruit trees and garden machinery. I want to get direct feedback from our progressive farmers to offer them the required help. We will help such farmers



in the best way as the promotion of diversification can help the state in coming out of the paddy-wheat cycle,” the minister said. The minister said the decision of planting a dragon fruit farm would open new avenues of economic empowerment for farmers. Talking about his fruit farm, Balwinder said he had planted the farm last year and the abundant production this year had encouraged him a lot. “The visit by the minister will give other farmers confidence to get ready for diversification.

Environment pollution soars, 14 illegal dyeing units sealed

Commissioner News Service FARIDBAD : The action by The Haryana State Pollution Control Board (HSPCB) comes in response to a complaint lodged by an environment activist on the portal of the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) in August. HSPCB has sealed as many as 14 dyeing units working in an illegal manner in the city in the past six weeks. However, it is claimed that the menace of the units posing a serious health and environment hazard is not over as action is yet to come against a large number such units that are reported to be functional. Varun Gulati, the complainant, revealed that he has been informed by the HSPCB authorities that several units identified in the grievance raised by him have been closed. These include nine units sealed on



October 31 and another five units shut on December 8. He said while the majority of the units had been operating in the localities of Kutta Farm, Surya Vihar part two and part three, Dheeraj Nagar and Tilpat village area, many more units are still functional at Bhood Colony and Basantpur. Claiming that the number of illegal dyeing units which consume 2-10 lakh litres of water per day could be more than 50 at present, he said many units tend to shift elsewhere when they are

issued notice or get sealed. Alleging gross violation of pollution norms, Varun Sheokand, another activist who had lodged a complaint with the NGT in 2016 in this regard, said that dumping or release of chemical-laced water in the open or in drains had failed to come to an end, resulting in water pollution. Alleging corruption, he said unauthorised electricity connections were being provided to such units with no surveillance on the part of the officials concerned against such activity.

Air India to replace Airbus A350, Boeing 787 and 777

Commissioner News Service PARIS/NEW DELHI : The replacing orders by Air India would include 400 narrow-body jets and 100 or more wide-bodies, including dozens of Airbus A350s and Boeing 787s and 777s, revealed industry sources. Air India is close to placing landmark orders for as many as 500 jetliners worth tens of billions of dollars for both Airbus and Boeing as it carves out an ambitious renaissance under the Tata Group conglomerate, industry sources said on Sunday. Such a deal could top \$100 billion dollars at list prices, including any options, and rank among the biggest by a single airline in volume terms, overshadowing a combined order for 460 Airbus and Boeing jets from American Airlines over a decade ago. Even after significant



expected discounts, the deal would be worth tens of billions of dollars and cap a volatile year for an industry whose jets are back in demand after the pandemic but which is facing mounting industrial and environmental pressures. Airbus and Boeing declined to comment. Tata Group-owned Air India did not respond to a request for comment. The potential order comes days after Tata announced the merger of Air India with Vistara, a joint-venture with Singapore Airlines, to create a bigger full-service carrier and strengthen its presence in domestic and international skies. The

planned order reflects a deliberate strategy to win back a solid share of traffic flows to and from India, which are currently dominated by foreign carriers such as Emirates. Air India also wants to win a bigger share of regional international traffic and the domestic market, setting up a battle on both fronts with IndiGo. But experts warn many hurdles stand in the way of Air India’s ambition to recover a strong global position, including frail domestic infrastructure, pilot shortages and threat of tough competition with established Gulf and other carriers.

SIT summons Sukhbir Badal in Kotkapura firing

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Sukhbir Singh Badal former Deputy Chief Minister and also held home affairs portfolio when the Kotkapura police firing incident took place in 2015, has been asked by the SIT to appear at the Punjab Police Officers’ Institute here with relevant records. Mr Sukhbir Singh Badal has now been summoned by ADGP LK Yadav-led Special



Investigation Team (SIT) in the 2015 Kotkapura police firing incident. Earlier, the SIT had summoned Sukhbir on August 30 and September 14, but the former Deputy CM had not “received” the summons as he was said to be out of the country.

'NRI Punjabi naal milni' on December 16

Five milnis (meetings) with NRIs will be held in different districts, including Jalandhar. With a view to resolving issues and complaints of the non-resident Indians (NRIs), the state government is organising the ‘NRI Punjabi naal Milni’ on December 16. Disclosing this here, Gurpreet Kaur Sapra, Commissioner, Jalandhar Division, and Chairman, NRI Sabha, said the milni at Jalandhar would be organised at St Soldier Campus near NIT on the Jalandhar-Kartarpur National Highway. She further said senior officers of all departments concerned would remain present during the meeting to hear the complaints of NRIs so as to ensure prompt redress. She said the registration of NRIs



would take place from 10:30 am onwards and immediate after registration ‘milni’ proceedings would commence. Dhaliwal would personally meet the members of Punjabi diaspora, said the Divisional Commissioner, adding that NRIs from the Doaba region from Jalandhar, Kapurthala, Hoshiarpur and Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar (Nawanshahr) districts would participate in this initiative. Besides, Principal Secretary J Balamurugan, ADGP (NRI Wing) Praveen Kumar Sinha, Deputy Commissioner of Police and SSPs of these districts would also be present there to initiate the process for resolving their complaints

with immediate effect. The Divisional Commissioner urged the NRIs to actively participate in the ‘NRI Punjabi Naal Milni’ so that their complaints could be sorted out besides getting their valuable suggestions to facilitate them. Pertinently, after Jalandhar, the next milni will be held at SAS Nagar (Mohali) on December 19, Ludhiana on December 23, Moga on December 26 followed by Amritsar on December 30. But till then you have to follow the law which is existing today and our job is to enforce the law as it stands today. We have to go by the law not by what your grievances are, any law declared by this court is binding," the bench said. The court noted that the



Centre recently sent back 19 names, of which 10 were reiterated by the collegium.

Frowning upon public criticism of the collegium system by top government functionaries, the SC on Thursday said no one,

including the government, is allowed to choose the laws and rules to be followed and everyone is bound by all laws of the land. The bench said that it was troublesome that the government was sitting on the recommendations of the apex court collegium for years and blocking names for "undisclosed reason" despite the fixed timeline and also being selective in clearing names.

Sector 8 Panchkula witnesses Free Wi-Fi service

PANCHKULA : Wi-Fi facility has been started by the Municipal Corporation in collaboration with Taksh Media Private Limited. Mayor Kulbhushan Goyal and Municipal Commissioner Virender Lather were also present at event inaugurated by Gian Chand Gupta, Haryana Assembly Speaker. Mr Gupta said the company should also ensure that Wi-Fi worked smoothly. Ashok, director of the company, said Internet with a 200 Mbps speed will be available in a radius of 120 metre daily. He said Wi-Fi service had also been started near DC Model School located in Sector 7 and near the Sector 20 market. This free service would be available free of cost daily from 8 am to 11 pm. A total of 20 LED screens have been installed by the MC, of which Wi-Fi will be made available on eight screens by December 31. By March 31, a total of 65 Wi-Fi zones will be



created in the city. Meanwhile, Wi-Fi facility stopped functioning around 6 pm as people complained they could not access signal. The Mayor said there must be heavy traffic in the evening when a large number of people visited markets. People may witness some glitches in the beginning but with the passage of time, the system would be improved by the company, he added. Ashok, director of Taksh Media Private Limited, said his staff checked the Wi-Fi setup and found it functioning properly. He said the Wi-Fi connection would be available only within 120-metre radius of the LED screen, not in the internal market of the sector.

Russia welcomes India's postures not to support G7's price cap on crude oil

MOSCOW : Russia has welcomed India's decision not to support the price cap on Russian oil announced by the G7 countries and their allies. Alexander Novak ,Russian Deputy Prime Minister made the statement during his meeting with India's Ambassador to Russia, Pavan Kapoor. The Deputy Prime Minister welcomed India's decision not to support the price cap on Russian oil, which was imposed on 5 December by the G7 countries and their allies," the Russian Foreign Ministry said in a statement. The Group of Seven major powers, the European Union and Australia last week agreed to a \$60 per barrel price cap on Russian seaborne crude oil after EU members overcame resistance from Poland. Russia was ranked second in terms of oil shipments to India this summer. The price ceiling seeks to restrict Russia's revenue as punishment for its assault on Ukraine while making sure Moscow keeps supplying the global market. Mr Novak described introducing a price cap on Russian oil as an "anti-market measure" which he stressed affects supply chains. "The introduction of a price cap on Russian oil is



an anti-market measure. It disrupts supply chains and could significantly complicate the situation in global energy markets. Such non-market mechanisms disrupt the international trading system as a whole and set a dangerous precedent in the energy market," Novak said in the statement. of oil products and coal . Mr Hardip Singh Puri Union minister for petroleum and natural gas recently said that the price cap on Russian crude oil will not affect India as the country's exposure to Russian oil is not significant. Mr Puri said that Russia is not the top supplier of oil to the country, while Saudi Arabia, Iraq, and UAE are the traditional major suppliers of crude. Further, Novak offered cooperation to India on leasing and building large-capacity ships in order to not to depend on the ban on

insurance services and tanker chartering in European Union and the United Kingdom, the statement said. Meanwhile, Russia, the world's biggest exporter of energy, could cut oil production and will refuse to sell oil to any country that imposes the West's "stupid" price cap on Russian oil, President Vladimir Putin said recently. "This will lead to the collapse of the industry itself because the consumer will always insist that the price be lower. The industry is already under-invested, under-funded, and if we listen only to consumers, then this investment will be reduced to zero," Putin said. All this will lead at some stage to a catastrophic surge in prices and to the collapse of the global energy sector. This is a stupid proposal, ill-conceived and poorly thought-out."

Govt shelves proposal for AIJS

NEW DELHI : In view of the existing divergence of opinion amongst stakeholders, there is no such proposal of AIJS (All India Judicial Services) at this juncture,said Kiren Rijiju law minister. He counted the merits of such a mechanism: This will give an opportunity for induction of suitably qualified fresh legal talent selected through a proper all india merit selection system as well as address the issue of social inclusion by enabling suitable representation to marginalised and deprived sections of society." The proposal drafted by the law ministry to set up a recruitment system for appointments at the level

of district judges on the lines of Union Public Service Commission for selection of IAS/ IPS, had been pending since 2012.in a response to a question raised in Lok Sabha law minister Kiren Rijiju said there has been a divergence of opinion among different stakeholders, including some of the state governments and the high courts, on having an independent recruitment system. The government has junked for now the proposed All India Judicial Service (AIJS), a recruitment mechanism for appointment at the level of district judges who could be later elevated to the higher judiciary, depending on merit, at a relatively younger age.

Washington : No more bilateral relation would go sans competition, and will not be simply based on anxiety factor around China. India will not be an ally of the United States but will be another great power, a top White House asserting there is no other bilateral relationship that is being "deepened and strengthened" more rapidly than between the two countries over the last 20 years. Responding to a question on India during his appearance at the Aspen Security Forum meeting here, Kurt Campbell, the White House Asia coordinator, said that in his view India is the most important bilateral relationship for the United States in the 21st century. "The United States needs to invest even more of its capacity, and building in people to people ties, working together on technology and other issues, he said. "India has a unique strategic



character. It will not be an ally of the United States. It has a desire to be an independent, powerful state and it will be another great power. There are inhibitions in both of the bureaucracies and there are many challenges, he noted. But I do believe that this is a relationship that should have some ambition. We should look at things that we can do together, whether it's in space, whether it's education, whether it's on climate, whether it's on technology, and really move in that direction," he said. Campbell acknowledged that Indians were ambivalent when President Joe Biden and his administration decided to take the Quad to the leader level.

"There were probably voices in their bureaucracy that were against it. But when President Biden made the direct appeal repeatedly to Prime Minister Modi, they decided that this was in their interests," he said.

"I'm thrilled to say that Prime Minister Albanese of Australia has invited us in 2023 for a major Quad meeting that we think will extend our coordination, cooperation, not just in Southeast Asia, and the Indo Pacific as well," he said.

"I'm very bullish on the Quad. I think it will remain an unofficial venue. But it has many lines of communication, and it's led to strengthening and deepening of coordination between these four key maritime democracies," Campbell said.

The Quad, known as the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue, is a group of four countries: the United States, Australia, India, and Japan.

Contract agreement to be more transparent

The sub committee of the cabinet headed by the CM with minister in - charge of the department as its members will be competent to decide the matter beyond 20 %, he added.

In respect of revision due to change in structural design and revision due to change in the scope of work, the existing system would continue if the allotted work cost was less than Rs 1 crore, added Mr Kaushal.

DCs to head 521 upgraded health centres by 31 Dec

CHANDIGARH: Buoyed with the response of Aam Adami Clinics, the Punjab government is looking to equip all the primary health centres in 23 districts with standardized human resources, infrastructure, medicine and diagnostics. There are a total of 521 PHCs in the state with each PHCs ----the first contact point between the village community and the medical officer -catering to a population of 30,000.

For improving the services of these centres, the government has decided to form districts health societies to be headed by Deputy Commissioners with Civil Surgeon as CEO of the society

These societies will be responsible for ascertaining the requirement and execution of the infrastructure, strengthening of each PHC in their jurisdiction and they have been advised to identify multiple execution agencies in the districts to take up the work. The government will provide maximum of Rs 25 lakh for the upgradation of infrastructure -civil work,

repair, renovation, branding and furniture ---for each PHC.

As per the guidelines framed by the health department, the district health societies will prepare rough cost estimates, which will be uploaded online.

The districts health societies will have to maintain the photographic record of infrastructure depicting the nature of the status of the facility before the start and after the completion of work. The district health society will issue 20% of the allocated funds as advance to executing agency while the next 50% of the estimate will be issued on 20% physical progress of the work and the remaining 30% on the completion of work. The government has set a target of completing the infrastructure strengthening of all centres by December 31.

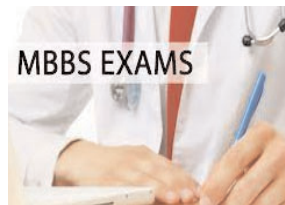


MBBS exam nears, protesting students join classes

Xi to buy more gas, oil from gulf Arab

DUBAI : Chinese President Xi Jinping urged the Arab countries to conduct energy sales in the Chinese Yuan, potentially divorcing the US dollar from transactions in a region where the US still stations thousands of troops.

Standing at the crossroads of history, we must renew the tradition of friendship between China and the GCC, (Gulf Cooperation Council)" Xi said. He praised the GCC countries



Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the UAE as they "actively sought political solutions to regional hotspots" and invited their astronauts to China's Tiangong space station. Xi also said China plans to build a joint China-GCC Nuclear Security Demonstration Center

that will train 300 personnel on nuclear safety and technology.

Xi stressed his nation will keep being a major buyer of their oil. "China will continue to import a large amount of crude oil from the GCC countries, expand imports of liquefied natural gas, strengthen the engineering services in oil and gas upstream development and the cooperation in storage, transportation and refining." Xi said. He also called on the GCC to use Yuan to settle transactions.
