The rule of law will triumph and hidden pot would uncover and hundreds of stinging yellow flies (diachlorus) would stem from the treasure, for those who are away from depositing their solemn property tax liabilities, payable to local bodies department. Running more than over Rs 200 Cr tax liability by realtors, the civic body has been letting them make hay, as the sun is shining now. Now "Agnipath", tech savvy combat force

NEW DELHI : The centre yesterday unveiled the Agnipath scheme, a radical recruitment plan for armed forces aimed at cutting down salary and pension bills and freeing up funds for urgent procurement of weapons..said Defence Minister Rajnath Singh. Under the scheme, about 45,000 people between the age of 17.5 years and 21 years will be inducted into the services for a four-year tenure. The recruitments will begin within the next 90 days and the first batch will be ready by July 2023. Those selected for the scheme will be known as Agniveers. The selection will be made through an online centralised system, the government said. The educational qualification for Agniveers will be the same as the criteria for regular positions in the force. Women will also be inducted under the Agnipath scheme, Navy chief Admiral R Hari Kumar said.



Army Chief General Manoj Pandey said Agniveers will be fully assimilated and integrated into the services. This four-year tenure will include a six-month training.. will be paid a monthly salary between Rs 30,000-40,000 plus allowances. They will also be entitled to medical and insurance benefits. After four years, only 25 per cent of these soldiers will be retained and they will join the regular cadre and go on to serve for a full 15 years in non-officer ranks. The remaining will exit the services with a package between Rs 11 lakh - Rs 12 lakh, but they will not be eligible for pension benefits. The forces announced that provisions have been made for loss of life or disability due to an injury on duty. The scheme has drawn criticism from some quarters, with critics arguing that it will impact the fighting spirit and professionalism of forces.

Punjab launches Volvo service to IGI airport from today

CHANDIGARH: Punjab plies Volvo buses to New Delhi airport from various sites in Punjab. Mr Bhagwant Mann CM, had noticed private players were exploiting innocent clients. Now, the Punjab government would charge lesser than half of the private transporters. The chief minister rued that for decades, only private buses were plying on this route and looted the people by charging as per their own whims and fancies. Mr Mann said that a number of NRIs who came to Punjab from abroad complained to him about only private players plying buses on this route and questioned why government buses were not running on the same route. He said that the booking of these buses can be easily done from the websites of Punjab Roadways and PUNBUS. The CM said that gone are the days when taxpayer money was plundered by the leaders and deposited in banks but now this money will be judiciously used for the welfare of the common man. Mann has sought support and cooperation from people to ensure the holistic development of the state. With a huge NRI population that travels to Punjab regularly, the lack of government buses was a sore point for many in the state. The bus service to Delhi Airport, which was discontinued in November 2018, was first introduced in 2010. At the time, the then Congress government had accused the Delhi AAP government of stopping the Volvo bus service of the Punjab government to the Indira Gandhi International Airport in Delhi with connivance of Akali leaders to benefit their private bus service. The issue was taken up in the assembly on a couple of occasions and the then transport ministers even sought the help of the Punjab unit of AAP to resolve the issue with Delhi government.

Prez polls on July 18, NDA reaches halfway mark

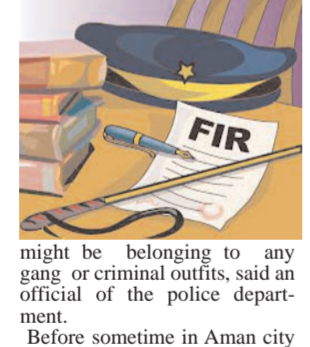

NEW DELHI: In a bid to find partners and put up an opposition candidate to challenge the NDA, Congress chief Sonia Gandhi conferred with CPM general secretary Sitaram Yechury, NCP chief Sharad Pawar and Trinamool chief Mamata Banerjee. Mallikarjun Kharge, leader of opposition in Rajya Sabha met Pawar in Mumbai and is set to reach out to like-minded parties. Non - Congress leaders are expected to sound out BJD, YSRCP and TRS. The political diminution of Congress and the emergence of anti - BJP players who are hostile to Congress has complicated negotiations and it is believed a non - Congress member

could be the consensus choice for President. Voting is scheduled for July 18 and counting on July 21. While PM Modi will have the final word on deciding the presidential candidate, support from YSRCP or BJD would pave the way for NDA's nominee in the race for the country's top office. Recently, YSRCP chief Jagan Mohan Reddy and Odisha chief minister Naveen Patnaik had met Modi in Delhi, although it is not clear what tran-

spired during the meeting. The two regional parties have maintained a low profile both went with BJP in backing Ramnath Kovind in 2017. Based on the current arithmetic, NDA is around 13,000 votes short and support from either BJD, which has over 31,000 votes in the electoral college, or YSRCP (over 43,000 votes) will ensure smooth sailing for the BJP - led alliance. NDA is estimated to have 5.26 lakh votes out of a possible 10.79 lakh in the electoral college, comprising elected members of Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha and the state legislatures. The numbers could change after the ongoing Rajya Sabha polls, but probably not enough to change the big picture.

3 booked for not getting tenants' antecedents verified

Tax scam at Jharmari barrier goes under vigilance scanner

LALRU (MOHALI) : Mr Harpal Singh and Salinder Singh, two tax officials posted at Jharmari tax barrier had been collecting bogus tax from commercial vehicles for the past one year, from which they earned approximately Rs 20,000 to Rs 25,000 per day using bogus receipts. The vigilance department produced the two officials in court on Thursday and obtained their two - day police remand. Now, they will ascertain for how long they had been duping the state exchequer and who were involved in the crime with them. The Vigilance Bureau said that three accused, identified as Harpal Singh of Hasanpur village, Fatehabad in Haryana, Salinder Singh of Bishanpura village, Zirakpur and Praveen Kumar of Khanpur village, Kharar. Mohali district had been booked. Fake computer software bogus stamps and seals used by them



have also been seized. Harpal and Salinder have been arrested. A senior vigilance officer said, "The involvement of other officers or employees concerned will be ascertained during investigation. These officials have been collecting lakhs daily, which was not possible without the connivance of other officers in the department." Around 2,000 commercial vehicles as well as new chassis of commercial vehicles enter Punjab from outside the state every day.

EDITORIAL -

BJP's offensive rhetorics stem precarious conditions

By ignoring, worse condoning, repeated acts of religious bigotry by members of the governing dispensation, the government does not seem to have served the interests of national security and integrity well. There are 'fringe' elements among all religions but all of them need to be dealt with the same firm hand to ensure that the fringe does not become mainstream. Yet the government and BJP do not seem to recognise that religious intolerance and bigotry remain the biggest challenge to India's national security and integrity. While armed forces are perfectly capable of dealing with challenges to external security, it is India's internal security that remains intractable. The national security establishment has not yet been able to overcome the challenge posed by sectarianism, insurgency, bigotry and religious intolerance. How can it be if the political leadership at various levels continues to pander to these very forces in search of votes? For decades the Indian republic stood tall in the comity of nations as a secular and plural democracy that was multi ethnic, multi-lingual, multi-cultural and multi-religious. Few countries around the world could make that claim for themselves. We took pride in our unity amidst diversity. Defending this very personality of the Indian republic, in the

face of grave/provocations, has always been the main political and security challenge for India. After a national spokesperson of BJP made intemperate remarks that hurt Muslim sentiments, responded with alacrity when a couple of Arab states began criticizing India for not taking action against members of the governing party. The external affairs ministry's clarification also raises a question about new challenges to Indian diplomacy. In the past, whenever the self-appointed spokespersons of the so-called Muslim Ummah usurped the prerogative to lecture India about its treatment of minorities. This sect have been promptly rebuffed by Indian Muslim leadership. What moral standing do regimes that govern in the name of religion have to admonish a secular and plural democracy that has constitutionally guaranteed rights for all minorities? A government that has refused to respond to domestic concerns about religious bigotry over the past six years has now responded to Arab states that have acquired influence through money power and influence - peddling in the region. Pakistan encourages radical Islamic elements within India, China encouraged Maoist insurgents. Other countries too stepped in from time to time to weaken an India that has always

chosen to have its own mind and speak for itself. In 1960s and 1970s Western analysts forecast the 'balkanisation of India'. The Republic of India survived all that. Today, as 'New India' celebrates 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' fresh concerns are being raised about the impact of religious, linguistic and developmental divides on the nation's unity and integrity. At a time like this, it is utterly irresponsible of elements in mainstream political parties to make statements that further weaken national security and integrity. Many political parties in office, in New Delhi and in state capitals, have liberally slapped sedition charges on people for merely articulating the social and economic concerns of less privileged citizens. Yet, why have arrests not been made when incendiary remarks are made fanning religious hatred? Mere apology is inadequate to stem the rot in the body politic that now runs deep. In past PMs have said that India is an ancient civilisation but a young nation. Even as we recall and celebrate the virtues of our civilisation, we must remain ever conscious of the fact that we are indeed still a young nation. Preserving the unity and integrity of "India, that is Bharat, a Union of States", a plural, multi-cultural, multi-religious society, is the solemn responsibility of every government.

Used bottles will not find easy way by liquor mafia in Punjab

CHANDIGARH : Punjab's new excise policy, announced recently, aims to curtail liquor mafia. From stopping rebottling of used bottles of imported liquor with cheap one, to busting illegal distilleries being set up. In the past three years, there have been incidents when Extra Neutral Alcohol was smuggled from distilleries and methyl alcohol from paint manufacturers. This was used by illegal distillers to make alcohol, which subsequently made its way to consumers. The Amritsar hooch tragedy in 2020 exposed the nexus between distillers, police, politicians and bootleggers. An illegal distillery last month, was unearthed in Fatehgarh Sahib, where used bottles of high-end Scotch, bought from scrap dealers, were being filled with cheap whiskey and sold to gullible consumers. "The Enforcement Wing of the Excise Department is being strengthened, with two additional companies of the police being deployed.



Significant changes have been made in the organisational structure," Excise and Taxation Minister Harpal Cheema, adding that the policy envisaged effective excise enforcement activities at the circle and district level. Officials in the department say the policy promises to put in place a viable mechanism from manufacturing to the supply chain for effective enforcement with a slew of measures like track and trace software using barcoding on all liquor supplies; POS machines at retail vendors; electromagnetic mass flow meters to assess production, uses and dispatch of spirit; CCTV cameras at units; and boom barriers at the gates of manufacturing units.

Wear masks in public places, Chd Health Dept issues advisory

CHANDIGARH : Chandigarh Health Department has issued an advisory, in view of increasing number of COVID cases in many states and UTs, including Chandigarh. Regular electricity supply for paddy sowing : CM

CHANDIGARH : Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said adequate arrangements were in place for smooth paddy transplantation beginning tomorrow. Mr Mann reiterated commitment to providing uninterrupted power supply to farmers during the paddy season from June 14 and 17. To ensure smooth irrigation in a staggered manner, the first phase in areas beyond the fencing across the International Border had already started from June 10.



Uninterrupted power from June 14 would be ensured in the second phase to 10 districts i.e. Hoshiarpur, Jalandhar, SBS Nagar, Kapurthala, Pathankot, Gurdaspur, Amritsar, Tarn Taran, Ropar and SAS Nagar. The remaining districts of Bathinda, Barnala, Faridkot, Muktsar, Patiala, Sangrur, Ludhiana, Fatehgarh Sahib, Ferozpur, Mansa, Moga and Fazilka will be provided regular supply starting June 17. Mann said the government had decided to allow paddy transplantation in a phased manner in a bid to conserve groundwater.

Harmohinder Singh Lucky becomes Chandigarh Congress chief

CHANDIGARH : Harmohinder Singh Lucky has replaced Subhash Chawla, who resigned from the post on Monday. The Congress had appointed Chawla as the city unit president in February last year. He also remained Senate and Syndicate member of Panjab University twice. Lucky was holding the position of

general secretary and chief spokesperson of the Chandigarh Congress Committee before becoming the city Congress chief. "All Congressmen who have somehow remained neglected will be involved in the party activities. I will first meet all senior leaders of our party. Also, many people from other parties want to join us," he said. Lucky had represented a ward comprising Sectors 20 and 33. In 2006, he became the deputy mayor. He lost last two elections by a thin margin.

5 DFOs summoned by Vigilance in forest scam

Amritsar sectors to surface to streamline sanitation work

AMRITSAR : Hardeep Singh, Joint Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, on Sunday held a meeting with officials of the Health wing, Operation and Maintenance (O&M) and Horticulture wings. He asked to chalk out a plan to improve sanitation in the city. The Amritsar Municipal Corporation (AMC) has decided to divide the city into sectors to improve sanitation and keep a check on the door-to-door garbage lifting properly. The chief sanitary inspectors and sanitary inspectors would keep a check on their respective sectors. The MC has been getting regular complaints regarding the door-to-door collection of garbage. The company has not been lifting the garbage on a daily basis. There are some areas in the city where the



company collects garbage twice in a week. The MC verified the vehicles of the company recently and found that the vehicles are not in a good condition to work efficiently. Around 60 vehicles out of the 342 are worn out and 45 are defunct. "After dividing the city into sectors, it would be easy to keep a check on the movement of the garbage collection vehicles of the solid waste management company. We will provide separate numbers to the vehicles on every route. We are planning to streamline door-to-door collection by dividing the city into sectors. We need

door-to-door collection of garbage every day without any miss. If the solid waste management company would not follow it, we will replace the firm," said Hardeep Singh, a PCS. The Joint Commissioner also asked the officials of the Operation and Maintenance wing to provide water, treated at Sewerage Treatment Plants (STP), to the Horticulture Department for green belts, tress, gardens and central verges of roads. The departments concerned have been asked to submit a plan of sectors and arrangements till Monday evening.

Mid-day meals back in Haryana schools

ROHTAK : In schools, dry ration is supplied to Class I-VIII students at their houses and they are paid cooking expenses too. A few schools had started serving meals on their own days before the vacation began. There are over 15 lakh students at more than 13,500 schools in the state who are served mid-day meals. Suspended in 2020 with the onset of Covid, mid-day meals are set to be cooked and served again at all government schools across Haryana from July 1 when classes resume after the summer break. The decision to cook the mid-day meals again in all schools had been taken in view of the declining number of Covid cases. The matter had been discussed threadbare by the education higher-ups with the authorities concerned in the district administration, sources



said. The Directorate of Elementary Education recently directed the District Elementary Education Officers to restore the facility in all schools from July 1. An Education Department official said the mid-day meal programme was aimed at addressing the issues of hunger and malnutrition as well as improving student enrolment,

attendance and retention rates. The purpose of the scheme was getting defeated by serving dry ration, he said. Sushil Saini, Programme executive at Jhajjar, said the students were served sweet kheer, vegetable pulao, rice-rajma, kadhi-chawal, khichdi, halwa with black chana, roti and seasonal vegetables before the facility was discontinued in 2020.

Private hospitals continue to refuse treatment for Ayushman member

PATIALA : Thousands of beneficiaries under the Ayushman Bharat Mukh Mantri Sehat Bima Yojana are being denied treatment across the state for over a month now. The private hospitals, which are empanelled under the yojana, have already stopped admitting new patients over the issue of the non-payment of their medical claims by the insurance companies. Patients due to the issues between two stakeholders have been left in the lurch. The matter, it seems, is not important to the government as it is continuously turning a blind eye towards it. A beneficiary of the yojana, Paramjit Singh, suffering from a kidney ailment, said a private hospital in Rajpura denied him dialysis under the Ayushman scheme. He is pleading with the government to immediately intervene because he can't afford to pay Rs 2,500 per dialysis, that too, twice a week. In Patiala alone, around 150 kidney patients have to undergo dialysis every day. Besides this, the neonatal care of newborns is also worst hit by



the abrupt closure of the scheme by private hospitals. Sources in the Health Department have revealed that the infant mortality rate had also gone up due to the lack of availability of the neonatal care in the government set-up while private hospitals had shut their doors. A senior official of the Health Department, preferring anonymity, said, "Poor beneficiaries can't afford treatment in private hospitals without the Ayushman scheme. In the government set-up, the neonatal intensive care units are rare. The government should intervene and stop patients from dying." Meanwhile, private hospitals claimed they were compelled to suspend the scheme due to the non-payment of their long-pending dues.

Toxic gas subjects 3 labourers to death in Karnal

KARNAL : The 3 labourers died after inhaling toxic gas have been identified as Satish (27) of Dabri village, Pawan (24) of Jharkhand and Raj Kumar, alias Raju (23) of Bhagalpur in Bihar, were declared dead, while Suraj (19), Mausam (20) of Bhagalpur Bihar, and Bheem Singh (42) of Nepal are undergoing treatment at a private hospital. Three labourers died after allegedly inhaling toxic gas while cleaning a tank in the leather factory on the Newal-Mughal Majra road under the Kunjpura police station on Sunday. Three other labourers are battling for life in the hospital. The police are investigating the case. The owner of the factory is absconding. As per the information, they were hired for cleaning the tank. They divided themselves into two groups and decided to work in



batch. The first batch comprising Pawan, Raju and Satish went inside the tank for cleaning it. When they did not come after a long time, the remaining three went inside the tank. Inside the tank they found they found them unconscious. Meanwhile, they too inhaled the toxic gas. Police officials also reached the spot. They bodies have been sent for autopsy to ascertain the cause of death. "We are investigating the case. The statements of family members are being recorded and we will take action accordingly," said Ganga Ram Punia, Superintendent of Police

Police constable recruitment targets another two, arrests go up to 100

KAITHAL : Another two arrested men have been identified as Parveen, a resident of Dhana Khurd village in Hisar, and Sukhwinder of Uralna in Panipat district. The Kaithal police nabbed them on June 7, taking the number of total arrests to 100, said Maqsood Ahmed, Superintendent of Police, Kaithal. With the arrest of two more accused in the alleged paper leak of police constables (male), conducted by the Haryana Staff Selection Commission (HSSC) on August 7, 2021, the Kaithal police have so far



arrested 100 persons, including the mastermind, middlemen and others in the case, in the past 10 months. The accused Parveen admitted that they got the paper from Anil and Manohar, who had been already arrested. Accused Sukhwinder got paper from Pardeep of Dhana Khurd village, the SP said, adding that the police had arrested three persons three days ago.

They were also identified as Ravi of Budhana village in Hisar, Ankit and Sumit of Karora village. "These are maximum arrests in any paper leak case so far," the SP Ahmed said, adding that they had already arrested the mastermind, middlemen and those who had leaked the paper along with those who had carried the reward.

Municipal election scheduled on June 19

CHANDIGARH: The poll in 28 Municipal Committees and 18 Municipal Councils would be held on June 19, 2022, from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm. Due to the likelihood of extreme weather conditions, polling time has been extended by an hour, and will be held from 7am to 6pm if required, repolling would be done on June 21, said Dhanpat Singh Haryana state election commissioner. "The nomination process will start from May 30 and end on June 4, scrutiny of papers will be done on June 6, while the last date for the withdrawal of candidature will be June 7. Counting of votes will take place on June 22," added Mr Dhanpat Singh. Around 10,000 polling personnel would be deployed to ensure smooth conduct of elections. Adequate police force shall be deployed to maintain law and order at the polling stations and extra police force will be provided in sensitive and hypersensitive areas, he said. To conduct elections in a free and fair manner, the state poll panel will appoint senior IAS or



HCS officers as election observers, senior IPS or HPS officers as police observers for the maintenance of law and order and senior officers of excise and taxation department as expenditure observers, said Dhanpat Singh. Candidates are required to maintain an account of election expenditure and submit the same within 30 days. The educational qualification for candidates in unreserved category is Class X pass, while for women and SC category it is class VIII pass. For women candidates from SC category, it is Class VIII pass for president's post and Class V for post of member. Elections to the Faridabad Municipal Corporation and three other municipalities will be held later, as the revision of the voter list there is still in progress, the poll officer said.

PWD engineers suspended, videos showing negligence goes viral

CHANDIGARH : The Punjab government would not tolerate any negligence in duty on the part of any government employees in the state, said the PWD minister Harbhajan Singh. The department (PWD) suspended sub - divisional engineer (SDE) Sukhpreet Singh and a junior engineer (JE) Naveen Kumar of from the duty with immediate effect under Rule 4 of the Punjab Civil Services (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1970, for negligence of duty. He said that the headquarters of both the



suspended officials would be the office of the chief engineer (headquarters) Patiala during the suspension. These officials will not leave the headquarters without the permission of the chief engineer (headquarters). The action was taken after a video went viral of the construction work being carried out revealed negligence of the SDE and JE. After the investigation of the case, the PWD decided to them.

Delhites to opt for power subsidy from Oct 1 optional

NEW DELHI : "We get appreciation for the Delhi government's free electricity scheme from all sections of the society. But over the years, people have suggested that instead of providing subsidies to financially strong households, the money be used for schools and hospitals," said Chief Minister. From October 1, Delhites who want to continue receiving subsidy on electricity will have to opt for it from October 1. City residents will continue to get free electricity but can choose as they wish to. We will now be asking Delhi's residents whether or not they require the subsidy, and accordingly, provide free supply of electricity to those in need," he said. "The process of asking and giving the people a choice to opt for subsidized or nonsubsidised electricity will begin very soon," he said. Sources said that the procedure through which consumers will be able to



opt for subsidy will be formalized soon and a system would be put in place. A total of 47,11,176 families will benefit from the subsidy, the government said in a statement. The continuation of the subsidy scheme was proposed during the cabinet meeting chaired by the CM, it said. According to the resolution proposed by the power department, the Delhi government provides subsidies to domestic consumers, farmers, and lawyers' chambers in courts based on their consumption,

Single-use plastic banned by Pb from July

CHANDIGARH: Punjab government on Sunday announced to impose a ban on single - use plastic from July with a motive to safeguard our environment. The decision was announced by Mr Rahul Tewari, Secretary, Science, Technology and Environment during a virtual state - level function to mark World Environment Day 2022. Mr Tewari announced to set up 55 STPs across the state to reduce water pollution levels as well as using the treated water for cultivation and other allied activities. Sharing the details about initiatives of state government to convert fossil fuel - based industrial units into natural gas - based units, he mentioned that the state government has started online monitoring of



industrial units by installing state of the art meters in industrial units as well as online monitoring stations to check water and air pollution level. Setting up the target of planting 1.20 crore saplings this year, Rahul Tewari said that the state was ready with Climate Action Plan 2.0 to reduce carbon emissions. In another initiative, the secretary announced to institutionalise Shaheed Bhagat Singh Punjab state environment award for outstanding contribution towards environment protection and conservation of precious natural resources of the state.

Which Market Welfare Asso to bag Re 1 lakh prize?

She said the MC has launched three - month long campaign to restrict the use of single use plastic products.

Contractors resent new Punjab excise policy

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH: Over 200 contractors participated in Ludhiana and decided to boycott the policy if the government goes ahead with the implementation without addressing their concerns. In the new policy, the government has increased the size of the group from Rs 7 crore to about Rs 30 crore, which the traders want slashed to Rs 7-9 crores. In Ludhiana they contended that for smaller groups investment of around Rs 2 crore is required which is within the range of all excise contractors. These have been a manifold increase in security amount



which will be refunded after the lapse of policy. Earlier, the security amount was adjusted in the last few months of the policy. Questions are also being raised on the rationale behind increasing the target revenue by about 40% in comparison to the last policy and slashing the rates. The government intends to give wholesale licence in form of L-

1 to individuals / firms having a minimum turnover of Rs 30 crore in the distribution business in two of the preceding three years. Mr Harish Kumar Bathinda liquor trader said, "The policy has been made keeping in mind big player. The policy will fail to achieve the over ambitious revenue targets."

FATEHPUR (PATIALA) : A case of some dead villagers in Fatehpura village of Patiala district has surfaced, being paid the wages for the construction work despite these beneficiaries having died years ago. Villager Ajaib Nath died in May 2020 but was paid for six days work done in November 2021 whereas Malook Singh was paid for 20 days work years after his death. "A report was sought from BDPO after the newspaper report, 'In Patiala, dead villagers get wages denied living'. It was found that two dead villagers were paid wages. The error committed by the sarpanch of Fatehpur village had not only tarnished the image of the government but also failed to do his duty intentionally. It is requested to suspend Fatehpur village sarpanch under section 20 of Punjab Panchayati Act 1994," reads the letter by ADC. The members of Democratic MGNREGA Front (DMF),



however, had raised questions over indicting only village sarpanch. They claimed that the officials were safeguarding their employees who were also hand in glove and there were many other similar cases that needed to be probed. "The panchayat department scrutinises and eliminates the job cards of the dead villagers every six months, but in Fatehpur village the job cards of dead villagers were active and being misused, said DMF members. Besides, the ADC has also initiated action against Gram Rozgar Sahayak (GRS) and ordered to recover from his salary the total amount of wages paid to dead villagers under MGNREGA.

Sukhna ESZ to be notified via northern zonal council

CHANDIGARH: UT has written to the Centre to expedite the process to notify ESZ around the sanctuary for the area falling in Punjab and Haryana. In follow up chief conservator of forests Dabendra Dalai had requested the ministry to look into the matter. The UT had reiterated 90 % area fell in Punjab and Haryana and to protect the entire sanctuary, it was important to notify the ESZ for areas falling in the two states immediately. Dharam Pal during adviser, said the UT was already pursuing the matter with the ministry and



Punjab and Haryana. "We are hopeful the neighbouring states will notify the ESZ for areas falling in their territory," he said. Last year, the ministry of environment, forest and climate

chance (MoEFCC), while replying to the UT, had stated it was pursuing the matter with both the state governments. In 2017, the administration had notified to leave a 2 to - 2.75 - kilometre radius from the sanctuary as ESZ. In 2020, in a meeting convened by the MoEFCC, wild life division, to discuss the issues related with forest and wildlife management being undertaken in the state governments and union territories, the administration had submitted for declaring the ESZ around the sanctuary at the earliest.

Guraman Preet Singh DFO gathers disproportionate property: Bureau

MOHALI : The present forest scam involves many former ministers, IFS officers and other forest officials. The Punjab vigilance bureau has claimed that arrested DFO Guraman Preet Singh Brar had amassed wealth disproportionate to his known sources of income. A fresh FIR regarding disproportionate assets was going to be registered against the DFO, said the sources. Mr Sadhu Singh Dharamsot former forest minister was produced in the court in Mohali, which remanded him in 14 days of judicial custody. Punjab vigilance bureau on June 2 had arrested Mohali divisional forest officer Guraman Preet Singh and contractor Harmahinder Singh alias Hammi for accepting a bribe of Rs 2,00,000 in favour of Davinder Singh Sandhu, owner of WWICS



Estate Pvt. Ltd, at Masol and Tanda villages of Mohali. Vigilance had issued summons to previous DFOs to explain their stand. Vigilance has also taken into custody the records of many forest officers, said sources. During interrogation of Guraman Preet, the bureau learnt how he was only transferred out of Mohali for brief periods and was brought back. Vigilance also questioned many wood contractors of Kandi area

in which they had named Guraman Preet for harassing them to pay money in lieu of cutting trees even on government permit. The bureau also discovered that Guraman Preet in his five - year tenure in Mohali had purchased a property in Mohali and on a one - kanal plot, and that the DFO also started construction works. Advocate H S Dhanoa, the counsel for Dharamsot, opposed the police remand by praying that in the past six days, the bureau had not been able to make any kind of recovery from Dharamsot as he has nothing to reveal. Now, law for Academic Quality Standard

NEW DELHI: HECI (Higher Education Commission of India) is a key regulatory reform envisaged in the National Education Policy 2020 in which it was stated that "the regulatory system is in need of a complete overhaul in order to re - energise the higher education sector and enable it to thrive". The government is likely to introduce the Bill to set up an overarching regulatory body for higher education - Higher Education Commission of India (HECI) in the monsoon session of Parliament in July. The proposed commission will have powers to enforce academic quality standards and order the closure of sub standard institutions. Non compliance could result in fines or jail sentences. As per the new education policy, regulation of higher education "has been rife with very basic problems, such as heavy concentrations of power within a few bodies, conflicts of interest



among these bodies, and a resulting lack of accountability." As stated in the NEP 2020 and draft being readied at the ministry of education (MOE), HECI will have four verticals - National Higher Education Regulatory Council (NHERC) as a single point regulator for the higher education sector - meta - accrediting body - called - the National Accreditation Council (NAC) Higher Education Grants Council (HEGC), which will carry out funding and financing of higher education and General Education Council (GEC), which will frame expected learning outcomes for higher education programmes.

AAP to launch flagship 'Mohalla Clinics' programs on Aug 15

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH: In its 1st phase on Aug 15, the 1st flagship programme of 75 mohalla clinics would be launched. The AAP government on Delhi pattern would fulfill one of its key poll promise, said Bhagwant Singh Mann, chief minister Punjab. He added non functional sewa Kendra across the state would be converted into mohalla clinics. These would be refurbished on a uniform pattern equipping with doctors room, reception cum waiting area, pharmacy besides separate toilets for staff and visiting patients. The CM also advised to form clusters of 5 to 6 closely villages which would help establish mohalla clinics at a preferred central focal point to provide easy accessibility. On a proposal by Secretary Health, existing 3000 sub centre headed by community health officer also be converted into mohalla clinics. Mr Mann sought an action plan for hiring an agency for clinical tests and go for hiring the services of doctors and paramedics on contract basis.

Protest to save ill-gotten wealth of Gandhis, not democracy : BJP

NEW DELHI : BJP accused congress of putting pressure on Enforcement Directorate, saying its leaders hit the streets in support of corruption and to protect the 'assets' of the Gandhi family. "The clarion call of Rahul Gandhi to congress workers to reach the national capital in the name of 'saving democracy' is a blatant attempt to save properties worth over Rs 2,000 crore amassed by the Gandhi family," said Union Minister and senior BJP leader Smriti Irani. "What would you



name this strategy of congress openly pressuring an investigation agency?" she asked at a press conference. As the Enforcement Directorate questioned Rahul Gandhi in the National Herald case, BJP dismissed the congress allegations of 'vendetta'

and called the opposition party's protests as a "drama to save the Gandhi family and not democracy" as it defended the agency's action. Nobody is above the law, she said never before such a blatant attempt was made by a political family to hold a probe agency to ransom. Union minister Dharamendra Pradhan said, "Juvenile optics and resource mobilization for creating a hostage like situation for the investigating agencies will not deviate the spotlight from the corruption of 'The Family'."
