AAP top leadership
being emasculated ?

Supreme Court, the judges asked the ED why it had not arraigned AAP, the alleged main beneficiary, and concentrated only on Sisodia and Vijay Nair, AAP's head of communications. Incidentally, the ED arrested Sanjay Singh, AAP's Rajya Sabha MP, the very day that Sisodia's bail plea was being heard. The ED sought to embroil him in the same PMLA case, thus effectively emasculating the AAP's top leadership before the next Lok Sabha elections in 2024. One political party in India can fight elections without money. That is simply not possible. Even the BJP, which gets the bulk of its funding from corporates through electoral bonds, where donors are assured of anonymity, is allegedly not averse to receiving kickbacks from contractors of government works, as the people of Karnataka were told by the Opposition before they voted in the Assembly elections earlier this year. If the ED is compelled to arraign political parties as the accused, the BJP's allies in the NDA could also meet a similar fate. For instance, the unified Shiv Sena used to control the Bombay Municipal Corporation for many decades. It was universally known that 10 per cent of any contract given by the corporation went to the corporators in whose jurisdiction the works were commissioned. And the corporators, in turn, passed the bulk of these earnings to the party. It is because of the imperative of raking in the bulk of the

collections that the Shinde faction of the Shiv Sena is busy winning over the serving corporators. Every week, local newspapers print the list of names of such 'Aaya Rams' who have crossed over. If the apex court insists that the political parties that stashed the illegal collections must be prosecuted along with those leaders who collected the monies, all parties in power in the states, at least, will be in trouble. The election fever has set in well ahead of the Lok Sabha polls in 2024. The arrest of Sanjay Singh, an influential figure in Delhi politics, was just one indication of its advent. In Telangana, the BJP is mounting a strong challenge to the entrenched BRS. Since there will be a triangular rivalry between the BRS, the Congress and the BJP, with Owaisi's Muslim-centric party likely to grab quite a few seats in Hyderabad city, the ruling party has a fight on its hands. The ED has dragged in Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao's daughter in the Delhi excise policy case. The use of Central enforcement agencies and the Delhi Police to keep opponents busy is a newly honed tactic which has not been tried out so emphatically by previous rulers. It is only after the Delhi Police raided its offices and the homes of the portal's promoters that I learnt more about its operations. The police claim that the portal has been financed by Neville Roy Singham, an American millionaire of Sri Lankan origin who is said to be financed by

China. The evidence to show that Singham got money from China is not in the public domain. That the money was given to publish stories to denigrate the BJP and PM Narendra Modi in particular has not been clearly spelt out. Since I have not seen any such article, I would not be influenced. The police probably feel that many citizens have been influenced! But does that merit arrests and sealing of the portal's office? Presently, NewsClick's founder and HR head are in the Delhi Police custody. The Editor's Guild of India has protested loudly and strongly. The stridency of the guild's protest shows that the media is concerned about the restrictions being imposed on journalists, whose job it is to confront power, lest it descends into an autocracy. The police action against NewsClick is another salvo fired by the Union Government before voters wend their way to the polling booths. But do voters get easily swayed after reading such articles? Most educated voters must have already made up their minds on whom to vote for. They may even vote differently in the Assembly polls to be held later this year and the Lok Sabha polls of 2024. The bulk of the voting public does not read English newspapers. Very few of those who do may be accessing NewsClick. So, if the Delhi Police want to bring in a Chinese angle to the discussion, it has to be more specific and convincing.

This prohibition will be enforced within the jurisdiction of Ward 15 of Municipal Council, Sohna, Gurugram district, Ward 1 of Municipal Council, Kaithal, Ward 16 of Municipal Council, Narnaul, Mahendragarh district, Ward 5 of Municipal Committee, Rajound, Kaithal district, and Ward 11, Municipal Committee, Bawal, Rewari district.



The Election Commission has instructed the Excise Department to ensure that no liquor shops, hotels, restaurants, clubs or similar establishments are allowed to sell or serve liquor to any individual on the said dates. The storage of liquor by individuals shall be curtailed during this period and the restrictions provided in the excise laws on the storage of liquor in unlicensed premises shall be vigorously enforced.

Land for old-age home
reserved by GMADA in
Mohali's Sector 78

MOHALI : The specific land measuring 2.92 acre will be handed over for free to the Social Welfare Department. The authorities of GMADA have sent a letter regarding this to the concerned department and the Deputy Mayor. Kuljit Bedi, Deputy Mayor said that GMADA has reserved 2.92 acres of land in Sector 78 to build an old-age home. Bedi said that he had requested that the Punjab government build old-age homes in every district. Except Hoshiarpur, there is no government old age home anywhere in Punjab, he claimed. He added that he filed a public interest petition in the Punjab and

Haryana High Court in 2014 when officials from the government did not give him the expected answer. The case was settled in 2020 on the basis that the governments of Punjab and Haryana filed affidavits stating that Punjab would build old-age homes in each district by 2022 and Haryana by 2024. GMADA has now reserved 2.92 acres of land and asked the Social Welfare Department to respond to this letter within 30 days. Bedi said that he has also met the Director, Social Welfare Department, in this matter, and he is hopeful that the construction of the old age home in Mohali will start soon.

Puncham society demands
ownership rights from GMADA

CHANDIGARH : The requisite record pertaining to a demand raised by GMADA with the Deputy Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Mohali, was submitted to the Estate Officer, GMADA, on August 22, 2022. The ownership rights of the flats can be transferred to their owners on charging a certain amount said Association president Mr Harish Poplani. Members of the Puncham Residents Welfare Association, Sector 68, Mohali, are up in arms against GMADA for not providing ownership rights to the flat owners on a pro rata basis. Poplani said they had made



a representation to the Principal Secretary, Housing, and the Chief Administrator, GMADA, that as per the policy of the government (dated January 5, 2022). But GMADA has not intimidated the residents the amount to be deposited by each flat owner. At an executive committee

meeting of the association, a resolution was passed about submitting undertakings regarding payment of their share towards the land cost dues to GMADA on a pro rata basis as per the approved policy. In support of the resolution, nearly 300 flat owners, out of a total of 448, filed undertakings at the single-window service of GMADA. However, the authority failed to take action, he said. Rajiv Kumar Gupta, Chief Administrator, GMADA, said flat owners should deposit requisite amount on a pro rata basis to get ownership rights.

Rs 10K penalty on postmaster for
negligence, wrong remark by postman

CHANDIGARH : Prem Shanker Agrawal (70) said he had booked one article by Speed Post on July 16, 2022, through the sub-post office, Sector 48. It was addressed to First Appellate Authority-Cum Joint Secretary Estate, Chandigarh Administration, UT Secretariat, Sector 9 stated Prem Shanker Agrawal (70) of Sector 49-A, in his complaint filed before the commission. Terming the wrong remark given by the postman for non-delivery of the article sent through Speed Post, the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission has directed the Post Master, Chandigarh, to pay Rs10,000 as compensation to a city resident. But the article was returned to the complainant on July 20, 2022, with the remarks as incomplete address/insufficient address on August 27, 2022. He says he has submitted a complaint to the Postmaster, Head Post Office, Sector 17, Chandigarh, and requested



to refund the amount of Rs 18 charged for the booking of the article. The complainant also sought the refund of Rs 250 spent by him for the delivery of the same letter at the given address by himself. The opposite parties (Post Master, Head Post Office, Chandigarh) did not reply to this notice. Hence, he filed a complaint with the prayer to refund Rs 18, Rs 250 along with compensation of Rs 10,000 for causing him harassment and mental agony. The Post Master, Chandigarh, in the reply admitted that the same article was returned to the sender with the remarks "incomplete /insufficient address" by the postman concerned. He said an

inquiry regarding this matter was conducted and held that there was no fault on the part of the delivery person concerned except that the remark given by the postman that could have been "refused by addressee", instead of "incomplete/insufficient address". After hearing the arguments, the commission said the complainant had posted the letter via Speed Post to the addressee seeking the services of the opposite party, but the postman, instead of giving remarks that the OP had refused to accept the same, gave the remarks that there is "insufficient address". The remarks of the postman of "insufficient address", instead of the "refused", amount to deficiency in service. The commission said in view of this, the complaint is partly allowed and the opposite parties are directed to pay Rs10,000 as compensation to him.

For construction of MBBS center, PGI
finance panel to take place on

CHANDIGARH : The PGIMER had proposed setting up of a state-of-the-art medical college with intake of 100 students for MBBS course at its Sarangpur centre. The proposal envisioned a college campus along with an attached hospital fully equipped for quality education, research and patient care. A meeting of the standing finance committee of the PGIMER will take place on October 27. Items on the agenda include construction of a centre at Sarangpur for MBBS course and implementation of Hospital Information System-2 (HIS-2). Among the important items on the agenda is the proposal for hiring 50 phlebotomists to be



deployed across various departments at the PGIMER on outsourcing basis. The panel will deliberate on the proposal to increase the stipend paid to BSc (Nursing) students during their six-month internship period. In accordance with the Government of India guidelines, the stipend for these students may see a substantial increase from Rs 500 per month to Rs 13,150 per month. Another significant agenda item is the proposal for the additional requirement of



17 laboratory attendants on outsourcing basis, along with the ex post facto sanction for 18 laboratory attendants who have already been hired. A significant workforce-related issue to be addressed is the regularisation of 124 relief-cum-housekeeping workers and 25 supervisors on a post facto basis. These workers are part of the 969-strong outsourced workforce deployed through a service provider at the institute.

NEW DELHI : The External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar called on PM Pham Minh Chinh, the only leader among the top four in the government who remained untouched by a scandal regarding RT-PCR tests.

and global issues was manifest. A stronger India - Vietnam partnership contributes to a stable, secure and prosperous Indo-Pacific," said Jaishankar after the meeting. The minister is in Vietnam on a four-day visit during which he will co-chair a meeting of the 18th India-Vietnam Joint Commission.

'Fake' registrations at Aam Aadmi Clinics in Punjab, probe sought : Bajwa

CHANDIGARH : Under its flagship health project, the AAP government offers Rs 50 per patient to the doctors deputed at these clinics.

However, a doctor gets a fixed salary of around Rs 63,000 per month. A clinical assistant and a pharmacist get a minimum salary of Rs 11,000 and Rs 12,000, respectively. Following the exposé of the registration of fake patients at Aam Aadmi Clinics in Punjab, the Leader of Opposition Partap Singh Bajwa, on Sunday slammed the AAP government in Punjab for launching



a faulty health model in the state. Bajwa said Patiala Deputy Commissioner had ordered a special audit after the revelation that an Aam Aadmi Clinic in the district had been allegedly registering fake patients. "The possibility of some bigger scam with the complicity of some highly placed officials in the Health Department cannot be ruled out.

It is an open loot of Punjab taxpayers' money. A thorough probe or a special audit into the alleged scam must be conducted at all the mohalla and Aam Aadmi Clinics in the state," Bajwa added. The Leader of Opposition said ever since the AAP got hold of power, it has been bent upon replicating the defective Delhi health model in Punjab.

Knee replacement surgery needs no stitches : Dr Harprit

the second patient to undergo knee replacement surgery using this technique. Notably, neither patient required a single stitch during their respective operations. Both Sukhwinder Singh and Varinderjit Kaur are currently recovering well. Dr Harprit Singh explained that this advanced approach utilizes laser technology to seal the wound, eliminating the need for stitches. This method offers numerous advantages, including reduced infection risks, quicker recovery times.

Nawaz Sharif to unveil 'recovery plan' at Minar-e-Pakistan gathering on October 21

week. "In his address at Minar-e-Pakistan, Nawaz Sharif will give a road map to pull the country out of the economic mess," Hamza Shehbaz, the nephew of Nawaz Sharif, said. He said the PML-N and its allies saved the country while risking their political capital. Had there been no agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), Pakistan would have gone bankrupt, Hamza said, adding that the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) government led by its chief Imran Khan brought the country to the verge of

default. Hamza, the son of former prime minister Shehbaz Sharif, said while the politics of the PML-N revolved around development, jailed former prime minister Khan-led PTI indulged in politics of hate. He referred to the May 9 incidents to back his point. PML-N leader Malik Ahmed, who was a former aide to ex-premier Shehbaz Sharif, said October 21 would not be "an ordinary day in fact this would be the day when the country would start its journey towards glory and prosperity". The PML-N is all set to hold the mass public meeting not only to welcome Nawaz Sharif but also to give a befitting reply to the PTI that used the venue to show its massive popularity among the masses, the report said.

Anabolic steroids manufacturing factory busted

AMBALA : A man who ran a gym had been detained from the spot of fake manufacturing unit. A huge quantity of injections, tablets and health supplements had been recovered, said the officials of Food and Drug Administration (FDA). At the illegal unit, the accused had set up machines and a lab to prepare the counterfeit drugs and supplements. A huge quantity of counterfeit drug of a multinational company, packing material, empty bottles and supplement jars were also seized. A joint team of the Haryana (FDA) and the Ambala police on Saturday unearthed an illegal drug factory preparing anabolic steroids and health supplements at the Defence Colony in Ambala Cantonment. Ambala Drug Control Officer Hemant Grover said, "The accused was preparing



anabolic steroids. A huge quantity of injections and tablets have been seized. It is being ascertained as to whom the drugs were being sold." He said the neighbours claimed they had no idea about the illegal unit. Sunil Dahiya, Senior Drug Control Officer, Ambala Zone, said, "The accused was operating an allopathic drug factory without any licence. We had been keeping a close watch on the person for several days, following which the raid was conducted. The seized drugs were used for hormonal treatment and fell in

scheduled category, which cannot be sold without a doctor's prescription. These are also used in gyms as body stimulants." Dahiya said the packaging material and labels suggested the accused may even have been exporting the drugs. "We are ascertaining whether the accused was selling the supplements in his gym. The samples will be sent to a government lab in Chandigarh for examination," he said. Panjokhra police station SHO Inspector Vikrant said an investigation was underway.

Near Airport, demolition stayed by SC

Mohali: The division bench comprising Justice A S Bopanna and Justice M M Sundresh , while granting permission for the SLP and issuing notices to the respondents, also ordered that neither the existing construction will be demolished nor shall the petitioners put up any further construction, will be demolished nor shall the meantime, status quo, existing as on today, would continue .

The recent orders of the Supreme Court to stay demolition of structures falling with in the 100-meter radius of the Chandigarh airport boundary wall were based on two grounds - (The) Works of Defence Act , 1903 (Act No.7 of 1903) - as to whether the said enactment can be sustained or has to be declared unconstitutional being inconsistent with Part III of the Constitution of India- is still pending and the defence failed to implement the notification within stipulated time - frame.

A Supreme Court division bench while allowing the



specific leave petition (SLP) filed by Pabhat residents seeking stay on the demolition of the structures near the defence installation , accepted the ground taken by the petitioners that the apex court's decision regarding the validity of (The) Works of Defence Act, 1903 (Act No.7 of 1903) - as to whether the said enactment can be sustained or has to be declared unconstitutional being inconsistent with Part III of the Constitution of India- is still pending and the defence failed to implement the notification within stipulated

time frame.

Advocate Ankit Grewal , counsel for the petitioners, had challenged the order of the Punjab and Haryana high court denying a stay on the demolition of the structures. Following the orders of the high court, a panel led by the Punjab chief secretary was formed to look into the legality of the structures . A comprehensive report was submitted to him, which had recommended that structures raised after 2010 were illegal and must be compensated as per the law before being razed.

IAF to continue maintaing originality of Heritage Centre

Thermal plants run shortage of coal

Patiala : "Among the 78 thermal plants with critical coal stock, 24 are private sector plants, 16 NTPC, there DVC, and 34 state sector plants. In Rajasthan, all seven thermal plants have critical coal stock between 2% and 14%. All the six plants in West Bengal, and three each in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh, have critical coal stock." said VK Gupta spokesperson of All India Power Engineers Federation (AIEPF).

"GVK plant in Punjab is already under close order due to coal problems. All three units of power plant at Talwandi Sabo, which has stock left for two days, have been running on reduced load, Similar is the situation at Unit 2 of Haryana's Yamunanagar power plant. Six thermal plants across the country running on imported coal have also reported critical stocks, including Adani Power," added Mr Gupta.



The stocks at 78 domestic coal based plants across the country are in "critical" category. Among them are two independent power producers from Punjab, which have stock of one to two days.

"The highest peak power demand this year stands at 239.9 GW, which was recorded on September 1. On October 10, the peak power demand reached 221.62 GW, with the peak shortage at 5.36 GW. On the supply side, the gap in daily receipt of coal by plants stood at 2,96,000 tonnes on October 10, with supplies of nearly 2.1 million tonnes and consumption of nearly 2.4 million tonnes," he further said.



A slew of fresh promises ,ranging from caste census and 27 % OBC quota to filling of backlog vacancies of SC and ST reserved posts in government offices and including all area with 50 % tribal population under the sixth schedule of the constitution, which has special provision to safeguard the rights of the tribals. Under the congress govt's "Padho Aur Padhao Yojna ",



children from class 1 to 8 would be given Rs 500/ per month ,students 9 to 10 would be paid Ra Ms1000/ and class 11 to 12 would be 15000/. Ms Gandhi Wadra said in one and half years , the congress govt has waived the loans of 27 lakh.farmers , increased social security pension to Rs ,600 per month and gave 100 units of power at Rs 100 to Rs 1Cr families, built a thousand

cows. Shelters ,made 12000 bartan banks and increased reservation for OBCs from 14 to 27%.

The farm loan waiver scheme will be resumed if congress forms the government, she said.

Thermal plants run shortage of coal

Patiala: "Among the 78 thermal plants with critical coal stock, 24 are private sector plants, 16 NTPC, there DVC, and 34 state sector plants. In Rajasthan, all seven thermal plants have critical coal stock between 2% and 14%. All the six plants in West Bengal, and three each in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh, have critical coal stock," Gupta added.

Supreme Court orders enquiry into defiance by NCLAT ?

New Delhi : The Supreme Court on Friday ordered (NCLAT) National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) chairperson Justice Ashok Bhushan to inquire into the allegations that a bench of the NCLAT defied the apex court's order [Orbit Electricals Private Limited. Deepak Kishan Chhabaria]. Despite an order passed by the top court asking NCLAT to defer pronouncement of verdict, the NCLAT pro-



ceeded to pass an order in defiance of the apex court's direction.

"We direct that an enquiry shall be conducted on the above allegations by the Chairperson of the NCLAT. A report shall be submitted

before this Court by 5 pm on October 16, 2023 after specifically verifying the facts from the judges who constituted the Bench of the NCLAT," the Supreme Court directed.

The case pertained to the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of Finolex cables. The NCLAT had earlier passed an order directing status quo on the results of the AGM till they adjudicate on the dispute between cousins Prakash Chhabria and Deepak Chhabria.

'Disaster rapid response committee' formed at PGI

Chandigarh: The PGI hospital administration has formed a 10-member disaster rapid response committee to be activated in case of any emergency.

It will consist of young faculty members, fire officials and others. Besides, no patient care area will house any electrical device area like UPS/server room.

During the fire at Nehru Hospital, which has no fire alarm/sensor, security official. Were alerted by a control hospital. However, the security wing had to call and arrange for the team to manage the disaster that took some time. "Had there been a dedicated response team consisting of doctors and other staff, they would have immediately sprung into

action by alerting team members," said an official.

The UPS room from where the fire broke out at Nehru Hospital was started in 2008 in an area where patients move, which is against the norms of hospital safety measures internationally. A total of 20 hot spots have been identified where such UPS rooms are inpatient area and they will be shifted outside the hospital building. In the absence of such a room that operated 24x7 in the team, the nurses, doctors, security personnel and other support staff were trying to call different people for help "The trained team members will be aware of who will participate in what role and accordingly speed up the rescue operation," said an official.
