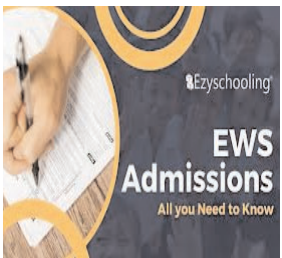


digital evidence. The brazen modus operandi landed the group as they had created multiple social media group touting their Ponzi schemes as the only next bite in the digital currency. The promised return

Tejas may put challenge to US F16 fighter

The Tejas was a product of the light combat aircraft programme, started in 1983 jointly by the Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA), the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL). The first test flight was conducted on January 4, 2001, and the aircraft gained its final operational clearance (FOC) on February 20, 2019 during the Aero India airshow. A significant milestone was the development of the Tejas MK 1A variant, which incorporates advanced radars, enhanced weapons capability and improved operational range, thanks to a better engine. The jet engine selected for the aircraft is the General Electric F404, being sourced from the US. The agreement for supply was arrived at during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the US in the summer of 2023. The delayed supply of this very engine has brought the IAF's induction schedule to a standstill since the first engines slated for delivery in 2023-end are now expected around April 2025. The manufacturer, General Electric (GE), has attributed this roughly one-and-a-half-year delay to supply chain issues from a Korean partner. This hold-up has adversely impacted the

IAF's operational preparedness, compelling the Indian Ministry of Defence to levy penalties on GE. It remains to be seen if this delay is really a supply chain issue or something far more calculated and deliberate. The US is well known for its focus on technology denial to ensure and maintain its own leading position amongst the comity of nations. The Tejas has been aggressively marketed at various international air shows, validating its performance and capabilities to the world. Furthermore, the Tejas is now seen as a capable, cost-effective, multi-role, 4.5 Generation fighter by many prospective nations seeking to replace their older fighter aircraft. It is this very challenge to the dominance of American fighter aircraft, such as the F-16, in the international market that makes the engine delays in the Tejas programme seem more suspicious. The Government of India's emphasis on the Make-in-India Mission and defence exports to friendly, like-minded nations has resulted in a leap in India's defence development and production capacity. The Tejas has an overall edge compared to the JF-17 and matches the F-16's capability while being comparatively cheaper, the lack of a foreign

customer so far has led many defence lobbyists to cast doubts on the Tejas programme. These attempts to deter nations from inducting the aircraft, compounded by the delays of the GE F404 engines, could further harm the Tejas programme's image. This development also minimises competition to the US Military Industrial Complex and ensures its continued hegemony in global defence markets. The US repeatedly resorts to the use of technology denial as a means to exercise its will and preserve its interests in the world. India is one of the nations affected by such policies in the past. The US efforts at ensuring that India remained a 'nuclear pariah' after its 1974 peaceful nuclear explosion are well known to the world and remain fresh in Indian minds. Even though the Indo-US nuclear deal of 2008 during the Bush presidency was aimed at recognising India as a responsible nuclear state, with which others could enter into nuclear trade and although Indo-US ties have come a long way since then, we cannot forget that there were plenty of naysayers to the Bush administration's carve-out for India in the nuclear field.

Worth Rs 20 crore fuel saved by e-buses within 2 years

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : About 25.28 lakh litres of diesel worth Rs 20.80 crore has been saved within two and a half years by plying electric buses on local routes. Procured in November 2021, 80 electric buses are in service in the tricity at present, said a spokesman of the UT Transport Department. The electric buses had covered 1.26 crore km till August 16 on intra-city routes, thus saving over 25.28 lakh litres of diesel besides preserving environment. These buses have helped prevent 6674.91 tonne of CO2 emission. The e-bus fleet of the department included vehicles of Ashok Leyland and Eicher. In order to provide eco-friendly transportation in the city, the department plans to procure 100 more e-buses this year. The administration has plans to replace the entire fleet of 350



diesel buses of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU), running both on local as well as suburban routes, with electric ones by 2027-28. Each bus covers a distance of nearly 130 km on a single charge. It takes nearly two hours to fully charge a vehicle. With a seating capacity of 36, a bus can carry a maximum of 54 people at a time. On an average, each bus covers 200-300 km a day. The State-Level Steering Committee (SLSC) has decided to replace 100 diesel buses with e-vehicles sanctioned by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs to Chandigarh under the Centre-sponsored PM

e-Bus Sewa Scheme. The ministry will be requested to allocate 80 more buses to the city under this scheme. Apart from public transport, the share of private electric vehicles (EVs) is also increasing. Since the implementation of the EV Policy in September 2022, as many as 3,281 electric two-wheelers and 1,785 four-wheelers have been registered in the city till July 15. According to the data provided by the Registration and Licensing Authority (RLA), 352 electric two-wheelers and 114 four-wheelers were registered from September to December in 2022. The highest number of 2,103 electric two-wheelers and 1,013 four-wheelers had been registered in 2023 and 826 two-wheelers and 658 four-wheelers till July 15 this year in the city.

No optional procurement of service charge from consumer : UT

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : "It had been noticed that some restaurants and hotels were levying service charge in the bill by default, without informing consumers that paying such charge was voluntary and optional", said an official of the Food and Supplies department. Now, the UT Department of Food and Supplies and Consumer Affairs and Legal Metrology has issued an advisory in public interest to hotels and restaurants that no hotel or restaurant shall add service charge automatically or by default to the bill. Service charge is being levied in addition to the total price of the food items mentioned in the menu and applicable taxes, often in the guise of some other fee or charge. Further, it has also been noticed that some customers have been paying tips to waiters in addition to service charges under the mistaken impression that service charge is a part of taxes. As per the guidelines issued by the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA), service charge cannot be added to the bill involuntarily, without allowing consumers the choice or discretion to decide whether they want to pay such charge or not. The department stated that, "Service charge shall not be collected from consumers by any other name. No hotel or restaurant shall force a consumer to pay service charge and shall clearly inform the

consumer that service charge is voluntary, optional and at consumer's discretion." No restriction on entry or provision of services based on collection of service charge shall be imposed on consumers. Service charge shall not be collected by adding it along with the food bill and levying GST on the total amount, adds the department. The department informed the public that if any consumer finds a hotel or restaurant that is levying service charge in violation to the mentioned guidelines, a consumer may make a request to the hotel or restaurant concerned to remove service charge from the bill amount. Lodge a complaint on the Consumer Helpline, which works as an alternative dispute redressal mechanism at the pre-litigation level by calling 1915 or through WhatsApp number 8800001915 or through the NCH mobile app. Consumers can file a complaint against unfair trade practice with the Consumer Commission. The Complaint can also be filed electronically through portal www.e-jagriti.gov.in for its speedy and effective redressal and submit a complaint to the CCPA by e-mail at com-ccpa@nic.in. A consumer can also send a complaint to the Department of Food & Supplies and Consumer Affairs and Legal Metrology by helpline number at 0172-2703956 or email at fcs-chd@nic.in for subsequent proceeding by the CCPA.

Dallewal surrenders to medical aid, Centre-farmer talks to be held Feb 14

Commissioner News Service PATIALA : Priya Ranjan, Joint Secretary, Department of Agriculture and Farmer Welfare, at a meeting with Dallewal, invited him for talks on February 14 at the Mahatma Gandhi State Institute of Public Administration, Chandigarh. He said, "I hope Dallewal breaks his fast and participates in the talks." The date has been chosen keeping in mind the model code of conduct for the February 5 Delhi Assembly elections. The Centre has invited farm leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who is on a fast unto death for the past 54 days at the Khanauri border, for talks, which may end the year-long farmers' protest. Dallewal later agreed to take medical treatment after Kaka Singh Kotra, Abhimanyu Kohar and other farmer leaders made an emotional appeal of going on a fast unto death if he failed to do so. Soon after, medical teams on standby started the treatment, said Kotra. Dallewal, however, maintained that he would not take food till the government agreed to a legal guarantee on the MSP. Kotra said Dallewal had expressed the desire that the first meeting should be held in Chandigarh and the second in Delhi. Hectic activity was witnessed at Khanauri after the farm bodies protesting on the Punjab border with Haryana

said they had got a "decent proposal" from the Centre regarding their demands even as farmer groups could not draw a unity plan during their second round of talks. Sources said the Centre had put a condition that Dallewal would have to accept treatment if they wanted the proposal to materialise. Earlier, Priya Ranjan visited Khanauri and met Dallewal. After meeting the fasting leader, representatives of the Centre, led by Ranjan, held nearly two-hour talks with the protesting farmers, following which they made the offer. Without revealing the details of the proposal, farmer leader Kotra said, "We have received a decent proposal and are discussing its modalities." The sources said former Punjab DIG Narinder Bhargav and former ADGP Jaskaran Singh played a crucial role in arranging the meeting. This was the first time since February 18 last year when representatives of the Centre held formal talks with the protesting farmer leaders over their demands. The protesting farmers, led by the Samyukt Kisan Morcha (Non-Political) and the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha, have been protesting at the Shambhu and Khanauri borders since February 13 when their march to Delhi was halted by the security forces.

80% cheap generic medicine at Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadhi Kendra in Kurali Civil Hospital

Commissioner News Service MOHALI : The Jan Aushadhi Kendra is the third in the district being operated by the District Red Cross Society. The other two are located at the District Hospital in Mohali and Civil Hospital in Kharar. Deputy Commissioner (DC) Aashika Jain inaugurated a Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadhi Kendra at the Civil Hospital here. The newly opened pharmacy store would provide generic medicines at 70 to 80 per cent cheap rates as compared to the market. The store will be run by the District Red Cross Society. A qualified pharmacist has been hired and will remain present at the store from 9 am to 5 pm. Besides, a mobile testing van has already been started by the District Red Cross Society. The special van covers the medical camps being



conducted by the District Red Cross Society with the help of the District Hospital medical team. Similarly, an ambulance service has also been launched at reasonable rates that can be hired by dialling 7087087005 and 8427544403. Jain assured that a public audit of CHC Kurali was done last year and soon it will get an upgrade as the case has been submitted to the Punjab Government. The DC also visited the wards and enquired about the wellbeing of the patients and offered blankets for the ward beds.

Widening of Ghaggar bridge to cost Rs 32.50 Cr



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The much sought after upgradation of Ghaggar bridge has been accorded approval for widening of the bridge at the cost of Rs 32.50 Cr by the Panchkula Metropolitan Development Authority (PMDA). The project would aim to address the problem of traffic congestion near Golf Course Road, particularly during peak hours. The Golf Course Road, which originates near the Tau Devi Lal Sports Complex, is a four-lane road. However, the transition into a two-lane bridge near the Ghaggar creates a bottleneck, causing long delays for commuters. The widening of the bridge to four lanes is expected to significantly reduce traffic snarls. "The project has been sanctioned by the

government, and we are in the final stages of preparation. Tenders for the project will be floated in about a month," said a senior PMDA official. "We are also planning to include cycle tracks on both sides of the bridge to promote sustainable and safe commuting," the official added. Commuters have welcomed the decision, expressing relief at the prospect of smoother traffic flow. Rajiv Mehta, a resident of Sector 24 who frequently uses the

road to reach his office in Sector 5, said, "The bottleneck at the bridge is a nightmare, especially in the morning. Sometimes, it takes 20 minutes just to cross the stretch. I am glad the authorities are finally addressing the issue. The addition of a cycle track is a great idea." Once completed, the widened bridge will not only ease vehicular congestion but also enhance safety for cyclists and pedestrians.

25% seats for admission must go to economically weaker section : Admn

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : In accordance with the Right to Education Act, non-minority, recognised unaided private schools in Chandigarh must allocate 25 per cent of seats for EWS/disadvantaged group (DG). The minority schools are out of its purview. Under the Right to Education Act, 2009, the struggle continues to be bone of contention between the UT Education Department and educational institutions. Despite being in existence for over a decade now, the mandate for reserving 25 per cent seats for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) students in local private schools. While private schools claimed that the administration has no fixed pattern of reimbursing the fee, there are some schools that have not received their dues for nearly a decade. The UT Education Department contradicts the claims and maintains that not even a single penny is pending. Interestingly, the matter has been in the court for the last two years, but both the department and the schools continue to trade charges. "The Chandigarh Administration is not willing to implement law and is actually bullying educational institutions. Crores of rupees have been pending with the



administration. The payment has been delayed by almost 10 years and the matter is in court for two years now," said HS Mamik, president, Independent Schools Association (ISA), Chandigarh. He added, "While other parents pay the fee quarterly, the administration has asked schools to wait for an entire academic year to clear the dues of the EWS students. Also, the process of filling the EWS seats in government schools starts after the private schools are done with it. The government should set an example by leading from the front rather than putting pressure on the schools." In a previous submission in the High Court, the UT Administration had said educational institutions were allotted land on leasehold basis under a 1996. In the past, the department and school managements have held several rounds of discussion, but to no avail. Sources claimed that ever since the implementation of the RTE Act, the cost (fee) for

teaching EWS students has been increasing. While the department has enhanced the cost per child, the schools have flagged the issue of reimbursement rates.scheme. Accordingly, they were required to admit 5 per cent students as part of social responsibility from the EWS category without charging any dues. The limit was enhanced to 15 per cent in 2005 and covered all schools that got land prior to the policy or after the notification of the policy. The schools are entitled for reimbursement for 10 per cent EWS students and not 25 per cent students admitted by them every year. As per Harsuhinder Pal Singh Brar, Director School Education, UT Administration, "The department will fill up EWS seats as per the RTE Act. We will ensure 100 per cent compliance and will also ensure that the schools meet their commitment. There's not a single penny pending for payment with the department. All payments have been cleared. That has been the law for the last 10 years and we are committed to meet our obligation under the RTE Act. We will ensure the schools meet their part of the obligations. It has already been in the public domain."

Now, 5 unpaid traffic challans to deprive driving licence : Chandigarh Admn

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The UT Administration has determine to issue notices to vehicle owners with five or more unpaid challans asking them to clear their dues within 15 days. Failing to do so, driving licences of the vehicle owners will be cancelled and their registration certificates (RC) suspended. Highlighting a significant rise in unpaid 7.5 lakh challans over the years, Registering and Licensing Authority In-charge Pradhuman Singh said, "Despite repeated



reminders and notices, many drivers continue to neglect fines for offenses such as speeding, red light violations, and dangerous driving." Pradhuman said the notices would be issued to violators with five or

more unpaid challans, requiring them to pay the penalties within 15 days. Non-compliance will result in the revocation of their driving licences and suspension of their RCs. Additionally, vehicles of defaulters will be flagged as "not to be transacted," which will block any transactions related to the vehicle. This includes ownership transfers, RC renewals, issuance of duplicate RCs, pollution certificates, and insurance, until all traffic violations are addressed and fines are cleared.

AAP manifests to give jobs, clean Yamuna within 5 yrs, if elected

NEW DELHI : “We coined the term guarantee for the first time in the country. The BJP stole it, but the difference is that we fulfil our guarantees, and they do not”, said AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal. The Aam Aadmi Party on Monday made 15 promises in its manifesto to woo Delhi voters, a week ahead of the Assembly elections. These ‘guarantees’ include promise to address unemployment and clean the Yamuna in the next five years. He said his announcement reflected AAP’s commitment towards continuing the party’s legacy of providing free electricity, water, healthcare, education and pilgrimage schemes for senior citizens, while introducing transformative initiatives like the Mahila Samman Yojana (Rs 2,100 to every woman per month),



Sanjeevani Yojana (free medical services to all citizens above 60 years at both govt and private hospitals), and the Dr Ambedkar Scholarship. Kejriwal reiterated the party’s vision of creating an inclusive and prosperous Delhi by ensuring that every household saves Rs 25,000 per month through welfare schemes. AAP promised to waive outstanding “hiked” water bills, round-the-clock supply of clean drinking water to every household. Under the Babasaheb Ambedkar Scholarship Yojana, AAP has pledged scholarships for Dalit students to study abroad. All students will benefit from free bus rides and a 50 per cent discount on metro fares.

The construction of world-class roads is among its other guarantees. It has pledged Rs 18,000 aid per month to priests and granthis and the extension of free electricity and water benefits to tenants. AAP has also committed to improving Delhi’s sewerage, issue ration cards to those left out of the system and offer financial support to auto and cab drivers. It has promised Rs 1 lakh for their daughters’ wedding, Rs 10 lakh life insurance cover and Rs 5 lakh accident insurance for all auto-rickshaw and e-rickshaw pullers. Resident Welfare Associations will also receive funds to hire security guards, AAP said in its manifesto.

Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

GURUGRAM : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city. The authority has drafted a ‘net zero 2050’ document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

25,000 jobs in govt sectors assures CM on 55th Statehood Day

DHARAMSALA : While speaking at the 55th state-level Statehood Day celebrations at Baijnath, the Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh said that the recruitment for 25,000 government jobs in the state would start soon. “The government has provided 42,000 jobs in the last two years compared to 20,000 in five years under the previous BJP government. CM said employment generation was the priority for his regime and 25,000 jobs would be created this year in the government sector in the state. Over 12,500 posts have been filled in the government sector,” he stated. The Chief Minister said that the coming fiscal year is challenging but with the cooperation of the people of the state and blessings of deities, we would overcome these challenges. “The Congress has been in power for only two years, but the financial liabilities and



debts inherited from the previous BJP regime has put a burden on us,” he said. Sukhu said the financial situation is such that loans are being taken to repay the principal and interest of previous debts. “In the last two financial years, the government has taken a loan of Rs 30,080 crore. Out of it, Rs 18,854 crore, approximately 63 per cent, has been used to repay the principal and interest on loans taken by the previous government,” he said. He said that during the BJP’s tenure in 2021-22, the state received a revenue deficit grant of Rs 10,249 crore, which reduced to Rs 6,258 crore in 2023-24 and

is expected to drop further to Rs 3,257 crore in the next financial year. The state government has generated an additional Rs 2,200 crore through reforms in various departments, he said. Sukhu stated that the state government has fulfilled six out of the 10 promises made during the Assembly elections. The employees and pensioners have been paid three installments of dearness allowance (DA) amounting to an 11 per cent increase. He said that to promote tourism, an international-level zoological park is being built in Bankhandi, Dehra, at a cost of Rs 600 crore. The expansion of Kangra airport is underway, with Rs 3,500 crore allocated, and Rs 355 crore already disbursed to landowners for acquisition, he said. He announced the development of grazing lands for shepherds and protection of their rights under the Forest Rights Act.

Global order changing fast, India-UAE cement its ties afresh : Jaishankar

ABU DHABI : “The collaboration between India and the UAE on the international stage is set to deepen further as the world navigates a “complicate” and “volatile” phase with the changing global order”, said External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Monday. Earlier in the day, Jaishankar embarked on a three-day visit to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) to further enhance India’s comprehensive strategic partnership with the influential Gulf



nation. Speaking at an event organised to celebrate India’s Republic Day in Abu Dhabi, Jaishankar said, “The world has entered a complicated and volatile phase because the global order is changing

for real. These are occasions when new opportunities arise, and true friendships are forged.” “As we contemplate the global scenario, there is much that draws our two nations together. I can confidently assert that our collaboration on international platforms will only get stronger,” he asserted. The minister underlined that the number of Indians who call the UAE their second home has grown from 2.5 million in 2015 to over four million now.

Maha Kumbh’s rush surpasses Rio Carnival, Oktoberfest of Brazil, of Germany : UP officials

NEW DELHI : 70 lakh visitors had attended the last Rio Carnival, 25 lakh had gathered for the Haj pilgrimage and 72 lakh celebrated Oktoberfest, said officials of Uttar Pradesh government on Monday. More visitors will attend the Maha Kumbh 2025 in Uttar Pradesh’s Prayagraj than some of the other major global gatherings like Brazil’s Rio Carnival and Germany’s Oktoberfest. Visitation at the ongoing Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj is, however, projected at 45 crore, including 15 lakh foreigners. The officials were speaking at a special briefing MEA and UP government organised today for foreign correspondents covering the largest religious gathering in the world. In the 2019 Kumbh, there were 25 crore visitors.



The officials—Sanjeev Singh, OSD to Chief Minister of UP Yogi Adityanath, Awanish Kumar Awasthi, CM’s Adviser, Shishir, Director Information, UP; Mrityunjay Kumar, Media Adviser to the Chief Minister—also said Maha Kumbh was projected to boost the economy up to Rs 2 lakh crore. Uttar Pradesh’s GDP alone is expected to grow by over 1%, with trade in daily essentials projected at Rs 17,310 crore; hotel and travel sectors expected to reach Rs 2,800 crore and religious materials and flowers market projected to generate Rs 2,000 crore and

Rs 800 crore, respectively. UP’s outreach was part of state government’s plans to celebrate and project the Maha Kumbh, expected to attract a million devotees from around the world and came a day after a fire at the Maha Kumbh Tent City gutted 18 tents. There were no casualties. The outreach was organised jointly by the Ministry of External Affairs and Uttar Pradesh government and highlighted the spiritual and cultural significance of the Maha Kumbh scheduled from January 13 to February 26.

Washington:The US authorities have arrested 538 illegal migrants and deported hundreds using a military aircraft said Karoline Leavitt, White House Press Secretary .With Donald Trump in power now, authorities have started cracking down on illegal migrants who have made a perilous journey in a quest for the American dream. Hundreds of illegal migrants were arrested and deported in a massive operation that comes just three days after the new administration was sworn in.Sharing the figures, White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt said that the US authorities have arrested 538 illegal migrants and deported hundreds using a military aircraft.The Trump Administration arrested 538 illegal immigrant criminals



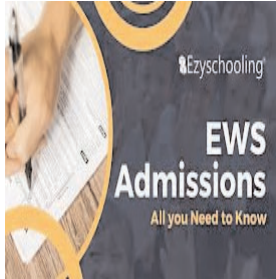
including a suspected terrorist, four members of the Tren de Aragua gang, and several illegals convicted of sex crimes against minors," Ms Leavitt said in an online post on Thursday. Promises kept," she added.White House shared a "small preview" into the work

the Trump administration is doing to "secure our nation's borders." It listed the names of some of the people arrested by the US Immigration and Customs Enforcement and the crimes committed by them. Crimes include rape, sexual conduct against a child, and continuous sexual abuse of a child aged 14 or younger.
