## Punjab Poultry Association demands induction of egg in mid day meals?

### "1 egg is nutritious and balanced food"

Dera Bassi/Lalru : On the  
demand of disadvantaged  
pupils and their families for  
the induction of incredible  
nutrient egg, as last year  
Maharashtra introduced on  
7 Nov 23, the induction of  
nutritious egg, Mr Parveen  
Garg, Chairman of Zonal  
National Egg Coordination  
Committee has reiterated the  
demand for induction in  
school mid day meal.  
The objective of balanced  
food goes for intro-  
ducing and sustaining the  
ideal meals. The process  
with egg inclusion promises  
to enhance and promote the  
qualitative change with  
adolescent age factor.  
The aim of the mid day  
meals is to serve the grow-  
ing children falling in the  
range of 6 to 14 years. All  
successive governments on  
this front have been sustain-  
ing the growth rate in order  
to monitor the nutritional  
values of the growing



youth. The nutritious egg,  
however, contains 6% iron,  
5% calcium, 55 % calories  
besides significant amount  
of cholesterol.  
The adolescent, however,  
need 70% in average calo-  
ries, 6 gram of protein and  
certain quantity of amino  
acids for vital growth val-  
ues.  
The pious task of the ruling  
regime remains to ensure  
escalating sufficient nutri-  
tional intakes as per the  
youth demand and consis-  
tent adherence in matching  
the international merits in  
competitive sport arena .  
The program nutritionally  
craves for optimum intake  
of egg calories, iodine ,  
iron and suffice amount of  
protein.

The provision of mid day  
meal also ensures rational  
enhancement of enrolment  
in schools besides regular  
attendance and stable con-  
centration on study topics.  
This way our nation would  
witness upper literacy rate  
and compete gloriously.  
Besides, fighting domain  
would shoot up with venues  
of employment generation .  
A part growing trend of  
economic backwardness,  
egg consumption would  
boost child's satiety level,  
foresees Mr Rishi Pal, the  
President, Punjab Poultry  
Association .  
Along rising upward trends  
of poultries. Mr Jasmeet,  
president of Ludhiana  
Poultry Farms too exalts  
the initiation and active  
consideration of the min-  
istry of Child Development  
and Social Welfare, the

## Likelihood of simultaneous 3 tier polls, apprised by Kovind panel

New Delhi: One of the key  
aspects to watch will be the  
transition path towards the  
switch to one election  
model, given that assem-  
blies have been elected at  
different times and synchro-  
nizing fresh polls to all of  
them along with elections to  
Lok Sabha will require the  
tenure of some being read-  
justed. The process will be  
time-consuming as the govt,  
after laying the report, will  
have to undertake legis-  
lative changes.  
The committee on 'One  
Nation One Election', head-  
ed by former President Ram  
Nath Kovind has finalised  
its report, and is expected to  
recommend simultaneous  
parliamentary, assembly and  
local bodies polls, in line  
with its terms of reference.

The panel, which submitted  
its report on Thursday, has  
based its recommendation  
for electoral simultaneity by  
saying that bunching the  
contests will save the econ-  
omy and society from disrup-  
tions as E result of holding  
frequent elections. Elections  
are due in some parts or  
another each year. In certain  
states, given multiple elec-  
tions to panchayat and local  
bodies, as many as 200-300  
days in a year are consumed  
by polls.  
The move will, however,  
require multiple changes  
from standardizing of the  
electoral rolls to amending  
the laws and Constitution -  
for which a roadmap has  
been provided in the recom-  
mendations submitted to  
President Droupadi Murmu.

## Vladimir Putin recaptures president seat with good electoral margin

Moscow : Despite the expected  
outcome, thousands of pro-  
testers demonstrated against  
Putin on the final day of vot-  
ing in the three-day election  
period, participating in a  
"Noon Against Putin" event.  
With a landslide victory in an  
election without real competi-  
tion, Russian President  
Vladimir Putin secured another  
term in power. And, follow-  
ing a downturn during the  
pandemic, marriage rates in  
the U.S. were on the rise.

Vladimir Putin has been cele-  
brating a landslide victory in  
Russia's presidential election,  
securing another six years in  
office that will have him sur-  
passing Josef Stalin as the  
country's longest-serving  
modern leader. The Kremlin  
announced that Putin won

87% of the vote, a win  
described by Putin as a sign of  
the Russian people's "hope"  
and "trust" in him.  
During his victory speech,  
Putin referenced his country's  
ongoing invasion of Ukraine,  
indicating his next term would  
focus on the "special military  
operation." The election, how-  
ever, has been widely criti-  
cized. Opponents of Putin  
have been exiled or impris-  
oned, leading to international  
condemnation. A U.S. official  
criticized the election as nei-  
ther "free nor fair."

EDITORIAL –

Handshake with Dragon would remain specious

The much construed government policy regarding the bilateral engagement with China is predicated on restoring peace and tranquillity along the Line of Actual Control (LAC); this includes de-escalation and disengagement in east Ladakh. Overemphasis on this aspect can well be interpreted as a strident stance reflective of a strong political will, but not pragmatism. China is not only our biggest neighbour but also a major international power with whom it would be prudent to remain engaged on a variety of issues of mutual interest and at various forums. Despite the tensions on the borders, India and China continue to be important members of international groupings like the Shanghai C o o p e r a t i o n Organisation and BRICS. In fact, the latter is expanding in a big way, with several nations around the globe seeking its membership. India and China have been on the same page at various fora, like the IMF and the WTO, and have expressed their solidarity against the position adopted by developed countries. Both nations also share a long history of cooperation and coordination on environmental issues at global platforms. Despite China's deep concerns about the Quad grouping, it would understand that India is s t r a t e g i c a l l y autonomous. The economic engagement in terms of India-China trade ties has been on the rise and it has been one of our largest sources of imports for the past 15 years despite efforts to reduce this dependency through import substitution and free trade agreements with ASEAN countries. This has resulted in an increasing trade deficit, skewed in favour of China. However, these commonalities, the tense and inimical situation on the LAC is likely to

continue, with the possibility of unpleasant face-offs between the Indian Army and the PLA. The military commander-level talks in east Ladakh have meandered on and become an exercise in filibustering by the Chinese. The Indian Army has responded strongly and built up its capabilities with enhanced deployment of troops and equipment. In short, for us, it's a policy of containment on the northern borders and calibrated engagement on other issues. In this kind of setting, India has to keep its leverages well-honed. Surprisingly, we have not optimised these aspects in the past and followed a path of appeasement against a wily and shrewd adversary like China. First and foremost is the Tibet issue, which seems to have increasingly lost salience internationally. The fact that the spiritual and political head of Tibet was given sanctuary in India was seen as a hostile act by the Chinese. That the Central Tibetan Administration (CTA), also labelled as the Tibetan Government-in-Exile, was allowed to be set up in Dharamsala has always irked the Chinese Communist Party. In 1959, it was a bold move, but over the years, the Chinese hysteria about Tibet and 'splittist' Tibetans has seen India go overboard in trying to downplay this card. This attitude towards a country that makes no attempt to hide its views about J&K, disregarding Indian sensitivities, is puzzling. China has no compunction in obstructing Indian efforts at the UNO to include Pakistani perpetrators of terrorism on the list of designated terrorists. That a permanent member of the Security Council behaves in such an egregious fashion only shows that it places the narrow interests of its close ally — Pakistan — over international obligations.

The CTA now increasingly controls political aspects, with the Dalai Lama stepping into the shadows, though it is his charisma that continues to be the principal asset of the Tibetan cause. The future of the institution of the Dalai Lama is somewhat uncertain, with the present incumbent, who is getting on in years, having even mentioned that it may cease after his demise. The Chinese as well as the Indian government may have their own game plans, but the CTA is here to stay and needs to be played up in a manner which becomes a leveraging point for India. Taiwan is the most sensitive issue for China, with the US playing hot and cold in the game of power politics in the South China Sea. India, while recognising the one-China principle, has semi-formal contacts and relations with Taipei. The India-Taipei Association in Taiwan and Taipei Economic and Cultural Centre in India are quasi-missions that recognise the extensive trade relations between India and Taiwan. Visits by retired chiefs of the armed forces, politicians and artists recognise the fact that Taiwan cannot be wished away. Interestingly, PM Narendra Modi had visited Taiwan in 1999, when he was a BJP functionary. This needs to continue and gather more substance. Communist China has blatantly disregarded Indian sensitivities about Kashmir's territorial inviolability as an integral part of this country by building the C h i n a - P a k i s t a n Economic Corridor, which runs through Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. To pay back in the same coin and create a pressure point for hard bargaining, India needs to play up the Taiwan issue, creating ambiguity about its status.

Congress-AAP count anti-incumbency factor in polling for all 10 LS seats, Karnal Assembly segment on May 25

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The Election Commission of India announced the seven-phase poll schedule for the Lok Sabha poll, with elections in Haryana falling in phase 6. The counting will be held on June 4. Polling for all 10 Lok Sabha (LS) seats in Haryana and byelection to the Karnal Assembly segment will take place on May 25. In 2019, the BJP had won all 10 LS seats, and is hoping to repeat the performance. It has already announced candidates for six seats and recently replaced the CM to mitigate anti-incumbency and dropped the JJP from the government. On the other hand, the Congress-AAP alliance is counting on the anti-incumbency factor and farmers' unrest against the BJP government. The BJP had bagged 58 per cent of the vote while the Congress could gather 28 per cent in the 2019 Lok Sabha poll. State Chief Electoral Officer Anurag Agarwal has informed that the state has added 23 lakh new voters in the past five years. In Haryana, a total of 1.98 crore voters will be eligible to participate in these elections. The maximum voters are in the 30-39 age group at 46.36 lakh, followed by 39.51 lakh

(40-49 age group) and 39.27 lakh (20-29 age group). The number of voters in the 18-19 age group is 3.63 lakh, including 1.2 lakh female voters, who will be participating in the electoral process for the first time. Similarly, the number of voters in the age group of 100-109 is 10,759. There are 41 voters above the age of 120, of which eight voters are from Gurugram. Agarwal said the final publication of the voter list was done on January 22. The list had been made available to representatives of all parties. To ensure no violation of the Model Code of Conduct during the General Election, the Election Commission has developed the C-Vigil app, which would function as the "third eye" of the commission. Any reports of malpractice can be updated on the app, and the reporter's identity would remain confidential. Any citizen can report violations of the poll code by providing photos, audios, and videos via their mobile phones.

Agency owner, employees booked for stealing from cylinders

**Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA :** The CM flying squad, teams nabbed a total of 19 suspects from a gas agency in Garira village. The team comprised of the officials of the Food and Civil Supplies Department and the police, registered a case against over 20 individuals of a gas agency for stealing liquefied petroleum gas from gas cylinders to sell it in a black market in Pinjore. Officials said they received a tip-off about the theft of LPG gas from cylinders and illegal sale of cylinders in Pinjore, adding that teams were called from the police and Food and Civil Supplies Department to the site. The police said they identified over 20 individuals who were involved in stealing LPG from gas cylinders. The officials added that the suspects filled the stolen gas into empty cylinders for sale. The police managed to nab 19 of those involved, and a few managed to flee. The suspects have been identified as Jitender, Mahesh Kumar, Shyam Shankar, Kuldeep, Pradeep, Karan Kumar, Manoj, Santosh Kumar, Samar, Manish, Akash Dipu, Mahinder Kumar, Sanjay Kumar, Avdhesh Kumar, Manoj Kumar, Ramesh

Kumar, Shiv Kumar, Abhishek Kumar, Rahul and Brijesh. The storekeeper of the agency told the police that the theft was being carried out on the direction of the agency owner, Jitender. The police said they have recovered a few vehicles and 507 gas cylinders, including 474 domestic and 29 commercial cylinders, from the site, along with other equipment from the possession of the suspects. The police said the suspects used to extract gas from cylinders and get paid in full money from residents, adding that after extracting gas, they would fill up empty cylinders, sell them, and divide the amount among themselves. The police at Pinjore police station have registered a case against the suspects under the Essential Commodities Act and Sections 120-B (party to a criminal conspiracy) and 420 (cheating and dishonesty) of the IPC.

Soup served with dead cockroach in Shatabdi, IRCTC fined

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation Limited (IRCTC) and Northern Railway would pay a compensation of Rs 10,000 to a city resident for causing mental agony and harassment by serving soup with dead cockroach. The District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has directed the railway authorities to implement the order. The commission also ordered payment of Rs 5,000 as cost of litigation to the complainant. In a complaint filed before the commission, Rahil Mahajan said he and his mother were travelling from New Delhi to Chandigarh in Shatabdi on September 3 last year. They were served hot soup and bread on board by catering staff of the OPs (Railway and IRCTC). After taking some soup, he noticed a dead cockroach in the bowl and immediately called the catering staff and informed them about it. Rahil also brought the fact to the notice of co-passengers. He clicked photographs of the cockroach in bowl and recorded his grievance in the IRCTC complaint



booklet. He also informed the train incharge/TC. The complainant had tweeted about it on the official account of the Railway Ministry and was assured that action would be taken as per procedure. The complainant stated that the bread served to him was expired as the package mentioned 'best to use before September 2'. The IRCTC denied the charges and claimed that the complainant had filed the false complaint. After hearing the arguments, the commission observed that it was clear from the documentary evidence that the OPs had served unhygienic food to the complainant and his mother as a dead cockroach was found in the soup. The aforesaid act of OPs amounted to deficiency in service and unfair trade practice, the commission stated.

Only sterilised ferocious dogs be allowed for registration : MC

**Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA :** The decision over dog breeds was being taken in a bid to control the population of these ferocious dog breeds, said officials. The MC had banned the breeding and keeping of such ferocious dogs in residences in October 2022 and directed the owners of such dogs to get their pets registered or face a hefty fine. However, the pet owners in continue to ignore MC's directions and have failed to register these canines. Over a year and a half after imposing a complete ban on the breeding of ferocious dog breeds — pitbulls and rottweilers — the Municipal Corporation is mulling the registration of dogs of such breeds only if these have been sterilised. The MC had recently issued directions for the registration



of pets. The MC Commissioner had said teams might take dogs into their custody in case these were found roaming in streets without leash. As per data accessed from the MC, residents have registered 128 pet dogs with the civic body in fiscal 2023-24. MC officials said physical applications were not accepted. "The applications for registration of pets are accepted through the Saral Haryana website," said an official.

Panchkula MC Commissioner Sachin Gupta said the MC had given residents one month to register their canines, after which they would initiate action against pet dogs found roaming in streets without leash. He said, "In a bid to deter people from breeding the banned dog breeds, we are mulling issuing directions that only sterilised dogs of ferocious breeds will be registered by the Panchkula Municipal Corporation."

Single-phase polling for Punjab on June 1

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The state has nine general constituencies, including Gurdaspur, Amritsar, Khadoor Sahib, Anandpur Sahib, Ludhiana, Ferozepur, Bathinda, Sangrur and Patiala. The four reserved seats (SC) include Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur, Fatehgarh Sahib and Faridkot. With the Election Commission announcing seven-phase Lok Sabha poll schedule elections on 13 parliamentary seats in the state will be held on June 1. The General Election will commence on April 19 and the votes will be counted on June 4. As of March 1, the state has 2,12,71,245 voters out of which 1,19,29,959 are men, 1,07,75,543 women and as many as 744 are transgender voters. The



state has a total of 24,433 polling stations. In the 2019 Lok Sabha poll, the Congress recorded victory on eight seats, SAD and the BJP won two seats each and AAP one. So far, only AAP has announced eight candidates—Ministers Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer (Sangrur), Dr Balbir Singh (Patiala), Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal (Amritsar), Laljit Singh Bhullar (Khadoor Sahib) and Gurmeet Singh Khuddian (Bathinda). The three others include Sushil Rinku (Jalandhar), Karamjit Anmol (Faridkot)

and Gurpreet Singh GP (Fatehgarh Sahib). Meanwhile, three prominent Congress leaders— Rinku, GP and Ch a b b e w a l —h a v e switched their loyalty towards AAP. There's a buzz of more leaving shortly incase their "political aspirations were not respected by the party high command". So far, SAD and the BJP have neither released list of their candidates nor have they announced an alliance. During the year-long farm stir in 2020-21, the Akali Dal had pulled out of the pact with the BJP. In February, Home Minister Amit Shah had mentioned about the talks between the two parties. However, the issues related to farmers and 'Bandi Singhs' have kept the tie-up lingering.

## No power tussle in Haryana BJP, as Nayab Saini takes over post of CM

**CHANDIGARH** : Former Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar said change is part of life. Changes keep happening, including in the political arena. He, however, indicated that the decision to effect the change in leadership was not a sudden one.

Felt happy like a family elder, says Manohar Lal Khattar on Nayab Saini taking over as Haryana CM

Addressing a rally in Karnal district's Gharaunda, Khattar while referring to the change at the helm in Haryana, said, "I am very happy today. I am feeling the same happiness which an elder of a family does..."

BJP president J P Nadda was also supposed to attend the event, but a functionary said he could not come due to some party engagements.

"It is not that it happened suddenly. For one year, I had been telling leadership that this is right time... bring a new face," said Khattar.

That wish was fulfilled last week and the party MLAs unanimously decided that Kurukshetra MP Saini will be the next chief minister, he



said.

"As disciplined soldiers of the BJP, we are ready to play any role. Our concern is to take the state and the country ahead," he further said.

The senior BJP leader said one sees power tussle which goes on in other parties. Factionalism is seen in the Congress, including in Haryana, he said.

Targeting the opposition in Haryana, Khattar said earlier when he became the chief minister in 2014, the opposition used to say he lacks experience and how will he run government.

"We did not have experience of indulging in loot like they did. But I had the experience of serving people for 40 years then... They criticise our portals, our flagship schemes like Parivar Pehchan Patra and other schemes, and say they

will shut them down if they come to power.

"I want to remind them that various sections of people who are benefitting due to these schemes will teach them a lesson in the polls," said the former chief minister.

Khattar, who resigned as an MLA from Karnal, has been made a party candidate to contest the Lok Sabha polls from Karnal.

"When I resigned from Karnal, I told the party high command that Karnal has got a tag of "CM city" and proposed that Saini should contest from there," Khattar said.

Addressing the gathering, Saini said it was Khattar who held his finger and guided him in his political career. He said Khattar has worked hard to take the state forward.

He said so many schemes were formulated during Khattar's tenure for the welfare of various sections including poor and weaker sections.

The chief minister also said the people of Haryana, like in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, will give all the 10 seats to "Modi ji's kitty" this time too.

## Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

**GURUGRAM** : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city.

The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting.

The decision to shift Kumar was taken as the officer was removed earlier too from active election management-related duty during the 2016 assembly election in the state and in the 2019 Lok Sabha election, poll panel sources pointed out.

## ED raids 10 locations in Delhi-NCR in spurious cancer medicines drugs case

**NEW DELHI** : The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Monday raided multiple locations in Delhi-NCR as part of a money laundering investigation linked to a case of manufacture and sale of spurious cancer medicines, official sources said.

The federal agency searched 10 locations and recovered about Rs 65 lakh in cash from two locations.

The money laundering case was registered taking cognisance of a Delhi Police crime branch case registered last week to probe an organised criminal racket allegedly involved in the manufacturing and selling of cancer and chemotherapy drugs to certain hospitals in Delhi-NCR, sources said.

The premises of the main suspects and their



associates such as Vipul Jain, Suraj Shat, Neeraj Chauhan, Parvez Malik, Komal Tiwari, Abhinay and Tushar Chauhan were covered by ED.

Of the total cash, Rs 23 lakh was recovered from a bean bag kept in the house of Suraj Sharma, sources said.

Police have arrested a dozen people, including an IIT-BHU graduate, in this case till now. According to the police, Vipul Jain was the "mastermind" of the racket.

Neeraj Chauhan, who previously worked as a manager in the oncology

department of reputed hospitals, joined Jain in 2022 and leveraged his experience in getting "fake" chemotherapy injections at affordable rates.

The accused were charged by the police under Sections 274 (adulteration of drugs), 275 (sale of adulterated drugs), 276 (sale of the drug as a different drug or preparation), 420 (cheating), 468 (forgery for purpose of cheating), 471 (using as genuine a forged document), and 120-B (criminal conspiracy) of the IPC.

**NEW DELHI** : The 55-year-old national convener of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has been asked to depose at the central agency's office in central Delhi.

The Enforcement Directorate has issued fresh summons to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal to appear for questioning on March 21 in the excise policy linked money laundering case, official sources said Sunday. The ninth summons have been issued so that Kejriwal's statement can be recorded under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), the sources said.

The CM has repeatedly refused to appear in response to these summons, calling them illegal.

A Delhi court on Saturday had granted bail to Kejriwal on two complaints filed by the agency against him for



skipping six of the previous eight summons in this case.

The ED had moved the magisterial court seeking Kejriwal's prosecution for not attending the summonses issued to him in the case.

The agency arrested BRS leader K Kavitha in this case two days back.

Kejriwal's name has been mentioned multiple times in charge sheets filed by the ED in the excise policy case. The agency has said that the accused were in touch with Kejriwal regarding the preparation of the excise policy for 2021-22.

So far, the ED has arrested AAP leaders Manish Sisodia and Sanjay Singh, party

communications in-charge Vijay Nair and some liquor businessmen in this case.

The ED had claimed in its charge sheet that the AAP used "proceeds of crime" to the tune of about Rs 45 crore in its Goa assembly polls campaign.

It is alleged that the Delhi government's excise policy to grant licences to liquor traders allowed cartelisation and favoured certain dealers who had allegedly paid bribes for it, a charge repeatedly refuted by the AAP.

The policy was subsequently scrapped and Delhi Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena recommended a Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) probe into the irregularities in its formulation and implementation. Later, the ED registered a case under the PMLA.

## Rouse Avenue Court grants bail to Delhi Chief Minister

New Delhi : Bail for Arvind Kejriwal against skipping summons In Liquor Policy Case has been granted by Rouse Avenue Court .

The Delhi Chief Minister violated Section 174 of the Indian Penal Code when he skipped the Enforcement Directorate's repeated summons in the alleged Delhi excise policy scam. Against arrest for skipping probe agency summons in the alleged scam, issue of bail was considered. He was asked to furnish a personal bond of Rs 15,000 and a security bond of Rs 1 lakh for the bail.

The Chief Minister violated Section 174 of the Indian Penal Code - which deals with disobeying a legal order to be at a certain place in person or by agent - when he



skipped the Enforcement Directorate's repeated summons in the alleged Delhi excise policy scam. The court summoned the AAP chief after the Enforcement Directorate, which wants to question Mr Kejriwal in connection with the Delhi excise policy case, told the court that the Chief Minister skipped eight summons issued under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act. Arvind Kejriwal will not have to appear in person for the next hearing of the case on April 1.

## Law on appointing CEC, ECs not stayed by Supreme Court

New Delhi : Supreme Court on Friday expressed reservations before declining to stay Chief Election Commission-er and Other Election Commissioners (Appointment, Conditions of Service and Term of Office) Act and passan interim order to prevent appointment of election commissioners under the law.

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna, Dipankar Datta and Augustine George Masih said the court had on two previous hearings refused to pass an interim order when pressed by the petitioners.

We do not stay legislation by way of interim orders," the bench said. As the application filed by the



petitioner regarding appointment of two election commissioners was not on re-cord, the court deferred the hearing to March 21.

On Thursday, Gyanesh Kumar and Sukhbir Singh Sandhu were appointed as election commissioners.

The petitioners Congress activist Jaya Thakur and Association of Demo-crat-ic Reformssought SC's

direction for appoint-ment of election commissioners by a panel consisting of the PM, Leader of Opposition and the CJI as directeda by it last year and not as perthe provision of subsequent Act. They have challenged the provision of the Act which says that selection of ECs is to be done by the Prime Minister, Union cabinet minister and Leader of opposition.

## Former IAS Gyanesh Kumar, Sukhbir Sandhu named ECs

New Delhi: Ex IAS officers Gyanesh Kumar and Sukhbir Singh Sandhu were appointed as election commissioners and will hit the ground running with the Election Commission setting poll dates for Lok Sabha and four state assemblies. The two appointments were approved by the PM-led election panel at a meeting on Thursday afternoon, attended by home minister Amit Shah and leader of Congress in LS Adhir Ranjan Choudhury the other two members . Choudhury put up a dissent note raising questions over the procedure for appointment of the two EC members, calling it a "mere

formality" as he was given a shortlist of six candidates "just 10 minutes be forever the meeting. The vacancies were created due to the completion of Anup Chandra Pandey's tenure in Feb, when he turned 65, and, there after, the sudden resignation of Arun Goel on March 8. Kumar and Sandhu belong to the 1988 batch of IAS and had super annuated in Jan; the latter, though, was on a six-month extension. Given that both were appointed as EC members on the same day, it remains to be seen who will succeed chief election commissioner Rajiv Kumar whose tenure ends in Feb 2025.

## Bribery of Re 38 Cr in Delhi Jal Board, alleges CBI

New Delhi : Amid the legal tussle between Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and Enforcement Directorate (ED) over the multiple summons in Delhi liquor policy case, the central agency has now asked the AAP leader to appear for questioning in another case. Mr Kejriwal has been summoned in a money laundering case linked to alleged irregularities in Delhi Jal Board.

Set up in 1998, the Delhi Jal Board is responsible for distributing drinking water across the national capital. Also called DJB, the board treats water from sources such as Yamuna river and Bhakra Dam and canals near



Delhi. It is also responsible for collecting and disposing sewage from areas under New Delhi Municipal Council and Delhi Cantonment.

The ED case is based on an FIR registered by CBI. It alleges that DJB's former chief engineer, Jagdish Kumar Arora, had awarded a Rs 38-crore contract to NKG Infrastructure Limited. This contract was for the supply, installation and testing of

electromagnetic flow meters. The FIR alleges that officials of DJB and NBCC illegally favoured NKG Infrastructure for a bribe. The ED arrested Mr Arora and a contractor, Anil Kumar Aggarwal, on January 31. NKG Infrastructure, it is alleged, got the bid on the basis of forged documents and that Mr Arora was aware of the fact that the company did not meet the technical eligibility.
