Evades to deposit 100% equal EPF share in saving accounts

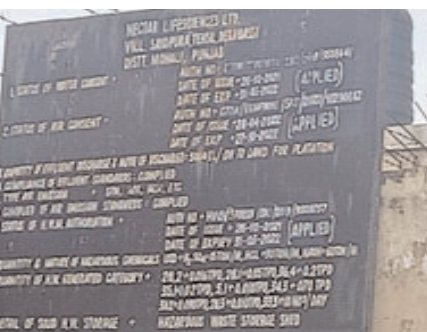
Pollution has slowly been killing more persons than any other disease like Covid, Dengue

DERABASSI : Already having been caught by the local legislator Kuljit Singh Randhwa, while discharging pungent, toxic Carbon gases into the environment, the director of Nectar Life Sciences "has purportedly neglected the order of Punjab Pollution Control Board besides the incumbent MLA of the Dera Bassi block. The industrial unit was penalised Rs 5 lakh as default cried by the local populace in the vicinity of Nectar Life Sciences. Vendors to be divested of licences, if not occupying sites

PANCHKULA : Despite futility of new vending sites vendors are seen showing little or no respect for the allotted sites by the local Municipal Corporation. In the follow up of the vending zone scheme, new licences are vigorously being issued as per the status, only 20% of vendors are seen working in their designated places. The licence holders if not working would be divested by their eligibility said an official of the civic body. In 8 sectors of the town 778 vending sites have been earmarked. Highest number being 350 licences are allotted to sector 19. So far, the MC has conducted six draws of lots and issued 564 licenses to street vendors but few actually work at the sites allotted to them. Most of the sites are lying vacant.



The MC survey conducted in the city states that there are 3,718 street vendors and 58.2% street vendors are Panchkula residents while the rest are from other states. The first preference in site allotment is given to Panchkula residents. Taking note of sites left vacant after allotment, Mayor Kulbhusan Goyal said, "We will cancel the allotment of the street vendors if they are not found to be sitting at their allotted site, which will then be given to other vendors. A draw for allotment of remaining sites will be held soon." He added that if vendors started working at sites allotment to them, the problem of encroachments would end. Vendors, on the other hand, alleged that the MC was not providing facilities promised at the time of site allotment, which was why they were not working there. MUMBAI : The Narcotics Control Bureau in draft charges filed in the drug case linked to actor Sushant Singh Rajput ' death has claimed actress Rhea Chakraborty received. Multiple deliveries of ganja from the co-accused including her brother Showik and were handed over to Sushant Rajput. The central, anti drug agency filed the draft charges. Last month in the Special Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (NDPS) against 36 accused. The accused had financed drug trafficking and consumed ganja, charas, cocaine and other narcotic drugs and psychotropic sub-



stances sans any valid licence, permit, or authorisation within the Mumbai Metropolitan region. All those involved have been charged under relevant provisions of the NDPS act, including section 27 and 27 A. (financing illicit trafficking and harbouring offenders), 28t punishment for attempts to commit offences), 29, (who ever abets or is a party to a criminal

conspiracy) as per the draft charges. The draft charges maintained that accuse number 10 Rhea Chakraborty received many deliveries of ganja from accused Samuel Miranda, Showik, Dipesh Savant and had handed over all those deliveries to the late actor Sushant Singh Rajput. Rhea made payments for those deliveries at the instance of Showik and the late actor between March to Sept 2020. Rhea's brother Showik was in regular touch with the drug peddlers. EDITORIAL —

Indian diaspora wins domestic audience

Those in the know of how domestic politics impacts foreign relations are increasingly focussed on the role of overseas Indians in shaping bilateral relations. Concerns about human rights abuses in India have been heightened by the activism of overseas Indians within developed country democracies. Any Indian politician who likes to draw attention to their overseas popularity respond to concerns of those who are not particularly enthusiastic about some leaders but have larger interests of the home country at heart. Of all the politically active overseas Indian communities, Canada has been home to the group that has generated the greatest concern in New Delhi. One day Canada may well have an Indian-origin PM. In the US an Indian origin politician is a heartbeat away from becoming head of state. While Indian-origin heads of government in countries like Ireland and Portugal may not worry New Delhi, London is a very different cup of tea. The fact is that whether or overseas the community of Indians is a diversified one. The Howdy Modi Houston event in 2019 was funded by over a hundred Indian American community organisations and

castelnes and all their sectional politics come into play in a variety of ways, impacting US-Indian relations. When PM Modi raised the domestic political profile of the Indian diaspora with his televised mega shows over seas it was hoped by the audience at home would be enthused by the success and adoration of overseas Indians. But the politics of overseas Indian can but both ways. Some love you and some don't. In any case, politicians of Indian origin in foreign countries have to please their domestic audience, not an Indian one. The economic and philanthropic roles of overseas Indian have been repeatedly welcomed by successive governments. It's the 'political' role that creates both excitement and angst and is increasingly a source of concern in home and host countries. Not surprisingly, therefore, Indian officials are presently hoping that a Boris-like figure would be elected British prime minister rather than a South Asian brown skin. Rishi Sunak may be of Indian origin and the son-in-law of a patriotic Indian, but it's best that someone like Liz Truss makes it. Easier to deal with the United Kingdom through a fish-n-chips true-blue Brit, than through a

dosa aficionado. That was the lesson learnt dealing with the United States and Canada. So, as the US vice-president, Kamala Harris has to speak for her constituents at home, even if that means displeasing Indians. More to the point, any political intervention by Harris that has a link to an Indian concern may always be interpreted in one way or another both in the US and in India. President Joe Biden would always be seen promoting US interests, while Indian expect Harris to be sensitive to Indian ones. That's the kind of concern shaping the thinking in New Delhi about recent political developments in London. There are three very different kinds of political roles that the Indian diaspora can potentially play. The first type is where overseas Indians promote Indian national interests. This was on display in the US congressional support for Indian national interests increased thanks to the political activism of Indian Americans. The support for Indian on issue pertaining to Kashmir and the nuclear programme increased year after year with Indian Americans funding pro-India lobbies. This finally translated into US congressional support for the US-India civil nuclear energy deal.

Councillor urges Purohit for 85% quota to Chandigarh domicile



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : In an open letter, MC councillor and advocate Saurabh Joshi has said Chandigarh, a UT, even though being a joint capital of two states i.e. Punjab and Haryana was deprived of any reservation policy prevalent in these states. Both states had in place reservations policies for the people with respective domiciles. More specifically, there was no reservation for children in Chandigarh professional colleges. Joshi has written to UT Administrator Banwarilal Purohit demanding 85% reservation policy for those holding a Chandigarh domicile. Even Panjab University and its affiliated colleges ignored any rightful

place to those born in Chandigarh. Also, institutes such as the Central Scientific Instruments Organisation (CSIO), National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER), etc. disregarded any quota for people of the city, said the BJP leader. Joshi further wrote due to lack of any such quota, the eligible youth of Chandigarh felt ignored and debilitated. Dejected, they were forced to move out of the city to pursue further studies and for appropriate job opportunities outside their city. "Given such a state, I, being a born and brought up in Chandigarh, tend to understand the ignored status of youth from city," he added.

Another 2 FIRs add to the tally of GBP builders

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : A woman resident of Sector 47 alleged Satish Kumar Gupta, Raman Gupta, Pardeep Gupta and Anupam Gupta cheated her of Rs 28.59 lakh regarding booking of an apartment their project 'Athens-1' in Kharar. The police have registered two more cases of cheating against Gupta Builders and Promoters Pvt Ltd for duping city residents. The apartment was



supposed to be delivered in August 2021, but the builders failed to give the possession. Another woman resident of DMC, Sector 38, filed a similar complaint regarding booking of property at 'GBP Camellia', Kharar. The police have registered cases at Sector 34 police station and initiated investigation.

100 locations to witness CCTV installations in city by Aug 15



Commissioner News Service AMRITSAR : A private firm has been instructed to install CCTV cameras at 100 locations in the city by August 15. In a review meeting on Integrated Command Control Centre (ICCC) under the Smart City project, Deputy Commissioner-cum-Municipal Corporation Commissioner Harpreet Singh Sudan. Under the Smart City project, the Amritsar Municipal Corporation (MC) had proposed to install 1,218 CCTVs at 466 locations in the city. The MC is also establishing an Integrated Command Control Centre (ICCC) to keep a check on the movements on the entire city. Work on establishing the centre at Ranjit Avenue has been started by the company a few days ago. Joint Commissioner Hardeep

Singh stated that by July 25, the company has to complete the work of centre at the MC office in Ranjit Avenue. Apart from this, directions have been given to the company by DC Harpreet Singh Sudan that by August 15, the company should install cameras at 100 sites in any condition. "The places where poles for CCTV cameras are to be installed, roads should not be dug to install wires. The laying of wires should be done through horizontal distance drilling machine only. As per the project, the entire city will be monitored 24x7 through these cameras on multiple screens, wherein the company, hired by Amritsar Smart City Limited (ASCL), will look after the operation and maintenance work for four years. This project, which will cost around Rs 95 crore, is being funded by ASCL.

Accelerate tempo of highways, ensure timely start of Mohalla Clinics

The meeting also reviewed the projects of Guru Teg Bahadur Law University, Kairon, Guru Ravidas Memorial, Maharaja Bhupinder Singh Sports University and Guru Gobind Singh Skill Institute, among others.

Govt nurseries to provide saplings to Forest Department

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : In view of the bungling charges made last year, under a plantation project of the NHAI, nearly one lakh saplings were purchased from private nurseries, the Forest Department has decided not to buy saplings from private nurseries and instead procure these from government-run places. The order comes after the Vigilance Bureau (VB) probe



into a corruption case against former forest ministers Sadhu Singh Dharamsot and Sangat Singh Gilzian. In its probe, the VB had pointed out that during plantation drives, contractors, without buying any saplings,

used to get back 80 per cent of the amount in cash after leaving the remaining 20 per cent with the nursery. This 80 per cent amount was shared among officials, politicians and the contractor, the VB said.

Embezzler devours Rs 28000 via hotel online booking

Bedi found a mobile number on which he contacted. A swindler duped him of Rs 28,000 after he tried to book a hotel online. confirmation. The complainant, unaware of the fact that he is being cheated, shared the OTP, following which a sum of Rs 7,000 and Rs 21,000 was deducted from his credit card. The police were informed about the incident, following

The police said as per the latest cyber crime trend, scammers and fraudsters had been duping people by uploading fake numbers on Google. "When people search for contact numbers of hotels, courier services and grocery shops, the numbers uploaded by the fraudsters appear in the search. On calling those numbers, people fall in the trap laid by fraudsters," said a cop.

Chandigarh speeds up for cloth bags replacing polythene

Tough cooking exercise with new GST rates

NEW DELHI : The GST Council chaired by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has withdrawn, in its 47th meet, exemptions from taxation on these items. Now, these products will have a GST rate from the current nil. Prices of several household items like packed curd, lassi, buttermilk, paneer, wheat and rice will go up while bank services and hospital room rent will



become costlier from Monday after the GST rates were hiked for several items in the 47th Goods and Services Tax meeting in Chandigarh last month. Products like curd, lassi, buttermilk, paneer, wheat, rice etc., which are pre-

packaged and labelled, will attract GST of 5 per cent from July 18. GST of 18 per cent will be imposed on roads, bridges, railways, metro, effluent treatment plant and crematorium.

Home buyers cry fraud of Rs 15 crore by builder in Gurugram

GURUGRAM : An FIR has been registered at the Farrukhnagar police station against the Proprietor of Amaya Greens. Residential society Amaya Greens was to be developed by the builder in Sector 3 of Farrukhnagar. Company director Vijay Rajan had appointed sales representatives to sell flats. Complainant Asish Negi and 77 others booked flats in the project. More than 75 homebuyers have been allegedly duped of Rs 15 crore by a builder (Savyasachi Infrastructure Private Limited) in the Farrukhnagar area here. The builder had



promised to develop the apartments within a year after taking money, but he failed to do so. At the time of booking, the builder told them that the map of the project was with the DTP Department and that they would get their units in one year. "We all have made payments. But, even after four years, neither the builders has given us flats nor returned

our money. We want a strict action against the builder," said the complainant. Following the complaint, an FIR has been registered against the builder and director Vijay Rajan and others under various sections of the IPC at the Farrukhnagar police station. "We have started investigation and action will be taken as per the law," said the investigation officer.

Linking Aadhaar with voter ID card to begin from August 1 : Chandigarh Admin

CHANDIGARH : The UT Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) chaired a meeting with the District Election Officer, Electoral Registration Officer and all Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs) of the Chandigarh Parliamentary constituency regarding the latest amendments to the election rules which will be implemented from August 1. The UT Election Department will implement the latest amendments to the election rules in the city from August 1. The CEO stated that the Election Commission of India conveyed the amendments made by the Ministry of Law and Justice to the Representation of the People Act, 1950, and the Representation of the People Act, 1951, vide the Election Laws (Amendment) Act 2021 dated December 30, 2021, including linking of Aadhaar with voter ID card and multiple qualifying dates etc. On the direction of the Election Commission, Aadhaar would be collected from the registered electors of Chandigarh for the electoral registration purpose, he said. From August 1, there would be four qualifying dates such as January 1, April 1, July 1 and October 1 for enrolment in electoral rolls, the CEO said, adding that there would be gender neutral provision for



service and special electors. Further, the updated forms mentioned in the latest instructions would be used in the coming special summary revision of photo electoral rolls. The AEROs were also briefed about the amendments to the forms. The amendments regarding forms would be uploaded on the website of the CEO, Chandigarh, i.e. ceochandigarh.gov.in for the information of general public. He said the AEROs were directed to provide the training regarding the amendments to the election rules, IT applications (Garuda App, NVSP, Voter Portal and ERO Net) to the BLOs working under their jurisdiction. The Chief Electoral Officer also reviewed the progress of the disposal of forms and directed all AEROs to dispose of the forms in a time-bound manner. It was also stated that from now onwards, electors photo identification cards will be delivered to the registered electors through post with the help of the Postal Department, Chandigarh.

Drugs hook over 40% inmates on narcotics in Punjab jails

CHANDIGARH : The situation was alarming in some jails as over 40 per cent of the inmates had enrolled themselves for de-addiction, sources revealed. In Barnala, 252 (45 per cent) of the screened 566 inmates had tested positive for drugs. More surprising was that a large number of prisoners who didn't have any recorded history of addiction nor were they enrolled for treatment in jail de-addiction centres tested positive for various substances. On July 15, the prison department conducted the screening in the jails of Nabha, Mansa, Barnala and Muktsar, sub jails in Malerkotla, Moga, Fazilka and Patti, the Nabha Open Jail and the Hoshiarpur Central Jail. The same exercise was earlier done in Ropar jail. That drugs are easily available in prisons across Punjab has become more evident after a surprise screening of about 6,000 inmates in 11 jails found most of them hooked on one drug or the other. Kept confidential, the testing was conducted following reports that several inmates were managing to



procure prohibited drugs inside jails. The health officials too were informed at the eleventh hour. Jails Minister Harjot Bains said the exercise was meant to check the smuggling of drugs into jails. "In some jails, a significant number of prisoners have tested positive for various substances. Apart from taking disciplinary action against jail staff, we will get the addicts enrolled for treatment," said Bains. Most of the prisoners were found addicted to pain relievers such as morphine, tramadol and buprenorphine. Interestingly, the jail staff had no record of addiction of around 10 per cent of the inmates who were found positive. A senior health official said that the findings of the testing indicated the prisoners were getting drugs easily inside jails.

Donate blood or do community service for traffic violation

JALANDHAR : People should not violate the stipulated traffic rules which ultimately enhances the frequency of road mishaps. Since the Punjab Government issued a fresh notification fixing fine amount and suspension of licenses in case of traffic rule violations, it would be now very hard to escape the clutches of law said AS Rai the Additional General of Police (Traffic). The ADGP stated that the traffic police wings across Punjab had been given necessary directions to ensure strict compliance of instructions stipulated in the new notification. In days to come, the police would set up nakas to check speed limit, jumping red light, using mobile phone while driving, influence of drink and drugs at time of driving, overloading and riding more than two persons on two wheelers. Seeking cooperation from general public, AS Rai said now licenses of violators would be



suspended for a specific period on first and second violations besides they will have to undergo the community services as suggested by the competent authorities. The ADGP not only urged the parent but also the school authorities to educate under-age children/students about the traffic rules besides preventing them from driving vehicles unless they have obtained licenses. He said it had been observed that in cities triple riding was done by teenagers and other youngsters, which would be strictly prevented by imposing fixed

fine amount. Now, the police officer of the rank of Assistant Sub Inspector and above will be authorised to challan the vehicle for overspeed, jumping red light, using mobile phone while driving, drunk and drive and triple riding, he added. Giving details of new notification issued by the Transport Department, the ADGP said that now driving at a speed exceeding the specified speed limit would attract fine amount of Rs 1000 along with suspension of licenses for a period of three months on first violation. The composition fee will be double, i.e. Rs 2000 in case of second violation with three month's license suspension. The fine of amount of Rs 1000 and Rs 2000 along with suspension of licenses for three months will be imposed respectively on first and second violation in case of red light jumping, he added.

PANCHKULA : The new NIFT campus has been built on 10.35 acres of land with a budget of Rs 133.16 crore. The 17th National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT) came into being in Panchkula. Mr Piyush Goyal Union Textile Minister and Haryana CM Manohar Lal Khattar inaugurated the building. The CM said that the new campus would be developed as a world class one on global rating. He added that Rs 133.16 crore had been spent on construction of the institute, which was built on 10.42 acres of land, having academic block on 7.50 acres and hostel block on 2.92 acres. The institute also has parking space for 280 vehicles. The NIFT campus has been established in collaboration with the union ministry of textiles and



NIFT, Delhi. The highlights of the building design include energy efficient VRV system for air conditioning, rain water harvesting system, sewerage treatment plant, light weight AAC (Aerated Autoclaved) blocks, natural day light, use of recycled materials and energy efficient LED lights. Mr Khattar said that if the union minister agreed to the state's proposal, then work of second phase of construction would be completed in 50:50 ratio. In the second phase, there are plans to build hostels,

theaters and auditoriums. The CM also announced that in line with NIFT policy, 20% seats in the institute would be reserved for people holding Haryana domicile. The institute will offer four-year degree courses in areas of fashion design/textile design, apparel production and two-year master degree courses in fashion technology, design and fashion management. Apart from this, there will also be certificate programs of one year and six months duration, said the institute authorities.

Direct flights from city by UK, Canada

MOHALI : The metropolitan town Chandigarh is connected to only two international destinations, Dubai and Sharjah. The direct flight to Bangkok was withdrawn in 2019 owing to poor response. FlyPop is all set to start its maiden flight to London by this October. Talks with the British high Commission were quite favorable, said CHIAL chief executive officer (CEO) Rakesh Ranjan Sahay. Raising hopes of revival of international flights from Chandigarh International Airport, two international aviation companies, Fly Pop from London and Dog Wex from Toronto, Vancouver have expressed interest in direct flights from Chandigarh. He added that recently,



Canada - based Dogwex international Capital Corporation Communicated via email, expressing interest in starting a Charter flight directly to Toronto and Vancouver from Chandigarh. Mr Sahay said, "We have replied positively and now we wait for the schedule to be released by the company for starting direct flights to Toronto and Vancouver." DogWex has committed funding for a new start-up charter air operation to provide both passenger and cargo services to domestic and international markets, he said.

DevDarshan dhoop proprietors browbeat scribes

5-G auction to kick off on July 26

NEW DELHI: The biggest - ever auction of Spectrum with the government is putting 72,000 MHz of mobile airwaves on sale the largest such quantity being sold at one go adding new frequencies and bands in line with international trends. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has time and again stressed on the need for ushering in 5G for an enhanced digital governance, and this has seen the government roll out a liberal bailout package for the beleaguered telecom industry in September last year. The government hopes that companies such as Airtel, Reliance Jio, and Vodafone Idea will take a lead in making the transition to 5G telephony, which is likely to have a stronger case in the enterprise segment initially than in the consumer space. The government hopes that



the auctions, which will begin on July 26 and have a value of around Rs 4.3 lakh crore just at the reserve price, will prepare India for the next generation of mobile telephony as the world transitions to the era of machine to machine (M2M) communications, smart factories, remote surgeries, autonomous driving, immersive experiences, intelligent agriculture and education, as well as internet - of - things (IoT). Our nation eyes transition to high - speed 5G up telephony, the country is set to witness.

"Enterprises setting up captive non - public network (CNPN) may obtain the spectrum directly from the department of telecom (DoT) and establish their own isolated network. In this regard, DoT will undertake demand studies and thereafter seek Trai recommendations for direct assignment of spectrum to such enterprises," the notice-inviting applications (NIAS) for spectrum auctions said. Telecom minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the 5G auctions will be the "beginning of a new era for Indian telecom".

Fake HSRP fixed, lands in police net

CHANDIGARH: Tushar Aggarwal landed in police net, for perpetrating a number plate in sector 38 (west) motor market. On a secret information, a police team raided his shop, Aggarwal Car Planet, and recovered around 40 HSRPs of different states, like Punjab and Haryana, and UT Chandigarh. Police also seized a computer, a CPU and machines, which he had bought from Delhi for fixing fake number plates. He has been doing it for the past one year and charged between Rs 1,200 and Rs

2,000 per plate. The government's price for fixing HSRP is Rs 350 per vehicle. Thus, he was causing loss to the government and earning huge profits. People used to get fake HSRPs installed to save time and avoid being challaned. The fine for not installing HSRP is Rs 5,000 for four wheelers and Rs 3,000 for two wheelers for the first offence. Cops are grilling the accused to find out if any other shop keepers are doing it in and around the city. Police produced the accused before a local court and obtained his two day police remand.

5 Cr incentives to EV buyers, provisional budget passed

CHANDIGARH: The innovatively designed concept of the incentives shows the UT administration is serious about attracting people towards recently introduced Electric vehicles in the coming days, said an official of the Chandigarh Administration. UT Administration has set a Rs5 crore provisional budget for the department of science and technology to disburse incentives to buyers. The EV policy of the administration is likely to be released soon. By setting a budget to pay for incentives on buying EVs, the administration has shown its intention that it will instantly offer the facility to people. Since this is a provisional budgetary allocation amount, once the policy rolls out and people come forward to purchase



EVs, more funds will be allocated. Sources in the administration said the amount or percentage of the incentives against the purchase of EVs is declared by the administration in its draft policy. It will be available for both four-wheeler and two-wheeler EVs. "Moreover, a dedicated and an exclusive single window

system through online mode is being prepared for residents to complete all formalities related to EVs," revealed the sources. Financial benefits or incentives will be from Rs 3,000 to Rs 2 lakh on e-bicycles to e-commercial vehicle, according to the draft policy that has planned to give scrapping charges to people who want to dispose of their fuel vehicle.

KU fails to rank among top 100 varsities

KURUKSHETRA : Kurukshetra University (KU) for the second consecutive year, has failed to make it to the top 100 universities (in the university category) in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) of the country. Like last year, the university again featured in the NIRF rank band of 100 to 150. In 2020, the university was ranked at 99th position, in 2019 at 98 and in 2018 it was at 80th rank. The NIRF is based on the scores of five parameters, including teaching, learning and resources; research and professional practice; graduation outcomes; outreach and inclusivity and peer perception. A senior teacher in the university said the university ranking had been decreasing every year. Now, for the second time consecutively the



university failed to feature in the list of top 100 universities, he said. "It is a matter of concern for all of us as the university hasn't been able to improve its position. Some strict measures need to be taken and teachers have to be motivated to increase research work. To improve its ranking the university needs to work relentlessly throughout the year," the teacher added. "The results of the NIRF ranking are out, but we are worried about the grading of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). If the situation does

not improve, it will have a negative impact on the NAAC grading too," the teacher said. Currently, the university has A-plus grade in the NAAC grading and the accreditation is due this year. A senior KU official said, "Student-teacher ratio is very important for the ranking. The university has 506 budgeted posts for teachers of which around 50 per cent are lying vacant. But after getting approval from the government the university has already started the recruitment process for 106 teaching and 13 non-teaching posts."

Panic button mandatory for commercial vehicles in HP

SHIMLA : When the panic button is pressed, a signal is received at 112 through satellite following which the person in distress is contacted and cops are also alerted. Himachal Pradesh has emerged as the first state in the country to integrate commercial vehicles registered after January 1, 2019, with the emergency response support system (ERSS). The Transport Department has made installation of vehicle location tracking device and



panic button mandatory for registration of commercial vehicles after instructions were issued by the Centre in 2017 in the aftermath of the Nirbhaya case. Till date, the devices have been installed in 9,423 commercial vehicles. The panic

alarm is connected with the ERSS being monitored at the police headquarters. The devices are also monitored at the transport office. Himachal has become the first state to integrate commercial vehicles with ERSS and the formal inauguration would be done by CM Jai Ram Thakur on July 19, said Director (Transport) Anupam Kashyap, adding the system would also be useful to the drivers in case of health hazard or disaster.

Hry Panchayat election to be held by Sept 30

CHANDIGARH : There are 6,288 panchayats which will go to polls and 1.2 crore people are expected to vote for 6,288 sarpanches and 62,022 panches during the elections. Elections will also be held for 22 presidents and 488 members of zila parishads, 143 presidents and 3,080 members of panchayat samitis as well. With the state election commission (SEC) asking the government to complete the process of reservation of wards and revision of electoral rolls, the elections to panchayati raj institutions of the state are likely to be conducted by September 30. The government is yet to announce direct elections to the posts of heads of block samitis and zila parishads. As the tenure of panchayats



already ended in February last year, the government appointed administrators for the purpose of development works. The elections process got delayed on account of multiple cases filed in the Punjab and Haryana high court. It was in May that the high court finally allowed the government to go ahead with its plans of elections. Hence, the process had begun. Haryana state election commis-

sioner Dhanpat Singh said the government had already been informed to ensure that it met deadlines related to completion of procedures related to revision of electoral rolls and reservation of wards. "Once this is complete, we shall meet our deadline of September 30. But let the entire process be completed first," said Dhanpat Singh, the state election commissioner.

Hike in rates for private, VIP rooms by PGI authorities

CHANDIGARH: The rates for a room in private ward will be Rs 3,500, which was Rs 1,900 in 2013. The rate for a VIP room will be Rs 6,500, which was earlier Rs 3,400. These charges were decided by the hospital charges committee meeting in February and have been approved recently. The charges are for all private rooms in advanced cardiac centres, advanced eye centre, Covid hospital, advanced trauma centre, psychiatry and Nehru hospi-



tal. For private and VIP rooms by 43% and 50%. The last revision was done in 2013. There are over 150 such rooms in various centres of the hospital. Most of them have a huge waiting list. The diet and laboratory charges

were Rs 200 each, while the room rental was Rs 1,500 per day previously. These have been hiked to Rs 250 and Rs 350 for diet and laboratory charges, while the rental is Rs 2,900 for private rooms. The VIP rooms rental was Rs 3,000, excluding diet and laboratory charges of Rs 200 each. This has been increased to Rs 5,900 for rental and Rs 300 each for diet and laboratory charges. However, the charges of Rs 300 for keeping an attendant which is optional remains the same.
