## Canada Promoting Extremism against India Amid Khalistan Bickering - Narendra Modi

New Delhi : Over persistent lethargic action by Trudeau government, in Canada , most provocative movements were noticed.Hence,the trade ties have been affected, sources revealed .Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 10 Sept had conveyed India,'s strong resentment about anti India activi-

ties of extremism elements in Justin Trudeau 's country.The extremists were vividly found promoting secessionism, inciting violence against its diplomats and threatening I n d i a n s community.Between the two nations ,over a half dozen rounds of talks were organised over the trade pact so far. Among the high priority deals, a trade



agreement with Canada is being sought as with United Kingdom, European Union with a full treaty with Australia and Gulf

Cooperation Council also are being monitored and in pipeline.Earlier, India and Canada were contemplating on early



harvest scheme or a preliminary free trade agreement to push trade with New Delhi. However, no positive signals appeared from

G 20 group.,without assigning any reason. "India has shown a strong resentment against certain political developments in

Canada, and therefore for the time being, till these political issues are settled, we have paused the negotiations," the official said .Canadian PM Justin Trudeau's stance resulted in the Modi government giving him a cold shoulder during his recent visit for the G20 Summit in Delhi, where he was stranded as his 30 year old plane developed problems

and the replacement, aircraft too developed a snag. Mr. Trudeau yesterday told members of parliament that Canadian authorities were investigating whether agents of New Delhi were behind the June killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar in Surrey, a suburb of Vancouver with a large Sikh community.

### Alertness of fire officer salvages six storeyed building from major tragedy

The India block of opposition parties decided to put off the contentious issue of working out the seat-sharing, state elections and the 2024



Lok Sabha polls, and said the matter would be sorted out at the state Level "at the earliest." "We should be discussing those seats that are held by BJP or parties not in our alliance " Such a formula would leave those who didn't do

well in different geographies discontented, said Omar Abdullah, leader of national conference . The block decided to kick start "joint public rallies" across India, "take up caste census and significantly make a list of media programmes and TV anchors who would be boycotted by them. Ms Mamta Banerjee in Mumbai had objected to caste census being put on the alliance agenda, was not represented.

### Canada sheltering Khalistani activists ? Was Hardeep Nijjar a Khalistani ?

Ottawa/New Delhi : Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau described yesterday in parliament what he called credible allegations that India was connected to Nijjar's assassination in British Columbia state in June.

In a similar attack, India has expelled a senior Canadian diplomat, hours after Ottawa expelled a top Indian official as tensions escalate between the two countries over the killing of Sikh separatist leader Hardeep Singh Nijjar earlier this year.

The Indian government dismissed the allegations as "absurd" and asked Canada instead to crack



down on anti-India groups operating in its territory. The row centres around the Sikh independence movement, commonly known as the Khalistan movement. India accuses Canada of sheltering Khalistani activists. Nijjar supported the demand for a Sikh homeland in India's northern state of Punjab, the birthplace of the Sikh religion, which borders Pakistan. He was reportedly

organising an unofficial referendum in India for an independent Sikh nation at the time of this death.

Trudeau on Monday said any involvement of a foreign government in the killing of a Canadian citizen was "an unacceptable violation of our sovereignty".

On Tuesday, India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said allegations of India's involvement in any act of violence in Canada are "absurd and motivated".

It said the "unsubstantiated allegations" sought to shift focus away from "Khalistani terrorists and extremists who have been provided shelter in Canada".

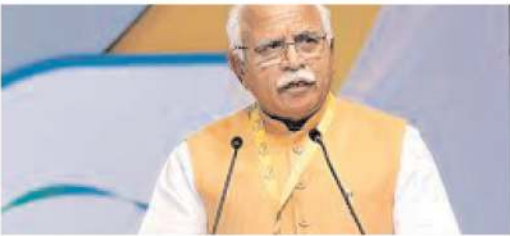
India epitomised digital connectivity

India's presidency has laid down several benchmarks, including ensuring that the G20 views challenges facing the world economy through the prism of the Global South. The ambit of the group has been widened immensely by the inclusion of the African Union, which comprises a sizeable share of the developing world. The proposals in the Delhi Declaration, whether in terms of reducing overall debt, reviving multilateral development banks, pushing for more climate finance or expanding the digital economy, are all aimed at supporting the Global South. This is in the fitness of things as the premier forum for international economic cooperation needs to work towards creating an equitable world order. But the idea of an East-West corridor has captured the imagination of the world. Evidently designed as a competitor to China's much-vaunted Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), it looks more feasible, given the involvement of many countries. The European Union has come on board along with seven others — India, the US, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Germany, France and Italy. It envisages a cross-border ship-to-rail network accompanied by cables for energy and digital connectivity and a hydrogen pipeline. Goods and services will move from India to Europe through an eastern and northern corridor. It will bypass the Suez Canal, which has been plagued by congestion in recent times. A defining element of the declaration is the emphasis on voicing the needs of the Global South. It is in this context that the theme of climate change has been dealt with, highlighting

the urgency of providing funds for energy transition to developing economies. It has pegged the requirements at \$5.8-5.9 trillion up to 2030. But the goal of \$100 billion annually for mitigation is yet to be achieved despite assurances from developed countries that it will be made this year. The need for a greater representation in multilateral development banks been highlighted, as also the urgency of providing more funds to the developing world. The Covid pandemic and Ukraine conflict have impacted low- and middle-income countries significantly and the global banking system needs to be revitalised to meet the challenges of this situation. Reform is the need of the hour for the multilateral financing system and this has been recognised for quite some time. The G20 has formulated concrete recommendations for the way forward based on its experts' report. On the issue of global debt vulnerabilities in low- and middle-income countries, it has underlined the importance of addressing these in an effective and systematic way. The cases of Zambia, Ghana, Ethiopia and Sri Lanka, which are at different stages of resolution, are mentioned specifically with an appeal for swift action. The Delhi Declaration has highlighted one area that is expected to be part of the corridor, that is, digital connectivity. India's success in creating Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) has been one of the highlights of the G20 discussions as other countries seek to emulate these systems. India has offered to build and maintain a Global Digital Public

Infrastructure Repository (GSDPIR), a virtual repository of DPI, to be shared with the rest of the world. A framework for development and governance of DPI will be created as well as a plan to help low- and middle-income countries to develop their digital economies. The corridor is an idea whose time has come. It brings a ray of hope to low- and middle-income countries through which the network will traverse. It will not only bring infrastructure to these areas but also provide access to energy and digital resources through the pipelines accompanying the railway network. In addition, it will make global trade easier for countries that have had to rely on expensive maritime transport. It is also likely to put the failure of the BRI into sharp relief. The scheme has caused many low-income economies to descend into debt traps owing to their inability to pay back enormous loans from China. The India-Middle East-Europe corridor thus needs to be designed with care to ensure that the outcome is regional prosperity rather than rising indebtedness of emerging economies. The US is also looking forward to the project leading to reduced tensions and instability in West Asia, but that can only be a long-term objective. The immediate goal is to implement the scheme as rapidly as possible. Unlike in the case of the BRI, a great deal of coordination will be essential, given the number of players involved in it. This is actually a point in its favour as the project is transcontinental and participation from major countries along its route will make it easier to implement.

It is unfortunate that even the Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL) has not been moved by our plight," bemoaned lamented Jaspal Singh Dappar, a resident of the Ashiana Colony, which is near DAV School in Dera Bassi. Residents of several areas in Dera Bassi are a harassed lot, as they have been reeling under enduring power cuts for the past week. A resident rued that they have been facing a lot of inconvenience due to the power outages, as even inverters stop functioning after a while. It is not just the power supply that has been irregular, but the water

Some residents claimed that the transformer near the local gurdwara had suffered a snag. In some areas, the cables too have developed faults and need repair work, some of the residents complained.

33% quota Bill for women approved by Cabinet

NEW DELHI : The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, okayed the Women's Reservation Bill that provides for 33 per cent quota to women in the Lok Sabha and state Legislative Assemblies, sources said.  
The Cabinet meeting had evinced political interest as Modi had stated that "historic decisions" would be taken in the special session of Parliament from September 18 to 22.  
The government, however, did not make an announcement regarding it as the customary briefing after the Cabinet meeting was not held.  
Earlier in the day, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi met Home Minister Amit Shah and BJP chief JP Nadda, making it clear that something "path-breaking" was



expected.  
The Women's Reservation Bill was first tabled in 2008 and has been on freeze since it was passed by the Rajya Sabha in 2010. It was not presented in the Lok Sabha in these 13 years. A Bill passed by the Rajya Sabha does not lapse under rules of the business of Parliament. The BJP and the Congress have always supported the Bill, but there were hurdles in the form of opposition by other parties and demand for quota for Backward Classes within the women's quota. Ahead of the Parliament session, leaders from the Opposition had pushed for the Women's Reservation Bill. The parties had made a strong push for it at an all-party meeting held on

Sunday.  
Since the announcement of the special session of Parliament, opposition parties, political observers and citizens were wondering whether the government was planning some big decisions. It was being felt that the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) or "one nation, one election" could be on the agenda. The buzz around the use of "Bharat" in the President's dinner invite to G20 delegates had sparked talk about the government planning to bring a resolution to change the name of the country.  
The government has already listed crucial Bills to be discussed during the special session of Parliament. These include the contentious Chief Election Commissioner and other Election Commissioners (Appointment, Conditions of Service and Term of Office) Bill, 2023. The other listed business for the Lok Sabha includes

Fee Hike For U.K. Visa, Students To Be Effective From Oct. 4

LONDON : The changes would mean that the cost for a visit visa for less than six months will rise to GBP 115 and the fee for applying for a student visa from outside the UK will rise to GBP 490 – to equal the amount charged for in-country applications said, the UK Home Office following legislation tabled in Parliament.  
The British government has announced that a proposed hike in visa fees will become effective from Oct. 4, when a visit visa for under six months will cost GBP 15 more and student visas will be GBP 127 more expensive for travellers from around the world, including Indians.  
It comes after British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak had announced in July that the fees and health surcharge paid towards the UK's state-funded National Health Service (NHS) by visa applicants are set to rise "significantly" to meet the country's public sector wage increase.  
"We are going to increase the charges that we have for migrants who are coming to this country when they apply for visas and indeed something called the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS), which is the levy that they pay to access the NHS," he said at the time.  
"All of those fees are going to go up and that will raise over GBP 1 billion, so across the board visa application fees are going to go up significantly and similarly for the IHS," he said.  
The Home Office indicated a



15% increase in the cost of most work and visit visas, and an increase of at least 20% in the cost of priority visas, study visas and certificates of sponsorship.  
"Income from fees charged plays a vital role in the Home Office's ability to run a sustainable immigration and nationality system. Careful consideration is given when setting fees to help reduce the funding contribution from British taxpayers, whilst continuing to provide a service that remains attractive to those wishing to work in the UK and support broader prosperity for all," the Home Office said this week.  
The hike in fees applies across most visa categories, including health and care visa; applications to register and naturalise as a British citizen; fees for up to six months, two, five and 10-year visit visas.  
The hike also applies for the majority of fees for entry clearance and certain applications for leave to remain in the UK, including those for work and study; fees for indefinite leave to enter and indefinite leave to remain; and fees in relation to certificates of sponsorship and confirmation of acceptance for studies. The changes are subject to parliamentary approval and are expected to be in force from Oct. 4, the Home Office said.

GMDA draws infra roadmap for Gurugram 2041

GURUGRAM : The augmentation plan of roads in the metropolitan town has been approved by CM Manohar Lal Khattar. Based on a projection that the city's population is likely to swell to 55 lakh by 2041, the plan put together by the School of Planning and Architecture in New Delhi draws a comprehensive infrastructure augmentation roadmap.  
Gurugram will be transformed into the city of future by 2041, according to the first ever Social Infrastructure Development Plan prepared by the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA).  
This roadmap shall help authority in deciding, approving and executing its projects and planning budgets. "The authority's sole purpose is the transformation of Gurugram into millennium city and achieve the target in next two decades. This can be called the blue print of the vision, which will systematically direct the development of the city," said CEO PC Meena.  
The plan focuses on a roadmap for authorities to follow in five areas education, healthcare, public safety,



recreation and socio-cultural facilities. The plan underlines the need for more schools, daycare centres in residential clusters, multi-purpose campuses of institutes, government healthcare facilities within three kilometres, parks in colonies, police posts and old-age homes.  
In the education sector, the assessment concluded that the five existing universities and another eight nursing and paramedical training institutes would meet the needs of the residents at the district level by 2041.  
But the city would need another 750 nursery schools, 430 more primary schools, and 686 secondary and senior secondary schools over the next two decades. Currently, there are 545 nursery schools, 279 primary schools, and 412 secondary and senior secondary schools in the city.  
On the health front, the city would need two more general hospitals, a civil hospital and

six veterinary hospitals. It currently has two government-run civil hospitals and five veterinary hospitals.  
About 210 speciality hospitals, diagnostic centres would be needed by 2041, 250 dispensaries and clinics, 25 nursing homes and maternity centres too.  
On public safety, the plan noted that there are 25 police posts in sectors, which need at least nine more, especially in Old Gurgaon and the new sectors that are now lined with housing societies.  
For recreation the plan seeks four district parks, 26 community parks and 747 neighbourhood parks in addition to sports complexes and a stadium. On socio-cultural activities, the key takeaway was the need for cultural centres, old-age homes (22), orphanages (16), night shelters (5), hostels for working people (3), and cremation and burial grounds (24) over the next 18 years.

Industrialists meet Haryana CM over ban on diesel generators from Oct 1

PANIPAT : A delegation of Panipat industrialists met CM Manohar Lal Khattar in Chandigarh over the ban orders passed by the Commission of Air Quality Management (CAQM) for the use of diesel generator sets by industries in the NCR from October 1.  
Pritam Singh Sachdeva, president, Panipat Industrialists' Association; Bheem Rana, president, Haryana Environmental Management Society; and Nitin Arora, adviser, Panipat Dyers' Association, are among the representatives. The CM heard their problems and assured them relief.  
The biggest problem was the ban orders passed by the CAQM. The orders mainly affected Haryana's industries as 64 per cent area of the



state was in the NCR region, in which 90 per cent industries were operational. Industrialists were not happy to run diesel sets as these were not viable economically, said Mr Sachdeva.  
"In case of a power breakdown, we need to supply power and fuel to boilers and thermopacks immediately. If not supplied on time, any big mishap may occur," he added.  
Bhim Rana said the second important issue was to supply treated water from the sewage treatment plant (STP) at

Sewah village to dyeing industries in Sector 29, part-2 there.  
The dyeing industries have been demanding treated water for re-use in units.  
A meeting with officials of the Public Health Engineering Department and Irrigation and Water Resource Department, Industries Department, etc., was held under the chairmanship of the CM, who assured that water from the STP would be provided to the industries soon, Rana claimed.

CHANDIGARH : Set up by the Ludhiana Municipal Corporation, the dog park is the third such facility to come up in the country after Hyderabad and Mumbai.  
North India's first exclusive park for dogs that will allow pet parents to take their fur babies for strolls, exercise and training has come up in Punjab's industrial hub of Ludhiana.  
Spread over an acre in Bhairi Randhir Singh Nagar, the park boasts agility equipment, including hurdles and tunnels, to help the canines develop their skills and stay mentally and physically active. It also has obedience training areas, said Ludhiana Municipal Corporation Senior Veterinary Officer Dr Harbans Singh Dhalla.  
There is also a swimming pool, he said.  
Facilities such as a pet cafe, clinic and a grooming centre are also in the offing, civic officials said.



There is also a plan to set up a boarding centre for people who need of a trustworthy place for their pets, they said.  
Dhalla said dog parks are common abroad and this project has been conceptualised on the same lines.  
The idea of setting up the park originated after Dhalla's visit to California.  
"I saw a dog park in the US where people brought their pets. Then the idea came about why not have one in Ludhiana," the senior veterinary officer said.  
The park has been designed to offer a safe and stimulating environment for dogs to socialise, exercise and play freely that will lead to them

becoming happier and healthier, he added.  
Dhalla said people often complain that they are not allowed to take their dogs to regular parks. Now, with this park, they can bring their dogs to a facility meant exclusively for them.  
Councillor HS Brar said dog shows, games and competitions in which people display their pets' skills will also be held at the park.  
There will be a nominal fee to enter the park, which will remain open from 6 am to 11 pm, said the officials.  
A Hyderabad-based contractor will maintain the facilities, they added

## Effluent Treatment Plants for 5 Gaushalas

Chandigarh The MC is in the final stage of allotting construction work of the ETP at the sector 45 gaushala. It has also invited firms for establishment of the ETP at the other three gaushalas in Maloya. Sector 25 and Industrial Area, phase 1. The three new ETPs will come up at a cost of around Rs 3 crore. The plants in Sector 25 and Industrial Area, phase 1 will cost Rs 1 core each and have a capacity of 20 KLD(killi liters per day) each. The ETP in Maloya will cost Rs One core with a capacity of 30 KLD. Raipur kaian gaushala will have a fully operational ETP by the month end. The Chandigarh Municipal Coperation ration has initiated the process of installing ETPs in the

remaining four gaushalas Chandigarh: All the five gaushalas in the city will be equipped with state of the art effluents treatment plants ( ETP) by the year end. Once the ETPs are established, no liquid water wfrom gaushalas will be released into the sewerage system without treatment. There will be a trial run of three month. Thereafter, the contractor will be responsible for operation, running and maintenance for the plant for next two year, "said the official. Construction is likely to be completed in two month of work allotment. Raipur kaian has capacity of 1,000 cattle heads, Maloya 600, Sector 25 has acapacity of 910 cattle heads and Industrial Area Gaushala has a capacity of 1,000 cattle heads.

## Bio Remedial waste would be removed within 6 month

Panchkula : The local Municipal Corporation (MC) finally setup a Bio Remedial Plant for managing solid waste from the dumping ground in sector in Sector- 23. A target of six month has been set from processing all the Solid waste from the Sector -23 dumping ground.

While sharing the information, Panchkula MC Officials informed that the work has been given to a private firm on a contract of Rs 20.40 crore and under the contract, the private firm will dispose of nearly 30 lakh metric tonnes of waste lying in the dumping ground by March 2024. The chief guest inaugurating the Solid waste management plant. Mr Gian Chand Gupta, Assembly Speaker said "It was the long pending demand of the



residents and we were working on it for a long time. Finally, the plant has been installed and it will remove the legacy waste within six month timeframes." Gupta has asked the private firm to maintain the time limit fixed for the processing of the garbage. The MC is planning to build a park at this site after the processing of all the legacy waste from this old dumping ground. The residents of Trans Ghaggar Sectors, from Sector -28,have been demanding the removal of

the dumping ground for a long time and had also staged protests against the new dumping site, which is situated in Jhuriwala village a few meters away from the old dumping ground of Sector-23. Residents alleged that they had invested in the HUDA property for peaceful living but dumping grounds near residential Sector have made their lives hell. Residents have also filed a case with the NGT and in Punjab and Haryana High court against the two dumping ground to get them rid of pollution traumas.

## Sunak Slammed for Weaker Language During G20 Against Russia

London: UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak faced the music back in Britain where he was heavily criticised by MPs in the House of Commons for not securing tougher wording against Russia in the G20 leaders' declaration as well as for the UK being left out of a landmark new economic corridor agreement. Leader of the opposition Sir Keir Starmer called the declaration as "disappointing" "with weaker language that last year's summit". Liberal Democrat MP Richard Ford asked if Sunak shared Canada PM Justin Trudeau's view that if it were up to him the language would have



been stronger.

Sunak was repeatedly asked if he had asked PM Narendra Modi to secure Scottish Sikh Jagtar Singh Johal's release and whether he raised with him the fact that India is buying oil from Russia. "Because this is not the G7 or indeed, the G1, it is not for us just to take the language that we ourselves would like," Sunak said our position on Ukraine is crystal clear for all to see, but tht G20 is a

collection of a large group of a countries that do not all share the same perspective on global affairs indeed, the same value, To assume that it can reflect the unanimity that we have in the G7 is to misunderstand how foreign affairs works." Conservative MP Rehman Chishtri pointed out India was one of 44 non aligned states not supporting sanctions against Russia which is delaying the war in Ukraine". "India takes Russia oil and some now say it refines that oil and sells the products into Europe circumventing those sunctions, Did PM Sunak have those conversation with PM Mod,"he asked.
