Adopted son cannot claim rights over genitive family properties: HC

Bengaluru : Justice CM Joshi has pointed out in the appeal filed by that in M Krishna vs M Ramachandra and in another case, the HC had already held that on adoption, the adoptee gets transplanted into the family that adopts him with the same rights as that of a natural-born son, and such transfer of the adopted child severs all his rights with the family from which he was taken in adoption. "It was categorically held that Bheesamaraja would lose the right of succession in genitive family properties," the judge ordered. Son of Pandurangappa Ellur and Radhabai, Bheesamaraja was given in adoption to Hyderabad-based couple P Vishnu and P Shantabai. The adoption deed was executed on December 22, 1974; at that time, Bheesamaraja was 24 years



old. His biological father died in 2004. In the very same year, subsequently he moved the Raichur court for partition. He argued that the adoption was without his consent and was prohibited under the provisions of Section 10 of the Hindu Adoptions and Maintenance Act, 1956. His mother, sister and brother resisted his claim, saying he was a consenting party to the adoption, and the suit was dismissed on December 10, 2007. On January 22, 2010, Bheesamaraja's appeal, too, was dismissed. Challenging both orders, he moved the HC, reiterating he is a coparcener in his genitive family and, therefore, had an existing right in family properties. On the other hand, his mother brother and sisters, and the children of his deceased brother, Ashokra, argued that in the Arya Vysya community to which they belong, adoption of a person aged more than 15 is allowed. An adopted son cannot continue to exercise rights as a coparcener in his genitive family the Kalaburagi bench of the Karnataka high court has observed in a recent judgment.

Buy onions at Rs 25 as buffer stock overwhelms

New Delhi: The Centre has magnified the buffer stock onions from three lakh metric tonnes (LMT) to five LMT on Sunday. The National Cooperative Consumers' Federation of India Limited (NCCF) will sell onions at retail price of Rs 25 per kilogram from Monday. The Centre, on Saturday, imposed a 40% duty on the export of onions. "The measures taken by the Government such as procurement for the buffer, targeted release of stocks and imposition of export duty will benefit farmers and consumers by assuring remunerative prices to onion farmers while ensuring continuous availability to consumers at affordable prices," the Union Consumer Affairs



Department said in a release. The Department termed the move to enhance the stocks as unprecedented and said it has directed NCCF and National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India Ltd.(NAFED) to procure one lakh tonne each to achieve the additional procurement target alongside calibrated disposal of the procured stocks in major consumption centres. Disposal of onions from the buffer has commenced, targeting major markets in States and union territories where retail prices are above the all-India average and/or are significantly higher than the previous month. As on date, about 1,400 MT of onions from the buffer have been dispatched to the targeted markets and are being continuously released to augment the availability," the Centre added.

MC to air-condition all community centres in PKI

Panchkula: The MC claims to have developed all community centres on the pattern of banquet halls. Now municipal corporation will make all community centres air-conditioned by the end of this month. Work on installation of the air-conditioners has started. MC commissioner has set a deadline of August 31 for the work. Officials concerned told the MC commissioner that work on installation of air conditioners had started in 10 community centres of the city and the remaining centres would also get air condition banquet halls soon. The civic body is developing and reconstructing all old community centres and has also made new community centres and has also made new community



centres at various places to provide residents space and facility to organise marriages, birthday parties, bhog, jagrans and badminton. Mayor Kulbushan Goyal said that Panchkula residents had to go Zirakpur and other places to organise marriages and other functions due to lack of banquet- halls in the city. "Now, local residents will not have to book costly banquet/ marriage halls as all the latest facilities will be provided in the new community centres at nominal booking price," he said.

EDITORIAL -

Are we building poor roads, environment policies

The critical place of public engineering itself, in the past 70 years, the standards of Indian public works have remained abysmally low and out of sync with changing requirements. Many stone tunnels, retaining walls and river bridges in hill states built by British army engineers and the public works departments are now almost a century old, and need serious evaluation for upkeep and possible replacement. So, outmoded are government designs, they are unable to cope with century-old safety standards. Just this June a new concrete bridge in Bihar's Kishanganj district collapsed, barely three weeks after another in Khagaria district had crashed into the Ganga. Was it faulty design or poor quality materials and execution? Over the last three years, 10 bridges have collapsed in Bihar; of these, the Rs 1,700-crore, 3.2km-long Aguwani-Sultanganj bridge collapsed twice during construction. In the monsoon, we accept tragedy as part and parcel of our rain-soaked lives. Buildings are expected to collapse in suburban Mumbai; Delhi and Chennai are always flooded; landslides block mountain roads, bridges collapse and riverside villages are washed away. While local city and state governments are quick to brush aside these problems as fallout of excessive rain, the real flaw lies in three clear causes: First and foremost, the unfortunate absence of a restrictive environmental policy that prohibits or limits large-scale construction in ecologically sensitive areas. Without careful environmental planning, many bridge constructions, mountain highway expansion programmes, tunnel borings and dams, become a form of environmental desecration contributing to erosion and landslides. It is no secret that invasive and heavy infrastructure in the wrong places has a long-term impact on natural systems. The way rivers behave, the treatment of flood plains and catchment

areas, how forests affect wind patterns and soil behaviour, are all a matter of careful science, that help decide what should be built, how, and if at all. More than ever now, there is need to define a new model for infrastructure development that is environmentally inclusive of Indian local ecologies. Over-building. India is today one of the most grossly overbuilt places on earth. Travel anywhere, north or south, the country appears like a permanent construction site; new roads and high ways are being built along with roadside hotels, makeshift institutes, schools and showrooms. Informal housing appears along the floodplains in UP, reckless commercial development in coastal Goa. Excessive and unchecked tourism in the mountain states further litters the landscape with empty summer houses, temporary shops, restaurants and parking lots. The view across cities such as Shimla, Mussoorie, Darjeeling and Gangtok makes it clear that restrictions on construction be seriously considered, along with an adoption of different, less invasive construction technologies. Sadly, the government's current plan is to amend the 1980 Forest Conservation Act and release more reserve forests for development. In the daily dose of human tragedy, we in India stand head and shoulders above most other countries. In new papers, on television, across the internet, tragic incidents oscillate between the comic and the bizarre, between callous and outlandish: boys swimming in flooded street sucked into drain, workers asleep on railway track run over by train, man peeing on wire electrocuted, family killed in monsoon building collapse, bridge crashes into river during inauguration. Leaving aside those dead in rail accidents and religious clashes, these are human tragedies linked to daily official incompetence and apathy. We invite these shameful headlines for two reasons. We are now the world's largest

population; and that 1.4 billion number is not scattered over a Norway-like sparseness, but is concentrated in some of the most crowded and ineptly governed urban centres and states. Outside of Dhaka and Tokyo, Indian cities have some of the highest human densities. Mumbai has 73,000 people per square mile, Kolkata has 33,000. And Dharavai is at one million. So, when floods and landslides occur, accident and tragedy are built into the terrifying numbers. The Bihar bridge scenario is so extreme it is hard to know whether to laugh or cry. But without the embrace of new technology and ideas, and round-the-clock environmental vigilance, India's cities and countryside will be more prone to floods, heatwaves, and more severe forms of climate dislocation. While there are now certainly better early warning systems and topographic mapping technologies for safe and quick movement of city populations, effective urban governance will require not just evacuation and relief measures during disasters but developing imaginative plans for long-term environmental security. After recent disasters, what is the possible course of action? Will bund walls and mangrove plantations appear as protective barriers against floods? Will road construction bans be put in place in hill areas where landslides have occurred? Will more stable bridge designs be promoted where collapses have happened? As flood waters recede in Delhi, and the tflow of mountain rivers returns to normal, city and state governments need to take decisive actions for future safeguards and controls. The protection of large unwieldy populations in unregulated cities with grossly over-tretched facilities, along with poor rural populations scattered across denuded and scarred hillsides, will require more than mere clean up, hope and prayer.

CTU eyes more revenue by boosting online bookings

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : In order to enhance potential reach to the maximum online platforms to enable people easily book bus tickets from anywhere, said UT Transport Director Pradhuman Singh. The Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU) is going to increase its reach for ticket booking by associating with various online platforms. By doing this, the revenue of the department will also increase as the buses will get more passengers due to increased online access. "This will provide more convenience to passengers and also increase the CTU ridership," he said. The official said they had already signed an agreement with Red Bus India Pvt Ltd and now they wanted to associate with other websites for online reservation of tickets. He said they had sought applications from such agencies, asking them to apply within 30 days.



At present, around 580 buses of CTU are running from different depots. These include 178 buses from depot number 1, 170 from depot number 2, 138 from depot number 3 and around 100 from depot number 4. With 80 electric buses, all buses from depot number 3 are running on local and suburban routes. Similarly, long route buses are running from depot number 1. The CTU buses ply to Khatu Shyam, Salasar, Haldwani, Amritsar, Shimla, Manali, Delhi, Rewari, Narnaul, Rohtak, Hisar, Dehradun, Mansa, Katra, Agra, Jaipur and other cities. The department has around 119 HVAC buses, including 20 those procured recently.

For picking returning officer, syndicate to meet on August 26

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The House of Panjab University syndicate is likely to discuss and approve the appointment of the university's registrar for the election of ordinary fellows.



The syndicate will meet on August 26 to discuss issues such as approval for appointing a returning officer for the election of ordinary fellows (due next month), a hike in the Youth Welfare budget and fees to be charged from candidates applying for teaching posts to be advertised by the university. The House will discuss the recommendations of the committee to hike the budget head of the Youth Welfare Fund for the financial year 2023-24. The committee has recommended an increase in the current budget for participation in inter-university, state/north zone and national events to Rs

80,000 from existing Rs 40,000. Similarly, an increase in the travel allowance from Rs 10,000 to Rs 15,000 will be discussed. The entitlement for community mess during the youth camp tours has also been increased to Rs 250 from Rs 200 (per student). The House is expected to give its nod to the recommendation of the Joint Academic and Administrative Committee (JAAC) for appointing former Vice-Chancellor Prof Arun Kumar Grover as an honorary professor in the Department of Physics. Besides, the syndicate will discuss the recommendation of a committee, which approved a hike in the fee for candidates applying for teaching posts to be advertised by the university. The committee recommended charging a fee of Rs 2,000 (an existing Rs 375) from members of the general category, Rs 1,000 (an existing Rs 150) from those belonging to the SC/SCT category, and Rs 1,000 (an existing Rs 185) from those falling in the Persons with Disabilities (PwD) category. The House will also consider the recommendation of the committee to reserve one seat for a transgender student in the MSc Stem Cell and the Tissue Engineering Department.

370 posts to be filled by September : PGI

Experiencing the staff crunch, the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER) here will fill 370 vacant posts of nursing, technician, clerk and sanitary attendant. Kumar Gaurav Dhawan, Deputy Director, PGIMER, said, "The institute will be able to fill 370 posts by September-end. It will relieve the burden on the existing staff, who are already stretched to their limits due to the staff crunch. With more staff, the institute can provide better quality patient care and reduce wait time. With the number of patients increasing daily, the institute needs more staff to ensure that

patients receive timely and adequate medical attention." The institute has around 7,300 sanctioned posts, including those of teaching and non-teaching doctor, nurse, paramedic, lab technician and security. However, the institute is unable to fill the vacancies due to various reasons, including court cases, which have resulted in a backlog of over 1,700 vacancies. The hospital provides treatment to an average of 9,000 patients daily, including 8,000 in the Out-Patient Department (OPD) and 300 in the Emergency wing. As many as 155 out of 2,572 nursing positions remain unfilled at the PGI. The situation is no better for teaching staff with 36 posts of professor and 91 of assistant professor remaining vacant against the sanctioned strength of 70 and 652, respectively.

Rs 2,500-crore GMDA budget for infra works, announces Manohar Lal Khattar

GURUGAON : The budget for 2023-24 allocates Rs 570.06 crore for infrastructure development, including roads, water supply, sewerage, and stormwater management, Rs 1,151.77 crore for capital projects, with a notable allocation of Rs 300 crore for Sheela Mata Medical College said Haryana CM Manohar Lal Khattar. In a major development boost to Gurugram, Mr Khattar approved a budget of Rs 2,574.40 crore for the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA). Additionally, Rs 36 crore has been earmarked for urban environment initiatives and a provision of Rs 538 crore has been made for operation and maintenance. For the annual budget, the authority will have a revenue of Rs 2,043.17 crore from various heads while the remaining Rs 531.23 crore



will come from the existing corpus fund. The CM also approved a proposal of a new master water supply line spanning 20.5 kilometres. To be built at a cost of Rs 125 crore, this line will address water supply demands for various city areas and new sectors. The 200 MLD capacity line, originating from Basai Water Treatment Plant Part II, will serve several sectors, including 101, 104, 108, 110, 110A, New Palam Vihar, Palam Vihar, Sector 23, and Cyber Hub, facilitating water supply for both old and new parts of the city. In the meeting, the Chief Minister approved the transfer of land for the proposed new sewerage

treatment plants (STPs) in Sector 107 near Daulatabad and Sector 78 near Naurangpur. For the Sector 107 STP, 49.93 acres of land will be transferred to the Gurugram Municipal Corporation and 3.75 acres of land from Municipal Corporation, Manesar, to the GMDA for a 40 MLD STP in Sector 78. Similarly, to upgrade the road connecting Southern Peripheral Road (SPR) from Faridabad Road to NH-48, and approval of Rs 109.14 crore was given for the underpass being constructed at Vatika Chowk. The underpass is being constructed by National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and the GMDA on a 50:50 share basis.

Luna-25 spacecraft smashes into moon, Russia's lunar mission fails

MOSCOW : Russia's state space corporation, Roskosmos, said it had lost contact with the craft shortly after a problem occurred as the craft was shunted into pre-landing orbit on Saturday. Russia's first moon mission in 47 years failed after its Luna-25 spacecraft spun out of control and smashed into moon. "The apparatus moved into an unpredictable orbit and ceased to exist as a result of a collision with the surface of the Moon," Roskosmos said in a statement. Failure of the prestige mission underscores the decline of Russia's space power since the glory days of Cold War competition when Moscow was the first to launch a satellite to orbit the Earth - Sputnik 1, in 1957 - and Soviet cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin became the



first man to travel into space in 1961. Russia has not attempted a moon mission since Luna-24 in 1976, when Leonid Brezhnev ruled the Kremlin. Luna-25 was supposed to execute a soft landing on the south pole of the moon on Aug. 21, according to Russian space officials. Russia has been racing against India, whose Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft is scheduled to land on the moon's south pole this week, and more broadly against China and the United States which both have advanced lunar ambitions.

150 MBBS seats authorised for intake new medical rules notified

NEW DELHI : The new rules by National Medical Commission will be applicable for colleges being established from the 2024-25 academic session. Currently, a new UG medical college is allowed to induct 100 to 150 MBBS students and increase the count to a maximum 250. The National Medical Commission has notified new regulations for the establishment of undergraduate medical colleges in the country, capping the maximum intake of MBBS students at 150 instead of the current 250 seats. "Applications for establishing new undergraduate medical education colleges shall be allowed only for 50/100/150 seats from 2024. Colleges seeking an increased number of seats cannot exceed a total of 150 MBBS students from 2024-25," state the NMC's 2023 regulations, superseding the 2020 rules. Easing the establishment norms, the NMC has allowed



medical colleges (which must have teaching hospitals and hostels for students and interns) to come up in two campuses, connected by a walking distance of not more than half an hour, instead of the currently mandated unitary campus. "Medical colleges shall follow the ratio of 100 MBBS seats for 10 lakh population in a given state or UT," the NMC said to prevent the skewed growth of colleges. Past bulk approvals to medical colleges in some states caused institutions to mushroom in southern and western India, leaving the northern states underfed. Among the 21 departments compulsory for a new medical college will be a new department of integrative

medical research to combine contemporary and traditional medicine such as AYUSH systems. A Yoga department has been recommended, though not mandated. The department of radio oncology continues to be optional. The departments of emergency medicine and respiratory medicine, compulsory under 2020 regulations, do not feature in the list of 21 departments mandated under the 2023 rules. The new regulations have come into force immediately upon notification and require doctors and staff to have minimum 75 per cent attendance through all working days excluding vacations. "Daily Aadhaar-Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS) of faculty and supporting staff, preferably along with face-linked recognition, shall be made available to the NMC as well as on the medical college website in the form of daily attendance dashboard..." the rules say.

Haryana ups Ayushman income limit from Rs 1.80 lakh to Rs 3 lakh

YAMUNANAGAR : The Ayushman Bharat Yojana provides a health cover of Rs 5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalisation. In a major gift to the people of the state, Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar has announced to increase the income limit under Ayushman Bharat Yojana from Rs 1.80 lakh to Rs 3 lakh per annum. With this announcement, eight lakh new families are expected to be included in the scheme. "We are going to give a big gift to the people of the state on the occasion of Independence Day. Now, families with an annual income ranging from Rs 1.8 lakh to Rs 3 lakh will also be entitled to get the benefit of the Ayushman Bharat Yojana," said Khattar. The Chief Minister made this announcement during the Jan Samvad programme at Bakana village in Yamunanagar district. Jan Samvad programmes were also held at Damla and



Alahar villages in the district. Kurukshetra MP Nayab Saini and former minister Karan Dev Kamboj were also present on the occasion. Speaking at Bakana village, the Chief Minister said for making Ayushman cards, the portal would be opened for a month. He said families whose annual income was less than Rs 1.80 lakh would not have to pay any premium, but families whose annual income was more than Rs 1.80 lakh and less than Rs 3 lakh would have to pay an annual premium of Rs 1,500 only. "At present, 30 lakh families in the state are getting benefits under the scheme. After this announcement, an additional eight lakh new families shall be included;

thus, a total of 38 lakh families shall be able to take advantage of this scheme," said Khattar. He said from now on, block development and panchayat officers (BDPOs) would have to keep the record of panchayats in the state. Earlier, the record of panchayats used to be maintained by the gram sachiv only. On this occasion, names of several persons were included in the Old Age Samman Allowance Scheme. The Chief Minister also distributed tricycles and hearing aids among Divyangjans. He also announced that roads would be constructed in the Radaur Assembly constituency at a cost of Rs 25 crore. He said complaints received in the Jan Samvad programme were uploaded on the Jan Samvad portal. He said 16,000 complaints had so far been received on the portal, of which 3,000 had been resolved while the remaining would also be redressed soon.

171 dengue, 106 chikungunya cases claimed by Health Dept

AMRITSAR : "A patient is declared to have contracted dengue only if he or she tests positive on Mac Elisa test. Similarly, there is a specific test for declaring a patient positive for chikungunya," disclosed a doctor on anonymity. While a large number of the city residents have symptoms of mosquito-borne diseases, the district Health Department has till date reported only 171 dengue and 106 chikungunya cases. As per figures released by the Health Department on Saturday, 12 dengue cases and eight chikungunya cases were detected in the last 24 hours. At present, the district has a total of 52 active dengue and 33 chikungunya cases. It is suspected the figures released by the department are miniscule in comparison to the actual numbers. A



senior health official said, The official said of nearly 50 patients with symptoms similar to those of chikungunya, only two or three were declared positive after being tested specifically for the disease. The health experts stated that a large number of patients with symptoms of viral fever were reporting at hospitals. Even as the Health Department had instructed private hospitals and clinics to inform officials regarding arrival of suspected dengue and chikungunya patients so that confirmatory tests could be conducted, most physicians and even patients preferred tests which were readily

Rs 200 crore to rain battered Himachal Pradesh by Centre

NEW DELHI : Besides release of Rs 189.27 crore of the state's past dues from the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) on August 7. The Centre on Sunday approved another release of Rs 200 crore from the National Disaster Response Fund as advance assistance to Himachal Pradesh to help the rain-battered state undertake relief measures for affected people. A spokesperson of the Union Home Ministry said the Centre had earlier approved the advance release of Rs 360.80 crore from the central share of the State Disaster Response Fund in two instalments on July 10 and 17. The home ministry has approved the release of Rs 200 crore, as an advance from the National Disaster Response Fund to the government of Himachal Pradesh to help them undertake relief measures for affected people during the ongoing monsoon season, a spokesperson said. The central government is



monitoring the situation in Himachal Pradesh round the clock and providing necessary logistics and financial help to the state government to deal with the situation efficiently. Twenty teams of the National Disaster Response Force, nine columns of the Indian Army and three helicopters of the Indian Air Force were deployed in Himachal Pradesh for rescue and relief. The central government, without waiting for a memorandum from the state government, had also deputed inter-ministerial central teams, to make an on-the-spot assessment of the situation and relief works

being carried out by the state government, the spokesperson said. The central teams visited the affected areas in the state from July 19 to 21. According to the home ministry data, at least 330 people lost their lives due to rains, floods, landslides and lightning in Himachal Pradesh since the monsoon's onset in the state. All 12 districts of Himachal Pradesh were hit by the rains, floods, landslides and cloudbursts this monsoon. The state was also hit by 25 landslides and one cloudburst in the last week, the data said.

Zelensky assured by Denmark Netherlands supply of F16

Copenhagen :The promise of new fighter jets came the day after an unusually brazen Russian missile struck on a Ukrainian theatre. Now Netherland Denmark will give F-16 warplanes to Ukraine, a long-awaited announcement that Ukrainian President Volo dymyr Zelensky called an important motivation for his country's forces, embroiled in a difficult counter offensive against Russia. The strike killed seven people and wounded almost 150 others in the northern city of Chernihiv. Mr Zelensky vowed stern retaliation for the attack, whose victims



included a slain 6-year-old girl dead and 15 wounded children. After months of entreaties from Zelensky for F-16s to bolster the Ukrainian air force, the US recently gave approval for the Netherlands and Denmark to provide Ukraine the American-made jets. Zelensky travelled to both countries on Sunday to finalise the delivery deals. "F-16s will certainly give new energy, confidence, and motivation to fighters and civilians. I'm sure it will deliver new results." he said. It's not clear yet how soon the jets will be in Ukrainian hands or in Ukrainian skies. It depends on how soon Ukrainian crews and infrastructure are ready, Dutch PM Mark Rutte said after he and Zelensky inspected two gray F-16 jets parked in a hang ar at a Dutch base.

Donald Trump threatens India with reciprocal tax if re-elected in 2024

Washington :Donald Trump, former U.S. presidenwho has been seeking a second term, has once again raised the issue of high tax by India on certain American products in particular the iconic Harley-Davidson motorcycles, and has threatened to slap with reciprocal tax if voted to power in the 2024 presidential elections. During his first term as the U.S. president, Mr. Trump described India as a "tariff king" and in May 2019, terminated

India's preferential market access — Generalised System of Preferences (GSP) — to the United States alleging India has not given the United States "equitable and reasonable access to its markets. Mr. Trump said came down heavily on India's tax rates, which he claimed was quite high. "The other thing I want to have is a matching tax where, if India charges us — India is very big with tariffs.

Supreme Court Raps Gujrat High Court on Termination of Pregnancy Case

New Delhi : Seeking permission to terminate her pregnancy , Supreme Court on Monday said any court passing an order against a superior court's ruling is against constitutional philosophy. The Supreme Court's strong remarks came after the high court passed an order on Saturday, even after the Supreme Court listed the matter for today. The high court had refused relief to the petitioner, but the Supreme Court has allowed the termination of her pregnancy. "What is happening in Gujrat High Court? No court in India can pass an order against a superior court order. It is against constitutional philosophy," the Supreme Court bench of



Justice B V Nagarathna and Justice Ujjal Bhuyan said after it was informed of an order by the high court on Saturday. Tushar Mehta solicitor General was representing the Gujrat government, said the Saturday's order was passed only to fix a "clerical error". "There was a clerical error in the previous order and that was fixed on Saturday. It was a misunderstanding," he said, adding, "We as the state government will request the judge to recall the order." This comes after the Supreme Court on Saturday flagged the delay by the high court in deciding the rape survivor's petition, saying "valuable time" has been lost. The bench of Justice Nagarathna and Justice Bhuyan then said they would hear the matter .

,there was no phynl/ litter available and also Mr Goel could not show, as per the pollution norms a proper ditch for the burial of the dead birds. In the absence of ditch, there could spread Avian influenza, followed by Fowl pox, and infectious bronchitis in the horizons of the poultry, as per the directives lodged in pollution norms.

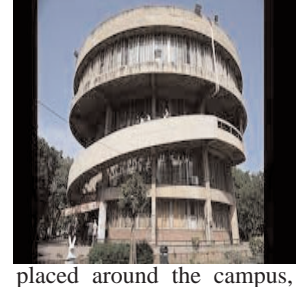
research endeavors aim to contribute to the growth of knowledge, new technolo-
