"Oasis Ethanol Industries" operates sans functional Effluent Treatment Plant

A chain of diseases like Cholera, Typhoid, Hepatitis A, Bacterial infection, Dehydration, Dysentery, Gastroenteritis stem from the aquatic vicinity of the Oasis Ethanol Industries

Jatwar (Ambala) : The untreated contaminated polluted water has often attacked the growth of plants, growing animal and the ecology by transmitting chain of several types of commonly experienced diseases. The clandestine discharge of hazardous waste, effluents, contaminated polluted water, micro organism have been noticed being channelised into the closeby passing Tangri River. The toxin polluted water triggers destruction of habitats, causes biodiversity loss through persistent contamination by disrupting the food chain. Further bio-accumulation of toxin

catalyses to health issues like water borne diseases. The contamination stems from untreated industrial chemicals, effluents, toxin water, agriculture run off and improper waste liquid disposal. The untreated water pollutants can viciously transform an aquatic environment into an inhospitable arena of human life. The chemical contaminants and excessive nutrients can destroy habitats leading to aquatic plants and growing animals. The reproductive system can directly be affected by habitat loss and toxin substance, if the aquatic life is not nourished with naturally clean, uncontaminated and properly



treated water. The potential extinction of sensitive species here may be pointed out, as the phenomenon does destroy successive composition of the eco system in the arena of Tangri tangency. The contaminated fish may generate vulnerable environs where disease may overtake the life span of wild life and sprawling environment under which all living bodies are surviving. Water pollutants do seep into the soil and can negatively affect plant growth, agricultural productivity, and hence can adversely affect the nutritional food supply.

On a visit to the nearby village Jatwar and neighbouring villages Gobindpur, Tasrauli, Khera Jattan, Sadanpur Mukkandpur, Chajumajra, CNS explored from Ram Avtar, Swaroop Singh, Ram Kumar Tyagi, Ashwani Verma bonafide residents about the flow of contaminated, polluted water into "Tangri River" by the "Oasis Ethanol Industries, and learnt the virtual taste of fish has developed all repulsive and unpalatable tastes which never existed in the past history.

The pot water is nowhere available as the water level for pure drinking water has gone far down beyond 1000 feet in the vicinity of Oasis Ethanol. The persistent onslaught on purity of natural water of Tangri is not being checked by the accountable pollution control sleuths. All protection and ecology gradation be safe guarded by the Central as well Haryana Pollution Control Department nevertheless it becomes clear here that no official is worried to see the functionality of the treatment plant of the ethanol industry and the safe drinking water is available all times for the local

inhabitants of the Jatwar as well neighbouring villages, flags the latest survey of the CNS. With regard to the incalculable harm being perpetrated to the ecology and environment by the unscrupulous management of the Oasis Ethanol Industries, the Regional Environmental Engineer Sukh Ram said he long ago had visited the ethanol factory and now would inspect, if the untreated water was being channelised into Tangri river yet the gross negligence was tantamount to the abuse of pollution control authorities, if the news contents are seriously taken into account.

Ups & downs remain inevitable in life -- RJD on Bihar poll defeat

Patna : The Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) on Saturday said that the "ups and downs" are "inevitable" in the "endless journey of public service", a day after it faced one of its worst setbacks in the Bihar assembly elections. In a post on X, "it is the 'party of the poor' and will continue to raise their voices," said RJD. "Public service is an unceasing process, an endless journey. Ups and downs are inevitable in it. No sorrow in defeat, no arrogance in victory," it wrote in Hindi. The Tejashwi Yadav-led party won just 25 seats in the 243-member assembly, its second-worst performance in a Bihar election after 2010, when it had



managed 35 seats, with the Congress getting six seats, down from 19, the CPI(ML) two seats, the CPI(M) one, and the CPI zero. The ruling NDA overcame anti-incumbency and won 202 seats, with the BJP securing 89, the JD(U) 85, Union Minister Chirag Paswan's Lok Janshakti Party (Ran Vilas) 19, Union Minister Jitan Ram Manjhi's Hindustani Awam Morcha five, and Rajya Sabha MP Upendra Kushwaha's Rashtriya Lok Morcha four. While Hyderabad MP Asaduddin Owaisi's AIMIM won five assembly seats, the former poll strategist Prashant Kishor-led Jan Suraj Party and Mukesh Sahani's Vikashheel Insaan Party (VIP) couldn't open their accounts.

Tejashwi Yadav elected to lead Bihar Opposition

Patna : Having faced a crushing defeat to the Mahagathbandhan and RJD in the Bihar Assembly elections, Tejashwi Yadav has been elected as the Leader of Opposition in the state Legislative Assembly. He will reportedly meet the newly-elected MLAs of his party to discuss the future course of action for his party. Tejashwi Yadav would "discuss the poor performance of the INDIA bloc in the 2025 Bihar polls" and decide on the "future course of action for the party". The development comes amid the ongoing family feud surrounding Tejashwi Yadav, after his sister Rohini Acharya's big allegations. The INDIA bloc suffered a major setback in the Bihar elections on November 14, with the NDA securing a decisive victory.



The RJD, which won only 25 of 143 seats, is simultaneously dealing with internal turmoil following Rohini Acharya's exit from the party and her decision to step away from politics. Acharya has alleged mistreatment within the family and expressed deep personal anguish in multiple posts on X, describing herself as abandoned and criticising the behaviour of those around her. The controversy has drawn sharp reactions from NDA leaders, who have criticized Tejashwi Yadav for what they describe as a failure to safeguard the dignity of women within his own family, and questioned his moral authority to promise better governance for Bihar.

Former PM Sheikh Hasina sentenced to death, Bangladesh govt says 'historic'

Dhaka : The International Crimes Tribunal in Bangladesh has found ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, former home minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal, and former Inspector General of Police Chowdhury Abdullah Al-Mamun guilty of committing crimes against humanity during the student protest of 2024 that ousted the Hasina regime.



This verdict, which was read on Monday, comes amid high security in Dhaka based on an order by the interim government led by Muhammad Yunus, has increased security across Dhaka and neighbouring regions as tensions brew. Sheikh Hasina and the top two aides were tried on a total of five charges. These include murders, attempted murders, torture and use of lethal force on unarmed student protesters; issuance of orders to deploy lethal weapons, helicopters and drones; and spe-

cific killings in Rangpur and Dhaka.

The five charges listed in court are -

- a) Orchestrating mass killings of protesters in Dhaka.
- b) the use of helicopters and drones to fire on civilian crowds
- c) the murder of student activist Abu Sayed.
- d) the incineration of bodies in Ashulia to destroy evidence.
- e) the coordinated killing of demonstrators in Chankharpur.

The ousted leader has denied all charges against her. However, the tribunal on Monday, sentenced her to death.

EDITORIAL -

Bihar preferred stability to regime change

The Bihar assembly elections have thrown up a massive victory for NDA. BJP has emerged with marginally higher seats than JDU and inched closer to fulfilling its long-stalled ambition of having its own chief minister. But the stellar surprise is the remarkable performance of Nitish.

Despite two decades of anti-incumbency working against him, and his switching sides so many times, voters have again expressed support for him.

Other NDA partners have also done exceptionally well. But without doubt, the key factor for the alliance's resounding success is the enduring mojo of Nitish.

From 2010 to 2015 he was the senior partner within NDA. This gave Nitish the freedom to run govt in an unfettered manner, since his will could hardly be challenged. Then 2012-13 saw the rise of Modi, who became BJP's choice to lead the party, replacing stalwarts like Advani. Nitish was comfortable with the older BJP leaders, and particularly close to Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

But in the 2014 parliamentary elections, when Nitish and JDU fought alone, the party was wiped out, securing only two of 40 seats. It was Nitish's most ignominious defeat. He resigned, accepting moral responsibility for the debacle, and made an

unsuspecting Jitan Ram Manjhi the CM. In the 2015 assembly elections he, however, bounced back again, this time in alliance with old-time foe and pre-BJP ally, Lalu Yadav. Mahagathbandhan won a resounding victory, and Nitish, even with a seat tally lower than Lalu's, was back as CM.

This alliance lasted only till 2017. After that, Nitish's credibility suffered serious damage due to his frequent flip-flops, joining BJP first, then RJD again, and returning again to BJP. However, in this month's elections, despite anti-incumbency, credibility erosion and rumours of poor health, three factors appear to have strongly been in his favour: empathy, sympathy and gratitude.

Empathy for what he had done for Bihar after Lalu's misrule, and for his many women-centric schemes. Sympathy for what was done to him and his party in the 2020 elections, when BJP-his ally used Chirag Paswan as a trojan horse to target JDU candidates, thereby enabling BJP to emerge as the decisive bigbrother. Gratitude because although his governance record in the last few years has been patchy, the very fact that this could perhaps be his last election after 50 years in public life, was reason enough to prompt a final pledge of support. To that one can add the Rs 10,000 distributed by him

(and NDA) to 1.5cr women by direct benefit transfer literally an hour before the Model Code of Conduct was clamped.

Will he now be sworn in as CM for a record tenth time? I think he will at least for the immediate future. Will he remain as CM for longer? That is dependent on the pleasure of BJP which, even without Nitish, can cobble up a majority with its smaller alliance partners, and a few JDU MLAs could always be lured to create a more comfortable majority, with the supporting MPs in Lok Sabha suitably persuaded to do like wise. None of this may happen, but it could if Nitish asserts himself. For BJP, with an appreciable larger mandate this time, will be itching to finally have its own CM.

BJP should be forewarned. Never take Nitish for granted. Nitish's great USP is his resilience. His indispensable asset is that he is the perennial bridge between parties with completely opposed ideologies and his strength is that no one really knows what he is going to do next.

For the moment, this Bihar election's X factor is the survivability of Nitish, a factor that may have even taken BJP by surprise. Somehow, it appears that 1 Anne Marg in Patna, the official residence of Bihar CM, is his natural habitat.

Saurabh Kumar, Chief Conservator of Forests-cum-Chief Wildlife Warden, UT, said for the first time, the Sukhna Choe reserve forest, Patiala Ki Rao reserve forest and the Lake reserve forest would be included in the census, which would be completed in four to five days.

A two-day training of the staff would begin on November 18, at the behest of Dehradun-based Wildlife Institute of India (WII). A wide range of environmentalists, representatives of NGOs and biology and zoology students from Panjab University have been approached to carry out the survey.

A workshop aimed to enhancing awareness and ensuring effective coordination among all stakeholders involved in the census activity would be held on November 19. The Dehradun-based Wildlife Institute of India (WII) was providing all technical support to the department. The first wildlife census was



carried out in the Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary, spread over an area of 26 sq km in the catchment area of Sukhna Lake, in 2010. The second census could not be carried out in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent imposition of lockdown in the country. However, the second wildlife survey of the sanctuary was carried out in May 2021. As per the report of the WII, Sambar was the most abundant ungulate species in the sanctuary with the highest density similar to the Rajaji Tiger Reserve.

The main animals spotted at the sanctuary include sambar, chital, pangolin (anteater), wild boar, jackal, small Indian civet, jungle cat, porcupine, langur, rhesus monkey, Indian hare, common mongoose and three-striped palm squirrel.

Leopard pugmarks were spotted at the Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary while carrying out the second wildlife census.

For green city, Centre approves 328 electric buses

Under the Phase II of the FAME India scheme, a fleet of 80 electric buses is already operating in the city on tricity routes.

Civic body to formalise new MC limits by December end

MOHALI : Residents of TDI City, Balongi, Badhajra, Ballyali, Green Enclave have resented the decision to exclude the villages from the new civic body limits and have even threatened to approach the court if their villages are not included in the new limits.

The expansion of the Municipal Corporation (MC) limits is set to be formalised before December 31, Local Bodies Department sources have disclosed.

After the deadline for suggestions and objections regarding the draft notification finished on November 6, the department has intensified the process to formalise the new MC limits as the government is keen to complete the process after much delay. Mohali MLA Kulwant Singh said, "The government has taken the decision after much deliberation keeping in mind the pros and cons of the move. However, after the residents expressed their desire to include their villages in the notification, government is considering their demand sympathetically and the decision will be taken in the benefit of all concerned."

Mayor Amarjit Singh Sidhu, meanwhile, "The House had resolved to include these villages in the new limits in 2021. But now the government



has taken a decision arbitrarily. We will support the residents of these villages and will knock on the doors of the court if AAP government does not reconsider its decision."

Significantly, the government will have to complete the entire process before December 31 as the Registrar General of India and Census Commissioner Mrityunjay Kumar Narayan in a letter to Chief Secretaries of states and UTs has stated that the administrative boundaries will be frozen on December 31, disallowing the states and Union Territories to change the boundaries of its municipalities, panchayats, police stations, sub-districts and districts from January 1 2025 to March 31, 2027.

The first phase of the Census 2026 will begin from April 1. The house-listing operation will begin on April 1, 2026 whereas population enumeration will start on February 1, 2027.

Base rate of plots in Mohali shoots up : GMADA

MOHALI : About 10% rate in different categories of plots in Mohali district has been escalated for 2025-26 by GMADA.

In Sectors 53 to 71 rate for the plots have been hiked to Rs 71,500 from Rs 65,000 per square yard. The rate for Sector 62 has been fixed as Rs 71,500. The prevailing rate of plots in Sectors 76 to 80 has been fixed at Rs 70,000 per square yard from the earlier Rs 63,400.

Sector 81 and above, IT City, Eco City-1, Aerocity, Sectors 90-91 land-pooling plots, Aerotropolis land-pooling plots in Blocks A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I and J, EcoCity-2 (100 to 300, 400 and 500 sq yards) have been fixed at Rs 65,000 from the existing Rs 51,500. Same rates are applicable for plots in Sector 101 now measuring 100, 200 and 300 to 500 sq yards.

The rate for SCOs in Sector 101 measuring 100 and 200 sq yards has been hiked to Rs 2,25,000 this year; earlier, it was Rs 1,99,600. Single-storey shops measuring 60 yards in Sector 101 now command a rate of Rs



1,50,000 per sq yard as against a rate of Rs 1,33,100 last year.

There has been a slight uptick in the rate of industrial plots in Rajpura Focal Point with rates changed from Rs 16,600 to Rs 18,000 per sq yard this year. Similarly, the Rajpura Urban Estate has gone up from Rs 22,500 to Rs 25,000 per sq yard now, officials said. The market rate of these plots is significantly higher than the rates fixed by the development authority. The base rates, however, will be applicable for allotment to government, semi-government, and non-government organisations. The revised rates will also be applicable for implementing court orders and fixing non-construction fee, said GMADA Chief Accounts Officer Ajay Mittal.

Residents seek 200-ft road from Dara Studio to Khanpur

HC questions outsourcing of MC tasks in Sector 26 mandi

CHANDIGARH : "Can a municipal body outsource a basic municipal service? Is it there in the Act itself? There are certain very foundational municipal functions, which have to be performed by your own employees, so that you have control over them," asked Chief Justice Sheel Nagu.

The Punjab and Haryana High Court questioned whether basic municipal functions such as sanitation and repair work could legally be outsourced by the Chandigarh Administration, while observing that such duties were required to be performed by employees under direct administrative and disciplinary control.

Taking note of an affidavit filed by the UT Administration in a suo motu case arising from unhygienic conditions and encroachments in Sector 26 mandi.

The Bench, which also included Justice Sanjiv Berry, was told by UT senior standing counsel Amit Jhanji that the



responsibility for sanitation and supervision in the mandi had been entrusted to a sanitary inspector appointed through an outsourced agency. The market committee, he said, had issued several show-cause notices and warnings to the outsourced sanitary inspector between February and July 2025 for lapses in cleanliness. However, when the Chief Justice questioned whether such critical functions could be delegated to outsourced staff, Jhanji conceded: "Your Lordship is correct... I have not gone through the rules. I can find out if it is required to be filled up, we will do that also."

Pointing to the photographs placed on record, the Chief Justice remarked that the images "don't show any improvement,"

Army Chief warns Pak against misadventure as Op Sindoos only '88-hour trailer'

NEW DELHI : For the Chanakya Defence Dialogue 2025 (CDD-2025) to be hosted by the Army in collaboration with Centre for Land Warfare Studies (CLAWS) from November 27-28, General Upendra Dwivedi said "Operation Sindoos" was "just an 88-hour 'trailer'".

The theme of the CDD is "Reform to Transform: Sashakt, Surakshit aur Viksit Bharat".

Army Chief on Monday said India gave a befitting reply to Pakistan through "Operation Sindoos".

"We are prepared for any circumstances in future. If Pakistan gives a chance, we will teach it how to behave responsibly with a neighbouring nation," he added.

The General stressed the national resolve against terrorism, emphasising that "blood and water cannot flow together" and that accountability was essential for those supporting terror activities.

"Our deterrence is very



strong and it's working," he said. India, he said was committed to progress and development, but would not hesitate to act against those who attempt to derail its path. "India focuses on progress and prosperity. If someone creates obstacles in our course, then we will have to take some action against them," said the Army Chief. Speaking about the situation along the LAC, India-China relations and diplomacy in handling the crisis, General Dwivedi said, "There has been a lot of improvement in our relations since last October, following a dialogue between leaders of the two nations to bring normalcy." He was referring to the

meeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi had with Chinese President Xi Jinping in Kazan last October.

"Troops of both sides have had almost 1,100 interactions in the past one year. There have been meetings between battalion commanders and brigade commanders. We are attempting to resolve several issues at the ground level, while major decisions will be taken at the higher level of military leadership," he said. "Some flexibility is coming and both sides are trying to find solutions," said the Army Chief.

"When the issue of boundary limitation comes, these ground level discussions will be very helpful," said General Dwivedi. He cited how an "expert group" and "working group" have been formed under the Working Mechanism for Consultation and Coordination on India - China Border Affairs.

He recalled the Ministry of Defence's declaration of 2025 as the "Year of Reforms" and underlined that security and development must advance together.

7,000 km high-speed rail corridors would be built by 2047: Vaishnaw

NEW DELHI : High-speed routes, designed for maximum speeds of up to 350 km per hour and an operating speed of 320 km per hour, will mark a transformative leap in India's rail infrastructure, said the Union railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw while inaugurating the 16th International Railway Equipment Exhibition (IREE), 2025, at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi.

Unveiling an ambitious roadmap for the Railways, on Wednesday announced that the government plans to build 7,000 km of dedicated passenger corridors by 2047 under the Vande Bharat vision.

Vaishnaw said the proposed corridors would be powered by indigenously developed signalling systems and modern operations control centres, ensuring both speed and safety.

He also outlined the



government's futuristic vision for Vande Bharat 4.0, Amrit Bharat 4.0, and next-generation railway manufacturing standards. Highlighting the success of the Vande Bharat series, he said the third-generation train already meets global parameters, with acceleration from 0 to 100 kmph in just 52 seconds, faster than many trains in Japan and Europe, while maintaining low noise and vibration levels.

"Vande Bharat 4.0 will be a new benchmark in performance and passenger experience," said Vaishnaw, adding that the upcoming

model will focus on superior seats, enhanced toilets, and refined workmanship.

Discussing the Amrit Bharat series, the minister said the 2.0 version is already operational and the 3.0 model, based on push-pull technology, is being developed for long-distance routes. The 4.0 version, he added, will bring in new-generation trainsets and locomotives, expected to be ready for testing within 36 months.

Vaishnaw credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership for what he termed "a decade of modernisation," noting that more than 35,000 km of new rail lines have been laid and 46,000 km of electrification completed in the past 11 years. "Our budget allocation for the Railways has consistently risen, reflecting the government's commitment to a modern, self-reliant network," he said.

Resentment over Punjabi University's Rs 53K 'golden chance' for exam scheme



Acharya, who unsuccessfully contested last year's Lok Sabha polls from Saran, also said that she is "taking all the blame", without specifying whether she was referring to the Bihar election, in which the RJD won just 25 seats in the 243-member assembly, its second-worst performance in a poll after 2010, or something else.



Islamabad : The staggering military balance of Pakistan's defence overhaul may further ruin its economic pedestal.

Pakistan has codified the most ambitious restructure of its military and judiciary in decades after President Asif Ali Zardari signed his assent to ratify the country's 27th Constitutional Amendment on Thursday. The amendment, which passed in both houses of parliament earlier in the week amid opposition protests and criticism from a range



of civil society activists and sitting judges, makes major changes to Pakistan's higher judiciary. But many analysts believe that its most consequential feature is a sweeping overhaul of Article 243, the constitutional clause defining the relationship between Pakistan's civilian government and

uncalled military regime. The changes grant lifetime immunity from criminal prosecution to the country's top military leaders, significantly reshape the military's command structure, and further tilt the balance of the tri-services – the army, navy and air force – substantially in the army's favour. Analysts warn that this contentious reform risks colliding with entrenched institutional cultures and could rock the country's fragile civilian-military equilibrium.

Putin to visit India on 5-6 Dec for annual summit

National Capital Region continues to breathe toxic air

New Delhi : Reaching beyond 500 Air Quality Index, Delhi, Noida and Gurugram as AQI remains 'severe', the region continues to breathe toxic air. How long will residents have to endure toxic air and suffer respiratory ailments?

With no respite in sight, a blanket of haze continued to engulf Delhi-NCR on Sunday, with several areas in the capital recording an air quality index (AQI) above 400 – categorised as 'severe'. The 24-hour average AQI stood at 386 in the 'very poor' range of 385, only a point less than Saturday's 386, according to data from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).

Parts of the city continues to breathe toxic air, with several stations reporting 'severe' AQI on Saturday.

At 7 am, Anand Vihar recorded 412, Bawana



436, Burari 405, IGI

Airport 338, ITO 417, Najafgarh 364, Punjab Bagh 409, and Wazirpur 435.

In Noida, the AQI at 435 was in the 'severe' category. Similarly, Greater Noida reported an AQI of 452, Ghaziabad 448, and Gurgaon 377. There is no relief expected anytime soon in Delhi-NCR, as the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology has forecast the air quality to remain in the 'severe' to 'very poor' range in the coming days.

According to the CPCB, an AQI between 0 and 50 is considered 'good', 51-100 'satisfactory', 101-200 'moderate', 201-300 'poor', 301-400 'very poor', and 401-500 'severe'.

6 Congress candidates dominated poll arena, 12 BJP stumbled

Patna : Only six of the Congress' 61 candidates could survive the onslaught of the ruling NDA. Even as the BJP made a spectacular show in the Bihar assembly elections with almost all of its 101 candidates registering massive wins, 12 of the nominees missed the jubilant bus.

A few of those contestants lost the polls by slender margins such as 30 or 178, according to the Election Commission.

On the other hand, only six of the Congress' 61 candidates survived the onslaught of the ruling NDA.

Of the 12 BJP nominees who failed to win, Vinod Kumar was handed a crushing defeat by AIMIM's Ghulam Sarwar in the Baisi seat by a margin of 27,251 votes.



Kumar polled 27,251

votes. of the Congress emerged victorious, polling 1,20,114 votes.

The BJP's Sweety Singh polled 76,875 votes and lost the Kishanganj seat to Congress' Md Qamru Hoda by 12,794 votes.

Compared to other BJP candidates, Bina Devi's performance was below par as she secured the third position in Kochadhaman by bagging 44,858 votes.

AIMIM's Md Sarwar Alam won the seat bagging 81,860 votes, followed by RJD's Mujahid Alam who got 58,839 votes.

BJP candidate Alok Ranjan was defeated in Saharsa by a margin of 2,038 votes. He lost to Indrajeet Prasad Gupta of the Indian Inclusive Party who polled 1,15,036 votes.

Fluoride contaminants in groundwater, a threat to public health

Dera Bassi : Fluoride habitation carrying water contaminants with the fast depletion of ground water and distant access to safe drinking water has been evolving a serious concern with the ministry of Jal Shakti. As public health has been the intimate concern of Punjab Pollution Control, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, steps must be initiated to eradicate flow of untreated sewage, effluents into the ground water.

The community water purification plants need to be augmented. The control over expansion of fluorosis need to be endemic, sources revealed. The accessibility to safe drinking water has been eloping with the discharge of untreated chemicals, effluents into the ground water, and depletion not halting for a cause. The multiplying cases of cancer are not being contained due to the surge in bacterial growth.

Pathogens like bacteria and viruses are being experienced as a very common hazard with the rural public life. Afflicted several health issues might be arthritis, infertility, hypertension, neurotoxicity and increased risk of skeletal cancer, reveals an official.

Additionally prolonged exposure can damage organs like liver, kidneys, lungs and testis. Water contamination has been posing immediate and chronic health threats, needs serious contemplation, medication and panacea.
