CBI officer in bribery case for demanding Honda City , convicted



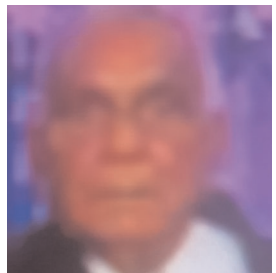

Chandigarh : During the trial, the defence counsels argued that the accused have been falsely implicated by the company, and no such demand was made by the accused. The Special CBI Court of Chandigarh on Friday held a CBI inspector guilty in a graft case. The convict, CBI

inspector Ravinder Singla had demanded a Honda City car from a company and reportedly obtained bribery worth Rs 4.3 lakh. The CBI Court of Alka Malik, Additional District and Sessions Judge, convicted Singla, under various sections. According to the prosecution, Singla was arrested by a CBI team from Delhi on May 26, 2016, after T K Sharma, manager of Nectar Life Sciences Limited, a pharmaceutical company at Sector 9, lodged a complaint against him that the officer was using the company's Honda City and despite several requests, did not return

the car and even threatened to implicate him in a false case if they did not stop demanding their car back from him. Mr Sharma alleged to the CBI in his complaint that Singla came to his office and demanded a car to go to Delhi to attend a meeting, saying his official vehicle had broken down and then refused to return the car once he returned from the meeting. Singla was then posted in the Special Crime Branch, which deals with several cases referred by the Punjab and Haryana High Court for investigation.

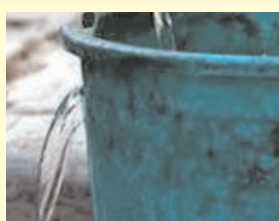


Mayor's push for higher property taxes.

China’s questionable stand, aggressive rhetorics serves no purpose

China might not want a full-blown India-Pakistan conflict for several reasons, including the possible return of the US to the region in some form or fashion and this time, most likely on the Indian side. This would mean that China would have to take sides with the Pakistanis. Apart from the lack of any real political or economic gain from such backing, the Chinese probably also do not want to complicate ties with either the US or India at this moment. Despite its retaliatory measures against the US in the trade war and the aggressive rhetoric, Beijing is also concerned about longer-term implications for its economy and has kept the door open for negotiations with the Americans. The current Chinese thaw with the Indians has at least partly to do with concerns with the Donald Trump administration in the US and is too recent for the Chinese to want to complicate with anything more than the sort of signals outlined above. No wonder then that Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi's phone call with his Pakistani counterpart ended by saying that "conflict does not serve the fundamental interests of either India or Pakistan." At the same time, if eliminating terrorism from Pakistan requires the weakening of the Pakistani military and if such weakening were to lead to an improvement of India-Pakistan ties or a strengthening of western-style

democracy, then China will be opposed to this too. China's ruling communists view democratic consolidation anywhere as threatening their own regime stability. China prefers the status quo — continuing tensions between India and Pakistan short of war, which would gradually drain both countries, distracting India from preparing for the China challenge and keeping Pakistan dependent on China's largesse. For long now, Chinese support to Pakistan on political and foreign policy issues has been largely rhetorical. While Beijing has blocked Indian attempts to get Pakistan-based terrorists sanctioned at the UN, it has also used such support to put pressure on Islamabad and Rawalpindi to address China's own concerns on what it perceives to be terrorism by Uyghurs from its Xinjiang region as well as attacks against Chinese workers in Pakistan. Two, Beijing is also shifting responsibility to India by urging "restraint" and asking both countries to "jointly uphold peace and stability in the region." By calling for an "impartial investigation", China is making clear that it does not buy India's version of events. And nor can it, given that its rivalry with India is structural. China has also used foreign interlocutors to highlight this hyphenation, referring, for example, to the Egyptian Foreign Minister calling for

"calm and self-restraint" in phone calls with his Indian and Pakistani counterparts. Once again, Indian rhetoric and domestic politics involving Pakistan offer opportunities to China to exploit the India-Pakistan divide and to keep India off balance. The first report of the attack by Chinese state-run Xinhua on April 22 did not refer to it as a terrorist attack but as "tourists killed", and an "ambush" in "Indian-controlled Kashmir." The report was largely matter-of-fact even if both Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and "the region's incumbent Chief Minister" Omar Abdullah were quoted as condemning it. It concludes noting: "A guerilla war has been going on between militants and Indian troops stationed in the region since 1989." The headlines and text change, with "UN Security Council condemns terror attack in Indian-controlled Kashmir" in the headline, "terrorist attack in Kashmir", and "terrorism and extremism." But even so, these are not the same thing as saying that China holds Pakistan responsible. In fact, China consistently attempts to portray a picture of neutrality, saying it "hopes India and Pakistan will exercise restraint, work in the same direction, handle relevant differences properly through dialogue and consultation, and jointly uphold peace and stability in the region."

Food safety training and certification for eatery operators pickup in UT



CHANDIGARH : The momentum launched by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), envisages to cultivate a culture of self-compliance among food businesses across the country. In a step towards promoting food safety and hygiene, the Food Safety Administration, UT Health Department, has started free training under the Food Safety Training and Certification (FoSTaC) programme. Earlier, Food Business Operators (FBOs) were required to seek paid training through private FSSAI-empanelled agencies. However, with the Health Department now officially empanelled as a training partner, the training is being offered at no cost to FBOs in Chandigarh. The initiative is being led by Sukhwinder Singh, Designated Officer, who is also empanelled as a FoSTaC trainer by the FSSAI. The Food Safety Training and Certification programme, first introduced in July 2017, seeks to create a dedicated pool of trained food safety supervisors

equipped with knowledge of hygiene and manufacturing practices as outlined in Schedule 4 of the Food Safety and Standards Licensing and Registration Regulations, 2011. The training is mandatory for all FBOs operating in sectors such as catering, hotels, restaurants, food vending, canteens, dhabas and mess facilities, before these are granted an FSSAI licence. The first batch of training was successfully conducted today at the department's new facility in the New Administrative Block, Government Multi-Speciality Hospital (GMSH), Sector 16. Around 20 FBOs participated and received official FoSTaC certificates upon completion of the training. Officials noted that the initiative is not just about compliance, but about fostering a lasting behavioural shift in how food businesses approach hygiene and safety. By introducing in-house training and making it accessible, the Chandigarh Administration hopes to raise the bar for food standards and public health.

Cyber fraudsters in online fraud bamboozle doctor, wife of Rs 1.4 cr

CHANDIGARH : A complaint to the police, Dr Anupam Lal, a resident of Sector 24-B, has alleged that a group of cyber fraudsters posing as employees of JM Financial persuaded him to deposit large sums in the several bank accounts of fictitious portfolio management services. They operated through a WhatsApp group titled "W6 Stock Uptrend Club", the victim alleged. The doctor couple have reportedly lost nearly Rs 1.4 crore in an online scam involving fake stock-trading platforms. Police investigations revealed that many of the recipient accounts were linked to shell companies, indicating a complex money-laundering operation. Between August and September 2024, the couple made at least 18 transfers, with individual payments ranging from Rs



50,000 to Rs 24.5 lakh. Initially, the fraudsters paid modest profits, a tactic commonly used to build trust. Once a substantial amount had been invested, the couple found themselves locked out of withdrawal options. Communication from the alleged representatives of the company stopped soon after. Dr Lal reported the largest single transaction of Rs 24.5 lakh on the National Cyber Crime Portal on October 11 last year. Following a preliminary investigation, the police registered a case under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita. The investigation is ongoing to trace the perpetrators and recover the couple's money.

National Lok Adalat in Panchkula on May 10

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The second National Lok Adalat will be held on May 10 at the District Courts Complex, Panchkula. The arrangements are being made under the guidance of Surya Partap Singh, Member Secretary of HALSA, and VP Sirohi, District and Sessions Judge, Panchkula announced by the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Panchkula. Aparna Bhardwaj, Chief Judicial Magistrate and Secretary of DLSA, said that help desks will be set up at both the District Courts Complex and DC Office Mini Secretariat. These desks will be managed by Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs) to help the public and provide information. To speed up case resolutions, ten benches will be working from May 2 to May 9 as part of Pre-Lok Adalats. These benches will try to settle cases before the main Lok Adalat day.



All insurance companies in the district have been asked to share lists of pending accident claims and other court cases. Similarly, all banks in Panchkula have been told to prepare lists of loan recovery cases that can be settled during the Lok Adalat. To inform people about Lok Adalat, Panel Advocates and PLVs will hold awareness drives and legal camps in villages and rural areas. These will explain how Lok Adalats work, what types of cases can be resolved, and how people can take part. Bhardwaj described Lok Adalats as a great way for people to settle their disputes peacefully, quickly and without spending money on court fee before encouraging the public to take part in it.

PM Sewa Scheme facilitates 100 E-Buses for Mohali

Commissioner News Service MOHALI : The areas of Kharar, Lalru, Banur and Nayagaon will be among the main beneficiaries for travelling in the newly introduced E-Buses. Mohali district has become eligible for the PM E-Bus Sewa Scheme, Deputy Commissioner (DC) Komal Mittal announced during a meeting with stakeholders to discuss the proposed route plan. Around 100 electric buses (EVs) will operate on eight routes covering distances between 17 km and 32 km, with a frequency of one bus every 15 minutes.



The Deputy Commissioner stated that the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Government of India, issued an amendment to the PM E-Bus Sewa Scheme guidelines on April 15. As per the revised guidelines, Mohali has now qualified to receive 100 electric buses under the cluster category.

No untoward incident during NEET-UG at 10 exam centres in city : SSP

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : As many as 4,848 candidates registered for the test. More than 95 per cent registered students, accounting for over 4,600 pupils, appeared for the test, said Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) Amandeep Singh Bhatti. The medical entrance exam, National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test-Undergraduate (NEET-UG), was held amid strict monitoring and security measures at 10 centres here. Mock drills were held at all centres on Saturday to ensure a smooth conduct of the nationwide exam. Most



of the centres were located in government and government-aided schools, colleges, universities and institutions. No untoward incident has been reported from inside or outside any of the 10 centres, said SSP Kanwardeep Kaur. However, sporadic incidents of the candidates objecting to the removal of their certain sacred items, which they were wearing, before

entering the exam hall were reported. There were three layers of monitoring at the district, state and central levels. Transporting question papers under police escort, monitoring coaching centres to identify organised cheating rackets, multi-layered frisking by the police in addition to the deployment of designated security personnel at the exam centres were among the steps taken by the National Testing Agency (NTA), governed by the Union Education Ministry.

Municipal Corporation clueless about bad shape Sector-dividing roads



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : With the MC facing a scarcity of funds, an agenda was brought before the General House in a meeting on March 25 to hand over V-3 roads to the UT Administration, but the councillors rising above the party lines rejected it. The local Municipal Corporation (MC) has found itself in a Catch-22 situation over the maintenance of V-3 roads, the stretches separating sectors, under its jurisdiction. While the councillors rejected an agenda for handing over these roads to the Chandigarh Administration, the MC has failed to get funds for their maintenance, leaving the residents in the lurch. When the agenda was discussed in the General House, MC Commissioner Amit Kumar apprised members that V-3 roads had not been recarpeted for the past three years. He said earlier too, the maintenance of V-3 roads was transferred to the Administration and later given back to the MC. He said the civic body had to work on two aspects — generate revenue and reduce the expenditure for which best efforts were being made. He said the V-3 road network should be transferred

to the Administration in view of the financial condition of the civic body as it was very difficult for the MC to incur such a huge expenditure. On the other hand, a majority of councillors were of the view that the MC should not transfer its rights to the UT. A councillor said the MC would have to transfer its staff if the work of recarpeting of V-3 roads was transferred to the Chandigarh Administration. He said earlier, the staff had not received their salaries for the past four months due to financial crunch in the MC. Later, the civic body arranged funds on its own and paid the salaries. They were totally dependent on the MC for their bread and butter, the councillor said. Councillors are of the view that a dedicated fund should be demanded from the Administration for these roads. Hardeep Singh, a councillor, said the Chandigarh Administration must release funds to the MC for the road recarpeting work. Saurabh

Joshi, another councillor, said the recarpeting of roads was not carried in his ward even as a tender was floated two years ago. Mayor Harpreet Babla has already raised the issue before the Chief Secretary of the Chandigarh Administration and demanded funds for road recarpeting. She had told the Administration that the MC was responsible for maintaining approximately 1,860 km of roads, which came to almost 60% of the total road length in the UT. Additionally, the MC was also maintaining roads and streets in 22 villages under the MC limits. Baljinder Singh Bittu, president Federation of Sector Welfare Associations (FOSWAC), said the condition of roads had been deteriorating day by day. He said the UT Administration must release more funds to the civic body. He added, “However, if the Administration is not releasing funds, the roads should be given to it. Why should people suffer?” RK Garg, president, Second Innings Association, criticised the decision of the councillors for not handing over V3 roads to the Administration. He said the councillors must take decisions in the interests of the city residents.

Dress code for govt schoolteachers introduced by administration

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Chandigarh has become the first city in the country to implement uniform for the school teachers, some of whom have silently resisted the move. The Administration has introduced for teachers of the government schools in the city. The dress-code initiative, taken by the Education Department on the advice of UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria, has been first introduced at the PM Shri Government Model Senior Secondary School, Sector 14, Dhanas. The uniform specifications outline female staff donning sarees, salwar kameez, while male teachers wearing formal shirts and trousers. The change is aimed at unifying the appearance of educators, fostering a sense of



professionalism and creating an environment conducive to learning. “A unified dress code not only promotes equality among staff but also instils a sense of pride and professionalism,” said Kataria. The Chandigarh Education Department, meanwhile, claimed that the department was committed to implementing the initiative in all government schools by the end of summer

vacations. “This timeline allows ample time for a smooth transition to the new dress code, ensuring that all teachers have their uniforms,” an official statement read. “Promote Equality: A uniform dress code minimizes socio-economic disparities among staff, fostering a more inclusive atmosphere. And, Boost Morale: A cohesive appearance can improve team spirit and morale among educators. The department looks forward to the positive impact these uniforms will have on both teachers and the broader school community,” the statement adds. At a department event in January, the Administrator had proposed the introduction of uniforms for teachers to symbolise their unity, discipline and role in shaping society.

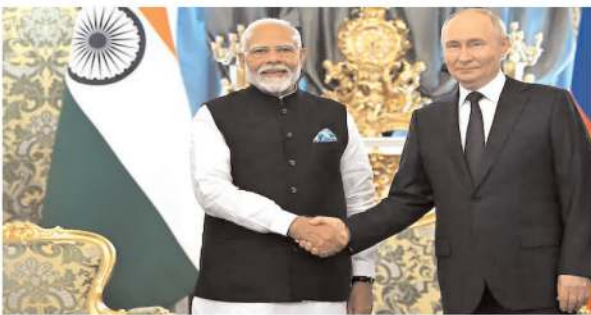

President Putin once again expressed his sincere condolences over the killings of

Indian citizens in the brutal terror attack in Pahalgam on April 22 and assured Modi that Russia stands with India in combating all forms and manifestations of terrorism, state-run Radio Vesti FM reported. Modi congratulated Putin and the people of Russia on the upcoming 80th anniversary of the Victory in the Great Patriotic War.

Civil defence mock drills to be executed by several states on May 7

NEW DELHI : As part of readiness in preparation of the impending Pahalgam terror attack retribution plan, the Central Government on Monday asked several states to conduct mock drills on May 7 to test civil defence capacities and effectiveness. Most states asked to test readiness are either on the border or close to the border. "The MHA has asked several states to conduct drills for effective civil

defence on 7th May," said top official sources. The following measures will be undertaken as part of the drill: Operationalisation of air raid warning sirens; training of civilians; students on the civil defence aspects to protect themselves in the event of a hostile attack; provision of crash blackout measures; provision for early camouflaging of vital plants and installations; and updation of evacuation plan and its rehearsal.

Military fight can go out of control, exercise restraint : UN chief

NEW DELHI : "Make no mistake: A military solution is no solution. It is essential at this critical hour to avoid a military confrontation that can easily spin out of control. Now is the time for maximum restraint and stepping back from the brink," Antonio Guterres Secretary-General said at the UN headquarters, in New York. Mr Guterres exhorted India and Pakistan to exercise "maximum restraint" to avoid a military confrontation saying it "could spin out of control" even as Russia and Japan offered full support to New Delhi in its fight against terror. Condemning the "awful" Pahalgam terror attack and offering condolences to the families of the victims, Guterres voiced concern over tensions between India and Pakistan being at their highest in years. The UN Secretary-General also said targeting civilians was unacceptable and those responsible must be brought to justice through credible



and lawful means. He reiterated the offer of his "good offices" to both governments in the service of peace. The remarks by Guterres came hours before a United Nations Security Council (UNSC) meeting was to be organised to discuss the escalating tensions between the two nuclear-armed neighbours. President Vladimir Putin on Monday called up Prime Minister Narendra Modi and offered full support to India in its fight against terror. Incidentally, Russia is one of the five permanent UNSC members holding veto powers. "Putin strongly condemned the April 22 Pahalgam

attack. He expressed full support to India in its fight against terrorism. He emphasised that the perpetrators of the heinous attack and their supporters must be brought to justice," said Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal, sharing on social media platform X the details of the Russian President's phone call. Separately, Japan also backed India and sought global cooperation to counter terrorism. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh met his Japanese counterpart Gen Nakatani here and both leaders condemned terrorism in all its forms. "The Japanese Defence Minister offered full support to India," the Ministry of Defence said. Rajnath condemned Pakistan's state policy of cross-border terrorism against India, perpetrated through state and non-state actors. He said such attacks destabilised the regional peace and called for a unified stand against terrorism.

The Directorate of Enforcement (ED) attached immovable properties worth Rs 2,348 crore in connection with an alleged real estate fraud involving WTC Faridabad Infrastructure Pvt Ltd and other entities of the WTC group, headed by Ashish Bhalla. The attached assets include approximately 159 acres of licensed and unlicensed land, along with unsold real estate inventory across Delhi NCR, Gurugram, Faridabad, and Noida, as well as



residential properties in Goa and commercial premises in Delhi-NCR. The probe revealed that over 12,000 investors were duped by Bhalla and his group companies through a well-orchestrated scheme of promising assured returns on investments in plots and commercial spaces under the WTC brand, ED sources said. More than Rs 2,700 crore was collected from investors across multiple states including Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab,

Chandigarh. However, a significant portion of these funds was diverted and siphoned off by Ashish Bhalla and never used for real estate development, a statement issued by ED said. Additionally, a substantial amount was illegally transferred abroad to entities based in Singapore, which are beneficially owned by close family members of Bhalla, it added further. The anti-money laundering agency had conducted search operations on February 27, 2024, during which Ashish Bhalla absconded and attempted to influence key witnesses. He was subsequently arrested on March 6, 2025, to prevent obstruction of the investigation and tampering with evidence, the ED statement added. The attached properties are identified as direct Proceeds of Crime.

Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

GURUGRAM : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city. The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contoured the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

Taxi auto drivers confront licence suspension over short trip declines

MUMBAI : During the suspension drive, as many as 48,417 taxi and auto rickshaw drivers were issued challans (penalty receipts) for different traffic violations, an official said. The traffic police have initiated the process to suspend licences of more than 28,800 taxi and autorickshaw drivers for refusing to ferry passengers wanting to undertake short-distance trips in Mumbai, officials said on Monday. The traffic wing of the Mumbai police



conducted a special drive against errant taxi and autorickshaw drivers from April 18 to May 2. These included taxi and autorickshaw drivers who were found plying vehicles without wearing proper uniforms or carrying valid permits, badges or registration documents. A section of these

drivers included those who refused short-distance trips and carried more passengers than the designated capacity of their vehicles, he said. Accordingly, action was taken against 48,417 autorickshaw and taxi drivers for violating traffic-related rules and a fine of Rs 40.25 lakh was recovered from them, according to the official. Process is underway to suspend licences of 28,814 taxi and autorickshaw drivers for saying no to short-distance trips of commuters, he added.

Prepare for strengthening civil defence, air raid warning sounding siren mechanism-- Home Secy

NEW DELHI : Preparations would be underway for Security Drills across 244 Areas in our country on Wednesday (7 May) said Ajit Doval,the Secretary Home. Mr Doval has asked all states to conduct drills on Wednesday, given the "new and complex threats" that have emerged amid rising tensions with Pakistan over the terror strike. Prime Minister Narendra Modi met National Security Advisor Ajit Doval on Tuesday amid speculation over India's military response to the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people last month the preparations for strengthening civil defence mechanisms that include conducting drills on air-raid warning sirens, training civilians



to protect themselves in the event of a "hostile attack" and cleaning bunkers and trenches. The developments came amid cross-border firing for the consecutive 12th straight night on Monday. There have been rising tensions between India and Pakistan after the April 22 terror attack. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has vowed to pursue the perpetrators of the attack and those who took part in its conspiracy to the "ends of the earth" to inflict punishment on them "beyond their imagination".

Dam chokes water flow to Pakistan, no water be spared in future

SRINAGAR/JAMMU : The dam actions demonstrate India's ability to regulate timing of water releases and comes after the Centre's decision to suspend Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) with Pakistan following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people, mostly tourists. Under the IWT, India would have had to inform Pakistan before regulating Chenab's waters. In Jammu's Akhnoor, dozens walked across the Chenab river, something they said they had never experienced before. Children collected coins from the bed as water levels dropped to 1.5-2ft from 25-30ft. Authorities have since Sunday restricted flows through Jammu's Baglihar and Salal hydroelectric dams on the Chenab that runs on to Pakistan, causing such an unprecedented drop in water levels that residents in downstream areas were able



to walk across the river for the first time in recent memory. The authorities had closed all five main gates of Baglihar Dam and those of Salal Dam downstream. Water released from Baglihar typically flows to Salal before the Chenab rolls into Pakistan, where it serves as a critical lifeline for its Punjab province. By closing both dams, authorities effectively stopped the river's flow, said sources. Officials downplayed the moves, saying the dams' gates were first opened to flush out silt and mud and then closed under a "continuous process". In Jammu's Akhnoor, dozens walked across the river,

something they said they had never experienced before. Children collected coins from the bed as water levels dropped to 1.5-2ft from 25-30ft. "For the first time in my life today, I was able to walk across half the Chenab. It's unbelievable," an Akhnoor resident said on Monday. Many welcomed PM Narendra Modi's decision to put the IWT on hold. "We do not want even a single drop of water to be supplied to Pakistan. We stand with Indian Army and PM Modi," said Akhnoor's Vinay Gupta. Fellow resident Kamal Langer echoed the sentiment: "Our govt is giving Pakistan a befitting reply in a lot of ways." According to Luv Puri, former UN counter-terrorism official and a J&K expert, the implications of placing the IWT in abeyance are becoming increasingly evident. "It shows this was preceded by significant preparation," Puri said.

UN Security Council demands accountability from Pakistan over J&K attack

New Delhi : Pakistan's recent missile tests and flagged their nuclear has been an escalatory factor in the development of potential war tension . The United Nations Security Council came down heavily on Pakistan at a closed-door consultation over tensions with India and the Pahalgam terror attack, citing sources. The members grilled Islamabad over Pakistan-based terror group Lashkar-e-Taiba's involvement in last month's Pahalgam attack, in which 25 tourists and a Kashmiri pony ride operator were killed by terrorists in cold blood. Islamabad's attempts to internationalise the situation failed with the members of the global security body flagging Pakistan's nuclear rhetoric as an escalatory blaze. Pakistan, one of the 10 non-permanent members of the council, had requested the UNSC's Greek presidency for "closed consultations" in view of the tensions with India.



The other members of the UNSC include the veto-wielding permanent ones: China, France, Russia, UK, and US. During the talks that lasted for over an hour, nthe UNSC members condemned the terror attack and highlighted the need for accountability. They also brought up that the tourists were targeted in Pahalgam based on their religion, the report said. They refused to accept Pakistan's "false flag" narrative on Pahalgam and asked it to sort out its issues bilaterally with India. Briefing the media after the UNSC talks, Pakistani envoy

Asim Iftikhar said his country has rejected all allegations of involvement in the Pahalgam attack. He also called India's suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty a violation of international law No official statement has yet been issued either by the Security Council or India. After the meeting, Tunisian diplomat Khaled Mohamed Khiari said that the situation was "volatile" and there was a call for "dialogue and peaceful resolution of the conflict.Greek envoy Evangelos Sekeris, the Security Council's President for May, called the meeting "productive and helpful". "We hope for de-escalation," a Russian diplomat said. Ahead of the talks, UN chief Antonio Gutierrez had said that "a military solution is not a solution" and called on both countries to show maximum restraint and "step back from the brink". "It pains me to see relations reaching a boiling point," he had said..

74 projects to cost Rs 49000 Cr for development of Amravati

Amravati : The ancient heritage town was once the thriving capital of the ancient Satavahana dynasty and renowned for its Buddhist heritage. Nearly 1,800 years later, moves to revive it as a capital are in full swing with Prime Minister Narendra Modi laying the foundation stone for projects worth thousands of crores. Breach of Indus Water Treaty

New Delhi : "India doesn't have at present infrastructure to divert waters from the western rivers because it was not allowed under the Indus Waters Treaty , " Anjali Prakash , an expert on the Hindu Kush -Himalayas water system and research director of the Hyderabad -based Indian School of Business sensitized the reporters . It may not be immediately feasible for India to stop the flow of river water to Pakistan. Thwestern rivers Indus Jhelum and Chenab rivers in winters might be During the 'low flow' season of winter, India might regulate water flow and its timing using the infrastructure of the



Baglihar and Kishan ganga dams. In order to punish Pakistan more effectively, India will have to increase its water storage capacity and speed up works of under-construction hydro power projects . But it will take time to have such infrastructure on the ground. Registering India's decision to keep the treaty in abeyance opens the door for strategic control over its river resources , he said , "With in two years , with streamlined approvals emergency execution powers .
