Green Lotus Utsav transgresses Supreme Court orders on alienating/sale of PACL properties

Investors are persistently demanding legal partition of their land

Zirakpur: The land of gullible investors was never got legally partitioned by DG Housing Project Ltd from Revenue department, therefore, the Supreme Court had to order SEBI (Securities and Exchange Board Of India) to ensure legitimate partitioning of the land of the investors and their compensatory relief

from the land (sharks) buyers. On the Supreme Court orders, Justice RM Lodha had constituted a committee on 2nd, May 2016, that later passed directions on 13th September, 2022 to Chairman AIG, SIT, Bureau of Investigation to contact revenue authorities for legitimate partition and justful



share in PACL (Pearl Agro Corporation Ltd.) as huge sum was invested in the Pearl Group. No civil court or any other authority or forum shall entertain a suit/other proceedings in respect of any claim, ordered the Apex Court. The Supreme Court had restrained the illegal owners/buyers not to

transact/alienate/sell the controversial properties on PR 7, yet the orders of the Lodha Committee are being defied, much to the agony of the gullible investors. Despite many calls to Amit Mittal, Managing Director of the Green Lotus Utsav there was no response from the very popular estate builder.

In the 2019 assembly elections, AAP contested 46 seats in Haryana and failed to win any, securing less



than 1% of the votes. Sanjay Singh declared that AAP will demand the withdrawal of Agnipath scheme, which involves short-term recruitment in the military. "They have given the Indian Army on rent. It is an insult to the fallen soldiers from Haryana. Besides, there is the issue of fair prices for agricultural produce and growing unemployment. BJP's double engine govt has tried to change its engine by replacing Manohar Lal Khattar with Nayab Singh Saini, but people will give them a befitting reply " he commented.

EDITORIAL -

Let the religious man be little scientific

Many gurus have lavish ashrams worldwide and some have also been convicted of rape and murder. Their followers are usually sceptical of these charges and that adds to the rationalists' bewilderment. How is it, they ask, that inspite of all the evidence these gurus still retain their flock ? Rationalists commit a major error here in their reasoning because science is not everything. Both Kant and Vivekananda had argued, over the ages, that science and religion should not mix and must be kept separate. Vivekananda put it clearly when he said that "their methods are different". This is "Religion deals with the truths of the metaphysical world just as chemistry and the other natural sciences deal with the truths of the material world" quoted Vivekananda. Over a hundred devotees died in a stampede at Bhole Baba's religious gathering. The arrangement was for 80,000 attendees but eventually about 2.5L devotees turned up. It is not as if Bhole Baba is a household name. There are hundreds like him but they all have enough worshippers to water the gardens, fire the "havans" and keep the chants humming. Such godmen are not unique to our country, except they seem to sprout spontaneously in this tropical air. However,

poverty is not the reason, for they are not to be found in villages. Magnum cults of the Bhole Baba kind have always been urban, both in terms of the worshipped and the worshipper. Villages don't have such godmen but, at best, lonely, dirt-poor ascetics. In a village where social bonds are firm, lack of communication is not strong. In a city where is felt. This is why all night "jagrants" and the thronging of godmen's ashrams come up to fill the vacuum. A guru's blessings and uplifting sermons provide a healing touch to urban souls who are dangerously cantilevered on shifting ground. Such godmen are worshipped not because there is poverty for, if that were so, them the guru cult should have suffered with the steady such "divinities" are flourishing and their numbers may even be growing. This is because a different kind of poverty stalks our society and its presence had hitherto gone unnoticed. We should now pause and reflect on the fact that, unlike other world religions, Hinduism does not need a communication. One can pray alone, even have a special family deity and not participate in collective worship. In a village, where social ties are firm, such a anonymity. It is this that creates the need for a collective buffer, also known as

community. Such gurus do well because there are millions who are precariously balanced on a tear drop and from a heartbreak. A recent study, by Prof Sonalde Desai shows that while poverty has declined, more than half the current poor are actually "newly poor". These people have slipped down because of a catastrophic event such as illness or job loss. It is this uncertainty, which exhibits itself primarily in urban India, that drives people to seek solace. After extremes. It is also in non-rural settings that you find most of the migrants in our country who are about 37% all. Hard to believe ? Well, check the 2011 census. Finally, there is a problem of perception that particularly afflicts diehard rationalists. They cannot see a speck of scientific reasoning behind the adoration that godmen, like Bhole Baba, receive from their followers. To rationalists, these godmen are charlatans who swindle people blind. How then could good, decent folk block reasoning faculties and not see through such obvious fakes ? Vivekananda, like Tagore, another great spiritualist, was a fervent supporter of Jagdish Bose's scientific efforts. Rationalists go wrong because the lens they see the world with is not bifocal. They just know and see a single method.

CJM court to work electronically as per new criminal laws

CHANDIGARH : From submitting the chargesheet online to recording of the evidences, all have been allowed electronically in the new laws. For example, Section 63 of the BNSS introduces technology compatibility for issuance and service of summons. The court can now issue summons in electronic form authenticated by the image of the seal of the court or digital signature. The court of the Chief Judicial Magistrate (CJM), Chandigarh, has been chosen as the first in the District Courts, Chandigarh, to function as per the provisions of the three new criminal laws — Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA). The National Informatics Centre (NIC) and other government agencies have been working on the software, which will equip the CJM court to do things electronically as per the provisions of the new laws. The focus in the new criminal laws has been given on paperless work. Further, Section 70 allows for service of summons through electronic means.



For the purpose of making the process effective, transparent and accountable, a provision has been made in Section 64 for maintaining a register in the police station and in the court to keep the address, email address, phone number, etc. of the person to be summoned. The lawyers will be allowed to participate in the proceedings even as they are sitting anywhere. The new laws also allow oral evidence to be given electronically. Witnesses, prosecution and the defence have also been allowed to record the statements electronically. As per the new provision, a magistrate can also supply documents electronically to the accused. Sources in the District Courts say that once the software is installed and other infrastructure is ready, the CJM court will be connected electronically with the model jail and police stations falling under its jurisdiction.

Grievances against builders

transcending list in consumer courts

CHANDIGARH : In accordance with the latest information, around 7,200 consumer cases have been filed in two district and one state consumer commissions in the past two years from January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2023. Complaints against builders are seen transcending the list of the cases filed in consumer courts here. Two district commissions and one state consumer dispute redressal panel are functioning in city. Of the total cases, 2,391 (33 per cent) are related to the real estate sector topping the list, followed by the cases against insurance companies. A total of 821 cases were filed against the insurance companies in the past two years and 367 against banks. Fiftytwo cases were filed against the education sector, including coaching centres, and 55 against the medical sector. The lawyers dealing with the consumer cases said the figures showed that the builders were not fulfilling their promises made to the



consumers. They said there had been a notable development in Chandigarh and its nearby areas. People are investing their hard-earned money in real estate. Ajay Jagga, an advocate, said complaints against builders often pertained to a range of issues, including delayed project delivery, substandard construction, misleading advertisements and the lack of transparency in transactions. Delayed delivery is the most frequent grievance, with many consumers facing extended waiting periods beyond the stipulated completion period. Substandard construction was another major issue where the structures failed to meet the promised

standards, leading to additional costs and safety concerns. Jagga said consumers were often lured by attractive offers and promises that are not kept by developers, resulting in a breach of trust. The complexity of real estate transactions, compounded by insufficient disclosure of terms and conditions, leaves many buyers feeling deceived and vulnerable. Another advocate, Pankaj Chandgothia, said the Consumer Act 2019 Act had given enhanced protection to consumers it provided for more stringent action compared to the Erstwhile Act of 1986. The 2019 Act gives additional power to the consumer court to declare a builder's agreement as 'unfair contracts' and therefore not binding on the consumer. The agreement having such terms, which adversely affect the rights of such consumers and indulge in unfair trade practices, can be quashed by the State Commission. These cases can be directly filed to the commission.

Accused arrested by Punjab VB before fleeing to Dubai

MOHALI : A committee under the chairmanship of Justice (Retd) RM Lodha had been constituted pursuant to the order of Supreme Court to sell the properties of PACL Ltd. and use the sale proceeds to refund the investors who had invested their hard-earned money in the collective investment scheme (CIS) offered by the company. The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB), in assistance with immigration department officials arrested an absconding accused Prashant Manjrekar, director of Sanranjeevan Infrastructure and Projects Private Ltd. wanted in Pearls Agrotech Corporation Limited (PACL) case from Mumbai airport. Evading his arrest, the



accused was attempting to flee to Dubai. A spokesperson of the VB said the above mentioned accused was wanted in FIR No. 79 dated July 16, 2020, under Sections 406, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of IPC, registered at Zira city police station in Ferozepur for his involvement in illegal alienation of properties belonging to PACL Ltd. in Gholumajra village, Mohali. The accused had full knowledge that the Supreme Court had already restrained the PACL Ltd. from

selling/alienating any of the properties wherein PACL has, in any manner, a right or interest and in village Gholumajra also, the spokesperson said. The directors/promoters of Finominal Construction Private Ltd and Sanarjeevan Infrastructure and Projects Private Ltd in connivance with the orders, had developed two colonies named Bella Vista 1 and Bella Vista 2 on a land measuring 115 bighas in Gholumajra village on the disputed land of PACL in the year 2018-19. The accused developers had allegedly collected huge amount of money by selling plots/houses in both the colonies and the VB had nominated the promoters of these companies in the case.

'IT to contribute 10% in India's GDP by 2025'

CHANDIGARH : While addressing a conference on 'Exploring IT Frontiers', Abhishek Gupta, chairman, CII, Punjab, is chief-strategic marketing, Trident Ltd, said, "The IT industry is a cornerstone of India's economic growth. In the FY22, the IT sector accounted



for 7.4% of India's GDP, a figure projected to reach 10% by 2025. Gupta highlighted the importance of IT sector in Indian economy. The IT and business process management industries' revenue was

Hike Agniveer quota to 10%, suggests Haryana Cabinet

CHANDIGARH : The Haryana government, in its proposal, had suggested five per cent reservation in jobs across Group A, B, C and D. The Cabinet, which deliberated on the reservation of government jobs for those completing the four-year stint as Agniveers, proposed an enhancement over the proposed quota. The ministers, however, at yesterday's meeting suggested that this be enhanced to 10 per cent in keeping with the reservation policy of the Centre for Agniveers on the completion of their tenure. One of the ministers, during the meeting chaired by Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, said that there should have been prior information of the reservation quota proposal instead of it being tabled at the last minute, sources said. Following this objection, on the instance of the Chief Minister, it was simply opened to deliberations in which the



ministers gave their suggestions. "The underlying idea is that no Agniveer should be unemployed after his four-year stint under the scheme. We are committed to absorbing everyone by bringing this job reservation," a minister said. Downplaying the minister's objection to the tabling of the proposal, another minister said, "It was not said as a complaint. However, the minister had said it as a suggestion to allow better preparation on the proposal since it affects a significant number of families." The proposal for granting horizontal reservation to the Agniveers across

government jobs within the existing quotas but under a new head had been readied for yesterday's Cabinet meeting. However, it ended up as a discussion with the Cabinet unanimous that the Agniveers be accommodated by increasing their job quota. "The new proposal will incorporate the various suggestions and is likely come as an agenda item at the next meeting provided it has been modified," a minister said. In June 2022, the then Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar had said that the Agniveers would be granted government jobs after their term ends.

3 newly elected MLAs sworn in Himachal Pradesh

Mahajan in the Rajya Sabha polls held on February 27. On March 22, the three independents MLAs submitted their resignation and joined the BJP the next day. However, their resignation was accepted by the speaker on June 3. The three Independents were given tickets by the BJP from their respective seats but Ashish Sharma was the only MLA to retain his seats while the other two lost the by-polls to Congress rivals. CM Sukhu accused the BJP of hatching a conspiracy to destabilise the government by horse-trading. In his response, Leader of Opposition Jai Ram Thakur accused the Congress government of winning the by-polls by misusing the official machinery. Sukhu hoped that the BJP would now shun the negative politics and cooperate with the government in pursuing the development agenda.

AMRITSAR : In the annual budget 2024-25, the Municipal Corporation targeted to earn Rs 20 crore from the sale of properties. However, the estate wing of MC is not able to sell the properties without the nod of the government. There are two types of MC properties. It owns 1,055 shops which are sublet to tenants. A number of tenants have been defaulters on rent for the last several years. The MC had proposed that the tenants buy the shops but later cancelled the proposal. There are some other vacant plots of MC, which have been identified for sale. These properties need the government's approval for sale. Though the Local Bodies Department has asked the civic bodies to increase revenue from their own resources, the Amritsar Municipal Corporation has not been able to do so as it failed to sell its properties in the last few years. Selling of

price fixation committee, comprising MLAs and officials of the administration, should fix the rates to get approval from the government. After the formation of the AAP government, the proposal passed in MC House was cancelled. Now, the price fixation committee has not been constituted and even the General House is lying defunct.

Dharminder Jeet Singh, Estate Officer of Municipal Corporation, said, "We don't want to sell our shops, which are on rent. The rent amount has been increased and we are getting good revenue from it. For the sale of vacant plots and properties, we need the government's approval. After the government's nod, the price would be fixed by committee and then the General House will approve it. Until the formation of a new General House, we will not be able to sell properties."

Extortion gang disguises as NIA officers in ZKP

Mohali / Zirakpur: The accused ,fake officers of NIA were identified as Jyoti and Neelam, residents of Geeta Colony, New. Delhi; Dalwinder Singh, a resident of Maloya, Chandigarh; Radhey Shyam from Anandpur Sahib , Punjab; Raj Kumar of New Delhi; Nitesh, a resident of Jhajjar, Haryana, Subhash Chandra, a resident of Sirsa, Haryana; and Sushil Kumar of Jhajjar, Haryana. Mohali police arrested eight people, including two women, for attempting to extort Rs 50 lakh from a property dealer by posing as fake officers of the National (NTA) in Zirakpur. The complainant Verpal r/o Sec 39, a real estate builder disclosed to the caller that he. could arrange only Rs 10



lakh. The accused then told the complainant Veerpal to meet them at Singhpura Chowk in Zirakpur with Rs 10 lakh. After discussing the matter with his family members, Veerpal field a complaint at the Zrakpur police station. After verifying the facts, the police laid a trap. When the complainant arrived at the chowk with the money, he found the eight accused standing there in

two cars. As the accused attempted to take the money from the complainant, the police arrested all eight individuals. The police suspected that the gang might he involved in extorting money from big business. The police produced the accused before the local court and obtained a two day police remand for further interrogation.

PU chancellor must be elected CM , not nominated person: Mann

Chandigarh: The Bill proposing to replace the Punjab governor with the Chief Minister as the chancellor of state universities has been returned by the President of India without her assent last week.

Chief Minister 'remarks came against the backdrop of President Murmu sending back to Punjab the Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2023.

Replying to a question on the Bill, Mann said, "We want that democracy should be of the elected and not selected. If we have to appoint the VC of Punjabi University, we will have to propose three names to the governor saab, and he will choose one out of them of his own choice. Then who made the choice in the end-



the selected or the elected ? One should also be conversant with the culture of the universities. What is Punjabi University's culture, what is the culture of Punjab Agricultural University and other universities " ? said CM.

Taking pot shots at the governor, Mann commented "We had brought the Punjab Universities Laws (Amendment) Bill in the Vidhan Sabha. The assembly had also passed the Sikh

Gurdwaras (Amendment) Bill, 2023.

It was also sent to the President. It means that the governor sends those bills to the President, which he doesn't want to pass. The President then sends them back after four five months. This is our democracy". Mann said such bills, which state that an elected chief minister should be the chancellor, were also brought by the govt in West Bengal and Kerala.

Delegations pledge support to Kamala Harris



Washington : Kamala Harris has secured the support of enough th Democratic delegates to become party's presidential nominee.

U.S. Vice Preagainst former President and Republican nominee Donald Trump, according to an Associated Press survey, as top Democrats rallied to her in the aftermath of U.S. President Joe Biden's decision to drop his bid for re-election.

The quick coalescing behind Ms. Harris marked an attempt by the party to put weeks of drama over Mr. Biden's political future behind them and to unify behind the task of defeating Mr. Trump with just over 100 days until Election Day. Prominent Democratic elected officials, party leaders

and political organisations quickly lined up behind Ms. Harris and her campaign set a new 24-hour record for presidential donations on Monday.

Several State delegations met on July 22 to confirm their support for Ms. Harris, including Texas and her home State of California. By Monday night, she had the support of at least 2,471 delegates, according to the AP tally of delegates, more than the 1,976 delegates she'll need to win on a first ballot. No other candidate was named by a delegate contacted by the AP.

California state Democratic Chairman Rusty Hicks said 75% to 80% of the state's delegation were on a call Tuesday and they unanimously supported Ms. Harris.

Maxi cab sans permit being challaned : RTA

Pkula: Challans are being issued against maxi cabs running in the district without authoritative per mission. During a checking drive, our team raced out that the maxi cabs were carrying people far beyond its capacity "Some cabs were challaned outside schools, where they had gone to drop children," said, RTA secretary Hairatjeet Kaur.

The officer has appealed to parents to send their child ren to school only inregistered school buses, asmaxicab drivers do not have any contract with schools.

The department has started cracking down on drivers who accommodate school children in maxi cabs beyond their capacity, and are running without obtaining permits from RTA office.



In case of any unfortunate mishap takes place involving a maxi cab and the school administration refuses to take responsibility for the lapse . There would be no way out without administrative whip and the legal course of mandatory action Moreover, maxi cabs do not have any kind of security system. Keeping in mind the safety of children, challans are being issued against maxi cabs and other vehicles ferrying school kids. This campaign will continue for

some time. Due to busy lifestyle, many parents are unable to drop their children to school, so in order to provide cheap transportation for their children, they hire maxi cabs." Kaur added. The RTA secretary stressed that parents must also check the condition of vehicles used for this purpose. "Often, drivers cram children into maxi cabs. Due to such carelessness, there is often a risk of accident and disasters take place," bemoaned the secretary.
