Food, Safety goes in doldrums, no action on unsafe, stale sweets

Zirakpur : Under the nose of district food safety authorities, sweets, confectionaries manufactured before 6,7 months old in wholesale quantity are being sold by the unchecked sweets

supplier. Throughout round the year , the sweets, confectioneries are manufactured without any festival demand like Diwali, Holi, Lohri in the calendar year. The despicable phenomenon is deplored by several

sweet retailers since their livelihood is assailed by the unethical big sweets sharks. Taking into consideration, the necessity of providing fresh food was gauged by the parliamentarians who legislated the much sought

after law on food safety , in 2006. The compliance of the act was envisaged to be overseen by the Food Safety Standard Authority of India . Nevertheless the enshrined law has desperately been falling flat

as the there is no raid, check on the defaulters, unscrupulous persons who conveniently trade the business and indulge in corrupt practices, is widely known or why the manufacturing date , expiry is not being dis-

played by the business sharks. After the news publication on the stale food, before 20 days, the fresh recce carried out by the Commissioner News Service, found the very old practice by the multiple sweets manufacturers,

which was disclosed to Dr Amrit Warring, Mohali as well Chandigarh District Food Safety Officer who assured Mr Ravi Nandan , Asst Food Safety Officer would raid the malpractices of the wholesaler

sweets manufacturers. Even after 20 days , no food safety official ever visited the godown area of Zirakpur ,where from truck loads of stale food ,sweets are routed to the markets of tricity. Since the food safety law exists and no raid is carried out , it becomes apparent ,the very minutes of law is being ridiculed by the accountable officials and the diseases like cancer, Asthma , Diarrhoea , Joint Pain, Bronchitis Conjunctivitis are germinated each, every other day

Saif Ali Khan's attacker had stolen diamond ring, shunted out from work

Mumbai : Shariful Islam Shehzad Mohammad Rohilla Amin Fakir, who was arrested for allegedly attacking actor Saif Ali Khan at his Mumbai residence in the wee hours of January 16, was earlier involved in a theft case, investigations have revealed. The accused intruder used to work at a restaurant and pub in the Worli area via a contractor, where he stole a diamond ring, allegedly belonging to one of the customers, in August last year. The incident had come to light after the owner of the ring filed a police complaint and various CCTV cameras were scanned. As Shehzad was found in possession of the ring, he was fired from his job at the pub. Thirty-year-old Shehzad, a Bangladeshi native, was arrest-

ed on Sunday morning from Thane city. Later, a court remanded him in police custody for five days. Now, the police are expected to recreate the crime scene at the Bandra home of Saif Ali Khan, who was repeatedly stabbed. "He entered the duct area, climbed to the 12th floor using a pipe and entered the actor's flat through a bathroom window. He then came out from the bathroom, where the actor's staff spotted him, leading to the chain of events that culminated into the knife attack," sources sensitized. The 54-year-old actor Saif Ali was stabbed multiple times in the attack, after which he underwent a five-hour surgery at nearby Lilavati Hospital and is recovering now.

EPFO members can self amend details by logging into website

New Delhi : EPFO members would be able to correct their address, name, bank details sans nod from their employers. The EPF department has provided the requisite consent for employees' convenience. The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO), the state-backed retirement-savings manager, has rolled out major changes that will simplify key processes for its nearly 70 million subscribers by cutting down

Divergent, sprouting
politics of Punjab

The politics of Punjab may be splintering in many directions — there are as many as three Akali Dals today, ranging from the newly minted Khadoor Sahib MP and radical Sikh leader Amritpal’s ‘Waris Punjab De’ to Simranjit Singh Mann’s Akali Dal (Amritsar), to Badal’s grand old party, which is also internally split; even as disgruntled politicians are party-hopping across the spectrum, mostly in the direction of AAP — but the BJP is still seen as anathema. Party candidates, like former finance minister Manpreet Badal, either lost their deposits or finished last in the recent bypolls.

Why does Punjab fancy itself as the “other pole”, doing exactly the opposite of what Delhi likes to do, the “Akal Takht” versus the “Dilli Takht”? The answer is equally simple. Punjabis believe Delhi either doesn’t care enough, that if it did it would help by working with the state government on fixing its many problems — ranging from the procurement of paddy, and now wheat, to the drones-and-drugs problem, failing law and order plus gangsterism and a million more. But the most important reason why the SGPC — and a large section of unhappy Punjabis — are against the screening of ‘Emergency’ is because they are afraid the film will show Punjab up to the rest of the country and the world “in a bad light” — meaning, as latter-day “Khalistanis”, not much worse than Bhindranwale. The thought that the rest of India could believe that Punjab today may be going back to those awful years because it has elected a radical Sikh jailed under both NSA and UAPA as an MP,

besides the son of Indira Gandhi’s assassin as a second MP — is enough to give the people nightmares. Rebellious, yes, but radical? Truth is, few understand how Punjab turned upon itself during those awful years. (No wonder, Canada beckoned.) And now that nightmare may be back, in technicolour, telling Punjab what’s wrong with it. It’s enough to depress a people. Jagrup Singh Sekhon and Paramjit Singh Judge, two political scientists in Amritsar, who have watched the decline and fall of Punjab these past several decades, speak today of a listlessness, a lack of trust in institutions, an agrarian crisis, an unclear roadmap. “Logon ne dil chhod diya hai,” Sekhon said, the people have lost their will. Judge, more optimistic, insisted that the tide will turn either soon or someday, especially as politics abhors a vacuum. The undercurrent of fear and loathing that has greeted Kangana Ranaut, the actor-director of a biopic on Indira Gandhi, ‘Emergency’, is scaling new unsavoury heights, with the SGPC preventing the film from being screened in theatres even as it was released across the country on Friday. SGPC president Harjinder Singh Dhami is a member of the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) and that the Sikh institution, which celebrates the 100th anniversary of it becoming a legal body — along with the RSS — is still largely controlled by the Sukhbir Badal-led party. You could argue that an SGPC functionary’s description of Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale as “mahaan” or “great”,

even as he illogically explained why the SGPC was boycotting Kangana’s movie — ostensibly because “Sikhs are portrayed in a bad light”, because “Bhindranwale is seen as telling Mrs Gandhi that he will ensure her the Sikh vote, if she gives a separate state”, meaning Khalistan — cannot belong to a world in which fact and fiction are obviously distinct and separate and movies clearly belong to the latter. A Punjab state that is not doing too badly on some parameters — it is certainly able to feed, clothe and educate itself, otherwise its cities and villages wouldn’t be full of immigrants from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar — but where the political sentiment is mostly so overwrought that nothing is really what it seems. Kangana is a polarising figure, critical of the farmer agitation that has been taking place on and off these last several months; a CISF constable even slapped her on this count in June last year.

Second, the farmer protests are back, with farm union leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal’s hunger strike entering its 53rd day, spurring another “marjeevda jatha”, literally, a “do-or-die” group of 111 farmers determined to cross into Haryana and therefore into Delhi, to get their demands fulfilled. But it’s equally clear that the farmers have not been able to capture the imagination of Punjab, like they did four years ago — leave alone that of Delhi — which had then forced PM Modi to withdraw the three farm laws, the only time he has been seen to go back on his own word. Dallewal’s so-called ‘satyagraha’ is failing today because it is largely seen as blackmail.

Chandigarh Mayoral polls be held post January 29, orders High Court

CHANDIGARH : Punjab and Haryana High Court, the Bench of Justice Sureshwar Thakur and Justice Vikas Suri ordered that the elections to be conducted after January 29 as the tenure of the current mayor, Kuldeep Kumar, continues until that date. The notification for the same could be issued prior to January 29.

The High Court on Monday set aside elections schedule for Mayor, Senior Deputy Mayor, and Deputy Mayor in Chandigarh, which were to be held on January 24.

The decision was issued in response to a writ petition filed by Kuldeep Kumar represented by Senior Counsel Gurminder Singh. The court found merit in the argument that conducting elections before the completion of the incumbent mayor’s tenure would be legally untenable.

The court also directed the Chandigarh administration to consider the use of the “show of hands” method for voting during the elections, while referring to concerns regarding transparency and fairness. The administration was also directed to ensure videography of the entire election process enhancing accountability.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) had earlier approached the high court, seeking directions for the Chandigarh administration to ensure transparency in the mayoral polls.

AAP’s councilor from ward number 25 filed the petition demanding, among other things,

that voting be conducted by “show of hands” instead of the secret ballot method.

On January 3, a delegation from AAP, led by Mayor Kuldeep Kumar, met Deputy Commissioner Nishant Kumar Yadav and submitted a memorandum requesting the shift to a show of hands for the election process.

The memorandum referenced the 341st meeting of the General House of the Chandigarh Municipal Corporation, held on October 29, 2024, where a majority vote resolved that Regulation 6 of the Chandigarh Municipal Corporation (Procedure and Conduct of Business) Regulations, 1996, be amended to allow elections for the posts of Mayor, Senior Deputy Mayor, and Deputy Mayor to be conducted through a show of hands to ensure transparency.

Despite this request, the demand has not been accepted by the administrator. The petition referred to the need for a change in the voting process following issues raised during the 2024 mayoral polls. It also sought directions for the installation of CCTV cameras to record the entire voting process to ensure further accountability and transparency.

Rs 10 crore comes alongwith driver unprecedentedly from lottery in Punjab's Rupnagar

Extension provided to “Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme” for one-month

NEW DELHI : The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) extended the due date for determining amount payable from December 31, 2024, to January 31, 2025. The CBDT has put out a notification in this regard on Monday.

For resolving pending appeals, the government has extended by a month the due date in the case of income tax disputes under the Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme.

In the Union Budget for 2024-25, the Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme was initially announced On September 20, the CBDT notified the Scheme that came into force

with effect from October 1. The Scheme provides for lesser settlement amounts for a ‘new appellant’ in comparison to an ‘old appellant’.

Also, it provides for lesser settlement amounts for taxpayers who file declaration on or before January 31, 2025, in comparison to those who file thereafter.

This Scheme is another initiative of the government towards litigation management.

Admn asks GMADA officials to remove sharp curve on Mohali road

MOHALI : The administration has asked GMADA and Mohali traffic police officials to take steps for an early removal of the sharp curve near Gurdwara Mata Sunder Kaur Sahib in Mohali.

During a review meeting of the Traffic Decongestion Committee at the DAC Meeting Hall here, Deputy Commissioner Aashika Jain asked all stakeholders to streamline this stretch of road and make it accident-free.

The S-curve has been

designated a black spot by road safety experts.

In 2009, a portion of the land was not released by the gurdwara, forcing GMADA to make a sharp curve at the time of the construction of Airport Road.

The gurdwara management had reportedly agreed to relocate to another piece of land to be provided by GMADA, allowing the development authority to begin work to straighten the stretch falling on the road separating Sectors 70 and 77, near the Sohana gurdwara light point.

Now, 5 unpaid traffic challans to deprive driving licence : Chandigarh Admn

CHANDIGARH : The UT Administration has determine to issue notices to vehicle owners with five or more unpaid challans asking them to clear their dues within 15 days.

Failing to do so, driving licences of the vehicle owners will be cancelled and their registration certificates (RC) suspended.

Highlighting a significant rise in unpaid 7.5 lakh challans over the years, Registering and Licensing Authority In-charge Pradhuman Singh said, “Despite repeated



reminders and notices, many drivers continue to neglect fines for offenses such as speeding, red light violations, and dangerous driving.”

Pradhuman said the notices would be issued to violators with five or

more unpaid challans, requiring them to pay the penalties within 15 days. Non-compliance will result in the revocation of their driving licences and suspension of their RCs. Additionally, vehicles of defaulters will be flagged as “not to be transacted,” which will block any transactions related to the vehicle. This includes ownership transfers, RC renewals, issuance of duplicate RCs, pollution certificates, and insurance, until all traffic violations are addressed and fines are cleared.

Dallewal surrenders to medical aid, Centre-farmer talks to be held Feb 14

PATIALA : Priya Ranjan, Joint Secretary, Department of Agriculture and Farmer Welfare, at a meeting with Dallewal, invited him for talks on February 14 at the Mahatma Gandhi State Institute of Public Administration, Chandigarh. He said, “I hope Dallewal breaks his fast and participates in the talks.” The date has been chosen keeping in mind the model code of conduct for the February 5 Delhi Assembly elections.

The Centre has invited farm leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who is on a fast unto death for the past 54 days at the Khanauri border, for talks, which may end the year-long farmers’ protest.

Dallewal later agreed to take medical treatment after Kaka Singh Kotra, Abhimanyu Kohar and other farmer leaders made an emotional appeal of going on a fast unto death if he failed to do so.

Soon after, medical teams on

standby started the treatment, said Kotra. Dallewal, however, maintained that he would not take food till the government agreed to a legal guarantee on the MSP.

Kotra said Dallewal had expressed the desire that the first meeting should be held in Chandigarh and the second in Delhi. Hectic activity was witnessed at Khanauri today after the farm bodies protesting on the Punjab border with Haryana said they had got a “decent proposal” from the Centre regarding their demands even as farmer groups could not draw a unity plan during their second round of talks.

Sources said the Centre had put a condition that Dallewal would have to accept treatment if they wanted the proposal to materialise. Earlier, Priya Ranjan visited Khanauri and met Dallewal. After meeting the fasting leader, representatives of the Centre, led by Ranjan, held

nearly two-hour talks with the protesting farmers, following which they made the offer. Without revealing the details of the proposal, farmer leader Kotra said, “We have received a decent proposal and are discussing its modalities.” The sources said former Punjab DIG Narinder Bhargav and former ADGP Jaskaran Singh played a crucial role in arranging the meeting.

This was the first time since February 18 last year when representatives of the Centre held formal talks with the protesting farmer leaders over their demands.

The protesting farmers, led by the Samyukt Kisan Morcha (Non-Political) and the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha, have been protesting at the Shambhu and Khanauri borders since February 13 when their march to Delhi was halted by the security forces.

Panel to redesign traffic police assistance booths

CHANDIGARH : To provide adequate facilities to traffic police personnel, the UT Administration has decided to redesign the traffic assistance booths in the city. It has constituted a three-member committee for the purpose.

During the recent meeting of the District Road Safety Committee, the issue of construction of traffic assistance booths at major intersections in the city was raised. The representative of the Chief Engineer Office said the work had been completed at two places — the Matka Chowk and Sectors 3/4/9/10 chowk. However, the traffic police informed the committee that the exiting booths at the Matka Chowk did not have



sufficient space and a washroom. They said staff, especially female employees, faced a lot of hardship at the booth.

The committee Chairman-Deputy Commissioner, Nishant Kumar Yadav, asked the Chief Architect to redesign the traffic police booths. He constituted a committee comprising a senior architect, the Executive Engineer, Division No. 6, and the DSP Traffic (R&D).

The DC directed the committee to conduct a survey for the redesigning of these booths and submit an action taken report at the next meeting of the committee. A total of eight traffic police assistance booths are to be built in the city.

The Chairman asked the representative of the Chief Engineer Office to look into the matter and provide some solution to eradicate this problem. The representative informed the meeting that a high-level bridge was proposed at the specific location and hiring a consultant was necessary for this proposal. The DC deferred the matter for three months.

80% cheap generic medicine at Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadhi Kendra in Kurali Civil Hospital

MOHALI : The Jan Aushadhi Kendra is the third in the district being operated by the District Red Cross Society. The other two are located at the District Hospital in Mohali and Civil Hospital in Kharar.

Deputy Commissioner (DC) Aashika Jain inaugurated a Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadhi Kendra at the Civil Hospital here.

The newly opened pharmacy store would provide generic medicines at 70 to 80 per cent cheap rates as compared to the market.



The store will be run by the District Red Cross Society. A qualified pharmacist has been hired and will remain present at the store from 9 am to 5 pm.

Besides, a mobile testing van has already been started by the District Red Cross Society.

The special van covers the medical camps being conducted by the District Red Cross

Society with the help of the District Hospital medical team. Similarly, an ambulance service has also been launched at reasonable rates that can be hired by dialling 7087087005 and 8427544403.

Jain assured that a public audit of CHC Kurali was done last year and soon it will get an upgrade as the case has been submitted to the Punjab Government.

The DC also visited the wards and enquired about the wellbeing of the patients and offered blankets for the ward beds.

Worth Rs 20 crore fuel saved by e-buses within 2 years

CHANDIGARH : About 25.28 lakh litres of diesel worth Rs 20.80 crore has been saved within two and a half years by plying electric buses on local routes. Procured in November 2021, 80 electric buses are in service in the tricity at present, said a spokesman of the UT Transport Department.

The electric buses had covered 1.26 crore km till August 16 on intra-city routes, thus saving over 25.28 lakh litres of diesel besides preserving environment. These buses have helped prevent 6674.91 tonne of CO2 emission.

The e-bus fleet of the department included vehicles of Ashok Leyland and Eicher. In order to provide eco-friendly transportation in the city, the department plans to procure 100 more e-buses this year.

The administration has plans to replace the entire fleet of 350



diesel buses of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU), running both on local as well as suburban routes, with electric ones by 2027-28.

Each bus covers a distance of nearly 130 km on a single charge. It takes nearly two hours to fully charge a vehicle. With a seating capacity of 36, a bus can carry a maximum of 54 people at a time.

On an average, each bus covers 200-300 km a day.

The State-Level Steering Committee (SLSC) has decided to replace 100 diesel buses with e-vehicles sanctioned by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs to Chandigarh under the Centre-sponsored PM

e-Bus Sewa Scheme. The ministry will be requested to allocate 80 more buses to the city under this scheme.

Apart from public transport, the share of private electric vehicles (EVs) is also increasing. Since the implementation of the EV Policy in September 2022, as many as 3,281 electric two-wheelers and 114 four-wheelers were registered from September to December in 2022. The highest number of 2,103 electric two-wheelers and 1,013 four-wheelers had been registered in 2023 and 826 two-wheelers and 658 four-wheelers till July 15 this year in the city.

Pre-emptive pardons provided to Gen Milley, Fauci and Jan 6 panel members by Biden

Washington : The US President Joe Biden providing pardons in his final hours of presidency, amount to a stunning flex of presidential power that is unprecedented in recent presidential history.
Biden on Monday issued pre-emptive pardons for General Mark Milley, Dr Anthony Fauci and members of Congress who served on the committee investigating the January 6, 2021, attack on the Capitol as a shield against possible retaliatory action against them by his incoming successor, CNN reported.
The pardons have been issued to protect several critics of US President-elect Donald Trump, including former Republican Representative Liz Cheney, whom Trump has pledged



retribution against.
In a statement issued hours before he is set to welcome Trump to the White House for tea before attending his inauguration, Biden stated, "These are exceptional circumstances, and I cannot in good conscience do nothing."
"Baseless and politically motivated investigations wreak havoc on the lives, safety and financial security of targeted individuals and their families," he noted.
In the final days of presidency, Biden had been weighing issuing the pardons, concerned Trump would seek to prosecute his

critics after he assumes office.
In a statement, Biden explained the reason behind his decision, saying "alarmingly, public servants have been subjected to ongoing threats and intimidation for faithfully discharging their duties."
The recipients of Biden's pardons have faced criticism from Trump and his allies. Anthony Fauci has served as director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infection Disease for several years, including during the outbreak of COVID-19 in Trump's first presidency. General Mark Milley served as Joint Chiefs of Staff chairman during Trump's first term as US President and has called US President-elect a "fascist."

Fund transfer rules simplified by EPFO

NEW DELHI : The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) members with e-KYC EPF accounts (Aadhaar seeded) can file their EPF transfer claims online with Aadhaar OTP (one time password) directly without any need for intervention of the employer.
Over 7.6 crore members of retirement fund body EPFO can now change personal details like name and date of birth online without any verification by the employer or approval by EPFO with the rollout of a new facility on Saturday.
Union Labour and Employment Minister Mansukh Mandaviya introduced the two new services on Saturday.

The minister said around 27 per cent of grievances filed by members are related to member profile/KYC issues and that would see a significant drop after the rollout of the facility.
He also stated that large employers having a huge workload of such requests will also benefit.
This facility will be available for members, whose UAN (universal account number) was issued after October 1, 2017, (when Aadhaar matching was made mandatory).
No supporting document is required in such cases, the minister said.
If the UAN was issued prior to October 1, 2017, the employer can correct details without the EPFO's approval.

Awarding life imprisonment to RG Kar is not suffice, death penalty was justice : Mamta

KOLKATA : Chief Minister, Mamta Banerjee assailed the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) for its probe into the rape-murder of the on-duty medic at the state-run hospital.
Expressing "dissatisfaction" over a Kolkata court awarding life imprisonment to the convict in the RG Kar hospital case, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Monday claimed the probe was "forcibly" taken away from the state police, asserting that had it been with them, they would have ensured a death penalty.
"From day 1, all of us had demanded death sentence, but the court has given life term until death. We still stick to our demand. I can share my party's opinion; the case was forcibly taken from us. Had it been with the (Kolkata) police, we would have ensured that he got death sentence," the CM said.
"We don't know how the



probe was conducted. In many similar cases that were probed by the state police, death penalty was ensured. I am not satisfied... Had it been death penalty, at least my heart would have been somewhat at peace," she said.
The Sealdah court, presided by Additional District and Sessions Judge Anirban Das, on Monday sentenced Sanjay Roy to life imprisonment, after convicting him for the rape and murder of the postgraduate trainee doctor at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital on August 9, 2024.
The ghastly crime had led to unprecedented and prolonged nationwide protests.
Judge Das ruled that the crime did not meet the

criteria for the "rarest of the rare" category, which would have warranted the death penalty.
The chief minister emphasised the severity of the case, stating, "If the verdict had been a death sentence, it would have provided some comfort to our hearts."
The crime warranted the "most severe punishment" Banerjee asserted.
"In the three cases we handled — Jaynagar, Farakka, and Guralp — our police successfully secured death sentences (through proper investigation and filing of chargesheet)," she pointed out, referring to similar rape and murder cases investigated by local authorities.
"The (RG Kar) case was forcibly taken away from us, and I don't know how the CBI fought the case or what arguments they made. It was all managed by the CBI. We want the most severe punishment for such criminals," Banerjee added.

Maha Kumbh's rush surpasses Rio Carnival, Oktoberfest of Brazil, of Germany : UP officials

NEW DELHI : 70 lakh visitors had attended the last Rio Carnival, 25 lakh had gathered for the Haj pilgrimage and 72 lakh celebrated Oktoberfest, said officials of Uttar Pradesh government on Monday.
More visitors will attend the Maha Kumbh 2025 in Uttar Pradesh's Prayagraj than some of the other major global gatherings like Brazil's Rio Carnival and Germany's Oktoberfest.
Visitation at the ongoing Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj is, however, projected at 45 crore, including 15 lakh foreigners.
The officials were speaking at a special briefing MEA and UP government organised today for foreign correspondents covering the largest religious gathering in the world. In the 2019 Kumbh, there



were 25 crore visitors. The officials—Sanjeev Singh, OSD to Chief Minister of UP Yogi Adityanath, Awanish Kumar Awasthi, CM's Adviser, Shishir, Director Information, UP; Mrityunjay Kumar, Media Adviser to the Chief Minister—also said Maha Kumbh was projected to boost the economy up to Rs 2 lakh crore.
Uttar Pradesh's GDP alone is expected to grow by over 1%, with trade in daily essentials projected at Rs 17,310 crore; hotel and travel sectors expected to reach Rs 2,800 crore and religious materials and flowers market projected to

generate Rs 2,000 crore and Rs 800 crore, respectively.
UP's outreach was part of state government's plans to celebrate and project the Maha Kumbh, expected to attract a million devotees from around the world and came a day after a fire at the Maha Kumbh Tent City gutted 18 tents. There were no casualties.
The outreach was organised jointly by the Ministry of External Affairs and Uttar Pradesh government and highlighted the spiritual and cultural significance of the Maha Kumbh scheduled from January 13 to February 26.

Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

GURUGRAM : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city.
The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

Naxalism will be wiped out from country by March 2026: Amit Shah

Shah expressed confidence that the NDA would form the government in Jharkhand, claiming it would win at least 52 out of 81 assembly seats based on the calculations from the recently held Lok Sabha elections.

government from Jharkhand, which is fuelling Naxalism for petty political gains," he said while addressing a rally in Simaria, Chatra district.
"We uprooted the menace from Jharkhand during the last five years, and now the Prime Minister Modi-led Centre will wipe out Naxalism from India by March 2026." Accusing the Soren government of

devouring funds meant for poor and tribals, he said the BJP once voted to power will put all corrupt Jharkhand leaders behind the bars.
"NDA will win 52 seats out of 81 in Jharkhand given people cast 47 per cent votes to the alliance in Jharkhand during the recent Lok Sabha elections," Shah said.
He said the people of Jharkhand gave nine out of 14 parliamentary seats to the NDA, with a total of 80 lakh votes cast in favour of the alliance.
Elections to the 81-member Assembly in the state are set to take place in two phases on November 13 and 20 with the votes to be counted on November 23.
