Nijjar belonged to Khalistan Tiger Force

Commissioner News Service Ottawa :Khalistani activist Nijjar had escaped to Canada on a forged passport in the name of "Ravi Sharma" in 1996 and kept a low profile as a truck driver and a plumber, the dossier said.. He came in touch with Pakistan-based KTF chief Jagtar Singh Tara and visited Pakistan under the cover of being a Baisakhi jatha member in April 2012, it adds. He was radicalised by Tara and cultivated by the Pakistan spy agency Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), with the former imparting him arms and explosives training in 2012 and 2013. The dossier even claims that in 2013, Tara sent the US-based Harjot Singh Birring to Canada to train Nijjar in using a handheld GPS device. In 2015, after the deportation from Thailand,



Nijjar assumed the role of operations chief of KTF Ottawa is yet to provide credible evidence that India was behind the killing of Khalistan Tiger Force terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar, but Canadian intelligence continues to push the narrative of him being the innocent and religious-minded head of Guru Nanak Gurudwara in Surrey, Canada.

Deprive Russia of veto power at UNSC : Zelensky

Commissioner News Service London : President Volodymyr Zelensky of Ukraine speaking before the UN Security Council session on Wednesday, presented his country's 10 point plan to end the war with Russia and called for Moscow to be stripped of its veto power over the Council "it is impossible to stop the war because all actions are vetoed by the aggressor," he said the session was part of the UN General Assembly meeting in the New York, where Zelensky's audience was made up of other global leaders, including allies and representatives of nations that have sat on the fence about Russia's invasion or have learned toward Moscow. Russia's foreign minister, Sergey Lavrov, was not present for the Ukrainian leader's speech. When Lavrov spoke later as justification of his



country's invasion, he reiterated his claims that the West had staged a "coup" in Ukraine to install a pro-Western president. Zelensky had left the chamber by then. / Lavrov accused the US of using the UN to level accusations at countries " who for one reason or another are inconvenient to Washington" He has also complained that France and Germany neglected the Minsk accords intended to bring peace to Ukraine prior to the invasion, and decried US military intervention in Iraq, Afghanistan Libya and else where.

EDITORIAL -

Come election, welfarism begins to make rounds

In the Congress-BJP head-to-head in poll-bound states barring Telangana, where the stage seems set for a triangular contest, the prelude suggests that populism and welfarism might become the dominant themes. Why else would the Centre respond by scaling down the price of cooking gas cylinders by Rs 200 per cylinder after the Congress incessantly called out the Modi government for increasing the cost of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) consumed by households?

In the flush of Chandrayaan 3's success and the leg-up it gave to the BJP's 'nationalism' theme song, it was believed that other issues would get eclipsed in the run-up to the elections. Welfarism might have been the last thought on the mind of the top brass of the BJP and the Modi government, which were literally over the moon after ISRO pulled off the lunar feat. But there was a hard realisation that inflation was an irritant that could not be ignored, more so after the Congress promised to provide LPG cylinders at Rs 500 if voted back to power in MP and the Rajasthan Government reduced the price by Rs 500. Did the BJP intuitively sense that there are limits to its nationalism-themed stories in state elections? The Prime Minister packaged the LPG price cut as his 'gift' to women on Raksha Bandhan, quite like MP Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, who marketed his decision to enhance financial aid for women under the Ladli Behna scheme from Rs 1,000 to Rs 1,250 per month as his rakhi offering.

But in the BJP's political schema, be sure that bread and butter — or rather dal-roti — will eventually be anchored in emotions because

welfarism cannot exist in a vacuum for the party. The Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana was touted as one of the Centre's stellar pro-poor programmes, considering that LPG is the primary cooking fuel for nearly 50 per cent rural and 90 per cent urban families. The latest price cut will be in addition to the existing Rs 200 subsidy per cylinder that effectively ensures relief of Rs 400 per cylinder to about 10 crore Ujjwala beneficiaries. Rajasthan is among the poll-bound states which adopted the labharthi idea in its entirety to buck the negatives created by factionalism within the Congress, the threat to Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot by his rival, Sachin Pilot, the possibility of a revolt among certain major castes and the history of a dispensation change because in each election voters pitilessly throw out the incumbent. Gehlot hosted back-to-back labharthi festivals where in video conferences he asked women voters if his welfare programmes reached them or not. The CM is apparently cognisant of the fact that his flagship Mukhyamantri Nishulk Dava Yojana, which sought to distribute generic drugs free of cost among the poor, flopped and denied him a second term in the 2013 elections. There was a perception that his government did not adequately publicise the merits of the scheme. Therefore, this time, Gehlot did what the BJP expertly does — publicise the bag of goodies unrolling every now and then. On the face of it, the rationale of his latest smartphone scheme for women makes abundant sense. It could potentially afford better access to online educational resources to children and make

women less dependent on the family's male members to use phones. Voters sometimes react similarly to the volatility in their lives triggered by inflation and unemployment. Welfare sops are intended to counter the negative fallout of price rise and the lack of jobs in the BJP-ruled states, while each time a Congress government announces a scheme for women or students, it can justifiably sniff at the BJP's boast, regardless of whether it brings in electoral dividends. The BJP's sole benefaction to the current dissatisfaction over price rise and job losses is enshrining labharthi in precept and practice, wherever necessary. A certain winning template might work in circumstances that need not necessarily be replicated in other conditions. In UP, the Opposition was fragmented and largely defensive while answering the BJP's rhetoric. The BJP tried to communalise Karnataka, but it only gave a huge fillip to the Congress's welfare-centred campaign. Are the labharthis back in fashion ahead of five significant state elections spanning north/central India (Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh), North-East (Mizoram) and the south (Telangana)? Madhya Pradesh has nothing in common with Mizoram. Mizoram, where the ruling dispensation is backed by the BJP, is in the throes of a social churn caused by ethnic and religion-propelled violence in next-door Manipur. The only thread that can potentially bind the voters of each state is the scepticism and doubts over the notion of the BJP's 'double-engine sarkar' that was halted in its tracks in Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka.

Draft guildlines and rules to come up for Spa centres functioning

CHANDIGARH : Acting on the news items regarding flesh trade rackets operating out of spa centres, UT Home Secretary Nitin Kumar Yadav directed the officers to put up draft guidelines and rules for approval of the UT Administration within a month. Mr Yadav has directed the Deputy Commissioner and the SSP to study the



guidelines and rules framed by other states and UTs with regard to the registration and operation of spa centres. After observing that cases under the Immoral Trafficking Act are rising in Chandigarh, the Punjab

and Haryana High Court has also suggested that the authorities should contemplate formulating guidelines for the operation of spa/massage centres, similar to those framed by the Delhi Government.

Lodge FIR against Congress Chief for castigating PM and CM : Speaker

CHANDIGARH : Against the objectionable words spoken by Congress state president Uday Bhan targeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar. Haryana Legislative Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta condemned the statement of and demanded his arrest. Mr Gupta said Congress leaders neither knew the dignity of constitutional posts nor the dignity of language. He said the Congress and its leaders had now become irrelevant among the people so they were now resorting to cheap politics to remain in the news.

Furthermore, Gupta said Bhan had used objectionable words against Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar. "This has hurt the sentiments of the electorate of the state and country. For this, a case should be registered against him and he should be arrested. Congress parliamentary party chief Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi should also apologise for this." Gupta said PM Modi and Khattar had dedicated everything for the society, while living the life of an ascetic. "It is the result of the PM's big vision that he has emerged as a global leader."

No registration of non-electric 2-wheelers by UT from October

CHANDIGARH : According to the target, only 12,076 two-wheelers running on ICE are to be registered in the city till December this year. After achieving the number, their registration will be stopped and only electric two-wheelers will be registered. Since April, as many as 11,254 two-wheelers have been registered to date. In such a situation, only 822 non-electric two-wheelers can be registered now. The UT Administration has decided to halt the registration of internal combustion engine (ICE) two-wheelers once the target fixed for 2023 in the revised Electric Vehicle (EV) Policy is achieved, most likely in the first week of October. Similarly, the Administration will stop the registration of four-wheelers running on internal combustion engine (ICE) (petrol/diesel) once the target is achieved, which is likely to be attained by December this year. According to the target, only 15,465 four-wheelers running on ICE are to be registered by the end of this year. As many as 12,937 four-wheelers have been registered to date in the city. In such a situation, only 2,528 non-electric four-wheelers can be registered as of now. Pradhuman Singh, Registering and Licensing Authority (RLA), UT, said the



registration of non-electric two-wheelers would not be done by the office of the RLA once the target of 12,076 non-electric two-wheelers was achieved. Similarly, registration of four-wheelers would not be done once the target of 15,465 non-electric four-wheelers was achieved for this calendar year. After backlash from stakeholders, the UT Administration had revised its Electric Vehicle (EV) Policy in the first week of July and reduced the registration target for electric two-wheelers. The target had been reduced to 35 per cent from the previous 70 per cent to be achieved in 2023-24. However, the new targets have to be achieved in the calendar year instead of the financial year. This means, 65 per cent non-electric two-wheelers can be registered in 2023. Earlier in June, the Administration had decided to stop the registration of non-electric two-wheelers on achieving the target of 6,202 in 2023-24 financial year.

Annual shopping fest begins in Sector 22 D

CHANDIGARH : Annual festival would be inaugurated by UT Adviser Dharam Pal while Mayor Anup Gupta would be present on the occasion. There would be a live performance by Kanhaiya Mittal said, the Sector 22-D Market Welfare Association president, Arvind Jain. The Sector 22-D shopping fest, an annual affair to mark the start of the festive season, is

set to get underway from Sunday. The festival will conclude on January 1, 2024. He said there would be 31 prizes for shoppers, which included seven cars and eight refrigerators for coupon holders, which shoppers would get on purchases of Rs 2,000 or above. The shopping volume to become eligible for a coupon should be Rs 10,000 or above at any jewellery shop.

Rs 68,000 crore being invested annually in Canadian education by students from Pb.

CHANDIGARH : The investment in Canadian Education by student of Punjab becomes an outflow of a staggering Rs 68,000 crore each year, Khalsa Vox reported. According to the Khalsa Vox, last year total 226,450 visas were approved by Canada under the Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), and a significant portion, approximately 1.36 lakh students, hailed from Punjab. These students are pursuing various courses with an average duration of two to three years. The growing tensions between India and Canada have raised concerns among parents about the hefty investments in their children's education in Canada. The current data from student visa processing agencies suggest that around 3.4 lakh Punjabi students are studying in various educational institutions across Canada.



As per the Khalsa Vox, the Chairman of the Association of Consultants for Overseas Studies, Kamal Bhumla said, "Based on the figures available to us, nearly 60 per cent of Indians migrating to Canada are Punjabi, accounting for an estimated 1.36 lakh students who went last year. On average, each student pays approximately 17,000 Canadian dollars in annual fees, in addition to depositing 10,200 Canadian dollars as Guaranteed Investment Certificate (GIC) funds." He informed that only 38,000 Punjabis were applying for Canada each year until 2008 but the numbers are now booming at multiple folds pace. A senior official from a prominent forex company in

Jalandhar added, "We often observe that the average expenditure incurred by Punjabi parents to send their children to Canada on a student visa amounts to approximately Rs 20 lakh per year. Extrapolating from this data, it is safe to estimate that there are at least 3.4 lakh Punjabi students in Canada, collectively contributing Rs 68,000 crore annually to the Land of the Maple Leaf." The Khalsa Vox publication reported that the surge of Punjabi students on Canadian campuses is a noteworthy trend, with nearly 60 per cent of all Indian students moving to Canada being of Punjabi origin. Approximately 1.36 lakh Punjabi students made the journey to Canada last year, with each student paying an average annual fee of amount 17,000 Canadian dollars as stated by the Chairman of the Association of Consultants for Overseas Studies, Kamal Bhumla.

e-appointment and tatkal e-appointment to become fast reality at Tehsil level

CHANDIGARH : The number of normal slots for the registration of sale deeds has been increased from 100 to 200 at all tehsils and sub-tehsils all over the state except Gurugram. In Gurugram, the number of normal e-appointments will be 300 daily, up from existing 100 e-appointments. Property transactions across Haryana are set to be hassle-free and fast with the BJP-JJP government deciding to significantly increase the number of e-appointments and tatkal e-appointments for the registration of property at all tehsils and sub-tehsils. For the tatkal e-appointments, the number has gone up to 50 per day from 10 all over the state. For Gurugram, this number would be hiked from 10 to



60 daily. "The decision to increase the e-appointments has been taken keeping in view the volume of land registration work and in public interest," a senior officer stated. With a spurt in the property registrations, especially in National Capital Region (NCR), buyers and sellers were facing lot of problems in getting immediate appointment for the registration of sale deeds. "In wake of the limited slots, getting even tatkal e-appointments was a difficult task," Suresh Aggarwal, president of the Haryana

Property Consultants Federation, said. Aggarwal added that the increase in the number of slots in both the categories of e-appointments and tatkal e-appointments would provide much-needed relief to property buyers and sellers. Besides, providing relief to the property buyers and sellers, the decision will net more revenue for the state exchequer as the stamp duty from the registration of the sale deeds will triple in the Gurugram and double in the rest of the state. As far as e-appointments are concerned, the state exchequer will be richer by five times in the rest of the state and six times in Gurugram district. The state government charges Rs 25,000 for e-appointment.

Over Rs 19 lakhs unpaid bill steers judiciary to order auction of hotel guests' cars on Oct 18

CHANDIGARH : In the order, the court had observed that the application filed by Bansal for staying the proceedings of the execution already stood infructuous as the separate application filed by him under Order 9 Rule 13 of CPC had been dismissed by the court. Rahul Garg, Civil Judge Senior Division, Chandigarh, has issued orders for the auction of Audi and Chevrolet Cruze of two defaulters guests who had left Hotel Shivalikview, run by CITCO, without clearing bills of over Rs 19 lakh four years ago. Earlier this year, the auction of the vehicles was stayed by the court on February 13 on an application of one of the defaulter guests, Ramnik Bansal. The court has issued the schedule for the auction. It will take place on October



18 this year. For this, munadi/affixation will be held on September 28. The bailiff has been directed to submit the report of the auction on October 30. The high-end Audi Q3 35 TDI and a Chevrolet Cruze of the alleged defaulters have been lying in front of the hotel for around four years. As per the petition filed before the court, CITCO had alleged that two guests Ashwani Kumar Chopra and Ramnik Bansal stayed in the hotel in 2018 for months without paying the bills.

Both the guests stayed in different suites of the hotel and enjoyed services like food, laundry, hard drinks etc. Later, the guests gave three cheques to the hotel each for Rs 6 lakh. However, all cheques were allegedly dishonoured. When one of the guests was trying to flee from the hotel without making the payment, the hotel security closed the exit gates. The guest parked his Audi Q3 car in the parking area of the hotel and asked CITCO to keep its keys as security against the amount payable by them. Another guest also gave the keys of his Chevrolet Cruze car to the hotel staff and assured to clear all dues. The authorities tried their best to recover the dues through talks, but they moved court when all their efforts failed.

Sans visa, Israeli citizens to travel to US : Biden

WASHINGTON : It may be noted the Department of US Homeland Security administers the program, which currently allows citizens of 40 mostly European and Asian countries to travel to the U.S. for three months without visas. The Biden administration is now poised to admit Israel this week into an exclusive club that will allow its citizens to travel to the United States without a U.S. visa despite Washington's ongoing concerns about the Israeli government's treatment of Palestinian Americans. U.S. officials say an announcement of Israel's entry into the Visa Waiver Program is planned for late in the week, just before the end of the federal budget year on Saturday, which is the deadline for Israel's admission without having to requalify for eligibility next year. Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas is set to make the announcement Thursday, shortly after receiving a recommendation from Secretary of State Antony Blinken that Israel be admitted, according to five



officials familiar with the matter who spoke on condition of anonymity because the decision has not yet been publicly announced. Blinken's recommendation is expected to be delivered no later than Tuesday, the officials said, and the final announcement will come just eight days after President Joe Biden met with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in New York on the sidelines of the U.N. General Assembly. The leaders did not raise the issue in their brief remarks to reporters at that meeting but it has been a subject of intense negotiation and debate for months. Israel's admission into the program has been a priority for successive Israeli leaders and will be a major accomplishment for Netanyahu, who has sparred frequently with the Biden

administration over Iran, the Palestinian conflict and most recently a proposed remake of Israel's judicial system that critics say will make the country less democratic. Netanyahu's far-right government has drawn repeated U.S. criticism over its treatment of Palestinians, including its aggressive construction of West Bank settlements, its opposition to Palestinian statehood and incendiary anti-Palestinian comments by senior Cabinet ministers. The U.S. move will give a welcome boost at home to Netanyahu. He has faced months of mass protests against his judicial plan and is likely to come under criticism from the Palestinians, who say the U.S. should not be rewarding the Israeli government at a time when peace efforts are at a standstill.

said, adding that this would be the right time to hold elections. The NRI Sabha works under the patronage of the government of Punjab and its main aim is to work for the welfare and interests of the NRIs from Punjab. The main objective of NRI Sabha is to redress the grievances of migrant Punjabis, protect their rights and properties. The NRI Sabha Punjab is

a society registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860 with the approval of the government of Punjab and the chief minister is the chief patron of this sabha. The commissioner of Jalandhar division is the chairman of the sabha, while deputy commissioners are the chairpersons of its district units.

India accuses Canada for providing safe haven for Khalistanis : Report

WASHINGTON : The allegations of killing Khalistani extremist on Canadian soil have infuriated India, which rejected the allegations as "absurd" and "motivated" and expelled a senior Canadian diplomat in a tit-for-tat move to Ottawa's expulsion of an Indian official over the case. India also accused Canada of being a safe haven for terrorists. Nijjar, the chief of the banned Khalistan Tiger Force (KTF), was killed in Surrey in British Columbia on June 18. India had designated Nijjar as a terrorist in 2020. The United States has urged India to cooperate with Canada in its investigations. The US provided Canada with intelligence after the killing of Sikh separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar, but communications intercepted by Ottawa were more definitive and led it to accuse India of orchestrating the plot, The New York Times (NYT) has reported citing sources.



The report came on Saturday as the top US diplomat in Canada confirmed that there was "shared intelligence among Five Eyes partners" that had prompted Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's offensive allegation against India in the killing of a Khalistani extremist on Canadian soil. "In the aftermath of the killing, US intelligence agencies offered their Canadian counterparts context that helped Canada conclude that India had been involved," the NYT reported, quoting unnamed allied officials as saying. Yet what appears to be the "smoking gun," intercepted communications of Indian diplomats in Canada indicating involvement in the plot, was gathered by Canadian officials, allied officials said.

Drone smuggling narcotics shot down by BSF near International Border

CHANDIGARH : During evening hours, of September 23, BSF located the movement of a drone near Mahawa village and intercepted it by shooting at it, said a BSF officer. The Border Security Force shot down a drone smuggling narcotics along the International Border in the Amritsar sector on Saturday evening.

A joint search with counter intelligence team and the Punjab Police was carried out in the depth area and the downed drone along with a packet containing about 500 grams narcotics was found from the paddy fields on the outskirts of the village, he added. The recovered drone is a China-made Quadcopter DJI Mavic-3 Classic series.

9 Vande Bharat trains with innovative features roll out

UDAIPUR : Prime Minister Narendra Modi flagged off 9 Vande Bharat Express trains on Sunday carry a host of innovative features incorporated after passengers' feedback to make the journey more comfortable. From improvising the seat reclining angle to incorporating deep wash basins to avoid water from splashing out, the coach manufacturers have paid attention to minute details. The railways also rolled out its first orange coloured Vande Bharat Express from Kasargod to Thiruvananthapuram, a high demand route which now operates two such trains, a senior Indian Railways official said. Over the next two months, nine more orange coloured Vande Bharat Express trains are expected to be rolled out. Among the new features introduced on the trains based on passenger feedback are: the seat reclination angle raised



from 17.31 degrees to 19.37 degrees, hardness of cushion optimised and the colour of seat in executive class coach changed from red to pleasant blue. The changes also include improved accessibility of mobile charging point under the seats, extended footrest for seats and magazine bags for executive class coach-end seats as well. The improved features also include increase in the wash basin depth to avoid splashing of water in lavatories, lighting in toilets improved from 1.5 watts to 2.5 watts, toilet handle given additional bend for improved grip and water tap aerator to better water flow

control. The new features include provision for securing points for wheel chairs of Divyangjan passengers in driving trailer coaches. The new trainsets also have improved air tightness for better air-conditioning with insulation over panels, better roller blind fabric with more tear strength with less transparency and smooth touch controls for luggage rack lights by changing from resistive touch to capacitive touch. The trains also have improved aerosol based fire detection and suppression system inside the coaches.

Vietnam to launch more jet services, to open route for Tiruchirappalli-Ho Chi Minh City from November

Ho Chi Minh City (Vietnam) : A new route connecting Tiruchirappalli (Tamil Nadu) and Ho Chi Minh City is expected to be launched this November, airline authorities said here. As Vietnam is largely becoming an emerging tourism destination for Indian travellers, Vietjet, the country's largest private carrier, is getting ready to tap this growing interest by expanding its service to India connecting more cities. Direct flight services from Kerala's Kochi to Ho Chi Minh City had already been launched by the private carrier from Cochin International Airport in August. A senior airline official said here that Vietjet currently has 32 return flights servicing India each week. "From November, Vietjet is expected to launch a new route connecting Tiruchirappalli and Ho Chi Minh City and we have plans to have an initial frequency of three return flights per week, in order to meet rising demand from travellers in both countries," the official, who doesn't want to be named, said. Vietjet would like to eventually expand its services to all capital



cities in India, he said. The official was speaking in Ho Chi Minh City during a recent interaction with a select media delegation from India. Explaining reasons for their plan to increase its connectivity, he said Vietnam is an emerging tourism destination for Indian travellers, while many Vietnamese are also very curious to explore one of oldest civilisations in Asia. "Vietjet's entry into the market has increased the total number of passengers travelling between Vietnam and India in the first six months of 2023 to over 3 lakh, nearly five times higher than 70,000 passengers recorded in the same period last year," he said. In particular, for routes connecting to Ho Chi Minh City, we have seven round-trip flights from Ahmedabad weekly, and four round-trip flights from Delhi, Mumbai and

Kochi, respectively, he said. For routes connecting to Hanoi, there are seven round-trip flights weekly from Ahmedabad, three round-trip flights from Delhi and another three from Mumbai, he further said. When asked how Vietjet's expansion would benefit the Indian economy, the official said the airline's new routes would deliver sustainable growth in tourism, trade and economy in both Vietnam and India. "Our commitment and passion is to make air travel more affordable for both Vietnamese and Indian people, help stimulate bilateral growth in tourism, trade and economy, and maintain and grow our presence in the Indian market while ensuring quality service to meet Indian demand," he added. Further explaining their future plans for Indian passengers, the official said Vietjet recently added a seventh A330 to its fleet to meet demand in the region. By the end of 2023, the airline expects to have a total of 10 A330s, he added. Vietjet has been operating for over a decade with around 450 flights daily across 120 routes connecting Vietnam with other countries across Asia and Australia.

Zelensky tries to motivate
US politicians for war aid

Washington : US president Joe Biden has been working to shore up support in Congress for an additional \$24 billion in military and humanitarian aid for Ukraine at a time when some Republican lawmakers are growing in creasingly skeptical Kyiv's slow moving counteroffensive "if we don't get the aid , we will lose the war " Zelensky said in a meeting with at least 50 senators, as recounted afterward by the Senate majority leader, Chuck Schumer. House Republican leaders had promised tough questions for Zelensky on his plans for winning Ukraine's counteroffensive against in vading, Russian forces Zelensky "conceded that it's tough, very tough to



overcome entrenched defences," Independent Senator Angus King said," They believe they will make slow but steady progress, but it's not going to be quick." Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelensky made a whirlwind return visit to Washington on Thursday to shore up US support for Ukraine, delivering an upbeat message on the war's progress while facing new questions about the flow of American dollars that for 19 month has helped

keep his troops in the fight against Russian forces. Zelensky came to the Capitol with a firm message in private talks with Republican and Democratic leaders . The Ukrainians have a solid war plan and "they are winning " lawmakers quoted him as assuring them , at a time that the world is watching Western support for Kyiv. Zelensky trip happening at a critical time Ukraine struggles to break through Russian frontlines in a counteroffensive being fought in the south and east, before the start of winter brings fighting to a standstill the US has been sent some \$113 billion in security and humanitarian aid to help Zelensky's government since Russia in vaded in February 2022.

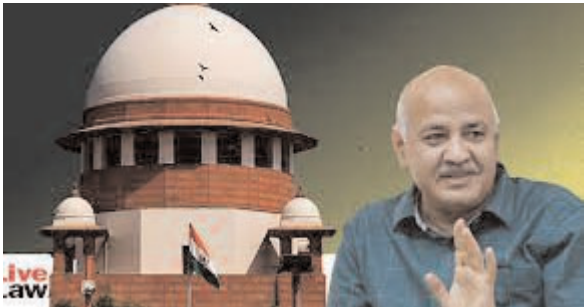

SC procrastinates hearing on
Sisodia bail pleas to Oct 4

New Delhi : At the outset of Sisodia bail application , a bench of justices Sanjiv Khanna and S V N Bharti said that hearing in the case will take time and it can be done at end of the board or some other day .As senior Advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, counsel for Sisodia , and Additional Solicitor General S V Raju agreed that matter be posted for another day, the bench posted it in October. The Supreme Court deferred till October 4 the hearing on the bail plea of former Delhi deputy CM Manish Sisodia who has been in custody since February 26 in a corruption and money laundering case relating to Delhi excise policy. Singhvi brought to the



court's attention that reports on his client are published whenever the case is listed in the court to influence the proceedings. The bench however said newspaper reports cannot influence the court proceedings. We have to get used to it the court said Singhvi also pleaded that the petition be heard and decided at the earliest as there is emergency situation and urgent attentions required . Sisodia approached the apex court after his bail plea in both the cases probed by CBI and ED

- was denied by the Delhi High Court. He also pleaded for interim bail to take care of his wife who is not well and suffering from an auto immune disease. Challenging the Delhi high court order, Sisodia in his petition alleged that nothing was found against him to prove that he either demanded or accepted bribe and that the decision to change policy was taken after consultation with all persons concerned including the Lieutenant Governor of Delhi.

Anup Gupta on Friday laid the foundation stone of the park at sector 22- D, in the presence of MC commissioner Anindita Mitra, and area councilor Daranpreet Singh. The park, to be made in a0.65 - acre area for Rs 1.23 crore will have disabled - friendly activities and will be completely wheelchair friendly.
