## Sans chlorination, infected water being supplied to residents

Zirakpur : Unlike neighbouring sector of Panchkula there has been no adequate provision of chlorinating the ground water fetched by tube wells in the jurisdictional territory of the Municipal Council in the local town. The civic body in the town has nevertheless over 122 prolific tube

wells in its kitty. Yet no care on the supply of polluted water being offered. One can see the Bartana town touching the border of Sector 19 Panchkula, where permanent staff quarter for pump operator has been facilitated to ensure periodical supply with good quality and quantity of chlorine for safe potable water for the

masses of exclusively Sector 19, Panchkula. Here, in Zirakpur, besides Chlorine, Sodium Chloride and sodium hypochlorite which do act as agents for disinfecting and sanitising the process, the task here seems to be herculean as the intent to supply the safe water is sadly missing.

The whole of the Zirakpur town is left to drink unsafe water where no chlorine arrangement are made available. Way back, the municipal body was formed during 2000, initially water pipeline were dug across the town. It is now beyond 22 years gone by, pipe lines are rusted with metals, worn out quality, with leaking

holes. Along sides of water pipelines, sewerage pipe are juxta positioned perhaps for want of space. Recently, in Pabhat, sewer water got mixed due to the persistent leakages of old worn out pipes. Often the sewer leakage problems are reportedly brought into the notice,

where from durable measures are not adopted and polluted water remains there for the consumption of local residents. Plethora of ailments like diarrhoea, vomiting, typhoid, jaundice, kidney and liver follow after the forced supply of polluted water is channelised for consumption.

The two decades old sewer lines are packed with the slush and foul odour may be seen, consequently blockade gives the way to spill onto the open way, laments Sukhdev Choudhry, the President of local Residents Welfare and Joint Action Committee. Mr Choudhary suggests safe drinking water must

be supplied to the local residents who have been inhabiting the town for the past over 20 yrs. In the neighbourhood Panchkula and Chandigarh safe water is being provided for the human consumption. Despite many efforts no contact could be made with the Executive Officer, Ravneet Singh.

The present mobility plan has been divided into 3 phases, where 1 st phase would stand completed by 2027, second by 2037 and 3 rd would be accomplished by 2052. Finally component and sub component wise financial details have been prepared. The entire drawn out plan has a financial budget of total Rs 16509 Crores. The Union Territory would however ,as per the Comprehensive Mobity Plan, spend a maximum amount of Rs 8289 Crores by the end of the third phase in its sole jurisdiction, to be followed by Mohali with Rs 6427 Crores and Panchkula with total expenditure of Rs 1793 Crores

EDITORIAL —

Sponsoring cross border terrorism becoming scourge

Pakistan has barely enough foreign exchange reserves to cover one month's imports. Even its 'all-weather friend' China has provided only token assistance in foreign exchange. The Chinese remain insistent on a direct presence and use of their equipment and personnel in all projects they undertake. Pakistan, moreover, has to repay Chinese loans in convertible currencies. International aid would not be available to Pakistan unless stringent IMF conditions are accepted. Even friendly oil-rich countries such as Saudi Arabia and the UAE would provide only token assistance. They will, however, await clearance from the IMF before loosening their purse strings. Pakistan is fortunate that Shehbaz Sharif, whose family has long-time ties with the Saudi monarchy, is the incumbent PM. Saudi generosity may not have been forthcoming at all had Imran been at the helm now. Pakistan's General Election is scheduled to be held around October. But, in the meantime, the army, led by Gen Syed Asim Munir, who loathes Imran, appears set to send the ex-PM and his remaining loyal followers to jail. The army has assumed powers to try errant civilians. Imran is himself out on bail in a corruption case. Pakistan's Chief Justice, who is believed to have presidential ambitions, is among the few who will make every effort to save Imran from imprisonment. The Chief Justice continues to approve release on bail of Imran's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf Party (PTI) members who have been charged with criminal offences.

But the determination of Gen Munir to get Imran convicted and debarred from politics is forcing influential politicians to defect from the PTI. The heat on Pakistan by the IMF has made potential donors hold back on disbursement of aid. A senior IMF official recently noted that it is essential for Pakistan to undertake some painful reforms to clear the way for IMF assistance. Pakistan's economy has grown at an estimated 0.3 per cent in 2022-23, with its per capita income falling last year. It is clear that in these circumstances, Pakistan will be compelled to be careful in sponsoring cross-border terrorism in India. Gen Bajwa had noted that such sponsorship of terrorism has resulted only in greater problems on Pakistan's borders and in Islamabad's ties with the international community. He was thereby acknowledging that Pakistan already had serious problems related to Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan and Baloch separatists. Not surprisingly, Pakistan alleges Indian involvement in these developments. Pakistan has taken note of the appreciation that Afghans and even the Taliban leadership have voiced for the vital supplies of wheat that India has been providing through Iran's Chabahar port. Dealing with Pakistan cannot be decoupled from problems India has on its borders with China. Beijing is evidently determined to build up Pakistan's maritime and air power. But the present situation across Beijing's western borders, where Pakistan is on the verge of bankruptcy, does give India more strategic space to deal with cross-LAC issues. External

Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has asserted that the relationship with China cannot be normalised till the Chinese move back from territories they entered and occupied in Ladakh. It would be interesting to observe President Xi Jinping's approach during the G20 Summit in New Delhi later this year. His presidency has been marked by continuing border tensions with India. This has led to India and the US agreeing to increasingly cooperate in dealing with the growing Chinese military power across the Indo-Pacific. This is evident from US Secretary of Defence Lloyd Austin's visit to India and the forthcoming visit of PM Narendra Modi to Washington. Pakistan has long remained an 'international economic basket case', heavily dependent on foreign aid and doles, more so after the Covid pandemic. The country's economy has been in constant crisis. During his tenure as PM, an egotistic and arrogant Imran Khan was unable to sustain or build a national political consensus on his foreign and domestic policies. He offended friends and foes alike, while Pakistan's economy inevitably headed for collapse. A Pakistani friend remarked recently that his country required a Dr Manmohan Singh to pull them out of trouble! Internationally, Imran remains disliked by the West, given his Islamist propensities. He continues to be disliked by some of Pakistan's Arab friends, notably Saudi Arabia. His move to build bridges with Moscow came too late, just when his domestic political base was shrinking.

RERA exhorts builders to register within a month or face penalty

**CHANDIGARH :** "If developers or builders fail to register their projects, the authority will take notice of the complaints received against any unregistered project, get it verified and take action accordingly," said an official. Requisite action would be initiated against plotting being carried out on agricultural land. To protect the interests of buyers in real estate, the Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA), Chandigarh, has asked developers, builders, etc., to register their projects with RERA in a month or face a penalty. So far, only six projects have been registered in the city. According to a public notice issued by RERA, real estate projects developed or being developed by promoters, builders, developers, individually or in collaboration, anywhere in Chandigarh for the purpose of sale or long lease, require compulsory registration with RERA before advertisement, marketing, booking, selling or offering for sale or inviting any person to purchase in any manner as per Section 3 of the Real Estate (Regulatory Development) Act, 2016. As many as four categories of projects fall under the Act — any real estate project being developed in full or part, either by making flats or floors or apartments or shops or commercial/office units, godown, etc., on a plot size of more than 500 sq m; any real estate project that entails construction of more than 8 flats, floors, apartments, shops, commercial/office units, godown, etc., on any size of plot; any real estate project envisaging plotting on land area of more than 500 sq m; and any real estate project falling in the above categories in respect of which completion certificate was not issued by the competent authority on or before April 30, 2017. An official stated that failure to register such projects with RERA will invite a penalty up to 10% of the estimated cost of the project as per the Act. Buyers purchasing any flat, floor, apartment, shop, office/commercial space, godown, etc., in real estate project falling in any of the categories mentioned in the Act must ensure that the project is registered with RERA, Chandigarh, to prevent fraud and delays.

Court summons RO firm's regional head on August 10

Puneet was working as the distributor of Kent RO Purifiers. In the application, he said accused Rakesh Sharma visited his office. After discussion, Puneet started purchasing Kent RO from accused against advance payments. He claimed that Rakesh asked him to deposit Rs 8.70 lakh for release of 60 units of water purifier. He deposited the total amount against two bills on September 19, 2019. He said after the receipt of payment, the accused neither sent the goods nor refunded the amount against two invoices. He said the invoice was also cancelled. He said a complaint was made

## SGPC threatens to begin agitation against amended Gurdwaras Act

**AMRITSAR :** The SGPC has asked the Punjab government not to interfere in the religious affairs of the Sikhs. The house also asked the government to withdraw the amendment or be ready to face a "morcha". The SGPC general house unanimously rejected the AAP government's amendment to the Sikh Gurdwaras Act, 1925, to allow free telecast of the Gurbani from the Golden Temple. Interestingly, the SGPC got support even from non-SAD members of the house. Bibi Jagir Kaur, who had contested against SAD-backed Harjinder Singh Dhami during the election for the post of the SGPC chief on November 9, supported the SGPC on the issue. In her address to the house, she endorsed the ending of the monopoly of the telecast of the Gurbani from the Golden Temple. Asserting



that Panthic values could not be ignored for a family, she favoured setting up of own channel by the SGPC. Balwinder Singh Bains, another opposition member, also flayed the interference of the government in SGPC matters. Dhami said the SGPC would first adopt constitutional means to oppose the AAP government's move. On setting up of a channel of the SGPC to telecast the Gurbani live from the Golden Temple, he said a sub-committee had been formed earlier to decide on the issue. The SGPC president announced that the house had decided to proceed legally against the

amendment to the Sikh Gurdwaras Act. The general house, convened under the leadership of Dhami, passed five resolutions. Two resolutions sought public apologies from Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann and AAP MLA Budh Ram for their alleged remarks hurting Sikh sentiments. In another resolution, it termed the Bill as a direct attack on the jurisdiction and independence of the SGPC. A resolution said under Section 72 of the Punjab Reorganisation Act, 1966, any amendment to the 1925 Act could only be accepted after approval of the SGPC general house.

## With 30% rebate one can deposit property tax till July 31

## Woman electrocuted at New Delhi Railway Station

"The police team led by ASI Gaikwad reached the spot and took her to Lady Hardinge hospital along with Ahuja's sister Madhvi Chopra where doctors declared her dead. The body was shifted to a mortuary. After this, Chopra filed a complaint alleging negligence by authorities," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Railways) Apoorva Gupta.

## Plausible deniability to Russian presi by Wagner Group

Moscow : The attempted coup in Russia means for Vladimir Putin and the Ukraine war. The short-lived insurrection could still be a turning point in the war but how it will shift the conflict is still uncertain.

## German Court Denies Indian Baby's Custody To Parents

Berlin : A court in Berlin's Pankow has denied the custody of 27-month-old Ariha Shah to her parents and handed her over to Germany's Youth Welfare Office (Jugendamt). Ariha has been in the custody of the Jugendamt since September 2021.

The court granted Ariha's custody to the German state on Friday and dismissed the claim of ūf fther parents that the injury sustained by her was "accidental".

The report said Ariha's parents expressed faith in the Indian government and said they are confident that Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Foreign Minister Dr Jaishankar would work



towards bringing their child back to India. "From today, we hand over Ariha to 140 crore Bhartiyas," they were quoted as saying. The child's parents had initially sought her custody but had then requested that she be given to the Indian Welfare Services genital injury The report said the court stated parental care was being denied to "avert the existing danger to the

child". It said it had come to the conviction "that the mother and/or father (had) intentionally nocaused the serious genital injuries of the child" and that they were unable to "explain the events in question in a sufficiently consistent man riha's continued stay in German foster care and "infringement" of her social, cultural and linguistic rights is of deep concern to the government of India and the parents.

## Punjabi varsity awaiting NAAC accreditation

Patiala: Four months on, Punjabi University Patiala is yet to get the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) accreditation, which is essential for the higher institutions to become eligible for the central government grants. On February 19, 2016, the executive committee of the NAAC had accredited Punjabi University with grade 'A', and this accreditation was valid till February 18, 2023.

A senior professor at the university, on condition of anonymity, revealed that the authorities had delayed applying for the NAAC knowing well the fact it was most essential for good health of the university. The professor also said the institutional information for



quality assessment (IIQA) reports submitted by the university to the NAAC office for accreditation were yet to be accepted. The authorities at Punjabi University, however, claimed that the process for the accreditation was under progress and soon they would get the NAAC accreditation. Director, internal quality assurance cell (IQAC), Punjabi University, Prof Dharamveer Sharma claimed that the accredita-

tion fee had been submitted in the month of February. He also said the IIQA report would be accepted soon by the NAAC. SP "The selfstudy report is yet to be submitted. We still have time to submit the report and soon it will be done as the process for the NAAC is under progress. The NAAC is essential for affiliation with the AICTE and approval for some courses.

Pramila Jayapal (D-Wash), signed a letter urging the Biden administration to make human rights a centerpiece of the week's negotiations.

## Pilot program for skilled Indian workers, as PM Modi visits US

WASHINGTON: As per Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit over to US, the Biden administration would make it easier for Indians to live and work in the United States, using the week's state visit by the Indian premier. The state department could announce as soon that a small number of Indians and other foreign workers on H-1B visas would be able to renew those visas in the US, without having to travel abroad, one of the sources said, part of a pilot program that could be expanded in coming years. Indian citizens are by far the most active users of the US H-1B program and made up 73%



of the nearly 442,000 H-1B workers in fiscal year 2022. "We all recognize that mobility of our people is a huge asset to us," said another US official. "And so our goal is to approach that in a sort of multifaceted way. The state department already has been working very

hard to find creative ways to make changes to things." state department spokesperson declined to comment on questions about which visa types would qualify or the timing of the pilot launch. Plans for a pilot program were first reported by Bloomberg Law in February.
