## "Uttam Sweets" unchecked, rubbishing Food Safety & Standard Act - 2006

*FSSAI fails to regulate purity, standards of sweets, edible oil*

Chandigarh : The "Uttam Sweets" tend to symbolise the superior quality, quintessential form, even these here might have been manufactured with plenty of specific adulterants, morphed sweeteners, edibles oil, already being pooh poohed by (FSSAI) Food Safety and Standards Act of India - 2006. No manufacturing, expiry period on display was seen, bare pictures reproduced in published news, by the team of Commissioner News Service, which went on a visit on 23 Aug 2024 to



"Uttam Sweets" for the safety and the welfare of the customers.

The "Uttam Sweets" brand is not worth its recognition, as despite recent orders by the Health authorities for renewal of registration were issued by the Director Health 2700255 but the owner had not complied with nor has manifested the manufacturing and the



expiry date of sweets as per the directive of Food Safety law stipulated by FSSAI- 2006. It seems that the proprietor has been selling stale food items. The Food Safety and Standards Authority, of India, 2006 Act came into being to consolidate and regulate food related norms and establish sci-



ence based food standards. The enshrined law assures standard food for human consumption but usually unsafe, unwholesome is seen in the today's markets. In market, real, original milk is nowhere available, the adulterated sweets are in plenty readily available from any-

where or neighbouring Zirakpur godowns which are often seen supplying to closer vicinity.

The Food Safety And Standards Authorities of India remains the supreme power responsible for regulating and supervising the food safety. It is mandatory for food establishments to

procure food safety license, registration as per the prevalent law. Food safety registration, and renewal is required even for small business or startups like petty, medium food manufacturers, storage units, transporters, retailers, marketers and distributors. In order to test the purity of the sweets, one could break a piece and add a few drops of iodine into the sweets mixture to see the result of adulterated sweets as its new color has surfaced blue/purple. Not far behind, even detergents are used to make its looks crystal

white and vigorously brightened. Another bamboozling addition remains "Urea" quantity that supplements protein contents and silver foils are substituted by aluminium fibre. It may be borne in mind that sweets in the markets are one of the most unchecked, contaminated food items with pandemic suppliers, sellers, said Mohan Rai, a dietician employed in a govt boys hostel. He remorsefully uttered even chalk powder and jawar flour were being added for a starch..

## 'Gopal Sweets' MD goes skeptic on FSSAI --2006

Chandigarh : No stale food would be sold to the consumers, specific date of manufacturing and expiry would be required for display along with the rows of sweets items.. Observing these certain enshrined objectives, the food safety and standard act of India 2006 was enacted in Parliament. The food law expects it's manufacturers strict compliance with non adulteration in its purity and fresh food for the citizens of India. "Yes, Certain sweets like Rasmalai, Dogala Jalebi have very short. life of a day or two, hence can't be expected displayment of life of these varieties span



with manufacturing date and expiry date," remarked Sharanjit Singh, the director of Gopal Sweets, Sec8, Chandigarh. The other entrepreneurs however, keep their fingers crossed to see this stern law of food safety relax but food safety has taken its toll too heavily in the modern times

of adulteration. "Hardly any consumable items are left where adulteration at the hands of manufacturers has escaped, food staff must ensure frequent raids for standard and purity," says Tarsem Chand, Gen Sec of the Jamna Residents Welfare Society, Zirakpur.

NEW DELHI : The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has fined Air India and its officials Rs 99 lakh for a rostering lapse that paired a trainee pilot with a non-training captain for operating an international flight out of India this July. On landing in Riyadh, the young trainee would have asked the training pilot to sign his SLF (supervised line flying) form. However, the training captain fell ill and rostering replaced him with a normal line (not training) captain. Enroute, the two pilots realised this mix up (which wasn't their fault) by the scheduling department. The other pilot could not have signed that form as he was not a training captain. The trainee could not have known this. And the other



pilot could not have known the trainee was to do supervised flying under a training captain. This was an oversight by crew management system (CMS) which could not ensure the legal complement of crew. The two pilots realised what had happened and filed a voluntary report with the base.

The airline then voluntarily reported it to the regulator. The DGCA had issued a show cause to AI on this lapse. On Friday, the

regulator said in a statement it has "imposed a financial penalty of Rs 90 lakh on Air India for operating flight with non qualified crew members. In addition, penalty of Rs 6 lakh and Rs 3 lakh, respectively, is imposed on the director operations and director training of AI." "Further, the concerned pilot has been warned to exercise caution to prevent such occurrences in future.

EDITORIAL –

Raise act to secure  
medics, now a high time

It is not only doctors who are at the receiving end; other healthcare workers (HCWs) also face violence. The most gruesome incident was the sexual assault on a nurse by a hospital lift operator at Mumbai’s KEM Hospital in 1973. The victim suffered brain damage and remained in a vegetative state for over 40 years. Nurses and other female employees are the most vulnerable segment at hospitals. The Indian Medical Association has been demanding a separate law to ensure the safety and security of doctors and other HCWs. Following reports of violence against HCWs during the Covid-19 pandemic, the Epidemic Diseases (Amendment) Ordinance, 2020, was promulgated to supplement the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare had released the Healthcare Service Personnel and Clinical Establishments (Prohibition of Violence and Damage to Property) Bill in September 2019 to address violence against healthcare professionals and damage to property. But it was rejected by the Ministry of Home Affairs on the grounds that the Bill would set an improper precedent for others seeking such exclusive protections for their respective professions. Subsequently, in September 2020, the Epidemic Diseases (Amendment) Act, 2020, was passed, but its provisions fall short of the doctors’ demands. The rape and murder of a resident doctor at the state-run RG Kar Medical College and

Hospital earlier this month has triggered widespread outrage and shaken the conscience of people. The post-mortem report indicates a Nirbhaya-like brutal assault. Shocking as it is, the incident occurred on the premises of the medical facility while she was on duty. To make it worse, the hospital authorities tried to cover it up. Violence against doctors falls into two categories. First, there is violence by the relatives or attendants of a patient over perceived negligence or billing disputes. And then there is violence by criminal elements. The Kolkata incident is a case of crime against a woman. Doctors at bigger, private hospitals are relatively safe, thanks to restrictions on the entry and number of attendants, the presence of CCTV cameras and adequate infrastructure. However, at government hospitals, the entry of outsiders goes mostly unchecked. Besides, there is a shortage of security personnel, corridors are poorly lit, duty rooms are not adequate, and there is often little electronic surveillance. Currently, most Class III and IV employees are hired on contract, and their antecedents are not verified. The victim in the Kolkata case had gone to a seminar room to take rest, perhaps because of the unavailability of a proper duty room. The culprit is said to be a ‘civic volunteer’, who would ostensibly help patients get admitted to government hospitals, in all likelihood, for a commission. The WHO defines workplace violence in

the healthcare sector as incidents in which a staff member is abused, threatened or assaulted in circumstances related to their work. Lancet surveillance yielded 225 violent incidents against HCWs in 2020 and 110 in 2021. Though India contributes less than 1 per cent of global HCWs, it accounted for 3.4 per cent of all such incidents. The incidence of violence against HCWs in India was 57 times that in the UK and 850 times that in China, countries that have taken legal action against violence. According to an estimate, there is at least one case of violence against an HCW in the national capital every day, with a majority going unreported. Since law and order is a state subject, there are state laws in 25 states (including West Bengal) and union territories called the Medicare Service Persons and Medicare Service Institutions Act. Under the Act, violence against HCWs is a non-bailable offence in most states, but there is no uniformity in its provisions in different states. Moreover, there is apathy and a lack of awareness about it among law enforcement agencies. The ongoing nationwide doctors’ strike is not the first one on the issue. In 2018-19, 10 states witnessed strikes over violence against HCWs. MLAG convener Dr Neeraj Nagpal says that if and when a police complaint is lodged, the patients’ relatives tend to lodge a counter complaint, forcing the doctors to retract under pressure from cops or politicians.

Power deptt to revamp  
electricity bills into  
Hindi, English

**CHANDIGARH :** The UT Engineering Department has revamped the power bill to make it more user-friendly, removing unnecessary information and adding useful details. Starting this month, the city residents will receive their electricity bills in a new and simplified format. The bills will now be bilingual, featuring text in both Hindi and English. Key changes include the addition of meter status, the last payment date and the amount paid. The back of the bill now includes guidelines and a notice under Section 56 of the Electricity Act, 2003, outlining potential actions if the bill is not paid on time. The bill also provides comprehensive information on payment methods, contact centres across Chandigarh and details on electricity rates, duties, taxes and cess to help residents calculate their bills. A senior officer stated that the new format was aimed at making electricity bills easier to understand, with all information now clearly presented in both Hindi and English. From this month, residents will have to pay more for power after the Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission (JERC) revised the fixed and power tariff in different domestic and commercial categories for the financial year 2024-25. The revised tariff are applicable from August 1. On an average, the commission had approved an increase of the 9.40% in power tariff. The Electricity Department had



proposed an average increase of nearly 19.44% in the existing power tariff of all categories. According to the order, in the domestic category, the JERC approved a hike of fixed charge from Rs 15 to 30 per month. In the slab of 0-150 kWh (unit), the tariff per unit will continue to remain Rs 2.75. But in the slab of 151-400 kWh per month, the tariff will increase from Rs 4.25 per unit to Rs 4.80 per unit. Above 400 kWh per month, the tariff approved is from Rs 4.65 per kWh to Rs 5.40 per unit. In the HT domestic category, the tariff will increase from Rs 4.30 per unit to Rs 4.90 per unit. For commercial and non-residential building category, the major tariff change is in the slab above 400 kWh per month where the tariff has been approved from Rs 5 per unit to Rs 5.90 per unit. As per the proposal put up by UT, in the domestic category, the department had proposed a hike in fixed charge from Rs 15 per month to Rs 40 per month. The department had proposed a hike from Rs 4.25 to Rs 4.90 per unit in the slab of 151-400 units and an increase from Rs 4.65 to Rs 5.50 in the slab 401 units and above. In the domestic high tension category, hike from Rs 4.30 to Rs 5 per unit was proposed.

600 new houses  
planned for  
construction by govt

**CHANDIGARH :** For the new housing project, the UT was considering using 33 acres in Sector 43, where “Apni Mandi” is held for the residents of Chandigarh town. At present, there are nearly 13,500 government houses for employees from Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and the Centre. The existing Type-2 houses, with two rooms, one toilet and one separate bathroom, are in poor shape. In an effort to alleviate the shortage of government housing for employees from Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh, the UT Administration has planned to construct nearly 600 new government houses. Officials of the UT Engineering Department had recently discussed the project with UT Adviser Rajeev Verma.

UT Chief Engineer CB Ojha said the administration was in the process of identifying a suitable site for the new housing plan, with potential locations being Sector 43, 46 or 50. A final decision was expected within a month. The major demand was for Type-2 (two-bedroom) and Type-3 (three-bedroom) houses, he added. Ojha also stated that 124 government houses, which are in poor shape, would be demolished. Preliminary estimates suggest around 600 houses would be constructed. The new two-bedroom houses will feature one drawing room, attached toilet, bathroom and dining hall each and two galleries. The three-bedroom houses will include one drawing room, one dining hall and attached bathrooms for each room.

Initiatives by Union cabinet on Unified  
Pension Scheme exalted by  
Govt employees

**CHD/NEW DELHI :** The initiatives of the Union Govt have been welcomed in implementing the Unified Pension Scheme (UPS). The nod of the cabinet has been acclaimed by All-India Railwaymen’s Federation (AIRF). Shiva Gopal Mishra, AIRF General Secretary and also Secretary of the Joint Consultative Machinery (JCM), a joint forum of government employees’ organisations, said, “at a press conference in New Delhi, the revised provisions would provide job security for government employees and their families. He mentioned that around 23 lakh government employees would benefit

from this scheme”. Extending his gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on his X Post, Mishra wrote: “I really thank to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on behalf of Secretary Staff Side NC/JCM to take a historical decision on NPS and giving relief to NPS holder.” Addressing the conference, Mishra said: “Our demands, including 50 per cent of the average basic pay drawn over the past 12

months of service as pension to employees who joined the service after January 1, 2004, have been fulfilled. It has got the Cabinet nod.” “Those who have retired and are getting low pension due to NPS, their cases will also be reviewed and they will also get benefits,” said Mishra. “We were told that family pension will be 60 per cent plus DA. There has been talk of a minimum pension of ~10,000,” he said. The National Pension System is applicable for government employees joining service after April 1, 2004. It was based on the premise of contribution rather than defined benefit applicable for employees prior to the NPS.

No headway in land exchange  
proposal with UT by Hry. govt

**CHANDIGARH :** In March the haryana govt had issued a draft notification demarcating area from 1 km to 2.035 km around the Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary as an ESZ on the Haryana side in Panchkula district. A senior UT officer said no further step could be taken until or unless the Union Ministry issued a notification on the demarcation of land for ESZ of the sanctuary, which was still awaited. After the lapse of 6 months there is no headway in the proposed exchange of land with UT for the construction of a new Haryana Assembly building as the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change is yet to issue a notification on eco-sensitive zone (ESZ) for Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary in Panchkula. However, the Haryana Government had sent a

Administration and Haryana

Government had already conducted a demarcation of 12 acres at Saketri village, which is intended to be swapped with 10 acres to be allotted by the UT Administration for the construction of the new Assembly building. To exchange land, the Haryana Government has to obtain environmental clearance for the land that falls in the ESZ. The allocation of land for the Haryana Assembly building was announced by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on July 9, 2022. This decision came in response to then Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar’s demand for the state’s rights in the existing Vidhan Sabha in Chandigarh, which it currently shares with Punjab. The demand stemmed from the projected increase in the number of Assembly seats following the 2026 delimitation exercise.

Worth Rs 20 crore fuel saved by  
e-buses within 2 years

**CHANDIGARH :** About 25.28 lakh litres of diesel worth Rs 20.80 crore has been saved within two and a half years by plying electric buses on local routes. Procured in November 2021, 80 electric buses are in service in the tricity at present, said a spokesman of the UT Transport Department. The electric buses had covered 1.26 crore km till August 16 on intra-city routes, thus saving over 25.28 lakh litres of diesel besides preserving environment. These buses have helped prevent 6674.91 tonne of CO2 emission. The e-bus fleet of the department included vehicles of Ashok Leyland and Eicher. In order to provide eco-friendly transportation in the city, the department plans to procure 100 more e-buses this year. The administration has plans to replace the entire fleet of 350 diesel buses of the

Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU), running both on local as well as suburban routes, with electric ones by 2027-28. Each bus covers a distance of nearly 130 km on a single charge. It takes nearly two hours to fully charge a vehicle. With a seating capacity of 36, a bus can carry a maximum of 54 people at a time. On an average, each bus covers 200-300 km a day. The State-Level Steering Committee (SLSC) has decided to replace 100 diesel buses with e-vehicles sanctioned by the Ministry of Housing and Urban

Affairs to Chandigarh under the Centre-sponsored PM e-Bus Sewa Scheme. The ministry will be requested to allocate 80 more buses to the city under this scheme. Apart from public transport, the share of private electric vehicles (EVs) is also increasing. Since the implementation of the EV Policy in September 2022, as many as 3,281 electric two-wheelers and 1,785 four-wheelers have been registered in the city till July 15. According to the data provided by the Registration and Licensing Authority (RLA), 352 electric two-wheelers and 114 four-wheelers were registered from September to December in 2022. The highest number of 2,103 electric two-wheelers and 1,013 four-wheelers had been registered in 2023 and 826 two-wheelers and 658 four-wheelers till July 15 this year in the city.

Jitendra Singh and former union ministers Anurag Thakur and Smriti Irani and Gen (retd.) V K Singh besides Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma and former Himachal Pradesh chief minister Jai Ram Thakur are other prominent faces who will visit Jammu and Kashmir during the campaigning. The three-phased assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir are scheduled for September 18, 25 and October 1. The counting of votes will be taken up on October 4.

Election Commission, BJP national general secretary and in-charge headquarters Arun Singh said the list of the 40 star campaigners of the party may be treated as valid for the remaining phases "unless we forward an amended list" within the prescribed time limit. The list also included former BJP general secretary and recently appointed election in charge for Jammu and Kashmir Ram Madhav, party national general secretary in charge Jammu and Kashmir Tarun Chugh, Jammu and Kashmir BJP chief Ravinder Raina, Member of Parliament Jugal Kishore Sharma, Rajya Sabha member Ghulam Ali Khatana, General secretary (organization) Ashok Kaul and Jammu and Kashmir BJP vice president Sofi Yousuf.

## In Congress party reservation for Mazhabi/Valmiki, ticket allocation sought

**CHANDIGARH :** Since Supreme Court upheld powers of the state governments to create sub-classification within the reserved categories for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes — which would secure the 12.5 percent reservation of Mazhabi Sikhs/Balmikis in Punjab. Ahead of the coming by election to the four assembly segment, Hoshiarpur, Barnala, Gidderbaha and Gurdaspur, Congress leaders have sought 12.5 per cent reservation quota for Mazhabi/Valmiki in party's organisational structure and ticket allocation. The sub-categorisation for reservation in Punjab has been there since 1975. The issue has cropped up in the party's state unit in the recently held Parliamentary election that saw Congress getting seven of the 13 parliamentary seats in the state.



Flagging the issue, former MLA from Jandiala Sukhwinder Singh Danny, a Mazhabi Sikh leader, has written to the party President Mallikarjun Kharge and senior leader Rahul Gandhi, seeking implementation of 12.5 per cent SC quota for Mazhabi/Valmiki candidates in party's organisational structure and ticket allocation. Giving statistics, Danny said Mazhabi Sikhs constitute 31.6 per cent and Valmikis 11 per cent of the total SC population. Giving the quota on party platform would help uplift the communities, deprived socially and economically. The MLA has further

asserted that in the true essence of justice for Dalits, the quota within quota was must for uplifting the "Atti Dalits". The concept of creamy layer is unconstitutional and unnatural, and must be discarded wholly to bring equality of opportunity and justice in the social fabric of Indian society. Former MLA from Amritsar (West) Raj Kumar Verka said the awareness was growing among the SC communities on the political platform and the party should give due consideration to the allocation of tickets. In the coming by election to the four seats, the Chabbewal seat is a reserved assembly segment. "The choice of the candidate depends on the voters' population of the particular SC community in the segment. The ticket is decided accordingly", said a senior PPCC leader.

"There is a huge lack of awareness among people about dental diseases, especially among the marginal section of society. It is also leading to situations like oral cancer. Dental doctors will play an important role in preventing the increasing disease of oral cancer. We are planning to offer such facilities at our AACs so that the marginal section of the society could benefit from it," said Dr Balbir. There are a total of 842 Aam Aadmi Clinics across the state, providing at least 80 diagnostic tests free of cost. Sharing details about the mobile dental clinic van, Dr Balbir Singh said that this state-of-the-art van has two fixed dental chairs and one mobile dental chair for the complete examination of the patient's teeth. Besides, the bus is equipped with air-conditioner, autoclave, generator, power backup, etc,



which will help in emergency dental treatment. Through this van, awareness about dental diseases will also be spread, particularly in rural areas. Besides, dentists will organise dental camps, and the van will be beneficial for the training and further studies of dental college students. Dr Balbir Singh said that dental students' study will examine the teeth of people in villages, cities, colonies, school students, and common people. This will benefit research and offer affordable oral healthcare to the marginal section of society. On this occasion, director Research and Medical Education Dr Avnish Kumar, joint director Dr Puneet Girhadar and Dr Akash, Colonel JV Singh, college principal Dr JS Mann, Dr Harmesh Sharma, Dr Gagandeep Kaur, and medical students were present. The minister added that the process has been completed and 39 vacant posts of dental doctors will be filled soon.

## Alert advisory issued for monkeypox by Pb Health Deptt

**LUDHIANA :** A wide ranging of key symptoms of monkeypox include fever, headache, muscle aches, back pain, swollen lymph nodes, chills and exhaustion. Characteristic skin lesions must be identified by the health authorities. The state Health Department has issued an alert for monkeypox (Mpox) and the district Health Department had been asked to adopt all necessary precautionary measures for the same. Though no case of monkeypox has been reported in the state, all precautionary measures are being adopted. "Human-to-human transmission is known to occur primarily through large respiratory droplets generally requiring a prolonged close contact. It can also be transmitted through direct contact with body fluids or lesion



material and indirect contact with lesion material, such as contaminated clothing or linens of an infected person," said Civil Surgeon Pardeep Mohindra. "The state Health Department has issued an advisory for the districts and we are following the same in Ludhiana," he said. Another medicine expert from the government sector said monkeypox was usually a self-limited disease with symptoms lasting from two to four weeks. Severe cases occur more commonly among children and were related to the extent of virus exposure, patient health status and nature of complications. Raising awareness of risk

factors and educating people about measures they could take to reduce exposure to the virus was the main prevention strategy for monkeypox, the Civil Surgeon said. There are a number of measures that can be taken to prevent infection with Mpox virus, which include avoid contact with any material, such as bedding, that has been in contact with a sick person. Isolate infected patients from others and practice good hand hygiene after contact with infected animals or humans. Use appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) when caring for patients. Key symptoms of monkeypox include fever, headache, muscle aches, back pain, swollen lymph nodes, chills and exhaustion. Characteristic skin lesions must be identified by the health authorities.

## Karnataka High Court defers special court proceedings for Siddaramaiah till August 29

**BENGALURU :** In the petition, the Chief Minister submitted that the sanction order by the governor, Thawar Chand Gehlot was issued without due application of mind, in violation of statutory mandates, and contrary to constitutional principles, including the advice of the Council of Ministers, which is binding under Article 163 of the Constitution of India. The Karnataka High Court on Monday directed the special court for people's representatives, slated to hear complaints against Chief Minister Siddaramaiah in the alleged Mysuru Urban Development Authority (MUDA) site allotment 'scam', to defer its proceedings till the next date of hearing on August 29. "No injunction has been granted," said Justice M Nagaprasanna, who heard a writ petition filed by the



Chief Minister challenging the legality of the August 16 order of the Governor, who accorded sanction against him under Section 17A of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, and Section 218 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. Siddaramaiah contended that the Governor's decision is legally unsustainable, procedurally flawed, and motivated by extraneous considerations, and thus, he has preferred the writ petition seeking to quash the impugned order amongst other reliefs. The Governor had issued the

order after Pradeepkumar S P, T J Abraham and Snehamayi Krishna had submitted to him petitions requesting sanction for prosecution of the Chief Minister in connection with the alleged irregularities in the allotment of alternative sites to his wife Parvathi by MUDA. Abraham and Krishna have moved the special court for public representatives, and the case was slated to come up on Tuesday and Wednesday. "Since the matter is being heard by this court and the pleadings are yet to get complete, till the next date of hearing, the concerned court shall defer its proceedings," Justice Nagaprasanna said. Senior advocate and Congress spokesperson Abhishek Manu Singhvi and the Solicitor General of India Tushar Mehta appeared on behalf of the Chief Minister and Governor, respectively.

## Rewarding Turncoats Can Be Danger- NC Chief BJP nominates 44 candidates for J&K, deleted, reissues only 15

Srinagar: National Conference chief Omar Abdullah, shortly after thrashing out what he called a "tough" seat-sharing deal with ally Congress, said he was surprised that the BJP, which prides itself on its discipline, failed to announce its candidates without a hitch. "When you suddenly change all your senior leaders, you are going to have a problem," said Mr Omar Abdullah. The BJP has released a list of 44 candidates for the three-phase election to 90 assembly seats in Jammu and Kashmir, but deleted it and released a list with 15 names -- the candidates for the first phase. The change has followed a



massive display of resentment from the local leaders. The list which was deleted, contained names of leaders who had switched over from the Congress, National Conference, PDP and Panthers Party said OmarAbdullah. "When you reward turncoats, you reward those who have left other parties and come and joined you... Look at the embarrassment.

I have never seen a situation where the party has had to withdraw its list within 10 minutes and then put out a truncated list," Mr Abdullah added. About the challenges faced by the INDIA alliance - Congress had to fly in two central leaders, KC Venugopal and Salman Khurshid, at the eleventh hour - Mr Abdullah said both parties were new to it.

## Champai Soren To Join BJP On Friday,-- Himanta Biswa Sarm

## Amid corruption probe ,CBI conducts searches at premises of Sandip Ghosh former RG Kar Medical College principal in Kolkata

NEW DELHI: The anti-corruption branch of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) conducted searches on Sunday (Aug 25) at multiple locations connected to former RG Kar Medical College principal Sandip Ghosh and his relatives in West Bengal's Kolkata.

Searches were underway at 15 locations across the city related to Dr Ghosh and his relatives.

A CBI team also reached the residence of Dr Debashish Som, Demonstrator of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, on Sunday morning, they said.

In pursuit of the complaint filed three days earlier by Akhtar Ali, former Deputy Superintendent of RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, alleging corruption and irregularities at the institution and specifically naming Dr Debashish Som. On Saturday, the CBI filed a First Information Report (FIR) against Dr Sandip Ghosh based on directives from the Calcutta High Court. The investigation was initiated after a single bench



of the High Court ordered the CBI to probe the alleged corruption at the medical college.

Earlier, a Special Investigation Team (SIT) from the Calcutta High Court visited the CBI office at Nizam Palace and handed over crucial documents related to the case.

Acting promptly on this information, the CBI filed the FIR and submitted a copy to the Alipur Chief Judicial Magistrate (CJM) Court on Saturday. The Calcutta High Court has granted the CBI three weeks to submit a progress report on the investigation, which is to be presented on Sept 17.

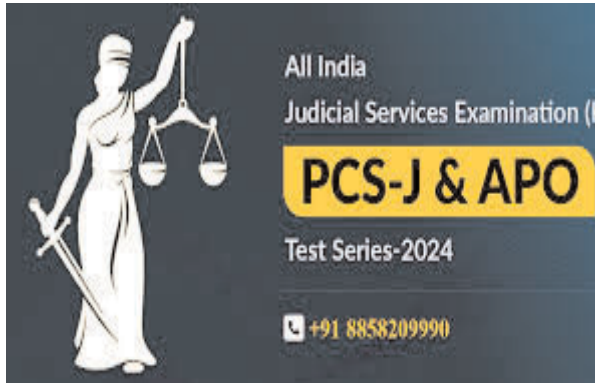
