## Pearl group 18 bigha land registry executed despite prolonging stay order of Supreme Court

Panchkula (RaipurRani) : No transaction on the land of Pearl Group can be made without the clearance (NOC) from Justice (Retd) RM Lodha Committee constituted by Honorable Apex Court. The Pearl Agrotech Corporation Ltd scam where thousands of investors were promised good returns of their land-

ed properties but were defrauded, and nothing was compensated to the victims even after fraudulently being snatched their tract of land. Chandigarh : New Delhi : Every medical practitioners owes accountability toward the patient in exercising reasonable degree of care, skill and knowledge, expected out from the prudent practitioner in the health care and cure. If the medical practitioner administers intervention lacking credibility, scientific evidence of safety and efficacy, and authoritative medical bodies too unequivocally voice concern over unproven medical treatment. Here, doctors admin-



istering speculative experimental treatment on patients amounts to professional misconduct and criminal negligence. Stem cell therapy can not be used for " Autism Spectrum

Disorder (ASD), said the bench of Justice JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan in Supreme Court. The bench expressed displeasure as ASD has never been approved for clinical treatment as no action by the Centre govt yet taken to prevent the malfunctioning. The centre was asked to, put in place the rules, regulations and guidelines to govern stem -cell based clinical trials andresreatvh in our country, " te bench directed.

## EU-India FTA to start getting operationalized in 2026 itself : Piyush Goyal

## SC sets aside compulsory retirement order of Income Tax Commissioner, Rs 5 Lakh costs imposed

New Delhi : The search cum selection committee (SCSC) headed by a sitting SC judge placed the Pramod Bajaj the serving Income Tax Commissioner at All India Rank One. Mr Bajaj, income tax commissioner had applied for the appointment to the post of Member of Income Tax Appellate Tribunal who j had been an army officer, later cracked Indian Revenue Services. The commissioner wanted to crack the competition for Income Tax Appellate Tribunal post but was denied on flimsy ground of his family court case. A bench of Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Sandeep Mehta remarked that despite his promotion to the post of income Tax Commissioner,



several prospects of next promotions loomed large, and false memorandum were orchestrated but not served in ultimate, was yet ordered to proceed on compulsory retirement. Undeterred and adamant department initiated an vigilance enquiry against Bajaj, and had put him in the list of officers with the suspected integrity. This move too was set aside by the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) and Rs 5 lakh cost was being readied.

‘Dada giri’ collapses in today's democratic World

India and the EU announced successful conclusion of the FTA negotiations and signed another deal to formalise their security and defence partnership at the India-EU summit. It would reminisce history as a tide-turning moment and the beginning of a new era in evolving relations. India has concluded the largest free trade agreement (FTA) in its history that will also boost investment between India and the EU, create new partnerships and strengthen global supply chains, acting not just as a trade agreement but a new blueprint for shared prosperity. The summit co-chaired by the PM and EU Council and Commission presidents, Antonio Costa and Ursula von der Leyen, respectively, saw 13 "deeply strategic" culminations including signing of a mobility which would allow Europe to attract more highly skilled professionals and students from India, and adoption of a new joint comprehensive strategic agenda. Talking about increasing global turbulence, Modi said respect for multilateralism and international norms remained a shared priority, adding both sides were united in their view that reform of global institutions is essential to address "challenges of our time". The "historic" FTA will facilitate easier access for Indian farmers and small

enterprises to European markets, create new opportunities in manufacturing, and further strengthen the cooperation across the services sectors said Modi. Vonder Leyen took a swipe the at the US as she said both sides through the "mother of all deals" were reducing strategic dependencies "when trade ment is increasingly weaponised". "It brings together In-codia's skills, services and EU scale, with Europe's technology, capital and innovation. and It will create levels of growth that neither side can achieve alone," said the president. On the defence partnership, Modi said it will boost co-operation on counterterrorism, maritime security, and cybersecurity: "Defence and security are a foundation for any strong partnership. This will also strengthen our shared commitment to a rules-based international order. Our cooperation in the Indo-Pacific region will grow, and our defence companies will gain new opportunities to work together on co-development and co-production." Two of the world's largest democratic powers had come together to add a defining chapter to their relationship. The new "ambitious and holistic" strategic agenda for the next five years, would provide clear direction, advance shared prosperity, accelerate innovation, strengthen security cooperation,

and deepen people to people ties. Cooperation between India and the EU constituted a "Partnership for the Global Good" said Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "We will expand trilateral projects from the Indo-Pacific to the Caribbean, thereby providing tangible support for sustainable agriculture, clean energy, and women's empowerment," said the PM, adding that both sides will work to establish the IMEC Corridor as a key pillar of global trade and sustainable development. "In the course of relations among nations, there are moments when history itself declares that this is where the direction changed, that this is where a new era began. To day's historic Summit between India and the European Union represents such a moment," said the PM. In a joint statement, both sides underlined the necessity of comprehensive reform of the UN Security Council, to make it more representative, inclusive, transparent, efficient, democratic, account-able and reflective of contemporary geopolitical realities. "They emphasised the World Trade Organization's central role in the multilateral trading system and global trade governance and underlined that meaningful, necessary and comprehensive reform of the WTO is essential to improve its functions so that it is better suited to advance all members' objectives,".

Hry govt extends farmers’ loan waiver scheme till March 2026

**Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA :** During a meeting of all district-level Chief Executive Officers and Managers held at the Haryana State Cooperative Agriculture and Land Development Bank (Land Mortgage Bank) headquarters information was shared by the bank’s Chairman, Amar Pal Rana. The Haryana Government has extended the One-Time Loan Waiver Scheme (OTS Scheme 2022) for overdue borrower-members of the Bank until March 31, 2026. Mr Rana informed that under this scheme, overdue interest on the loan accounts of deceased borrowers of the District Primary Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Banks would be waived in full. If legal heir/heirs of a deceased borrower deposit the entire principal outstanding amount, they would receive 100 per cent

not repay his/her loan and was declared a defaulter by the bank on March 31, 2022, may avail benefits of this settlement,” he said. It is noteworthy that the 19 District Primary Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Banks together have 61,767 borrowers, with total outstanding dues of Rs 1,857.92 crore (Rs 723.55 crore principal, Rs 1,002.91 crore interest and Rs 131.47 crore penal interest). The government extended the OTS Scheme once again to facilitate repayment by these borrowers. Rana said, “The scheme has been extended for a limited period. The beneficiaries should avail its benefits on a ‘first come, first served’ basis. For availing the scheme and obtaining further information, borrowers may contact any of the 19 District Primary Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Banks or the 70 branches established at the tehsil

Chandigarh Administration seeks Rs 8379.81 crore for FY27 Budget

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The Central Government for the current financial year, had allocated Rs 6,983.18 crore to the UT. Now for the next fiscal, the Chandigarh Administration has requested an additional Rs 1,396.63 crore, taking the total budget demand to Rs 8,379.81 crore. The Administration has been forwarded proposal to the Union Ministry of Finance. The UT Administration has sought a nearly 20% increase in its annual budget for the financial year 2026-27 to undertake several major development projects across various sectors, including health, education, transport and urban infrastructure. Of the Rs 6,983.18 crore sanctioned for 2025-26, Rs 6,185.18 crore was provided under the revenue head and Rs 798 crore for capital expenditure. Officials said the increased demand reflected the city's growing requirements due to rapid urbanisation and rising pressure on civic amenities. According to sources, the proposed budget for 2026-27 prioritises the health and education sectors. In healthcare,

the Administration plans to construct an Ayush hospital as well as a new hospital in Sector 53 to strengthen medical infrastructure and improve access to services. In the education sector, several government schools are slated for renovation, upgrade and infrastructure improvement to enhance learning facilities. Apart from health and education, the proposed budget also focuses on transportation, housing and urban development projects aimed at easing congestion, improving connectivity and addressing housing needs. Chandigarh had received Rs 6,313.62 crore in the fiscal 2024-25. In 2025-26, the Central Government had increased the allocation by 7.21%. Officials pointed out that while the Administration sought a budget hike of 20-25% every year, the Centre generally approved an increase in the range of 7-10%.

Pkl Metropolitan Development Authority to explain frailing infra, asked by HHRC

**Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA :** In the satellite town, road signage, lane markings, zebra crossings and reflective studs have virtually disappeared, making night-time driving hazardous. Mandatory signboards such as speed-limit indicators, warning signs at accident-prone zones, slip roads and pedestrian crossings are either missing or poorly maintained, significantly increasing accident risks. The Haryana Human Rights Commission (HHRC) has been approached by the Citizens’ Welfare Association (CWA), Panchkula, regarding the poor, collapsing civic infrastructure besides the discernible plight of recarpeted roads. The Welfare Association has flagged the deteriorating state of civic infrastructure in the city, prompting the HHRC to seek a report from the Chief Engineer of the Panchkula Metropolitan Development Authority (PMDA). The CWA alleged that roads re-carpeted barely a year ago have developed deep potholes across several sectors, causing distractions to commuters. The association blamed multiple government agencies, including the Municipal Corporation, HSVP, PMDA, HSIDC, the Urban Local Bodies Department, the police and the PWD, for failing to maintain roads, medians, footpaths, drainage systems and traffic infrastructure.

The lack of regular tree pruning, particularly in residential areas has blocked sunlight during winter and rendered recently installed reflective guide maps ineffective. Overgrown branches have encroached onto carriageways, posing a danger to heavy vehicles. Damaged footpaths force pedestrians to walk on busy roads. The association further drew attention to the collapse of the drainage system in sectors 8, 9, 10, 15 and 19, resulting in rainwater entering homes during the monsoon, damaging property and disrupting traffic. Frequent damage to central business district (CBD) ducts at major junctions has led to prolonged road closures and traffic diversions. Taking cognisance of the complaint filed by Swadesh Singh on behalf of the general public, the HHRC has directed the Chief Engineer, PMDA, to submit a detailed report on the allegations before the next hearing scheduled for February 11. The Commission’s intervention has raised hopes among residents for urgent corrective action and accountability.

‘Sade Bazurg Sada Maan’ campaign continues, to cover remaining districts from February 2 to 18

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The flagship campaign of “Sade Bazurg Sada Maan” reached Phase II, reaffirming the government’s commitment to ensuring dignity, care and social security for senior citizens across the state. The campaign was launched from Kalkat Bhawan (Kisan Vikas Chamber) in Mohali, by Dr Baljit Kaur, Punjab Minister for Social Security, Women and Child Development. “For Phase II of the “Sade Bazurg Sada Maan” campaign, an amount of Rs 786 lakh has been earmarked to hold district-level camps so that essential services can be provided on the doorstep of the elderly,” said Dr Baljit Kaur while addressing gathering on the occasion. “During Phase I, which was launched in 2023, as many as 20,210 senior citizens were registered. The remaining districts of Punjab will be

covered under Phase II from February 2 to February 18,” the minister said. The camps are designed to provide comprehensive care to senior citizens. Facilities include eye check-ups and cataract examinations, ENT and orthopaedic consultations, screening for non-communicable diseases and dementia, as well as homeopathic and ayurvedic treatment. On-the-spot enrolment for social security pensions, issuance of Senior Citizen Cards and ALIMCO cards is also being done at camps.

HESMA 1974 law extended in Chandigarh by six months

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The application of the Haryana Essential Services (Maintenance) Act (HESMA), 1974, in the city has been extended by another six months. The ban on strikes by employees of Chandigarh Power Distribution Limited (CPDL) will continue, said an official of the UT Administration. Power supply is an essential service and any disruption would directly affect the city’s residents. To ensure uninterrupted power supply, HESMA has been imposed, prohibiting CPDL employees from going on strike. Any employee who participates in a strike or similar protest during this period will face legal action, in accordance with a notification issued by the UT Administration. Since the employees were reportedly planning a large-scale protest on January 30

in support of their demands, the unequivocal decision was taken to frustrate the designs of the employees union. The HESMA imposed six months back was in force till January 26. Until recently, the Punjab ESMA was applicable in Chandigarh. However, amid ongoing protests against the privatisation of the Electricity Department, the Administration scrapped the Punjab ESMA and invoked the Haryana ESMA, citing its stricter provisions. Officials said that under the earlier rules, only employees directly participating in a strike could face action, but under the Haryana ESMA, even those who plan a strike or provide funds for it could be penalised.

Rules of UT staff are provisional, governed by Chandigarh Power Distribution Ltd : CAT

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** Pankaj Kumar Gautam, challenged the transfer of his services to the newly created CPDL under the Chandigarh Electricity Reform Transfer Scheme, 2025. The Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) has held that employees of the electricity wing of the UT Engineering Department continue to remain with the Administration and are with Chandigarh Power Distribution Limited (CPDL) on provisional basis. Opposing the plea, the Chandigarh Administration and the CPDL raised objections on the maintainability of the application, arguing that Gautam’s services, along with those of all employees of the erstwhile electricity wing of the Engineering Department, stood transferred to the firm through a notification dated January 31 last year. The respondents further submitted that the applicant’s representations had already been rejected by the competent

authority and that the case had become infructuous. The Administration also contended that the issue was barred by the principles of finality of litigation and res judicata, citing earlier rounds of litigation before the Punjab and Haryana High Court and the tribunal. The counsel for Gautam argued that the transfer scheme itself was ultra vires Article 311 of the Constitution, as the applicant’s service conditions were governed by statutory recruitment rules — the PSEB Service of Engineers (Electrical) Recruitment Regulations, 1965. It was submitted that Gautam continued to be an employee of

the electricity wing of the UT Engineering Department and was entitled to retain his status with all consequential benefits. The applicant also argued that while the High Court had earlier examined issues related to the timing of finalisation of the transfer scheme under the Electricity Act, 2003, the validity of the scheme itself had not been adjudicated. It was pointed out that the tribunal, in an earlier review petition, had granted liberty to challenge the scheme, ruling out the plea of res judicata. Hearing the petition on January 29, the tribunal directed that status quo with respect to the applicant’s service position be maintained till the next date of hearing, clarifying that the order should not hinder the applicant from continuing work under the company. The matter has been listed for further hearing on February 27 with directions to the respondents to file detailed replies by then.

‘Ashirwad Scheme’ pleas only through portal of seva kendras

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The Department of Social Justice, Empowerment and Minority Affairs, Punjab Government, has made an important change in the application process of the Ashirwad Scheme, with the objective of ensuring transparency, uniformity and smooth delivery of services to beneficiaries. Till now, most beneficiaries were applying for the Ashirwad Scheme online through private cyber cafes and personal computers. However, from January 28, the Minister of Social

Justice, Empowerment and Minority Affairs has formally inaugurated the facility of submitting applications on the Ashirwad portal exclusively through seva kendras. With immediate effect, the option of applying for the Ashirwad Scheme through private cyber cafes or

personal computers has been discontinued. Now, applicants wishing to avail of the benefits of the scheme will be able to submit their applications only through authorised seva kendras. District Social Justice and Empowerment Officer Ashish Kathuria has requested all departments concerned and field officers to disseminate this information widely among the people at their respective levels.. Applications under this scheme can be made till 60 days after the date of marriage.

New villages under Mohali Municipal Corporation under focus

**Commissioner News Service MOHALI :** Under the watch of GMADA, major issues related to water supply, sewerage, storm water drainage, ponds and STPs in various villages and colonies were reviewed. Time-bound decisions were taken to ensure completion of works before formal handover and onset of the monsoon season. A review meeting by the Mohali administration, GMADA, the Municipal Corporation (MC) was held to assess the issues/problems of the civic infrastructure in the newly included areas in the extended limits of the civic body. The meeting was attended by Municipal Commissioner Parminder Pal Singh, officials of the engineer wing of the MC,

GMADA, and Water Supply and Sewerage Board. During the meeting the waterlogging issues in Green Enclave were addressed through a dedicated project funded by GMADA, the tenders for which had already been floated by the Municipal Corporation. Cleaning of rainwater drains at Ballomajra and provision of two-three feet diameter pipe at Patiala Ki Rao, estimated cost of which was Rs 30 lakh, were

discussed. During the meeting senior officials were informed that the STP at TDI were functioning satisfactorily. Directions were given to officials concerned for conducting a survey as well as clean and desilt ponds and sewer lines under the Amrit Yojana in villages including Balongi, Landran, Nanu Majra, Sambalki, Mauli Baidwan, Kambali, Lakhnaur and Bilali. Stormwater management issues in Gateway City and TDI City were reviewed, and GMADA was directed to submit a comprehensive plan. Officials were asked to urgently address infrastructure concerns in Phase 11, including street lighting and road works.

Patiala Heritage festival, crafts mela to vibrate from next month

During the festival, light will also be shed on Sheesh Mahal, which was built by Bhupinder Singh. ## Tarun Chugh appointed central observer for election of Manipur legislature

NEW DELHI : The BJP national general secretary Tarun Chugh was appointed central observer for the election of Manipur legislature poll, which indicated the possible formation of a popular government in the northeastern state. The move came as NDA MLAs from Manipur arrived in the national capital after being summoned by the BJP central leadership, ostensibly to discuss the formation of government in the state where the current spell of the President's rule will expire next week. Manipur has been under the President's rule since February 13, 2025, following months of ethnic violence between Meitei and Kuki communities. The central rule was



imposed after the BJP-led government headed by Biren Singh resigned on February 9, 2025. The 60-member state assembly, whose tenure is till 2027, was put under suspended animation. The BJP legislature party meeting is expected to take place on Tuesday, but its location is not known immediately. Nearly 20 MLAs arrived on Sunday night, while others reached here on Monday following the direction of the BJP leadership. The legislature party meeting will be held days ahead of the expiry of the

second spell of the President's rule, which was first imposed on February 13, 2025, for six months and then extended for another six months in August 2025. Those who have arrived in the national capital include former chief minister N Biren Singh, Assembly Speaker Satyabrata Singh and former minister Y Khemchand Singh. BJP state president A Sharda Devi is also in Delhi. The BJP central leadership had held several rounds of separate meetings with its Meitei and Kuki MLAs, allies NPF and NPP and a few Independent legislators over the last few months to gauge their views on whether the political situation was conducive for the formation of a popular government, sources said.

NEW DELHI : Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla disallowed Gandhi from raising the issue, but he did not relent and several opposition leaders also rallied behind him. The House was adjourned twice and later for the day amid uproar as heated exchanges took place between the treasury and opposition benches. A major political row erupted on Monday as Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi sought to quote in the Lok Sabha from an unpublished "memoir" of former Army chief MM Naravane on the 2020 India-China conflict to target Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, evoking a backlash from BJP leaders who accused him of misleading the House and belittling the armed forces. While Gandhi said the government is "afraid" of a line that he wants to quote from the book and asserted that he would state that line in the Lower House, the BJP alleged that the Congress leader undermined the dignity of Parliament and hurt the morale of the Indian soldiers with his false accusations, in defiance of Speaker Om Birla's ruling.



The ruling party's leaders, including ministers, asked Gandhi to stop "speaking the language of anti-India elements". Speaking with reporters, Gandhi claimed that he was not being allowed to quote from Naravane's unpublished book in the Lok Sabha because it indicts Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh for "letting down" the army during the 2020 conflict with China. "Naravane ji has written about the prime minister and Rajnath Singh ji clearly in his book, which has appeared in an article, and I am quoting from that article. They are scared because if it comes out, the reality of Narendra Modi ji and Rajnath Singh ji will be revealed. What happened to the 56-inch chest when China was before us and advancing?" Gandhi said.

## Possible defect in Dreamliner fuel control switch, aircraft grounded : DGCA

NEW DELHI : The matter of fuel control switch has been communicated to the aviation regulator, DGCA. Air India had checked the fuel control switches on all Boeing 787 aircraft in its fleet after a directive from the DGCA, and had found no issues," the statement said. An Air India pilot on Monday flagged a possible defect with the fuel control switch of a Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner, and the matter has been reported to aviation watchdog DGCA. The aircraft operated the flight AI132 from London to Bengaluru, and it landed at Bengaluru on Monday morning, according to sources. In a statement, the airline said it is aware that one of its pilots has reported a possible defect on the fuel



control switch of a Boeing 787-8 aircraft. "After receiving this initial information, we have grounded the said aircraft and are involving the OEM to get the pilot's concerns checked on a priority basis. The incident assumes significance against the backdrop of concerns in certain quarters about the functioning of the fuel control switch in the ill-fated Air India Dreamliner that crashed in June last year. In one of the worst aircraft

accidents in India, a total of 260 people, including 241 passengers, died after Air India's Boeing 787-8 aircraft operating flight AI171 to London Gatwick crashed soon after take-off from Ahmedabad on June 12, 2025. The Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) is probing the crash. In its preliminary report on the crash that was released on July 12 last year, AAIB said the fuel supply to both engines of the plane was cut off within a gap of one second, causing confusion in the cockpit soon after take-off. "In the cockpit voice recording, one of the pilots is heard asking the other why did he cut off. The other pilot responded that he did not do so," it had said.

## Bhagwant Mann slams Centre over MGNREGA, pending rural funds

HOSHARPUR : Punjab Chief Minister Mr Bhagwant Mann addressed a gathering here after hoisting the national tricolour during a function on the occasion of Republic Day. He gave a warning to those who are trying to disturb peace in the state with their nefarious designs. The CM said that his government is committed to maintaining amity and mutual brotherhood at any cost. Punjab has to fight even to get its rights, said Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday as he slammed the Centre over the issue of MGNREGA and pending rural development funds. Mann said that his government will make all-out efforts to get Chandigarh as Punjab's own capital. At present, Union Territory Chandigarh is the joint capital of Punjab and Haryana. Mann also listed several initiatives, including free electricity and government jobs for youths and campaigns against drugs and gangsters, carried out by his government.



He said Punjab is known as the food bowl and the sword arm of the nation. "For the country's progress, we (Punjab) suffered damage to its natural resources. Our underground water got depleted, and our rivers' water also got polluted," he said. "I am pained to say that despite making maximum sacrifices, injustice and highhandedness have continuously been done to our state. Punjab has to fight even today to get its own rights, and it is knocking on the doors of courts," he added. He alleged that a conspiracy was hatched to end Punjab's right over the Bhakra Beas Management Board, "which we did not allow to be successful."

Mann added that the Centre has not only changed the name of the MGNREGA (Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act) scheme but its entire structure as well. "Because of which, the livelihoods of scheduled caste workers, women and landless families have come into danger," he said. The Chief Minister said at present, 19.85 lakh people are registered as MGNREGA workers in Punjab and out of which, 12.65 lakh belong to the SC families. He said his government is committed to raising the voice of Punjab's rights. "In this regard, we are fighting and raising our voice for Punjab's rights, be it through the Vidhan Sabha or any other way," Mann said. He also pointed towards the non-release of RDF funds to the state. "Our RDF funds have been stopped. The Constitution mentions the rights of all states and their fundamental rights. Even then, we have to struggle to get our rights," he said.

## 7,000 km high-speed rail corridors would be built by 2047: Vaishnaw

NEW DELHI : High-speed routes, designed for maximum speeds of up to 350 km per hour and an operating speed of 320 km per hour, will mark a transformative leap in India's rail infrastructure, said the Union railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw while inaugurating the 16th International Railway Equipment Exhibition (IREE), 2025, at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi. Unveiling an ambitious roadmap for the Railways, on Wednesday announced that the government plans to build 7,000 km of dedicated passenger corridors by 2047 under the Viksit Bharat vision. Vaishnaw said the proposed corridors would be powered by indigenously developed signaling systems and modern operations control centres, ensuring both speed and safety. He also outlined the



government's futuristic vision for Vande Bharat 4.0, Amrit Bharat 4.0, and next-generation railway manufacturing standards. Highlighting the success of the Vande Bharat series, he said the third-generation train already meets global parameters, with acceleration from 0 to 100 kmph in just 52 seconds, faster than many trains in Japan and Europe, while maintaining low noise and vibration levels. "Vande Bharat 4.0 will be a new benchmark in performance and passenger experience," said Vaishnaw, adding that the upcoming

model will focus on superior seats, enhanced toilets, and refined workmanship. Discussing the Amrit Bharat series, the minister said the 2.0 version is already operational and the 3.0 model, based on push-pull technology, is being developed for long-distance routes. The 4.0 version, he added, will bring in new-generation trainsets and locomotives, expected to be ready for testing within 36 months. Vaishnaw credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership for what he termed "a decade of modernisation," noting that more than 35,000 km of new rail lines have been laid and 46,000 km of electrification completed in the past 11 years. "Our budget allocation for the Railways has consistently risen, reflecting the government's commitment to a modern, self-reliant network," he said.

"Pakistan maintains long-standing, friendly, and mutually beneficial relations with the EU. The GSP Plus scheme for Pakistan has proven to be a win-win template for bilateral cooperation," said Andrabi .  
He added trade volumes between Pakistan and the EU stood at over 12 billion, that EU imports of Pakistani textiles and apparel had risen sharply under the scheme.

Could the case be treated as abetment to suicide, Mr Singh said the investigation would proceed based on the complaint. He added that the searches were led by an I-T team from Kerala, and the police would elicitv

information needed for conclusion. Roy's brother told a Malayaman news channel that the Income Tax team from Kerala first came on December 3 last year, and stayed in Bengaluru for a few days. Again they visited on January 28 after calling him back from Dubai. In a message posted on its Facebook page, the company paid tribute to its chairman, calling him its "beloved leader""Our beloved leader has departed from us, but not from the path he showed us. The values he lived by and the vision he entrusted to us will continue to guide our journey forward," it said, adding that the entire Confident Group family mourns the "sudden and irreparable loss" of its chairman.

## Fluoride contaminants in groundwater, a threat to public health

DeraBassi : Fluoride habitation carrying water contaminants with the fast depletion of ground water and distant access to safe drinking water has been evolving a serious concern with the ministry of Jal Shakti. As public health his been the intimate concern of Punjab Pollution Control, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, steps must be initiated to eradicate flow of untreated sewage, effluents into the ground water. The community water purification plants need to be augmented. The control over expansion of fluorsis need to be endemic, sources revealed. The accessibility to safe drinking water has been eloping with the discharge of untreated chemicals, effluents into the ground water, and depletion not halting for a cause. The multiplying cases of cancer are not being contained duo to the surge in bacterial growth. Pathogens like bacteria and viruses are being experienced as a very common hazard with the rural public life. Afflicted several health issues might be arthritis, infertility, hypertension, neurotoxicity and increased risk of skeletal cancer, reveals an official. Additionally prolonged exposure can damage organs like liver, kidneys, lungs and testis. Water contamination has been posing immediate and chronic health threats, needs seriouses contemplation, medication and panacea.

## Sensitive sectors of agriculture and dairy have been excluded from the U.S. deal, says Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal

NEW DELHI : On the India-U.S. trade agreement, Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, says, "The trade deal is in the final stages of detailing between the negotiating teams of both countries. As soon as the final understanding of the deal is inked and the joint statement is finalised, technical processes are completed, and full details will be shared." U.S. President Donald Trump announced a trade deal with India on Monday (February 2, 2026), saying that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has promised to stop buying Russian oil over the war in Ukraine. Mr. Trump said he was cutting tariffs on Indian goods to 18%. He had previously levied 25% reciprocal tariffs, plus an additional 25%



for New Delhi's purchases of Moscow's oil. Stock market benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty were trading nearly 3% higher during the afternoon session on Tuesday (February 3, 2026). The development also propelled a sharp rally in textile, leather, gems and jewellery, seafood exports and speciality chemicals stocks. "Delighted that Made in India products will now have a reduced tariff of 18%," said Mr. Modi, thanking Mr. Trump. "When two large economies and the world's largest democracies work together, it benefits our people and unlocks immense opportunities for mutually beneficial cooperation," said Mr. Modi in his post on X.
