Builders facilitated with fake NOC's for illegal colonies MLA orders probe into registry scam

Derabassi : Fake NOC's kept shuttling between the office of Executive officer Varinder Jain and Tehsildar Kuldeep Singh only to facilitate the registration process followed by anticipated architectural drawings. The process of illegal registries and architec-

tural drawings has virtually bamboozled the government exchequer and enabled the builders to go with their constructionwork of illegal structures around in Derabassi Municipal Jurisdiction. A record of over 110 registries were executed by the incumbent Tehsildar on the basis of availal NOC's,

commented Sukhdev Chaudhary president of and well-fare society Zirakpur. After the execution of registry the beneficiary has to obtain the approval of one's architectural drawings for raising the approved structures / colonies for using official clearance / NOC's



No builder would merely be interested in getting the preparation of registries if it does not move to the office of executive officer for architecture approval, here the sanctioned registries by the Tehsildar were executed online for the concerned builder for architectural approval. How the fake signature

on the NOC were not recognised by the executive officer before signing the architectural plan and did not censure the on going process in the Municipal precincts. While talking to CNS, Mr. Varinder Jain said that NOC's are issued online and ensured several checks for the verification of the certifi-

Between 2014 and 2020 , Khaira reportedly spent over 6.5 crore on himself and his family members, with expenses exceeding declared income . Khaira alleged that he was arrested in a false case in

which the Supreme Court had already quashed the summons issued against him. " I am being hounded because I have been strongly opposing and exposing the Bhagwant Maan government and the chief minister is carrying out personal ventdetta against me "he said the case of Sukhpal Khaira pertains to a trans -border heroin smuggling racket in which eight person were arrested and 2 kg heroin, 2 Pakistani sim card, 1 Pakistani mobile phone, 24 gold biscuits and two small firearms were seized.

Submission of Wage details deadline extended by EPFO

New Delhi : For submission of wage details, retirement fund body granted a 3 month extension till December 31, 2023 and to employers for up-loading employees ' wage details for pension on higher wages. The earliest deadline for uploading the wage details was due to end on September 30. It has been extended, a union ministry statement said, following multiple representations



from employers and employers' associations highlighting technical difficulties arising due to non- availability of data, for

which they sought clarification from the retirement body. It added that as of September 29, a total of 5.5 lakh application for Validation of option/joint option are still pending with employers. Considering the requests sympathetically, chairman, Central Board of Trustees- Union labour minister Bhupender Yadav - decline to extend the time for employers to submit wage details.

England doesn't plan to send military trainers for Ukraine

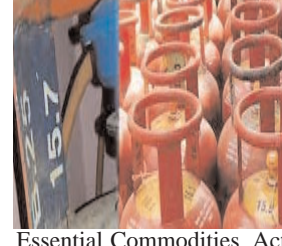


British Defence Minister Grant Shapps.said in a interview with " Sunday Telegraph ", he wanted to deploy military instructors to Ukraine in addition to training

grip on the law and order situation there, will be returning to Manipur almost a year ahead of the end - date of his inter- cadre deputation . The Manipur government had sought his premature repatriation

around 20 days back, as per sources.The home ministry had approved Balwal's deputation to AGMUT cadre for three years in October 2021. A need was felt latterly to have more officers who are perceived as "neutral " amid the deep ethnic divide that has pitted local communities like Meitis and kukis against one another, revealed the sources.

**Russia, Saudi barricade
World with harsh all prices**

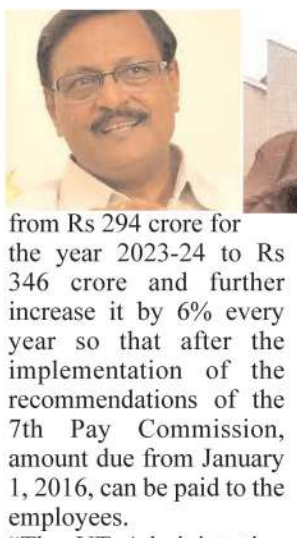
As the world is grappling with higher oil prices and the prospect of inflationary pressures reviving, the perspective of the OPEC+ leader, Saudi Arabia, is that it needs resources to develop infrastructure. It envisages a future in which the demand for fossil fuels may decline drastically and is preparing for this long-term eventuality. It has devised what is described as Vision 2030 to overhaul the kingdom's economy, reduce dependence on oil and provide jobs through a massive infrastructure drive. It is clearly linked to predictions made by the International Energy Agency that the demand for fossil fuels will decline after 2030. The West Asian country must also have kept in mind the experience during the pandemic when crude oil prices crashed to about \$9 per barrel. This was for a brief period, yet it enabled India to buy large quantities to fill its strategic reserves. But it was unsettling for the oil-exporting countries, which are looking to mop up enough financial resources before the fossil fuel demand wanes in the long run. The oil cartel, the Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) and its allies like Russia which now form OPEC+, had initially announced a production cut of 1.15 million barrels per day (bpd) in April. This did not alter the market movements much at the time. The prices were then ruling at around \$75 to \$80 per barrel. Voluntary

production cuts of 1.3 million bpd by Russia and Saudi Arabia followed in July. These reversed the trend and prices began to firm up. It is the decision to extend these cuts to the end of the year that has caused a spike in the prices recently. The benchmark Brent crude is now ruling at around \$92 per barrel while the US West Texas Intermediate crude is at about \$89 per barrel. Despite these warm ties, the two leading oil exporters have ensured that prices remain elevated in the world markets, much to the detriment of a country that imports over 85 per cent of its fuel needs. There is little concern for the impact on emerging economies like India. The drive to elevate oil prices will put a heavy burden on the exchequer here by raising the oil import bill, which reached \$158 billion in 2022-23. The downside risks of even higher oil prices will grow further next year, judging by estimates made by a raft of global investment agencies, including Goldman Sachs and Citibank. What is interesting is that both countries have close bilateral ties with New Delhi. In the case of Saudi Arabia, relations have been on the upswing in recent years and the latest visit by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman ended with eight joint agreements having been concluded. These were largely on the ways to utilising the \$100-billion investment offer made earlier by Riyadh. Several projects were identified, including an oil refinery on the west

coast designed to process Saudi crude. For Russia, too, the need for resources to fund the Ukraine war is paramount in its strategy to firm up world oil prices. It is also facing domestic constraints, forcing it to ban the export of gasoline and diesel. This may be a temporary measure, but it has created more volatility in the market. The question is — can the close ties between India and the two biggest players in the international oil market help in ensuring concessional prices for this commodity? Russia did offer oil at discounted rates last year when its traditional buyers in western countries decided to impose sanctions. This turned out to be a mutually beneficial arrangement as India was stymied by the skyrocketing rates of oil — over \$100 per barrel — right after the Ukraine conflict began. The discounts are still available, but are lower than before. As a result, the cost of the Indian basket of crudes is now \$93.93 per barrel as against \$74.93 per barrel in June. Saudi Arabia, on the other hand, has so far not given any concessions to countries of the Global South. The only relief given lately, after India shifted the bulk of its purchases from West Asia to Russia, has been the reduction in the so-called Asian premium. This is an extra charge for Asian buyers of Gulf crudes that has now been cut from \$10 to \$3.5.

Satya Pal Jain seeks extra grant for PU

New online transfer policy for college teachers by Haryana



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : A teacher falling in the "performance category" under the amended policy, can get a maximum of 23 points out of a total of 100 marks. The length of service in this category accounted for 10 marks while the teacher's results in the university examinations in the last three years will get him/her 9 marks. The research papers in the peer-reviewed and UGC-listed journals will fetch him/her additional 4 marks. The BJP-JJP government has rolled out the new Online Transfer Policy for the government college teachers under which the assistant and associate professors having good results and research publications will have an edge over their counterparts. Meanwhile, the age of the teachers will be the first and deciding parameter on their claim against vacancy as it would have a weightage of a maximum of 57 marks out of a total of 100 marks. The parameters under the "special category" will carry a maximum of 20 points. The teachers can avail 20 marks under such criteria as being a widow, widower, divorced, specially-abled and parents of the differently-abled children.

Besides, "couple cases" will also be considered under the "special category". Higher Education Minister Mool Chand Sharma, that the state government had come out with a transparent online transfer policy with an aim of providing a level-playing field to all teachers to work in different parts of the state. "The college teachers joining the department on repatriation from the Chandigarh Administration, other states and other state government departments where they were on deputation, will be posted in any government college having workload or vacancy. However, these teachers will compulsorily participate in the next transfer drive irrespective of the length of their tenure in the colleges where they were posted upon repatriation from deputation," the policy said. The policy made it clear that the college teachers would not bring in any outside influence. "If such an influence from whichever source supporting the cause of the college teacher is received, the request of the college teachers for transfer will not be considered," the policy said, adding that disciplinary action could be initiated against such teachers.

Energy efficient LED lighting system to illuminate Panchkula streets



Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : Rs 9.90 crore an administrative and financial sanction has been provided to the Panchkula Municipal Corporation for converting the traditional light system into LED street lights. The Directorate of Urban Local Bodies has granted approval for the conversion of traditional streetlights in Panchkula into energy-efficient LED lights and the establishment of a command and control centre for a smart lighting system as part of Divya Nagar Plan. Mayor Kulbhushan Goyal revealed that recently, during a meeting of the Finance and Contract

Committee (F&CC) of the civic body, an approval was granted to replace all streetlights in the city with LED lights. An estimated Rs 9.90 crore will be allocated for this project. The technical approval and budget allocation for monitoring the smart lighting system have also been provided. Under Divya Nagar Plan, all streetlights in Panchkula will be converted into LED lights. Half of the amount required for the purpose has already been sanctioned by the Urban Local Bodies Department. The entire smart lighting system will be operated from a single location.

No registration of non-electric 2-wheelers by UT from October

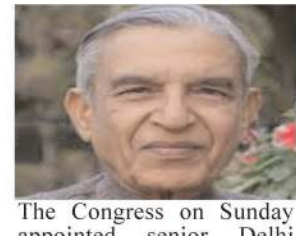
Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : According to the target, only 12,076 two-wheelers running on ICE are to be registered in the city till December this year. After achieving the number, their registration will be stopped and only electric two-wheelers will be registered. Since April, as many as 11,254 two-wheelers have been registered to date. In such a situation, only 822 non-electric two-wheelers can be registered now. The UT Administration has decided to halt the registration of internal combustion engine (ICE) two-wheelers once the target fixed for 2023 in the revised Electric Vehicle (EV) Policy is achieved, most likely in the first week of October. Similarly, the Administration will stop the registration of four-wheelers running on internal combustion engine (ICE) (petrol/diesel) once the target is achieved, which is likely to be attained by December this year. According to the target, only 15,465 four-wheelers running on ICE are to be registered by the end of this year. As many as 12,937 four-wheelers have been registered to date in the city. In such a situation, only 2,528 non-electric four-wheelers can be registered as of now. Pradhuman Singh, Registering and Licensing Authority (RLA), UT, said the



registration of non-electric two-wheelers would not be done by the office of the RLA once the target of 12,076 non-electric two-wheelers was achieved. Similarly, registration of four-wheelers would not be done once the target of 15,465 non-electric four-wheelers was achieved for this calendar year. After backlash from stakeholders, the UT Administration had revised its Electric Vehicle (EV) Policy in the first week of July and reduced the registration target for electric two-wheelers. The target had been reduced to 35 per cent from the previous 70 per cent to be achieved in 2023-24. However, the new targets have to be achieved in the calendar year instead of the financial year. This means, 65 per cent non-electric two-wheelers can be registered in 2023. Earlier in June, the Administration had decided to stop the registration of non-electric two-wheelers on achieving the target of 6,202 in 2023-24 financial year.

Ajay Maken replaces Pawan Bansal as AICC treasurer

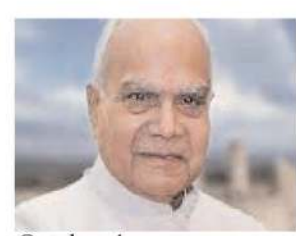

During the three-day visit, the Governor will interact with residents in Pathankot and Gurdaspur on the first day, in Amritsar and Tarn Taran on the second day and in Ferozepur and Fazilka on the third day, according to Raj Bhavan sources.

Baker penalised Rs 40K for selling 'substandard' cake

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : Ms Anju Ahlawat the complainant had ordered a cake for her son's birthday on June 29, 2019. After the delivery of the cake, and subsequent cutting ceremony, her son started vomiting, experiencing pain and having loose motions. She said the cake had artificial colour that came off on to their hands. Ahlawat said the cake was non-edible and unhygienic. A city-based bakery here has been penalised Rs 40,000 by the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission for allegedly selling a substandard cake to a client. Anju Ahlawat, a scientist at the Post Graduate Institute (PGI), Chandigarh, had complained to the Commission against Nik Bakers, Sector 5, Panchkula, through its manager and M/s MG Bakers Private Limited, Chandigarh. The guests invited to the



birthday party, including the complainant, did not eat the cake. The doctor said the trouble had arisen due to food poisoning. Ahlawat complained to the bakery many times, but in vain. She then approached the consumer panel. Nik Bakers, on their part, said they followed the best food practices and every food recipe went through multiple quality processes. The company was not using any food colour except the prescribed ones in the country. The company added that the complainant might not have kept the cake in the refrigerator, making it give stains on clothes and hands. The Commission, however,

maintained that it was Ahlawat's valid expectation to have a clear and true report from the bakery qua the alleged poor quality of the cake, but Nik Bakers had preferred not to send the cake's sample to any of its authorised laboratory. The Commission observed that Nik Bakers had been "found deficient while selling the substandard and contaminated quality of the cake to the complainant". It ordered the bakery to refund the cost of the cake (Rs 3,186) to Ahlawat, along with interest at 9% per annum. The baker was further told to pay Rs 40,000 as compensation, of which Rs 20,000 will go into the account of the Poor Patient Welfare Fund (PPWF) at the PGI and Rs 10,000 to the complainant for mental agony and harassment. An additional Rs 10,000 would be paid to cover the litigation cost incurred by her.

Ultratech cement served notice for flouting pollution norms

ROPAR : A show-cause notice was issued to Ultratech Cement the company after it was found that many of the the sprinklers provided on the internal roads to control air pollution were found jammed. Water jets of sprinklers were also not covering the full width of the road. Inadequate arrangements were made to sweep the roads. The tyre washing system was simply shallow water containment pool from which the vehicles passes. There was no water jets system provision to clean the tyres effectively which could result in air pollution in the area. The Punjab Pollution Control Board has issued a show-cause notice to Ultratech Cement for



allegedly violating pollution norms in operating and maintaining the clinker feeder dump at Dehni village near Kiratpur Sahib. A team of the PPCB had visited the site on July 24. The unit was not in operation at the time of checking. According to the officials, the site is used for the storage of clinker, gypsum, fly ash, coal, pet coke and red ocher — the raw material for a cement company. According to notice, it was clear that the industry has failed to comply with the provisions of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, as well as assurances given in the bank guarantee submitted by it. Pollution Control Board SDO Charanjit Rai said it has been proposed to cancel the consents to operate granted to the industry and a notice had been issued to provide an opportunity to the company authorities to explain regarding it on October 11.

Polished diamond prices may shoot up after import ban

NEW DELHI : The entire Indian gems and jewellery industry has asked its members to stop the import of rough diamonds for two months starting from October 15. Diamond prices are set to rise as days after a Russian diamond company suspended its transaction in diamonds for the next two months in order to avoid intrusive western scrutiny into their source in Surat. "Members may be advised to halt the import of rough diamonds beginning October 15 to December 15. It was assessed that halting imports of rough diamonds will help the industry better manage the balance between demand and supply, thereby protecting the value of assets and increasing consumer confidence. "The demand for loose polished diamonds and jewellery from large consuming economies such as the US and China have



been materially affected over the last many quarters, on the back of the all-time highs of 2021 and 2022, with a visible slowdown in orders. "As a result, exports have declined. Due to such factors, our inventories in polished diamonds have increased over the past few months and prices are softer," according to a joint circular issued by the Gem and Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC), Bharat Diamond Bourse, Surat Diamond Bourse, Mumbai Diamond Merchants Association and Surat Diamond Association. The G7 is planning certificates for diamonds sold within their jurisdictions.

10% hike in GST collection to Rs 1.62 lakh crore in September

NEW DELHI : Gross GST revenue collected last month was Rs 1,62,712 crore. Of this, Central GST was Rs 29,818 crore, State GST was Rs 37,657 crore, Integrated GST was Rs 83,623 crore (including Rs 41,145 crore collected on import of goods) and cess was Rs 11,613 crore (including Rs 881 crore collected on import of goods). Gross GST collection rose 10 per cent to over Rs 1.62 lakh crore in September, crossing the Rs 1.6



lakh crore mark for the fourth time during current financial year. The revenue in September 2023 was 10 per cent higher than the GST revenue of Rs 1.47 lakh crore in the same month last year, the finance ministry said in a statement. "During the month, revenues from domestic transactions (including import of services) are 14 per cent higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year. It is for the fourth time that gross GST collection has crossed Rs 1.60 lakh crore mark in FY 2023-24," it said.

Punjab Governor asked by AAP on liquor smuggling from Chandigarh to state

ROHTAK : "Future and challenges of journalism" organised by the Haryana Union of Working Journalists (HUWJ) in Rohtak on Sunday, announced Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar. The Haryana government will bear the insurance premium amount of upto Rs 10 lakh for journalists instead of Rs 5 lakh. "The state government is providing insurance cover of Rs 5 lakh, 10 lakh and 20 lakh to journalists through LIC. Till now, the government was paying the insurance premium amount upto Rs 5 lakh but it will now bear insurance premium amount of upto Rs 10 lakh. The government would also contribute 50 percent of the premium



for insurance up to Rs 20 lakh," said Khattar. Protests in Imphal against students killing continue

The Government was focused on stemming the wave of misinformation, rumours and other form of provocation through social media platforms. The two students were last seen in CCTV footage riding a Road . They were apparently coming from a coaching centre, at Keishampat Mutun Leikal , where the girl studied physics. Several photos of the deceased bodies of two missing Meitei teenagers appeared on the internet who were allegedly killed by

suspected Kuki militants. In the images, one shows the two students' dead bodies, while the other one shows them sitting in fear with two armed men in the background . A large number of students gathered and staged a demonstration in Imphal seeking justice for the two Meitei students, who went missing on 6 July - during the peak of ethnic violence in the state mobile internet services were suspended for five days in Manipur. The curbs will remain effective in the state till 7.45 pm on 1 October 2023 .

INLD becomes property of Abhay Chautala

Known for his oratory skills, Chautala senior started his speech by accusing Congree party of sending him behind bar in 2013 in a "false case" regarding alleged irregularities in the selection of JBT teachers. e former CM said when he was sent to jail , people had started saying he would die behind bars and INDL would be finished. "I am happy that Indian National Lok Dal not only survived the storm, but is now again the strongest political outfit in the state" he said Of the 90 assembly seats in Haryana has just one under itsbelt Abheys Elenabed .
