“NO TO FIRE DOCTRINES”!!

Dera Bassi plays with fire, yet to begin issuing certification to over 96% sensitive buildings

DeraBassi : Time and again, incidences of fire breakouts have been on the alarming rise. As was witnessed on 17 June the blaze took over the PRJ paint industry at Mor thikri village and about dozen fire tender had to be pressed into service. Another case of Yervik Hindusthan Export textile

mill on 7 May 2024 had to face conflagration near the Daffarpur village on Ramgarh Road. At Maggo village another chemical plant on Behra Road was engulfed on 8 April 2024. And here, unlike in neighbouring capital Chandigarh, Panchkula, issuance of safety certification has yet to start.

The eloping of basic fire amenities demonstrate definite 'scourge' besides perceptible threat on the security aswell protection of human beings and their well being and safe property. Rarely, safety and the wellbeing against frequent short circuits are becoming matter of serious concern. The anticipated well being

against potential conflagration needs to be taken care of, said a scrupulous person of the town on a n o n y m i t y . In the fast developing town , multiple range of the state-of- the-art buildings, Hotels , Hospitals, Colleges, Towers comprising hundreds of flats are evolving with least propensity for making these scores of fire combat

available around 24 hours. The legitimacy of building bye laws under Punjab Fire Prevention and Fire Safety Act 2004 demands (hundred) 100% safety of human life with the fixtures of basic equipments lik's fire alarm, efficient fire hydrant systems, smoke detector, heat detector, fire Hose, fire buckets, fire suppression system, valves and Hose

reels in every building where human and other species are living with broad senses. Certian posh buildings in Dera Bassi frequented by bureaucrats, legislator, ministers, legal luminaries from judiciary need to be taken care of thei well beings against potential their inferno, calamities and holocaust. In the events of heavily infested

roads with vehicular traffic, hardly space is found for scrambling the vulnerable site by the fire tenders. Due to the space crunch becoming a thick travail, for the emergent speedy ambulances and fire brigades, a viable solution will have to be invented for speedy reach. In the absence of other basic mechanism fire cabinet, fire fighting pumps & fire

blankets, fire sprinklers , no philosophical modus operandi would simply work and be amply rewarded. High priority would have to be accorded over 5 phenomenal buildings like distinctive hospitals, Govt public schools, Civil Courts, SDM office, BDPO, where hundreds of visitors have to daily meet govt officials for their urgent works.

Recruitment of Agniveers is 'to use and throw colourful precious youth'

New Delhi : Rahul Gandhi ,the leader of opposition termed the recruitment of Agniveer as tactic to "use-and-throw labour" for the government. Polls are long over. The action has moved to parliament. It's now time for debate and discussion. And, disagreements, too. The Lok Sabha witnessed one such spirited exchange between Rahul Gandhi, the first time Leader of Opposition, and Rajnath Singh, Defence Minister, over Agniveers. Mr Gandhi, while speaking in Lok Sabha, targeted the government over the Agnipath scheme. Launched in 2022, Agnipath



scheme provides for short-term induction of personnel into the armed forces with an aim to bring down the age profile of the three services. Those recruited under the scheme are called Agniveers. One Agniveer lost his life in a landmine blast but he is not called a 'martyr'. I call him a martyr but the government of India does not call him a martyr. PM Modi does

not call him a martyr. He calls him an Agniveer. His family will not get a pension. They won't get a compensation. He won't be called a martyr. His people won't get a pension. They won't get a compensation. Agniveer is use and throw like a labourer," said Mr Gandhi, dressed in his trademark T-shirt and trousers. Under the scheme, youngsters in the 17.5 years-21 years age group are inducted for a four-year period. There is a provision to retain 25 per cent of these recruits for 15 more years. The remaining will be given a financial package as their service comes to an end.

CJI Chandrachud announces Lok Adalat from July 29 amid long pendency of cases

New Delhi : DY Chandrachud, Chief justice , on Tuesday appealed to the citizens to take advantage of the Lok Adalat as he is concerned about the large backlog of cases. "From July 29 to August 3, the Supreme Court would

organise a special Lok Adalat. This would be a part of series of activities which the Supreme Court is observing to commemorate the 75th year since the establishment of the Apex court." "Most significantly, we are all judges, as people dedicated to the institution of justice, concerned about the large backlog of cases. The Lok Adalat is one of the alternative dispute redressal mechanisms, it is a forum where disputes pending in the court of law or at the pre-litigation stage are settled or compromised amicably.

1st" FIR registered by Delhi Police under new penal code BNS against a street vendor

New Delhi : With the new criminal laws taking effect from 1 July, Delhi police has registered its first FIR under Section 173 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), which replaces the British-era Indian Penal Code. A street vendor was booked under Section 285 of the BNS for obstructing a foot overbridge at the New Delhi Railway Station by selling



tobacco products and water from a cart. The vendor ignored police requests to restation his cart. All FIRs filed from July 1 onwards will follow the

BNS provisions, while cases registered up to June 30 will continue under the Indian Penal Code (IPC), Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC), and the Indian Evidence Act. BNS (Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita)with 358 sections, reduces the 511 sections under the IPC, introduces new crimes, extends imprisonment for some, increases fines, and introduces community service.

3000 kg fake desi ghee adultrated with palmolein oil, recovered --FSSSI

Chandigarh airport safety, well being details demanded by AAI Delhi

.Mohali: The airport Delhi has sought details regarding dampness, water retention, the age of the building, and when it was last renovated. The reports will have to be submitted within one week. Following the instructions, the Chandigarh International Airport Limited (CHIAL) have held marathon meetings with the engineering department in this matter in the past (two days.) There port will include details about the building structure and drainage water sy stem. Officials said they have already begun preparing the report. Additionally, reports on all buildings within the airport area have also been requested. Preparations have begun by CHIAL to handle the monsoon season. As part of this, AAI has requested a re port on the storm water drainage system installed at Chandigarh international airport to prevent water logging in the apron area and

airport premises during heavy rains. Sources said the authority has also asked for review and preparations's regarding the drainage water system in the parking area. AAI requested a report from CHIAL on the domestic and international cargo buildings prepared three years ago. Ajay Verma, CEO, CHI AL, said, "Every year, AAI requests a structural report in preparation for the pre monsoon season. The engineering department has started preparations, and the report will be sent in 3 to 4 days. The reports on building structures, drainage water systems, and cargobuil dings will provide AAI with a comprehensive understanding of the current state of the airport infrastructuret will enhance AAI on safety. This information will help them identify any potential issues and take necessary measures to add ress them before the monso on season begins.

Offensive floats against India in Ontario, Toranto

New Delhi, June 24 On the anniversary of worst-ever act of terrorism in Canada, the Indian High Commission in Canada, in an indirect reference to offensive floats in Ontario and Toronto on the bombing of AI-182 in 1985, has said that any act of glorifying terrorism "is deplorable and should be condemned by all peace-loving countries and people". "While 39 years have passed since the cowardly act, terrorism has unfortunately assumed proportions of an existential threat to international



peace and security today. It is unfortunate that such actions are allowed to be routine on many occasions in Canada," it said. The perpetrators and the co-conspirators of this dastardly act remain free," it added. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) claims it its

"investigative efforts remain active and ongoing". Terming the Kanishka bombing "the worst ever in Canadian aviation history to date", it said the incident would remain an "unbearable loss" not only for the victims' families, but also for humanity as a whole.

EDITORIAL - Military needs to confine its role to restrictions

Members of terrorist groups such as Lashkar-e-Taiba, Harkat-ul-Ansar and Hizbul Mujahideen continue to be trained and infiltrated into India for carrying out terrorist activities and creating destabilisation. As things stand, this situation is unlikely to change anytime soon.

During this entire past, through the shrill cacophony of revenge, there have been sane voices from both sides suggesting better relations between the two and progressing together in peaceful co-existence. Why these efforts have not produced the desired results, thus prolonging the status quo, needs to be analysed.

In the current geopolitical environment, a continuing hostile stance between the two is likely to prove harmful to both, more so to Pakistan, due to its vulnerabilities.

Unlike in India, where a democratically elected government conducts foreign policy with all countries, including Pakistan, the civilian government in Pakistan must go by the wishes of the army while dealing with India. This creates a dichotomous situation wherein a clandestine hand seems to be controlling the outcome of direct talks.

The Pakistan army has ruled the country directly or indirectly for the past 77 years. Not having been popular while ruling the country directly, the army has conveniently indulged in back-seat driving by making the ‘selected’ government do its bidding. This ensures that it gets credit for all the good deeds, while unpopular decisions are attributed to the civilian government.

The army has maintained its position within the polity by branding India as Pakistan’s enemy No.1 in people’s minds while projecting itself as the saviour of the nation. It is not uncommon to find that for most things going wrong in Pakistan, India is generally the

whipping boy. The army is adept at orchestrating an anti-India agenda from the background. The only negative aspect of such a game plan is that it cannot be played perpetually, thus exposing the perpetrators.

Punjabis have invariably dominated the government and all its important wings, even at the expense of depriving others of their fair share of government jobs. Thus, there is a strong undercurrent of resentment and alienation among Sindhis, Baluchis and Pakhtoons, giving a fillip to divisiveness. With the passage of time, this faultline is becoming more prominent.

The army has gradually expanded its overall control to almost all institutions in the country. The Fauji Foundation has been activated to control some of the economic activities.

Recent reports of pressurising and threatening the judiciary to get favourable decisions for the ‘establishment’ have pointed to the subversion of judicial processes.

Manipulation of the religious discourse to suit the aspirations of the military has resulted in creation of a suspicious and untrustworthy environment wherein the friction between the Shias and Sunnis has increased manifold. In fact, the minority Shias have been targeted more frequently by the Sunnis lately, thus heightening the discord.

There is also a feeling of alienation in the lower and middle ranks of the Pakistan army, especially since most spoils of power are being shared at the higher levels. It is this disenchantment that Imran Khan tried to exploit while taking on the army when he was the Prime Minister. His failure, of course, does not change the ground reality.

The foreign policy of India is the responsibility of the democratically elected government. Principally, it would be happy to have cordial neighbourly

relations with Pakistan. Several past prime ministers of India have repeatedly shown their positive intent on this account. Negotiations have broken down either because of the last-minute pressure from the Pak army on their government or because of Pakistan going back on the agreed upon agreements.

The Simla Agreement of 1972 is a glaring example. The solution lies in weakening of the stranglehold of the army on the foreign policy of Pakistan vis-à-vis India. The public of the country needs to realise that the India-centric approach propagated and followed by the army has only hastened Pakistan’s slide. It is the inherent contradictions within the Pakistan polity, propped up and manipulated by the army, that are leading the country towards disintegration.

Pakistan’s abysmal march to doomsday. There are murmurs of discontentment and unhappiness within Pakistan, especially since most aspects are weighed in comparison with India.

The high-handed way the ‘establishment’ deals with all other institutions of the state is becoming clearer. Ultimately, it is the public in Pakistan that can bring about an end to the army’s domination. Nurturing and encouraging this thought process would help build a case for the long-term wellbeing of Pakistan as well as better relations with India.

Congeniality between India and Pakistan is possible only once acts inimical to each other are stopped. Pakistan needs to stop supporting the proxy war in J&K and terrorist activities in other parts of India. Resolution of other issues, including J&K, can happen as trust and confidence between the two builds up. In the long term, good neighbourly relations would benefit both countries.

For one person, one prepaid SIM to combat cybercrime : Pb & Hry High Court

CHANDIGARH : For a exceptional proposition with concept transformative in telecommunication policy: one person, one prepaid number would be better mechanism.

The innovative initiative aims to disconnect the society from the growing menace of cybercrime.

Justice Anoop Chitkara also suggested hanging up on the issue of call routing via international cellular networks and the internet by implementing default blocking of incoming calls with international country calling codes. The subscribers, at the same time, could be given the option to opt-in at their discretion.

“This strategy guarantees that subscribers exclusively receive calls pertinent to their geographical context. For instance, individuals devoid of overseas acquaintances or relations may question the necessity of receiving calls originating from international codes featuring prefixes such as +91 or +00. Conversely, subscribers who have traveled internationally or

maintain connections abroad retain the flexibility to activate incoming calls from specific countries,” Justice Chitkara asserted.

Justice Chitkara also added the Union Ministry of Telecommunication as a respondent before directing the officer concerned to file response on an affidavit. The directions came on a petition by a Madhya Pradesh resident confined in Hisar Central Jail on allegations of facilitating cybercrime by activating and supplying SIM numbers to co-accused. The Bench was told that 35 SIM cards were issued in his name; 12 were still active.

“Why does the Ministry of Telecommunication permit individuals, firms, or companies to acquire multiple prepaid SIM cards under their name? Given



the aadhaar card is exclusively linked to a single SIM card for OTP generation, there seems to be no justification for the issuance of multiple prepaid SIM cards? Justice Chitkara questioned.

Referring to mobile phones use by minors, Justice Chitkara asserted the parents and caretakers could be given an option to obtain prepaid SIM cards associated with their Aadhaar cards. Similarly, foreign nationals should be entitled to acquire a single prepaid SIM card, contingent upon the verification and validation of their passports through OTP. Individuals seeking additional SIM cards could always opt for post-paid numbers, provided they underwent verification procedures. Any misuse would result in temporary disconnection.

Rainwater harvesting system must be sustained by July 15: Chd Admn

CHANDIGARH : Residential plots of one kanal and above, residential group housing buildings, hotels, multiplexes/malls, commercial units (converted from industrial sites), banquet halls/marriage palaces, bulk building-material buildings, timber sites, educational/ academic institutions, hostels, theatres converted into multiplexes, industrial plots above one kanal, dispensaries, hospitals, cultural and non-academic institutional sites, religious sites, buildings in IT Park, etc, are required to get the rainwater harvesting constructed, repaired or renovated before July 15, announced Deputy Commissioner Vinay

Fill in correct information for new Aadhar card : Chandigarh DC

CHANDIGARH : Out of the 1,190 applications received for aadhar card in the past one year, 627 have been rejected, mostly because the applicants were not found residing at the mentioned address during field verification.

Chairing the district-level Aadhaar monitoring committee, Deputy Commissioner Vinay Pratap Singh urged people to submit complete applications with correct details for new enrolment as the Administration conducts physical verification of each and every application.

Jagdish Kumar, Director, UIDAI, Chandigarh, said residents must keep their Aadhaar updated and ‘upload document’ feature was available on



mAadhaar app and on ‘my Aadhaar portal’ where one could upload latest proof of identity (POI) and proof of address (POA) in cases where no updation was done in the past 10 years.

The feature is accessible free of cost till September 14 online or at all Aadhaar enrolment centres for a fee of Rs 50.

The DC also appealed to parents to get their children enrolled for Aadhaar and further get the biometrics updated of children aged 5 and 15 years at nearby Aadhaar

enrolment centres. The facility is free of cost and provided in select government schools in Chandigarh as well as at Sampark centres, select post offices, bank branches, aanganwadis centres and Aadhaar Seva Kendra.

Sachin, project manager, UIDAI, suggested to update email ID in Aadhaar so that residents could get updates. At present, only 17% of Aadhaar cards from UT Chandigarh are seeded with email ID.

90% conviction to generate reduction in crime, justice within 3 yrs of FIR : Amit Shah

NEW DELHI : The new criminal laws have replaced the British-era IPC, CrPC and the Indian Evidence Act, respectively. Union Home Minister Amit Shah said on Monday that justice would be delivered up to the level of the Supreme Court in all cases within three years of the registration of an FIR under the new criminal laws. Shah expressed the hope of a reduction in crime in future as 90 per cent conviction was expected under the new laws. The Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) and the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA) came into effect on Monday. "Justice can be received up to the level of the Supreme Court within three years of the registration of the FIR," he said. The Home Minister said with the implementation of the three criminal laws, India would have the most modern



criminal justice system in the world. Shah rubbished the charge of the Opposition that the legislations were passed by Parliament after hundreds of members were suspended from both Houses, claiming that these were extensively discussed for four years with all stakeholders and he had personally held 158 meetings before finalising these. Shah said these laws were discussed in the Lok Sabha for nine hours and 29 minutes in which 34 members participated and gave their views, while in the Rajya Sabha, these were discussed for six hours and 17 minutes in which 40

members participated. He said a lie was being spread that the laws were passed after the expulsion of MPs. The Home Minister said the "expelled members" still had an option to come to the House and participate in the discussion to express their views. "After 77 years of Independence, the criminal justice system is now completely 'swadeshi' and embedded in Indian ethos," he said. "I want to tell people in the Opposition to rise above politics and support this development," he said, adding that the Centre was also open to change of names of the new laws. Shah said the first case under the new laws was about a motorcycle theft registered in Madhya Pradesh's Gwalior at 10 minutes past midnight. Shah clarified that the new laws did not give more powers to the police and the remand period would remain 15 days only.

Paddy transplantation picks up after rains, may end by July 10

KARNAL : With rainfall lashing a majority of areas on Friday afternoon, paddy transplantation has picked up pace across Karnal district, which is known as the rice bowl of the country. Farmers who have been struggling due to intense heat while transplanting paddy, have now intensified their efforts, pressing labourers into fields to expedite the process. Labourers can be seen across the district transplanting paddy. "The transplantation has picked up pace. We are hopeful that it will be completed by July 10," said Dr Wazir Singh, Deputy Director of Agriculture (DDA). Speaking about direct-seeded rice (DSR), Dr Singh said nearly 10,000 acres have been covered out of the total target of 30,000 acres.



He advised farmers to complete paddy transplantation before July 10 to ensure optimal growth and yield. Joginder, a local farmer, expressed his relief and said, "Although the rainfall was scattered, it has brought respite to farmers involved in paddy transplantation, who were waiting for rainfall." "Due to heatwave, we struggled to keep our fields irrigated for paddy transplantation. The rainfall has brought temperatures down, providing much-

needed relief from heat. Now, it is easier to keep the fields irrigated. We are working tirelessly to transplant paddy," said Ravinder, another farmer. Farmers believe timely transplantation will contribute to a good yield of paddy. Paddy is transplanted on 4.25 lakh acres in the district, with 60 per cent dedicated to non-basmati varieties and 40 per cent to basmati varieties. The Agriculture Department has noted an increase in transplantation activities. So far, nearly 55 per cent of transplantation has been completed by farmers. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted further rainfall in coming days, which is expected to facilitate the continuation of paddy transplantation.

Rs 1L cr in Odisha to be invested by Railway in next 5 yrs

AI devices, semiconductors for missiles would be developed by US and India

NEW DELHI : Both US and India would explore co-production of the Javelin anti-tank guided missile and armoured carrier Stryker. These are in addition to the procurement of long-range armed drones MQ9B and the joint-production of the General Electric's F414 jet engine for Tejas Mark 2 jets. Duo are looking at cutting-edge military technology, including military-grade semiconductors to guide long-range missiles and new artificial intelligence backed situational awareness equipment that will be jointly developed by a US company with an India-based partner. US State Department's Deputy Secretary Kurt Campbell, in an international online press briefing last week, mentioned the recent meeting of the US-India initiative for Critical and Emerging Technologies (ICET). Campbell, who was in India with the US delegation on June 17-18, led by National Security



Advisor (NSA) Jake Sullivan, said, "We are also launching a new strategic semiconductor partnership between General Atomics and 3rd ITECH to co-develop semiconductor design and manufacturing for precision-guided ammunition and other national security-focused electronics platforms". The US-India are working to expand defence industrial partnerships. He mentioned the launch of an AI multi-domain situational awareness product jointly developed by General Atomics and 114AI to support joint all-domain command and control. On the armed drones, he said the letter of offer and acceptance was delivered to India in March.

Fuel surcharge to continue till December, no browny for consumer

CHANDIGARH : The fuel surcharge adjustment (FSA), which was being levied from April 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, will continue to be levied on the non-agricultural consumers and consumers consuming less than 200 units per month for six months more. There is no relief in sight for lakhs of power consumers in Haryana in the run-up to the October Assembly elections as the Power Department has decided to continue the (FSA) of 47 paise per unit till December 2024. A circular issued by the Chief Engineers of the Uttar Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam (UHBVN) said the "existing FSA @47paise per unit on various categories of power consumers will continue till December 2024". The FSA is effected to recover the amount incurred by the power distribution companies in arranging additional electricity supply through short-term



agreements. Meanwhile, the Congress reacted sharply to the continuation of the FSA by the BJP Government. "The continuation of the FSA at a time when there is a virtually power crisis in the state in the wake of long unscheduled power cuts is unjustified and anti-people. A temporary provision like levy of the FSA should be perpetuated to put additional burden on the common man," asserted BB Batra, Congress chief whip in the Haryana Assembly. However, sources claimed that the levy of the FSA was in accordance with various rules and regulations framed by

various statutory bodies including the power regulator — the Haryana Electricity Regulatory Commission (HERC). The state government recently announced relief for the power consumers by abolishing the minimum monthly charges, the sources claimed. It may be noted that Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini announced the abolition of minimum monthly charges for domestic power consumers last month. This would mean that the people of the state would receive bills based solely on the number of units of electricity consumed.

Except Manali, garbage from other areas would not be accepted after July 15

KULLU : "After July 15, if need be, we will stop trucks from other areas, except from Manali and its suburbs, from dumping garbage at the Rangri site." He added it was for the government to look into solid waste management of other areas said Chaman Kapoor, president of the Manali Municipal Council. MC has decided to accept garbage from Kullu town, its suburbs and Lahaul at the Rangri Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF) plant till July 15 only. The president said if the contractor at the Rangri facility carried out operations in a proper manner, it was sufficient to manage the garbage of Manali and surrounding panchayats. He said an ultimatum had been given to the contractor over alleged irregularities and default in payments. The MC president alleged that the contractor had failed to instal machines to generate energy from waste, as per the agreement done by the previous body of the MC in



2017. He said yesterday about 150 tonne of garbage in five trucks from other areas reached the Rangri plant. Earlier, the Manali MC had stated that it would stop accepting waste from Kullu and Bhuntar towns, Manikaran and Banjar valleys and from Lahaul areas till Sarchu after June 21. In a meeting with the Kullu DC and other stakeholders on March 21, the other civic bodies and panchayats were directed to make arrangements for garbage management in their respective areas within three months. The National Green Tribunal (NGT) had imposed a penalty

of Rs 4.6 crore on the Manali MC on May 29 for polluting the Beas through discharge of untreated waste from the Rangri plant. The MC has approached the HC to seek relief in the matter. As of now, waste from many areas of Kullu was being sent to the RDF plant at Manali by paying Re 1 per kg to the Manali MC, as many urban, semi-urban and rural areas do not have adequate waste management systems in place. The Rangri plant was also working beyond its capacity. Over the past 5 years, the Kullu MC had been looking for a site to set up a waste treatment plant after the garbage dumping at a yard at Pirdi near Kullu town was stopped from January 2, 2019, following the orders of the NGT and later protests by locals, besides directions issued by the Supreme Court. Many sites were earmarked for setting up the waste treatment plant for Kullu town and its suburbs, but local panchayats had raised objections.

Russian triggers chaos by using bikes in Ukraine

Motorcycles carrying Russian soldiers sped into view, zig zagging across a field, kicking up dust, attempting a noisy, dangerous run at a Ukrainian trench. "They moved fast, they spread out and they swerved," said Lt. Mykhailo Hubit sky, describing the Russian motorcycle assault he witnessed.

It's a type of attack that has been proliferating along the frontline this spring, adding a wild new element to the already violent, chaotic fighting. Russian soldiers riding motorcycles, dirt bikes, quadricycles and dune buggies now account for about half of all attacks in some areas of the front, soldiers and commanders say, as Moscow's forces attempt to use speed to cross exposed open spaces where its lumbering armoured vehicles are easy targets. These nonconventional vehicles have been turning up with such frequency that some Ukrainian trenches



now overlook junk yards of abandoned, blown up off-road vehicles, videos from reconnaissance drones show.

The new tactic is the latest Russian adaptation for a heavily mined, continually surveilled battlefield, as Moscow's forces work to achieve small tactical gains, often of just a few hundred yards. The Russians farthest advance in the region is 15 miles from its starting point. "We are fighting a war over every metre," said Captain Yaroslav, an artillery commander with 80th air assault brigade. The drawback is that they provide no protection for Russian soldiers, who are

exposed to a hail of machine gun fire as they approach the trenches. If they make it across a field, the riders cast aside their bikes, enter the Ukrainian trench and engage in close combat on foot. "How they find people willing to do this, I don't know," said Volodymyr, a Ukrainian sergeant. "Sometimes, none of them will make it, sometimes all of them." That hasn't deterred Russian commanders from continuing to employ the tactic. "All the tree lines," said Sapsan, a sergeant in the 47th Brigade, "are now full of these buggies and motorcycles."

Sanjiv Mukhiya is kingpin of hatching paper leak conspiracy

Nalanda : Brain' behind NEET paper leaks who secretly harboured political ambitions is Sanjeev Mukhiya. A resident of Nalanda, Mukhiya, whose wife contested the 2020 assembly polls, is currently absconding. Investigators of Bihar's Economic Offences Unit has handed over the alleged NEET-UG paper leak probe to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), there was one person whom they conclusively named: Sanjeev Kumar 'Mukhiya. Head of what is now being called the 'Solver Gang' - an interstate network who allegedly sold solved question papers of

competitive examinations to those willing to pay.

Mukhiya, 51, is believed to have been involved in as many as five major paper leak cases, including the Bihar teachers' recruitment exam for which his son,

Mukhiya has been a technical assistant at Udyan Vidyalaya in Nalanda's Noorsarai for over 10 years, and has been named in at least four paper leak rackets both inside and outside Bihar.

.He was also arrested twice - once for a block-level examination in Bihar a decade ago and for the second time in 2016 for a suspected paper leak in Uttarakhand's constable recruitment exam.

Balak buddhi, tumse na ho paaega': PM Modi mocks at Rahul Gandhi in Lok Sabha

High level of curb over laundering in India

New Delhi: India has reached a high level of technical compliance and backed its anti-money laundering and counter terror financing efforts, while underlining the need for improvements to strengthen supervision and implementation of preventive measures in some non-financial sectors and address delays in concluding prosecutions. It also sought checks to prevent the non-profit sector from being abused for terror financing, said an official of Financial Action Task Force. Following an evaluation of the Indian regime, the agency that leads the action to tackle money laundering, terrorist and proliferation financing, said the good results included access to basic and beneficial ownership information, use



of financial intelligence, and depriving criminals of their assets and counter-proliferation financing measures. An official of the foreign ministry called it a good and an astounding outcome for India. "It is a significant achievement in that sense," said the spokesperson. Govt sources said they were waiting for FATF to publish its report, which will give detailed recommended actions, which will be analysed in detail. "India has also developed an action plan a part of its national risk

assessment. A fresh national risk assessment is also due in 2025 and all the issues flagged by FATF will be addressed in due course. But, again the issues flagged by FATF are not significant deficiencies," said a source As real estate agents, dealers in precious metals and stones, professional accountants, virtual asset service providers were brought under PMLA recently and India substantiated the sustainability of the framework.

Chandigarh: A team of doctors used the new Penumbra CAT - Rx catheter and performed thrombus aspiration, successfully removing the thrombus completely. In PGI, a team of doctors at Advanced Cardiac Centre (ACC) led by Dr Hi- manshu Gupta used a mechanical thrombus aspiration device on a 60-year-old male, who had a complicated case with 100% blocked artery of an area of the heart which was complex and clinically a challenging one .

Chandigarh: The Union home secretary has been chairing a series of meetings with the state govt officers and Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D) has created effective training modules and material for effective implementation of the new laws, remarked Gurkirat Kirpal Singh .Like a few other states, Punjab has not raised any issues with the Centre on the contents of the new laws yet. About the translation of the new criminal laws into Punjabi, the home secretary said, "We have already referred the new laws to the legal remembrancer for

translation because technical issues are involved, therefore it requires specialists. It will be completed soon." He said the new laws will come into force from July 1 and the old laws - Indian Penal Code (IPC), aCriminal Procedure Code (CrPC) and Indian Evidence Act (IEA) -will now be applicable only for the old ongoing cases. Since the process of implementation involves multiple agencies, including police, prosecution, forensics, prisons and judicial authorities, their training sessions have been conducted at various places across the state, police officials in the three new criminal laws.
