BBC documentary blown off by United States

WASHINGTON : The Biden administration has blown off questions about a controversial BBC documentary on then CM Narendra Modi's purported culpability for the 2002 Gujarat riots while vigorously taking up shared values and close ties between the US and India. Washington's stand on the BBC documentary, which the Indian government dismissed as a biased propaganda piece, follows its repudiation by London, BBC's home, where UK PM Rishi Sunak said he did not agree with the characterisation by a Pakistani-origin lawmaker that Modi was culpable for the "grave act of ethnic cleansing" in Gujarat. Peppered with questions by a Pakistani journalist on the documentary and Washington's lack of condemnation of PM Modi, state department spokesman Ned Price said he was "not aware" of the documentary, and segued into a lavish assessment of US-India ties. "What I will say broadly is that there are a number of elements that undergird the global strategic partnership that we have with our Indian partners. There are close political ties, there



are economic ties, there are exceptionally deep people-to-people ties between the US and India," he said. Washington desired regional stability, the "pace, the scope, the character of any dialogue between India and Pakistan is a matter for those two countries" New Delhi has ignored calls for talks, with Indian interlocutors viewing it as a ruse by Islamabad to seek economic help from the international community. US' remarks essentially underscored Islamabad's dimming geopolitical and economic fortunes. Common values between the US and India in the current situation in the face of misgivings in some quarters about growing intolerance against minorities in both countries saying they (US and India) are "two thriving, vibrant democracies" and "we look to everything that ties us together, and we look to reinforce all of those elements".

Govt can remit sentence, not courts : SC

NEW DELHI : DY Chandrachud CJ comprising a bench of Justices P S Narasimha and JB Pardiwala asked the Gujarat government to reconsider the convict's plea for premature release earlier rejected by the state. The Supreme Court infact has turned down the remission plea of a life convict who has spent more than 15 years in jail and said that it was a function of the government. Though one of the co-accused was released prematurely in 2017, the petitioner's plea for remission was rejected by the government as he had jumped bail and absconded for five years when granted bail



for three weeks in 2005. He was awarded life sentence and has spent over 15 years in jail. Rejecting his plea for remission, the bench said, "We are of the considered view that the state government shall freshly consider the application. Since the grant of premature release is an executive

function related to Article 162 of the Constitution, we are of the view that it is appropriate for the government to re-evaluate the matter by bearing in mind all the relevant circumstances". Aurangabad bench of Bombay high courts has granted pre-arrest bail to a trio accused by a woman from a scheduled caste community of offences of a sexual nature such as whistling and making sounds and gestures from a terrace towards her. The HC said, "Merely because some sound is created by a person in his house we cannot directly infer that it is with such an intention that it is with sexual nature towards the informant."

Had To Call Off My Yatra, enroute Security Lapses

SRINAGAR : Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra was scrapped yesterday (Friday), in Jammu and Kashmir with the Congress alleging "very serious security lapses" as the march entered the Kashmir Valley. Rahul Gandhi was to walk 20 km in Kashmir but had to stop after about a km. Former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister



Omar Abdullah, the leader of the National Conference, was with him. As Rahul Gandhi crossed the Banihal Tunnel on his way to

Srinagar, a large, unexpected crowd was waiting for him, said Congress leader. Congress leader Rajni Patil tweeted that the administration "failed to provide security to the Bharat Jodo Yatra" and that the security lapses indicated "unfair and unprepared attitude joined the Yatra as he was concerned about the image of the country."

Why has BBC raked up Modi issue

Now British Broadcasting Corporation has resurrected the events of Gujarat of 2002 as if a Shylock wants a pound of flesh from Narendra Modi. They are blowing the rusty fog horns of those biased new articles and motivated inquiries that have tried to keep Indian Muslims locked in perpetual victimhood. Colonialism is still alive at the British Broadcasting Corporation.

Its documentary India: The Modi Question recalls a bygone era where gora sahibs used to oversee matters for their subjects and pronounce them right or wrong. But how often have these foreign nawabs introspected on the excesses wrought by the British Empire upon Indians? India was ruled by the British who proclaimed that their moral obligation was to 'civilise' us. Instead they left us divided, abused, emptied and stolen from. So an India of riots and communal disruptions was born out of the seeds of hatred the British sowed. But now we have moved on. We are inching towards a better India. But opinions that have stagnated refuse to relieve us of victimhood. The law believes in the principle of innocent until proven guilty and Modi has been absolved by the highest court of India from all the allegations made against him. Why would audiences believe in the investigation carried out

by some foreign broadcaster who had no locus to do so in the first place?

BBC's ethical track record anyway has many questions to answer over the decades-from the role of its journalists in faking documents to secure an interview of Princess Diana to the terribly biased coverage of the Israel-Palestine conflict by Tala Halawa to showing fake footage of child labour in Bangalore. Such episodes do not inspire confidence about accurate reporting when it comes to India.

The present documentary on India's PM not only looks like a web of selective truths, there may also be some jealousy in play here, as India has toppled the UK to become the world's fifth largest economy. Going further, there could be an underlying agenda of feeding our insecurities. Constant hammering of victimhood starts chains of discontent and unrest. Muslim youth from Kashmir to Kerala who joined terrorist groups were brainwashed in precisely this manner. In case of an untoward situation, our Constitution have provided safeguards, and these are at short disposal. In the battles that Indian Muslims need to fight and, win within the ambit of the Constitution, no alien solicitor is needed to make their case.

There is also an exaggerated narrative of how Indian Muslims are being persecuted through recent laws. The law against triple

talaq does not infringe on personal rights as a Muslim but in fact restores equality in accordance with the tenets of Islam. Likewise the very people who are paranoid about how the demography of Kashmir will change after Article 370's repeal, ironically downplay the anxiety about demographic change in the context of growing Muslim populations elsewhere. And many of those who emphasise protecting minority rights in India falter when it comes to protection of Hindus and Sikhs in Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan. If Muslims are not safe in India, why should CAA (Citizenship Amendment Bill) invite Muslims of neighbouring countries to India? The Shaheen Bagh brouhaha was over neighbouring countries' Muslims who are not even persecuted on religious basis. The fact is that India, the land of my ancestors, continues to welcome anyone who comes to add glory to the country. The cause espoused by extremists and terrorists will never be allowed to flourish. When the government gives a call for Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas, it would be inclusive of Muslims. Indeed an ideal path has been evolved, we have found a place in the country's growth story like never before and has developed an international recognition the world over.

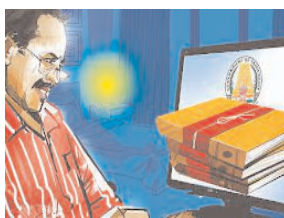

PANCHKULA : The area in Sector 20 was not earmarked as a green belt. NGT (National Green Tribunal) allowed the (Haryana Shehri Vikas Pradhikaran (HSVP), to carry out any construction work on its own, provided prior proper permission for felling of trees would be obtained from the authority concerned on behalf of the HSVP.

In a major relief to the the National Green Tribunal (NGT) has decided in favour of the estate agency for cutting down 3,500 trees from the forest area of Sector 20 in the city. The NGT gave the directions while hearing the matter on January 12 in New Delhi. The office-bearers of the Residents Welfare Association (RWA), Sector 20, had filed a case in the NGT against the construction of 4,500 Ashiana flats for economically weaker sections by felling trees in the forest area. The NGT had summoned both sides for hearing their views in the matter and deliver its final judgment. Estate Officer Gagandeep Singh along with executive engineer and four advocates were present on behalf of the HSVP, while the RWA, Sector 20, was represented by its vice-



Paperless work planned by Edu deptt with 'e-dak' portal

CHANDIGARH : The Paperless scheme aims to bring transparency to the system and reduce the burden on school teachers by eliminating the need for physical travel to hand over letters of communication. By communicating through email on the portal, the department will ensure that all communication is recorded and timestamped, providing transparency and accountability. The Chandigarh Education Department is implementing a paperless system with the introduction of "e-dak" portal, through which all communication from the District Education Office and the office of the Director of School Education will be sent via email on the portal itself. The portal also allows for easy tracking of correspondence, with the ability to see if emails have been read or not, reducing the likelihood of important information being missed. Sharing the details, Director of School Education, Harsuhinder Pal Singh Brar, said, "On an average, around 112 people would commute physically to hand over the letters of communication from schools to education office and vice versa. With the introduction of the "e-dak" portal, all communication will be sent with the click of a button. By eliminating the need for physical travel to hand over letters of communication, the

department can reduce the burden on school teachers. Teachers will no longer have to spend time and effort travelling to the Education Department office to deliver or collect letters, allowing them to focus on their primary responsibilities of teaching and educating students." "Overall, the paperless system will increase efficiency and streamline communication within the department, ultimately reducing the burden on teachers and allowing them to better serve their students," said Brar. The department is also planning to introduce a Staff Management System for online leave applications and medical bill submissions, as well as a grievance redressal mechanism. Additionally, the department will have its own "online transfer teacher policy" for government school teachers starting April 1, allowing for rationalisation and adjustment of subject teachers in schools facing shortages.

Excise & Taxation Department seals 5 bottling plants sans fire safety certificate

CHANDIGARH : Five bottling plants have been sealed by Excise and Taxation Department for not getting a valid fire safety certificate issued by the Municipal Corporation.

After a fire broke out at M/s Batra Distilleries Private Limited on October 27 last year, leading to the closure of the plant, the department had asked such units through notices to submit fire safety certificate. On account of non-compliance and non-submission of the certificate, the department sealed five bottling plants and imposed a penalty of Rs 10 lakh each on these. These plants are M/s Highfield Distillers and Bottlers Pvt Ltd, M/s Oasis Distilleries Ltd, M/s All Aces Distilleries and Bottlers Pvt Ltd, M/s



Zannat Beverages Pvt Ltd and Queen Distilleries & Bottlers Pvt Ltd. The department clarified that there was zero tolerance policy against any violation of norms laid down in the Excise Policy and the Excise Act. After receiving information about violations such as underpricing, officials of the department sealed the two liquor vends at Sector 9 and Sector 45 last evening. They were complaints about vends selling liquor at prices below the minimum retail sale price.

Nadda to continue BJP head till June 2024

NEW DELHI : BJP is destined to win the 2024 Lok Sabha polls with a bigger mandate than 2019 margin and the party has extended the term of current chief JP Nadda till June next year, beyond the Lok Sabha polls falling due next year, said Amit Shah, Union Home minister. Nadda's continuation though was a foregone conclusion as the party's parliamentary board had given its consent for the extension of his term a few months ago. Shah made the announcement formally at a press conference saying that Nadda has utilised the popularity and charisma of PM Narendra Modi in winning polls and expanding the party's footprint across the country. Rajnath Singh Defence minister said the resolution was passed unanimously by the national executive



committee members in presence of PM Modi, who was in attendance at the meeting through the day. Under the leadership of PM Modi and organisational headship of JP Nadda, BJP will win with a bigger margin in 2024 and Modi ji will be the PM once again." "BJP is the popular democratic party in the country and its organisational polls take place in a democratic manner. The elections for the national team take place after an extensive membership drive followed by polls from the booth level to the state, said Mr Shah Home minister. He asserted that BJP values the system of democratic processes.

"Right from the days of Jan Sangh's establishment to date, BJP has conducted elections from booth to the national president as mandated by our Constitution.

Following immaculate methods of democracy election officials are appointed, voters' lists are made and only then the polling begins," he added.

He said that due to the pandemic, the party could not carry out the membership drives in time, on account of which holding of the polls to elect the national president is not possible as per the party constitution.

"Even in the past, the tenures of party chiefs had been extended in different times to tackle different circumstances. Following this tradition the national executive committee decided to extend the tenure of JP Nadda," he said.

The vulture has adapted to the conditions of Chandu wetland and is actively feeding. We are monitoring it and intervene only when required," said Wildlife Inspector Rajesh Chahal. The Wildlife Department has formed special teams to monitor a black vulture (Coragyps atratus) that has been spotted at Chandu



wetland here. The range of black vulture extends from northeastern United States of America to Peru, Central Chile and Uruguay in South America. There is no previous record of its migration to South

Asia.

The presence of an exotic bird here has attracted birdwatchers from across the region. Fearing its capture for illegal trade, the Wildlife Department has stepped up vigil. According to experts, the species doesn't migrate beyond its territory and the sighting is probably a result of illegal wildlife trade. As per the Wildlife Department, the vulture was spotted by a guide, Ram Kumar, who works at of Sultanpur Sanctuary, on January 27.

Religious bodies ignore action on encroachments

FARIDABAD : Since, the number of encroachments on government land could be more than 300 at present, action against the majority of encroachers is pending, according to civic body sources. The district authorities are yet to come up with a fresh survey to check for encroachments on the government land under the garb of religious spots and structures in the city. About 118 encroachments were found in a survey carried out in 2010-11, but no survey has been conducted in the past 12 years. The number of encroachments might have doubled during this period, claim the sources, adding that the majority of illegal constructions have come up in green belt areas, parks and open spaces. "Traffic movement is interrupted by a large number of devotees every Thursday on the Neelam-Bata road

due to the presence of a "mazar" right in the middle of the road (road median)," says a resident, Vishnu Goel. He said recently an attempt to raze a 25-year-old temple in the NIT zone here was abandoned in view of the protest. Setting up of a gurdwara in the Sector-11 park led to a protest by residents in 2018, who filed a petition with the NGT. Though the NGT directed action against the encroachment, the matter is still pending in the High Court, according to Vikas Singh, a resident. "Despite standing court orders For a check to prevent the menace, no action has been taken against encroachments," said another resident, Varun Sheokand. Ombir Singh, Chief Engineer, Municipal Corporation, Faridabad said the demolition of encroachments has become tough in view of the mass opposition and protests.

Opioid addiction threatens as increase stares 4 times in 6 years

ROHTAK : As per the official data, the total number of opioid-dependent patients (including new and follow-up cases) registered at the centre jumped from 1,261 in 2017 to 5,613 by the end of 2022. The rapid increase in the cases of addiction to opioids in the state has become a cause for concern for the medical experts. Sources point out that the number of opioid-dependent patients registered at the State Drug Dependence Treatment Centre (SDDTC) in Rohtak has recorded more than four-fold increase in the past six years. Opioids include heroin, brown sugar (smack), opium and certain medical drugs used to relieve pain etc. "Easy availability of opioids is the main reason behind the



sharp rise in the cases of opioid abuse. Concerted efforts on part of the de-addiction specialists and law-enforcement agencies are required to break the drug-supply chain," observes Dr Rajiv Gupta, Director-cum-CEO of the Institute of Mental Health (IMH), Rohtak. He points out that the medical drugs used as opioid substitutes are also being abused by the persons who are dependent on opioids. NS Deswal, project director, Red Cross Centre for De-addiction and Rehabilitation in Rohtak, concedes that a

number of drug-dependent persons visiting the centre take medical drugs as intoxicants. Such intoxicating drugs are being sold at chemist shops without the mandatory medical prescription, but the government agencies have failed to check the illegal practice. The authorities concerned pin hopes on the sale of such medical drugs through Saathi app, which is being promoted by the Haryana Government to regulate the sale of such habit-forming drugs. "All chemists will be registered with the said app. A pilot project has been successfully launched at Sonapat," said Mandeep Maan, Drug Control Officer, Rohtak.

Vacancy of technical member of PSERC hangs fire for 9 months

PATIALA : The PSERC is a three-member body with one chairman and two members. "There is no technical member to deal with various technical issues and tariff-related petitions. In absence of technical members all issues are decided by the chairman, who is a retired bureaucrat," said All-India Power Engineers Federation spokesperson VK Gupta. "The state has adopted an indifferent attitude in filling the post," he added. The post of a technical member for the Punjab State Electricity Regulatory Commission (PSERC) has been lying vacant since May last year. The government had initiated the selection process but no



headway has been made despite a couple of months left before the power regulator will determine the power tariff for 2023-24. The government had issued an advertisement in May for the post with the last date of application as May 30, 2022. The three-member selection committee comprises a retired judge of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, the Chief Secretary, Punjab, and Chairman of the Central Electricity Regulatory Commission as members.

"The post will be filled soon," said a top government official. "We are in the middle of filling this post and also that of the CMD, PSPCL, on a regular basis," added the officer. Meanwhile the Electricity Amendment Bill 2022, which is yet to be passed by Parliament, has now proposed one chairman and three other members for the state electricity regulatory commission. The PSEB Engineers' Association general secretary Ajay Pal Singh Atwal wrote in a letter to the government, "If these posts are kept vacant, the upcoming paddy season will be challenging for the power sector and consumers will face power interruptions."

Tonnes of manure pile up at biogas plants for want of requisite norms

CHANDIGARH : Many companies, whose projects for setting up compressed biogas plants (CBG) have been approved, are waiting to set up plant only when a clear policy to sell and/or use manure formed by the government. Thousands of tonnes of manure, a by-product derived during the production of the compressed biogas (automotive fuel) and biogas power (electricity), is piling up at various plants in the state, installed to use crop stubble as raw material. There is no policy yet that allows the sale of manure produced by these biogas plants. While the in-situ management of stubble has failed to give the desired results in Punjab,

considering the high incidents of stubble burning – over 53,000 – reported in 2022, the focus on ex-situ management of crop stubble has also taken a hit because of the lack of policy for sale of the manure. Interestingly, farmers have been critical of in-situ stubble management due to huge costs involved and also because of the rise of rodent population in fields where this crop residue management method has been adopted. Sukha Singh, a farmer of Alamgir village in Ludhiana district, says most farmers would be more than happy to earn money by selling stubble if it was collected from their fields. "We will also like to use manure. But the government does not seem to promote this



and wants farmers to spend money on buying expensive machinery, fuel and rodenticides to deal with rodents when we opt for in-situ stubble management," he rued. Ashish Kumar, Managing Director, Verbio India, the Indian subsidiary of Verbio AG, which has set up the biggest bio-energy plant in India at Lehragaga in Sangrur, said 25,000 tonnes of manure was lying at the unit site. "This time, our plant worked at 30 per cent of its capacity. We started giving manure to farmers

for free in the catchment area of the unit, but still stocks are piling up. The norms of the fertilizer control order have to be amended before we can start selling manure. It is only through the sale of the manure, along with the bio-fuel, that the plant will be economically viable," he said. The plant was inaugurated by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann in October last year, he added. Sanjeev Nagpal, who has a biogas-based plant in Fazilka, said, "I was selling manure to farmers at Rs 4 per kg. But then the licence has not been renewed, though I have applied for it several times. Since stocks of manure piled up to 5,000 tonnes, I was forced to stop using paddy straw as raw material. Now, I use only cow

dung. My plant is running at just 20 per cent of its capacity." Gurwinder Singh, Director, Agriculture, said the government was aware of the problems faced by plants while disposing off manure. He said the rules say that the manure produced by these plants had to be tested for three years in a row for nutrients present in it. "The tests for the first year have been done by scientists at PAU, Ludhiana. These are, however, inconclusive. The management of these plants are not even applying to get the manure tested. These tests are important to find the nutrient value of manure and whether it can replace any chemical fertiliser, before allowing its sale and use by buyers," he said.

AAP knocks at Apex Court's door on MCD Mayor polls

NEW DELHI : Mr Virendra Sachdeva, BJP working president demanded that Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal states what the party's problem in electing a Mayor was when it had a majority in the House.

After two adjourned House sessions of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi, where elections for the posts of mayor, deputy mayor and six members of the standing committee could not take place, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Thursday said its Mayoral candidate Shelly Oberoi and Leader of the House Mukesh Goyal had moved the Supreme Court asking that the elections be held "immediately".

The AAP's Oberoi also sought prohibition on voting by the 10 Aldermen, who were nominated by Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena and belong to the Bharatiya Janata Party. The BJP hit back, alleging that the move



stemmed from a purported bid by the AAP to deliberately postpone the MCD's internal polls as it did not have faith in its elected councillors.

"The AAP has moved the Supreme Court through its Leader of the House and Mayor candidate. We have placed two major demands in the apex court, the first is to elect the mayor in a time-bound manner and form the government in the MCD; second, as Aldermen do not have the right to vote under Article 243R of the Constitution and Section 3 of the DMC Act, they should be prohibited from casting votes," said Saurabh Bharadwaj

AAP national spokesperson . The court should complete this process as soon as possible because the BJP and the central government will not complete (it)... Aldermen in principle and in law are unelected nominees and do not have the right to vote under Article 243R of the Constitution and Section 3 of the DMC Act. But the BJP wants to get them to vote by resorting to hoolliganism. The Supreme Court should also give strict orders in this matter to the central government and the administration of the MCD in this regard," Bharadwaj added.

UK to play third umpire on Kashmir during Pakistan Army chief's visit

LONDON : Despite India taking over Britain in terms of economy and global clout, UK still harbours illusions over the Indian sub-continent and likes to play in the Af-Pak region with the help of Pakistan.

The Taliban takeover of Kabul in 2021 has been the disastrous consequence of this UK-Pak devil play with Afghan minorities and women thrown to Islamist wolves. Indians during the under Narendra Modi is a bigger economy than UK, still has delusions of an imperial power and has a colonial mindset towards India and still plays the Af-Pak region with a traditional bias towards Islamist Pakistan and Rawalpindi GHQ.

While UK state broadcaster BBC with directions from the foreign office chose to rake up the 2002 Gujarat riots despite Indian Supreme Court's clean chit to PM Modi with an eye towards 2024 elections, the Pakistan and UK Army have decided to jointly host regional stability conference in England to discuss among other things the so-called Kashmir dispute.

While neither UK nor Pakistan has any locus standi in UT of Jammu and Kashmir, Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir at the invitation of the Rishi Sunak government is scheduled to address 5th joint UK-Pak stabilization conference at Wilton Park between Feb 5-8. Wilton Park is an executive agency of UK foreign office apparently providing a platform for strategic discussions. Co-hosted by UK Army Chief Gen P N Y M Sanders, the conference is themed "Regional Stability in South Asia: the return of geopolitics and other challenges." The conference will focus on the Ukraine war impact on EU, UK, and its consideration for

Pakistan, which has provided weapons and ammunition to Ukraine secretly using RAF aircraft. The duplicitous role of Pakistan in the Ukraine war must not be forgotten as it was then Pakistan

Prime Minister Imran Khan Niazi who was feted by President Vladimir Putin in Moscow on February 24, 2022, when the Russian strongman decided to invade neighbouring Ukraine. The other topics of discussion are the role of information operations, cyber-attack in warfare, evolving south Asian regional stability, security challenges and an update on the Kashmir dispute.

When the Modi government decided to abrogate temporary Article 370 and Article 35 A in the context of Jammu and Kashmir on August 5, 2019, the UK had expressed its concerns to India and advocated the situation to remain calm between India and Pakistan. UK played a double game in the UN post-abrogation Article 370 as on August 16, 2019, it sided with Pakistan's iron brother China and Kuwait and wanted the UN Security Council to discuss the Kashmir issue but US would have nothing of it and said the matter should be discussed between India and Pakistan bilaterally. In the second round of meeting on the same day, UK and again appeared to be on the side of Pakistan in wanting a discussion on the issue but US and France again came to India's support then U government bilaterally between India double By discussing the so-called "Kashmir dispute" next month with Pakistan Army Chief Gen Asim Munir, the UK is trying to play the role of a third umpire, for which there is no provision under the rules of the Kashmir game.



EPFO's plan to review high pension payout cases sparks concern

NEW DELHI : The cases of employees who retired prior to September 1, 2014 without exercising any option under paragraph 11(3) of the pre-amended Employees' Pension Scheme, 1995 and were granted pension on higher wages need to be re-examined.

The Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) on reopening cases of higher pension for those who retired prior to September 2014 has evoked concern among sections of such pensioners that they may lose the benefit which they have been enjoying for the past five years or so.

Why the issue of higher pension



had to be reopened. The cases of employees who retired prior to September 1, 2014 without exercising any option under paragraph 11(3) of the pre-amended Employees' Pension Scheme, 1995 (EPS-95) and were granted pension on higher wages "need to be re-examined", it said. It was for this purpose that the payment of higher pension should be stopped. In other words, it had to be ensured that such pensioners

"are not given higher pension from the month of January 2023", the circular said, adding that their pension would now be revised based on the salary ceiling of Rs 5,000 or Rs 6,500. Paragraph 11(3) dealt with the matter of maximum pensionable salary. It also talked of an arrangement for employees and employers to give a joint option for allowing to the Pension Fund the remittance of a proportionate portion of the employers' contribution on wages higher than the statutory ceiling The second feature of the paragraph was removed through an amendment to the Pension Scheme, effective September 1, 2014.

Nadda to continue BJP head till June 2024

The battery plant is being set up to meet the growing needs of Ola's electric vehicles business, and this flows from the company winning production-linked incentive (PLI) benefits under the government's advanced cell chemistry (ACC) for EV batteries.
