## Indus Waters Treaty being interfered by Pak' breach of ceasefires

Cautioning Pakistan, it should stop blaming India for the breach of the Indus Waters Treaty, as the unrelenting cross-border terrorism from its soil is interfering with the treaty's implementation. Addressing the plenary session of the first UN conference on glaciers in Tajikistan's Dushanbe on Friday, Minister of State for Environment Kirti Vardhan Singh said that Pakistan itself was violating the treaty through terrorism. We are appalled at the

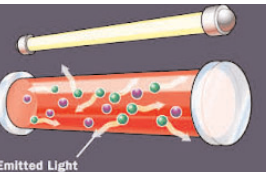

since the Indus Waters Treaty was signed, which requires a reassessment of the treaty's obligations. These changes include technological advancements, demographic changes, climate change and the ongoing threat of cross-border terrorism, he said.

## Does "XENON" gas energises exuberantly & positively

Chandigarh : Mountaineering by 4 British climbers has last week turned the adventurous climb into a much easier ordeal. The task undertaken by the Londoners was hard to be believed. Such adventure took place by inhaling of XENON gas where prolonging period for adjustment into hill air , was to take acclimatisation. The secret weapon " " "Xenon " gas triggered the scaling pace and rolled the world of mountaineering on Everest, claimed the organisers of the expedition. The XENON gas was the accelerating tool of the speed in climbing the Everest summit. The performance enhancer of the delegation comprising 4 climbers made one of the sporting 's greatest accomplishments. The consumption might be the provocation particularly for the traditional mountaineers who realised emotionally tempered on hearing of scaling the sum-



mit through XENON mantra. The scaling over to the summit in less than a week, was sensitized by Lukus Furtenbach. Mr Lukus announced beginning 2026 ,he devised a plan to offer 2 week routine trip picnic to Everest by inhaling gas XENON. Hence, the future of commercially guided mountaineering over Everest. The gas and odorless had been known to activate a molecule called the hypoxiainducible factor which is also turned on when people acclimate to low oxygen opined a mountaineers and Professor of University College London Mr Hugh Montgomery. Mr Montgomery had led an expedition to Everest to study how hams responded to low oxygen.

## Indian military chief laments loss of fighter jets in May conflict

New Delhi : India's military has acknowledged for the first time that an unspecified number of its fighter jets were shot down during strikes on Pakistani-controlled territory amid intense fighting between the neighbors in early May. Indian officials had previously refused to confirm even a single aircraft loss. Asked on Saturday if Pakistan was correct in its claim that "six Indian jets" were downed, Anil Chauhan, the chief of defense staff of the Indian Armed Forces, initially



denied the veracity of the claim, stating: "Absolutely incorrect and that is not information which, as I said, is important." But he went on to say that "what is important is why they went down," seeming to imply that a number of jets were shot down during fighting between the historic foes/.

Blood and water can not flow together in mutual relations

Our defence experts decided that Pakistan's Army chief (now Field Marshal) Syed Asim Munir, was the main culprit. But the first shot had been fired by Lt Gen Ahmed Sharif Choudhary, D G - I S P R , immediately after the Jaffer Express fiasco. He vowed 'badla' (revenge) and blamed R&AW for the train hijack. Certainly, this was accentuated by the highly provocative statement on the 'two-nation' theory by Munir. It may be appropriate to recount that the diabolic drift in the Pakistan army was initiated by Gen Zia-ul-Haq, who was IMA-trained, St Stephen's college-educated and hailed from Jalandhar. Zia gave the Pakistan army a theological twist, with the new motto — 'Iman, Jihad-fi-Sabillillah' — and, most surprisingly, added the defence of ideological frontiers in its role. Gen Munir is now a sort of outlier and 'dark horse', a rare OTS achiever, with an intelligence (DGMI and DGISI) background. His posting profile is peppered with India-f o c u s s e d appointments. After nearly two and a half years at the helm, there is no point in being surprised at his 'mullah' orientation. Born to an 'imam' father, hailing from

Jalandhar, he had a madrasa education. Like Zia, his parents are both Punjabi and m o h a j i r . Surprisingly, he earned the title of Hafiz by attending the Koran recitation course in Saudi Arabia, while on d i p l o m a t i c assignment. Munir's description of Kashmir as the “jugular vein” is not new; it has been a constant theme with Pakistani generals. Only a few years back, Gen Kayani described the same phrase in Urdu as India's 'shah rug' — Munir, in fact, has inappropriately termed it as Pakistan's “jugular vein.” The timing of Munir's uncalled-for diatribe was probably triggered by his yearning to recover his p l u m m e t i n g popularity. He was also unsettled by the growing dissent in junior ranks, coupled with recent statements by the former and more moderate Army chief, Gen Jehangir Karamat and other senior veterans, calling for a review of the ongoing m i s m a n a g e d operations in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Baluchistan. While China is the primary and c o m p l i c a t e d adversary, Pakistan remains the persistent and prickly one. Pakistan considers India the

raison-d'etre for its existence, and seeks parity and attention. It certainly has the propensity to continue to surprise us — unveiling the 6th Armoured Division in 1965, invading India at Kargil in 1999 and more recently, using s o p h i s t i c a t e d Chinese missiles and weaponry in the recent conflict with India. It is time to make amends so that we begin to acquire a m e a n i n g f u l understanding of Pakistan. Critical to our study will be the ability to differentiate between three segments of the population — the m i l i t a r y e s t a b l i s h m e n t, mullahs (clergy) and the awaam (public). Significantly, despite limited or no government contact in the last decade or so, the Internet remains porous. People on both sides of the Radcliffe Line i n Punjabcommunicate in Shahmukhi (Punjabi written in the Persian-derived script). But for some mystical reason, the decision to set up the S h a h m u k h i Linguistic Centre at Panjab University was dropped after the VC changed in 2018; although Panjab University in Lahore did set up its G u r m u k h i Department and Chair later.

Hardware, software components of parking project discussed in MC sub-panel meeting

CHANDIGARH : Key features such as pink parking provisions for women, Internet connectivity for real-time parking management, pre-booking of paid parking slots, and pre-paid parking cards for use across Chandigarh were discussed and finalised in the sub panel meeting. Under the chairmanship of Saurabh Joshi, meeting of the committee to finalise the Smart Parking Solution Project of the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh (MCC), was held. The meeting was attended by Umesh Ghai, councillor, and officials concerned of the MCC. The committee held detailed deliberations on various aspects of the smart parking project, including the overall scope of work, hardware and software components, and the eligibility and technical criteria for prospective bidders. The committee also reviewed terms related to service level



agreement (SLA) penalties for non-compliance with the request for proposal (RFP) conditions, technical audit of IT tools and the inclusion of a panic button feature in pink parking zones. Additional aspects finalised included mobile app and web portal-based slot booking, portal cabin specifications, stamp duty clauses and surrender/exit terms for the service. Meanwhile, a delegation from the Chandigarh Traders Association Sector 17 led by Kamaljit Singh Panchi also submitted suggestion that a dedicated mobile application should be developed through which users could view real-time availability of parking spot.

AI-powered tools scouted by Hry Police to check cybercrime

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : Officers from various departments in a meeting were briefed on Saturday by DCP Crime Amit Dahiya on the strategic use of digital tools in policing. To modernise policing and strengthen cyber vigilance, the Panchkula police have determined to adopt AI-powered mobile applications. Among the digital tools introduced were the Sanchar Saathi app, which helps block lost or stolen mobile phones, and the Telecom Analytics for Fraud Management and Consumer Protection (TAFMCP) portal, which allows individuals to check and report unauthorised SIM cards registered in their name. The DCP shed light on the Chakshu portal, designed for reporting frauds and scams, especially those carried out via phone calls and messaging apps. The Bhashini app, capable of translating text and speech across languages, was also demonstrated. The cop said this tool could prove valuable not only for the



police but also for the general public, especially in multilingual scenarios. A live demonstration of these tools was conducted for officers. The DCP said similar workshops will be held regularly and their outcomes reviewed to ensure improvement. DCP Dahiya highlighted that technological advancement was not just an option but a necessity for effective policing in the digital age. Using a video presentation, he demonstrated how the integration of smart applications could significantly reduce response time, enhance transparency, and help in tracking criminals more swiftly. He emphasised that keeping pace with evolving cyber threats was crucial.

60 small flats allottees asked to vacate flats by CHB

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The Chandigarh Housing Board (CHB) had issued eviction notices to allottees of 60 small flats. They have been given one month to vacate the flats in the past four days.



The CHB has started the proceedings for eviction of allottees of small flats who have failed to deposit the prescribed licence fee. The occupants have u n a u t h o r i s e d l y occupied dwelling units from December last year. The allotment of the units was cancelled over non-payment of licence fee and the dues had risen to Rs 1 lakh or more in each case. The CHB ordered them to vacate the premises within one month from the date of service of notice, failing which they will be evicted forcibly. On May 19, the notices were issued to 10 allottees in Ram Darbar and six in

Sector 49. On May 21, notices were issued two flats in Sector 56. The next day, eviction orders were issued for a total of 16 flats in Sector 14 (West) Dhanas, 10 in Sector 56 and 16 small flats in Sector 38 (West). The CHB had constructed about 20,000 flats in different areas of the city under the Small Flats Scheme-2006. These flats were allotted to poor families who lived in slum colonies. The terms of allotment included that the allottees have to deposit the monthly rent of Rs 800 with the board. Most allottees have failed to pay rent for the past several years. The dues added up to Rs 2 lakh or more each.

MC duped of crores in booking of community centres, AAP demands CBI probe into free bookings

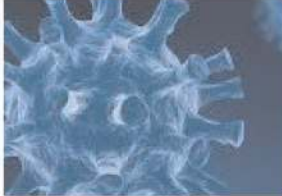


CHANDIGARH : AAP city unit president Vijaypal Singh, general secretary Sunny Aulakh, leader of Opposition in the Municipal Corporation House Jaswinder Kaur, other councilors in a press conference alleged that the civic body has been duped of crore through fake bookings made under the name of “poor people”. Alleging misappropriation of funds, the leaders of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) have demanded a CBI or vigilance inquiry into free bookings of the community centres under false names and using forged signatures of officials concerned.

Councillor, Yogesh Dhirra demanded that inquiry be marked for all bookings made free of cost. He took note of the 140 bookings at the Sector 37 community centre, saying 102 were made free of cost. He alleged that the “organised exploitation” was carried out through forged documents, fake stamps of councilors, falsified signatures and manipulation by middlemen posing as municipal staff.

Meanwhile, said his signature had been forged for one of the bookings. In one case, he noted, an applicant with no connection with his ward was provided free booking. Singh urged the entire community centre booking process be immediately made fully digital via the e-office portal to eliminate middlemen and unauthorised agents and to curb revenue leaks and manipulation in manual processes. AAP leaders also demanded an immediate withdrawal of the agenda for increasing the booking rates.

Covid cases climb to four in Panchkula



PANCHKULA : Local health teams are reportedly monitoring the situation and urge the public to remain vigilant, maintain hygiene and seek medical attention promptly in case of symptoms. The number of active Covid-19 cases in Panchkula climbed to four on Sunday, according to Dr Mukta Kumar, Chief Medical Officer at Civil Hospital, Sector 6. While the latest case has not been disclosed by the authorities, the two previous cases were from the same family. These include a mother and her son from Sector 12A who sought medical advice after

experiencing cold, cough and fever. Their diagnosis was confirmed through testing at a private healthcare facility. Health authorities have reported that both individuals are recovering well and are under home isolation. Notably, neither of them has a history of recent travel. Earlier in the week on Thursday, a 29-year-old

resident of Sector 21 tested positive following her return from Bengaluru. She had approached a local clinic after developing a fever and is currently isolating at her residence. With another covid-positive individual reported by Sunday evening, the total number of active cases in Panchkula district has risen to four. Meanwhile, neighbouring Chandigarh recently recorded the region's first Covid-19 fatality of the year. A 40-year-old patient, referred from Ludhiana, passed away at the Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH), Sector 32.

Addition of garbage collection charges to property tax deplored by several traders



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The MC had imposed garbage collection charges of Rs 9,844 and added the same to his property tax bill for 2025-26, said a trader of Sector 22, Nareesh Malhotra in a letter written to Mayor, Harpreet Babla. A large number of city traders has taken an exception to the Municipal Corporation's decision of adding garbage collection charges to the property tax. They claim that while the MC has failed to ensure proper garbage collection in markets, it has started charging the garbage collection fee. Malhotra claimed that neither garbage was being collected from the premises nor any person had been deputed to clean area near his SCO. Asking why should he pay a huge amount as the garbage collection charges to the MC in advance, he has requested the Mayor to look into the matter. Sanjiv Chadha , president of Chandigarh Beopar Mandal, said he had been receiving similar complaints from many markets. When the MC had failed to put in

place a proper garbage collection system in markets, why it was levying the charges for the same, he asked. Chadha said there was no reason to add the garbage charges to the property tax bills. He said charging the fees in advance was also wrong. He added that there is no arrangement for garbage collection in Burali for two years, but the MC is still charging the traders for garbage collection. Alleging harassment of the traders by the MC, the CBM president said there was a total mismanagement in the system as people were still getting bills on old rates. He reiterated the demand for extending the last date for depositing the property tax. Chander Verma, president, Chandigarh Business Council, has also opposed the practice of adding the garbage collection

100 CTU diesel buses on expiry of operational lifespan to go off tricity roads in November



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : After reaching their operational lifespan, the buses will no longer be roadworthy and have to be removed from the local routes, said officials of the UT Transport Department. Commuters in the tricity would have to face inconvenience as nearly 100 diesel buses of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU) operating on local routes will be condemned in November this year. These 100 aging diesel buses, currently operating from Depot No. 4, are to be replaced by electric buses. The existing fleet, which includes non-AC green and AC red automatic diesel buses, was allotted to the city under a special scheme during the 2010 Commonwealth

Games in Delhi. The department had submitted a proposal to the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for the procurement of environment-friendly buses under the Central government's PM e-Bus Sewa scheme so that the Administration can process the tender at its level and buy 100 electric buses as replacement of diesel buses. However, the proposal is yet to be approved. Officials stated that it was now certain that even if the approval was received, there would be a

shortage of buses on the local route by the end of this year, as it would take at least two to three months to finalise the tender process and select the company. Even if the process was completed by August or September, the selected company would not be able to deliver 100 buses till November, they added. The shortage of buses would affect routes of Chandigarh as well as Mohali and Panchkula as only CTU buses run for public transportation in the tricity. Officials said buses could be diverted from the long routes to the local routes, but it would affect the long routes, from which the CTU gets more revenue. About 350 buses of CTU run on local routes while about 230 run on long routes.

Operation Sindoor likely to be discussed in special Parliament session on June 16

**NEW DELHI :** The sources revealed the decision on holding the session was likely to be taken once the seven multi-party delegations — currently visiting key partner countries to convey India's message of zero-tolerance against terrorism — returned to India. The delegations are expected to be back this week. The Opposition has stepped up its demand after Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan acknowledged at an event in Singapore on Saturday the loss of air assets during the recent conflict with Pakistan. The Centre is likely to convene a special session of Parliament to discuss Operation Sindoor on June 16. This comes amid growing Opposition



asked the government to call a special session in June, ahead of the Monsoon session slated for July. The Opposition had first raised the demand soon after the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, which had claimed 26 lives. The demand was also raised at an all-party meeting held to inform MPs about Operation Sindoor. India had carried out precision strikes on nine terror infrastructure sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir on May 7 in response to the terror attack. Following the action, Pakistan attempted to attack military bases on May 8, 9, and 10. The Indian side responded strongly by hitting Pakistan airbases.

Mamata opposing Operation Sindoor to appease minorities : Amit Shah

**Kolkata :** In a call to uproot the TMC government from power, leaders and workers here, Home Minister Amit Shah Assembly polls, asserted that the tenure of Banerjee as the CM will end in 2026. Mr Shah on Sunday launched a blistering attack on West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, accusing her of “stooping low” by opposing Operation Sindoor and the Waqf Amendment Act to appease the Muslim vote bank, and alleging that the Murshidabad riots were “state-sponsored”. “To appease the Muslim vote bank, Mamata didi opposed Operation Sindoor. By doing so, she is insulting the mothers and sisters of this country. I have come to appeal to women of Bengal to explain the value of sindoor to those who are



against Operation Sindoor, in the upcoming (Assembly) elections,” he said. Banerjee had recently accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the BJP of trying to exploit Operation Sindoor for political gains. “In the 2026 (Assembly polls), the mothers and sisters of the state would teach the CM and the Trinamool Congress a lesson for opposing Operation Sindoor,” Shah

asserted. He alleged that senior TMC leaders were complicit in the violence in Murshidabad in April, which broke out during protests over the contentious Waqf Amendment Act. “The way a TMC minister incited the violence, it can be said that the Murshidabad riots were state-sponsored,” he claimed. “The MHA kept on insisting about the deployment of BSF during the Murshidabad riots, but the TMC government didn’t allow it to happen so that the violence could continue. If BSF personnel had been deployed, Hindus would have been protected. It was only after BJP workers approached the high court that the BSF was finally sent in,” he alleged.

The Ludhiana (West) Assembly bypoll is set to be a litmus test for all political parties in Punjab as its outcome will serve as an indicator to their electoral prospects in the 2027 state Assembly elections. Stakes are high for ruling AAP as the bypoll is likely to be considered as a referendum on its performance. The bypoll for the Hindu-dominated urban constituency is being held in the wake of the government crackdown on farmers, who were evicted from protest sites on the border with neighbouring Haryana earlier this year. The move was interpreted as an attempt to win the trust of traders, who had to suffer losses due to the closure of roads during the over one year-long farmer protests, held to demand a legal guarantee for Minimum Support Price (MSP) for crops. The party also kickstarted its campaign in February, months ahead of the announcement of the bypoll schedule, by fielding



Rajya Sabha MP Sanjeev Arora. For the past three months, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann and all top leaders of the party, including national convener Arvind Kejriwal, have increased their public presence in the industrial city, meeting all sections of voters and launching new government initiatives. Meanwhile, pressure will be on the Congress too, which is currently grappling with differences among its leaders. The Congress, which is the state's main Opposition party, has placed its bet on former minister and aggressive campaigner Bharat Bhushan Ashu. The stakes are also high for state Congress chief Amrinder Singh Raja Warring, who is the sitting Lok Sabha MP from Ludhiana. Pressure will be intense on Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) president Sukhbir Singh Badal to deliver a win, even though this is not a traditional Akali seat.

3 judge ICT-BD bench indict Ex PM Hasina on mass murder charges

**DHAKA :** Delayed proceedings marked the start of Hasina's trial on Sunday in absentia nearly 10 months after the ouster of her government following the protests. “We do hereby take into cognisance the charges,” a three-judge ICT-BD Bench led by Justice Golam Mortuza Majumdar said after a prosecution team formally accused them of attempting to tame the protests using brutal force. Bangladesh's International Crimes Tribunal on Sunday indicted former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and two others on several charges, including mass murder, for their alleged role in the violent crackdown on student-led protests last year. The tribunal, after hearing a 145-page excerpt during the indictment proceedings, simultaneously issued a fresh arrest warrant against Hasina and then Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal. The third accused, the then Inspector General of Police Chowdhury Abdullah Al-Mamun, is in custody to stand trial in person. The prosecution charged Hasina with exercising



absolute authority to ruthlessly suppress the uprising. The two others were accused of provocation, complicity, abatement, instigation and facilitation. “Upon reviewing the evidence, we concluded that it was a coordinated, widespread and systematic attack,” ICT-BD chief prosecutor Mohammad Tajul Islam told the court. All three were accused of superior command responsibility for the crimes. The prosecution said they would submit video, audio and forensic evidence during the trial and listed 81 persons to appear as witnesses. The tribunal's investigation agency on May 12, in its report to the chief prosecutor's office, named Hasina as the instigator of the killings during the uprising that ousted her

government. The chief prosecutor urged the court to treat the Awami League as a criminal organisation since the crimes were committed on a partisan basis. The interim government led by Professor Muhammad Yunus last month ordered the disbanding of the party until the trials of its leaders were completed. Under the ICT-BD law, if convicted, Hasina and the co-accused could face the death penalty. The proceedings were broadcast live on television for the first time in Bangladesh's history. According to a UN rights office report, some 1,400 people were killed between July 15 and August 15 last year as violence continued even after the fall of Hasina's Awami League regime. The tribunal was originally formed by the past regime to try collaborators of Pakistani troops during the 1971 Liberation War.

Six top leaders of the Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami and one leader of former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia's Bangladesh Nationalist Party were hanged to death after being convicted by the court.

Flight passenger caught with 48 highly venomous snakes at Mumbai airport

**MUMBAI :** Customs officials intercepted a passenger on Saturday night after he got down from a flight from Bangkok. The passenger of Indian origin arrived at Mumbai's Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport from Thailand was found to be carrying 48 highly venomous snakes and five turtles, an official said on Sunday. During a search of his baggage, the Customs officials discovered 48



highly venomous viper snakes and five turtles, he said. A team from RAWW (Resqink Association for Wildlife Welfare) assisted in the identification and handling of these species, he said.

The Wildlife Crime Control Bureau has ordered that the reptiles be sent back to the country from where they had been brought, as per the provisions of the Wildlife Protection Act, the official added.

party that real workers should not be ignored, but sycophants were given high positions in the party and real workers were sidelined.


