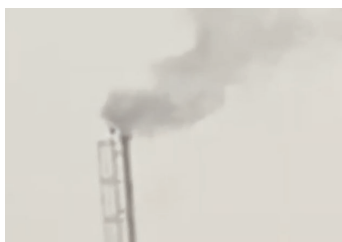
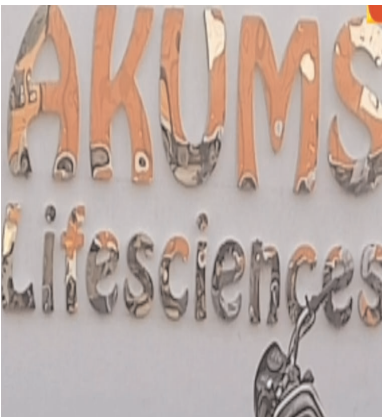

## Akums Life Sciences & Adler Wud Pvt Ltd industrial units transgress pollution norms

**DERABASSI** : The NGT (National Green Tribunal) panel monitoring committee led by Pritam Pal Justice (Retd) has observed the failure in execution of environmental norms and has held the respective District Pollution Control incharge accountable for the lapses in the jurisdictional control. The NGT panel has been over-

seeing the progression of the norms and has recommended the state govt to take strong action against the transgression by the district officials despite having adequate physical and financial resources at hand. It has been noticed massive pollution by the industrial units is being wilfully ignored. On a recce, the CNS with regard to transgression of pollution

norms found that the Adler Wud India Pvt Ltd was devoid of any water disposal treatment plant and norms were openly being violated, grudging the local inhabitants against the polluted ground water. Akums Life Sciences was seen propagating toxic carbon smoke and also not treating chemical water, deplored the residents of Sundra village in Derabassi Sub

Division. Under the act Air ( pollution) 21,22 Act 1981, water (pollution) 25, 26 Act 1974 norms of pollution control regulatory monitoring mechanism has perceptibly gone into soup as Adler Wud India Pvt Ltd and Akums Life Sciences have been discharging untreated water into the earth, unchecked by the authorities. At Seehpur village

several local residents lodged their grievances about the polluted water due to the nearby located industrial unit of ply manufacturing, has not been treating the chemically polluted water with the requisite plant. The residents cried hoarse due to the diseases like Asthma, Glucoma, Joint pain, Skin pigmentary disorders germinating in their locality.

Against the intense carbon emission, disseminated by Akums Lifesciences Ltd on Sundra road no action for withdrawing consent to operate has been initiated so far in pursuant of Air (pollution act). It has to be underlined here that the Central Pollution Control Board has to unequivocally regulate the sanctity of environment for cleanliness of air for

disease free life. Why the unstoppable poisonous smoke is being given loose rope to run its shameless, destructive emission and no regulatory monitoring mechanism is yet constituted to carryout random checks, point out vulnerable inhabitants in the vicinity of the Akums focal Centre. Unscientific management of fly-ash does adversely impact

health of all living being otherwise enforcement of norms are deliberately being put a ide for the reason best known to the authorities. The frequent emission plague the skin, eyes and health of lungs leaving nothing to applaud and breath on this earth planet, says Monika Bansal a retired biological teacher.

## Necessity of urgent expansion of alternative social security measures

**NEW DELHI** : The move actually has dexterously been synchronised. The first step consists of waiving, for one year, the token payments that National Food Security Act, or NFSA, cardholders normally make for their foodgrain rations. The second step – the big one – is the termination of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana. The first step is of little consequence. Remember, the bulk of NFSA cardholders, known as Priority households, are entitled to 5 kg of cereals per person per month under the National Food Security Act. Until now, they were paying Rs 2 per kg for wheat and Rs 3 per kg for rice. In 2023, they will get the same amount for free and save Rs 10 to 15 per person per month. This is not going to be of much help. Nor is this step going to cost much to the central government – perhaps Rs 15,000 crore or so. Politically, however, this small step is a smart move from the govern-



ment's point of view. For one thing, it will facilitate the second step – the termination of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana – by sweetening the pill. For another, it will help the Modi government to claim the entire credit for food subsidies. An impression is likely to spread that people owe their free food rations to the kindness of the other bastion. The second step that really matters. Under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana, or PMGKAY, launched in April 2020, all NFSA cardholders – Priority as well as Antyodaya households – were entitled to bonus cereal rations of 5 kg per person per month, for free. For poor households, this was a signifi-

cant economic supplement. For the government, it was a major financial burden. Both are over now. The short life of PMGKAY must be seen in the context of recent trends in foodgrain procurement and distribution. Ever since the NFSA came into force into 2013, procurement levels have amply exceeded the distribution requirements of the Act – about 60 million tonnes of foodgrain, including 48 million tonnes or so for the public distribution system, and the rest for various welfare schemes. That is why foodgrain stocks have been growing by leaps and bounds until two years ago. The Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana reversed this imbalance: with PDS offtake roughly doubled, distribution started exceeding procurement and stocks came down – sharply so this year due to poor procurement. Continuing PMGKAY in its present form would have led to an unsustainable depletion of stocks, short of a major increase in procurement.

**AMBALA** : The protests by farmers at Ambala and other neighbouring districts continued demanding Rs 450 per quintal for sugarcane enforced by Jan 9. In case no decision by the government the farmers would conduct a panchayat proceedings and reach at strong resolution. "Nevertheless crushing operations in all sugar mills commenced before one month, the government was yet to declare SAP ( State Advised Price ) for 2022-2023 stimulating a wider discontentment in the mind of cane growers", said Ajay Rana, district president of the association. Meanwhile, activists of BKU (Charuni) tried to gherao the residence of Manohar Lal Khattar but were stopped by the district police. Meanwhile the protests at Ambala



and Yamunanagar went on for 3 hours in the morning hours from 11am to 1 pm outside the homes of Naraingarh's Congress MLA Shalley, Jagadhi's Bharatiya Janata party MLA and Haryana Education Minister Kanwar Pal, and Shahabad Markanda's Jannayak Janata party (JJP) MLA and Haryana Sugarfed chairman Ram Karan Kala. The farmers led by the district presidents of BKU (Charuni) raised slogans against the Haryana government and burnt effigies of chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar.

## Now, human composting becomes fertilizer in US

## Civic body demands property tax from Rlys, UT, Pb, & Hry govts

**CHANDIGARH** : The civic body authority has written to the officials of Punjab Haryana governments and Chandigarh administration, asking them to pay pending property tax. The engine-- neering department of the Chandigarh administration owes maximum tax of around Rs 9.29 crore to the Municipal Corporation. A list of the amount along with specific buildings in question has been attached. The Demi Official letter to the railways and specific letters to the two state governments was written after detailed discussions by sen-



ior MC officials. Chandigarh Railway Station is also one of those which owe maximum tax among government offices. The Municipal Corporation (MC) has been focusing on defaulters who owe a large amount as property tax, has written a DO (demi official) letter to senior officials of Chandigarh

Railway Station, asking them to deposit tax of around Rs 2.30 crore. The amount also includes arrears which the Chandigarh Railway Station owes to the authority. The matter was discussed in detail, taking into account all the records, amounts and related financial aspects. The major amount in terms of arrears has not been paid and the authority is left with no option but to send them a recovery notice," said sources. On the other hand the MC says that even government organisations have to pay tax to the authority as they have to maintain the said properties.

## Deficient ventilation drives homeless to sleep on roadside in biting cold

media company by Adani billionaire has stirred emotions of many viewers. The Roy's had sold NDTV shares to RRPR Holding an investment

company of the couple in which AMG had gained stake, and hence the deal was done through inter-transfer. In pursuits of ownership, Adani's AMG Media Networks has appointed four directions on NDTV's board including Sunil Kumar, former chief secretary in the Chhattisgarh Government's office and Aman Kumar Singh former civil servant.

## RTI query to cost official Rs 11K from his salary

**MOHALI** : "The onus and responsibility lie on the PIO (Public Information Officer) to ensure transmission of the complete information to the applicant. The PIO-cum- EO, MC, Kharar, Rajesh Kumar Sharma, is hereby held guilty for not providing the information on time as prescribed under Section 7, which is within 30 days of the receipt of the request, said Mr Asit Jolly, State Information Commissioner, Punjab. Jitendra Kumar Sood, a resident of Indrapuram, Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh, had sought some information through RTI from Kharar municipal council but was denied. Cause submitted by a public infor-



mation officer (PIO) that records are "not available" in reply to an RTI application is not admissible and against the rules of Right to Information Act, ruled Punjab State Information Commissioner while holding the PIO guilty of not providing the information and directing a penalty of Rs 11,000 be deducted from his salary. "When the appellant pointed out that the information furnished was only partial, the PIO's representative stated that the remaining

record was 'not available' with the Kharar municipal council. The respondent, however, had no clue whether any steps had been initiated to trace or reconstruct the missing record," said the orders. The commissioner directed the PIO-cum-executive officer municipal council, Kharar, to appear in person during the next hearing. He ordered a compensation of Rs 10,000 to the appellant, a septuagenarian and a person with disability, for the harassment. The orders also imposed a penalty of Rs 11,000 on the PIO to be deducted from his salary and deposited in the Punjab government treasury under the Right to Information Act.

## 35 Edu Inst risk closure in Afghanistan

**KABUL** : Afghanistan has 140 private universities across 24 provinces with around a total of 2,00,000 students. Out of these, some 60,000-70,000 are female students. "Closing the universities to women is both a spiritual and material blow," Nasiri said. Now a quarter of Afghanistan's private universities risks closure because of the ban on female students imposed by the Taliban government, a spokesman for the education sector said Thursday. The Afghanistan regime last week barred women from attending universities effective immediately,



dealing another blow to women and girls' rights and freedoms since they seized power in the country in August 2021. The move also triggered international condemnation and outcry at home.

35 institutions risk closure because of the ban already imposed. Male students have also been boycotting classes and exams in solidarity with their female counterparts, he added.

## EDITORIAL –

### ‘Bharat Jodo Yatra’ enthuses Congress workers

In 2011 Rahul had taken up the cause of agitating farmers in Bhatta Parsaul, but quickly abandoned it. In 2013 he projected himself as an anti-corruption crusader, even tearing up his own government's ordinance, but the campaign didn't cut ice. In 2017 ahead of Gujarat elections, he asserted his Hindu credentials by saying he was a "janeu-dhari Hindu" but that stance seemed collapsing. For the first time perhaps Rahul is attempting to make an emotional connection with crowds and people are being given a chance to find out who the Nehru-Gandhi scion really is. The padyatra has always been a potent device in India: Gandhian, arduous and populist, it brings leaders down from billboards and sends them into the arms of a crowd. The 1983 padyatra catapulted Chandra Shekhar from anonymity to revival and the 2004 padyatra carried YS Rajasekhara Reddy to victory in Andhra Pradesh. The Bharat Jodo Yatra has imparted a new credibility to Rahul Gandhi - sporting an unkempt beard waking every day at 4am, starting his walk at 6am and striding over 20 kms a day. He's attracting decent crowds and his 'Pappu' image seems buried in the big numbers that are turning out to see and interact with him. An important change seems to have occurred. Rahul has finally stepped back

from his party-chief-by-birth position. Instead, the Gandhi scion has now reinvented himself as the party's ideological mascot. Detaching himself from the nitty-gritty of electioneering, he's made himself the party's chief ideologue and conscience keeper, the exponent and propagator of the Congress's ideology. The scion is now the ideologue. In times when the rest of the opposition is outdoing itself in electoral instrumentalism, playing either the soft Hindu line, or smart caste combinations or regional identity, Rahul is the one standing forth as the no-holds-barred ideological adversary to the Narendra Modi-led BJP. He is thus becoming a rallying point for all those seeking the alternative worldview to the BJP- RSS vision. He made a telling statement at a press conference in Jaipur: "There is a particular direction to this country that BJP and RSS propose, they believe in a particular path. They believe one state should dominate, one language should dominate, one religion should dominate, one culture should dominate. But there's another view... another vision ... BJP wins elections partly because they have complete clarity on who they are. Congress is not a party of crusading campaigns but of power seeking

realists. Railing against big industry or BJP regime's preference for "billionaires" enthuses the Left, but Congress has never been a party of activists. A party accustomed to being in office, for whom power is oxygen, might be a mismatch with a mascot who is focussed on ideological purity. Rahul's search for ideological coherence won't fix the party's real problems. It won't paper over the cracks in Rajasthan Congress, or revive Congress's mojo in the Hindi belt, or rescue the demoralised Gujarat unit, or strengthen the faltering party organisation in all states. Rahul Gandhi in the Bharat Jodo Yatra has correctly identified Congress's problems of ideological vacuum and disconnect with the people. The question is how will this new sense of ideological mission benefit Congress? How will it become an electoral fighting force? 'Anti-Modiism' or 'anti BJP-RSSism' is clearly not enough. In the 2019 general election, in 180 direct contests between BJP and Congress, Congress wins didn't cross double figures. The challenge therefore is to distil ideology into specific programmes and policies that will attract voters. A reinvigorated party organization and a new plan of action are urgently needed.

### Domestic consumers aggrieved on unscheduled power cuts in Punjab

**PATIALA** : Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL) officials deny any power shortage, on the contrary residents claim that the cuts are regular every late night or early morning. Many cities and villages are facing unscheduled power cuts everyday. In many villages, including the village of the CM's sister, power cuts over an hour are a regular feature. Even last night, cities and villages faced cuts for around an hour. "Punjab is purchasing around 150 lakh units on day-ahead basis and real-time basis and minimal cuts are being imposed that too in case of immediate shortage," said a PSPCL insider. Many villagers complained yesterday that there were unscheduled power cuts ranging from an hour to three hours. "We are in the same village where the Chief Minister's sister is married. We are facing power cuts at odd hours for the past over a week. Even yesterday, it's been two hours and there is no power," claims resident of Rampura village in Sangrur Jagwinder Singh. Residents claim that usually power cuts take place late night, which affect no one in the winter months, but for the



past few days there have been cuts even during day time. "Yesterday night not a single streetlight was working and fog made the visibility minimal. Even today there were almost three to four cuts, each over 20 minutes," said Narinder Singh Chauhan from Bathoi Kalan village. Power minister Harbhajan Singh ETO, "Some cuts could be due to technical glitches. However, I will ask officials to check why villages were facing cuts as there is no power shortage. I will get an independent feedback from villages," he said. The present maximum demand is about 7,800 MW which is being met by the state-owned thermal plants in (four units) Ropar and (three units) of Lehra Mohabbat. In the private sector, all three units of Talwandi Sabo, both units of Nabha thermal plant and one unit of Goindwal plant are in full operation.

### Custom deptt intercepts Dubai traveller, seizes 2.9-kg gold

**MOHALI** : "Based on profiling, officers of the Ludhiana customs at the airport intercepted a passenger of an Indigo flight (6E56) from Dubai to Chandigarh, and detected six rectangular pouches pasted inside his underwear. The department seized 2,907-kg gold, worth Rs 1.59 crore, from a passenger at the Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport here on December 31. The passenger had arrived on a flight from Dubai. He was stopped in the green channel and on examination, officials recovered six rectangular pouches from his underwear. He was taken away for further

questioning. "Gold weighing 2,907 gm was extracted, having a market value of Rs 1,59,07,104. The extracted gold in the shape of two bars has been seized and further proceedings as per the Customs Act and extant instructions are under way," he added. On November 14, the officials had nabbed a person with gold worth Rs 52 lakh. The search had resulted in the recovery of 12 pouches with yellowish-brown paste from the turban and two pouches from the waist and zip stitching of the passenger's trousers.

### Covid test might become mandatory before surgery : Deputy Civil Surgeon

**PANCHKULA** : Health department does not have enough testing kits to start Covid testing at the CHC level. On the other hand, vaccination camps are being set up at the centres in which only Covaxin jabs are being offered to people as the department did not have Covishield or Corbivax in stock. The Health Department is mulling over making the Covid test mandatory before conducting a surgery at the Civil Hospital in Sector 6 here. Apart from surgery cases, samples of patients visiting the outdoor patient departments (OPDs) will also be taken if they showed Covid symptoms. Till now, it was not necessary to conduct Covid test before surgery. Even if a suspected case was coming to the OPD, he was not being investigated.

Deputy Civil Surgeon Dr Sneha said flu corners were being set up in the health centres. At present, Covid tests were being done at a few centres. She said the Covid test was not mandatory so far, but they would start doing it after receiving directions from the state government. Meanwhile, Covid testing would start at Subdivisional Hospital at Kalka, along with General Hospital and Community Health Centre (CHC) at Raipur Rani from the first week of January. If anyone arrives from the infected country, his samples would be taken for testing and if found positive, then genome sequencing would be done to find out the Covid variant in their sample. Genome sequencing is necessary to trace the new variant of coronavirus.

### After fatal accident MC revokes building plan of showroom

**MOHALI** : The civic body officials are considering action against the Kharar-based architect who had drafted the building plan. Mr Dinesh Kumar, a contractor of the under-construction building has already been booked for culpable homicide not amounting to murder at the Kharar City police station. The Kharar Municipal Council cancelled the building plan of the under-construction building that collapsed at Chajju Majra here on



Saturday. The authorities and the MC have further recommended an FIR against the showroom owner as permission was sought only for the basement and ground floor. A construction worker was killed and another

injured in the incident on December 31. The deceased was identified as Ajay Kumar, 40, a native of UP, while Nitish Kumar, 25, of Madhepura, Bihar, sustained injuries and was admitted to the Phase-6 Civil Hospital in Mohali.

### Against civic amenities over Rs 100 crore spent by Civic body in 2 years: Mayor

**PANCHKULA** : The development work of the satellite city is going on under the leadership of the state government and Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta to provide facilities to the people, said Panchkula Mayor Mr Kulbhushan Goyal. Goyal said the work of door-to-door garbage collection was started at a cost of Rs 13 crore, with the aim of improving Panchkula's rank in the Swachh Survekshan. Work of sewage treatment plants was completed at eight places in 12 villages under the AMRUT scheme at a cost of Rs 48 crore. Water supply work has been done in Saketri and Kot at a cost of Rs 10 crore. Working Women's Hostel was constructed and made operational at a cost of Rs 6 crore while the old age home in Sector 27 was completed at a cost of Rs 12 crore. The work on building new community centres by demolishing old ones in Sector 7 and 10 started at a cost of Rs 13 crore.



Development works worth more than Rs 100 crore have been done by the Municipal Corporation in the past two years. The mayor said three new vending zones were started in Sector 2, 4 and 15. In two years, 2,700 destitute cows from the MC area were sent to Shri Mata Mansa Devi Gaudham, Madhav Gausala, Sukhdarshanpur and Gauvan, Sector 23. He said a proposal to give plots for the rehabilitation of the people living in slum areas under the MC has been passed and sent to the government for approval. Apart from this, free WiFi facilities were provided in three major markets of the city, he added.

Goyal said tender was floated for the construction of a sports stadium in Billa village and a proposal was passed for the construction of Education City in Chandimandir village. The e-bike and e-cycle projects were introduced in the city for the convenience of the people and to reduce the pollution levels. A resolution has been passed to form a group housing society and the MC had bought equipment worth Rs 5 crore for various works in the city. The construction of the office building of the MC is going on in Sector 3 at a cost of Rs 35 crore. The work on NMT track was complete and painting work was done on the roadside walls, he added.

## December fetches Rs 1.50 lakh-crore GST, revenues up 15 per cent

**NEW DELHI :** The revenues have remained above the Rs 1.4 lakh-crore mark. The collection in November was about Rs 1.46 lakh-crore showing 10th month in a row.

The collections from Goods and Services Tax (GST) grew by 15 per cent to over Rs 1.49 lakh-crore in December 2022, indicating improved manufacturing output and consumption demand, besides better compliance.

“The gross GST revenue collected during December 2022 is Rs 1,49,507 crore, of which CGST is Rs 26,711 crore, SGST is Rs 33,357 crore, ICGST is Rs 78,434 crore (including Rs 40,263 crore collected on import of goods) and Cess is Rs 11,005 crore (including Rs 850 crore collected on import of goods),” the ministry said in a statement. The revenues for December 2022 are 15 per cent higher than the GST collection in the same



month last year, which itself was close to Rs 1.30 lakh-crore. During the month, revenues from the import of goods were 8 per cent higher, and the revenues from the domestic transaction (including the import of services) are 18 per cent more than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year. In November 2022, 7.9 crore e-way bills were generated, which was significantly higher than the

7.6 crore e-way bill issued in October 2022. Deloitte India Partner MS Mani said, “An 18 per cent increase in the GST revenues from domestic transactions viewed with the increase in e-way bill issuance and the significant increase in GST collections by key manufacturer and consuming states, would be indicative of a sustained manufacturing and consumption cycle across recent months”.

**ROPAR :** The foundation stone of the museum, being set up in memory of valiant Sikh General Baba Jiwan Singh (Bhai Jaita Ji), was laid by the then Chief Minister, Parkash Singh Badal, on July 18, 2016.

The Rs 12-crore Bhai Jaita Ji Memorial is likely to be opened within the next couple of months. The civil work of the project is at the completion stage and its galleries will be ready for visitors after approval is received from the SGPC for the “script”. According to Tourism and

Cultural Affairs Secretary Gurkirat Kirpal Singh, the memorial, spread over five acres adjoining the Virasat-e-Khalsa, a museum of Punjab culture and history of Sikhism, will be completed in the next couple of months. The Secretary said the museum would have two wings, each having five galleries, depicting the life history of Bhai Jaita Ji. While both wings would also have a terrace garden, a giant “Khandra”, weighing 32 tonne, would be one of the main attractions for the visitors, he said.

## Pollution board starts inspection of plywood units & brick-kilns

**YAMUNANAGAR :** The Pollution Control team is taking samples under provisions of the Air and Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Acts.

A team of the Haryana State Pollution Control Board (HSPCB), headed by a

scientist, posted at the board's head office in Panchkula, has started an inspection of 28 plywood units and five brick-kilns in Yamunanagar district. Besides, the team is also checking whether these units have installed adequate/required air pollution control machines (APCM) or not. According to information, the inspection started on the direction of the National Green Tribunal (NGT). On the complaint of Sumit Saini of Damla village of Yamunanagar district, a case is going on against these plywood factories and brick-kilns in the NGT.

In his complaint, Saini alleged that the plywood factories and



brick-kilns were being run at Damla village in violation of norms laid down by the government to stop air and water pollution.

According to the information, the next hearing at the NGT is on January 17 and the authorities of the HSPCB have to file their reply before the NGT regarding pollution by these units. The team of the HSPCB headed by a scientist of the board, Shivendra Singh, started the inspection of these factories and brick-kilns on December 29, 2022.

“The team started inspection on December 29 and it continued on December 30. During the

two days, it inspected 10 plywood factories. The remaining 18 plywood units and five brick-kilns will be inspected soon,” said Naresh Kumar Sharma, Assistant Environmental Engineer of HSPCB, Yamunanagar. He said the officials of the HSPCB, Yamunanagar, were also helping the team in the inspection work. “The team is taking samples to check air and water pollution. After the completion of inspection, a detailed report will be prepared and submitted to the NGT, before the hearing date on January 17,” said Naresh Sharma.

## 31,000 complaints received by NCW in crimes against women in 2022

**NEW DELHI :** According to the data, the highest number of complaints related to the right to live with dignity and domestic violence were received from Uttar Pradesh.

The number of complaints received by the NCW in 2022 is the highest since 2014, when the panel had received 33,906 complaints. Nearly 31,000 complaints of crimes committed against women were received by the National Commission for Women (NCW) in 2022, the highest since 2014.



In 2021, the NCW had received 30,864 complaints while in 2022, the number slightly increased to 30,957. Of the 30,957 complaints, the maximum of 9,710 were related

to the right to live with dignity that takes into account the emotional abuse of women, followed by those related to domestic violence at 6,970 and dowry harassment at 4,600, according to NCW data accessed.

About 54.5 per cent (16,872) of the complaints were received from the most populous state of Uttar Pradesh.

Delhi recorded 3,004 complaints, followed by Maharashtra (1,381), Bihar (1,368) and Haryana (1,362).

## 200 acre housing estate not cleared by HSPCB, for non clearance of green pproval

**GURUGRAM :** The developer, Malibu Estate Private Limited, is constructing the project, Malibu Town, on the Sohna road. It has a pollution index score of 60 and is in the “red” category. The society is inhabited by 2,200 families.

The Haryana State Pollution Control Board (HSPCB) has served a closure notice on a builder for allegedly violating environmental norms during the construction of a 200-acre housing project here.

The developer obtained neither consent to establish or operate the project from HSPCB nor clearance under the provision of the environment impact assessment notification. As per an investigation conducted in 2020, it was also found guilty of discharging untreated sewage in the HUDA/ GMDA pipelines. Samples were taken from the sewage treatment plant, rainwater harvesting plant, underground water tank and sewerage line going directly to the HUDA/GMDA sewer, and the pollutants were found exceeding the prescribed limits of HSPCB.

“The developer has violated environmental norms at different stages and has failed to rectify them. Till the issue is resolved, the project

would remain under closure, and the developer would be barred from any further developments. The department is reviewing all projects in the region, and those found lacking any such clearances and permissions will share the same fate,” said Kuldeep Singh, regional officer, HSPCB.

The Board has also directed the Town & Country Planning Department to take necessary action to stop further construction activities related to the project till the project proponent obtains relevant clearances and consent from HSPCB.

The revenue authorities have also been instructed to not register sale deed of any plot/flat/house/shop related to this project. The Dakshin Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam (DHBVN) would not allow any new electrical connection for this project or any of its components with immediate effect.

Though no official statement was released by the developer, sources claimed they requested resampling of sewage. The order also highlighted litigated complaints pertaining to the alleged misuse of community sites.

## Conjunction of slip & main roads creates panic

**CHANDIGARH** : The problems with design of the intersection expounding re- designing ought to improve traffic flow. It has suggested geometric improvements at 12 intersections. These include Matka chowk, ISBT-17 chowk, Kisan Bhawan chowk, Sector 43B/35C chowk, Press Chowk, Transport chowk, Junction no.22, Gundwara chowk, Sector 46C/47D chowk, Tribune Chowk, Chandigarh Railway station Road junction, and Housing Board chowk. Many have questioned the design elements of the conjunction of slip and main roads. The design has also been blamed for accidents on some occasions. "Daily one is stuck for long durations and many a times we witness accidents at the Hallomajra light point when vehicles try to enter the main road. Similar is the situation when one tries to exit the chowk into the slip road headed toward Panchkula. Nowadays, during the evening



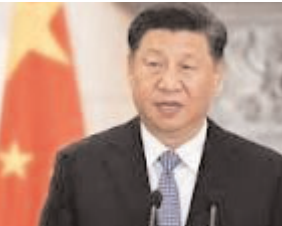
sometimes the road gets totally blocked as even Zirakpur-headed traffic enters the slip road to join the main road at the Hallomajra light point," said Vikas Sharma, a resident of Sector 15, Panchkula, and daily commuter to the city. Nearly all of the busy intersections in the city have the problem of merging traffic from slip roads to main roads and vice-versa getting clogged, particularly during peak hours. Some of the roads/intersections where the problem is acute include the press

light chowk, Hallomajra ISBT-17 chowk. Aroma chowk "At places where space is available, we are undertaking re-designing of the slip roads and their conjunction with the main roads. But at places like press chowk where additional space is not available, realignment or redesigning is generally not feasible. At the new roundabouts, which we are constructing on Vikas Marg, we have kept this aspect in mind while designing the slip roads", said CB Ojha UT chief engineer.

## President Xi warns of tough Covid fight in China

**SANGHAI** : President Xi Jinping said that tough challenges remain in the country's fight against Covid-19 and admitted divisions in society that led to rare spontaneous protests. The president said China is in new phase of covid control and has adapted after following a science-based and targeted approach. The nation's strategy had been "optimized" to protect people's lives and minimize economic cost. On December 7, the government took definitive easing steps from its harsh zero-Covid policy, which had included snap lockdowns, frequent mass testing and largely closed borders. Xi had repeatedly defended the strategy despite mounting economic costs, including as late as mid-October. But on Saturday, the Chinese leader addressed the hardships endured by the nation's people during strict lockdowns, as well as in the rapid spread of Covid. "Since Covid-19 is struck, we have put the people first and put life first all along,"



Xi said "With extraordinary efforts, we have prevailed over unprecedented difficulties and challenges, and it has not been an easy journey for anyone. We have now entered a new phase of Covid response where tough challenges remain," said Xi. In his speech, Xi indirectly referred to the protests and said that it's "only natural" for the country's 1.4 billion people to have different concerns and views on some issues. "What matters is that we build consensus through communication and consultation," he said. On top of repeated Covid outbreaks, China's economy in 2022 muddled through a persistent property market slump, sluggish consumer demand and waning overseas appetite for its goods.

## India, Japan to conduct joint air combat drill in Jan

**NEW DELHI**: With a belligerent China figuring high on their radar screens, India and Japan will conduct their first-ever air combat exercise next month in a significant development in their steadily expanding militaries. The exercise 'Veer Guard- Man', to be conducted at the Hyakuri and Iruma air bases in Japan from January 16 to 26, will see India deploying four Sukhoi-30MKI fighters supported by two C-17 Globe- master-III strategic lift air- craft, one IL-78 mid-air refuel- er and around 150 IAF personnel. Japan, in turn, will deploy F-2 and F-15 jets, among assets, for the exercise. "The Veer Guardian exercise will further strengthen bilateral



defence cooperation and military interoperability, as also enhance tactical air combat skills of the two sides," an official said. On the bilateral front, India and Japan already conduct the 'Dharma Guardian' exercise between their armies and the 'JIMEX' between their navies. Since Japan's Iruma air base, one of the two sites where the

exercises will be conducted 2015, Japan has also become a regular participant in the top-notch India-US 'Mala- bar' naval combat exercise, which now also includes Australia. All these four Quad countries have openly declared their intent to deter any "coercion" in the Indo- Pacific in the face of China's expansionist behaviour.

**CHANDIGARH** : The Punjab government is planning its first mega job fair in March for which preparations are underway. All the district bureaus of employment and enterprises (DBEEs) have been given targets of identifying jobs to be offered to youth in the fair. Four industrial districts- Amritsar, Jalandhar, Ludhiana and Mohali- have been given a target of identifying 2,400 job vacancies each while Patiala, Hoshiarpur and Bathinda districts have been instructed to find 1,400 jobs opening each while remaining districts have been given a target of 800 each job openings. All the DBEEs must submit the data by December 27.

Unemployment is one of the major challenges facing the AAP government in Punjab, which had a shaky start on this front in the first two quarters of 7 the financial year after storming to power in the state with the urban rate of unemployment recording an increase whereas the rate slipped at the all-India level. Terming organising fairs as adhoc



and bandage approach, experts opined that such moves failed even during the tenure of the previous governments. The efforts of the previous government were largely restricted to organising job fairs and the bulk of the jobs offered to youth were low-paying, between Rs 5,000 and Rs 15,000 per month. Not surprisingly a large number of such openings remained unfilled and faced criticism from the opposition parties. Economist Lakhwinder singh said that fairs won't solve unemployment, as fairs do not provide quality and sustainable work. For solving the problem, he advised attracting investment both in the private and government sector.

## In past 2 months, 46 illegal miners apprehended

**PANCHKULA** : Against the continual mining 46 vehicles involved in illegal operation have been seized, Rs 30 lakh fine imposed and 11 FIRS were registered in the past two months, said Mahavir Kaushik, Deputy commissioner. In November, 24 vehicles were seized, from which Rs 23.56 lakh was recovered as fine and nine FIRS registered. Similarly, in December, 22 vehicles have been seized, from which Rs 6.45 lakh has been recovered as fine and two FIRs registered, he added. Mahavir Kaushik gave strict instructions to the officers to curb illegal mining activities in the district. Panchkula and Kalka sub-divisional magistrates, BDPOs and tehsildar and naib tehsildar will



conduct surprise inspection in their respective areas in a week. "They will be submitting the action taken report to my office. He directed strict action be taken against those involved in illegal mining along with confiscation of vehicles. Kaushik said in the five mining blocks in the district, it should be ensured that mining is being done there only up to the prescribed depth. He directed the district mining officer to identify people on whose land

illegal mining is being done. DC also directed the Haryana Urban Development Authority to ensure that there is no illegal mining in and around Ghaggar river near sectors 27 and 28. He said that the authority should submit its report every month regarding the progress of the assigned work. Similarly, the forest department should also send a report certifying that no illegal mining is taking place on the land under them.

## Lists of nuke facilities, prisoners exchanged by India & Pakistan

**ISLAMABAD / NEW DELHI :** India and Pakistan have exchanged the lists of nuclear installations and prisoners facilities simultaneously through diplomatic channels . India and Pakistan on Sunday both exchanged lists of nuclear installations that cannot be attacked in the event of hostilities, maintaining a tradition dating back to 1992 despite bilateral ties remained at an all-time low. The two sides further exchanged lists of prisoners held in each other's jails, and the Indian side sought



the early release and repatriation of civilian prisoners, missing defence personnel and fishermen, along with their boats, from Pakistan'. According to provisions of the Agreement on the Prohibition of Attack against Nuclear Installations and facilities but both sides have

not disclosed details of such facilities. The agreement, which was signed on December 31, 1988 and entered into force on January 27, 1991, provides that "India and Pakistan inform each other of the nuclear installations and facilities .

## Induction of 28 PCR's for 45 zones in Mohali

**MOHALI :** We have got 28 more PCR's, which will give some respite to the force. Now, we will be able to penetrate into the remotest parts of the district to keep 24x7 vigil. Though we are still short of manpower, we will perform with what we have at our disposal. Our main aim is to make roads safer for residents and decrease response time during emergency calls, said SSP Sandip Garg. He added, "We have decided that police will rule the roads of the district, challenging bad elements and reducing their movement. Visibility of PCR's on roads will be increased with addition in their number." Mr Garg said that there will be 25 zones in Mohali city, in which PCR will remain round the clock and the focus will be in the post midnight period. There will be six

zones in Zirakpur and four in Kharar, two each in Mullanpur and Derabassi and one in Kurali. The SSP also said that PCR staff will be instructed to have zero tolerance towards movement of anti-social elements and drug smugglers. The SSP said, "Special emphasis will be laid on those roaming around with weapons, even licensed ones. From time to time, reaction time of the PCR will be checked personally by me or by an SP level officer. We will also maintain the record of the reaction time of a particular PCR." In the time to come, more PCR's will be added once new recruits join the Mohali Police, said the SSP. He also demanded relieving of police officials engaged in duties with the police headquarters, senior officers and VVIPs so that the total sanctioned strength of the Mohali Police could be attained.

## Ayodhya Ram temple to open by Jan 2024 : Shah

**MYSURU :** Four months ahead of the Karnataka assembly polls, Amit Shah Union home minister exhorted voters in the Vokkaliga heartland of Mandya about 100 km from Bengalurur that it was time to end dynastic politics in the state and give it a corruption-free government . He promised voters that his party would put the district on the path of development if people offered full support in the polls. JD(S) national president and former PM HD Deve Gowda heaped praise on Shah during the launch of a new mega dairy at Manmul, in Mandya , Mr Gowda said Shah has worked tirelessly to curb corruption in cooperative banks across the country, and has empowered the dairy sector. Calling Shah "active and brilliant", the JD(S) patriarch said politics aside, he has a lot of respect for him. In Mandya Shah said both Congress and JD(S) have not



come out of the clutches of dynastic politics. "When people voted them in, both parties didn't take up any development work. Karnataka became Delhi's ATM when Congress was in power; when JD (S) held the reins, it was one family's ATM," he claimed. "If the people of Mysuru and Mandya strengthen our hands, then BJP will, in the next five years, take development in the region to a whole new level," he said, exhorting party workers to work hard in Mysuru and Mandya so that BJP hits the majority mark in the state on its own for the first time. Shah claimed Congress and JD(S) are communal" and shelter criminals. He said

Congress withdrew cases against 170 activists of the Popular Front of India whereas the Modi government had banned the organisation and jailed its members. He also alleged that Congress, when in power, had done injustice to Dalits and adivasis until BJP made a Dalit and adivasi the president of India. Mr Shah said Ayodhya Ram temple is scheduled to open by Jan 2024, Shah said the "grand inauguration of the magnificent Ram Mandir in Ayodhya will be held on January 1, 2024, " and urged people from Mandya to start reserving tickets for their journey to Ayodhya.

## Lower price of solar cells, researcher assures

**CHANDIGARH:** The research group of Prof. Pradeep Nair at IIT Bombay in collaboration with physics research group headed by Prof. Aldrin Antony (now with Cochin University of Science and Technology, Kochi) embarked upon this project in 2014 which has now come to fruition. The commercial silicon based solar cells that are now available in the market require temperatures in the range of 1000 degree Celsius.

Swasti Bhatia, a resident of Pinjore in Panchkula district



of Haryana and a researcher at IIT Bombay, has revealed a revolutionary Si solar cell manufacturing process that has the potential to dramatically lower the price of these cells. Bhatia, then PhD student in IIT Bombay, demonstrated a 12% efficient Si solar cell that was entirely made below 100C. With the use of new non-toxic materials like TiO2,

these low temperature solar cells replace the primary high temperature process that also employs hazardous gasses like phosphine. She informed that this innovation was made possible by a number of inventions by the group, one of which has been filed for patent. This is the first step towards more environmentally friendly solar cells whose cost is also significantly lower than the current commercial devices. "Solar technology will see increased adoption at domestic level if its initial investment can be brought down," said Swasti.

## Ownership right for land using beyond 20 yrs

**CHANDIGARH :** Sanjeev Kaushal the chief secretary said that he has directed the officers to prepare the draft of the scheme within 15 days. Thereafter, the draft will be sent to the chief minister's office and the finance department and thereafter it will be placed before the council of ministers for approval. Under this scheme, those who have been in possession of land through rent or lease for 20 years, are being given ownership rights on paying up to 80% of the collector rate. Similarly, according to the extent of years in possession of the land, the collector rate will have to be paid according to the designated levels. For example, a person having possession of land for 25

years will get ownership rights on paying 75% of the collector rate, 70% for 30 years, 65% for 35 years, 60% for 40 years, 55% for 45 years and 50% for 50 years. The Haryana government's 'Mukhya mantri Shehri Nikay Swamitva Yojana', which is aimed to grant ownership of commercial lands in municipalities that have been rented out or leased for more than 20 years to the people using them, will now be adopted by other departments as well. It was informed in the meeting that about 7,000 applications were received during the first phase of the 'Mukhyamantri Shehri Nikay Swamitva Yojana'. Letter of Intent (LOI) has been issued to 1730 applicants.
