Cyber crimes germinate from unaccountable social media

Anonymity on social media often encourages users to post inappropriate material and indulge in cybercrimes. Although the Telecommunications Act, 2023, prescribes duties of the social media users and measures to protect consumers from unauthorised intrusion into their privacy and empowers enforcement agencies to intercept objectionable communication, it is not proving a deterrent in the absence of rules and a lack of awareness among the masses. Humankind now stands at a critical juncture regarding social media overuse. It must introspect: "Are we using social media or has it started consuming us?" social media should be used with due responsibility. The bombardment of crypted and unverified information on social networking sites is cluttering the users' minds. It has snatched away from them the joy of being and living in the moment. Moreover, biased social media algorithms passively make the users consume unsuitable content that might lead to moral desensitisation. An overindulgence in social media leads to psychological disorders; a new class of such victims has already emerged. They can be seen checking their cell phones involuntarily — 79 times a day, according to a study — compelled by the desire to seek screen

stimulation. Excessive time spent on networking sites has the potential of dragging such individuals into solitude and loneliness. In the absence of regular face-to-face interactions, humans lose the ability to recognise and respond to facial cues, voice tone and inflection, body language and the warmth of emotions. The ethical consequences of addiction to SM are far more serious and extend from cyberbullying to privacy violations. Notably, 30 per cent of students in middle and high school are either victims or culprits of cyberbullying; 18 per cent of them are girls. Unfortunately, 15 per cent of the victims of cyberbullying attempt suicide out of depression. Social Media, however, people who desire to expand their social networks, promote their businesses or overcome loneliness with an incredible platform. It fosters a feeling of belongingness among those who need company but cannot physically interact with their family members, friends and relatives. SNS also makes for a good pastime and a source of entertainment for all, especially senior citizens. However, overindulgence in SM has a harmful impact on the physical, mental and overall wellbeing of its users. Comparison is ingrained in human

nature. The fake videos, manipulated information, impractical solutions and mischievous prescriptions published on SM are so mesmerising that ill-informed and innocent users start comparing their 'real life' with others' 'reel life', leading to self-doubt and making them feel frustrated and depressed. It is sickening that the rat race to get maximum likes on digital platforms and the quest for creating the best videos and stories have made many gullible individuals share each and every moment of their private life and that of others, allowing an intrusion into their privacy. It is leading to different kinds of behavioural abrasions, relationship discord and social conflicts. Such people do not understand that SM platforms are best meant for impacting people and not for impressing others. Studies have established that frequent stimulations received from SM sites shorten the attention span of the users, triggering far-reaching consequences. Such individuals may find it difficult to express themselves clearly, make mistakes as a result of a diminished attention to detail, and perform badly in a variety of settings, such as social situations, at their workplace and at educational institutions.

Norms for promotion to head-constable challenged in CAT

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The local Bench of the Central Administrative Tribunal said the Tribunal, vide order dated June 21, 2023, had issued status quo qua earlier notices dated May 31 and June 15, 2023. The present notice is in continuation of the earlier two notices. The Bench has directed the DGP to maintain status quo regarding a notice issued by the Police Department dated August 23, 2024, till the next date of hearing. The DGP has asked all eligible constables to convey through their respective unit incharges by August 30 if they are willing to take B-I Test (under 25% quota) for the promotion to the post of head constable. Many constables, in their application filed through advocate Rohit Seth, have prayed before the Bench for staying the notice. Seth argued that the written test (B-I Test) was scheduled for October 5 and it would defeat the



purpose of original application of the applicants filed in CAT. In their original application, the constables have stated that the new criteria for the promotion was discriminatory and violative of Articles 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India. They said there cannot be two classes under the same employer. Many constables have already been deputed for Lower School Course for promotion as head constable without B-I Test and the denial of the same to the present applicants would be violative of Articles 14 and 16. They said the notice dated August 23 mentioned that willing candidates

responding to the notice after August 30 would not be entertained in any case. After hearing of the arguments, the Bench said the notice had been issued in continuation of the earlier notice dated May 31, 2023, calling for the same "willingness" and followed by the subsequent reminder dated June 15, 2023. Therefore, the applicants herein are also entitled to the same relief as granted to the applicants in the original application. Therefore, the status quo as on today regarding notice dated August 23 this year be maintained by the respondents till the next date of hearing fixed for September 17.

No headway in land exchange proposal with UT by Hry. govt

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : In March the haryana govt had issued a draft notification demarcating area from 1 km to 2.035 km around the Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary as an ESZ on the Haryana side in Panchkula district. A senior UT officer said no further step could be taken until or unless the Union Ministry issued a notification on the demarcation of land for ESZ of the sanctuary, which was still awaited. After the lapse of 6 months there is no headway in the proposed exchange of land with UT for the construction of a new Haryana Assembly building as the Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change is yet to issue a notification on eco-sensitive zone (ESZ) for Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary in Panchkula. However, the Haryana Government had sent a



proposal to the ministry that area of 1,000m around the sanctuary on the Haryana side be delineated as an ESZ. The UT Administration had decided to allocate 10 acres for the construction of the new Assembly building near the railway station light point, towards the IT Park road in Chandigarh. In exchange of UT land, the Haryana Government had offered 12 acres at Saketri village of Panchkula district. However, the land offered by the Haryana Government in Chandigarh falls in the ESZ of the Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary. Officials of the UT Administration and Haryana

Government had already conducted a demarcation of 12 acres at Saketri village, which is intended to be swapped with 10 acres to be allotted by the UT Administration for the construction of the new Assembly building. To exchange land, the Haryana Government has to obtain environmental clearance for the land that falls in the ESZ. The allocation of land for the Haryana Assembly building was announced by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on July 9, 2022. This decision came in response to then Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar's demand for the state's rights in the existing Vidhan Sabha in Chandigarh, which it currently shares with Punjab. The demand stemmed from the projected increase in the number of Assembly seats following the 2026 delimitation exercise.

Panchkula mayoral polls to fall on September 25 -- Haryana government

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Despite mandates under the Municipal Corporation Act, 1994, and the Haryana Municipal Corporation Election Rules, 1994, requiring elections within 60 days of newly-elected Municipal Councillors' notification, the positions have been vacant since December 2020. The State of Haryana has scheduled the elections for



Senior Deputy and Deputy Mayor of the Panchkula MC, pending for over three years, for September 25, as informed to the Punjab and Haryana High Court. Consequently, the court has disposed of the petition

seeking directions for conducting these elections, allowing the petitioner to approach the court again if the elections are not conducted as scheduled. The petition was filed by Akshaydeep Chaudhary, a Congress councillor of the Panchkula MC. The petitioner's counsel argued for urgent poll of Senior Deputy and Deputy Mayor in the Municipal corporation of Panchkula.

Worth Rs 20 crore fuel saved by e-buses within 2 years

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : About 25.28 lakh litres of diesel worth Rs 20.80 crore has been saved within two and a half years by plying electric buses on local routes. Procured in November 2021, 80 electric buses are in service in the tricity at present, said a spokesman of the UT Transport Department. The electric buses had covered 1.26 crore km till August 16 on intra-city routes, thus saving over 25.28 lakh litres of diesel besides preserving environment. These buses have helped prevent 6674.91 tonne of CO2 emission. The e-bus fleet of the department included vehicles of Ashok Leyland and Eicher. In order to provide eco-friendly transportation in the city, the department plans to procure 100 more e-buses this year. The administration has plans to replace the entire fleet of 350



diesel buses of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU), running both on local as well as suburban routes, with electric ones by 2027-28. Each bus covers a distance of nearly 130 km on a single charge. It takes nearly two hours to fully charge a vehicle. With a seating capacity of 36, a bus can carry a maximum of 54 people at a time. On an average, each bus covers 200-300 km a day. The State-Level Steering Committee (SLSC) has decided to replace 100 diesel buses with e-vehicles sanctioned by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs to Chandigarh under the Centre-sponsored PM

e-Bus Sewa Scheme. The ministry will be requested to allocate 80 more buses to the city under this scheme. Apart from public transport, the share of private electric vehicles (EVs) is also increasing. Since the implementation of the EV Policy in September 2022, as many as 3,281 electric two-wheelers and 1,785 four-wheelers have been registered in the city till July 15. According to the data provided by the Registration and Licensing Authority (RLA), 352 electric two-wheelers and 114 four-wheelers were registered from September to December in 2022. The highest number of 2,103 electric two-wheelers and 1,013 four-wheelers had been registered in 2023 and 826 two-wheelers and 658 four-wheelers till July 15 this year in the city.

Power deptt to revamp electricity bills into Hindi, English

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The UT Engineering Department has revamped the power bill to make it more user-friendly, removing unnecessary information and adding useful details. Starting this month, the city residents will receive their electricity bills in a new and simplified format. The bills will now be bilingual, featuring text in both Hindi and English. Key changes include the addition of meter status, the last payment date and the amount paid. The back of the bill now includes guidelines and a notice under Section 56 of the Electricity Act, 2003, outlining potential actions if the bill is not paid on time. The bill also provides comprehensive information on payment methods, contact centres across Chandigarh and details on electricity rates, duties, taxes and cess to help residents calculate their bills. A senior officer stated that the new format was aimed at making electricity bills easier to understand, with all information now clearly presented in both Hindi and English. From this month, residents will have to pay more for power after the Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission (JERC) revised the fixed and power tariff in different domestic and commercial categories for the financial year 2024-25. The revised tariff are applicable from August 1. On an average, the commission had approved an increase of the 9.40% in power tariff. The Electricity Department had



proposed an average increase of nearly 19.44% in the existing power tariff of all categories. According to the order, in the domestic category, the JERC approved a hike of fixed charge from Rs 15 to 30 per month. In the slab of 0-150 kWh (unit), the tariff per unit will continue to remain Rs 2.75. But in the slab of 151-400 kWh per month, the tariff will increase from Rs 4.25 per unit to Rs 4.80 per unit. Above 400 kWh per month, the tariff approved is from Rs 4.65 per kWh to Rs 5.40 per unit. In the HT domestic category, the tariff will increase from Rs 4.30 per unit to Rs 4.90 per unit. For commercial and non-residential building category, the major tariff change is in the slab above 400 kWh per month where the tariff has been approved from Rs 5 per unit to Rs 5.90 per unit. As per the proposal put up by UT, in the domestic category, the department had proposed a hike in fixed charge from Rs 15 per month to Rs 40 per month. The department had proposed a hike from Rs 4.25 to Rs 4.90 per unit in the slab of 151-400 units and an increase from Rs 4.65 to Rs 5.50 in the slab 401 units and above. In the domestic high tension category, hike from Rs 4.30 to Rs 5 per unit was proposed.

AAP leaders are “prima facie defamatory” - Delhi High Court

NEW DELHI : The defamation case of AAP party stems from their comments regarding the alleged deletion of voter names from the electoral roll in Delhi, which they claimed was orchestrated by the BJP. The Delhi High Court on Monday refused to quash the defamation proceedings against Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and other AAP leaders, including Atishi, Sushil Kumar Gupta and Manoj Kumar. The Bench of Justice Anoop Kumar Mendiratta said the remarks made by the AAP leaders were “prima facie defamatory” and appeared to be intended to defame the BJP by blaming it for the



deletion of voter names. The Bench dismissed AAP leaders' defence that their statements were made in good faith for public welfare, adding that this would need to be proven during the trial. The court upheld the trial court's decision to summon Kejriwal and other AAP leaders for defamation, stating that the remarks were likely made to gain political mileage.

The high court, which had on February 28, 2020 stayed the proceedings, vacated the interim order and asked the parties to appear before the trial court on October 3. The case originated from a defamation complaint filed by BJP leader Rajeev Babbar, who accused AAP leaders of harming the BJP's reputation by alleging that the party was responsible for the deletion of over 30 lakh voters from the electoral rolls in 2018. The AAP leaders had claimed that voters from the Bania, Poorvanchali and Muslim communities were disproportionately affected by this alleged deletion.

‘Sensitive and Religious sentiments can’t be allowed for hurt’ in film Emergency : Government

NEW DELHI : The release of “Emergency” has been deferred multiple times as the film is yet to get a certificate of clearance from the Central Board of Film Certification. Government sources on Monday said actor and BJP MP Kangana Ranaut's film “Emergency” had sensitive content and religious sentiments could not be allowed to be hurt. Speaking on the deferment of the release date of the film, initially scheduled for September 6 launch, official sources said, “Some religious organisations have raised concerns. Religious sentiments cannot be hurt. There is some sensitive content in the film,” a top source said. Sikh organisations have been agitating against the film, demanding a ban on it. The Shriromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee earlier sent a legal notice to the makers of the film alleging misrepresentation of history and sought removal of content that are hurtful to Sikh sentiments. Kangana is the director, writer and co-producer of the film. Today she took to X to term the developments related to her film “hugely demotivating and unjust”. “Law of the land is that one can



show unimaginable amount of violence and nudity on OTT platforms without any consequence or censorship, one can even distort real life events to suit their politically motivated sinister motives, there is all the freedom for communists or leftists across the world for such anti national expressions but as a nationalist no OTT platform allows us to make films that revolves around the integrity and unity of Bharat, it seems censorship is only for some of us who don't want tukde of this nation and make films on historic facts. It's hugely demotivating and unjust,” she wrote. Kangana was referring to Anubhav Sinha's IC-814, which uses non-Muslim names the hijackers of the ill-fated plane had assumed to hide their Muslim identities. The government has now summoned Netflix director on the issue of IC-814 film also.

First random check of EVMs carried out

PANCHKULA : The district had set up 455 polling stations for the Assembly elections, including 225 in the Kalka Assembly constituency and 230 in Panchkula, said Yash Garg Deputy Commissioner-District Election Officer (DEO). Officials of the district election commission carried-out the first randomisation of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) for Haryana Assembly elections on Monday. The randomisation was conducted in the presence of DEO and representatives of political parties at the conference hall of the Mini-Secretariat in the city. Mr Garg said the first level checking (FLC) of EVMs was conducted periodically to ensure all machines were in an optimal working condition. The randomisation process is computerised to ensure transparency and fairness in selecting the machines that would be used for polling votes. The allocation of the EVMs



has been set at 120 per cent of the number of polling stations for ballot units (BU) and control units (CU), and 130 per cent for voter verifiable paper audit trails (VVPAT). Consequently, the district has set up 546 BUs and CUs each, and 592 VVPATs. Mr Garg said the machines would be distributed to their respective constituencies and sent to designated locations before the elections. The next randomisation process would also involve representatives of political parties to maintain transparency, he added. The election notification for Haryana Assembly elections-2024 will be issued on September 5, marking the start of the nomination process. The process will continue till

September 12. Scrutiny of nomination papers will be carried-out on September 13, and candidates will be able to withdraw their nominations until September 16. Voting in the entire state is scheduled for October 5, and the counting of votes will take place on October 8. Panchkula SDM and Returning Officer Gaurav Chauhan, Kalka SDM and Returning Officer Rajesh Punia, CTM and Deputy District Election Officer Vishwanath, Kalka Tehsildar Vivek Goyal, Raipur Rani BDPO Param Nandan and representatives Rajendra and Ramesh Gupta from Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Manoj Aggarwal and Satish Kumar from Indian National Lok Dal (INLD), Ravindra Rawal from Indian National Congress (INC), Ram Swaroop from Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), KC Bhandari and Ishwar Singhmar from Jannayak Janata Dal (JJD), and Promila from Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) were also present on the occasion.

BJP fields party chief Ravinder Raina in 4th list for J-K Assembly polls

JAMMU : With the fresh list, the party has so far named 51 candidates, including 14 for the Kashmir Valley, where the BJP is yet to open its account in Assembly elections. The BJP on Monday released its fourth list of candidates for the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly polls, fielding its Union Territory unit president Ravinder Raina from Nowshera in the Jammu region. Raina, who won from Nowshera in Rajouri district in the 2014 polls too, has been



fielded again from his home constituency. The other names in the list are: former MLC Vibodh Gupta from Rajouri (ST) in the Jammu region; and Aijaiz Hussain (Lal Chowk), Arif Raja (Eidgah), Ali Mohammad Mir (Khansahib) and Zahid Hussain (Char-e-Sharief) from the Kashmir Valley. The list was released

on the approval of the party's central election committee. The Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, which has a 90-member assembly, is going to polls in three phases on September 18, 25 and October 1. These six seats will vote in the second phase. This will be the first Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir since the revocation of Article 370 of the Constitution in August 2019 and the state's division in two Union Territories.

High resolution surveillance of Robots preferred by Army

NEW DELHI : Ideally, the robots, which can even climb stairs, will be sent in ahead of troops if a terrorist hideout has to be raided. The robots are connected to the nearest base unit to provide real-time imagery. The Army has named these robots as MULES — Multi-Utility Legged Equipment. Unmanned robots looking like steel-made “dogs” have been inducted into the Army. They can carry high-resolution surveillance equipment, transport light loads, small arms, sensors and even have thermal imaging camera that provide images in the dark. The first lot of 25 arrived in June, following which the Army laid down the standard operating procedures for using these robots. These have been sent to front line units and are functional, sources said. The Army had placed an order for 100 such robots in September last year under an emergency procurement scheme. They can be equipped with small arms, allowing for actual encounter to



be done while the troops could be at a safe distance. The robots can even carry small supplies to soldiers stationed in frontline positions. China already has integrated similar robots into its military operations, unveiling gun-toting robots earlier this year. During an exercise with Cambodia, China demonstrated two versions of these robots: one weighing 50 kg and equipped with an assault rifle, and a lighter 15 kg model for reconnaissance missions. The Indian Army is making a shift to include more and more technology in its operations. The year 2024 has been declared “year of technology absorption” to focus on adopting new technologies to stay ahead of adversaries.

Patwari arrested for taking Rs 10,000 bribe for doing mutation

PATIALA : The revenue official had been arrested based on a complaint lodged by Gurdev Singh, a resident of Amam Nagar, Karhali village in Patiala district. The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB) apprehended Sohan Gir, Amam Nagar revenue halka patwari, Karhali village in Patiala district, while he was allegedly demanding and accepting a bribe of Rs 10,000. He added the complainant had



approached the VB and alleged the said patwari had been demanding illegal gratification of Rs 10,000 for mutation of land belonging to his grandfather in his name. The spokesperson added after preliminary verification of allegations levelled in the complaint, a VB team laid a trap in

which the said patwari was arrested red-handed while he was accepting a bribe of Rs 10,000 from the complainant in the presence of two official witnesses. He added a case under the Prevention of Corruption Act had been registered against the said patwari at VB police station, Patiala range. “He would be produced in the competent court tomorrow and further investigation into this case was under progress,” a VB official said.

legal pitfalls may arise. He said as a deputy mayor as well as being an aware citizen, he is bringing this important matter to the attention of the chief minister and officials of the Punjab Government so that the government takes a timely decision to provide urban faci lities to the residents of the se villages, fulfilling the ho pes of the people of these villages with the inclusion. of this area in the municipal corporation to end this dispute.

While addressing the inaugural session of a national conference of the district judiciary in the presence of Chief Justice of India DY

Chandrachud. Modi said there were several stringent laws to deal with crimes against women and there was a need to ensure better coordination among the criminal justice system to ensure swift justice.

His remarks came after West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee on Friday wrote to Modi, reiterating her request for stringent central legislation and exemplary punishment on heinous crimes like rape and murder.

10% rise in first time voters in PKI : Haryana Poll

Panchkula: The district election office had published the updated voter lists for both assembly constituencies within the district. The comprehensive voter list includes 4,33,369 voters - 2,27,053 male voters, 2,06,290 female voters, and 26 third gender voters, said Mr Yash Garg Deputy Commissioner & Disitt Election officer.

The upcoming assembly elections will witness a 10.18% rise in first time voters in the age group of 18-19 years in Panchkula. Also, 26 third gender voters will cast their vote in the polls, scheduled on October 1, sensitised district election officer Yash Garg here on Friday.

Mr Garg emphasised that individuals who had turned 18- and were not yet registered in the voter list could apply for inclusion until Sept 2. This opportunity allows

ment features 2,33,072 voters-1,22,627 male voters, 1,10,437 female voters, eight third-gender voters. He said that there were 10,132 voters in the age group of 18-19 years, with 4,859 in Kalka and 5,273 in Panchkula. This group has seen the addition of 1,032 new voters, said Garg.

Inferior quality food served at anganwadi Centres

Mohali: Vijay Dutt , member Punjab State Food Commission, on Wednesday conducted surprise inspections of various government schools and anganwadi centres in Kurali and Majri blocks to review the implementation of beneficial schemes. back. Additionally, he directed the relevant department to periodically test the TDS and quality of drinking water in schools to ensure that the children have access to safe and clean drinking water.day meal with the students .

Mr Dutt instructed health checks for school students and medical check-ups for midday meal workers to ensure their wellbeing and prosperity.
