EDITORIAL –

‘Trump's threat of imposing penalty’ on India

When the US President Donald Trump lashed out at India for not lowering tariffs for American businesses, Trump undercut the claim he has incessantly made that on May 10, the Modi govt caved in to his threat of not doing trade with India if it did not pause Operation Sindoor against Pakistan. He had also suggested that India would get a good deal for it's compliance. Trump's outburst on Truth social on Wednesday conflicted with his claim of having frog marched India to cease Operation Sindoor by dangling the threat of stopping trade. Interestingly, the 'all things not good' admission from

the US President, who has earned the reputation of being the global scold because of his petulance and pugnacity, came on a day when the two Houses of parliament concluded a debate on Operation Sindoor that was dominated by Trump's claim of having mediated the suspension of hostilities. On Tuesday, PM Modi had refuted Trump's claim, saying no global leader had asked him to cease the offensive, and that it was the sheerferocity of the *IAF* strikes on Pakistan's airbase that led Islamabad to sue for peace on May 10. That was getting as close as an Indian PM could get to accuse the

US President of inexactitude. External affairs minister S Jaishankar went a step further on both Tuesday and Wednesday, stating that Trump and Modi did not talk between April 22 and June 16. Media in a telephonic conversation, Modi had rebutted the suggestions that the Operation against Pakistan was ceased because of any one's mediation. In a significant decision, the Modi govt got foreign secretary Vikram Misri to let out details of the conversation. India has also consistently rebutted Trump's claim that trade was a factor in India's decision to stop attacking Pakistan after May 10.

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has taken cognisance of alleged illegal tree felling in a garden located in Bhainsa Tibba village, Sector 3, Mansa Devi Complex. During the hearing held on July 29 before the Principal Bench in New Delhi, a three-member bench comprising chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava, Dr A Senthil Vel, and Dr Afroz Ahmad heard submissions from the applicant's counsel, Siddharth Mittal and Sumit Kumar Sharma. The applicant supported his allegations with specific khasra number details and submitted video footage (Annexure A-4) as evidence of the illegal felling, which he reportedly witnessed on



December 19, 2024. He also claimed to have seen logs being transported for commercial gain. The tribunal has issued notices to the respondents and directed the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF), Panchkula, to conduct an immediate site inspection. The PCCF has also been asked to prevent any further illegal activity and take action against the responsible individuals if the claims are substantiated. A separate action taken report must be filed by the PCCF at least one week before the next hearing scheduled on October 30. The NGT has also instructed the applicant to serve notice to all respondents and file an affidavit of service accordingly.

30 services of transport deptt now available through Sewa Kendra from 8 am to 8 pm

MOHALI : Citizens may now visit the Sewa Kendra at their convenience to avail themselves of various govt services. To facilitate easier access to public services, the operating hours of the Sewa Kendra located at the District Administrative Complex (DAC), Mohali, have now been extended from 8 am to 8 pm, Monday to Saturday. The Punjab Government has significantly expanded the range of services offered through service centres and doorstep delivery. Notably, 30 services of the Transport Department, including those related to Registration Certificates (RC) and Driving Licences (DL), have now been made available via these channels. As a result, residents no longer need to visit the RTO office or depend on different agents to complete these formalities. Deputy Commissioner Komal Mittal stated that the Transport Department services recently launched through the Sewa Kendras and doorstep delivery include a wide range of driving licence-related facilities, such as new applications, change of address, change of name, duplicate learner's licences and duplicate licences. Additional services include renewal of licences (where there is no requirement to visit the test track), replacement, correction



of date of birth, driving licence extract, pre-registration, surrender of licence, badge for public service vehicles, renewal of conductor licences, extension of the validity of learner's licences and international driving permits. Similarly, RC-related services now offered include issuance of duplicate RCs, change of ownership of non-commercial vehicles, continuation of hire purchase agreements (in cases of ownership or name change), endorsement of hire purchase agreements and the issuing of fitness certificates for commercial vehicles—whether heavy, medium, three-wheeler, four-wheeler, or LMV—as well as the collection of additional lifetime tax in cases involving change of ownership. Citizens can now avail themselves of these services by calling the 1076 helpline and completing the process from the comfort of their homes, without the need for repeated office visits. The convenience charge for doorstep delivery services has also been reduced from Rs 120 to Rs 50.

Monsoon session to reinforce under-privileged of Haryana to commence on August 22: CM Saini

CHANDIGARH : The duration of the monsoon session will be decided by the Business Advisory Committee (BAC) of the Assembly, said Nayab Singh Saini, Haryana Chief Minister after the Cabinet meeting. The state Cabinet, which met here on Friday, has decided to convene the Monsoon session of the Vidhan Sabha from August 22. For the past 11 years, both the Centre and the Haryana Government have consistently implemented welfare schemes with a focus on the poor, he said. Saini emphasised that the government's objective is to empower and strengthen the underprivileged as against the previous Congress governments, which, he claimed, designed schemes primarily benefiting the affluent. He also affirmed the government's commitment to maintaining law and order in the state. Police officers have been



directed to take prompt and appropriate action on the spot to effectively deal with criminal elements, he said. The Saini government has faced flak from the Opposition over alleged deterioration of the law and order situation. Targeting the Congress, the chief minister accused the Opposition party of focusing solely on spreading misinformation. He said that while it consistently criticises the BJP-led dispensation in Haryana, it remains silent on issues in the Congress-ruled states such as Karnataka, Himachal Pradesh and Telangana. He also dismissed the Congress' election manifestos as mere

"poll gimmicks", contrasting them with the BJP government's "commitment to delivering on its promises". Saini claimed the present government is executing development work at three times the pace, without any bias or regional discrimination. The Chief Minister also said that an action plan is being finalised for the implementation of the 'Lado Lakshmi Yojana' in the state, for which a dedicated portal will be launched soon. To fulfil its poll promise, the BJP government is set to implement the 'Lado Lakshmi Yojana', under which it promised to give Rs 2,100 financial assistance to women. Social Justice and Empowerment Minister Krishan Kumar Bedi recently said his department has prepared a draft policy for the scheme, which has been forwarded to the chief minister's office for approval. Once approved, the scheme will be rolled out soon, Bedi had said.

Commission orders Fortis Hospital to pay Rs 50L for medical negligence

CHANDIGARH : Ms Priyanka Sharma having lost her husband during medical treatment being administered by Fortis Hospital at Mohali, she remained unconsoled and unconvinced due to negligent treatment by the doctors. She filed her complaint that her husband, an advocate, was admitted to the hospital in 2021 with acute gastric problem, she claimed that her deceased husband was not allowed to meet his wife during treatment. When she visited her husband between 12.30 pm and 1 pm on July 29, 2021, she was told that her husband had recovered from the gastric problem and given improvement in his condition, he desired to be shifted to a private ward from the ICU. He was however kept in the ICU on the pretext that ascites was to be removed from his stomach, said the complainant. The commission passed the order on a complaint filed by Priyanka Sharma, widow of deceased Harit Sharma. In her complaint. Holding guilty of medical negligence, the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has directed Fortis Hospital in



Mohali and its doctor to pay Rs 50-lakh compensation along with interest at the rate 9% per annum to a woman whose husband died during treatment at the hospital. Before admitting him, the hospital conducted his Covid test, which was found negative. Since there were restricted visiting hours at the hospital, only one visitor was allowed to visit the patient during the entire identified visiting hours. Tapping was done on the patient on July 28 and 30. However, due to negligence in carrying out tapping, his oxygen level came down drastically and he had to be put on oxygen support. As Harit was fully conscious despite being on the oxygen support, he overheard the

conversation between the hospital Director and doctors that tapping had been wrongly done upon him and it would be carried out again. When she went to see her husband during the visiting hours the next day, she found he was unable to speak due to mask, but made signs asking for a pen and a paper. He wrote on a paper conveying to her about what happened with him at the time of tapping for removal of ascites. He wrote the note with a shaky hand. In fact, it was a dying declaration by the patient, she said. On August 2, she was informed that her husband had died. Refuting the allegations, the hospital authorities claimed that there was no negligence on its part and there was no expert evidence to prove the negligence. After hearing the arguments, the commission said the opposite party (hospital) was liable not only to medical negligence but also deficiency in service as well as unfair trade practice. It said in view of the fact, the opposite party is directed to pay a lump sum compensation of Rs 50 lakh along with interest at the rate 9% per annum from the date of the patient's death.

August 14 new dress code deadline for Chandigarh school faculty

CHANDIGARH : “Considering requests from teachers and their union, and reviewing the practical constraints, the time by which all teachers are required to be in uniform is extended to August 14,” read an order. The directives of UT Education Department reads “All teachers will make best use of the time and get the uniform stitched, so that we all wear the uniform by the Independence Day.” Last going with August 14 as the new deadline for implementing the dress code for faculty of the local government schools has gone final. Earlier, the department had decided to implement the same from July 20. Before that, the department had ordered implementation of a dress code for teachers and principals in government schools on June 30.



However, the order was declared null and void a few hours later. The order was withdrawn considering the objection over the uniform colour, raised by the faculty members. Recently, the department changed the colour combination and outlined ivory colour full suit with a shade darker dupatta for female teachers. Lower could be salwar or salwar-pant or ivory coloured saree and blouse with beige or golden border. For male teachers, it is blue shirt (formal) and grey trouser. For female principals, maroon saree and maroon blouse with golden/beige

border or plain maroon suit with golden/beige dupatta. Male principals are required to wear a white shirt (formal) and grey trouser. The order, which was later withdrawn, had specified off-white shirt and a golden/beige lower (salwar or pant) or off-white saree with beige or gold border for females, and for male teachers, it was formal white shirt and navy blue trousers. It was in April this year that the department had announced to introduce a dress code for teachers, making Chandigarh the first city in the country to implement uniform for schoolteachers. The initiative, taken by the Education Department on the advice of UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria, was first introduced at the PM Shri Government Model Senior Secondary School, Dhanas.

Another name is that of union minister Bhupendra Yadav, who is considered close to home minister and top BJP leader Amit Shah. Hailing from Ajmer in Rajasthan, Yadav is an MP



from Alwar, and he is currently the minister for environment, forests and climate change.

The third name doing the rounds is that of former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan. He has strong organisational experience and a massive mass appeal. He is currently the agriculture minister in the Narendra Modi cabinet.

According to the report, another name has joined the list of probables: BD Sharma. He is a senior leader in the BJP and is known for his strong influence within the party. Former Haryana chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar has also said to be in the list of probables.

FSSAI seizes 273 kg "dates" of expired delivery from Flipkart ware

Coimbatore : The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) officials seized 273.6 kg of expired "dates" from a warehouse of e-commerce major Flipkart India Private Limited in Coimbatore district.

The stock of expired dates was found in the warehouse at Okkilipalayam on Palladam Road near Othakalmandapam on July 17. The Food safety officers destroyed the expired dates and served a notice to the company, seeking explanation.

T. Anuradha, Designated Officer for FSSAI in Coimbatore, disclosed a total of 37 warehouses of e-commerce companies in Coimbatore district were searched in a three-day drive, based on instructions from the Health Secretary and the Commissioner of Food Safety, Tamil Nadu. As the warehouse of



Flipkart at Okkilipalayam was inspected, the FSSAI team found two batches of expired black dates of the brand 'Manna', totally weighing 273.6 kg. While packages of one batch expired on May 19, 2025, the expiry date of others ended on May 30, 2025. "Though expired, those packages were kept on storage racks along with other products meant for sale. Expired products should be kept separately and marked as 'not for sale'," said Dr. Anuradha. Though the company stated that it would return the dates to the

manufacturer, the FSSAI did not permit it and destroyed the product. A statement from Flipkart said "In this instance, the expired products were already identified and segregated as part of our regular quality checks designed to remove near-expiry or expired items from active inventory. These items were stored in a designated zone and were never intended for sale. Our advanced technology and robust processes ensure that only items with sufficient shelf life reach our customers".

Modi flaunts Trump saying India would continue to purchase Russian Oil

New Delhi : Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi struck a defiant tone in the face of US President Donald Trump's tariff threats, and said it would continue to buy Russian oil. He has urged the nation to preferably buy local goods as his administration has signalled favourable economic trends. Modi's government hasn't given India's oil refiners instructions to stop buying Russian oil, and no decision has been taken on whether to halt the purchases. Those people who are familiar with the situation told Bloomberg, asking not to be named due to the risk ridden sensitivity of the matter. Both state-run and private refiners are allowed to buy from preferred sources, and crude purchases remain a commercial decision,



several of the people said. Over the weekend, Modi underscored the importance of shielding India's economic interests during uncertain global conditions. The comments came just days after the Trump administration imposed a 25% tariff on Indian exports to the US. The White House is stepping up threatening more action if India continues Russian oil purchases. "The world economy is going through many apprehensions — there is an atmosphere of instability," Modi said at a rally in

the northern state of Uttar Pradesh on Saturday. "Now, whatever we buy, there should be only one scale: we will buy those things which have been made by the sweat of an Indian." India has become one of Trump's top targets as he looks to pressurise Russian President Vladimir Putin to end his war in Ukraine. The US president lashed out at India last week, criticizing it for joining the BRICS grouping of developing countries and maintaining close ties with Russia, saying "they can take their dead economies down together." The rebuke marked a stunning shift in tone for the US, which for years had overlooked India's close historical ties with Russia as it courted the nation as a counterweight in Asia to China.

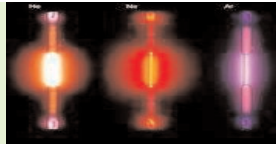

Cultural tussle remains behind Thailand,

Cambodia hostility

Putrajaya (Kuala Lumpur) Both countries Thailand and Cambodia have agreed to an "immediate and unconditional" ceasefire in an effort to resolve deadly border clashes, said Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim.

Acting Thai Prime Minister Phumtham Wechayachai and Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet met on Monday for ceasefire talks at Anwar's official residence in Malaysia's administrative capital, Putrajaya.

"We have seen very positive development and results that would augur well for Cambodia and Thailand," Anwar said as he was flanked by Phumtham and Hun Manet.

The talks between the two warring Southeast Asian countries hosted by Anwar were aimed at halting fighting over a border dispute that has killed at least 35 people and displaced more than 270,000 from both sides of Thailand-Cambodia border. The ambassadors of the United States and China were also present at the meeting. Anwar said US President Donald Trump and China's leaders were in close contact



with the leaders of the warring countries as well as Malaysia "to find a peaceful resolution to the conflict".

He said on Monday that both Cambodia and Thailand have agreed to a ceasefire effective at midnight (17:00 GMT). A meeting between the military commanders of both nations will follow on Tuesday, he added. "This is a vital first step towards de-escalation and the restoration of peace and security," Anwar said. Hun Manet said he had "a very good meeting and very good result that we hope to stop immediately the fighting that have caused many lives lost". He also praised Trump's "decisive" role in paving the way for the talks and the ceasefire, adding that he hopes the agreement will lead to the "rebuilding of trust and confidence" between his country and neighbouring Thailand.
