ZIRAKPUR : Several times in past, the issue of undue pressure on official sewer lines was highlighted by this print media but nothing stemmed out of conversational dialogues as the municipal authorities seemed unwilling to raid the illegal annexations of sewer lines surpassing by over 80 % builders. It is pertinent to underline that good quantity of fertilizer (compost) used to be manufactured by the operator of official sewerage plant located at Singhpura in Municipal jurisdiction.



The surreptitiously annexed sewer lines have been blocking the free flow of sewage water through official channels. The over flow of sewer water emanates foul odour and hit the sensibilities of passers by.

Instead they inhale stinking air and evolve ailments,at present no politico or bureaucrat is taking care of the catas trophic development taking place in Zirakpur with regard to overflow of sewerage water and its emanat-



ions causing over load in sewage pipes lines resulting into blockages, dents and damaging sensitive ceramic lines. For the past over 3 years the only available STP project has been going under



maintenance .The time factor beyond 6 months has been irrational and unjustifiable beyond even one's comprehension . How all of sudden the blockade load became gigantic is clear due to poor maintenance and

non cleanliness of sewer lines .The neglect of mainteance only stood accountable for the collapse of sewerage system of the town . The probe only can ascertain the frequency of cleanliness undertaken by the sewerage

board could reveal the failure of the system and pin point the name of the incumbent Executive officer .The vicious practice would continue to torpedo the functioning of sewerage plants if the frequency of cleanliness is not raised . While conversing with incumbent Executive Officer Jagjit Singh Judge, CNS learnt that he did not have updated information on the local STP functioning , however he said that he would confirm from the sewerage board about the span of more maintenance.

Delhi not ready for ban on old vehicles' plying -- Lt Governor

New Delhi : The Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena has advised the Delhi government to file a petition with Supreme Court before imposing a ban afresh,as people's emotions are attached to their hard earned conveyances.

The ban on diesel cars going above 10 years and for petrol going for 15 years needs to be re contemplated. The LG has advised Chief Minister Rekha Gupta to file a review petition with Supreme Court .The measures undertaken by the local government must be interpreted. The government has claimed that the move will curb vehicular air pollution in the national capital. They sought quashing of the government order and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) that prosecute and penalise



pump owners under Section 192(1) of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, in case of non-compliance with the 'No fuel to End of Life vehicles Rule'. Advocates Anand Varma, Adaysha Nanda and Apoorva Pandey appeared for the petitioners. The Delhi government was represented by its Standing Counsel Sameer Vashish and advocate Harshita Nathrani.

President Xi Jinping bootsup for retiring ?

Beginning : Chinese President Xi Jinping , widely regarded as a leader for life, is beginning to delegate authority to key organs of ruling Communist Party , a first in his over 12- years rule . Xi's move sparked speculation that he may be laying the ground work for an orderly power transition or scaling back his role in preparation for possible retirement . Speculation about Xi's power transition was rife after state - run Xinhua news agency recently reported

that the powerful 24- member Political Bureau of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) in its meeting on June 30 reviewed a set of new regulations on the work of the party's institutions . The meeting presided over by Xi himself stressed that the regulations will further standardise the establishment , responsibilities , and operations of the CPC Central Committees decision - making , deliberative , and coordinating institutions. Such institutions should exercise more effective leadership and coordination over



major tasks and focus on planning , discussing , and overseeing major tasks , the Xinhua report said . While the overseas Chinese dissident community in recent months was abuzz with speculation of a power struggle within the secretive and tightly controlled CPC , quoted the analyst as saying.

Elon Musk launches 'America Party' opposing Donald Trump's tax Bill

Washington : Amid a growing feud with US President, Billionaire entrepreneur Elon Musk has officially launched a new political party in the United States called the 'America Party'. The move came just a day after Trump signed the multi trillion-dollar 'One, Big, Beautiful Bill' outside the White House, approving a tax-cut and spending package that was openly criticised by the Tesla boss. Musk had described the Bill as "fiscally irresponsible" and a "betrayal" of their

shared goal to reduce government size. Musk revealed the development on his X platform, citing an online poll he conducted showing that 65.4 per cent of respondents supported the idea of launching an 'America Party'. Unveiling the plan on Sunday, Musk said he has formed the party as a corrective to what he called a "corrupt one-party system". He accused both Republicans and Democrats of fueling national debt through excessive government spending and corruption -- assert-



ing that the America Party's mission is to give people back their "freedom". As the world's richest person, Musk is expected to self-fund initial operations.

' Verka ' 3000 litre fake milk supply by society Secretary



Dirbah (Sangrur) The Health department on getting information , on Friday along with police official raided a Kothi where adulteration of verka milk was being carried out by its Secretary of Verka society . Hardeep Singh , Secretary, Verka society ,along with his wife Hardeep Kaur used to adulterate the original milk

with locally procured dairy milk, and caustic soda , refined oil and used to sell on good margins to their customers . Health officials learnt that approximately 3000 litres milk daily used to be sold daily for the consumption of the consumers . The raiding team traced about 50 quintal spurious milk from the possession of

the milk supplier. The samples of the fake supply has been sent to the laboratory for the check upin order to know ,as to how much quantity of adulterants were being mixed in the milk supply which could gradually torpedoed the health of consumers.

Land sought for waste disposal by Civic body

Mohali : There was no environmentally approved land available for the dumping of waste disposal.The absence of a designated site for the planned urban city is resulting in the unchecked rise of garbage heaps across the city posing serious threats to public health and the environment.

Amarjit Singh Sidhu , the mayour highlighted past futile attempts of the MC to acquire land for waste management . He said opposition from surrounding villages and the unavailability of suitable land had derailed previous efforts.



In his letters , the Mayor also raised concerns about a major flaw in Punjab's current urban planning policy. He criticised the fact that while land is often earmarked for roads , water , sewerage , and electricity in new housing schemes, there is no provision mandating land for solid waste disposal as a basic infrastructure component .

Silence between
curfew and screams

Words become a lifeline, piecing together the splintered remnants of a city torn apart in and forging a narrative of endurance from the shards of a memory. It moves between private loss and public crisis, between the tragic past and a dark future, transforming an affirmation of the survival of imagination and art in apocalyptic times. 'I See Kashmir from New Delhi at Midnight', Shahid writes: "The city from where no news can come/is now so visible in its curfewed night...." Here, poetry becomes both a vigil and a wake with one's homeland imagined not merely as a region but as an idea, one whose annihilation is always imminent, yet whose memory lives stubbornly in the word. His metaphors of disappearance, longing and fractured belonging are not mere poetic conceits but also chronicles of trauma, deeply reminiscent of Abu Toha's words: "Knitting poems from shards of glass, concrete, steel bars, isn't easy. Sometimes my hands bleed. My gloves get burnt every time." Darwish resists the

dehumanisation that occupation requires. His words are not cries of victimhood but declarations of existence, articulating both the coarse textures of everyday dispossession and the harsh intensity of historical betrayal. In Kashmir, such necessity shapes rare poets like Uzma Falak and Ather Zia, whose verse draws not from abstraction but from lived, daily terror. Their poems map the silence between curfews, the scream that is stifled under the boot. What unites all these voices, from Darwish to Shahid, from Kanafani to Abu Toha, is a shared recognition that poetry, in colonised and occupied lands, is not a retreat from politics but its fiercest articulation. When the state surveils speech, when universities are raided and journalists are jailed, when even mourning is policed, the poem becomes a lethal document, a living archive of dissent. In Kashmir, poets smuggle words across barbed metaphors; in Gaza, they write under drones and dust. It does not prescribe political ideas or actions but helps us live in political history. Yet, to read

these poets merely as chroniclers of suffering is to miss the radical hope embedded in their lines. As Abu Toha writes, "A country that exists only in my mind. Its flag has no room to fly freely, but there is space on the coffins of my country men." This is his way of imagining better days. Though forged in the bleak landscape of Gaza, he conjures a radiance that echoes Milosz and Kabir, insisting that beyond the checkpoint lies a childhood, that beyond the teargas there is still a language that can sing. Poetry, thus, becomes not only the memory of what was lost but also the dream of what might still be won. Poetry becomes suffused with life, where one smells tea and roses blooming through rubble, glimpses a sunset over a sea still shimmering despite blockade and siege. To write poetry in defence of your people is, therefore, not merely an aesthetic act but also an ethical struggle affirming pain as testimony, and rescuing memory from expurgation. As Agha Shahid Ali writes: "My memory keeps getting in the way of your history."

Follow emigration act 1983
for offering work visas or
tourist visa

Mohali : Only agencies registered under the Emigration Act, 1983, with a valid Recruiting Agent Certificate or Foreign Employer Permit, are legally authorised to offer work visa or tourist visa services in India. The district administration has strictly directed that firms registered under the Punjab Travel Professional Regulation (PTPR) Act, 2012, not to engage in any services related to overseas employment, work visas, or work permits, said District Magistrate Komal Mittal. The District Magistrate further instructed all the Punjab Travel Professional Regulation-registered firms to immediately stop all advertisements and



promotions related to employment abroad. Any violation of the District Magistrate's directives will attract strict legal action under the Emigration Act, 1983. Mittal also urged citizens to verify credentials of recruiting agents seeking overseas employment at www.emigrate.gov.in, and remain cautious of unauthorized firms falsely claiming to provide work-related services abroad.

100 CTU diesel buses on expiry of
operational lifespan to go off
tricity roads in November

CHANDIGARH : After reaching their operational lifespan, the buses will no longer be roadworthy and have to be removed from the local routes, said officials of the UT Transport Department. Commuters in the tricity would have to face inconvenience as nearly 100 diesel buses of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU) operating on local routes will be condemned in November this year. These 100 aging diesel buses, currently operating from Depot No. 4, are to be replaced by electric buses. The existing fleet, which includes non-AC green and AC red automatic diesel buses, was allotted to the city under a special scheme during the 2010 Commonwealth Games in Delhi. The department had submitted a proposal to the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for the procurement of environment-friendly buses under the Central government's PM e-Bus Sewa scheme so that the Administration can process the tender at its level and buy 100 electric buses as replacement of diesel buses. However, the proposal is yet



to be approved. Officials stated that even if the approval was received, there would be a shortage of buses on the local route by the end of this year, as it would take at least two to three months to finalise the tender process and select the company. Even if the process was completed by August or September, the selected company would not be able to deliver 100 buses till November, they added. The shortage of buses would affect routes of Chandigarh as well as Mohali and Panchkula as only CTU buses run for public transportation in the tricity. Officials said buses could be diverted from the long routes to the local routes, but it would affect the long routes, from which the CTU gets more revenue. About 350 buses of CTU run on local routes while about 230 run on long routes.

Cash strapped Punjab to
borrow Rs 8,500 cr capitial
amount during July-Sept

CHANDIGARH : The planned borrowings are within the permissible limit set by the RBI. We are raising loans at the lowest rate of interest prevailing in the market till March 2024, the state's total outstanding debt stood at Rs 3.82 lakh crore, which is over 44 per cent of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) disclosed an official from Finance Department on anonymity. The Punjab Government is set raise a loan of Rs 8,500 crore in the second quarter of the ongoing fiscal year (July to September). The market borrowings to be undertaken by the state government have been approved by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). According to information available with the cash-strapped government would raise a loan of Rs 2,000 crore in July, Rs 3,000 crore in August and Rs 3,500 crore in September. After these borrowings, the total loan raised by state government during this fiscal year will go up to Rs 14,741.92 crore. In April and May, the government had raised Rs 6,241.92 crore loans.



The state government targets to raise Rs 34,201.11 crore loans this year. By the end of March 2026, the state's total debt is likely to touch Rs 4 lakh crore. This means that each Punjabi (considering the state population to be 3 crore) will have an average debt of Rs 1.33 lakh by the end of this fiscal year. Earlier this year, a report on debt-stressed states in the country, tabled in Parliament by Union Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary, had expressed concern that Punjab's debt-to-GSDP ratio was the second highest in the country. During the first two months of this fiscal year (April and May), the state's revenue deficit was Rs 5,513.65 crore. The state received Rs 12,903.04 crore in revenue receipts, while the revenue expenditure stood at Rs 18,416.69 crore.

15 MGD upgraded plant costing
Rs 145 cr inaugurated by CM,

MOHALI : The Punjab government has immensely benefited from the experience of Kejriwal, who had taken several path-breaking initiatives in Delhi said Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann. Bhagwant Mann and National Convener of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Arvind Kejriwal dedicated a 15 MGD (million gallons per day) capacity sewage treatment plant (STP) worth Rs 145.26 crore to people.



Kejriwal said it was a matter of pride and satisfaction that a major STP was being inaugurated at Sector 83 here. The government has upgraded this project at a total cost of Rs 145.26 crore. The plant previously had a capacity of 10 MGD. Starting this December, the state government will ensure water supply,

sewerage facility, cleanliness, roads, lights and STPs in 166 cities of the state. "This plant has been upgraded using advanced nutrient removal technology. In addition to the 15-MGD plant, a 5-MGD capacity ultra-filtration tertiary treatment plant has also been established. This is Punjab's first such plant. To reduce electricity consumption, a solar power plant of 1 MW (megawatt) capacity has also been installed at the site.

Under One Judge, One Plant, Mission
500 saplings planted by judicial officers

State-of-the-art trauma centre set
to open in August at GMCH-32

CHANDIGARH : The state-of-the-art facility, with a capacity of 259 beds, is expected to bolster the city's burdened emergency services. The Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH), Sector 32, has finalised scheduled for opening its newly built trauma centre this August. According to GMCH Medical Superintendent Dr GP Thami, while construction has been completed, the installation of medical equipment is still underway. He said a proposal to hold the trauma centre's inauguration on the same day as the institute's 11th convocation has been submitted to the UT Administration. The name of the chief guest for the event is still under discussion. Originally sanctioned in 2019 with an expected completion timeline of a year and a half, the trauma centre project faced significant delays during the Covid-19 pandemic. The project again gained urgency as the existing emergency block began operating beyond capacity. Authorities are optimistic that the new facility will ease



overcrowding and allow the reallocation of the old emergency space for other departments. With this, the city will also house two dedicated trauma centres — the other being at PGIMER — enhancing the region's preparedness to handle critical emergencies. The trauma centre is part of GMCH's larger effort to bolster its emergency healthcare infrastructure. Currently, the hospital operates around 150 emergency and trauma beds combined, which often proves inadequate during peak hours. The existing emergency wing has long been unable to accommodate the growing patient load, leading to situations where patients were

managed on stretchers in crowded corridors. The new wing is expected to significantly improve patient care and response times. The late Dr BS Chavan, the former director of GMCH, had secured funding of Rs 52 crore for the expansion, aiming to separate trauma care from general emergency services. GMCH's 11th convocation, previously postponed due to regional tensions at the Indo-Pak border, has been rescheduled for August 2. Initially it was supposed to happen on May 2 and Union Health Minister JP Nadra was expected to preside, but Minister of State Anupriya Patel had later been finalised as the guest of honour. Degrees in medicine, nursing, paramedical sciences and allied disciplines will be awarded during the ceremony. In addition to the trauma centre launch, the hospital administration is also exploring options to utilise the vacated space in the main building for expanding the gynaecology department, which is facing persistent bed shortages.

"BRICS group does't target any one" plead China, Russia

Rio De Jaeniro : President Donald Trump warned that the United States would impose an additional 10 per cent tariff on any country which aligns itself with the "anti-American policies of BRICS", at least three members of the grouping — China, Russia and South Africa — responded sharply on Monday. There was no response from New Delhi on Trump's remarks. Trump's comments came after the BRICS declaration on Sunday, in an oblique reference to the US, raised "serious concerns" about the rise in tariffs, which, it said, were "inconsistent with WTO (World Trade



Organisation) rules" and "threaten to reduce global trade, disrupt global supply chains and introduce uncertainty." BRICS leaders, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, are in Brazil's Rio de Janeiro for a two-day summit on July 6-7. Hours later, in a post on Truth Social, Trump said: "Any country aligning themselves with the Anti-American policies of BRICS, will be charged an additional 10% tariff. There will be no

exceptions to this policy". He did not clarify or expand on the "Anti-American policies" reference in his post. B R I C S , originally comprising Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa, expanded in 2024 to include Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran and the United Arab Emirates, with Indonesia joining in 2025. China said BRICS is not a bloc for confrontation and does not target any third country. "BRICS is an important platform for cooperation among emerging markets and developing countries,"

MNS workers detained for not following authorised route: CM

Mumbai : Thackeray's party workers were detained, didn't follow route,said Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis Several workers of Raj Thackeray's Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) were detained on Tuesday during a rally to counter a protest staged by traders in Maharashtra over the assault of a food stall owner for not speaking Marathi. The rally in Mira Bhayander area brought Thane district to a standstill, with heavy police deployment and road blockage affecting traffic movement. Despite no police permission for the rally on the route, the MNS workers planned to march to Mumbai. However, the swift detention of MNS's Thane and Palghar head Avinash



Jadhav and other leaders in the early morning derailed the party's plans. In fact, MNS's Sandeep Deshpande said the leaders were detained as early as 3.30 am, calling it an "Emergency-like" situation. "At 3.30 this morning, our leaders were arrested. The police are showing respect to the protest march of Gujarati traders, but are not giving permission to the march of Marathi people. What kind of emergency-like situation is this? Is this the government of Maharashtra or of Gujarat? No matter what they do, the march will

definitely take place," Deshpande said. Saif Ali Khan loses inheritance rights over Royal family properties

Bhopal : In the ongoing properties case Saif Ali Khan has faced set back as Madhya Pradesh HC sends 25-year-old royal property dispute back to trial court; appellant heirs claim 'private properties not part of the throne'

Madhya Pradesh High Court has set aside a trial court order in the long-standing Bhopal royal family inheritance dispute, which deemed the Bollywood actor, his sisters Soha and Saba, and mother Sharmila Tagore as the successors to the properties in an appeal

by heirs of Nawab Hamidullah Khan, who challenged the previous property distribution that was in support of Sajida Sultan, the second daughter of the Nawab and Saif's paternal grandmother.

A trial court had in 2000 decreed two personal properties in favour of the heirs of Sajida Sultan. However, the heirs of erstwhile Nawab Hamidullah Khan of Bhopal, as well as those of his elder brother, wanted a partition and succession of the private properties according to the Muslim Personal Law (Shariat) Act, 1937, which



was applicable at the time of the then Nawab's death in 1960. Thus, they moved court in 1999. But the 2000 order was not in favour of them. Now, the High Court has sent the case back to the trial court and directed it to start afresh with the proceedings and finish the hearing in one year.

Despite previous extension of stay , Ex CJI not vacating govt bungalow

New Delhi:

After the Supreme Court administration wrote to the Centre seeking the vacating of official residence of Chief Justice of India, Justice Chandrachud responded citing personal reasons for his extended stay at the bungalow.

My two daughters have severe comorbidities and genetic problems – particularly nemaline myopathy, for which they are being treated by specialists at AIIMS," the former CJI said.

He said that it was taking time to find a house appropriate for the family, while acknowledging that it was a "personal issue".

Chandrachud further clarified that this has been discussed with the judges and officers of the Supreme Court.

While asserting that he fully aware of his responsibilities having "occupied the highest judicial office", he said that he would move in a few days.

To be sure, former CJIs in the past



have been allowed extended time to retain government accommodation post-retirement, often to facilitate transition or address personal exigencies," Chandrachud said. The top court, in a July 1 letter to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), asked for the Bungalow No. 5 on Krishna Menon Marg in Lutyens' Delhi – designated for the sitting CJI – to be vacated immediately.

While Chandrachud left office eight months back, he still resides in the Type VIII Bungalow, with his two successors – Justices Sanjiv Khanna and the incumbent Bhushan R Gavai – opting to continue living in the bungalows allotted to them earlier.

'Body burials case triggers unease in Dharmasthala

Mangluru ': Ex - sanitation worker's chilling claim " I was forced to bury bodies for years in K a r n a t a k a ' s Dharmasthala's ; shared photocopies of skull , skeletal remains with police. In a startling revelation that can unearth - quite literally - long buried crimes , a former sanitation worker has filed with Dharmasthala police , claiming he was coerced into several years.

A written complaint , dated July 3 was submitted by the complainant to the office of the superintendent of police and Dharmasthala police station , and a case was registered under BNS on July 4.

The complaint further said he had recently

returned to one of the



burial sites and exhumed skeletal remains, of the bodies he had buried photographs of which were submitted to the authorities . In keeping with the complainant's request for anonymity , police have withheld personal details .

The complaint has offered to identify the perpetrators and reveal the burial sites - potentially opening a Pandora's box .

"Colour photocopies of two photographs , showing a skull and some skeletal remains, have

been submitted to the police station. While submitting the complaint on behalf of the complainant , his lawyer had issued a written statement that sketches (of those killed) would be submitted to the court at a later stage , " police confirmed .

Police are yet to confirm the authenticity of some of the skeletal remains that have been found or the exact number of victims . However , the case has already triggered unease in Dharmasthala , a town known for more for its spiritual legacy than criminal intrigue .

The man, who reportedly worked as a sanitation worker in Dharmasthala from 1995-2014, has alleged he was forced into disposing of dead bodies pertaining to acts of crime.
