mer Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) chief Sukhbir Singh Badal, his brother - in -law and senior party leader Bikram Singh Majithia, along with six other SAD leaders, opposed the dismissal of Akal Takht Jathedar Giani Raghbir Singh and Kesgarh Sahib Jathedar Giani Sultan Singh .Issuing a joint statement on Saturday evening, they said that Friday's decision by Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee,'s (SGPC) executive com-mittee to sack the high

priests has "hurt them " They also mentioned that infighting in the party had apparently led to the crisis and called for Panthic unity.Majithia was the first senior SAD at a time when Sukhbir was increasing his hold over Panth affairs by replacing the jathedars , which is seen as the final move towards clearing the hic-cups pertaining to jathedars' insistence on conducting of SAD's membership drive by the Akal Takht - mandated seven seven- member committee. This panel was reduced to five mem-bers following SGPC president Harjinder Singh Dhami and former SGPC president Kirpal Singh Badungar resignation. Expect for Sukhbir 's camp , the move was strongly criticised by the community.

Trump has to face mirror of veracity

US President, Trump has made himself an enigma; a classic case study of a grievously make-belief wounded soul who has managed to pile loads of pending unaddressed grievances during his days of being a common American, without the glitz and glamour of the official paraphernalia. In fact, Trump's every move and management style seems to be taking his unpredictably predictable course of absurdity to a new height of diplomatic embarrassment. From Panama to Canada, Denmark to Germany, each friendly state is feeling hurt, being insulted, ridiculed and snubbed by the POTUS. Whatever has happened thus far (the bewildering variety of utterances and actions of absurdity) under the POTUS can be compared, to an extent, with the 26-year chapter (1325-1351) of Indian history's Delhi Durbār monarch Muhammad-bin-Tughlaq. Historians have graciously judged Tughlaq as "an amazing compound of contradictions" for making the impossible possible, even if for a fleeting moment, and then trying to unscramble the scrambled egg (like scenario) through equally fancy actions of ethereal fiction. Trump has taken a vow to retaliate with tariff-for-tariff in equal measure to make his mission to "Make America Great Again" (MAGA) a grand success during his tenure in the White House itself. In the process, a multi-front strategy is being implemented in battle speed, affecting the entire country and shaking large sections of the populace. The US today is in turmoil would be an understatement because of the unexpectedly astonishing opposition to a broad spectrum of Trump's policy and against a few of his favourite high-profile personnel. The opposition is by no less than some people who were once either close to the POTUS or important officials implementing state policy decisions in the recent past. The developments in the US today appear far from refreshing or reassuring to assuage the feelings of either Trump or the

people. Consequently, mission MAGA of the POTUS is creating a headache every day owing to Trump's uncontrollable and uncontrolled lack of appropriate vocabulary. It is, thereby, putting both friends and foes alike under psychological stress. Trump thinks that his method would succeed in making people all around to kowtow to him and make them succumb to his whims and fancies during his four-year occupancy of the White House. Not exactly. Today, the POTUS, too, needs to do some self-introspection and reflect on his acts through a full-sized mirror to reassess whether he is overstretching himself to put his pet MAGA to an acute angle of futility and resorting to an act of no return. One thing glitters amidst this gloom. Trump is "honestly" non-discriminatory about his indiscriminate howling at all, however mighty or muscular he/she may be, belittling or ridiculing (officially invited) foreign Heads of Government or State. Thus, all foreign dignitaries are under pressure when face to face with the POTUS, notwithstanding its being unlikely to be good news for the USA in the long run. Nevertheless, Trump has been equally unsparring and insulting to India, notwithstanding his avowed personal friendship with the Prime Minister, Narendra Modi. "I have exposed India on tariff," declared a condescending Trump and followed it up with a unilateral declaration that "India has reduced tariff". What absurdity! No meeting, no talks, no discussion between India and America, but the ordained verdict arrives from the White House! Is it a delusion of grandeur? The gross act of the POTUS amounts to the humiliation of successive Indian establishments. His command of demands is reaching an intolerable height, hence unacceptable to this Indian, at least. So, let Trump recall his own country's tariff saga which put the USA on the road to prosperity. Alexander Hamilton, the first US Treasury Secretary

(1789), wanted his country to be on "firm commercial basis". In 1791, he defended the "protection" of the local US manufacturing industry as a fundamental prerequisite. "Not only wealth, but independence and security of country were materially connected to prosperity of manufacturers." Hamilton laid the foundation of the subsequent belief of Americans in their "manifest destiny", whatever that means, internally or otherwise. The US soon became a strongly protectionist country throughout the second half of the 19th century as the victorious Republicans post US Civil War, in 1865, emerged as a party of "national economic might" with a very high level of protection and very low income tax. The "high priest of high protection" was the Republican, William McKinley, the 25th POTUS. Before becoming President, his 1890 McKinley tariff raised import duties to an average of 49.5 per cent because he was convinced that "tariff created jobs, generated revenue for the government and preserved the US industrial power". Consequently, the story of US unilateralism in economics, commerce and tariffs developed a long narrative of its own. It has usually been extremely self-centred through the ages, but for the two World Wars, which turned tariff protection into free trade, owing to the mobilisation of vast resources and an equally vast investment in the US' war economics. Trump, therefore, must stop slighting India at every step — from handcuffing its deportees to using abusive language on everything about New Delhi tariffs. Indian tariffs, good or bad, are for the 1.4 billion Indians. Let Trump deal with China, which finished the US industry, led by the Republican Nixon-Kissinger duo. Incidentally, was Kissinger right or wrong to suggest "it may be dangerous to be US' enemy but to be US' friend is fatal"? Is India's US friendship destined to be fatal? Was Indira Gandhi prophetic to push back the USA in 1971?

Swachh Survekshan necessitate MC to use stricter measures against plastic carry bags littering, non segregation of waste material

Misappropriation of Ayushman medicine caught at PGI

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The PGIMER security staff caught a youth attempting to claim Rs 60,000 worth of medicines on Feb 18, from AMRIT Pharmacy using a fake stamp. After the interrogation of the accused, officials recovered an indent book from the Department of Urology and eight counterfeit stamps belonging to various departments of the PGIMER.



A racket involving misappropriation of medicines meant for patients under the Ayushman Bharat cashless scheme has been unearthed at the Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER). The scam, allegedly spanning multiple states, is under investigation. The police found that the accused was getting instructions from a handler in Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh, who had been using forged documents to fraudulently obtain medicines worth crores under the Ayushman Bharat Yojana. These medicines were then allegedly sold to private medical stores. The perpetrators also had access to patient data of the PGIMER, raising concerns about data security and misuse. The PGIMER and the AMRIT Pharmacy lodged a complaint with the police.

They also formed an internal committee to investigate the scam and recommend preventive measures. To safeguard the integrity of its healthcare services, the institute has made several reforms. The PGIMER is now transitioning to a 'secure online indenting system', replacing the manual process to prevent further misuse of medicines under the scheme. The computer section, in collaboration with the internal committee, has developed an online solution that will be integrated with the existing Hospital Information System (HIS 1) within a week. A dedicated service area outside the Emergency has been allocated for the AMRIT Pharmacy exclusively for the cashless scheme beneficiaries. To further enhance services, the authorities are working to increase staffing to ensure timely delivery of medications and implants directly to patients at their bedside.

200 Maloya houses await CHB orders of allotment

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** MP Manish Tewari in Lok Sabha sought details on the number of houses built under various PMAY-U and PMAY 2.0 projects in Chandigarh since their inception.



Mr Tewari raised a question regarding these houses whether it was a fact that houses constructed under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana - Urban (PMAY-U) in Maloya remained unallotted and were in dilapidated condition, particularly when Chandigarh was yet to achieve the slum-free status. Around 200 houses built in Maloya under the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) and later converted into the Affordable Housing Scheme have remained unallotted since 2015.

In response to Tewari's question, Union Minister of State for Housing and Urban Affairs Tokhan Sahu stated that 2,195 houses constructed under JNNURM in Maloya were later converted into Affordable Rental Housing Complexes (ARHCs). Of these, 1,997 houses have been allotted to beneficiaries on a rental basis and are being used. These houses were converted into ARHC units after the closure of JNNURM on March 31, 2014. Tewari said actually the number of unallotted houses in Maloya, which had become decrepit, might even be substantially more than what had been disclosed in the answer. The ministry further stated that 1,255 families in Chandigarh had benefited from interest subsidies under the Credit Linked Subsidy Scheme (CLSS) pertaining to the PMAY-U. However, the UT has not yet submitted any proposals under other verticals of the scheme. Tewari also questioned about the number of beneficiaries under each of

the four verticals of the PMAY-U in Chandigarh since its inception, along with the year-wise budgetary allocation and expenditure under that scheme as well as the PMAY 2.0. In response, the minister stated that based on the nine years of PMAY-U implementation experience, the scheme has been revamped into the PMAY-U 2.0, also called the "Housing for All' Mission". Launched on September 1, 2024, this scheme is aimed at providing affordable housing to one crore additional eligible beneficiaries through four verticals: Beneficiary Led Construction (BLC), Affordable Housing in Partnership (AHP), Affordable Rental Housing (ARH) and Interest Subsidy Scheme (ISS).

Rs 800 crore income prompts administration to launch auctioning of 97 liquor vends

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The UT Excise and Taxation Department started the process for auctioning 97 liquor vends in the city, envisaging an aim to generate Rs 800 crore in 2025-26 financial year.



The process to submit bids started at 10 am and would conclude till 2 pm on March 20. The bids would be opened at 10 am on March 21. The prices of liquor are likely to remain unchanged with the Department not increasing the ex-distillery price in the Excise Policy. The policy will be applicable from April 1 and remain in force till March 31, 2026. For the 2025-26 fiscal, 97 licensing units will be auctioned by the Excise Department and each of these will be permitted to have one retail vend. The total reserve price of all 97 retail vends has been fixed at

Rs 443.56 crore, which is Rs 8.78 crore less compared to the current fiscal. The reserve price of the liquor vend at Palsora village, neighbouring Mohali, has been fixed at Rs 10.22 crore and for the vend in Dhanas at Rs 8.71 crore. The Khuda Lahora vend has the reserve price of Rs 7.56 crore. Way off the Rs 1,000-crore target for the current financial year, the department is able to generate nearly Rs 743 crore. Twelve vends remained unsold. Sources said the department had set a revenue target of Rs 800 crore for the next financial

year. Meanwhile, women residents of Sukhna Enclave have demanded shifting of two liquor vends facing each other in the area. In a letter to the Punjab Governor and UT Administrator and the Punjab Chief Minister, Lata Dua, a resident of the enclave, stated that the two liquor shops were located near the entrance of Sukhna Enclave on either side of the main road to Kaimbala village in Chandigarh and Kansal village in Mohali. Traffic chaos amid merry-making by labourers was a routine every evening and women and children feared to cross road due to traffic hazards and open-air pubs, she added. The unruly conduct of these individuals disturbs the peaceful environment of the neighborhood, especially during the evenings and late at night, she added.

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Free trade agreement negotiations by New Zealand, India to launch for 2025 deal

**NEW DELHI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that India and New Zealand have decided to start detailed negotiations on a mutually beneficial free trade agreement (FTA). Mr Modi said the agreement is expected by the end of 2025 with his New Zealand counterpart Christopher Luxon. The development assumes significance as India's exports to New Zealand are aggregated to \$682 million in 2023, while New Zealand's shipments to India totalled \$369 million in the same year, as per the data visualisation platform Observatory of Economic Complexity. External Affairs Secretary (East) Jaideep Mazumdar said free trade agreement is a process which has been initiated, in a time-bound manner. "Perhaps by the end of this year we hope to conclude (the) free trade agreement," he added. Welcoming the launch of negotiations for what they called as "balanced, ambitious, comprehensive, and mutually



beneficial" FTA between the two countries to achieve deeper economic integration, both Modi and Luxon agreed for discussions between respective authorities on both sides to explore the early implementation of cooperation in the digital payments sector within the context of FTA negotiations. According to a joint statement, both the PMs, in the context of the negotiations for the trade deal, also agreed to start discussions on an arrangement facilitating the mobility of professionals and skilled workers, primarily to address the challenge of irregular migration.

Speaking on the proposed FTA, Modi said mutual cooperation and investment will be encouraged in areas like dairy, food processing and pharma. The agreements signed between the two sides include a mutual recognition pact between the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs of India (CBIC) and New Zealand's Customs Service. Luxon arrived in New Delhi on Sunday on a five-day visit primarily to push for deeper economic engagement between the two sides.

Housing demand to accelerate with high prices above inflation rate: CREDAI

**LUDHIANA :** CREDAI President Boman Irani said there are no signs of a demand slowdown in the Indian housing market; rather, it will continue to rise in the long term. The Confederation of Real Estate Developers' Associations of India (CREDAI) has said that housing demand remains strong and is expected to grow further, fuelled by tax incentives offered in the Budget and a recent repo rate cut. "While there could be an impact in some markets that are 'overheated,' overall at the pan-India level, there are no concerns at all about growth increasing," he said, while asserting that short-term fluctuations in a real estate cycle are not something to worry about. "We need to see long-term growth," he stressed, citing the property registration data of the Mumbai market for February 2025 to demonstrate that demand remains intact. He shared that property registration in the Mumbai municipal region remained flat in February at 12,000 units. "Tax incentives offered in the Budget and a recent 25 basis points reduction in the repo rate will improve housing demand,"



he opined, while emphasising that one of the boldest moves that he had seen in recent times was the present Budget, in which the government announced it would not tax income up to Rs 12 lakh. Asserting that this will improve people's purchasing power, Irani said the government has been focusing heavily on infrastructure, which is creating new business opportunities for all segments of the real estate sector, including housing, office, malls, and warehousing. Forecasting the housing price outlook for this year to remain similar to the inflation level, the CREDAI chief reiterated that a price increase was not in developers' interest at all. "We are very happy with inflation-related cost increases only. We believe in velocity. The better IRR comes out from quicker turnaround of projects than by taking the prices up," he said, while hinting at a price increase

exceeding inflation due to supply shortages. Noting that real estate developers will have a better profit margin by rapidly executing projects, he said the association is focusing heavily on adopting new technologies that can help complete projects faster without compromising quality. Meanwhile, CREDAI President-elect Shekhar Patel said the association is placing a strong emphasis on promoting green real estate and skill development. "CREDAI is also making significant contributions on the CSR (corporate social responsibility) front," Patel said, disclosing that CREDAI has decided to upgrade 1,000 government schools across the country to mark the association's 25th anniversary. He said that in these 1,000 government schools, CREDAI, in partnership with an NGO, will set up smart classrooms and make provisions for supplying quality water and modern toilets for students. CREDAI was established in 1999 and represents over 13,000 developers across 230 city chapters in 21 states.

IGNOU extends deadline for online distance learning registration to March 31

**NEW DELHI :** Since, the last date for IGNOU admissions-2025 was March 15 and the candidates needed to have a DEB ID for admission (IGNOU) the Indira Gandhi National Open University has changed its admission programme. Now, IGNOU has announced the extension of registration for online distance learning and online programmes till March 31, except for the certificate and semester courses. "Last date for the submission of applications (except for certificate and semester-based programmes): March 31, 2025. Please note: DEB ID is mandatory for submission of application. Please create your DEB ID before starting the application process," the official website read. The ID refers to a unique identification number created by a student who wishes to enroll in any online or open and distance learning (ODL) programme



offered by IGNOU. This ID was developed by the University Grants Commission (UGC) to help students easily identify and enrol in recognised and accredited institutions. Once a student creates this ID, it remains valid for all future use, meaning the student can use it for any future admissions or educational activities. This system ensures that students are enrolling in institutions that meet the necessary standards set by the UGC. To re-register, students should log in on the official IGNOU re-registration portal using their enrolment number and password. After logging in, they can select their desired courses and complete the payment process online.

PM Internship Scheme carrying mobile app launched by Finance Minister Sitharaman

**New Delhi/Ludhiana :** With the aim at providing 1.25 lakh internship opportunities to the youth during 2024-25, the pilot project of the scheme was launched on October 3, 2024. With a dedicated mobile application for the Prime Minister Internship Scheme, Finance and Corporate Affairs Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Monday urged more companies to join the programme while appealing the MPs to encourage youth to join the scheme. "The scheme is aimed at getting youth from Tier II and III cities and help them to understand the skills that are required by the industry as well as the job availability," Sitharaman said, after launching the app in New Delhi. Maintaining a shortage of people in terms of industry expectations and requirements and the scheme is aimed at bridging that gap, the FM emphasised that there is no compulsion on industry and no interference. "The scheme is for a national cause," Sitharaman asserted, while urging more companies to be part of it.



Exhorting the Indian industry to participate in the larger interest, she said, "You need to open the window... for people to have a peek." Speaking on the occasion, Minister of State for Corporate Affairs Harsh Malhotra said the scheme provides on the ground experience for youth and will help in contributing towards Viksit Bharat. "In the first round of the scheme's pilot project, more than 1.27 lakh internship opportunities were provided by the companies and the second round of the project started in January this year under which over 1.18 lakh internship opportunities have been posted by around 327 companies. The deadline for applications in the second round is March 31," he

shared. Sitharaman informed that the scheme's website and app are being made more accessible. It is available in various languages, she said, adding that every language should have its prominence and interns will be provided monthly financial assistance of Rs 5,000 for 12 months and a one-time grant of Rs 6,000 under the scheme. "The scheme, announced in the 2024-25 Union Budget, aims to provide internship opportunities to one crore youth in the top 500 companies in five years," she recalled while stating that the top 500 companies have been identified by the Corporate Affairs Ministry, which is implementing the scheme, on the basis of their average CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) expenditure over the last three years. Stating that more companies beyond the top 500 ones are expected to join the scheme, Corporate Affairs Secretary Deepti Gaur Mukherjee said the government has also introduced a framework for assessment of the implementation of the pilot project.

Bandh call against pastor Bajinder's arrest in Punjab delayed to March 26

**JALANDHAR :** The Punjab bandh call was initially made in solidarity with the pastor, who is facing a sexual harassment case registered against him at Kapurthala. However, considering the upcoming Holi Mohalla and Holi celebrations in the state, the groups decided to postpone the bandh. The Punjab bandh call, initially scheduled for March 12, has been postponed to March 26, by Christian groups and supporters of pastor Bajinder Singh. This decision was announced at a press conference in Jalandhar on Monday, attended by representatives of various Christian organisations and Valmiki, Mazhabi Sikh religious groups. Christian groups alleged that they, along with other minorities and churches in



the state, were being repeatedly targeted. They termed the case against pastor Bajinder Singh as "false" and demanded a fair inquiry by the Special Investigation Team (SIT) formed by the Kapurthala police. The groups also urged the state government to implement the 12.5 per cent reservation for Mazhabi Sikhs and Valmiki in Punjab, as upheld by the Supreme Court of India. Additionally, they sought better representation of Christians and minorities in

various state boards, commissions, and bodies. Surjit Thapar, spokesperson of the Tajpur Church and leader of the National Lok Sewa Party, stated, "False cases are being registered against minority community leaders, including Christians, Valmikis, and Mazhabi Sikhs. We welcome the SIT probe but demand a fair investigation by the Punjab Government and state DGP." The pastor was booked for sexual harassment, stalking, and criminal intimidation on a complaint by a 22-year-old woman of Kapurthala on February 28. As the SIT is already probing the case, the Punjab State Commission for Women has also sought a status report in the case. The National Commission for Women has also taken cognisance of the matter and demanded his arrest.

## Canada imprisioning more indigenous persons

Saskatoon : In Canada, the problem has defied attempts by the Liberal govt to address it .At least 50 persons were involved in Canada's criminal justice system --- lawyers ,advocates, prison staff and former prisoners. They pointed to the imposition of post release conditions on indigenous people, a higher rate of parole denials and the use of mandatory minimum sentences, as playing a key part in the rising rates of incarceration.The sharply higher supervision orders that is being reported for the first time were four times the rate of increase for white people. When Canada's Prime Minister's Justin Trudeau took over office a decade ago, he pledged "a total renewal of the relationship between Canada and Indigenous peoples." His Liberal Party committed to implementing recommendations from a govt commission which



included eliminating within 10 years the over-representation of Indigenous people in custody. With Trudeau due to step down as Liberal leader on Sunday , worsened. Indigenous people, who comprise 5 % of Canada's population , account for about one - third of federal inmates --- compared to just over one - fifth in 2015.High rates of Indigenous imprisonment are a problem in several Western nations. In the

United States, Indigenous people are incarcerated at double the rate of Americas overall , according to the Prison Policy Initiatives. In Australia, incarceration rates are 15 times higher for aboriginal peoples. Trudeau's office and Canada 's justice ministry did not respond to requests for comment. In 2022, Trudeau's govt repealed mandatory minimum sentences for some drug and weapons offences

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
