Global warming becoming increasingly a scourge

NEW DELHI : For 33rd conference of parties of the UNFCCC (United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has proposed to hold COP-33 in India during 2028. The latest Edition of COP-28 witnessed passionate interest of member countries in fast turning climate change conference.

The remarks were made by the PM during an address in Dubai as the latest edition of the climate change conference (COP28) began. He added India had achieved its emission intensity targets 11 years ahead of the committed time frame and remained on track to achieving its Nationally Determined Contribution targets. “We must rise above self-interest and transfer technology,” said Modi.

“In spite of the 17% population, our global carbon emission is less than 4%. India is one of those few economies of the world that is on the path to meet NDC targets,” he said.

Modi called for maintaining a balance between intensity by 45% till 2030” and had decided to increase the share of non-fossil fuel to 50%. India is working towards a goal of net zero by 2070.



“India is committed to UN Framework for Climate Change and hence I propose from this stage that COP33 Summit in 2028 be hosted in India.” India also intends to “bring down emissions

intensity by 45% till 2030” and had decided to increase the share of non-fossil fuel to 50%. India is working towards a goal of net zero by 2070.

Modi called for maintaining a balance between



mitigation and adaptation and said that energy transition across the world must be “just and inclusive”. “Mother Earth is looking towards us to protect her future, we have to succeed, we have

to be decisive,” the prime minister added.

The world leaders have continuously supported the issues of climate justice, climate finance and green credit raised by him. “With our collective

efforts, the belief has increased that for the welfare of the world, it is necessary to protect everyone’s interests.” He also emphasized on the need to give all developing countries a fair share in the global carbon budget. “India’s Prime Minister demonstrated vision at COP28 by outlining crucial mechanisms for global collaboration through the Green Credit Initiative. Building on India’s recent commitment to a Green Credit Scheme, the emphasis is on the interconnectedness

of carbon emission mitigation, biodiversity, and adaptation bilateral ties and the current conflict between Israel and Hamas.

Modi invited the Emirati leader for the Vibrant Gujarat summit, which will be held next month. The Indian Prime Minister also discussed bilatera cooperation on defence, trade, and research and development with his Swedish counterpart, Ulf Kristersson. Modi also met with the leaders of Uzbekistan and France.

Successful execution of rescue operation

All workers trapped in a partially collapsed tunnel for 17 days were evacuated by Indian and foreign experts. This is not the first time that an accident involving a major development project has occurred in the Himalayan region. The Silkyara tunnel disaster has raised many questions relating to large-scale projects being undertaken in the fragile hill regions and also about safety of operations in a difficult terrain as well as disaster preparedness required for such projects. The tunnel under construction was as part of the ambitious Char Dham programme aimed at constructing an all-weather, four-lane highway to connect important religious shrines such as Badrinath and Kedarnath. The project has been criticised by environmental groups and has also been the subject of a public interest litigation in the Supreme Court. Several government committees have gone into various aspects of the project and given it the go-ahead, but the tunnel incident has revived all the doubts and apprehensions about taking up such projects in the Himalayan region. The issue of developing massive hydropower projects, highways and tourism-related infrastructure in the hills has been under discussion for almost two decades now. Following a prolonged agitation by environmental groups during the tenure of PM Manmohan Singh, a couple of large projects were shelved. And no new major projects were taken up. But in the past decade, there has been renewed construction activity in the hills, ignoring safety concerns and calls for environmental reviews. Various laws and regulations, such as the mandatory environmental impact assessment (EIA), have been severely diluted

or bypassed by the agencies and governments concerned. While tunnelling appears to be a good option that can avert the destruction of forests and minimise damage to the environment, the size of the tunnel matters a lot. Can the hills cope with the damage that long tunnels cause? Maybe, project teams need to think of constructing smaller tunnels. The Environmental impact of tunnelling has to be properly assessed before long structures are constructed, whether for highways or hydel power projects. Ill-planned tunnelling is known to affect underground water sources and cause landslides. Blasting for making wider tunnels has dangerous environmental consequences. Another unanswered question is about disaster preparedness and safety precautions taken by construction companies. Only a full-fledged inquiry can reveal if there were lapses on the part of the companies and government agencies involved in the Silkyara project. Environmental hazards have grown due to climate change, which is resulting in extreme weather events and related disasters. The other major issue that needs to be addressed fully is of safety and disaster preparedness for projects in the hills. It is critical to pay attention to the causes of tunnel accidents and ensure the safety at construction sites. This has been amply demonstrated in the past by incidents in Uttarakhand as well as the GLOF (glacial lake outburst flood)-related disaster in Sikkim recently. Accidents are often caused by below-par technical and safety management as well as natural calamities such as cloudbursts, landslides, etc. Adequate attention has to be paid to training and safety management at all

levels. Many technical and scientific issues have to be studied and addressed at the planning stage itself. Europe-based Bernard Gruppe, which has been providing planning and consultancy services to Navayuga Engineering Company for the Silkyara-Barkot tunnel, has said: "Since the start of tunnel driving, the geological conditions have proved to be more challenging than predicted in the tender documents, thus confirming the results of the further exploration measures carried out at the beginning of the execution phase." This points to the need for thorough geological studies before such projects are approved. The other major issue that needs to be addressed fully is of safety and disaster preparedness for projects in the hills. It is critical to pay attention to the causes of tunnel accidents and ensure the safety at construction sites. This has been amply demonstrated in the past by incidents in Uttarakhand as well as the GLOF (glacial lake outburst flood)-related disaster in Sikkim recently. Accidents are often caused by below-par technical and safety management as well as natural calamities such as cloudbursts, landslides, etc. Adequate attention has to be paid to training and safety management at all levels. The trapped workers could have been rescued much earlier on had the safety rules and regulations been followed by the construction agencies, such as the availability of a rescue tunnel. Now that an accident like this has occurred, systems should be in place for swift rescue operations, given the fact that the state has faced several disasters in recent years. All agencies concerned should share their experience and knowledge on how to handle the situation.

Poll preparation for local bodies underway for Jan contest

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : "All the groundwork is complete for the local bodies poll. The model code of conduct will come into force by December 15" revealed highly-placed sources. Elections to at least five Municipal Corporations and 41 municipal councils will be held in the first fortnight of January 2024. The Secretary, Local Government, had issued a notification that elections to five Municipal Corporations, including Amritsar, Patiala, Phagwara, Jalandhar and Ludhiana will be held in the "first fortnight of November". The term of Amritsar and Patiala MCs had ended on January 22, Jalandhar on January 24 and Ludhiana on March 26. The tenure of Phagwara MC had ended in March 2020. The notification came after the Punjab and Haryana High Court in March had asked the State Election Commission to conduct the poll. The Election Commission had committed that the final publication of electoral rolls would be completed by November 10. Sources said the work related to delimitation of wards in the local bodies was complete. They said



preparations were underway to conduct the panchayat poll in the third week of January. Even block samiti and zila parishad elections are also expected to be conducted on the same day. The CM is learnt to have expressed his intention that all elections should be held within a limited time frame. Earlier, the government had decided that panchayat elections would be conducted in two phases. Even delimitation exercise in panchayats was underway. Moreover, January being less hectic for farmers, it's the most ideal month to conduct the poll. The state has around 13,240 panchayats, 150 block samitis and 22 zila parishads. These elections would be a litmus test for the Aam Aadmi Party government's which came to power with a massive mandate in March 2022.

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : Voters can get the entries recorded in the voters' list corrected and name transferred from one polling station to another under the Assembly constituency during this time, for which eligible persons must enter the new name in the voter list, said Deputy Commissioner and District Election Officer Sushil Sarwan. As per the instructions of the Election Commission of India (ECI), claims and objections regarding the voters' list will be taken up by December 9. Persons who will be aged 18 or more on January 1, 2024, can get their names registered in the electoral rolls ahead the upcoming elections. Form number 7 will have to be filled to remove the name of an ineligible voter while form number 8 will have to be submitted for corrections, changing location (outside the Assembly constituency) and remove duplicate cards. OPD, emergency and other services remained unaffected. The PCMSA expressed its displeasure over the government response to its

demands, such as the timely implementation of the Old Pension Scheme (OPS), reinstatement of the 4-9-14 Assured Career Progression scheme, the disbursal of arrears pending under the sixth Central Pay Commission, the release of DA installments that are due and the rectification of pay anomalies of employees recruited under the seventh Central Pay Commission. The association said that given the existing shortage of medical officers, the non-fulfilment of the demands would send the attrition rates soaring, and it may hit the delivery of healthcare services across public medical facilities in the state. PCMSA, Punjab, reiterated its commitment to safeguarding the public healthcare system in the state. The association asserted that the government should accept the demands of its employees as soon as possible.

20% hike in Nov GST collection by Panchkula

PANCHKULA : According to the Ministry of Finance, the collection for November stood at Rs 210 crore, Rs 35 crore more than Rs 175 crore collected during the same month in 2022. The goods and services tax (GST) collection in the city last month witnessed an increase of 20% against the gross levy collected during the corresponding period last year. The collection for October stood at Rs 389 crore, Rs 38 crore more than Rs 351 crore collected during the same month in 2022. In September, the UT had witnessed a growth of just 6% with Rs 219 crore mop-up, which was Rs 13 crore more than Rs 206 crore collected during the same month in 2022.



In August, the UT saw a similar growth of 7%. The tax collection was Rs 192 crore against Rs 179 crore during the same month in 2022. The GST collection had registered an increase of 23% in July against the mop-up during the corresponding period last year. The collection for July stood at Rs 217 crore, Rs 41 crore more than Rs 176 crore in the same month last year. The GST collection had registered a growth of 34% in June against the mop-up during the corresponding

period last year. The collection for June stood at Rs 227.06 crore, Rs 57.36 crore more than Rs 169.7 crore in the same month last year. The GST collection for May had witnessed a record increase of 55% against the collection during the corresponding period last year. The collection stood at Rs 259 crore, Rs 92 crore more than Rs 167 crore collected in the same month last year. It was the highest-ever collection for a month by the UT since the inception of the GST.

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Mid term cooperation review assessed in emerging tech, semiconductors

NEW DELHI : The Ministry of External Affairs made no mention of any talks on the alleged botched attempt to kill Sikh separatist Gurbatwant Singh Pannun. "The two Deputy NSAs reviewed key bilateral issues and exchanged views on regional and global developments," said an official of the MEA. The spokesman of White House on Monday held a meeting with Deputy National Security Adviser Vikram Misri. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said the meeting primarily focused on a comprehensive mid-term review of the India-US Initiative on Critical and Emerging Technologies (ICET), whose first meeting was co-chaired by the two National Security Advisers (NSAs) in January. Previously, sensitive issues such as the alleged involvement of Indian Government officials were



brushed under the topic of "bilateral issues". It is understood that the US side is publicly playing down the case, whereas its Department of Justice alleges that Indian Government officials were ready to pay \$ 1 lakh to an Indian-origin narco-smuggler to kill Pannun. But sources acknowledge that the trajectory could take an unknown turn once the case is taken up for active hearing. The visiting US official, Jonathan Finer, US Principal Deputy National Security Adviser, also called on NSA Ajit Doval and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar. He will also

meet Foreign Secretary Vinay Mohan Kwatra. The MEA release mentioned details only about Finer's meeting with Misri. The aim of the interaction was to facilitate outcome-oriented cooperation in new and emerging technologies. They also took stock of progress made in building technology value chains under the framework of ICET. They also noted ongoing collaborations in semiconductors, quantum, AI and High-Performance Computing (HPC), defence innovation, space, and a d v a n c e d telecommunications, added the MEA.

Suspension of Raghav Chadha MP cancelled in Rajya Sabha

The AAP leader was accused of forging the signatures of five Rajya Sabha MPs in a motion related to the Delhi Services Bill in the Rajya Sabha. The Bill was passed by both houses. Chadha was accused of not obtaining the consent of five Rajya Sabha MPs before including their names in a select committee.

Residents get aggrieved due to faulty lifts, file complaints

GURUGRAM : The Dakshin Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam (DHBVN) has served a show-cause notice to the developer of Shobha International City. Keeping in view complaints filed by residents a residential society in Sector 108 here regarding the malfunctioning lifts in the buildings, the developer has been granted a week's period to provide a response, failing which they would be penalised. The society has eight towers and is home to around 600 residents. The residents approached DHBVN MD Amit Khatri to highlight the poor condition of the lifts. They also highlighted the irregular power supply in the society, adding to the problem of faulty lifts. Besides, the lifts are neither equipped with fans, nor are any phone numbers provided



in them to deal with emergencies. The lift lobbies do not have adequate lighting, say residents. "The conditions of the lifts is such that we fear that they could fall down," said a resident. Acting on the residents' complaints, Khatri directed officials to conduct an inspection, following which a team, led by Electrical Inspectorate XEN YS Gulia, took stock of the situation. The team examined the lifts of B1 and B3 towers and spoke to the residents, following which the notice was issued to the condominium's developer.

"The intercom display does not work properly. Around 320 families living in the seven towers are scared to use the lifts. We have been complaining about the problem for 18 months, but no action has been taken in this regard. Children and senior citizens are often stuck and frightened to even step down from their flats due to the fear of lifts," the residents alleged. "We have taken note of the residents' complaint, and the builder has been given a week to reply to the notice," said XEN Gulia.

Punjab, Haryana asked to prepare anti fire scheme for 2024

NEW DELHI : A time bound plan to tackle the stubble burning in Punjab and Haryana has been demanded by the National Green Tribunal (NGT). While hearing the matter about rise in air pollution due to crop residue burning, it emphasised that farm fires were a serious problem and preparations for remedial action should start now. The tribunal said it had from October 20 regularly monitored the farm fire incidents in Punjab and Haryana and had issued directions to regulate and control the same. "There were 36,632 farm fire incidents in Punjab and 2,285 of those had occurred from September 15 to November 28 this year. According to the district-wise cumulative data, the maximum number of 5,352



incidents took place in Sangrur district of Punjab, while the corresponding figure for Haryana was 476 in Fatehabad district between September 15 and November 16," the NGT said. "The problem of residue burning arises every year. Therefore, for 2024, a comprehensive plan and remedial action needs to start at this stage itself. To prevent such issues, we have directed Punjab and Haryana to prepare a phase-wise

action plan. The counsel for Punjab has submitted that such an action plan will be prepared and submitted before the tribunal in six weeks," NGT's Principal Bench, headed by chairperson Prakash Shrivastava, said. The Bench said the incidents of paddy residue burning in Punjab and Haryana had reduced. Eighteen incidents of paddy residue burning were noticed in Punjab on November 28 and no case was reported in Haryana.

Feb 29 enhanced date for voter enrolment period

AMRITSAR : A fresh notification was issued by the Gurdwara Election Commission with a revised schedule in this regard. The last date for receipt of claims and objections will be April 11, 2024. The final publication of the voters' list will be May 3, 2024. The voters' enrolment process for the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) general poll has been pushed to February 29, 2024. Earlier, the voters' registration was between October 21 and November 15. Many Sikh organisations, including the SGPC, had approached Justice SS Saron (retd), Commissioner, Gurdwara Election Commission, apprising him about the problems being faced by members in registering their votes. In the 2011 elections, a total of 52.69 lakh voters were registered in Punjab, followed by 3.37 lakh in Haryana, 23,011 in Himachal and 11,932 in Chandigarh. As Haryana may be out of the picture this time as it has already constituted a separate ad-hoc Haryana Sikh Gurdwara



Management Committee, the voters from Himachal and Chandigarh would participate in the SGPC poll. While Chandigarh has started the enrolment procedure from today, Himachal has yet to start this exercise. Thus, taking cognisance of flaws in the registration process, the Gurdwara Election Commission has extended the window.

Monthly rental Rs. 1.8 crore, owner evicted by PGI

Chandigarh : The PGI administration issued an eviction order to the private chemist operating the emergency drug shop on Monday. The monthly rental of the shop was Rs 1.8 crore, which was being recovered as escalated price of medicines from patients.

"Overpricing and exploitation has to be tackled in the interest of patients, making patients pay through their nose is a criminal offence. We will look into this for all outlets," said PGI director Prof Vivek Lal, who has taken this initiative for first time. The shop has been licensed to Affordable



Medicines and Reliable Implants for Treatment (Amrit), an initiative of the central government, under which 60% to 70% discount is offered on medicines and surgical items. The private license holder has been asked to vacate the shop on December 31 this year. "Amrit shall take over the shop from January 1 and ensure availability of medicines and surgical items round the clock," said the order.

A committee forced recently by the PGI direction to monitor chemist shops on the hospital campus submitted the report. The panel detected several anomalies in the pricing and quality of medicines being supplied. Based on the recommendation, the director issued eviction order to the emergency drug store which perhaps would ensure all time justice for the suffering class of patients.

Imran to be indicted again in Cipher case on Dec 12

ISLAMABAD : The case was heard in the Adiala Jail, Rawalpindi. The in-prison hearing of Khan, 71, and Qureshi, 67, began from the start on Saturday after a ruling by the Islamabad High Court last month declared the jail trial illegal on procedural grounds and also nullified its proceedings.

A special court in Pakistan on Monday ruled that jailed former PM Imran Khan and his close aide ex-foreign minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi would be indicted again on December 12 in the cipher case for allegedly leaking state secrets and violating the laws of the



country. The judge said that fresh indictment was mandatory in the light of the Islamabad High Court judgment which declared all proceedings illegal after ruling against the jail trial on procedural grounds. It resulted in a fresh process to initiate an in-prison trial of the due after completing all procedures and starting the case from the start.

UT ready for presentation of Mobility card to Centre

Chandigarh: A DPR has already been approved by the Central Institute of Road Transport, Pune. With the introduction of common mobility card, the transport department of the UT administration aims to integrate automatic fare collection system having EMV enabled electronic ticketing machines through partner bank/financial institution. Further, the existing system integrator will upgrade the AFCS application to meet the requirement of NCMC open loop card and the partner bank/financial

institution will be responsible for instant issuance of mobility cards.

"Once the project is introduced, people will have to carry only one card and the same could be used everywhere. This move will encourage people to opt for the city bus service to travel. Since it will be used for multiple purposes, including shopping, people won't have to carry multiple cards with them. Once the project gets the nod, the issue of payment gateway, banks etc will be decided accordingly," sources said.

MOHALI : The magnitude of platelets can never be multiplied by consuming certain specific drinks as goat milk, kiwi fruits ,and coconut water during the recovery process of "Dengu " ailment .One would have to refrain from the directives issued by some quacks, Even in the events of mild fever , one must get checked from the qualified physician , opined Dr Mahesh Ahuja .the Civil Surgeon. During the spread of dengue disease, one would have to become extra vigilant for another 15 days . The platelet count would naturally increase with the intake of health, green food



material. The patient would have to cover full body,and no water be allowed to stagnate in open area as it would breed the mosquitoes . Repulsion of mosquitoes and prevention thereof further would be the priority factor with spray of foggy and toxic chemicals. Many simple fevers however , can not be treated

at home as laboratory tests are always pre requisite to determine the viral quantity . Platelet count goes down with the attack of viral fever. For fast recovery from "dengue" fever, intake of fluids ,healthy home food with complete bed rest would be suffice, pleaded the Civil Surgeon.

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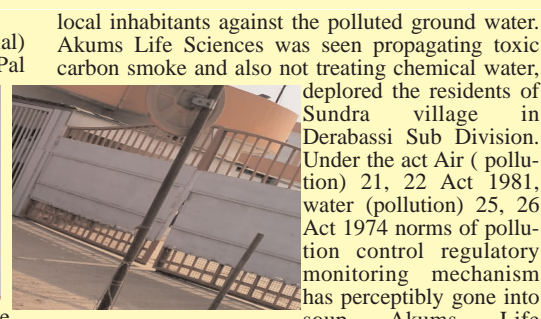
AKUMS Life Sciences violates water pollution act 1981

DERABASSI : The NGT (National Green Tribunal) panel monitoring committee led by Pritam Pal

Justice (Retd) has observed the failure in execution of environmental norms and has held

the respective District Pollution Control incharge accountable for the lapses in the jurisdictional control. The NGT panel has been overseeing the progression of the norms and has recommended the state govt to take strong action against the transgression by the district officials despite having adequate physical and financial resources at hand. It has been noticed massive pollution by the industrial units is being wilfully ignored. On a recce, the CNS with regard to transgression of pollution norms found that the was devoid of any water disposal treatment plant and norms were openly being violated, grudged the



local inhabitants against the polluted ground water. Akums Life Sciences was seen propagating toxic carbon smoke and also not treating chemical water. deplored the residents of Sundra village in Derabassi Sub Division. Under the act Air (pollution) 21, 22 Act 1981, water (pollution) 25, 26 Act 1974 norms of pollution control regulatory monitoring mechanism has perceptibly gone into soup Akums Life

Sciences have been discharging untreated water into the earth, unchecked by the authorities. At Sundra village several local residents lodged their grievances about the polluted water due to the nearby located industrial unit of ply manufacturing, has not been treating the chemically polluted water with the requisite plant. The residents cried hoarse due to the diseases like Asthma, Glucoma, Joint pain, Skin pigmentary disorders germinating in their locality. Against the intense carbon emission, disseminated by Akums Lifesciences Ltd on Sundra road no action

for withdrawing consent to operate has been initiated so far in pursuant of Air (pollution act). It has to be underlined here that the Central Pollution Control Board has to unequivocally regulate the sanctity of environment for cleanliness



of air for disease free life. Why the unstoppable poisonous smoke is being given loose rope to run its shameless, destructive emission and no regulatory monitoring mechanism is yet constituted to carryout random checks, point out vulnerable inhabitants in the vicinity of the Akums focal Centre.
