## AP Paper Mills, Rama Industries operate unchecked, sans Water/ Effluent Plant

DeraBassi / Lalru : Precipitous cry for the potable water is nowhere in the sub division being heard and the adverse climate change has not been stopping its meteoric rise, since the unseasonal rains are the perfect example of the fast changing weather. The requisite steps due to the persistent disregard of Water (prevention & control of pollution) section 21, 22 Act 1981, Air (prevention & control of pollution) section 25, 26 act 1974 and environment pollution 1986

must be initiated to halt the ongoing assault. In Parliament these laws were constituted in order to prevent the adamant climate change owing to unprecedented breakouts of acidic, gaseous emanation into the environment. The world is worried on the worsening change and the gigantic quantum hike in the green house gases, the reason Paris summit had taken place in order to caution the offenders as they also are being subjected to suffering and vulnerabilities. The fast explosion , out-



break of diseases of cancer, diarrhoea, burning skin, asthma, joint pain, bronchitis, conjunctivitis, skin and pigmentary disease are seen not ceasing its hike. The consent provided to the defaulting industrial units was never withdrawn by the regional control authorities, consequently the masses here in the sub division, are paying heavy price through their nose by making high medical treatment bill if the evidence speaks on various hospitals. The growth of cancer cases are taking place on

every alternate day. The other day, AP Paper Mills on Barwala Road was visited by CNS, learnt that no effluent, waste water was being treated. On request, Mr Anil Garg, the Director of the company took the scribes around the industrial unit, and explained the work-

ing but no polluted water was being treated , also effluents were discharged in open and buried in the earth itself. The director of the company said they didn't need treatment plant as their polluted water was evaporated into the environment. He, perhaps, didn't

know that the polluted water, and effluents were mandatorily required to be treated clean . Since expanse of environment was precious and valuable asset, for us to breathe. No industrial unit could damage the ground water ,yet the director Anil Garg didn't accede to our advice. In this context , where are the regional control authorities, taking no action , only providing fast consents to damage the fabric of environment. On the contrary, in contravention of said pollution norms, another Rama Gelatine Industries were discharging acidic, polluted water sans any treatment, remained unchecked by the pollution control sleuths. Despite many efforts to contact Regional Pollution Control Executive Engineer incharge Gursharan Das Garg, there was no reply and he obviously evaded to talk with the media on the combustible subject matter, steps must be, initiated to reform the ailing system which could see resultant catagoric change.


considerably one's high blood pressure. Eggs contain essentially requisite quantum of protein which does regulate our chaotic blood pressure.

Multiple meetings have been convened in the past few days, so that all the components can be studied minutely before giving a final shape to the budget." The Chandigarh administration has already approved Rs560-crore (GIA) for the Chandigarh municipal corporation for 2024, said sources in the Civic body.

## Bail from court for Nobel laureate



Dhaka : In a 2.3 million embezzlement case, Muhammad Yunus was imprisoned for 6 months and on Sunday was granted bail Mr Yunus was awarded Nobel Peace Prize in 2006 for pioneering the use of microcredit to help impoverished people . He was also charged for transgressing labour laws. Mr Mir Ahmmad Ali Salam the prosecutor said embezzled amount comprised of workers welfare fund of Grameen Telecom , which owns 34.2% of the country largest



mobile phone company. The embezzlement of over 250 million involved takas and money laundering.The accused had given the money to trade union leaders instead of workers. Moe than 170 global leaders and Nobel laureates urged Bangla Desh prime minister Sheikh Hasina to suspend legal proceedings against Yunus.

## Mohali gets 1st street vending zone for Mohali

After the inauguration, MC commissioner Navjot Kaur said that 268 vendors will be allotted sites, and preference will be given to handicapped vendors and those which have already been issued licenses. The site has been prepared at a cost of rupees 41lakhs. Proper marketing has been made for the vendors and other public utilities like toilets, parking have been pro-



vided at the site." MC had earlier failed to start street vending zone due to disparity between GAMADA and MC over hand allotment. On earlier four instances, GAMADA and MC did not arrive at a consensus over street vending sites proposal, which were stalled.

**EDITORIAL -**

**Compulsions rule the roost in politics**

The most significant aspect of the tie-ups firmed up INDIA bloc last week by the Congress with the Samajwadi Party (SP) in Uttar Pradesh and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in Delhi, Haryana and Gujarat is a belated realisation in the grand old party that it no longer holds the command of a coalition from an imperious perch. In the joust for leverage — in this case, limited to seat-sharing and not leadership or yet crafting a political narrative — between a pan-India party such as the Congress and regional entities, the playing field is uneven.

There are potential Congress allies such as the Trinamool Congress (TMC) that are steadfastly unwilling to accept the upper hand it would like and there are those like the SP and AAP, which refused to compromise while extracting their part of the bargain from the party. The just-settled relationships look so transactional that both sides must wonder if there is headroom for them to fashion an ideological countervail against the BJP, which reminds voters at every step of its 'commitment' to the RSS's credo despite the blatant cynicism it demonstrates in a bid to retain power. AAP leader and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal raised a smidgen of hope among voters with the promise that INDIA would be their 'safety net', protecting his flagship schemes from the Centre's alleged predation. Regional parties have their own compulsions while safeguarding their terrain. Most of them, especially the SP, were buffeted by serial setbacks amid the BJP's national ascendancy.

If the SP does not put up a respectable show on the 63 seats it will contest (17 have been apportioned to the Congress) — which means that it needs to win more than just the legacy seats claimed by its chief Akhilesh Yadav's family — it will be left battered and demoralised before the 2027 UP polls. Since 2014, the SP has lost every election in UP, including the 2017 Assembly polls fought together with the Congress. It was then a half-hearted pact that was mutually broken on quite a few seats. Akhilesh, then the chief minister, INDIA's limited objective seems to be to hold back the BJP wherever it can. The Congress is fortunate that its alliance in Bihar — despite the JD(U)'s exit — and Tamil Nadu stand intact, but will the party's top brass check the daily exodus to the BJP from its rank and file and convey an impression that it is at least half-way robust? The BJP's intention is to hollow out the Congress. Combating the few regional players standing up to it so far can come later. With AAP, the considerations for sewing up a partnership were many. Delhi had handed a runaway victory to the BJP in the 2014 and 2019 Lok Sabha elections, reinforcing AAP's status as a small entity in contrast to Kejriwal's lofty ambitions. AAP was rendered more vulnerable after the Centre enacted a statute truncating the Delhi Government's powers and importantly, whittling down the CM's authority over his own bureaucrats. Then, the probe into the excise case zeroed in on two of Kejriwal's prime aides and ministers, leading to

their incarceration. Kejriwal never let on that he was negotiating with the Congress from a weakened position. In fact, he delivered the first blow to an incipient INDIA in its first meeting in June last year when he threatened to walk out if the Congress would not publicly declare its opposition to the Delhi Services Bill. Later, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge resolved the impasse by setting up a parliamentary strategy group for issues arising out of alliances. AAP got the seats it wanted in Delhi — four out of seven — leaving three for the Congress in the hope that the arrangement will consolidate the traditional vote of both parties from the minorities, Dalits and a section of the migrants. AAP ensured that there was no alliance in Punjab for a tactical reason: had the two tied up, the anti-AAP vote might have shifted largely to the Shiromani Akali Dal or the BJP. Rahul Gandhi led the campaign on the 'UP ke do ladke' (UP's two boys) slogan, but on the ground, the SP found it hard to transfer its base vote from the Yadav caste to the Congress. This time, notwithstanding the early hiccups, the seat-sharing was clinched more amicably, simply because both sides are desperate to survive. According to insiders, the big expectation is that the Muslim vote will go to the alliance despite the proven tendency of the third player, the Bahujan Samaj Party, to field many candidates belonging to the minorities in order to split votes. Had the SP not tied up with the Congress, the minority vote would have been fragmented.

**TTE pushes woman, victimised out of moving train gets stuck between train and platform**

He first threw the woman's luggage out of the train and then pushed her while the train was moving. In a shocking incident, a Travelling Ticket Examiner (TTE) allegedly pushed a 40-year-old woman out of a moving train in Haryana's Faridabad. As she was pushed, the woman got stuck between the train and

the platform and got injured. Bhavna is a resident of SGJM Nagar in Faridabad. The woman boarded the AC coach of the Jhelum Express from Faridabad, Haryana, and was on her way to attend a wedding in Jhansi. A case of attempt to murder has been registered by the GRP against the TTE. The TTE fled the spot after pushing her. The incident dates back to February 29.

**IT professionals complain lower back pain**

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** Lifestyle factors, including prolonged sitting in a poor posture and excessive use of mobile devices, have been identified as major contributors to this rise in back pain cases. In an associating trend observed at the PGI Pain Clinic here, a surge in young patients, particularly those in the IT field, seeking treatment for lower back pain has been reported over the past five years. The clinic recently attended to a 23-year-old IT professional who presented with severe lower back pain. Investigation revealed that his sedentary lifestyle, coupled with prolonged hours of coding work, led to the distressing symptoms. The patient has been prescribed lifestyle modifications, counselling and pain relief medication to address the immediate concerns. However, doctors emphasise if such detrimental habits persist, the intermittent pain may evolve into a



chronic condition, potentially causing 24-hour discomfort and mobility challenges. Dr Babita Ghai, in charge of the Pro and Pain Clinic, Anaesthesia Department, highlighted a shift in the age demographic seeking treatment for back pain. Previously associated with older age groups, back pain is now affecting individuals aged between 20 and 30, with over half of them employed in the IT sector. The Pain Clinic, operating every Wednesday and Saturday, caters to referral cases, with 70 to 75 per cent patients reporting lower back pain persisting for years. The clinic provides various

therapies, with a significant focus on yoga, which has shown promising results in alleviating pain associated with prolonged sitting. Dr Ghai emphasised the importance of physical activity and the adverse effects of continuous sitting. Yoga, previously lacking scientific evidence, is now being actively incorporated into patient care. The PGI has undertaken a large-scale study to further explore the benefits of yoga in managing spinal cord patients. Furthermore, the Collaborative Centre for Mind Body Intervention at the PGI, established four years ago, has collaborated with the Research Council on Yoga and Naturopathy in New Delhi. This centre scientifically studies the effects of yoga on the body. Notably, online yoga sessions are being offered to patients, reflecting a proactive approach to address the growing concern of back pain in the younger population.

**Upgradation of Chandigarh railway station goes upto May 31**

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** Initially set for April 10, 2024, the project's timeline has been revised to May 31. The railway officers from the headquarters and Ambala division took stock of works being carried out under the Amrit Bharat Stations scheme. Local railway station's transformative upgrade, designed as a prototype for future stations, has encountered an extension in its completion deadline. The station is being upgraded with innovative modular designs and prefabricated components. The contract has been awarded to M/s Ahluwalia Contracts



(India) Limited at a cost of Rs 462 crore. Buildings (G+3) of sizes 60m x 42m each are planned on both sides of the station. The ground floor features essential services such as ticket counters, book stalls, a souvenir shop, a retail shop, railway offices and an executive lounge. The second floor will house enquiry counters, a food court, retail shops, a cloak room and a paid waiting lounge. The third floor will have an exclusive food court. An air-concourse (72m x 80m) will connect the

second floors of the two buildings. The platforms will be accessible through lifts, escalators and stairs from the concourse. Two foot overbridges (each 12 m wide) are strategically positioned on the Kalka and Ambala ends of the station. These will be used by arriving passengers and will also be connected with the station building. A through roof, measuring 180m x 80m, covering the entire area of air-concourse and both the foot overbridges is an important feature. The present parking area on both sides of the station are being developed and is being increased from the existing 13,720 sq m to 24,515 sq m.

**Unidentified persons shoot outside shopping mall in Mohali**

Following the incident, a forensic team reached the spot and an investigation was initiated by the police. Police said around eight to nine shots were fired. Eight FIRs were registered against the deceased, who had come out of the jail recently, they added. Ropar Range IG Jaskaran Singh said as per preliminary investigation, four persons belonging to

**'Ghost plants' scam to be reprobated by SIT Forest Department**

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** After grilling by the Vidhan Sabha's Committee on Government Assurances, the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) has assured that the ghost plants scam of the Forest Department's Research Division, Pinjore, will be investigated by a special investigation team (SIT) headed by a DIG. The issue was raised in the Haryana Legislative Assembly on March 22, 2022, during a Calling Attention Motion, where the government tabled the inquiry report and assured a vigilance inquiry. However, after the DSP of bureau, Devinder Singh, gave a clean chit to the accused, IFS officer Jitender Ahlawat, the Assurance Committee took up the case. During a hearing, DG (Vigilance) Shatruijeet Kapur and DIG Pankaj Nain appeared before the committee and it was decided to form an SIT under Nain. The inquiry report had revealed that despite no target available for new plants from the Forest Department, on January 27, 2021, a letter was issued to former contractors for extending their contract from January 28, 2021, to



February 28, 2021. Their contracts had ended on August 31, 2020, and October 31, 2020. The contractors had executed works worth Rs 1.87 crore. The panel found that the then Deputy Conservator of Forests (Research), Pinjore, Jitender Ahlawat, violated a standing order on tenders. Ahlawat was to grow 16.85 lakh new plants, while the detailed account reflected only 9.6 lakh plants were grown till March 31, 2021. It implied that 7.77 lakh plants were not grown, but the entire allotted amount was spent by March 31, 2021. The panel said Rs 51 lakh was "embezzled" as it was meant to be paid as EPF/ESI/contractor profit, but instead, it was spent on labour, machinery or material. The panel found that Rs 37 lakh was available with the Research Division from January 2021. The permission was granted for its use for growing new plants, which was not done.


# New flight by IndiGo to commence from March 31 between Amritsar, Hyderabad

**AMRITSAR** : The new air connectivity with Rajiv Gandhi International Airport in Hyderabad would enable one-stop flights onwards to Bangalore, Chennai, Mumbai, Raipur, Rajahmundry, Vijayawada, Mysore, Visakhapatnam, Nashik, Tirupati, Shirdi, Bhubaneswar, Madurai and Colombo (Sri Lanka). IndiGo would start a new flight from Sri Guru Ram Das Jee International Airport to Rajiv Gandhi International Airport in Hyderabad from March 31. IndiGo would be the second airline to connect Hyderabad with Amritsar. Currently, Air India Express operates daily Boeing 737 MAX flights on this route. The airline would operate daily A320 flights. The 6E168 flight would depart from Amritsar at 5:30 am and reach Hyderabad at 8:05 am. The return flight, the 6E167 would depart from Hyderabad at 9:05 am and reach Amritsar at 11:45 am. Local residents and activists of Fly Amritsar Initiative have welcomed airline's move. Yogesh Kamra, convener, the FlyAmritsar Initiative, said, "Direct non-stop between Amritsar and Hyderabad will be a boon for the tourism industry and devotees who are headed to Nanded, Tirupati and Shirdi."

# Rs 1500 per month for over 5 lakh women in HP : CM

**SHIMLA** : The new scheme had been named Indira Gandhi Pyari Behna Sukh Samman Nidhi Yojna, said Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. Mr Sukhu announced the grant of Rs 1,500 monthly financial assistance, one of the 10 Congress guarantees, to over five lakh women between 18 and 60 years from April 2024. "I had proposed to make this announcement in the Budget, but owing to



a ruckus in the Assembly, I thought of announcing it later," he said. This, he added, would silence the opposition BJP, which had been criticising the government on not fulfilling the 10 guarantees. "This scheme has already been implemented in the

tribal district of Lahaul & Spiti and now from the next financial year, commencing on April 1, this assistance will be given to women all over the state," he said. He said with this, the state government had fulfilled the fifth guarantee made by the Congress. Sukhu said the decision to give Rs 1,500 to women will put an additional burden of Rs 800 crore annually on the state exchequer. "About five lakh women are likely to benefit," he said.

# 36 months prison for Zaman Shaa's owner of Indian restaurant banned for Covid loan fraud in UK

**LONDON** : Zaman Shaa was sentenced to 36 weeks in prison, which has been suspended for 18 months under strict conditions and was disqualified as a company director for two years. The owner of an Indian restaurant who used funds from the UK government's Covid Bounce Back Loan for personal gain has been sentenced and banned as a company director for two years. Zaman Shaa's Shaa Ventures Limited ran Chutneys Indian takeaway food restaurant in Salisbury, southern England. The 53-year-old broke UK company law before securing a loan by applying to dissolve his business, even though it had been trading in the previous three months. "Zaman Shaa exploited a scheme intended to help businesses during a national emergency for his gain,"



said Pete Fulham, Chief Investigator at the UK's Insolvency Service. "His actions cannot simply be dismissed as something he did in the spur of the moment. They required a degree of planning and sophistication over several weeks to execute. The sentence and disqualification order for Shaa demonstrate we will not hesitate to take action against directors who have abused Covid financial support in such a manner," he said. Shaa was also ordered to pay GBP 6,000 (USD 7,614) in

costs, at a rate of GBP 250 (USD 317) per month, at the same hearing on February 23. The court heard that he had applied for a GBP 30,000 (USD 38,071) Bounce Back Loan in August 2020 when he was the director of Shaa Ventures Ltd. He failed to fulfil his legal requirement to inform creditors that he had applied to dissolve the company. Insolvency Service analysis of Shaa's transactions indicated he transferred the funds into his personal accounts, sent some of the money abroad using a remittance service, and withdrew significant amounts in cash. The disqualification order prevents Shaa from becoming involved in the promotion, formation or management of a company, without the permission of the court before February 2026.

# Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

**GURUGRAM** : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city. The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

**NEW DELHI** : A Bench led by Supreme Court CJI DY Chandrachud -- which had last month pulled up the AAP for encroaching on the land meant for expansion of judicial infrastructure -- however, allowed the AAP to apply to the Land and Development Office (L&DO) of the Centre for alternative land. "The Supreme Court permits the AAP to move the Centre (L&DO) for allotment of land and LN&DO to process the application in accordance with law in the meantime and communicate its decision within four weeks," it said. The top court said the Delhi High Court was in urgent need of the allotment of premises for housing the new recruits, for which courtrooms were not available. The Supreme Court on Monday directed the Aam Aadmi Party to vacate by June 15 a bungalow on land allotted to the Delhi High Court for expansion of judicial infrastructure in the national capital. The AAP's party headquarters



is situated on that land. "In view of impending general election, we grant time till June 15 to vacate the premises so that land allotted to extend district judiciary footprint can be duly utilised on an expeditious basis," the Bench said. Noting that the the MTNL building, which was earlier proposed, has been found to be unsuitable, it directed the Chief Secretary of the Delhi government to come up with an alternative proposal in two weeks and communicate it to the Chief Justice of the Delhi High Court. Anguished to know that the AAP has built its office at Rouse Avenue in the national capital over a piece of land originally allotted to the Delhi High Court for

expansion of judicial infrastructure, the Supreme Court had last month directed the Delhi government and the Delhi High Court Registrar General to hold a meeting for removal of the encroachment. "How can a political party sit tight on that? Unencumbered possession must be given to the High Court," the CJI-led Bench had said while hearing a plea related to the condition of district judiciary in India. "No one can take law into their own hands ... how can a political party sit tight on that? Unencumbered possession must be given to the High Court. What will the High Court use it for -- only for the public and citizens? Why was the land then allotted to the High Court?" the CJI had wondered. The top court had asked the Delhi Chief Secretary, Secretary, Delhi Public Works Department, and the Finance Secretary of the NCT government to convene a meeting to find a solution to the issue after amicus curiae K Parameshwar informed the Bench that a political party has set up its office on the land in question.

## CTU fleet to be inducted with 100 new electric buses in Aug

Chandigarh: E-buses were availed under the phase II of the FAME (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles) India Scheme of the central government. In the tendering process for the new e-buses, which concluded earlier this week, the lowest bid was of Rs 61.8 per km made by PMI Electro. The 100 buses are being availed under the 'PM e-Bus Sewa' scheme of the central government. "Now the transport department will issue a letter of consent to the company. Thereafter, a model bus will be manufactured. After the approval from the CTU, the company will start delivering the buses. The



entire process will take at least six months," said an official. The new buses, longer in size, will be able to carry more passengers. "Being ULE, it will be very convenient for the commuters to enter/exit buses, particularly, for people with physical disabilities and senior citizens," said the official. The 100 new e-buses will replace the existing diesel buses, which are currently

plying on Tricity routes. The CTU got its first batch of e-buses in 2021, and currently, 80 e-buses are operational. There are total of 438 local buses with the CTU. The UT administration plans to replace all of its diesel buses with e-buses by 2027-2028. With the central government completing the tendering process, a fresh batch of 100 new e-buses will join the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU) fleet from Aug.

## Mandated price list not being implemented

Chandigarh: Despite demands from students nearly two years ago for implementation of the student center rate list for food at Punjab University, little progress is visible, allowing shop owners to exploit students by charging inflated prices. In 2022, the student body urged Punjab University to implement the student centre rate list. "Despite the promised release of the rate list, it remains unimplemented by student centre shops, resulting in higher charges than those stipulated," the student body emphasized, denouncing this as exploitation of students and criticizing the DSW's inaction regarding the implementation of the rate list. Most students were unaware of the prices they should expect for food items. Approximately at the nine food and juice shops at the student centre, five do not



display prices on their menus. When queried a shop attendant remarked that prices were not listed and directed customers to inquire at the cash counter. Notably, discrepancies abound between the approved rate list and the actual price charged. For instance, while the approved rate for chana bhatura with three pieces is Rs 46, an eatery charges Rs 60, for just two pieces. Similarly, the approved rate for Amritsari chola kulcha is Rs 55, but these shops charge Rs 75 for the dish. Prices for items like paneer thali and chinese dishes far exceed the approved rates, with little oversight apparent.

## Sohana pond to be rejuvenated at Rs.1.6 crore-- MLA

Mohali: The Sohana pond will be rejuvenated under Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) Scheme, at a cost of Rs 1.6 crore" sources revealed. ## Russia leaks link where officer talk military aid for Ukraine - Germany probes

Warsaw: German Chancellor Olaf Scholz this weeks said he remained reluctant to send Taurus long-range cruise missiles to Ukraine, pointing to a risk of Germany becoming directly involved in the war. But in the purported audio, German officers discuss the possibility of the missiles being used in Ukraine. Scholz said on Saturday authorities were investigating a purported recording published by Russian state media in which German military officers discussed the country's support for Ukraine, including the potential use of Taurus missiles. Scholz called it a "very serious matter" in comments to reporters on the sidelines of a visit to the Vatican on Saturday, a German news agency reported.



Margarita Simonyan, chief editor of state-funded Russia said the audio revealed German officers discussing strikes on the Crimean Bridge. "In this (...) recording, high-ranking Bundeswehr officers discuss how they will bomb (attention!) the Crimean bridge," she wrote on the Telegram messaging app, adding the conversation took place on Feb 19. Within the conversation she said, one of the officers

mentioned a planned trip to Ukraine on Feb 21 to coordinate strikes on Russian targets. Scholz said German authorities were working to clarify the matter "very carefully, very intensively and very quickly" Ministry of defense said it was probing whether communications within the air force were intercepted by Russia. Zelensky seeks air defence as attacks kill 10.

## Kejriwal to appear before ED in excise policy probe on 16 Mar

## New dress code for convocations being deliberated by PU

Chandigarh: The panel responsible for deliberating on academic costumes at PUNJAB UNIVERSITY finally reached a consensus after two previous failed attempts. The meeting held on November 16 saw the PUNJAB UNIVERSITY CAMPUS STUDENT COUNCIL (PUCCS) proposing a "unique and attractive dress as an alternative to the conventional gown." The university is currently in discussion and convening meeting to deliberate on changing the dress code for the upcoming convocation, scheduled for March 7. During the last convocation, the issue was addressed and resolved that it would be tackled next time. However years have passed since the committee was formed, yet I recently learned in the senate that no progress has been made. Students' opinions were sought in November. Hence, this time, we could have expected action, at least for fellows or senators."

## Blds violation penalty moved to Re 1 lakh : UT

Chandigarh: The penalty on building violations and misuse of premises, the UT administration has submitted a fresh communique with the ministry of home affairs (MHA) on the 'cabinet note' prepared. The MHA had sought certain clarifications, including financial impact of the decision, and requisite information in a stipulated format. ## Only 10 Fake drugs manufacturing companies challaned out of 1683 in HP

Kulu : Himachal Pradesh state govt has taken legal action only against 10 pharmaceutical companies out of 1683 challaned by state drug controller .



In the recently held budget session, the minister disclosed that only 677 pharma companies were based in the state, in a total 1683 drug sample had failed.

Some companies got just warnings, rest got product manufacturing suspension only for 7 days to 6 months or just let off sans justified reasons.

In other cases, one Rajni Bharga the Baddi based Cypher-- Pharma had been

arrested for illegally manufacturing drugs and samples had failed.

The defaulting companies included Digital Vision, Nixi Laboratories Pvt Ltd, Cypher Pharma, Tulip Formulation, LV life & sci-

ence, Stanford Laboratory, Park pharma veyot, Digital Vision is a pharmaceutical company linked to cough syrup which had reportedly led to the death of 12 infants in the Ram Nagar area of Udhampur district.

## Amrit Sarovar : Waste management plant inaugurated by Administrator

Chandigarh : The local Municipal Corporation dedicated to constructing a state of the art integrated solid waste management plant, designed by research institute NEERI, would ensure the task of waste management plant commences shortly.

Mr. Banwari Lal Purohit the administrator asked the MC commissioner Ms. Anindita Mitra to process tender for the plant at the earliest so that the construction could commence soon which could further enhance the potentialities of waste management. Mr. Purohit also inaugurated newly built Amrit Sarovar in Dadumajra.

Mayor Kuldeep Dhalor stressed commitment to development in Dadumajra area. He said it was a happy moment for not only the residents of Dadumajra, but also for the citizens of City Beautiful that no further



dumping of waste would take place in this area as all waste now would be processed scientifically. He added that the compost plant had been constructed at a cost of approximately Rs 7 crore.

Mr. Dhalor further said that addressing the issue of leachate and ensuring the wellbeing of the community, MC Chandigarh was constructing a 400-meter wall around the dumping ground, accompanied by a continuous drain to prevent leachate from flowing on to the streets. Tender for the drain had been received, and work was expected to commence

shortly. Additionally, a sanitary land fill site and a 15 feet wall had been constructed around the dumping ground in the past two years. Ms. Anindita Mitra Municipal Commissioner said the compost plant, spread over 7,200 square meters, and equipped with a 300 TPD window, was designed to handle the increasing waste generation in the city. "With a commitment to providing effective waste management service and garbage free city, the MC Chandigarh has invested in this much awaited project.

## Housing project laden with non functional STP

Gurgaon: Committee will have to determine the situation at the residential project, the extent of violation, and also recommend corrective actions before preparing the report.

The order was issued after a petitioner Varun Gulati filed complaint against two developers in Panipat, alleging that they had developed a project but the STP is not operational.

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed a joint committee to look into allegations of a nonfunctional sewage treatment plant (STP) at a residential society in Panipat. The panel will visit the project and prepare a report in six weeks, before the next hearing on May 1. Gulti said that since the STP does not function,



the sewage is being discharged in the green belt or drains, which is detrimental to the environment as well as health. "It is further alleged that the respondents with the help of tractor tankers, collect and discharge their untreated sewage either into green belt, the open land or into the nearby drainage system, which emerges directly into Yamuna," the petition stated. "The committee comprises representatives from HSPCB as well as CBCP and Panipat's deputy commissioner," the tribunal said.
