Bangaluru : A novelty milestone has been achieved, graduating from the S Band telemetry and command regime is being leveraged for communication with its space modules to a high throughput X band frequency for Aditya - Li.

India's first Sun mission that completed the first of five earth bound manoeuvres at

1140 am on Sunday ISRO had used X - band only for payload data downloads compared to S - band (2-2.5GHz) All this would be in line with global standards for missions beyond Earth's sphere of influence. The principal uh merit of using X band remains as it allows for more clear communication with distant satellites. Aditya 's operations

are being executed by a multiple tracking stations operated by the I S R O Telemetry, Tracking and Command Network head quartered in Bengaluru. The setup includes a temporary station in the Fiji Islands.

The Mai antenna supporting operation is an 18 m one in Byalalu. It is equipped with auto tracking features across both hands and



remotely operable from the network control centre The antenna at Byalalu can operate in both S and X bands

,disclosed S Somanath, Chairman ISRO.

space craft PSLV C57 rocket would continue to travel to the L1 point from where it could observe the Sun. needed to remain in position. The spacecraft was injected in an intended orbit of 235 19,500: km.. After some earth manoeuvres.. Aditya L L1 would start a very long journey of about 225 days to the L1 point. Aditya would be at the safe distance from the Sun about 1 % of the Earth -- Sun distance. At the L1 point ,the space craft will have a constant , unin-

errupted view of the Sun without any occultation or eclipse. Once Aditya is commissioned , it will be an asset to heliophysics in the country and for the global scientific fraternity ". In the next 4 month, the spacecraft will perform a series of orbital manoeuvres by using its liquid Apogee motor to reach a halo orbit around L1.

Russia & G7 tougher stand over Ukraine

Russia in its own announcement foreign minister Sergey Livor's participation decried what it described as the west attempts to devalue the rule of consensus in G20 by wearing in "questionable "G7 agreement into the agenda for the upcoming summits as binding commitments.

New Delhi : Even as remained confident f the G20 summit culminating in a joint declaration, both G7 and Russia appeared to be hardening their positive on the Ukraine war.

Canadian PM Justin Trudeau seemed to have taken the lead of G7, the group of economically most advanced nations, as his office said while announcing his visit to India that holding Russia accountable was essential to



maintaining the integrity and effectiveness of G20 Trudeau had last week also expressed disappointment that Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy was not going to be President at the summits.

We refer to this phenomenon as the Ukrainisation of the international agenda, meaning a refusal to recognize the actual challenges related to the Ukraine crisis and way to settle. Russia doesn't want any mention of Ukraine in

the joint communique but may agree if documents also draw attention to Moscow's legitimate concerns.

Trudeau's office said he would continue to advocate for collective action to hold Putting accountable for his illegal war and to secure a just and durable peace that start with Russia Ukraine is an attack on the rule that all countries rely on to do business trade grow and improve said Canada in a statement.

EDITORIAL —

Nation wide anger, electoral unrest

The Congress had lost Delhi and Punjab to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) but a sense of purpose is clearly palpable among the Opposition parties, which can get transformed into political pragmatism. In order to derive example of Delhi and Punjab, an AAP-Congress alliance in these two states and the union territory of Chandigarh could turn out to be a formidable combination for 21 Lok Sabha seats. The attempt by the Opposition alliance will be to have one-on-one fights with the BJP, ensuring that anti-incumbency votes do not get split.

It is pertinent to mention logical to assume that the Opposition candidate will sail through, given that there is nationwide anger against the Centre. The political template that is being applied here is the anti-Centre or anti-PM wave created by the Janata Parivar against the Congress in 1977 and 1989. The success of this venture obviously depends on whether the nation is in the mood to dislodge PM Modi. So, inevitably the election will be all about Modi: an anti-Modi coalition seeking votes to remove him from office.

The inherent flaw in this Opposition strategy is that a personality-oriented campaign can boomerang (as it happened in the case of Indira Gandhi in 1971), particularly when Modi loves to play the cornered victim battling alone to save Hindutva.

The possibility of advancing the Lok Sabha polls is always talked about in an election year, particularly when the going gets tough for the incumbent. The BJP is not expected to do well in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Telangana and Mizoram, which go to the polls in the coming three months. Hence, the assumption of a possible advancement of the Lok Sabha elections — due only in April 2024 — towards the end of 2023 is about cashing in on the euphoria of the moon

landing, economic growth indicators and the grand G20 leaders' meet.

A national election happening in three months or six months may not drastically alter the outcome for the ruling party and the Opposition because while the former is perennially in the election mode, the latter bickers till the last moment, depending solely on anti-incumbency to return to power. Sure, the temptation to hold a presidential-style election around PM Modi's candidature before adverse results from various states queer the pitch cannot be overlooked. But the Opposition insists that all this speculation is only to manage the news cycle by trying to divert the discourse from INDIA's meeting in Mumbai and the fresh allegations of stock manipulation against the Adani group.

Another issue that has got completely eclipsed in the meantime is the possibility of Chinese President Xi Jinping skipping the G20 meeting. Modi warmly hosting Xi and the latter's smiling presence at the G20 meeting without resolving the border issue would have been political harakiri for the BJP, particularly in the context of Rahul Gandhi raising concerns over Chinese border incursions during his recent Ladakh visit. Then came the map controversy, which too was lapped up by the Opposition. After India's "strong protest" over China's new map and the condescending "calm down" response by Beijing, Xi's visit had almost become untenable. So, politically there cannot be a more welcome news for the government than Xi skipping the G20 meet.

It would be terribly out of form for a host to be less than polite to a visiting head of state. And historically, India is yet to live down the 1962 debacle or the continuing hostility that keeps getting expressed in border tensions and the Chinese claims over Indian territory. Again for historical reasons, Russia remains an

all-weather friend whose President's absence will not change the relationship. Russian friendship notwithstanding, India's alignment with the West gets more pronounced with every hostile Chinese action. The G20 meeting, thus, becomes another opportunity for India to proclaim its proximity to the West as a new reality and an established norm. However, for the ruling BJP, it is still a reality that is tempered with anxieties about a western regime-change agenda.

When the Opposition on Thursday unleashed an attack on the PM over his alleged proximity to Adani or accused the government of crony capitalism, the response, interestingly, was a finger pointed at the source of funding for the investigations against Adani — George Soros, Rockefeller Brothers Fund and Ford Foundation, all accused some time or the other of furthering American interests or interfering with the opinion-moulding process in Third World countries. Foreign media and foreign-funded Indian news outlets have by and large been critical of Modi, helping the BJP claim that such exposes have all been a motivated political hit job by the West, aimed at regime change.

Whether the latest Adani expose has fired up the Opposition or not, the Centre appointing a committee headed by former President Ram Nath Kovind to examine the feasibility of simultaneous parliamentary and Assembly elections seems to have triggered some urgency in the INDIA camp. It is hoping to finalise the sharing of seats by September 30 — something unheard of even in the Congress, what to say about a conglomeration of disparate political parties fighting for the same political space. It won't be an easy task for the Congress to play second fiddle to its new partners in its traditional strongholds, which it lost to these very allies.

400 loan applications for self employment hang in balance, red tapism to blame

CHANDIGARH : The passouts — mainly from the ITIs — have applied for loans ranging from Rs 2 lakh to Rs 5 lakh under the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme and Pradhan Mantri MUDRA Yojana, besides with the state government entities like the District Industries Centre, Punjab Scheduled Castes Land Development and Finance Corporation, Punjab Backward Classes Land Development and Finance Corporation and Punjab Khadi and Village Industries Board. The state government's efforts to propel self-employment programme has hit a roadblock with financial institutions sitting on more than 400 applications of loan seekers. As the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann-led AAP government has planned a



big event next month in Ludhiana to facilitate self-employment loans, the delay in approving these files has been red flagged by the Department of Technical Education and Industrial Training. DPS Kharbanda, Secretary, Technical Education and Industrial Training, said the financial institutions had raised several objections, including lack of banking history. He said the matter had been taken up with the institutes. The department facilitates loans to students who specialise in plumbing, welding and electrical trades.

Pb advances Rs 1.37 crore toward 'Metro' project report

CHANDIGARH : The Punjab Government has provided a financial contribution of Rs 1.37 crore as the state's share for the detailed project report (DPR) of the eagerly awaited tricity Metro project. A senior UT official said, "The Punjab government's submission of Rs 1.37 crore towards the project is a promising move. We anticipate a similar contribution from Haryana in the near future. The funds will expedite the preparation of the DPR, enabling us to adhere to deadlines for this ambitious project." Earlier this year, the UT Administration had undertaken the commitment to involve all stakeholders, including Haryana and Punjab, in formulating an alternative analysis report and the DPR for the proposed Metro. These initiatives align with the guidelines established by the Union Government. RITES, a leading consultancy firm in

transport infrastructure, has been tasked with crafting a comprehensive mobility plan for the tricity area. This plan includes the development of the Metro, which has already garnered official approval. According to RITES, the estimated cost for preparing the DPR would be Rs 6.54 crore. Regarding the financing structure for the entire project, a comprehensive agreement has already been reached. The states will contribute 20 per cent of the funding, the Union Government another 20 per cent and the remaining 60 per cent will be secured from a lending agency. The tentative budget for the Metro is approximately Rs 10,570 crore. The DPR, intended for the Centre's approval, will encompass essential elements such as cost projections, financial considerations, design specifications, institutional arrangements and a comprehensive implementation plan for the most viable mass rapid transit system.

Tax collection up by 20% this fiscal year

CHANDIGARH : The Haryana Government had been constantly working towards strengthening and modernising the infrastructure of the Excise and Taxation Department. The department was digitising tax collection, as a result of which revenue was continuously rising, he added. Tax collection in Haryana has gone up by 20 per cent in the first five months of this fiscal year (2023-24). From April to August, a revenue of Rs 27,438 crore has been collected in Haryana. In the same period last year, the collection was Rs 22,880 crore.

In the first five months of this financial year, the Excise and Taxation Department collected VAT of Rs 4,686 crore, while the SGST collection, including IGST settlement and SGST compensation, stood at Rs 17,062 crore, which was 30.2 per cent higher than the previous year. With this, an excise collection of Rs 4,792 crore was achieved — an increase of 15.15 per

cent. The spokesperson further informed that the state had collected a total GST of Rs 33,527.42 crore in financial year 2022-23. Haryana stood at the fourth position in total per capita GST collection for financial year 2022-23. In terms of total collection across all states, Haryana continues to rank sixth in FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23. The department was trying to collect more revenue than the target of Rs 57,931 crore set for the department in the state Budget, so that there was no dearth of funds to carry out developmental works.

New projects to replace old ones ahead of MC elections

PATIALA : AAP leaders have started wooing locals with the promise to initiate new works in the city. Despite the fact that numerous projects had been lying incomplete which were initiated during the Congress rule and even after AAP came to power in the state as elections to the Municipal Corporation are expected to be held soon, revealed the sources. The new map of municipal wards and their boundaries was notified by the Local Government Department on Wednesday. A day after the notification, AAP MLA from Patiala City Ajit Pal Singh Kohli said a slew of works would be carried out in the city with Rs 57 crore grant provided by the state. The new projects included a food street, parks at Wadda Arayin Majra and Vikas Colony, public toilets and dharamshalas at various places apart from new intersections and dividers on city roads. While the MLA pointed out



that government projects initiated during the Congress rule were started without planning and that the state government was looking for ways to deal with such issues, corporation officials said numerous projects started by the AAP government after March 2022 were stuck. Rehabilitation of street vendors, dairy shifting project, canal water supply, heritage street, rejuvenation of Rajindra Lake and others were included. Municipal employees pointed out that the corporation had made no headway in the street vendor rehabilitation project, which could have freed the city of traffic chaos. "It will help the corporation generate

revenue, but the officials happen to look the other way," an employee said and added, "The corporation failed to shift vendors to new sites in five years of the Congress rule and over one year of AAP government." Similarly, the dairy shifting project has been in a limbo despite completion of a major part of the project. It was put on halt two years ago in September. "The heritage street project was abandoned after it was initiated by the PDA. Multiple changes in the original plan have made life difficult for residents living adjacent to the project site," an MC official said. The district administration and the corporation had also failed to maintain the Rajindra Lake. A city resident said, "Just like previous governments, the already initiated projects worth crores have been left mid-way by the present government as the focus remains only on announcing new projects."

PPCB approval for environmental norms must for dairy farms, gaushalas

PATIALA : The PPCB authorities have asked the proprietors of dairy farms and gaushalas that as per National Green Tribunal (NGT) orders, it was mandatory to comply with the revised guidelines for environmental management and to have consent to establish a unit. Directing owners of dairy farms and gaushalas to get its consent for operations, the Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB) has asked them to adopt necessary safeguards and ensure compliance of revised environmental guidelines or face penalty. This comes as the majority of gaushalas and dairies continue to discharge dung and wastewater into drains, leading to water pollution.



The consent include undertaking that the dairies and farms would treat wastewater before releasing it into sewers and stop dumping bovine dung. The PPCB approval would be given only if the units would collect dung from the sheds at regular intervals. "At present, the majority of dairies are flouting norms and polluting both air and water. This has to stop or environmental compensation will be levied against defaulters as per NGT orders. At present, most farms are operating without

following any norms," said a top PPCB official. Sources said the recent order came following the problems caused by discharge of dung and wastewater, especially during the floods across Punjab. "Many dairy farms and gaushalas throw dung along with wastewater into drains, leading to clogging. This ultimately reaches rivers and creates water pollution. The dung produces many gases and compounds which are emitted into the atmosphere," said PPCB Chairman Adarsh Pal Vig.

Against the violation of pollution norms, CPCC files case

CHANDIGARH : The Chandigarh Pollution Control Committee (CPCC) had filed a complaint against the firm for the violation of provisions of pollution control Acts. The local court has issued notice to Berkeley Realtech Ltd for allegedly violating the provisions of Water and Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Acts. The firm has been summoned to face trial. The complainant also made a request to dispense with the recording of preliminary evidence on the ground that he had filed the complainant in his capacity as a public servant while discharging official duties. After hearing the arguments on the point of summoning the



accused, the court said: "From the material placed on file, it is prima facie established that on August 09, 2012, at Plot No. 24, Industrial and Business Park, Phase I, Chandigarh, accused persons constructed mall/building without obtaining mandatory consent from the complainant and violated Section 21 of Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and Section 25 and 26 of the Water (Prevention and Control of

Pollution) Act, 1974. They committed offences punishable under Section 44 and 47 of the Water Act and Section 37 and 40 of the Air Act. Accordingly, the accused are ordered to be summoned to face trial." The court ruled that since the complaint has been filed by the complainant in his capacity as a public servant while discharging official duties, therefore, as per Section 200, Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, the recording of preliminary evidence stands dispensed with. The court has adjourned the hearing of the case for October 12.

Arrested patwari Balkar owns massive 54 properties : VB report

CHANDIGARH : Patwari Balkar Singh, who was posted in Kakkarwal revenue circle, Sangrur, was arrested for allegedly preparing fake documents and a private will of 14 kanal, 11 marla land situated at Khanouri. He was already being investigated by the Vigilance in a disproportionate assets (DA) case. Balkar, whose arrest by the Vigilance Bureau on August 23 had led to a statewide strike by patwaris, reportedly owns 54 properties. This came to the fore in a report prepared by the Vigilance. According to a report prepared in the DA case, Balkar joined as a patwari on December 12, 2002. He and his family members own 55 acres, a 400 sq yd residential plot at Officers' Colony in Patiala and two commercial plots at Mahindra Complex, Patiala. These properties were purchased for Rs 3.5 crore and Rs 50 lakh was spent on the construction of his house. Balkar also gave token money to purchase two more



properties for Rs 1.25 crore, mentions the report. The report stated that Balkar owned 54 properties, which were purchased between 2005 and 2023. Out of these, 33 properties are situated in Lehragaga, Moonak and Budhladha. According to documents seized from his car, Balkar purchased 21 properties. The Vigilance pointed out that he, along with some private parties, was doing wrong mutations of the properties. In the wake of arrest of Balkar and Naib Tehsildar Darshan Singh, the Revenue Patwar Union and Revenue Kanungo Union had appealed to the PCS Officers' Association and the Punjab Revenue Officers' Association to join their pending strike from September 1.

The union claimed that before registering a case under Section 17-A of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, nod was not taken from the Deputy Commissioner and the Financial Commissioner (Revenue). However, after facing criticism from various quarters, the union changed its position and announced that their strike was related to old-pension scheme and conducive work atmosphere. Later, the government had even invoked The East Punjab Essential Services (Maintenance) Act. Harbir Singh Dhindsa, chief, Revenue Patwar Union, said they welcomed the Vigilance's probe. "Whosoever, has done anything wrong, won't be supported. The law should be followed while implicating any employee," he said. Balkar has been booked under Sections 409, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of the IPC and Sections 13(1A) and 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act by the Vigilance.

'Road repair, rainwater drainage priority for Phagwara MC'

PHAGWARA : The draining of rainwater on the national highway will be done soon and both sides of the road under the Sugar Mill Chowk will be made operational so that the residents do not have to face any problem said Additional Deputy Commissioner-cum-Municipal Commissioner Amit Kumar Panchal. In addition to above stated, proper drainage of rainwater, repair of potholes on highways and in city, cleaning of blocked sewerages, street lights besides proper fogging in each and every corner of the

city are on the list of priorities of the Municipal Corporation, Phagwara. This was stated by Panchal. He said that the effect of the special meeting held by him with the NHAI officials the previous day were in evidence on the Phagwara national highway. It may be mentioned here that there were many potholes on the road above/under the NH elevated bridge and along the service lane. Because of it, traffic on the road was badly affected and the people were facing a lot of problems. Besides, there was also a fear of loss of life and property.

RERA cautions defaulting realtors, as only 6 projects listed in Chandigarh

CHANDIGARH : The Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA), Chandigarh, has decided to take suo motu action against new constructions not registered with it as per the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016. Even after the lapse of the deadline, not even a single developer came forward to get any project registered, said a RERA official. The authority had given a month's deadline in June to developers to register their residential and commercial projects, saying failure to do so would invite action. He said only six projects were so far registered with RERA, whereas more than 20 were currently underway within the jurisdiction of the UT. The Act makes it mandatory for promoters to register all residential and commercial real estate projects where the area proposed to be developed exceeds 500 sq m or the number of apartments or offices proposed to be developed exceeds eight. The provision aims at protecting the interests of buyers and investors and ensuring a speedy disposal of disputes. According to the Act, if a promoter constructs more than eight flats, shops, chambers or units on a plot irrespective of its size, he or she will have to



register the project with RERA. Similarly, if a promoter carves out plots of the size of more than 500 sq m, he or she has to register the project. Even the construction of godowns was covered under the Act, the official said. If a promoter failed to get his project registered, a penalty to the tune of 10 per cent of the cost of the project could be imposed on the violator under Section 59 of the Act, said the official. On getting a complaint against any unregistered project, the authority would get it verified and take action accordingly, he said, adding that action would also be initiated against plotting being carried out on agricultural land in the UT. The official said they had already appealed to the promoters to register their projects. The Act covers all bodies (private and public) which develop real estate projects for sale to the general public. In the absence of the Apartment Act, the Chandigarh Housing Board (CHB) is the only government agency responsible for the construction of residential units in the city.

PANIPAT : A delegation of Panipat industrialists met CM Manohar Lal Khattar in Chandigarh over the ban orders passed by the Commission of Air Quality Management (CAQM) for the use of diesel generator sets by industries in the NCR from October 1. Pritam Singh Sachdeva, president, Panipat Industrialists' Association; Bheem Rana, president, Haryana Environmental Management Society; and Nitin Arora, adviser, Panipat Dyers' Association, are among the representatives. The CM heard their problems and assured them relief. The biggest problem was the ban orders passed by the CAQM. The orders mainly affected Haryana's industries as 64 per cent area of the



state was in the NCR region, in which 90 per cent industries were operational. Industrialists were not happy to run diesel sets as these were not viable economically, said Mr Sachdeva. "In case of a power breakdown, we need to supply power and fuel to boilers and thermopacks immediately. If not supplied on time, any big mishap may occur," he added. Bhim Rana said the second important issue was to supply treated water from the sewage treatment plant (STP) at

Sewah village to dyeing industries in Sector 29, part-2 there. The dyeing industries have been demanding treated water for re-use in units. A meeting with officials of the Public Health Engineering Department and Irrigation and Water Resource Department, Industries Department, etc., was held under the chairmanship of the CM, who assured that water from the STP would be provided to the industries soon, Rana claimed.

Halwara airport to become operational by September 2023

The Airport Authority of India (AAI) will take over once the construction is complete," said a PWD official.

The civil aviation department is hoping that the AAI will be able to take over in August. "They also need to float tender and shift some of their infrastructure from Sahnewal. That too will take some time and we have asked them to do it

in two months. The actual operations at the airport could, therefore, begin in the beginning of September," said an official with the civil aviation department. In his Budget speech for 2023-24, finance minister Harpal Singh Cheema had said that for the development of the terminal building at the Halwara Indian Air Force Station, the AAP government had decided to contribute. After some initial hiccups, the upcoming international airport at Halwara, 40 km away from Ludhiana, is likely to be ready by September as the Punjab public works department (PWD) hopes to get work on the terminal building completed by July end.
